The years have been good to Phil Mickelson. If Mickelson has his way, 2018 will be another busy, rewarding and successful lap around the sun. And his first major responsibility and/or test of the new year will be to serve as tournament ambassador for the CareerBuilder Challenge while also competing in the tournament.

For the second straight year, Mickelson will serve as ambassador for the Coachella Valley's PGA Tour stop, scheduled for January 17-21 at PGA West and La Quinta Country Club in La Quinta, California.

famously missed last year's U.S. Open to attend the high school graduation of his daughter, Amanda. Based on his past experience and performances, the potential for Mickelson to make history at the 2018 U.S. Open this year at Shinnecock Hills Golf Club in Southampton, New York, will be one of the top story lines heading into the championship.

Before all the excitement of the majors and World Golf Championship season, however, Mickelson will kick off his year—and the California-based portion of the PGA Tour's winter schedule—at the CareerBuilder Challenge.

No doubt his focus will then turn to major prep as he looks forward to claiming a potential fourth Masters title, a second PGA Championship and a second British Open Championship title. Now 47, Mickelson enters 2018 with 42 career wins, the last coming at the 2013 British Open at Muirfield Golf Links in East Lothian, Scotland.

There's also the matter of completing the career Grand Slam, should Mickelson finally break through and win the U.S. Open. His U.S. Open record is the stuff of legends, finishing second or tied for second on six occasions. To add texture to the story line, Mickelson

New CareerBuilder Challenge tournament director, Pat McCabe, who took over in September, can't wait for the opportunity to work with Mickelson and reap the benefits of having one of the biggest names in the game as a promotional partner.

How helpful does McCabe expect Mickelson to be? "Extremely helpful," he says. "He's won 42 events on the PGA Tour; he's got the winningest record in Presidents Cup history; he's played in, gosh, how many Ryder Cups? He's a native of Southern California, a World Golf Hall of Famer—the laundry list goes on



desert], he owns property here and he wants to have his name in lights here in the valley."

There's no doubt Mickelson would love to begin the season by winning a tournament with which he shares such a close relationship. A victory would be his third at the event, and he's finished in the top 10 on two other occasions in 13 total appearances. Mickelson finished tied for 21st in last year's event despite just having returned from an injury layoff, so a win would not only be satisfying, it would set him off on his 2018 campaign with great momentum. While tournament officials have no vested interest in a particular outcome, there's no question they'd be as thrilled as Mickelson should he manage to win.

"It'd be fantastic," McCabe says. "His last win came too long ago, at the 2013 British Open, and certainly he's only one leg away from the career Grand Slam. But he's won this event twice, he's played in it a number of times, even back in the old Bob Hope days and Chrysler days, so he loves coming to the desert. I can't say that I'm rooting for him necessarily, because we've got 155 other guys in the field. But if he wins on Sunday and we're handing him the first-place check and trophy, it would certainly be a benefit to this golf tournament."

Not to mention to Mickelson.

and on. He's a fantastic ambassador, philanthropist and a heck of a golfer. So it's definitely an honor to have him as the tournament ambassador."

The benefits for the tournament include the use of Mickelson's likeness in all available advertising mediums. His presence increases the strength of field, and it's likely Mickelson will play with some top personal and tournament sponsors during tournament week. The tournament's benefits of the relationship may appear obvious, but McCabe says Mickelson may have his own motivations

for his enhanced participation during the CareerBuilder Challenge.

"Phil is certainly one of the most prestigious names in the game, and he wants to give back to the community here in the Coachella Valley," McCabe notes. "All the greats of the game have had this type of ambassadorship role. You had Arnie, rest in peace to Mr. Palmer, at Bay Hill, then you have Jack at Memorial and Phil fits into that category of legendary names. He wants to have an association with a PGA Tour event that's near where he grew up. He loves coming down [to the

2018 BNP Paribas Open: Paradise in Full Bloom



In preparation for the 2018 BNP Paribas Open, Indian Wells Tennis Garden is launching a new marketing campaign

Each March, Indian Wells Tennis Garden, one of the world's premier sporting venues, offers BNP Paribas Open attendees a "full bloom," so to speak, of colors, flowers, palm trees and lush landscaping, all set against the backdrop of snowcapped mountains.

To celebrate the beauty of Mother Nature, BNP Paribas Open staff members are introducing a new, integrated marketing campaign for the 2018 tournament: "Full Bloom," an opportunity to showcase the event's world-class tennis players, venue and desert setting. To experience this tennis paradise for themselves, more than 450,000 fans now attend the BNP Paribas Open each year—an astonishing figure. Of course, the sky is the limit and there's no reason to believe the tournament can't continue to increase attendance in coming years. With this in mind, the Indian Wells Tennis Garden was renovated extensively last year, and now offers patrons a wide variety of scrumptious dining options throughout the venue: Japanese (the world-renowned Nobu), Italian (Piero's Pizza Vino) and Californian fine dining (Wolfgang Puck's Spago), among others.

In addition to its dining options, the Tennis Garden also provides guests a renovated Stadium 1 (which includes four premium walk-in concessions, a new private club venue and an updated workout area and media room), as well as the highly popular, 8,000-seat Stadium 2, which opened to the public in 2014 and increased the stadium's seating capacity considerably.

A Tremendous Value

Although the venue has been renovated and a new marketing campaign will be unveiled, some things simply never change at Indian Wells Tennis Garden. The striking, incomparable views have already been mentioned, as has the natural splendor of the desert setting. But it’s the exhilarating action of the tournament that attracts fans from across the globe, the opportunity to watch

To help all fans witness tennis greatness live, regardless of their budgets, the 2018 BNP Paribas Open will offer a variety of ticketing options. For example, patrons can purchase daily tickets at Stadium 1 for as low as \$45, as well as Ground Passes that range from \$20 to \$50 and provide access to all non-reserved seating in Stadiums 2-9—a tremendous value at an affordable price.

“For fans interested in premium seating options, mini packages, hotel packages and series packages offer the best value for a multiday tournament experience,” Haas says.

In addition, to prepare for the 2018 tournament, fans will also be able to review the official player entry lists in mid-January.

“We’re thrilled to once again welcome star-studded and competitive player fields on the men and women’s tours,” Haas says. “And we’re looking forward to following a number of interesting storylines as the world’s top players descend on the desert to compete for one of tennis’s most coveted titles.”

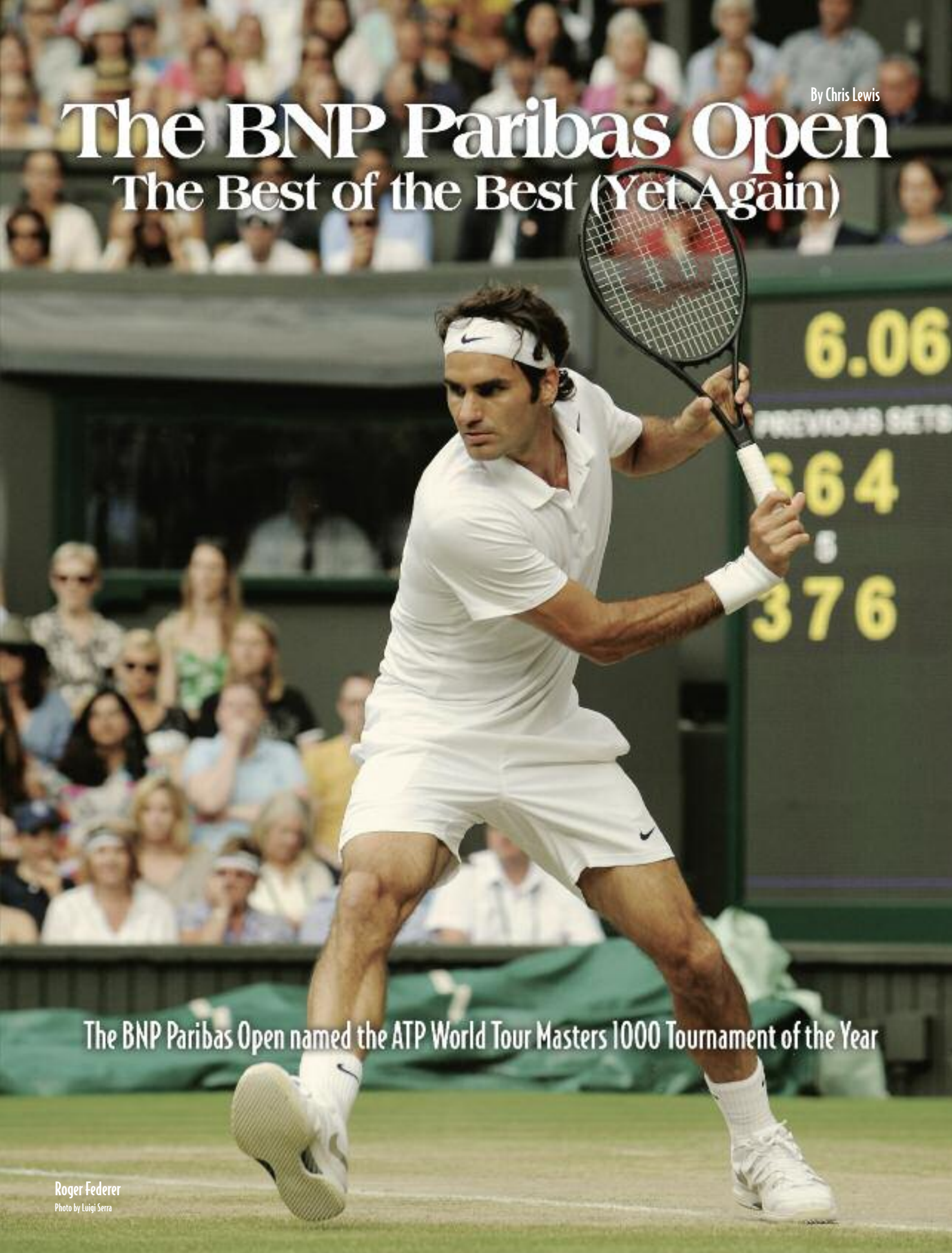

In 2009, Larry Ellison, a co-founder of Oracle Corporation, purchased the BNP Paribas Open. Already renowned as one of the game's most prestigious events, the tournament has gained even further recognition since Ellison's purchase, thanks in part to extensive renovations and upgrades to host venue, Indian Wells Tennis Garden. From the development of Indian Wells' 8,000-seat Stadium 2, to upgrades at Stadium 1—including an expansion of its Stadium Plaza and the addition of 21 restaurants and concessions—to the implementation of Hawk-Eye on all match courts for main draw and qualifying matches (the only tournament in the world to have such technology), the changes have been considerable and are certainly being noticed by the tennis industry.

Ahead of the 2018 BNP Paribas Open, the tournament has yet again been named the ATP World Tour Masters 1000 Tournament of the Year, as determined by a player vote, for the fourth straight year. The designation is not surprising. After all, the BNP Paribas Open is the world's largest WTA and ATP World Tour combined two-week event. And the 2017 edition of the tournament had a roughly \$406 million total gross economic impact on the Coachella Valley's regional economy, a rise of more than \$32 million since 2014.

"I have a tremendous amount of respect for the countless hours of planning and dedication that the entire staff contributes to make the BNP Paribas Open one of the [world's] best sporting events," says Tommy Haas, tournament director. "This award reaffirms that our actions are being appreciated by the players."

In preparation for next year's tournament, the BNP Paribas Open has also announced a new, integrated marketing campaign, known as "Full Bloom," which will focus on the event's gorgeous landscaping, desert setting and world-class tennis players.

"We remain focused on improving the event every year and hope to make the 2018 edition even more memorable for fans, players, media and sponsors," Haas adds.

2017 U.S. Open Champion Sloane Stephens

To become a champion, one must have each of these character traits, as evidenced by 24-year-old Sloane Stephens's path to becoming the U.S. Open champion this fall.

Sideline by a foot surgery that led to her confinement in a wheelchair early this year, Stephens maintained her sights on greatness and overcame all odds as she defeated her close friend Madison Keys (who also had her fair share of injuries recently, including a wrist surgery and a sore thigh), 6-3, 6-0 in just one hour of play during the final round of the U.S. Open.

With the victory the unseeded Stephens, ranked number 957 in the world during the summer, became the lowest-ranked champion in U.S. Open history, claiming her fifth career title and first major championship and exceeding her previous best finish at a major considerably. Prior to the U.S. Open, she had only reached the semifinals at a Grand Slam one other time (the 2013 Australian Open).

By playing controlled and consistent tennis while fully utilizing her strengths of athleticism and speed, Stephens only committed six unforced errors during the match in comparison to Keys' 30. In doing so, she proved that impossible is just a word and that it is never too late to achieve your potential.

Until their injuries, Stephens and Keys had been viewed as potential winners of Grand Slam championships. By overcoming those setbacks and reaching the final stage of one of the game's most cherished events, it appears that the pair is ready to show the tennis world what they are capable of.

The journey to the finals wasn't easy for Stephens or 22-year-old Keys, who, unlike Stephens, was ranked and seeded 15th. During the semifinals, Keys had to defeat CoCo Vandeweghe, who was riding the momentum of her recent victory over World No. 1 Karolina Pliskova. On the other hand, Stephens competed against Venus Williams, a two-time U.S. Open champion, in the semifinals.

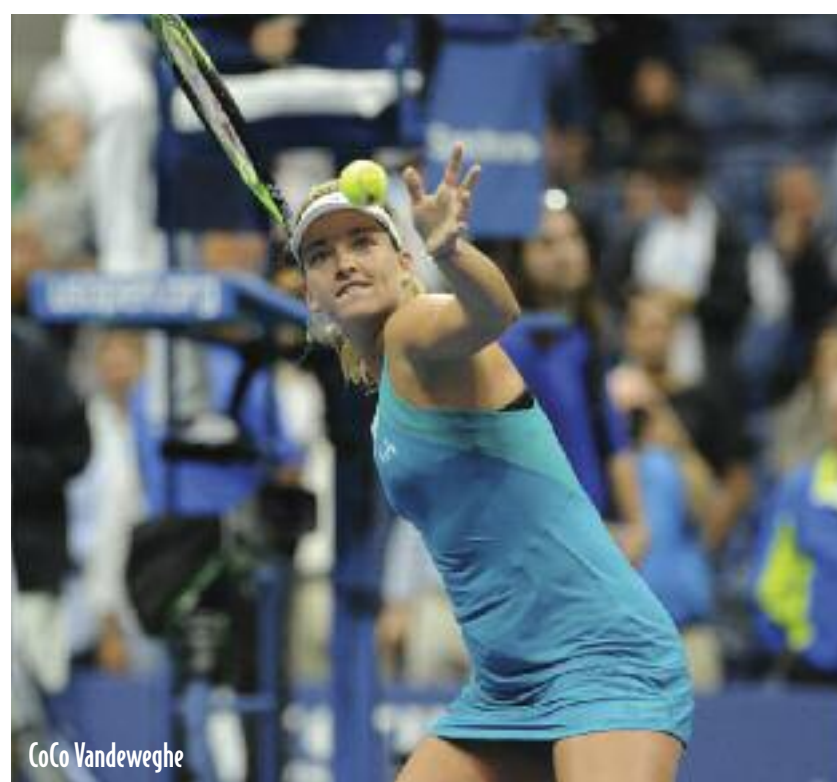
Aside from the uniqueness of Stephens' low ranking, the semifinal matches were unusual for another reason: all four players were American, a distinction that had not occurred at the U.S. Open since 1981. The odds are so rare, in fact, that no Grand Slam semifinals have featured all-U.S. players since the 1985 Wimbledon Championships.

To say the least, the 2017 U.S. Open was historic. And both players recognized the significance of their accomplishments as they hugged and cried near the net after the stunning championship concluded. Stephens was so overwhelmed by her victory that she couldn't help but raise her arms in disbelief.

"I told Maddie I should just retire now," Stephens said. "It's never going to get better than this."

As the two friends waited for the championship ceremony, they began to chat as they had for years, laughing and smiling as they reflected on the past few days of the most important championship of their careers thus far.

"Sloane is truly one of my favorite people," Keys stated. "To get to play her was really special. Obviously, I didn't play my best tennis today and was disappointed. But if there's someone I have to lose to today, I'm glad it's her."

Stephens—just the fifth unseeded player in the Open era to win a Grand Slam title—earned \$3.7 million for her victory, while Keys received a check for \$1,825,000. Stephens also earned the distinction of being the first American champion at the U.S. Open, aside from Serena and Venus Williams, since Lindsay Davenport, who happens to be Keys' coach, won in 1998.

"It's incredible. I had surgery January 23rd. If someone had told me then that I would win the U.S. Open, 'It's impossible,' I would have said," Stephens noted. "The journey has been incredible, and honestly I wouldn't change it for the world."

This new tournament adds celebrities back into the mix

When the Arnold Palmer Hospital for Children Celebrity Invitational of the Desert tees off in February, it will be the culmination of a plan set in motion during a private dinner among friends, a dinner that happened to include the driving forces behind the tournament.

Mary Coor, tournament director for the event, and Canadian Grant Fuhr, five-time Stanley Cup-winning goaltender, happened to be among a group dining together. During the meal, Fuhr mentioned his desire to put on a celebrity golf event in the Coachella Valley, one created to benefit the Arnold Palmer Children's Hospital. Coor, who previously helped organize the Frank Sinatra Celebrity Invitational, told Fuhr of her firm belief in the viability of a new celebrity benefit tournament—and she possessed the expertise to put it together.

The end product of that dinner is the valley's newest celebrity tournament, scheduled for February 17-19 at Desert Willow Golf Resort in Palm Desert, California. Organizers believe it's the first of what will become an annual affair. Tournament participation features three nights of parties, two days of golf and the satisfaction of contributing to one of Arnold and Winnie Palmer's favorite charities, the Arnold Palmer Children's Hospital in Orlando, Florida.

"Everyone has a love for Arnold Palmer," Coor says. "He was a very philanthropic gentleman and this was his charity. So this inaugural event is going to benefit what he loved, and it will honor him."

While the children's hospital is the primary beneficiary, Coor says there will be local beneficiaries as well. With the upcoming event being the first of its kind, she couldn't offer a projection on the potential for raised funds. However, she did say 70 percent of what is generated will go to the Arnold Palmer Children's Hospital in Orlando, 15 percent will be donated to the Make-A-Wish Foundation, and another 15 percent will go to a local charity to be named later.

Raising charitable funds is obviously the primary goal of the tournament, but Coor believes there's an opportunity for the tournament to fill a widening niche in the Coachella Valley tournament mix.

"The Warburton for St. Jude (The Patrick Warburton Golf for Kids Celebrity Golf Tournament) is doing very well here," Coor notes. But she also points out that other events, including the Frank Sinatra, the Bob Hope and the CareerBuilder Challenge no longer include celebrities.

"What I hear from my constituents and participants is that they love celebrity events. And the celebrities are all about raising money for the charities. So we got with Grant Fuhr, who's going to be our tournament host. He's always wanted to put on a celebrity event here in the valley, and we couldn't have asked for a better match."

According to Coor, the event will be a celebrity-country bash. "We're calling it Arnie's Bash and we're going to have some country people and rock people—a country-rock-blues thing. We're getting the celebrity players lineup together right now. We know Grant is going to call a lot of his hockey friends."

While the playing field is taking shape, the "country-rock-blues" theme is quickly coming together. Arnie's Bash already includes commitments from Preston Pohl of *The Voice*, country

music singer/songwriter Rob West, Mississippi Delta-stylist Steve Azar and country singer/songwriter Ira Dean.

Along with the celebrities and the desert itself, Coor says Desert Willow, which previously hosted Frank Sinatra events she organized, is another great reason to participate in the event. She calls the course "one of my favorites in the valley for tournaments."

The tournament will also incorporate area restaurants into the nightly events in a way that many benefit tournament participants have not seen before.

"We're not going to have the typical sit-down gala. It's going to be more open, more networking, more friends. It's a party mode," Coor says. "We're making it fresh, new and energetic. We'll have lots of local restaurants so you can just go and get a bite; you're not having a full dinner because we'll have 20 restaurants out there, so that will be a full meal."

Unbridled Andalusia

La Quinta community combines stylish elegance with camaraderie and coltish good fun

When lifelong friends Grady Sparks and Gary Drummond partnered to create a golf community in La Quinta, California, it was Sparks' love of Andalusian horses that was the initial inspiration for the design and lifestyle of Andalusia at Coral Mountain. His son, Nolan, says, "My father raised cattle and horses and was impressed with Andalusian horses, so stately and proud."

A design team traveled to the Andalusia region in southern Spain and they were enamored with the clean, crisp lines of its architecture and interiors—especially during a time when rustic Tuscan clubhouses dotted the desert.

Everything is in place for Andalusia to shine: postcard views, a stellar golf course, racquet club, pool and fitness facility and a community of stylish homes. Add elegant golf and social

clubhouses and accommodating service from every single staff member. Management acknowledges those are member and homeowner expectations among quality clubs. What makes Andalusia rise above the competition?

"It's kind of cliché but the membership is fantastic," says head golf pro Lindsey Winch. "That really sets us apart. We're in the growing phase and everybody knows everybody. It's not as cliquy as other clubs." About 85 percent of homeowners make Andalusia their second or third residence, but they also experience the extraordinary camaraderie of the community.

Andalusia's golf course is the club's centerpiece. The only Rees Jones design in the area, it has hosted PGA and USGA events including four U.S. Open qualifiers. With a spectrum of yardage





adjustments, the championship course was built with playability in mind for beginners who relish the wide, wide fairways, as well as elite players who tackle the tips at 7,521 yards.

“We like to think every hole is a signature hole, but No. 17 is spectacular with a view of Coral Mountain,” says Winch. “It’s a difficult tee shot. There are bunkers on the right and left and there’s a big lake on the left, so with an errant shot it will come into play. But there’s a generous fairway.”

Practice facilities are expansive and two extra holes are available for practice or play. A new golf clubhouse opened three years ago, showcasing dramatic Santa Rosa Mountain views.

Built in 2005 on 980 acres with a plan for 800 homes, 220 have been completed—two designs have been honored with Golden Nugget Awards from the Pacific Coast Builders Conference. Construction stalled with the downward turn of the real estate market, but there’s new life at the development as well as throughout the club. Nolan Sparks, who oversees both aspects, says, “We move with the market. We’re sort of a 10-year-old new club.”

He adds, “We’re developing a community that’s supposed to be out in the country. It’s at the base of the mountains and away from the rat race and noise.” That doesn’t mean residents are cut off from civilization. “There’s access to restaurants, theater, polo in season and the



music festival. Or you can chill and hang out in your backyard enjoying the view.”

Single-family homes range from 3,000 to 5,000 square feet on various-sized lots, with views of the golf course, lake or mountains. Sparks says the homes’ pocket-slider doors are coveted among residents. “You can enjoy snow-covered mountains when it’s 80 degrees in January. Or coffee, brunch or an after-golf cocktail on the patio.”

Andalusia is currently introducing its new “lock and leave” residences. At 2,000 square feet, they’re ideal for those who travel in and out of the area. Maintenance is taken care of and residents just need to “park in the garage, get on a golf cart and enjoy the club,” says Sparks.

The Olympic-sized swimming pool and fitness center complement tennis activities. Blake Wilcox, director of tennis

and fitness, says, “Other clubs’ tennis programs are more tournament oriented, but we’re more social. Our members want to have a good time. As the club grows, we’ll add USTA leagues and more competition.”

Events are organized so that members might even alternate playing tennis, then pickleball, in half-hour segments. Pickleball is a club obsession and Andalusia hosts an annual tournament featuring more than 250 players from around the world.

General Manager John Cummings has been with Andalusia since its inception. “We’re starting to see a younger membership with kids, so we’re working on programs to attract that kind of buyer who is not so focused on golf or tennis but on family activities.”

A new basketball court is being added to the disc golf course that opened this fall.

Families also enjoy hiking and biking the club’s 9-foot-wide, 2.5-mile asphalt trail just inside the property walls, complete with dog parks and up-close views of Coral Mountain.

“When you think about [elite] clubs you get the same things: a quality experience, treated well by staff and a great experience on the golf course with members and guests,” says Cummings. “We’re different. Our members are welcoming, genuinely successful people—but they’re not going to let you know that.”

A visit, he says, speaks volumes. “Take a look and you’ll be genuinely surprised. Andalusia is a gem.”

Club Professional Moves

Each day that he goes to work at Toscana Country Club, John Cochrane thanks his lucky stars.

Not that he was slumming around before, mind you. But the enthusiasm in his voice when he talks about his new role as general manager at the club, the club's projects, its members and its future, is unmistakable.

"I have to tell you, Toscana Country Club is just so beautiful," Cochrane says. "Right now we're in the middle of opening a brand new restaurant that will feature casual dining, and it has glass, so it's a show kitchen. When the members are enjoying their meal, they can watch the chef in back preparing it and it is absolutely gorgeous.

"We have a new swimming pool, we have a movement studio and a Pilates studio added," he continues. "We have an event lawn and two new tennis courts. We have six tennis courts, one clay court and two new pickleball courts. We've even added two Bocce ball courts! So everything is just first-class, well thought out and well done. It makes me really proud to be here. I've got a wonderful team and it's going to be a great year."

It's a big statement from the 53-year old, who came to Toscana from PGA West's private side to assume his new role in early August. Cochrane's move was just one of several significant personnel changes in the Southern California PGA's Desert Chapter over the summer. Other general managers on the move this summer included Benjamin Dobbs, who moved from Indian Wells Country Club into the opening at PGA West, and John Kulow, Jr., who moved from La Mirada Golf Course to Monterey Country Club in Palm Desert.

Directors of golf were also on the move. Among them were Charles DeLorey, who is the new DOG at Borrego Springs Resort, moving over from Palm Desert Resort, and Charles Peterson, who left his DOG job at Indian Ridge Country Club in Palm Desert to assume the same job on Cochrane's staff at Toscana Country Club. There were also a handful of head professional changes, including Derek Mazzoni's promotion from assistant to head professional at Indian Ridge Country Club.

Club staff and golf professionals make moves for any number of reasons, from commute times to position to salary. Cochrane says he was perfectly content at PGA West, but decided to make the move to Toscana because he considers the club to be among the most elite in Southern California.

"When I heard about [the opening at Toscana], I was very happy at PGA West," he says. "I was the general manager for the private courses, and we had our own capital improvements to our fitness area and were building a swimming pool and what-not over there also, and I was very happy. But Toscana is a tier-one property. It's the top of the top. It's got a little smaller membership, so I thought I could be more hands-on with the members, and that's what my specialty is. It just looked like the general manager position at Toscana fit who I am as a leader."

Cochrane knows all about the top tier. Before moving back to PGA West in 2014 to take over as the general manager for the facility's private courses, Cochrane put in shifts as an assistant professional at La Quinta Resort's Mountain and Dunes Courses, and was head professional PGA West Stadium and Tournament Courses before becoming the head professional at PGA West's three private

courses. He was eventually promoted to director of golf at the private courses, piling up 10 years with the club. Cochrane then moved to Del-Mar Country Club where he stayed for 14 years, serving as director of golf, and eventually senior manager.

When he returned to PGA West, he intended to dig in for the long term. But the lure of Toscana prompted him to pursue the position.

"Well, times are changing," he says. "Back in the day, the pro was the pro at a facility, and a lot of times those pros would stay for 20-plus years. When I came back to PGA West as the general manager, I had all intentions of staying there for a long period of time. Then I had the opportunity to come to Toscana, and this place is so wonderful. I'd love this to be my last job. I'm all in at Toscana."

Cochrane says he couldn't be happier with his decision, and not just because of the club's reputation and facilities. As with most new

jobs, Cochrane had his personal concerns about the unknown when he made the move. But the welcoming and friendly nature of the membership hastened his transition. Cochrane says his daily interaction with members has become one of the most enjoyable aspects of his job.

"It's nicer than I could have imagined. One of the biggest surprises to me is that the members here are so friendly and active. Our members go on trips together with our leadership. Our chef took a group to Tuscany recently to taste truffles. There was a cycling trip to Peru, hiking in Iceland and our golf professional took a group to Reynolds Plantation. What that really means is our members are so social and no matter what, Toscana is always all about the members. It's really a wonderful, warm, friendly place."

Golfer's Playbook

How to Create More Power in Your Swing

If you were to study all athletic sports and the similarities they share, you might be surprised at how many are built on similar fundamental principles.

In every sport that involves a ball, players are attempting to control the ball's distance, direction and trajectory in relationship to a desired target, whether that be hitting a tennis ball over the net into the opposing court, hitting a baseball into the right-field bleachers, a long pass in football from the quarterback to the receiver or a last-second jump shot from behind the three-point line in basketball. How the athlete in each of those sports actually creates that motion with the ball is uniquely based upon their physical build and their own mannerisms. Golf is no different.

Storing Up Power In The Backswing

Let's start with how to take the club away from the ball, the takeaway. Many golfers face the dilemma of standing over their ball at address and wondering, "What do I do now?" Sometimes starting the swing can be the most difficult thing to do!

The way to start is by setting up to the target line and standing with a balanced posture. That means shoulders directly over the hips, hips directly over the knees and knees directly over the ankles.

When I initiate my backswing, I trigger the takeaway by engaging the legs through "loading down." This engaging of the legs serves the purpose of feeling the strongest muscles actively playing the most important role in the swing, storing up power.

I like to have the hips/legs loading downward as I'm rotating into the backswing. Why? The legs are among the strongest muscles in the human body and they're designed to work in a vertical direction. The way to engage a vertical muscle is to move vertically. If the legs are not loading down, you're not engaging the muscles.

Think of a rubber band. If you try to flick a rubber band without stretching it out, it won't go far. The farther I stretch it, the more energy I store up. The same holds true for muscles. I can engage muscles according to how much power I want to store up for the shot I'm about to make.



Transitioning The Power

Now that I have stored up the energy in the backswing by loading the legs, I need to transition for the forward swing. The interesting thing about transitioning into the forward swing is how similar it is to the transition made in other sports, such as in baseball and football when a player is throwing a ball to a target. The transition is made from the lower body, the waist down. It's important to understand that there are two transitions in the golf swing: one from stop to start, the other from back swing to forward swing. Both transitions are initiated by the "engine" or power source—the legs.

As the upper body completes the motion of the backswing, the lower body starts to lever from the ground. The right foot starts to push off from the ground, which lengthens the right leg and rotates the right hip through in the forward swing. A softer power level will have a softer push off from the ground, while a higher power level will have the right foot push off harder from the ground. In a higher power level, the lengthening of the right leg will also be faster and the hip turn more intense.

The key to the golf swing rests right here. It's the lower body leveraging that initiates the dropping of the shaft into the slot, or onto the right forearm as seen in the photo below. Many golfers battle with coming "over the top" in the transition; the secret to not coming over the top is by transitioning from the ground up through leverage. This leverage is like a chain reaction that instantly goes up the leg and releases the hips to rotate, creating centrifugal force. The controlling of this lever transfers into the amount of "effortless" power into the ball. I call it effortless because using the bigger, stronger muscles of the lower body gives golfers the illusion that it is less effort because they are using the stronger muscles to create the power.

The Power Behind the Sequence



Focus, concentration, patience and discipline are the true benefits of yoga, starting with the breath sequence

Many people believe that yoga is about mastering one's form in a particular pose, but the greatest benefit is what you can't see—the non-tangible aspect of yoga that you take with you from the yoga studio. While we use mirrors to pay attention to our alignment and form, the real way we achieve proper posturing has a lot to do with our levels of focus and concentration and how we use our breath, all beneficial outside the studio.

The mirror is a powerful tool and initially students' perception of themselves, their body image and their psychological state cloud what their actual image is in the mirror.

The 26 postures with two breathing exercises that comprise the Bikram series all have significant benefits physically, physiologically and psychologically. Individually, they provide amazing therapy; however, done as a sequence the benefits are exponential.

We will explore each *asana* (pose), its form requirements and its benefits through the next series of articles. We'll start with the initial breathing exercise that kicks off the entire series and prepares students for class and the day.

Sequence 1: The Breath

The Bikram series begins with 10 minutes of a Pranyama breathing exercise that not only prepares the lungs for class but benefits students as they take it with them the rest of the day. It's often referred to as "yogic breathing."

When you breathe naturally without focus, it's more of a superficial breath that uses only partial lung capacity. But Pranyama breathing, breath control, is great for the lungs and respiratory system. It can change the shape of the lungs and increase lung capacity over time. The exercise allows the lungs to be stretched to maximum extension and contraction.

Angela Wilson, MA, RYT, at Institute for Extraordinary Living's Front Line Providers Program, illustrates how yogic breathing techniques support the nervous system: "The respiratory system is the one part of the autonomic nervous system over which we have conscious control. Because air intake is essential for life, the brain responds to the respiratory system with urgency. That's why yogic breathing can make such an impact on overall health. It's a place where we can begin to plug into our nervous system and support its overall function and balance."

And, yes, you *can* try this at home. In fact, it's a simple breathing exercise that can be done in one's steamy shower in the morning to kick-start bodily functions.

Mindful or Pranyama breathing as part of Bikram yoga requires focus and concentration. It shifts the subconscious daily breathing to a higher awareness. Students concentrate on deeper and fuller inhalations and exhalations with each set. This full range of expansion and contraction of the lung tissue renews cells, which aid in prevention of respiratory ailments such as bronchitis, emphysema, asthma and shortness of breath.

There is also an amazing group energy that occurs when yoga students breathe together, similar to the energy produced by synchronized swimmers. The ebb and flow of group inhales and exhales fills the room with a buzzing sound of life.

Students begin by facing the mirror and focusing on what is referred to as one's third eye, a point between the eyebrows. Feet are together side-by-side with toes and heels touching and shoulders are even. Fingers of both hands are interlaced tight to the webbing with all 10 fingers like a fist, and the knuckles are "glued" below the chin. We use the word "glue" because the knuckles stay there throughout the breathing exercise. The elbows point to the earth.

The inhale is long, deep and slow through the nose with the mouth closed, and a snoring sound accompanies it. The initial breath begins with the head straight. During subsequent breaths the head is back and drops down to the straight position. Simultaneously, moving with the breath, the elbows slowly lift toward the sky with a slight pressure of chin to knuckles/ knuckles to chin. The inhale extends for six seconds. When maximum capacity is reached, the exhale begins.

The exhale is equally as long, taking six seconds to slowly let the air out while the arms and head move together in synchronization with the breath. During the exhale, the head drops back with mouth wide open as students make a "HAAAA" sound. The elbows now reach across the chest and touch at the end of the six-second exhale.

The cycle begins again for the second breath, but this time the head drops down for the inhale and the chin comes parallel to the floor as the elbows swoop up toward the ceiling. This pattern of inhalations and exhalations goes on for two sets of ten full breaths.

Bikram Choudhury, founder of Bikram yoga, describes a dizzy feeling that new students experience because "you are not used to so much oxygen pouring into your system." Keeping eyes open during the whole breathing exercise is important so as not to lose balance and fall over. This also teaches students to stay present and focused.

This form of standing deep breathing helps to jumpstarts the circulatory system, waking up the entire body in no time flat.

As part of the sequence or the start of the day in your morning shower, this is an excellent breathing exercise that everybody can enjoy as part of a healthy exercise routine or just an added energy boost to the morning repertoire.

California Coastal Destinations with all the Amenities of Home

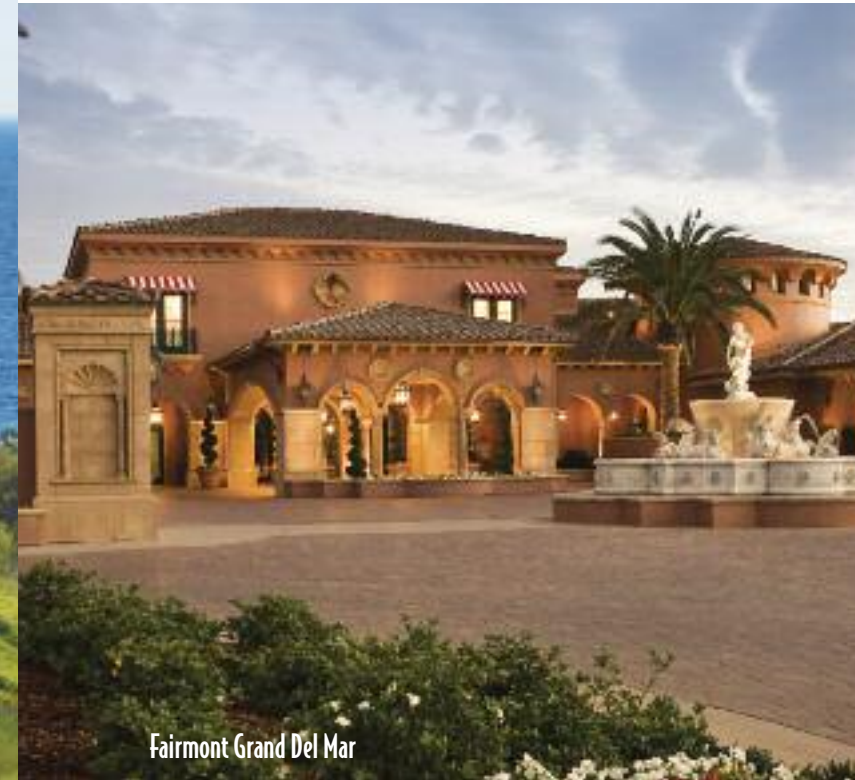

The Coachella Valley's Top Golf, Tennis, Spa and Fitness Clubs

It's not hard to find a premier golf club, but it is a little harder to find a club that offers great golf, top tennis, a world-class spa facility and active fitness.

There are several that offer it all for budgets from low to high.

On the lower end of the budget you have **Palm Valley Country Club** in Palm Desert. Palm Valley is a community with 1,200 condos ranging in price from \$200,000 to \$600,000. Two beautiful Jack Nicklaus Signature courses, a caddy program and excellent golf instruction with top-50 golf instructors are a draw for golfers. In addition, there's a high-tech teaching facility and large practice area, as well as competitive team play and golf social activities.

Toscana is celebrating the grand opening of its premier tennis, fitness and luxury spa center with a large resort-style pool. The Charlie Pasarell Tennis Center, named for the longtime Coachella Valley resident who has been instrumental in keeping Indian Wells and the valley in the forefront of tennis, features a stadium court and three additional lighted tennis courts, including one clay court, delivering a high-caliber playing experience. Two additional tennis courts are slated for completion before year's end. There are also two dedicated pickle ball courts. The fitness center features top-of-the-line workout equipment and there are fitness classes for all levels. Can't make a class? Join a spin class led by top instructors in New York City through live streaming or in-demand on the innovative Peloton bike. There are kids classes as well. Homes in Toscana range from \$1 to \$5 million. At build-out there will be approximately 700 homes across 640 acres.

At the other end of the valley in La Quinta is **PGA West**, aka the western home of golf in America and host of the PGA Tour CareerBuilderChallenge. Arnold Palmer, Jack Nicklaus, Tom Weiskopf, Greg Norman and Pete Dye designed the facility's six championship golf courses (Dye designed two), including the revered Stadium Course. There are three expansive driving ranges and golf practice facilities as well as a well-known PGA WEST Golf Academy.



Mission Hills Country Club

PGA West offers a variety of competitive and social golf events, and many areas were recently redone including the clubhouse. The renovated fitness facility reopened in November and offers workouts, classes and massages. The club has 10 tennis courts including two clay courts, and there's a robust tennis program with instruction and leagues. For pickleball enthusiasts, there are 16 courts. 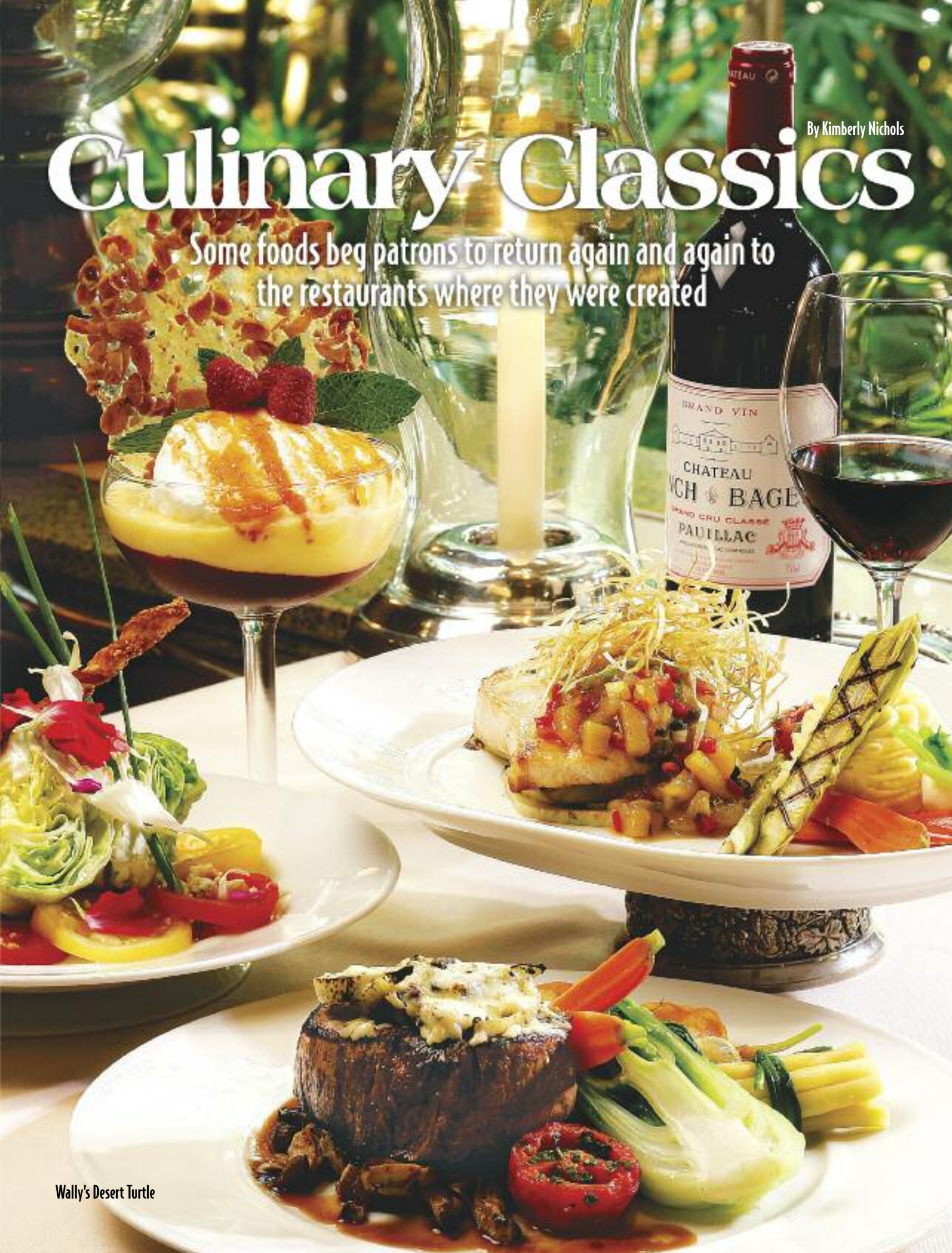
Culinary Classics

Some foods beg patrons to return again and again to the restaurants where they were created

What makes a culinary classic? It may be a restaurant that stands the test of time and trends, offering up its savory signature dishes year after year to a loyal crowd of patrons. Perhaps it's a place that takes ordinary cuisine and elevates it above the norm, making it stand out miles from the rest. It could be a kitchen that provides something so creative it becomes stamped as the place to go for that dish or an adventurous palate in general, or a joint that offers a consistent ambience as inviting as its entrees and cocktails. Or perhaps it's an old or new favorite serving food and cocktails that are irresistible and addictive.

However you define it, this season's classics range from down home to haute, weaving a thread through the scene preferred by locals.

As old school as it comes, Wally's Desert Turtle is a valley dinosaur on the culinary landscape, opening its doors more than 30 years ago. Today, Executive Chef Pascal Lallemand reigns over the restaurant's traditional white-table-clothed glamour, cooking up legendary entrees such as sautéed imported Dover sole, pan-fried Lake Superior whitefish, Maple Leaf seared duck breast and an exquisitely classic calf's liver with applewood smoked bacon, caramelized sweet onions and sherry gastrique. CLASSIC BBQ Zobo & Meesters

Some barbecue aficionados would call BBQ joints in California an oxymoron. But Zobo & Meesters have us begging to differ. Come Saturday morning, the smoked BBQ ribs, brisket, chicken and pulled pork are offered, one day only, until 11 a.m. or until they run out. Otherwise the quirky place with the large, green bull out front, is open daily 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. serving homey, fast and fresh fare including a roster of excellent paninis. Of particular interest are the stellar cubano made with black forest ham; the flame-thrower stuffed with roast beef, pulled pork, pepper jack, marinated jalapeno, habanero pepper and secret Zam sauce; and the daring homage to Elvis with peanut butter, banana and bacon between two pieces of cinnamon French toast. Even though food is plentiful, you'll want to try an appetizer. Consider the lobster tail lightly fried, tossed in spicy cream sauce, drizzled with jalapeno jelly and placed atop a cucumber salad. Truly One of a Kind

If you want the only one in the world, you want the Rolls-Royce Bespoke team



It's the world's most expensive car at \$13 million and you can't buy it—even if you have the team of accountants to make the transaction a reality. No, the Rolls-Royce Sweptail was commissioned by a collector and designed solely for his pleasure. He must like classic-meets-modern because the Sweptail blends Rolls-Royce features from the 1930s with modern styles making their way into mainstream production.

The Sweptail is the creation of the Rolls-Royce Bespoke team. This is what they say about themselves: "Personalize subtle features such as door handles, drivers dials and treadplates. Make a bold statement by having a paint color developed especially for you—or the veneers crafted from a tree on your estate. Dedicated to bringing your vision to life, this is the Bespoke service."

If have you \$10+ million or so and a tree you want to remove from your estate and turn into door handles, the Bespoke service is right for you.

"Sweptail is the automotive equivalent of haute couture," comments Giles Taylor, director of design at Rolls-Royce Motor Cars. "It is a Rolls-Royce designed and hand tailored to fit a specific customer. This customer came to the House of Rolls-Royce with



an idea shared in the creative process where we advised him on his cloth, and then we tailored that cloth to him. You might say we cut the cloth for the suit of clothes that he will be judged by."

Take the roof for example. This one feature is a work of art in itself. The single piece of glass is likely the largest piece of glass ever installed in a production vehicle. The glass begins wide, like the front end, and tapers toward the sloping rear of the vehicle. The arcing arrow shape provides a sleekness to an otherwise bulky coupe. The effect is sunlight dancing off an interior that signifies excellence in every way.

There's a veritable forest of hardwood inside the Sweptail. Macassar Ebony clings to the surface of nearly everything that isn't leather. Paldao wood joins the mix, making for a design studio any finish carpenter would drool over. Along with the usual door handles and dash trim, the owner asked Rolls-Royce to install a shelf for his hat, which makes for a wonderful display of craftsmanship and undoubtedly the perfect place to put a hat.

A handcrafted set of Rolls-Royce Sweptail luggage was also designed specifically to fit the dimensions of the vehicle. Embedded in both doors are compartments made to the exact dimensions of the client's attaché case. The case perfectly fits his laptop. These "secret"



compartments make for cozy and couture ways to carry a device and blend the function seamlessly into the vehicle frame.

Behind the two front seats, a luggage area serves as a place to display more handiwork. The metallic rack and polished wood veneer showcases the Sweptail moniker emblazoned on the wood shelf. Illuminated by the glass roof, the rear teardrop is one part display case, one part functional storage area.

The entire interior screams simplicity the way Leonardo's David whispers strength. Both masterpieces make form function to their advantage. The icing on the Sweptail cake is the inner console. At the touch of a button, a one-of-a-kind mechanism deploys a bottle of the owner's favorite champagne—and two glasses.

The little things mean a lot and the Sweptail is loaded with meaning. Not to mention the V-12 under the hood that

becomes a virtual afterthought in all the gasping over the custom elements. Many manufacturers claim that, "No detail was overlooked in the making of this model." Rolls-Royce sweeps those would-be competitors aside with the Sweptail.

We can only hope that some day the Sweptail will sit in a museum for the world to see, just as other art pieces of its caliber do.
