Nick Kyrgios: A \$9 Million Winner. ked in the top 50 n the world ranking

The Future of Bright!

Four upcoming stars will likely enjoy memorable victories for years to come.



s everyone in the tennis industry continues to welcome a new year **1 L** with opened arms—cautiously optimistic about the upcoming season in the midst of the global pandemic—one fact remains clear: the future of tennis is definitely in good hands.

Without question, tennis's future stars are. despite their youth. fully prepared for the challenges of Grand Slam tournaments, as evidenced by their results last season, with major winners ranging from 19-year-old Iga wi tek (French Open) and 21-year-old Sofia Kenin (Australian Open), to 23-year-old Naomi Osaka (US Open) and 27-year-old Dominic Thiem (US Open). And they're certainly up to the challenges of competing one-onone with tennis's biggest names: Novak Djokovic, Roger Federer, Rafael Nadal and Serena Williams, among others.

But there is an even younger group of up and comers that tennis professionals, commentators and fans should be aware of—rising male stars that have the ability to carry the mantle as legends like Djokovic, Federer and Nadal prepare for the last chapters of their careers. Ranging from 25year-old Australian Nick Kyrgios and 19year-old American Brandon Nakashima, to 22-year-old Greek Stefanos Tsitsipas and 23-year-old German Alexander Zverev, these four talents will soon prove that tennis's future (despite the uncertainties of the last few months, due to COVID-19) remains as bright as ever.

he competed against each of them, Kyrgios also has one doubles title, as he has a 41-43 record so far. Born in Australia in 1995, Kyrgios also achieved Grand Slam success as a junior, winning the boys' singles event at the 2013 Australian Open and the boys' doubles event at the 2013 Wimbledon Championships.

Brandon Nakashima: Leaving College to Become a Professional

A winner of two ITF singles titles, Brandon Nakashima was a student at the University of Virginia, where he compiled a 17-5 singles record and a 20-3 doubles record, was named the ACC Freshman of the Year and received All ACC First Team and All ACC Academic Team honors. And then, after just one highly successful semester, he decided to forego the rest of his eligibility and become a professional.

To some, the decision may have been viewed as a bit premature, as he could have finished his college career, earned his



Nick Kyrgios: A \$9 Million Winner

A former world number one as a junior, Nick Kyrgios has since won six ATP tournaments, while also reaching eight ATP finals overall. Ranked in the top 50 in the world ranking, Kyrgios has compiled a singles record of 161-95 so far, won nearly \$9 million in prize money and reached the guarterfinals of the 2014 Wimbledon Championships and the 2015 Australian Open.

Only the third player to defeat Djokovic, Federer and Nadal the first time bachelor's degree and compiled more collegiate victories, prior to becoming a professional. However, Nakashima has since proven that his decision was indeed correct, as he received a wild card to the Delray Beach Open-his first ever ATP main draw event-and reached the guarterfinals. He has since reached the top 200 of the world rankings too.

"I want to take my game to the next level and hopefully win an ATP tournament," he says. "I am really looking forward to [this] year."

Stefanos Tsitsipas: Quickly Ascending the Rankings

Born in Athens in 1998, Stefanos Tsitsipas won his first ATP match in 2017. From there, he began to quickly ascend in the world rankings, ultimately reaching a career high ranking of No. 5 in 2019 (he was No. 6 as recently as November 2020). This quick ascent in the rankings was primarily due to his consistency, as he has compiled a career record of 133-76 so far, won 5 ATP titles and reached the semifinals at the 2019 Australian Open and the 2020 French Open.

A former world number one as a junior, Tsitsipas also reached the quarterfinals of all four junior Grand Slam tournaments and won Wimbledon in doubles, thereby becoming the first Greek male to win a junior Grand Slam in the Open era. In addition to all of these successes, he's also the youngest player to defeat Djokovic, Federer and Nadal-doing so before he was 21 years old.

Alexander Zverev: Preparing for Grand Slam Victories

Compiling a 251-125 singles record so far, Alexander Zverev has also ascended to nearly the top of the world rankings, reaching a career high of No. 3 in 2017 (and ranking No. 7 as recently as November 2020). A former world number one as a junior, Zverev won a junior Grand Slam singles title at the 2014 Australian Open, a sign of what was to come.

A winner of 13 career singles tiles, he has also finished runnerup at a Grand Slam (the 2020 US Open, after reaching his first Grand Slam final) and been praised by the likes of Djokovic and Nadal, who consider him to be a future star.

"I'm only 23 years old," he adds. "I do believe I will be a Grand Slam champion at some point."

The Future of the 2021 ^{Br Chris Lewis} BNP Paribas Open

Due to COVID-19, the BNP Paribas Open has been postponed; new dates have yet to be announced



n December 29, 2020, representatives of the BNP Paribas Open announced that the tournament, which was originally scheduled to be held on March 8-21, 2021, would be rescheduled to a new date.

After consulting thoroughly with California's state and local health authorities, Larry Ellison, owner of the BNP Paribas Open, decided it was in the best interests of players, broadcasters, advertisers, employees and fans to postpone the tournamentwhich was cancelled altogether last March when the pandemic began in full force—due to continuous concerns with COVID-19. As of early January, a new date for the tournament had not yet been decided, but representatives appeared to be clear that it

would still be hosted this year.



"The tournament is proactively working with the ATP and WTA Tours, as well as title sponsor BNP Paribas, to confirm dates later in the year to hold the event," tournament representatives mentioned in a statement published on BNPParibasOpen.com. "Details will be released in the near future as plans are finalized." "As soon as the new dates are confirmed, the tournament will

provide more information to current ticket holders, including credit and refund options," the statement continued.

Safety First

Known as the "fifth major", the BNP Paribas Open has taken a variety of measures to ensure everyone involved with the tournament is as safe as possible once the tournament is actually contested. First, it has implemented various social distancing protocols, based on present guidelines. In addition, an array of safety precautions will occur at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden, each of which will be focused on attendants' health, above all else. "As we prepare to host the BNP Paribas Open, our team at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden has one priority above all else: to

ensure the health and safety of everyone involved with the eventfans, players, sponsors, media, vendors and staff," tournament representatives stated on BNPParibasOpen.com.

"With that as our guiding principle, we will continue to consult with a committee of expert advisors that includes tennis industry stakeholders, medical professionals, government officials and safety professionals to make the best decisions possible in the lead-up to the event," tournament representatives added during their online statement.

The tournament representatives stressed that they realized the on-site experience will be altered considerably once the tournament is held-alterations that will require cooperation from every attendant.

"We are committed to creating an environment that will allow everyone to feel safe and secure in attending the BNP Paribas Open; it is our collective responsibility to help keep each other safe," tournament representatives added on BNPParibasOpen.com.


As evidenced by the event's typical attendance statistics (up to 450,000 fans have been attending the tournament annually lately) and prize money (more than \$17 million), the BNP Paribas Open has not only become one of the most popular tournaments in tennis, but in all sports, likely a primary reason why Ellison had no choice but to reschedule it.

"We're proud that the BNP Paribas Open has become a favorite of players and fans alike," tournament representatives said on BNPParibasOpen.com. "But we know that right now, it's not about us; it's about what we can do to ensure that everyone can feel safe and [is] excited to return to Tennis Paradise."

The Economic Influence of Cancellations

In 2017, the BNP Paribas Open generated an estimated gross economic impact of \$406,602,107 on the Coachella Valley

regional economy, according to a study conducted by The George Washington University. In comparison to 2014's figures, the year in which the last BNP Paribas Open economic impact study had been completed, total gross economic impact had risen by more than \$32 million.

In a little over ten years, from 2006 (another year in which the study was conducted) to 2017, total gross economic

impact increased by more than \$187 million. This increase is even more noticeable when the influence of Indian Wells Tennis Garden's renovations (on the 2017 BNP Paribas Open) are considered, raising gross economic impact to \$466,943,364

Not to mention, the total fiscal impact of the tournament on the Coachella Valley was estimated at roughly \$19 million,

according to The George Washington University study; this total was generated through tax revenues for city and county governments, particularly through property and sales taxes, along with Transient Occupancy Tax.

In addition, nearly 440,000 fans attended the tournament in 2017, a total that has since regularly risen to approximately 450,000 annually. Eightyseven percent of all attendees had traveled from outside of the region, a primary factor of the tournament's high gross economic impact.

With these figures in mind, the economic losses, directly resulting from the cancellation of the 2020 BNP Paribas Open, were detrimental—likely even higher than the \$406 million that was generated in 2017. Therefore, Ellison likely has no choice but to host the tournament later this year, especially as other ATP and WTA tournaments have remain scheduled for the first few weeks of 2021.

Although Ellison's decision may not be known for months, there's no doubt about this: the BNP Paribas Open's return to the tennis circuit will be wholly welcomed by worldwide fans, along with Coachella Valley residents, as Tennis Paradise's comeback can't begin soon enough.



Leaves a Legacy of Extraordinary Tennis Photography-and Humanity



s news of renowned tennis photographer Luigi Serra's passing went out, tributes and statements of great sadness passing went out, and account of an arrow and a man beloved by so many—in the Coachella Valley, Chicago, New York, Italy, in fact, it seems, wherever he went.

The term "legendary" is not an overstatement of his extraordinary skill and accomplishments as a photographer.

The 79-year-old succumbed to complications of COVID-19 in Chicago on Dec. 9, 2020. He is survived by his wife, Bonnie, and sons, Alessandro and Gianluca, all of them at his side when he passed away. He is also survived by his grandchildren Isabella, Daniela, Lexi, Gabriella and Vincent, and by his brother Roberto and sister Maria Luisa.

"Luigi was an exuberant, creative Italian who loved his family and his friends-and he considered everyone his friend," says his wife, Bonnie Serra. "Luigi was very fortunate to be able to make a career out of his two passions, tennis and photography. His death has left a hole in the heart of his family."

InMemory

Born in Mantova, Italy, and raised in Florence, Serra came to the United States in his mid 20s. For nearly three decades he worked as an electrical engineer specializing in the design of nuclear power plants before retiring and giving himself the time and space to pursue tennis and photography. Although he photographed other sports, tennis was his true love, and for 45 years he photographed all of the important tournaments across the globe from Wimbledon to the U.S., French and Australian Opens. His striking images of many of the world's greatest stars and up-and-coming players captured the raw power, grace and intensity of on-court play. Rafael Nadal, Roger Federer, Novak Djokovic, Andy Murray, Serena and Venus Williams, Maria Sharapova, Flavia Pennetta, Simona Halep, Bianca Andreescu and Taylor Fritz are among the athletes so brilliantly portrayed by his expert eye and lens.

In the Coachella Valley he was a stalwart at the BNP Paribas Open, an ATP Masters 1000 tournament played at Indian Wells Tennis Garden, and his photos of that tournament as well as many other important contests and players provided the visuals for



tennis coverage in *Desert Golf & Tennis*, a publication that likely would not have ever included tennis if not for Luigi Serra.

Tim Pade, desert resident and publisher of the magazine, says that it was Serra, along with fellow Italian Piero Pierattoni, founder of popular Palm Desert eateries Mamma Gina and PizzaVino, who convinced him to expand the magazine, then known as *Desert Golf*, into a two-sport publication for which Serra would supply the photographs of all the great tennis players and tournaments. That's exactly what he did. His first image for the newly renamed *Desert Golf & Tennis* was of tennis great Rafael Nadal, which appeared on the cover of the February-March 2014 issue. His photos have appeared in every issue and on multiple covers to this day.

Serra split his time between the Coachella Valley and Chicago when he wasn't traveling all over the world to cover tournaments or to visit his beloved home town of Florence. In its obituary chronicling the life of the photographer, the *Chicago Tribune* echoed what every other tribute and obituary noted: "Luigi lived life to the fullest and went out of his way to make everyone he met feel valued. He was the life of the party and will be missed by many all over the world."

He was by all accounts one of a kind and the kind offriend any of us would be grateful to have . In addition to friends and family left behind, Serra also leaves the world, especially the sports world, a legacy of exquisite, powerful images of the men and women who play tennis on courts across the globe, and of singular moments that define athletic prowess. Fortunately, those will be with us forever.

Kipp Robert Downing, Palm Desert and La Quinta Restaurateur

The valley lost a longtime community member and entrepreneur. Desert Golf & Tennis Magazine Palm Desert and La Quinta restaurateur Kipp Robert Downing passed away on Dec. 30, 2020, following a hard-fought battle with NET (neuroedocrine tumors), a rare form of cancer. He leaves his wife, Jacquee Renna-Downing; daughters Julia, Olivia and Matlin; stepdaughters Junie, Hailey and Drew; sister Jan King and brother Kirk Downing.

Born July 5, 1948 in Boulder, Colorado, Downing attended the University of Colorado where his parents had met years before. He graduated from the university's Leeds School of Business and ultimately turned his attention to running restaurants. He first opened Café Pacifica in 1980 in the San Diego area, followed by Pacifica Del Mar and Pacifica Grille. In 2001 he opened his first restaurant in the Coachella Valley, Pacific Seafood Restaurant in Palm Desert, followed by La Quinta Cliffhouse Grill & Bar in 2012. He was a dual resident of San Diego and La Quinta.

It was through his restaurants that Downing became a longtime advertising supporter of *Desert Golf & Tennis*, a relationship that made perfect sense considering Downing's legendary passion for the game of golf. A member of The Palms Golf Club and The Club at PGA West, both in La Quinta, he lived and breathed golf. "His days off, his vacations, his relationships all centered around golf," says his wife, Jacquee. "He played all over the world. He was a great teacher as well. When he wasn't in the restaurants, he was on the golf course until he was no longer able to play."

Jacquee and Kipp had been together for several years and married for just a little over a year, though their story actually began some 30 years ago when they first dated. It just wasn't their time back then, Jacquee says. They went offin different directions. Both got married and both had three daughters. But when the marriages started to fall apart, she notes, "We found each other again."

Jacquee ran the restaurants with Downing for multiple years and will continue on at Pacifica and La Quinta Cliffhouse. But she will greatly miss her partner. "He had a vision of hospitality that was centered around making

everyone—guests and his team—feel special. He was the kindest individual ever, never a judgment about people. He was very accepting of people and he was a great mentor. He mentored many of those who worked for him to go on and open their own restaurants. He also has people who followed him from restaurant to restaurant, who worked for him for 30 years. He was that kind of person."

He was also, she adds, a great storyteller with a wonderful sense of humor, even though it could be a little dark at times. But above all else, she says, "Above all, he loved his family."



For a short time on Sunday it looked like a playoff was in the cards, between rock-steady South Korean Si Woo Kim, who had three bogey-free rounds and had been in contention almost from the start, and Californian Patrick Cantlay, who barely made the cut and was tied for 56th when the third round began. Cantlay's spectacular rise to the top of Sunday's leaderboard came thanks to weekend play that included 20 birdies—more than in any other non-Major tournament. When he walked off the green in the final round, he held a solo lead at 22 under, posting a brilliant 61 and 11 under for the day.

But that wasn't enough to stop Kim, described by one commentator as "a machine" moving through the course. Laser focused and calm, Kim exhibited only a couple of brief flashes of emotion, including a blink-and-you-missed-it fist pump after his second birdie of the last three holes dropped in to move him ahead of Cantlay. All that was left was to remain focused and make par on 18. He did exactly that in almost textbook fashion, placing his final drive from the challenging 18th tee well down the fairway, followed by a solid 8-iron to the green and two putts for a near-perfect par.

Australian Cameron Davis also put on a good show on Sunday, notching a career-best third, followed by Tony Finau who started the fourth round sharing the top of the leaderboard but faded, ending with a solo fourth place. Never really in contention were defending champion Andrew Landry (T64) and tournament ambassador and host Phil Mickelson, who failed to make the -4 cut on Friday, though Mickelson did one thing he'd never done before in his 29-year career—make 18 consecutive pars in one round.

While the breathtaking successes and shocking fails of tournament play were just what we expect, much else about the 2021 American Express was not. The fairways weren't lined with spectators, there was no pro-am tournament and there were just two courses in play rather than three. But charity, a cornerstone of this event that has changed names and title sponsor multiple times over many years, was as front-and-center as ever, albeit in a completely new format.

The first-ever Charity Challenge, hosted by Mickelson, took place on Wednesday prior to the start of competition with a foursome of celebrities and Tour pros who competed to donate to chosen local charities. Tony Finau, World No. 22, partnered with former pro soccer superstar Landon Donovan, and Paul Casey, World No. 27, partnered with country-music star Jake Owen. When all was said and done, Casey ad Owen earned \$660,000 for "health and wellness" charities while Finau and Donovan raised \$340,000 for "youth development and education" charities—\$1 million in total.

Kim posted rounds of 66-68-67-64 for

his win, and in spite of appearing entirely

"The Coachella Valley has been very supportive of this tournament for half a century, and the ability to contribute to the people here and many of the local charities that help those in need is an important part of this tournament," Mickelson said at the start of the event. "It's an important part of the game of golf, and I'm appreciative that we're able to continue it, even in this time of a pandemic."

Additional highlights of this year's American Express included a somewhat bizarre moment on Friday when Mark Hubbard unleashed a social-media-worthy move called "The Snail," involving a putter, the sudden arc of one arm diving down the shaft and theatrical pinky flourish just above the putter head—all after what appeared to be a perfectly normal setup. The broadcasters guffawed and replayed the putt multiple times while some pros and fans took to Twitter. If only the fourfooter had dropped.

Although Cantlay ultimately didn't ultimately prevail in the tournament, he has little to regret. "I thought I would have a chance at a playoff," he said after falling just short of his fourth career victory despite a phenomenal round of 61, his best career round as a pro. "I played about as good as I can possibly play."

Cantlay's four rounds of 69-71-65-61 not only gave him the 2nd place finish at The American Express, it moved him up **StrokePlay**

unflappable throughout the tournament, he may have been a bit more nervous than he seemed. "I couldn't sleep last night," he said just after his win. "Today, I just kept trying to think positive, not be too aggressive and just keep calm."

The 2021 American Express is Kim's third win on the PGA Tour and first since 2017 when the then 21-year-old became the youngest player ever to win the Players Championship. Asked about that dry spell, he said it's been a long three-and-a-half years. This victory should now put it out of his mind.

Perhaps most important for fans and for the game of golf, the 2021 American Express was a success. Pros played and charities benefited. That bodes well for the rest of the PGA Tour schedule and golffans everywhere regardless of the pandemic.

Traveling to Scotland



16th hole – Par-3/215 yards

I fyou haven't been to Scotland to play golf, you definitely need to plan a trip. Golfin Scotland is an experience "not to be missed" for golfers from around the world. If you have been to Scotland to play golf, no doubt you will be eager to return.

Why is Scotland such a great golfing arena? Because it has many of the greatest links golf courses in the world. Links is the purest form of golf and is how the game originated some 600 years ago. There are a few golf destinations in Scotland, but perhaps the most famous are the links to be found in or nearby to St Andrews. The Old Course at St Andrews is a prime target for those making the pilgrimage. Kingsbarns, too, is on most golfers' bucket list as a 'must play'.

However, 'the new kid on the block' which opened last summer to rave reviews is Dumbarnie Links, a 20-minute drive south of The Old Course. I was very privileged to be involved in this project as Founder and Designer of the golf course. Presented with a stunning, genuine links site stretching along a mile and a half of waterfront, combined with the land owner, Lord Balniel's blessing, allowed us to utilize 345-acres of his 5000-acre Balcarres Estate and produce a genuine links that looks as if it has been there for more than 100 years.

Having only been open since late May 2020, LINKS magazine recently rated it amongst their 'Five Courses in Europe that should Host The Ryder Cup'. "Bunkered" is an international magazine,


and said "It's impossible to pick a favorite hole. They are all absolutely spectacular." In all, to date we have had 35 feature articles in national and international golf magazines, a number of which are





tapping Dumbarnie Links to be included in the World's Top 100.

So, what makes Dumbarnie Links so special and worth a visit on your next trip to Scotland? It is an unusual site in that it comprises two elevations connected by a gentle, sweeping escarpment. All 18 holes



have far-reaching, panoramic views across the 11-mile stretch of the Firth of Forth to famous landmarks like Muirfield. North Berwick and the city of Edinburgh. Golfers describe the views at Dumbarnie Links as 'stunning'. These panoramic views are contrary to many of the old, classic links which have a tendency to run 'out and back', where their fairways hide under the coastal dunes giving the golfer some shelter, but only scant views of the water.

The course at Dumbarnie Links is very playable for all standards of golf. There is further intrigue with a number of 'risk and reward' holes where the golfer can gamble in an effort to pick up a birdie. For instance, although the course ranges from 5,300 yards to 6,900 yards - with a set of professional tees bumping the vardage up to 7,600 yards – the course includes three potentially driveable Par-4 holes. In order to reach the green on these holes, or come close, the 'risk' is tempting in order to gain the 'reward'. There are also holes with twin fairways where the direct line generally gives a fairway of 25-yards or less in width. The safe line tends to offer fairways of 45-50 yards in width. However, the safe line always plays very much longer. The 5th hole at Dumbarnie is a prime example, where a large nest of bunkers separates the twin fairways. The first time I played it, I hit good drives down both fairways. For the


direct line I hit drive and 9-iron, but this line has a narrow, well protected fairway. For the safe line I hit drive and 4-iron to the 45yard wide fairway. So, golfers may choose their own poison!

Our superintendent, Grahame Taylor (formerly at The Old Course, St Andrews) together with his team nurtured the course during grow-in and it was brought into play in simply spectacular condition in May 2020.

One of the fascinations of links golf, and it is well demonstrated at Dumbarnie, is the fact that because of large, smooth aprons around the green, the golfer may receive some assistance allowing the ball to collect onto the green. On the other hand, there are also some dells and hollows around the putting surfaces. Because of the smoothness of these large aprons, players might opt to use anything from a utility club to a sand wedge for their approach. The options are endless when playing links golf.

the fall and the major music festivals will run, bringing in thousands of fans and dollars in the fourth quarter. The American Express golf tournament already went forward, albeit without fans, but with players, sportscasters, photographers and ancillary staff in town for the event.

And there's more good news. In mid-December the Wall Street Journal reported that since the pandemic began, there's been a big jump in demand for homes in golfing communities, which should be a boon for the golf-centric Coachella Valley. TAKING GOLF FASHION TO NEW HEIGHTS

Today's golf topic is "set up - posture". As golfers we sometimes forget how the basics set up effects the golf swing. I have a few photos to help visualize the feel of these set up extremes. You can check your set up in a mirror at home. This is my 7 iron view from the back-down the target line. Here are a few key set up basics to keep an eye out for: bow, knee

Bow-hinge forward:

flex & grip distance from the thigh.


I have golfers stand in an straight stance & work on the "bow to the ball". Some golfers call this the "bow or hinge forward". Keys here are: bending at the hips NOT the middle of the back, NOT from the neck. I feel like for most golfers (if you start from a locked leg upright position & 2 clicks forward bowIng toward the ball you will get you there). Then slightly "unlock the knees".

Don't "sit" on the wall (photo for visual), bow forward away from wall.

If your posture is too upright, (or too much sitting) top shots or high right or low left will be your result. It will many times NOT allow for the hips to turn & you feel like you are constricted in the turn.

Knee Flex:

The knees only need to be bent (or unlocked) to the middle of the laces on the shoes. Many golfers have TOO much knee flex (or knees out to the end of your golf shoes). Be careful for too much knee flex, this drops your hips / butt down & can get your back / posture into a "C" or too rounded position. Which results





Using 1 hand as "measuring " the correct distance away

Correct 7 iron posture



many times in the grip too far from the thigh & sometimes grip too high.

Miss hits with too much knee flex can cause: over the top, slide, sway, top shots, thin shots, and lack of distance.

Grip distance from the ball:

I do the bow & the knee flex FIRST then the grip distance from the thigh last.

Here are a few guidelines:

Wedges: (chipping & pitching) 3-4" from the thigh (super close feel for control)

Irons: 4-6" or 1 palm width from the thigh (Arm feels like it is straighter down from the shoulders, dangling in a relaxed feel state)

Woods: 6-8" distance from the thigh. Arm feels like it is at a sight angle (under the chin) because of the longer shaft

I would recommend to check your arm distance in a mirror. Many golfers are too far away from the ball with this radius. If your arm hang is too far from your thigh: falling forward to your toes, lack of turn, lack of distance, lack of power can happen.

If your arm hang is too high or too stiff, top shots, elbows start to bend too much (flying elbow & chicken wing), over the top path can happen.

Keep working on your set up in the mirror & you will feel a more solid swing.







Ford's electric-powered crossover

The newest Mustang surprises, inspires and shocks those expecting a sedan in line with the Shelby fastback of the 1960s. If a purest will give it a chance, they may be more in love than ever.

A crossover Mustang is sacrilegious to worshippers of the original 1965 model. The American family who wants size of an SUV and the environmental friendliness of an electric car, the new Mustang Mach E is right on target.

Yes, Ford is reshaping the Mustang's legacy with the Mach E. This electric-powered crossover would be exciting by any name, but Ford chose to pair the future of the brand with the history of its most successful sedan. The Mach E is not without characteristics that fit well with its namesake

The torque coming out of the dual electric motors makes the Mach feel more like a racehorse than a Clydesdale. That's especially true in the GT version of the Mach E. The motors max out at 635 lb-ft off the starting line. This is neck-snapping thrust. More than the 5.0 liter V-8 Ford has in its F150.

The result of this low-end torque is a 0-60 mph time that puts the Mach E in good company. At 3.5 seconds to hit the mark, the Mach E GT competes nicely with its rival the Tesla Model Y. This is Porsche boxter territory in an SUV that weighs nearly 5,000 pounds.

The GT Performance model has 480 horsepower. Not bad for a car with no engine under the hood. Again, the output is better than its little brother the Mustang GT sedan that we've all grown expect big horsepower from. The Mach E is no joke.

Of course with an all-electric car, drivers need enough range to get to the next charging station in a cross-country road trip. At least, they need to make the commute to work and back on one charge. The Mach E gives quite enough range in its 98.8 kWh extended-range battery. The EPA estimates the extended range gives up to 300 miles of driving. This is the brass ring for electric vehicles and Ford has put itself squarely with the front runners with this bombshell of a battery. Another gold star for the company is how quickly the Mach E can recharge. With a Ford charging station, the Mach E replenishes its full battery at 32 miles per hour, less than 10 hours.

Inside, its simple dashboard and interface are dominated by an gorgeous digital gauge cluster. The vertically-mounted

touchscreen is the centerpiece. A floating, flip-up armrest on the center console creates the option for space or storing small items between the front-seat passengers. The Mache E has surprising features like the ability to change the color of the ambient interior lighting, a heated steering wheel, wireless charging, and a huge panoramic sunroof. This isn't your grandfather's Mustang. The front trunk is made of a durable plastic that can be rinsed and then drained, which Ford used in a promotion to store what looked to be 20 pounds of peeled shrimp. The Mach-E has 29 cubic feet of cargo space behind the rear seats, and up to 60 with the back seats folded

The exterior is where fans of the original Mustang have contemplated riots at Ford headquarters. The historic emblem with the Mustang pony runs prominently across the grill. With no need for the air intake a gas-powered engine requires, the display is bold. The hood features two long body lines running from nose to windshield, providing a look of sleekness uncanny for such a large vehicle. Of course an SUV isn't going to turn heads like the Shelby GT or fastbacks of yesteryear. However, the Mach E won't be laughed out of the parking lot. There is plenty of style to make this fit quite naturally in the family of noble body styles.

With a price tag around \$60,000 fully loaded, the Mach E GT Performance model would make a fine addition to any family's lineup of commuter vehicles. The range, fast charging and the sport-car performance make this a pony you'd be proud to have in vour stable.
