By Matt McKay Making it on the Champions Tour Scott McCarron Is finding a new, laid-back success on the senior circuit "On the PGA Tour Champions, I feel like if I play well I can play anywhere."

Life for Scott McCarron these days is just, well, less intense.





"It's going pretty good. I'm very fortunate to be 54 years old and still playing the sport I love for a living," he says. "The Champions Tour has been absolutely fantastic for me. I'm having a great time playing against all these legend golfers, guys I grew up watching and got to play a lot with on tour. To have a 20-year career on the PGA Tour, then keep playing golf for a living after 50 is something pretty

The senior circuit's schedule is a factor. McCarron is still a young whipper-snapper on the Champions Tour, which also helps. Financial security, thanks to his play thus far on the Champions Tour, is a massive plus. The kids are gone, which frees up time and

But it's the laid-back nature of the tour McCarron likes most. It's helped to fuel his career and make life easier in general.

"I think the big difference is, the PGA Tour was a little more cutthroat," McCarron says. "You know, you're teeing it up every week with 156 guys, new guys are coming in every year and they're trying to take your job. You're playing for your livelihood, you're



playing for your career, your mortgage, getting kids through college, all that."

Once you get to the Champions Tour, he continues, "Most of the time all the kids are gone out of the house. I'm playing against 78 guys each week, we're playing three rounds with no cut so it's a little bit different. It's a little more laid back, a little more relaxed in that

On the PGA Tour, he says, "You always knew you were going into a tournament, but you never knew if you were going to miss the cut or when you were going out. On the Champions Tour, it's more of a set schedule. I know when I get to come in and I know when I get to go out," he adds.

McCarron was always competitive on both tours, nabbing 19 worldwide wins since turning pro out of UCLA in 1992. Like many regular tour players crossing over into the senior division, McCarron felt he had the potential to make hay early on.

And he did. McCarron has 11 wins over the first three-and-ahalf years of his Champions Tour career. He says the financial

benefits have helped him remain relaxed and put him in position to take his senior career to the next level. He has beefed up his workouts and modified his practice regimen in an effort to achieve even loftier goals.

"I've had a good enough career already on the Champions Tour that I've made enough money and had enough wins to be set for as long as I want to keep playing out here, which is really nice. On the PGA Tour, you never knew, year in and year out," McCarron says. "You were always trying to keep your tour card, and whenever you had some 'free seasons' where you knew you were going to keep your card, it was because you'd won a couple of times and gotten some exemptions."

On the Champions Tour, however, McCarron knows he's good to go. "I can play year in and year out no matter how I play, and that takes a little bit of that edge off. Now I'm trying to win Schwab Cups and majors and just trying to be the best I can be out there."

McCarron currently resides in Mooresville, North Carolina, about 20 minutes outside Charlotte, near Lake Norman. He lived in La Quinta for eight years before moving back east, and says the move was predicated by his desire to have more recreational options once golf rounds and practice time were over.

McCarron's girls, Courtney, 24, and Cassidy, 22, are grown and gone; he's remarried to wife Jenny, with the two exchanging vows at the 2016 Bass Pro Shops Legends of Golf event in Ridgedale, Mo. They both love to travel (he's a licensed pilot) and she's now a regular on tour with him.

If she's been a good luck charm for him during his senior career, he'll want that luck to continue as he barrels toward a potential 2019 Schwab Cup title. Some of the events left on the schedule are among his favorite on tour. But these days, things are going so well that where McCarron tees up from week to week is almost irrelevant.

"I'd say on the PGA Tour I felt like I had a good chance every time I went to certain places," he says. "On the PGA Tour Champions, I feel like if I play well I can play anywhere."





There's no doubt about it. The summer 2019 tennis season was one for the ages. From up-and-coming stars making their presence known on the global stage to longstanding champions making history (yet again), this was one of the most memorable summers in recent memory. Some might call it one of the greatest summers in tennis history.

Here are the moments that made summer 2019 so special.



Cori "Coco" GauffStuns Wimbledon Fans.

Prior to becoming the youngest player in history to qualify for Wimbledon's main draw, where she ultimately reached the fourth round defeating one of her idols, Venus Williams, in the process, Coco Gauff was already on her way to becoming a household

A former world No. 1 junior, she won a junior Grand Slam singles title and finished runner-up in the 2017 U.S. Open girls' singles event—the youngest finalist in that tournament's history. Inspired to play tennis after watching Serena Williams capture the 2009 Australian Open, Gauff has shown vast potential over the vears, potential that would be fully realized during the 2019 Wimbledon Championships. Gauff's popularity seemed to rise with each of her victories. Her four matches were the mostwatched on ESPN during those days.

"I won't step on the court unless I think I can win," Gauff says. She's the youngest woman to win a Wimbledon match since Jennifer Capriotti in 1991. "My tennis dream is to be the greatest of all time. Anything is possible at any age."

Nadal Wins His Record 12th French Open.

For the second straight year, Rafael Nadal dueled Dominic Thiem in the finals of the French Open men's singles championship. And, just like 2018, the same result was recorded vet another victory for Nadal. This time, however, history was made as Nadal broke the record for the most singles titles won by a player at the same Grand Slam tournament. Prior to June 9, he had shared the record with Margaret Court, who won the Australian Open 11 times.

Nadal ultimately won the 3-hour, 1-minute match 6-3, 5-7, 6-1 and 6-1. In all, 46 points went 10 strokes or more as each competitor claimed half of them. As a result of the remarkable achievement, Nadal has now won three consecutive French Opens and is only two Grand Slam victories away from tying Roger Federer's all-time record of 20. In addition, his career record at Roland Garros is now 93-2—a statistic that may never be surpassed.

"I can't explain my emotions," Nadal said after the match. "Congrats to Dominic. He deserves [a win] here, too. He has an unbelievable intensity."





The Balkans Shine at Wimbledon.

After completing one of the most memorable, if not the most memorable, singles finals in Wimbledon history, Novak Djokovic won his second straight Wimbledon Championships, defeating Roger Federer 7-6, 1-6, 7-6, 4-6 and 13-12. Lasting four hours and 57 minutes, the singles final was the longest in Wimbledon history.

Djokovic has now won 16 Grand Slam singles titles, while Federer remains a 20-time Grand Slam singles title champion, eight of which are Wimbledon victories. In addition to the hope of extending his record of Grand Slam singles victories, Federer was also striving to become the oldest man in the Open era (37 years and 340 days old) to win a Grand Slam singles title.

"I hope I give some other people a chance to believe at 37 it's not over yet. I had my chances, [but] Novak was great," Federer says.

Djokovic, whose record at Wimbledon is now 72-10 (Federer has won 101 matches at Wimbledon), says, "I never stopped



believing, even though I was very close to losing—two match points down. But I managed to find my best tennis when it mattered most."

At the same time, Simona Halep became the first Romanian woman to win a singles final championship in Wimbledon history, leading to yet another record: For the first time in Wimbledon history, two Balkans won the championship the same week. By defeating Serena Williams, who was striving to win an all-time record 24th Grand Slam singles title, 6-2, 6-2 in 56 minutes, Halep proved that nothing is impossible.

"We don't have a grass court in Romania, [so] I never thought [I could] win on grass with all these players that are very tall and serving with a lot of power," Halep says. "That was the match of my

This summer, Cori "Coco" Gauffentered the All England Lawn Tennis and Croquet Club as a virtual unknown, a 15-year-old with all the potential in the world yet not much recognition for it, aside from the most ardent tennis fans.

That all changed by the time she left the 2019 Wimbledon Championships. After becoming the youngest woman to win a Wimbledon match in 28 years, eventually reaching the fourth round, she was no longer just a prodigy. She was a household name, a superstar in the making that became popular faster than nearly any other star in the making. Her four matches were the mostwatched on ESPN during the days they were played.

So when Gauff prepared to compete against World No. 1 Naomi Osaka during the third round of the U.S. Open, more than 23,000 fans knew they were about to witness history in-person. They just weren't aware how yet.

The match wasn't quite what most had expected. In a little over an hour, Osaka won 6-3, 6-0 to continue her title defense and pursue her third Grand Slam singles title, and second of the year as she had already won the Australian Open. Although the match wasn't as exciting or memorable as everyone had hoped, the moments that followed may very well be remembered for years to come. In fact, they may have changed the future of the sport.

After coming up short in her quest to qualify for the fourth round of yet another major, Gauff, the youngest player to advance to the U.S. Open's third round in 23 years, became quite emotional. Unable to hide the tears, she was quickly embraced by Osaka, who seemed to sense that she needed to be comforted. And then to the shock of the crowd, Osaka asked Gauff to join her during the postmatch on-court interview with ESPN's Mary Joe Fernandez.

At first reluctant to join Osaka for the interview, Gauff eventually relented as she was told it would be much better to cry with her than by herself in the locker room. Before long, both players were in tears as they spoke to Fernandez, each other and certain members of the crowd.

"She did amazing, and I'm going to learn a lot from this match." Gauff said. "She's been so sweet to me, so thank you for this. Thank

Osaka then turned toward Gauff's parents and spoke directly to

"You guys raised an amazing player. I remember I used to see you guys—I don't want to cry—I remember I used to see you guys training in the same place as us," said Osaka, who, like Gauff, lives in Florida. "And for me, the fact that both of us made it and we're both still working as hard as we can, I think it's incredible. And I think you guys are amazing. I think, Coco, you're amazing."

The hugs, the tears, the honesty, the vulnerability—it all caught the tennis world by surprise. It led to immediate praise from the game's former and current greats, and stirred a sense of optimism and hope for the future of the game that simply can't be explained. Gauff summed it up best during her news conference afterward.

"She really showed sportsmanship tonight. I'm glad I was able to experience that moment. She proved she's a true athletesomeone who on the court treats you like [her] worst enemy but off the court can be your best friend."

Defeats Serena Williams for a History-making Grand Slam title



The win at Flushing Meadows was the shot heard 'round the world, so to speak. Nineteen-vear old Bianca Andreescu is the tennis star who defeated Serena Williams in the nailbiting U.S. Open finals match on September 7, in a rollercoaster 6-3, 7-5 win, and the first Canadian player to win a grand slam title at the tournament. Let's say that again: Andreescu is the first Canadian ever, male or female, to win the Grand Slam trophy at the U.S. Open in her main-draw tournament debut in the Open era, which started in 1968 when professionals were allowed into grand slam tournaments. She has only participated in four majors in her brief

She's also the first player born in the 2000s to win a major and the youngest grand slam winner since Maria Sharapova at the 2006 U.S. Open. Andreescu's match-up against Williams, 37, Williams would have tied her with Margaret Court, the only player in history with 24 grand slam singles titles.

Despite withdrawing from Wimbledon earlier this year due to a shoulder injury, Andreescu recovered and dominated throughout the U.S. Open. She's currently ranked No. 15 and managed to take down Katie Volynets, Kirsten Flipkens and Caroline Wozniacki throughout the tournament.

So, who is Bianca Andreescu? She lives in Toronto, her nickname is Bibi and she speaks Romanian fluently. She was born in Mississauga, Ontario, Canada, to Romanian parents who moved to Canada in 1994. She started playing tennis at age 7 when her family moved back to her parents' native Romania. When she was 11 years old, she joined Tennis Canada's National Training Program in Toronto, after her family moved back to Canada.



represented the largest age gap in a grand slam final, and it came almost exactly 20 years to the day since Williams won the U.S. Open for her first major title in 1999, a year before Andreescu

The tennis phenom has even earned her own slogan, often with a hashtag in front of it: "She the North," a riff on the Toronto Raptors' "We the North" from earlier this year following their NBA championship win.

Her youthful accomplishment is noteworthy on its own, but what's really catapulted spectators up out of their box seats is that she has handed Williams her fourth consecutive defeat in the final of a major to again deny Williams a 24th grand slam title. That's history-making and jaw-dropping, especially since such a title for

Her tennis career can be traced to 2014, when she won the prestigious Les Petits As. Andreescu began the 2015 season by winning both the singles and doubles titles at the Grade-2 tournament in La Paz. She also began working with former World No. 3 Nathalie Tauziat, who previously coached Canadian Eugenie Bouchard. Andreescu was named the 2015 Outstanding Junior Female by Tennis Canada. At the 2016 Rogers Cup, she was encouraged by player Simona Halep to turn professional.

In 2017, she advanced to the semifinals at the junior event of the Australian Open and won the doubles title with Carson Branstine. At the Citi Open in August that year, she defeated Camila Giorgi in the opening round, her first win on the WTA Tour. In her next match, she upset World No. 13 Kristina Mladenovic, becoming the



first player born in the 2000s to beat a Top 20 player.

In 2018, she continued with a steady performance; however, a back injury forced her out of tournaments until November. As we now know, her breakout year proved to be 2019. She won her first WTA 125K title at Newport Beach in

January, bumping her to a career-high ranking of No. 68 and passing Eugenie Bouchard to become Canada's top-ranked player.


Andreescu had a breakout tournament at the Indian Wells Premier Mandatory event, part of the 2019 BNP Paribas Open, where she won her first WTA tour title, vaulting her to No. 24. She took to the court for the second Grand Slam of the year at the French Open, playing as the 22nd seed.

Many observers assess her play as creative and powerful. She's been practicing meditation since she was 12 years old, believing it helps her mental discipline on the court.

Whatever she's doing for motivation, it's brought her to that sweet moment when she was able to accept the champion's check for \$3.85 million. We would say, "Remember her name," but that's hardly necessary. We're sure we'll be hearing a lot about Bianca Andreescu from here on out, as she pumps her fists all the way to the bank and into sports history.



Now 87 years old, Dante is as active as ever, having recently taken a trip to Italy to visit the land of his roots. As an up-and-coming baseball star back in the golden era of the 1950s, his life was a busy one. He's yet to slow down.

It all started for Dante in 1950 in Stamford, Connecticut. As shortstop for the Stamford High School team, he was MVP of the New England Newspaper League, which Stamford won. The Boston Braves signed him to a \$6,000 contract right out of high school. Dante immediately rewarded his parents.


"They couldn't sign me alone because I was underage. So they had to sign me in the presence of my parents at home in Stamford," Dante said. "So, I signed for \$6,000, which was, back then, the equivalent of being a first-round draft pick. And the first thing I did was buy my parents a new car—a four-door Buick with white walls and a radio. It was \$2,400 with all the options."

Early in his career, Dante began to feel discomfort in his right arm, a condition that worsened without treatment. After having

Tall, dark, and handsome, Dante quickly found himself doing Somebody Up There Likes Me with Paul Newman. Within six years of his first screen test, he was in the Southern California town of Idyllwild filming the movie Kid Galahad with Elvis Presley—easily the biggest male singing and movie star in the country at the time.

"We become fast friends in the story, and I get him to sing with all the other fighters and myself, I'm the champ of the camp," Dante says. "He sings in every movie he's made and we get him to sing and we had a ball. The name of the song was "This is Living." It was a fun time and Elvis couldn't have been nicer. He was very wellmannered—'Yes sir, no sir, no ma'am.' He was always on time, always knew his dialogue and he was a good athlete. Between shots we'd throw the football. He loved football. It was a joy, we had a great time and it was all filmed in Idyllwild."

Dante continued to perfect his craft and his roles improved accordingly. One of his favorite films, and perhaps his best individual performance, was his lead role in Winterhawk. The



successful surgery on the arm, doctors suggested Dante rehabilitate in a warm climate. He chose to attend the University of Miami in the off-season to work on his drama major as acting was his second love.

In Miami, Dante spent a lot of time with Mickey McDermott, a pitcher for the Boston Red Sox. McDermott happened to be good friends with immensely popular big-band leader Tommy Dorsey, who was a baseball fanatic and loved hanging out with ballplayers. During a tour of the U.S. Southeast in 1954, Dorsey reached out to McDermott to arrange a dinner, and Dante was invited to come along to add his input to the baseball discussion. Dante and Dorsey stayed in contact, and during another dinner the following February, Dorsey told Dante he had "it," and asked if he'd ever considered acting or taking a screen test. Intrigued, Dante consented.

As Dante describes it, he said to Dorsey "You really think I have it, Tom?' Dorsey replied, "You have all the qualities and prerequisites, the rest is up to you. I was under contract with MGM for several years. I could easily arrange a screen test for you and we'll see what happens. After that, you're the boss."

Soon after, Dante went to spring training but his arm wasn't quite ready. "Meanwhile, Tom was calling every couple of days asking for a progress report. I took a two-week leave of absence and joined him in Vegas for a few days. He told me he was heading to LA for a couple of weeks and would arrange a screen test while there. So, I met up with Tommy when he was in LA and tested out at MGM. MGM signed me to a contract and I never went back to baseball."

150 television programs in which he appeared include Days of our Lives, Death Valley Days, Daniel Boone, The Big Valley, General Hospital, Get Smart, Knots Landing, Perry Mason, The Six Million Dollar Man and Simon and Simon. His movie portfolio includes Cruise Missile, The Farmer, Operation Bikini, Willard and the cult classic, The Naked Kiss.

A Rancho Mirage resident for 30 years, Dante has also been active in philanthropic work in the Coachella Valley, including his namesake golf tournament, which ran for eight years, and his tennis

"We've done a lot of things for this desert that we're really proud of," he says. "We love living here. We love to travel, but we always love coming home."

Most recently, Dante has been putting pen to paper. He's just completed his third book, Six Rode Home, documenting the post-Civil War lives of six soldiers.

"What inspired me was it applies to the beginning of war, when soldiers went out to fight, survived and then they came home. There was always a sixth sense about the insecurities, the doubts, the fears, about what to expect when they get home after being gone—in this case for four years without any communication, maybe a letter or two. And now they're going home but to what? These are the same emotions soldiers have gone through since the beginning of time, just the names and places change."

In May, the 3rd Annual Anthony Anderson Celebrity Golf Classic raised nearly \$500,000 for the star's charitable foundation, which benefits a host of organizations including Children's Hospital Los Angeles, Boys & Girls Club of America, Compton Jr. Posse Youth Equestrians, Compton Initiative, The Black Academy of Arts & Letters, Children Striving Together, Compassion for Teen Life, Inc. and others. There's an emphasis on supporting inner-city organizations that benefit underprivileged youth.

Of course, Anderson doesn't do all this alone. Lexus signed on as the presenting sponsor, and other sponsors included YES, Diageo, Novo, Brand Jordan, Others First, Artists First and Jim Wilkes. And then there were the 150 celebrities from the sports and entertainment industries who gathered at exclusive Bighorn Golf Club in Palm Desert to take on the Canyon Course and raise money in the process.

In attendance were George Lopez, Smokey Robinson, rapper Schoolboy Q, Ozzie Smith, NBA All-Star Chris Paul, NBA Hall of Famer James Worthy, NBA coach Doc Rivers, former MLB star Dave Winfield, pro golfer Lee Elder and many others.


The two-day event started off on Sunday evening, May 19 with a VIP reception and pairings party held at Canyons Steak House at Bighorn Golf Club. It was followed by a private VIP Celebrity Cigar Lounge event hosted by Anderson and friends.

The next day it was all about golf, but fun, laughter and, most important, significant charitable giving to Anderson's foundation, were all part of the event, which lived up to its mission of providing support for causes important to the actor.

Anderson pledged support for Children's Hospital LA when he served as an interim host of Jimmy Kimmel Live! in early May. The hospital is where Kimmel's son was treated for a rare heart defect.

Another organization that received money from the 2019 Celebrity Golf Classic was Tomorrow's Aeronautical Museum, which provides free flying lessons to underprivileged youth and uses Compton-Woodley Airport as its home base. Since it was established by pilot Robin Petgrave in 1998, Tomorrow's Aeronautical Museum has utilized aviation to engage at-risk youth as an alternative to the negative influences in their environment. Along the way, eight of the young people trained have broken aviation flight records. The museum was presented with a \$10,000 check at the event this year.

Los Angeles Mission, which supports more than 400 homeless individuals, also received support from Anderson's foundation. "A big reason for this tournament is to help programs in the inner city, to support people in the community who don't always get the help



re you already thinking of planning your golf vacation for next summer? There is much choice to be had and many Line golf resorts/venues scattered around the world. One of the most popular, though, is Scotland. Why? Because Scotland has more links golf courses than any other country in the world.

You may ask, what is a 'links course' and why is it so special? Links, developed in Scotland, were the way golf started. Links courses are the tradition of the game. By definition, a genuine links course is a band of land close by the sea. Its topography is typically characterized by dunes and a sandy soil unsuitable for arable farming but which readily supports various indigenous bent and fescue grasses.

Because this land could not support crops, it basically became wasteland destined to be used by farmers for grazing cattle and sheep. In fact, the sheep were the "architects" of many of the early bunkers! They dug into the sandy dunes and created small, depressed sandy areas that afforded them shelter from the prevailing winds and inclement weather. This is the land out of which the old, great links courses were eventually created.

So, where does the name links originate? It is thought that it evolved from the fact that this links wasteland sat between the sea and the local towns—a link, as it were, connecting the sea/sand and town. Fishermen used to cross this thin band of land and, it's thought, to make their walk more interesting, they would hit

pebbles over the ground with a stick. Hence, a very crude version of the game of golf was born.

Most of these original old links remain intact. They were largely built through sand dunes and tended to follow the natural contours of the land. Any dirt-moving could only be attained by men using shovels combined with the use of horses and carts.

Today the scene is very different. There is the opportunity to involve, where necessary, heavy machinery, from large bulldozers and smaller 'dozers, which are used by the shapers, to massive excavators and 50-ton dumper trucks. So, does one always have to use a large amount of machinery to create a modern links? The answer is yes and no. It depends on the topography of the site on which the architect is working.

Ideally, a large site with natural sand dunes is a terrific start. The biggest problem is that most of this type of land is heavily protected these days by environmentalist agencies and local heritage societies. Obtaining a permit to create a golf course can be extremely difficult and often impossible. The alternative is to use a flattish, sandy piece of land by the sea. The architect then crafts new dunes such that, after they grow-in, they will look like they've been there for over 100 years.

There are little more than 40 world-class links in the entire world. Links are rare and their importance cannot be overstated. They are sustainable and ecologically friendly. Scotland is home to at least half of the entire worldwide supply. Scotland has more genuine links than any other country and, with a number of these being world class, Scotland is able to provide an unusually wide choice for the discerning traveling golfer.

When making a golf trip from the United States of a week or longer, it's likely that a golfer or group want to visit more than one destination. Fortunately, there are several areas in Scotland offering at least three top-class links courses in close proximity to one another, ideal for multi-day stays.

On the west coast, Ayrshire is home to Turnberry, Troon and Prestwick. Turning to the east coast, you'll find Muirfield, North Berwick and two or three other courses in a supporting role. In the northeast corner of Scotland, one's choices move to Castle Stuart, Dornoch and maybe Brora, which provides an ancient and raw feel to the links experience.

But perhaps the most recognizable grouping is in the kingdom of Fife, and in particular, the St Andrews area. Here we find The Old Course, likely the most famous golf course in the world and commonly known as "The Home of Golf." Its adjoining neighbor, The New Course, is also a good quality links. Just down the road we find Kingsbarns Links, and the 'new boy on the block,' Dumbarnie Links, which is only 20 minutes from St Andrews and scheduled to open in May 2020. Many people in the golfindustry who have enjoyed a tour are already predicting that Dumbarnie

ack in the day, American Express Bused stars from across the entertainment-industry spectrum to entice new cardmembers by asking: Do you know me?



Many handicap golfers are in pursuit of hitting their tee shots longer, thinking that will make the difference in lowering their scores and handicaps. My belief, however, is that better wedge play will lead to shorter putts, which will in turn lower your scores. Here are my keys to dialing in your wedge game.

Starts with the Grip

Great wedge play starts with the grip. I have what many would refer to as a "square grip." I like to have my thumbs on top, matching the leading edge of the clubface. In this position my hands match the angle of the clubface so I can better control the leading edge through impact. As I take hold of the club, I also want to be sure that my right hand has the club resting more in the fingers, which increases the feel and control of the clubface. As I slide the two hands together, it's almost like they're melting together, that they're "one hand." This hand placement allows me to "feel" the ball on the clubface, as if literally throwing the ball to the target.











Setup Creates Swing Path

Making sure that my hands match the clubface through my grip provides the right alignment to create my swing path. I often see golfers open up their stance too wide, which causes the swing path to be too much "out-to-in." Instead, I want the feeling of squaring up to my target line, like I'm standing on a railroad track to the target in the distance.




Swing Path Creates Ball Flight

The swing path is key to an effective wedge game. On the takeaway, it should be slightly outside. You can see in the photo that in my takeaway the clubface is slightly outside the hands. This move is created by keeping very quiet hands and using my body rotation to move the club away from the ball. My takeaway being slightly outside keeps the space to the inside open for the transition from backswing to forward swing.



My transition from backswing to forward swing occurs around waist high, where I allow the weight of the club to cock my wrist. This transition requires the wrist to be very supple in order to feel the weight of the club "set" the wrist for the forward swing. In the transition, I want the angle of the club shaft pointing directly to the golf ball in order to establish my swing path for the forward swing through impact.

> My forward swing is all about feeling the appropriate speed in the rotation of my body, very similar to throwing a ball. As my body rotates left through impact, it's the hinge in my wrist that helps me control the compression with the golf ball and thus control the ball's flight through the air. I have to make sure I rotate all the way into a complete finish with my chest facing the target and my right wrist remaining hinged.

hen you think Lexus, a racetrack and super model are not likely the first images that comes to mind. That's because you've yet to drive the Lexus LC 500. Take one look, give it a quick spin and you'll conjure images of Indy and wonder where Lexus has been keeping this pretty little sister all your life.

The LC 500 is one part power performer and one part pin-up model. Under the hood sits a 5.0-liter V8 engine ready to deliver 471 horsepower. The 10-speed automatic transmission sets the bar for what a sports car should feel like as it races through the gears. Lexus tests report a 0-60 mph time of just 4.4 seconds. That's race car fast and classy as anything on the road.

The LC 500 has been the Lexus flagship performance car since 2017. In the classic mantra of "if it ain't broke, don't fix it," the LC 500 keeps its finish and components in 2020 but does gain a new look in the upgraded Inspiration model. The 2019 Inspiration line came in one color: flare yellow. The 2020 Inspiration is Nori Green Pearl. This is the color green you see when you imagine the Irish countryside. It's hard not to love its metallic glitter and its depth. The Inspiration model goes just as fast but tricks out the interior with a black-and-tan combination sure to sooth and swaddle.

Lexus has built its brand as a dependable, upscale vehicle. That makes it difficult to imagine squealing tires and racing for pink slips. A few minutes into a drive in the LC 500, however, you'll be looking for action. This car occupies a space in the market with the Porsche 911 and Mercedes S Class. Unlike the 911 though, you won't need a trip to the chiropractor after your morning commute. You won't need to tow it to the mechanic for bi-weekly maintenance either.

Everything on the interior of the LC 500 has its place and makes sense. There aren't any strangely placed buttons or gimmicky features. Safety features like brake assist and blind-spot monitoring give the car a feel of excellence. The leather feels like a million bucks—even the door handles have an air of upscale. This is certainly the top of the Lexus line


From the exterior, the design features accentuate the LC 500's agility and class. A frontal view makes you feel like you're about to be attacked by a futuristic predator. The metal grill and long hood pose with strength and hint at agility. The side view subtly dares you to compare bank accounts. The taillights are almost understated and sporty. Four 21-inch, two-tone wheels give the LC 500 a sense of anticipation that anything could happen with this machine.

With 471 horses, you won't be begging for power from this beast. It gets off the line fast and the handling is everything you'd want from a luxury coupe. It's not a Boxter, but you aren't 25 anymore. The refined feel of the suspension and low notes of the exhaust bring a sense of maturity to the party. Think wine and cheese rather than kegs.

There's plenty to like about the LC 500 from the optional Mark Levinson Reference Surround Sound audio system to the speed-activated rear wing (also optional). You won't break your neck and get nose bleeds from the G-forces in the LC but you'll get plenty of second looks around town and have all power you need for almost any situation. The LC 500 can hold its own against the steepest competition and isn't the kind of car you see at every country club in America.

Only 100 Inspiration series models will be produced for the U.S. market. The LC 500 should retail around \$100,000. If you can get your hands on one, be ready to fall in love.

s a brand, Dolce & Gabbana has Aimbued our culture with its impossible-to-ignore designs by partners Stefano Gabbana and Domenico Dolce. Their tendency to occasionally be outspoken when quoted as well as in advertising campaigns has probably boosted their cachet as a fashion house, appealing to women's independence and femininity. Since they presented their first collection in 1985, the partners have remained loyal to core themes: Bohemian styles and animal prints evocative of flirty lingerie, often inspired by their Sicilian heritage.

Dolce and Gabbana's muses, by way of brand advertisers and celebrity collaborations, have included Madonna, Scarlet Johansson and Christy Turlington. They have produced costumes for the international tours of Missy Elliott, Beyoncé and Mary J. Blige. Some of their collections have been inspired by sports and movies; however, for the most part their luxury clothing lines are inspired by high design, with an air of formality and timelessness.

The Dolce & Gabbana fall-winter 2019 collection is a showcase of florals, with heavy emphasis on pink, green and burgundy tones as well as vellow sunflowers and red and black contrasts. It's an understatement to point out that anyone who wears Dolce & Gabbana this fall will be noticed in a big way.

The Lily Print Poplin Bustier Top captures the brand's trademark sensibility. Cotton poplin with splashes of pink and white flowers is enhanced by front laces and a deep round neckline that highlights the sensuality of the décolletage. Underwired and boned, the top is fastened with a back zipper and hook-and-eye fastening and is available for \$1,245.

The Lily Print Poplin Pants are cropped, wide legged and whimsical, coordinating well with the Bustier Top. These high-waist slacks feature slant pockets for a casually elegant look, and the bright pink, white and green floral print pops pleasantly against the rich black poplin background. These pants sell for \$945.

Moving into the realm of the romantic, the Cashmere and Silk Cardigan with Lace Details is pretty in pink, embellished by Chantilly lace. Stitched from 18-gauge knit, the delicate sweater has a round neck, long sleeves and fine-rib trims. It forms the perfect twin set with the sleeveless Cashmere and Silk Sweater with Lace Details made from the same yarn, measuring 23.6 inches from the collar. The cardigan retails for \$1,845, the matching shell for \$1,145.

Pairing sweetly with the cardigan and sweater set, the Lily-Print Shantung Pants continue the floral lily theme, this time set against a creamy pale pink background. The high waist lends sophistication in silk shantung with slant pockets and a front zipper fly closure accented with a covered button. The inner leg measures 26.8 inches, the center front pleat adding to the emphasis of the crop. These pants retail for

About as classic Dolce & Gabbana as it gets, the Short Cady Dress with Leopard-Print Details features a bright red, sleeveless bon-ton sheath in stretch viscose cady. The traditional shape has been given a make-over thanks to the iconic animal print waistband and front pockets along with the metal ball buttons. The dress sports a peter-pan collar and leopard-print stretch silk satin lining, fastening in back with a zipper and measuring just shy of 20 inches from waist to bottom hem. This dress may be purchased for \$2,145.

The Stretch Satin Bustier Dress invokes the designers' love of the slip dress. a motif consistently represented in their collections year after year. The ultimate "LBD" (little black dress), this sexy number is made of stretch viscose satin and embellished by laces and golden eyelets. The dress features a sweetheart neckline with boned bodice and adjustable straps, and it falls 33.5 inches below the waist to a midi length. The dress retails for \$4,395.
