**RETIREMENT
JUST AHEAD
?**

Will Serena Williams and Roger Federer Retire Soon?

The question is being asked by many but no one is answering yet

It's hard to imagine tennis without Serena Williams or Roger Federer. Maybe we won't have to this year, though rumors have been swirling for months that one or both will soon announce retirement from the sport that they've dominated, that made them famous across the planet, that they've given so much to, that they changed.

Williams, who just turned 40, has been particularly prickly when questioned about retirement. During an interview at age 38, she said she expected to retire from the sport in 20 years—which would make her 58. That's obviously unlikely, but fans have been solidly behind her pursuit to win that elusive 24th Grand Slam title and crush Margaret Court's record. Whether she does or doesn't achieve that, her legacy will in no way be diminished.

Williams created a new era in women's tennis with her powerful athleticism. She holds more Grand Slam titles than any other player—including men—since the start of the Open Era. She has four Olympic gold medals, one in singles competition and three in doubles with her sister Venus Williams, and she holds the record for the most money won in women's tennis with close to \$100 million (#2 is Venus with just over \$40 million). Add endorsements and other off-court money and Serena is worth more than \$200 million. She's ranked at No. 30 on a list naming the 40 Most Successful Athletes of the 21st Century, which includes men and women from all sports and all countries. Did we mention she won her 23rd Grand Slam when she was pregnant?

Williams' professional career launched in 1995 at age 14. The youngest of five girls, Serena learned tennis alongside Venus on the public tennis courts of Los Angeles, coached by their father. Although Venus turned pro one year earlier than Serena, it was Serena who took the first Grand Slam title, winning the U.S. Open in 1999. By 2012, she captured her fifth Wimbledon singles title. In 2013, she won her second French Open and fifth U.S. Open. By 2015, she had her sixth Australian Open title. Additionally, she won singles titles twice at the BNP Paribas Open in Indian Wells.

The Williams sisters have faced each other in competition more than 30 times, and they're the only two women in the Open Era to play each other in four consecutive Grand Slam finals. They've won 22 titles as doubles partners, including four Grand Slams and three

Olympic gold medals. As good as Venus is, Serena has dominated. Venus was ranked World No. 1 for 11 weeks compared to Serena's stunning 316 weeks at the top. Venus has won 49 career singles titles to Serena's 73. And of the 30-plus times the sisters met in head-to-head matches, Serena won 19 times.

In 2017, Williams gave birth to her daughter with Reddit founder Alexis Ohanian. She returned to competition in

2018 but failed to win, though she reached the finals at Wimbledon and at the U.S. Open, where controversy ensued when she was fined a game for arguing with the chair umpire over a code violation. In 2019 she was again defeated in the finals at Wimbledon and the U.S. Open, and in 2021 she suffered a heartbreaking loss to Naomi Osaka in the semifinals of the Australian Open. This past June, she slipped on the grass in her first set of the

first round at Wimbledon, suffering a hamstring injury that forced her to leave the tournament—but to a standing ovation from the crowd.

Speculation about the end of Williams' career being near is rampant, but her longtime coach, Patrick Mouratoglou, doesn't believe Serena will stop until she wins that 24th Grand Slam. "She doesn't quit," he says.

Roger Federer is ranked at No. 29 on that list of the 40 Most Successful Athletes of the 21st Century. The Swiss star has won 20 Grand Slam titles and one Olympic gold medal. His first Grand Slam singles win came at Wimbledon in 2003, and since turning pro in 1998 Federer has spent 310 weeks as the No. 1 men's tennis player, second only to Novic Djokovic.

Those 20 Grand Slam titles tie him

with Rafael Nadal and Djokovic—who as a group became known as the Big Three, widely considered three of the best tennis players of all time. Federer's Olympic gold medal was won in doubles play at the 2008 summer Olympics in Beijing, partnered with fellow Swiss tennis great Stanislas Wawrinka. Federer also won a silver in singles competition at the 2012 London games, where he finished runner-up to Andy Murray.

Federer has won \$130 million in prize money, though his net worth is put at \$900 million by some estimates, and he's on track to be the first billionaire tennis player in the world.

Federer has won five times at the BNP Paribas Open, and he's still ranked No. 9 in the world as of August 2021.

Off the court, Federer is known for his philanthropy. He founded the Roger Federer Foundation, which provides aid to children in need in Africa, especially in South Africa where his mother was born. He funds the foundation in part through the Match for Africa exhibition series, during which he plays a singles match against another of the world's Top 10 tennis players, as ranked by the Association of Tennis Professionals (ATP). Federer is routinely one of the Top 10 highest-paid athletes in any sport, and in 2020 he ranked first among all athletes with \$100 million in endorsement income. From 2017 to 2020, the Match for Africa exhibition series included doubles play, for which Federer teamed up with Bill Gates—yes, THAT Bill Gates—against other pro/celebrity teams. Federer and Gates won all three years.

Like Williams, Federer has had a disappointing 2021, including at Wimbledon where he lost the quarter-finals match to Hubert Hurkacz. Both Williams and Federer announced their withdrawal from the 2021 U.S. Open due to injuries—his knee, her hamstring—and neither will play at the 2021 BNP Paribas Open.

Not surprising, there's once again talk that we may have seen the last of them in competition. Whatever they decide about the future, one thing is clear: Serena Williams and Roger Federer are two of the world's greatest tennis players, and nothing is going to change that.

Novak Djokovic Enjoys
Another Historic Season.
Claiming the first three
Grand Slam titles this year

The tennis industry is currently preparing for yet another chapter in its long, storied history.

On July 6, 2003, Roger Federer won his first Grand Slam singles title at Wimbledon, ushering in the “Big Three” era, in which he, Novak Djokovic and Rafael Nadal would each win 20 Grand Slam singles titles over the next 18 years, eclipsing Pete Sampras’s former record by six titles thus far.

Without question, it was an era unlike any other in tennis history, one that will most likely never be replicated again. However, despite the fact that age is starting to catch up with the “Big Three”, leading to injuries and missed events recently, the future of tennis is bright. And the next era appears to have potential for greatness, likely leading to years of more excitement for tennis fans around the world.

As spectators, sponsors, coaches and players alike all prepare for the next era, here are some names to keep an eye on (two of which have already been at the top of the rankings for years), as the transition from the “Big Three” to tomorrow’s top talent begins.

Novak Djokovic Enjoys Another Historic Season

Now 34 years old, the Serbian hasn’t shown any signs of slowing down, with regards to his track record, as he claimed the first three Grand Slam titles this year, prior to enduring injuries and exhaustion during the Olympics.

His streak was on par with his historic run a few years ago, as he previously won four straight Grand Slam singles titles—from the 2015 Wimbledon Championships to the 2016 French Open, becoming only the third man to hold all four titles at once. In addition, he has won nearly 1,000 matches so far, while only losing less than 200.

Before attempting to become the first man to win all four Grand Slam singles titles in a calendar year since Rod Laver achieved the feat in 1969, Djokovic had also previously triumphed at all nine ATP Masters 1000 events—winning 36 in all so far.

“Just believe in your dreams. If you have dreams, don’t give up,” Djokovic stresses. “Belief is the most common word to me—even more than hope. For one to achieve his dreams, he needs to truly believe in them.”

Rafael Nadal Prepares for the Future

On August 20, the 13-time French Open champion announced he had to withdraw from the US Open, a championship he has won twice so far, due to an ongoing foot injury. Prior to the announcement, the 2021 season had already been rather disappointing for the 36-year-old, as he withdrew from the Wimbledon Championships and the Olympics.

The injury began at the French Open earlier in the season, the championship he is most renowned for, as his record at Roland Garros will likely never be surpassed; in fact, his 13 wins in one Grand Slam singles championship is five more than the next closest aggregate: Federer's eight victories at the Wimbledon Championships.

"I am [determined] to do whatever it takes to regain the best possible shape [and] to continue competing for the things that really motivate me," Nadal says. "I am convinced that with the recovery of [my] foot and obviously a very important daily effort, this can be achieved. I will work as hard as I can to make it happen."



Stefanos Tsitsipas Showcases His Potential

In 2017, the then 19-year-old Greek won his first match on the ATP Tour. One year later, he captured his first title at the Stockholm Open, prior to being runner-up at the Canadian Open and becoming the youngest player to defeat four top-10 opponents in one tournament. And then, in 2019, he was the champion at the 2019 ATP Finals, thereby becoming the youngest winner of the year-end championships in 18 years.

A seven-time ATP singles titles champion, Tsitsipas won his first Masters 1000 event at the 2021 Monte-Carlo Masters, while also reaching his first-ever Grand Slam final at the 2021 French Open (the first Greek to ever do so), ultimately losing to Djokovic in five sets.

"Tennis taught me a lot of things in my life," he states. "I owe everything to this game, a game with which I have grown [and] learned."

He continues, "Tennis represents me and everything I have. [It] is my life!"

Dominic Thiem Looks Ahead to 2022

Last year, Thiem achieved a career-high world ranking of No. 3, as he has been ranked in the top 10 ever since early June 2016, which is currently the second longest active streak (only behind Nadal).

As a further sign of his consistency, he has won 17 ATP titles, including at least one on every surface (clay, grass and hard) and has reached four Grand Slam finals (two French Opens, one Australian Open and one US Open), one of which he won—the 2020 US Open after defeating Alexander Zverev.

Unfortunately, he has endured injuries this season, leading to a variety of missed appearances in tournaments he would have otherwise competed in. Nonetheless, the 27-year-old Austrian is very optimistic about the future.

“When I am back with my best version, I will be able to beat all of them and win whatever tournament I play,” he says, referring to his fellow competitors. “I look forward to starting the 2022 campaign strong.”



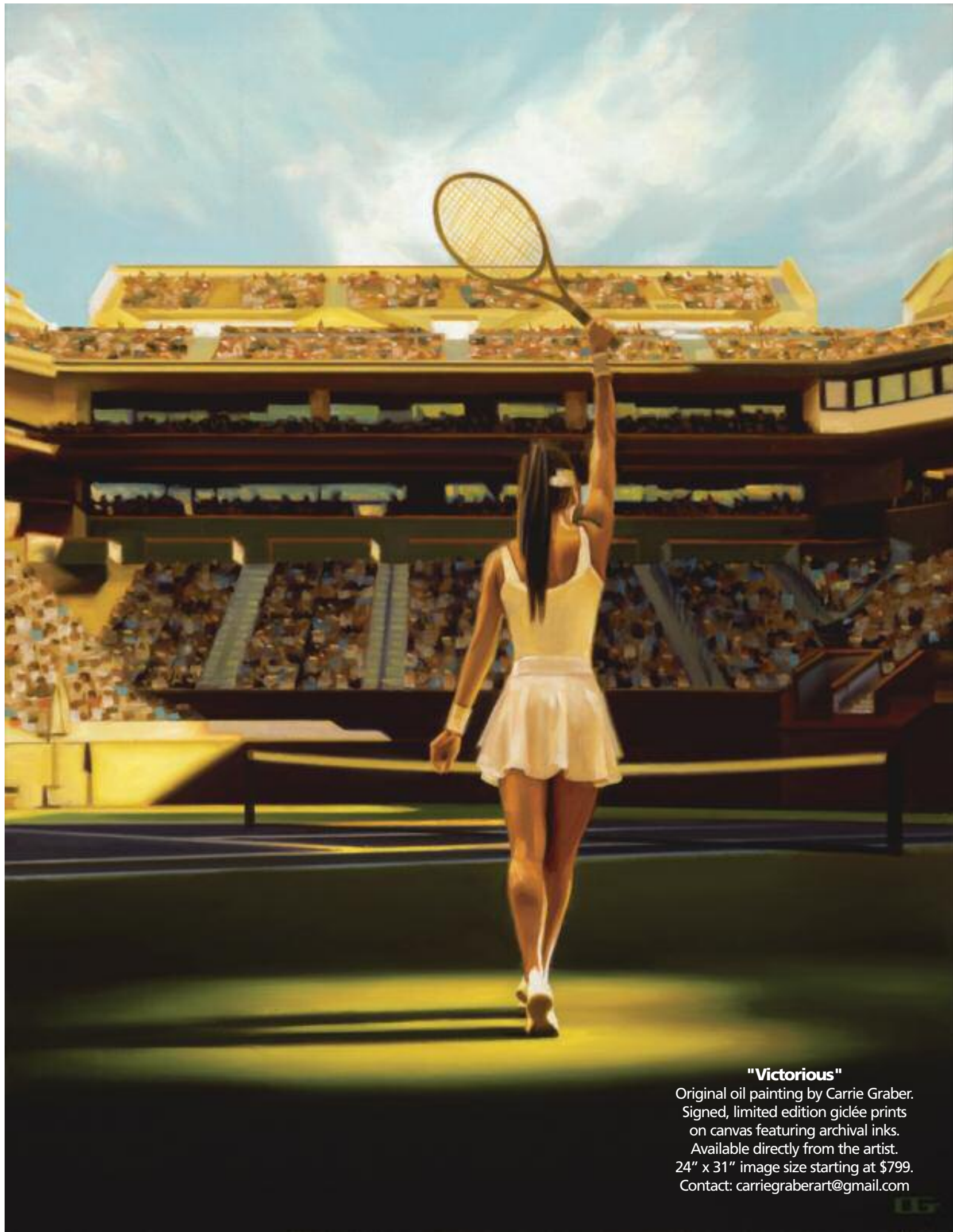
Ashleigh Barty Joins Goolagong Cawley as a Wimbledon Champion

At the same time, as rumors continue to spread about the possibility of a merging between the ATP and WTA Tours, the wide range of talent in women's tennis is considerable too. One of the WTA Tour's rising stars, Ashleigh Barty, enjoyed a remarkable season this year, as she followed in the footsteps of fellow Australian Evonne Goolagong Cawley by claiming the Wimbledon Championships.

As the first Australian woman to win the title since Goolagong Cawley in 1980, as well as the first top seed to win since Serena Williams in 2016, Barty enjoyed her second Grand Slam singles title victory (along with the 2019 French Open), defeating Karolina Plisková in the process.

“The stars aligned for me,” the 25-year-old says. “[It’s] incredible that it happened to fall on the 50th anniversary of Evonne’s first title here too—absolutely incredible.”

She continues, “I think for Australians, there is such a rich history here at Wimbledon. I feel like Wimbledon is where tennis was born.”

Naomi Osaka Claims Her Fourth Grand Slam

Far too often, as athletes and entertainers become more and more successful, fans and media outlets tend to start focusing more on their lives outside of their respective “arenas”, rather than what led to their popularity to begin with: their talents and achievements. Despite the constant focus that’s been on her, Naomi Osaka continued to let her talents do the talking, so to speak, as she won her fourth Grand Slam singles title in four seasons.

Defeating Jennifer Brady 6-4, 6-3 in the finals of the 2021 Australian Open, Osaka won a Grand Slam for the fourth consecutive year, as she enjoyed victory at the first Grand Slam event of the season for the second time in her career (she previously won it in 2019, and also won the US Open in 2018 and 2020). Additionally, she joined Roger Federer and Monica Seles as the only three players in the Open era to win their first four Grand Slam finals.

“I have this mentality that people don’t remember the runners-up,” the 23-year-old says. “You might, but the winner’s name is the one that’s engraved.”

If her steady performances in recent years, especially in the finals of Grand Slams, are of any indication, tennis fans will likely continue to see her name engraved in trophies for years to come.



Aryna Sabalenka: A Future Singles Star?

As the former world No. 1 in women’s doubles, the 23-year-old Belarusian has enjoyed more success in that format so far, when compared to singles, as she has already claimed two Grand Slam doubles titles: the 2019 US Open and the 2021 Australian Open.

However, as shown by her career high ranking of No. 3 in singles this year, the future is certainly bright for her in that format as well. After all, she has already won 10 singles titles, triumphed at more than 260 singles matches (compared to roughly 130 losses in singles matches) and enjoyed her best result in a Grand Slam singles championship to date this year, as she reached the semifinals of the Wimbledon Championships.

“Everyone can stop everyone,” she explains, while reflecting on the wide array of talent that’s currently competing on the WTA Tour, as various players can win any given week. “I’m just going to focus on my game [and] do the best I can.”

As today’s rising stars continue to “focus on [their] game[s]” and “do the best [they] can”—while also seeking to leave their own marks on the game and its history—there’s no telling how bright the future of tennis will be.

A Merging for the Ages



The potential of a merge between the ATP and WTA Tours seems more likely now than ever before.

Just wondering...am I the only one thinking that now is the time for men's and women's tennis to be united and come together as one?

With that 25-word tweet on April 22, 2020, 20-time Grand Slam singles champion Roger Federer may have changed the world of tennis forever, as the conversations that followed continued to increase until Sky News broke a huge news story—arguably the biggest story in the tennis industry in decades.

According to a revelation from the television news network in June, CVC Capital Partners, a private equity and investment advisory firm based in Luxembourg, has been negotiating about an investment in a potentially game-changing merger: between the ATP and WTA Tours, thereby ultimately fulfilling the wishes of many of the game's greatest players, from Federer to Billie Jean King.

As the former owner of Formula One motor racing, CVC Capital Partners appears to be an ideal investor of the merging, due to its various ties to the sports world. After all, it has also invested in the International Volleyball Federation to launch Volleyball World, an entity that will oversee various tournaments. In addition, according to Front Office Sports, it agreed to a partnership with Six Nations Rugby in March, while also starting negotiations to purchase a stake in the Currie Cup, which is South Africa's domestic rugby union competition.

Prior to the pandemic, the ATP Tour earned roughly \$150 million a year in revenue, whereas the WTA Tour generated approximately half of that amount on an annual basis, according to FanSided. As a result of the potential merge, which is appearing more and more likely, as Sky News has reported the negotiation conversations are at advanced stages, there is no telling how much higher the tours' revenues would rise. If Sky News' reporting provides any indication, the sky is truly the limit.

Providing further evidence of the merger's likelihood, Sky News also revealed that CVC Capital Partners has sought approval from both the ATP Tour's and the WTA Tour's boards as well. And, at the same time, the tours' commercial activities will likely be unified under One Tennis, which the firm will have a minority interest in.

Furthermore, the television news network broke yet another huge story: the combined organization may be led by Mark Webster, who currently serves as the

CEO of ATP Media, the broadcast production and distribution arm of the ATP Tour.

When asked about a potential merging between the ATP Tour and the WTA Tour after Federer's tweet in spring 2020, many leading figures in tennis mentioned that they agreed with his idea overall.

"I think the concept sounds great and I think that is what our goal has been for the last 50 years," says Chris Evert, an 18-time Grand Slam singles champion and current Eurosport analyst. "[50 years ago] Billie Jean King said why can't we play the same circuit? Why can't we play together?"

She continues, "But I think logistically there will be some challenges with equal prize money. I don't think the women would be wanting to play alongside the men if they didn't have equal prize money and I am not sure the men would permit that."

Steve Simon, WTA's CEO, is on board with a potential merger as well, adding that he is "not afraid of the full merger" and that he "never [has] been."

"I would certainly be the first to support it, because I think then you truly have the business and the strategic

principles all aligned, which is what you need to do," he stresses. "Obviously it's a long and winding road to get there, but I think it makes all the sense in the world."

He adds, "It would take time, but conceptually it may not take as long. If you agree on the goal, you can usually get things done quicker."


Andrea Gaudenzi, ATP chairman, also agrees with the concept of the merger, as he mentioned that the "biggest events are combined" and "fans want to see both" tours.

"We belong to the same storytelling, starting in January and ending at the end of the year," he says. "We are working very closely with the WTA."

In a joint statement released in June, the tours added the following: "The ATP and WTA are continually looking for ways to bring the sport closer together in order to provide an enhanced experience for fans, players and tournaments. By working together, we believe there may be significant opportunities ahead."



Celebrating the Original Nine's 50th Anniversary

The Original 9 will be honored at a reception during the 2021 BNP Paribas Open.

During the first-ever fall edition of the BNP Paribas Open, the Original Nine—comprised of seven Americans (Peaches Bartkowicz, Rosie Casals, Julie Heldman, Billie Jean King, Kristy Pigeon, Nancy Richey and Valerie Ziegenfuss) and two Australians (Judy Tegart Dalton and Kerry Melville Reid)—will be celebrated and honored at a reception.

Set to be held at Indian Wells Tennis Garden's banquet room, the reception, known as the Love & Love Tennis Foundation Annalee Thurston Award Reception, is going to be hosted on Sunday, October 10, from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. PT.

Above all else, it will focus on the Original Nine's influence on sports history yet again, as it became the first group to be inducted into the International Tennis Hall of Fame this year. At the same time, the reception will also commemorate the group's 50th anniversary, which actually occurred last year, as the tennis professionals signed \$1 contracts with *World Tennis Magazine* publisher Gladys Heldman on September 23, 1970. The anniversary wasn't celebrated last year though, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, since the group wanted to ensure everyone remained safe and healthy, first and foremost.

With the pandemic in mind, the reception, which will include a dinner, is going to adhere to all COVID-19 guidelines, as it will be limited only to attendees that have been personally invited by the Original 9, including friends, patrons and sponsors.

"We will follow the guidelines issued by Riverside County, as well as the State of California and the BNP Paribas Open itself," says Rosie Casals, Original Nine member and founder of the Love & Love Tennis Foundation. "As of right now, those who have not been

vaccinated will not be allowed into the grounds. Proof of vaccination must be provided for entry."

As Casals and the rest of the Original 9 prepare for the reception, they're especially looking forward to the social aspect of the gathering.

"I can't wait to finally gather and celebrate with our friends, many for the first time since the pandemic began," Casals stresses. "I'm also excited about enjoying the BNP Paribas Open and Indian Wells Tennis Garden."

At the same time, the group will also be reflecting on its overall impact on the tennis industry—ever since all nine members decided to defy the old establishment (the International Tennis Foundation (ITF) and the United States Tennis Association (USTA)) in 1970.

"We changed the course of tennis for everyone; in fact, we changed the course of history in other areas in which women have always been treated unfairly too," Casals states. "I believe—due to our decision to boycott Jack Kramer's Pacific Southwest Open, while also declaring that we wouldn't play unless we had equal prize money—we started a revolution for women's sports. The road to women earning a living in sports began at that time."

She continues, "I'm proud to once again stand with all Original Nine members during our reception as a humble believer that anything is possible when women stand together!"

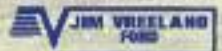

Pete Carlson's Golf & Tennis Celebrates 40 years



Generations of golf and tennis enthusiasts
honor a beloved institution



Golf originated on the coast of Scotland during the 15th century, where golfers would hit a pebble instead of a ball around the sand dunes using a stick. After 1750, golf evolved into the sport we recognize today, and in 1774, Edinburgh golfers wrote the first standardized rules for the game of golf. According to the National Golf Foundation, nearly 25 million people played on a golf course in the United States in 2020.

As for tennis, many historians believe that tennis originated in the monastic cloisters in northern France in the 12th century. Today, tennis is more popular than ever, with participation increasing in 2020 by 22 percent with 21.64 million people hitting the courts, according to a Physical Activity Council (PAC) report.

Pete Carlson's Golf & Tennis has become as much of a fixture in our culture as the games of golf and tennis, especially this year as the highly revered retailer celebrates its 40th anniversary and stands tall as a beacon for devoted shoppers from around the country. According to owner Pete Carlson, friends and players look forward to a store visit upon arrival into the Coachella Valley as their first stop before vacation or a conference. Store excursions are often punctuated by manufacturer representative demo days, in-store fashion shows and jazz performances.

Where they are now is in the clear position of vanguard of all things golf and tennis since 1981, backed by integrity and credibility, as a prototype and regional institution not found elsewhere.

The 14,000 square foot store is a welcome sight along Highway 111 in Palm Desert, with its extensive storefront parking lot (called



"President's Plaza") backing up to the famed El Paseo corridor which came into being around the same time the store was established. When Pete Carlson first opened his space four decades ago, the 2,000 square foot venue was significantly less copious, having undergone multiple expansions and renovations over the years, with the last being completed in 2013.

Carlson said that that was probably their last expansion, given the cap on space at their current location. But the space they occupy now is one that people enjoy just spending time in, shopping or not. It's both cozy and spacious, with the charm of a mid-century building and the familiarity of a friendly neighbor. As the city of Palm Desert nears its completion of upgrading its commercial and business landscape, Carlson feels that a visit to his store will be even more enhanced as a destination experience.

As Carlson says, the 40-year mark is more of an achievement than a one time-event. Carlson noted, "A visit to our store is a one stop shopping experience. People often come in for a pack of tees or a can of tennis balls, and once they see the extensive selection and become a part of the exceptional service and immaculately



organized surroundings, they leave loaded down with a lot more.”

The six different departments in the store feature an overwhelming inventory of golf and tennis equipment, footwear and apparel, with all the top brands. Displays include over 2,500 golf clubs, thousands of golf balls and golf gloves, range finders, pull carts, travel covers, extensive apparel with over 50 name brand apparel lines, over 1,500 pairs of men’s and women’s golf shoes and over 1,000 pair of tennis shoes. There’s even equipment for pickle ball which continues to attract players on courts around the valley. Carlson points out that many of the women’s athletic attire brands easily make the transition to everyday wear, especially with the ever-popular Jamie Sadock and Fila.

The store also stocks over 250 tennis racquets, and an in-house repair service for

golf and tennis equipment is offered. Patrons can often be seen stopping in for refurbishment of golf club grips and restringing of tennis racquets by the expertly trained technical staff.

Carlson is quick to emphasize that an enormous part of the establishment’s success is due to his wife Edna, whom he says serves as the “backbone of the business.” Carlson says that she is masterful at taking care of the myriad behind-the-scenes operations that the public doesn’t always see. Both Edna and Pete Carlson and their long-time staff enjoy interacting with customers and being hands-on in the store on a daily basis.

The BNP Paribas Open tennis tournament is a special time of year for the store, bringing in lots of visitors. The Carlsons look forward to hosting tennis manufacturing representatives for in-store

“demo days” with possible in-store player appearances during the tournament.

Many people also know the name Pete Carlson for his love and support of jazz music. For 10 consecutive years, Pete and Edna Carlson have hosted world class musicians to perform in their live annual jazz concert series. They help benefit the American Jazz Institute, a 501 (c)(3) non-profit with its own local affiliated jazz radio station in Palm Desert. They also benefit the Heat Wave Jazz and Show Band, part of the music program of The Boys and Girls Club of the Coachella Valley, whose members perform a seasonal monthly concert at the store.

The success of Pete Carlson’s Golf & Tennis is a 40-year milestone that crosses generations of families who consider the store “home.” Many loyalists will pay a visit to the store, following in the honored footsteps of their parents and grandparents to continue the tradition of dressing, looking and playing their best on and off the golf course and tennis court.

As Carlson says of the store’s ruby anniversary, serving the community and improving the quality of life here, “I really can’t think of a better measure of the test of time for such a significant achievement.” Neither can we.

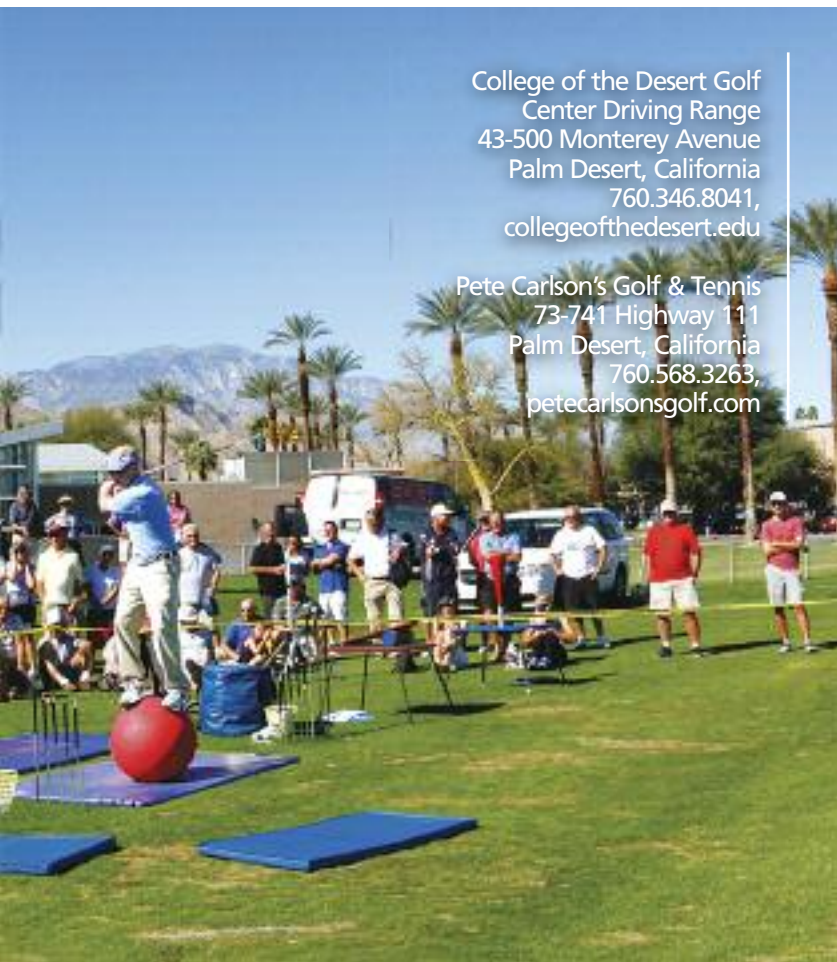

Golf Instruction

Chipping

Chipping to "RANDOM TARGETS"

Welcome back to the Desert! Let's dust off our basic golf skills around the green & start lowering our golf scores!

Chipping is the basic golf skill that can feel like you can improve on very rapidly. Today's golf tip is describing the definition of (Chipping vs Pitching) & giving you a "RANDOM" chipping drill that you will love!

Many golfers feel confused on the golf words / definitions. Let's get that clarified today.

Chipping definition is: a low running shot (typically used around a green or under a tree). Most golfers use 8 iron – SW as a

club selection for "CHIPPING". The ball typically travels (1/3 in the "AIR" & 2/3 in the "roll out / release").

Pitching definition is: a higher more "LOFTED SHOT". Pitching feels like an "under hand TOSS or a "under hand volley at the net in tennis". The Pitch goes 2/3 in the air & 1/3 on the ground. A typical pitch shot is "over something : like over a "bunker" or over "water". Most golfers might choose a "SW (56* of loft) or a LOB wedge (60* of loft). The pitch shot typically makes a "pitch mark" in the green, hence where the shot gets its name (the name of the shot does NOT have to be the name of the CLUB USED).



Chipping Set up & Swing Keys:

"THREE LEFTS" (set up keys)

1) Start with your set up with your feet together. Then "step LEFT" & a tad open = the ball position will now be on your back foot (or your right foot). The ball position in the back will help you hit down on the ball & help the ball roll or release (the club selection & how far back in your stance determines how much that ball rolls to the target).

2) Weight LEFT: 80% of your weight should be on your LEFT. This promoted a good feeling contact & helps you hit DOWN. Once you set your weight to the LEFT – stay there in the take away, then the follow through go "LEFT" – weight shift onto the LEFT FOOT!

3) Handle / grip: lean to the LEFT. In chipping the grip needs to feel forward of the ball position for clean feeling contact.



Chipping: (Swing Keys)

- 1) Hit down
- 2) Set your weight left & don't move!
- 3) Small feeling swing (10-2pm) keep the club head below the waist (especially for a 10,20,30 yards chip)
- 4) Small feeling "speed or pace" (same pace as parking your car in the garage!)
- 5) Keep the face of the bade toward the target (don't release the face of the club)
- 6) The back of the LEFT palm "always faces where you want the ball to go (NO FLIPPING!)



Chipping DRILL: (3 Random Targets)

- 1) Today I did a random drill (10,20,30 yard targets)
- 2) I used alignment rods & walked them off (headcovers on top of the alignment sticks for easier view / to feel the target better)
- 3) I like to start 1 ball at each distance: 10 yards, then 20, then 30
- 4) Random drills are just that (make up games, make up targets)
- 5) Repetition drills are (30-100 balls at the same target) – that is skill building
- 6) Mix it up – create RANDOM DRILLS which test your "skills & creates a more live situation"

The Coachella Valley Arena

Just one sign the valley is poised to become a mega sports and entertainment destination

If you've been living in total isolation without access to news or have otherwise missed one of the hottest topics involving the Coachella Valley in years, the valley is getting a hockey team. A professional hockey team. It's not a National Hockey League (NHL) team, but it's close. The American Hockey League (AHL), a developmental league for the NHL, awarded its 32nd franchise to the Coachella Valley. The new team is slated to take the ice for the 2022/2023 season at the Coachella Valley Arena. It will be an official affiliate of the NHL's Seattle Kraken.

After two years of discussion and much local anticipation, developers of the planned, multi-purpose 10,000-seat indoor arena put shovels in the ground on June 2, 2021. The \$250 million, 300,000-



square-foot arena is set on 43.35 acres of unincorporated land near Palm Desert, between Interstate 10 and the Classic Club golf course. The arena will be home not only to the new AHL franchise hockey team but will also be an entertainment venue ready to host a variety of concerts and other live events. It's designed to attract new sports stars, entertainment celebrities and fans to the Coachella Valley.

Equally important, it will have an immediate positive economic impact on the valley, providing hundreds of temporary and permanent jobs.

Back in May 2019 there were rumors that the Palm Springs area might become home to a new hockey franchise. Weeks later, Oak View Group (OVG), the Los Angeles, California-based sports and entertainment company, announced a partnership with Live Nation to build an arena. The original site was in downtown Palm Springs, also in partnership with the Agua Caliente Band of Cahuilla Indians. That union ultimately fell through and COVID hit. The date for a 2020 groundbreaking came and went and the decision was made to move the site of the arena to its current location.

Throughout 2020 and the first five months of 2021, Oak View Group, which

is involved in stadium and arena projects across the United States, never wavered from its determination to bring a new sports and entertainment arena to the Coachella Valley. The star power at the groundbreaking ceremony is testament to the commitment behind this project. Among those present were Tim Leiweke, CEO of Oak View Group; Irving Azoff, music mogul and founding partner of



OVG; Paul Tollett, president and CEO of Goldenvoice; entrepreneur and philanthropist Harold Matzner; Robert Moon, former mayor of Palm Springs; V. Manuel Perez, Riverside County Supervisor; Paul Rodgers of Bad Company fame; and rock-and-roll legend and member of the Eagles, Joe Walsh. Completion of the arena is slated for fourth quarter 2022—just in time for the start the 2022 hockey season.

Azoff is no stranger to the Coachella Valley. He owns a home at the well-guarded and gated Madison Club and is an avid golfer thanks to his longtime friendship with the late Glen Frey of the Eagles, one of the many A-list groups Azoff managed throughout his career. In the Eagles' later years, Frey reportedly scheduled tour dates in places where he wanted to play golf, much to the annoyance of his fellow bandmembers.

Azoff is also former CEO and chairman of Ticketmaster Entertainment and was executive chairman of Live Nation Entertainment. In January 2020, he was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame. Feared, disliked and also greatly admired in the music industry, Azoff is a visionary who brings that same bulldog tenacity and determination to Oak View Group projects, including the Coachella Valley Arena. They will build it, and hockey stars and entertainment luminaries will come.

In addition to seating for 9,918 hockey fans, the arena, which will likely sport a new name once a sponsor signs on, will have 10,815 seats for basketball and other sporting events, as well as up to 11,679 seats for concerts, according to design specs currently available. The lower area will seat about 8,000. There will also be 20 suites accommodating seating for up to 20 in each suite, a private club that can hold 145, a pair of VIP clubs accommodating up to 80 each, and a premium concourse club that will seat nearly 600. It's reported that bars will be located on each side of the stage during live entertainment events.

Tickets are part of a membership program. Members have access to all regular-season home AHL games and to exclusive

member-only events. Patrons can choose general-seat, club-seat or suite-holder memberships. Club seating includes access to a premium club with high-end food and beverage offerings and pre- and post-game access. Memberships are available by placing a deposit with long-term OVG partner Ticketmaster.

Hockey, of course, isn't the only game in town. The Coachella Valley is becoming a baseball hotbed. In fact, 11 Major League Baseball (MLB) players have a valley connection. Several organizations are bringing baseball talent front and center in Palm Springs.

POWER baseball was back in full swing this summer, and the California Winter League (CWL) is back as well, both at Palm Springs Stadium. The POWER organization gives elite college athletes a chance to display their skills each night during the June/July season, not just for fans but also for professional scouts. During the day, the Palm Springs Collegiate League is in play, a league in which players can develop and advance their skills. Many of the participants receive commitments from colleges and a few go on to the MLB draft.

Come winter, the California Winter League showcases the talents of professional free-agent players from around the globe who want to be seen by Major League scouts, coaches and instructors and who hope to receive lucrative contracts. About half of CWL participants do just that, making the league prime—and affordable—viewing for baseball fans who want to see up-and-coming MLB stars in action.

Hockey, baseball, top-tier concerts and entertainment—the Coachella Valley has it all. And with the new Coachella Valley Arena, it's only going to get better.

Nobu

It's a sure bet that many of the A-listers who frequent Nobu restaurants in cities around the U.S. will also be seen at the Indian Wells outpost, ensuring that patrons can still delight in some of the best cuisine in the world while attending the Tournament. Delicacies like crispy rice with spicy tuna, squid pasta with light garlic sauce and lamb chops with miso anticucho sauce will keep guests and their tastebuds content during their stay in Indian Wells.

Celebrity chef Nobuyuki "Nobu" Matsuhisa rose to prominence in the late 1980s with his fusion cuisine blending traditional Japanese dishes with Peruvian ingredients. His first

Nobu restaurant opened in New York, and today he boasts satellite establishments throughout the big apple as well as in Malibu, Los Angeles, Las Vegas, Scottsdale, Palo Alto, Newport Beach and Miami. He has restaurants bearing his name in several countries. Selections are one of a kind, such as lobster with wasabi pepper sauce, Jidori free range chicken, teriyaki salmon filet, prime filet mignon, breaded tiger shrimp and many others.

Hot special dishes open new horizons for diners, including tuna tempura roll with yuzu miso sauce, king crab tempura with amazu jalapeno, uni or white fish oil yaki, U.S. Kobe beef short rib, Wagyu dumpling or chicken truffle dumpling, buckwheat soba risotto, limestone lettuce with rock shrimp and scallop and so many more.

Cold special dishes are another revelation, with options such as Inaniwa pasta with lobster or king crab, kanpachi agua de chile, scallops with mayonnaise in an orange, salmon kelp roll, halibut wasabi ceviche, ankimo (monkfish liver paté) with caviar, sashimi tacos and a world of other taste treats.

One of Spago's most famous and beloved concoctions is the pizza with house cured smoked Scottish salmon, topped with red onion, dill crème fraîche, chives and salmon roe. Other favorite "mains" include spicy big eye tuna tartare cones with sesame-ginger tuile, chili aioli wasabi, tasa soy and daikon sprouts, Keluga caviar rye tart with yolk jam, chives and Meyer lemon custard and grilled 36 ounce USDA Prime côte de boeuf with pommes aligot and Armagnac-green peppercorn sauce.

The wine list is curated to perfection. Cocktails also hit the sweet spot, with selections such as barrel aged Negroni (gin, Campari and sweet vermouth aged in solera since 2014), Garden of Eden (passionfruit black tea infused vodka and lemon), Pepino's revenge (El Tesoro Blanco, cucumber, basil and lime), Alito's way (Don Julio Reposado, Aperol and lemon), samurai sword (Hibiki Harmony whisky, ginger, honey and lemon) and many others that will redefine "tennis paradise" for every spectator following the action on Stadium I.

Desserts should not be skipped, with offerings such as strudel with Fair Hill Farm apples with whipped cream and caramel sauce, dark chocolate soufflé with Madagascar vanilla gelato, crème fraîche and Complexité Guittard chocolate and Cara-Cara olive oil cake with orange flower water, candied pistachios and yogurt.

Puck's food has won a continuous string (coincidentally the meaning of "Spago") since he first emerged on the cuisine scene. In 1993, Spago Hollywood (at its original location) was inducted into the Nation's Restaurant News Fine Dining Hall of Fame. The next year it received the James Beard Restaurant of the Year Award. Spago Beverly Hills received a James Beard Foundation Outstanding Service Award in 2005. It was awarded two Michelin stars in the 2008 and 2009 Los Angeles Michelin Guide.

For the record, the service is as exceptional as the food, and there's no doubt Spago at the BNP is the place to see and be seen. You'll thank yourself later for a wise dining decision indeed. wolfgangpuck.com/dining/spago

765LT Spider,

Want One? Get in Line





McLaren's new 765LT Spider isn't one of a kind, it's one of 765 — but who's counting? This is the company's most powerful convertible ever put into production. Only 765 units will be produced and every one of the 765 vehicles has a line of buyers waiting to get a crack at ownership.

At a starting price of \$388,000 and change, this supercar is in rare company. Its price and performance set the bar for the class and it looks every bit the part. McLaren knows how to make a stunning machine and the 765LT is no exception. The Spider gives drivers a convertible option that makes the car as exciting as it is fast.

Aerodynamics not only make the car fast, they give it a sleek, mean look. Its rear window lowers to let in the engine notes and streamline things a bit more. Engineers do everything they can to keep the car from launching into the stratosphere through downforce-inducing dampers. For years McLaren has worked to perfect the art of molding carbon fiber into car frames. The 765LT essentially is a one-piece carbon frame. The stiffness of the coupe allowed for very little re-engineering to accommodate the drop top.

The retractable top is constructed using a single carbon fiber frame. Noise-reducing foam fills the panel and the internal headliner. This removes mass from the upper section of the car as well as reducing the volume of unwanted noise inside the cabin. It also creates more headroom than the coupe. McLaren claims that the roof mechanism sets records as one of the world's quickest and quietest. Push a button and the roof can be opened or closed in just 11 seconds.

The carbon fiber also reduces weight. The 765LT Spider has a dry weight of under 2,900 pounds. That's 500 pounds less than a Lamborghini Huracan and 400 pounds under a Ferrari 488 spider. It's punching way above its weight class though when it comes to the numbers.

This 4.0-liter V-8 engine eats muscle cars for breakfast and German roadsters for dessert. Twin turbo chargers team up like super heroes with a seven-speed dual-clutch

automatic transmission. The resulting 755 horsepower and jarring torque will have you happily paying your chiropractor to put you back in line after you snap your head back coming off every green light in town.

All this naturally leads to a mind-numbing zero to 60 mph in just 2.7 seconds and a top speed of 205 mph. You'll cover the quarter mile in 10 seconds. Warning: Don't try this with the top down. McLaren states you can operate the top at up to 31 mph, but who would ever go that slow in this beast? Better to just put the top down and drive.

Inside the cabin a simple design focuses everything on the road ahead, at 200 mph drivers can't be bothered with bells and whistles like radios and air conditioning. Of course, those features are likely to be optioned in for most owners.

McLaren lets drivers adjust transmission and suspension characteristics using the Comfort, Sport and Track mode settings. The 765LT's transmission increases driver control by way of a new function called "limit downshift". In previous versions of a McLaren transmission, drivers would not have the ability to down



shift if that maneuver would over-rev the engine. Now, the LT transmission software acknowledges the shift request and changes gear as soon as engine speed and road speed permit. The process also creates audible drama by momentarily allowing the engine to “bounce” off the rev limiter. That bounce will sound badass and probably frightening considering it’s the sound of 755 horses screaming at once.

McLarens are all attention getters. From the scissor doors to the aggressive

front-end, you aren’t going unnoticed in this beauty. The 765LT Spider takes this up a notch and likely creates a stir when you pull into your local 7-11 for a Slurpee. It isn’t just the driver that feels their heart racing around the 765LT, even onlookers get the chills.

This may not be the most practical vehicle you can purchase but it may be the most fun you’ll ever have getting from point A to point B. Launching from traffic light to interstate on-ramp will give you

visions of Formula 1 prowess. The responsiveness and limitless possibilities make this a dream car for 765 lucky owners.
