We welcome the American Express team to the valley and support Mickelson and American Express in their efforts to create an exciting new chapter for this tournament that has long been an integral part of our


desert community. We begin our coverage of the upcoming event on pg. 12.

It's time to get ready, time for the glitz, glamour, high golf anxiety and rock and roll that make up the desert's PGA Tour event. In 2020, organizers expect to see all of the above ramped up as a new, high-powered title sponsor steps in to add punch and prestige.

The American Express, the Desert Classic tournament's new name, will be played January 16-19 on the same La Quinta-based courses as last year—PGA West Stadium and Tournament courses and La Quinta Country Club. With society currently engaged in fall and winter sports, not to mention upcoming major holidays, the new year and the PGA Tour's 2020 calendar seem a long way off. But behind the scenes, things are coming together.



"Everything is rocking and rolling. The American Express is coming to town and it's going to be the biggest and best one yet," says Jeff Sanders of Lagardere Sports, the tournament's executive director. "We're getting set to deliver some great entertainment to all our fans. You know how we do it. It's golf by day, music by night. It's Golfchella."

Player commitments tend to come rolling in around the first of December, and the American Express stands ready to benefit from the second year of the PGA Tour's adjusted majors' calendar. Top players who might have considered skipping the tournament in the past, when the season's second major wasn't just over a month after the first, front-loaded their schedules in 2019. The former Desert Classic benefitted greatly, boasting one of its best fields in years.

Sanders believes the event is positioned perfectly during the tour's West Coast swing. As a result, many players will come to the desert and establish a base for The American Express and the other Southern California events on the schedule," he says.

Those players will often come in early to practice, particularly if they haven't been playing a lot of golf over the holidays, then shift their seasons into high-gear. "I know that's what Phil says," notes Sanders, referring to tournament host Phil Mickelson. "He likes to



come here early and get ready for the tournament, then put the tee in the ground and get it going, get the new year kicked off right."

While the field has yet to be set, it's already known that many of the off-course fan favorites from last year will return to PGA West for 2020, including Michelob Ultra Beers for Birdies on 16 and Casamigos Club 17 on the par-3 17th. The Albertsons/Vons Fan Pavilion, an all-access, enclosed party area behind the Stadium Course's 18th green, is set to expand based on last year's demand.

The golf festival theme continues in the ticket booth. Sanders says the tournament will once again offer its one-price ticket (\$30 per day, \$75 for five days), which allows holders into every area and every event, including the now-famous music concerts the tournament puts on after Friday's second round and Saturday's third round.

"It's all about having the most inexpensive ticket on the PGA Tour," he adds, "which gets you into all the venues—no extra charge beyond the ticket price for that day. It's all inclusive and that's by design. We don't want to lock anyone out due to pricing and we're excited about that. The buzz is back in the valley. We want to have the biggest crowds we've ever had. It'll be a great year for charities, a great year for fans, so let's go have some fun."

Sanders couldn't yet confirm this year's musical guests but did say one of the nights could be, "for sure the biggest night we've ever had in the three years we've been here." If all goes well, the acts will be announced in late November.

For Sanders personally, the difference in prep this year when contrasted with previous years is the enthusiastic support of American Express chairman and CEO, Steve Squeri. Sanders says Squeri has been "very involved and very supportive," and is planning to attend the event.

"American Express has come in with a multiyear agreement that gives us the solid foundation we've been looking for. With them as our title sponsor, the event is on solid footing for years to come. We needed them to be successful and they're looking forward to putting on a great show. It's going to be another great



Tn 1981, Ray Moore, an eight-time doubles titles champion, partnered with Charlie Pasarell, winner of 23 singles titles and ▲30 doubles titles, to oversee a tournament that would ultimately become known as the BNP Paribas Open, one of the world's most popular sporting events.

For years, they hosted the tournament at various locations around the Coachella Valley, including La Quinta Resort & Club and the Grand Champions Hotel. But they always desired to have their own tennis facility, one that would welcome the sport's

After almost two decades of discussion, this dream was finally transformed into reality when the legendary founder and chairman of IMG, Mark McCormack, joined forces with Pasarell and Moore to privately fund Indian Wells Tennis Garden (IWTG). Designed by Rosetti Associates Architects, Indian Wells Tennis Garden was constructed in 1999 and opened in March 2000 to the delight of fans, players and sponsors.

Developed to take advantage of the majestic backdrop of the Coachella Valley and provide fans with access to first-class tennis matches and unparalleled dining options, IWTG wowed the tennis industry when it hosted the Tennis Masters Series Indian Wells, which was presented by *Newsweek* that spring.

The Tennis Gardens not only featured a spectacular 54-acre landscape but also offered players and patrons a state-of-the art facility that included the 16,100-seat Stadium 1, the world's second largest outdoor tennis-specific stadium.

Over the next nine years, the well-received and highly attended facility hosted some of the game's most popular and talented players, including Andre Agassi, Roger Federer, Rafael Nadal and Novak Djokovic, along with Lindsay Davenport, Serena Williams, Kim Clijsters and Maria Sharapova. As the tournament and facility continued to become increasingly popular with each passing year, Oracle cofounder and CEO Larry Ellison, a tennis enthusiast, decided to purchase both from Pasarell and Moore.

Seeking to ensure that the original vision of a facility designed and built to attract the game's greatest players year after year remained fully intact, Ellison focused on renovating and adding onto the property after buying it in 2009, the same year that BNP Paribas became the tournament's new title sponsor.

Preparing for the Future

In preparation for the 2014 BNP Paribas Open, a new, permanent 8,000-seat stadium, aka Stadium 2, was added to the mix. In addition to the new stadium, three permanent restaurants,





including world-famous Nobu, were opened, each overlooking the on-court action. New practice courts, as well as a 19,000-square-foot shade structure adjacent to one that had been installed in 2012, were also constructed.

"Stadium 2 is beloved by fans and players alike and has hosted some of the

most memorable matches in tournament history," says Philippe Dore, marketing director, Indian Wells Tennis Garden. "It's particularly known for electrifying nighttime doubles action."

In 2015, as IWTG celebrated its 15th birthday, Ellison decided to fund a variety of renovations and additions in two separate phases, the first before the 2016 BNP Paribas Open and the second prior to the 2017 tournament. Upon completion, Stadium 1 featured new seats, remodeled suites, a VIP Champions Club, a lowered court surface to accommodate recessed television cameras and 21 new restaurants and concession areas, including Wolfgang Puck's renowned Spago.

"Additional improvements were made outside of Stadium 1, too," Dore adds, "most notably the now permanent Stadium Plaza and Superwall, which provide a relaxing area for fans to grab a beverage and view matches live on screen."

An Unparalleled Tennis Garden

Due to the dramatic setting of Indian Wells Tennis Garden, the outstanding play of the world's biggest stars and the overall atmosphere for which Southern California is known, the BNP Paribas Open has been referred to as Tennis Paradise. In recognition of this moniker, the tournament announced the launch of its Full Bloom campaign ahead of the 2018 event, a celebration of IWTG's pristine beauty from its palm trees and flowers to its designated park area where fans can relax, dine and socialize.

That successful marketing campaign is now being followed by the Welcome to Tennis Garden messaging, which features three primary elements that make the BNP Paribas Open unique. Welcome to Delicious recognizes the facility's restaurants and food vendors, Welcome to Excitement focuses on the on-court action and Welcome to Delightful emphasizes the Coachella Valley's exquisiteness—all of this as IWTG prepares to celebrate its 20th birthday.

"Twenty years is a remarkable milestone," Dore says. "We're confident that the 2020 BNP Paribas Open will once again delight fans from around the world as they travel to 'tennis paradise' for an unparalleled experience in the desert."

The 2019 Pickleball Championships are a Wrap

This popular sport is pushing boundaries and gaining momentum

Year two of the Margaritaville USA Pickleball National Championships concluded nine days of spirited competition at Indian Wells Tennis Garden. The largest tournament in pickleball history, the 2019 event drew 2,500 players of all ages and skill levels to the world-class facilities and amenities of this spectacular sports

Easily one of the most exciting outcomes from the final weekend of play came on Saturday, November 9, when the mother-daughter team of Leigh Waters and Anna Leigh Waters were crowned champions of the Women's Doubles Open division. They edged out the duo of Catherine Parenteau and Jessie Irvine in a match that saw plenty of back-and-forth action. Winning the gold

medal at Nationals is a gratifying achievement for any player, but it's especially sweet for this family team, which had the crowd behind them all the way on championship court as they proved that the combination of youth and experience was the perfect strategy for

Saturday's other gold-medal winners included Lisa Naumu and Kris Anderson in the Women's Doubles Senior Open, Brian Poynter and Dave Weinbach in the Men's Doubles Senior Open and Kyle Yates and Ben Johns in the Men's Doubles Open.

Sunday's gold-medal match continued the scrimmage. In addition to year-long bragging rights, the Open division players competed throughout the day for a piece of the record-high

\$80,000 total cash purse, with top doubles prize winners receiving \$5,000 and singles players netting \$2,500. Many of the sport's most well-known pros took to the courts to battle it out for gold medals and singles glory.

The Women's Singles Senior Open division was the first final of the day, which pitted Cammy MacGregor and Moira Roush against each other for gold. While surprise finalist Roush put up a worthy fight, it wasn't enough to withstand the consistent play that MacGregor channeled on Sunday, as the 2018 champion defended her title in impressive fashion.

On the Men's side of the Singles Senior Open division, Paul Olin and Scott Moore contested a hard-fought final, which saw Olin take the top prize after also having taken the gold in the Men's Skill/Age Singles Senior 5.0 division earlier in the week.

In the Men's Singles Open division, a crowded field of more than 32 participants included all three of the medalists from the 2018 Nationals, with Tyson McGuffin, Tyler Loong and Ben Johns all vying to reach the singles podium once again. As competitors were eliminated, it was clear that none were a match for Johns, who took a decisive straight-set victory that further solidified his place as one of the most dominant forces in pickleball today.

As the sun began to set, the Women's Singles Open finalists took to the championship court for the last final. Two of the biggest names in the women's game, Lucy Kovalova and Simone Jardim, engaged in an epic battle that required extra points to be decided. Defending champion Kovalova was outperformed by Jardim who



proved her mastery here, collecting gold medals in Women's Skill/Age Doubles and Mixed Doubles Open before her title run

The sport has come a long way from its roots as a backyard children's game in the 1960s. This all-inclusive paddleboard game—combining tennis, badminton and table tennis—includes

two or four players who use solid paddles made of wood or composite materials to hit a perforated polymer ball, similar to a Wiffle ball, over the net. The sport uses the dimensions and layout of a badminton court and a net and rules similar to tennis. The origin of the game's name is thought to be derived from founder Joel Pritchard's family cocker spaniel, Pickles, who loved to chase stray balls and hide them in the

Pickleball is clearly on the upswing in popularity and participation. Its explosive growth is reflected not only in the quality of players participating in the National Championships but also in the crossover of players from other sports, namely tennis and racquetball, and to some degree golf



and gymnastics. Competition is governed by the United States Pickleball Association (USAPA), launched in 2005.

Every U.S. state, all Canadian provinces and many international countries now have pickleball venues, which numbered 6,500 locations in 2018.

The year 2018 began an exciting new chapter for the sport's premiere event as USA Pickleball and Desert Champions, LLC, partnered on a multiyear agreement to host the tournament at renowned Indian Wells Tennis Garden, featuring 45 championship-caliber pickleball courts and the world's largest pickleball championship court.

This popular North American sport is clearly taking off around the world, and

fans can expect to see greater momentum across the globe. Organizers have already set the date for next year's championships, scheduled for Oct. 31 to Nov. 8, 2020, again at Indian Wells Tennis Garden. Mark your calendars now because next year is sure to be another nice get!

Tom Flores

on the Oakland Raiders, Las Vegas and Antonio Brown

The desert resident and NFL great offers his perspective on football past and present

Valley resident Tom Flores isn't as involved with the NFL and his old team as he used to be. But he's as interested in the NFL as he's ever been, thanks in part to the interesting times in which we live.

A Super Bowl champion as a player and assistant coach, and two-time winner as head coach with the Los Angeles/Oakland Raiders, the 82-year old Flores spends a majority of his weekdays relaxing in his Indian Wells Country Club home, rehabilitating a January shoulder surgery that's kept him off the golf course this year. Weekends when the Raiders play at home are spent in Oakland, where he hosts the club's initiative with Oakland-Alameda County youth, including the Boys and Girls Clubs. Flores and former Raiders offensive lineman Lincoln Kennedy meet with kids at the Oakland Arena prior to home games, speak to them about the issues of the day, have lunch, then walk to the Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum to take in the game.

"We entertain the kids before the game starts at the Coliseum where the Warriors used to play—which, incidentally, it's sad that they're gone," says Flores. "The kids are there as guests of the Raiders, and these are East Bay, Oakland-Alameda kids. It's important to them and it's important to the Raiders organization to build a relationship with them."

With more distance between himself and the league, Flores has his own big-picture perspective on the NFL, and he believes it's in an "excellent" position. That said, he notes, times today are vastly different than they were only 10 to 15 years ago, and not just on the football field. Flores cites the curious case of Antonio Brown to point out how modern athletes are treated and how they conduct themselves.

"So many of the negatives are out there. You read about them in the paper," he says. "But so many of the positives you don't read about, like myself and what I'm doing right now with the Raiders and the Boys and Girls Clubs."

And he says there are many other charity events that players and teams around the league sponsor that you also don't hear about. "Instead, you hear about guys like Antonio Brown. Who wants to read about him anymore? You know, he poisoned himself. Nobody did anything to him other than try and help him. And trying to help him, you enabled him and look what he left you with. It's sad to see, but it happens."

As for the Raiders, Flores believes the sky is the limit. He cites the fact that Oakland fans still flock to games even knowing the team will be heading for Las Vegas at the end of the season. Vegas stadium seats are selling like hotcakes, and the team's Southern Nevada location, not to mention the glitzy attractions of modern-day Vegas, should serve to tempt longtime fans to make at least a few trips to Vegas to watch their team—and maybe throw the dice or see a show after.

"I think it's an exciting time for the Raiders," Flores says. "I personally would rather them stay in Oakland because that's where I started in 1960 and that's where they belong historically. But there's a lot offolks who still believe the Dodgers should be in Brooklyn. I'll always feel that way about Oakland because that's where Jim Otto and I started in 1960 on the first day of camp, and we're still with the organization. We have a great affinity for them."

Yet he calls the move to Las Vegas exciting. "The new stadium there is going to be dynamite. They have a natural crowd there. There's all those casinos and hotels. It's perfect for people coming into town. I'm sure most of the hotels are buying the luxury suites for their guests. It's a party town, it's a fun town and they'll get a Super Bowl because of that stadium and that city. It's a different world now for the lil' ol' Oak land Baiders."

ONE OF THE VALLEY'S FAVORITE EVENTS RETURNS IN FEBRUARY

The Southern California desert has its great traditions. There's its staple PGA Tour event, top-fight tennis championship, Palm Desert's golf car parade and Village Fest. Another of its great traditions is Pete Carlson's Golf & Tennis Golf Expo. Celebrating its 16th year, the expo will once again celebrate the desert lifestyle by bring the latest in golf equipment and gear to Palm Desert just when it's needed—at the beginning of the desert's winter golf

The 2020 event is scheduled for the weekend of Feb. 7 and 8 at its traditional home, the College Golf Center on the campus of the College of the Desert, located on Fred Waring Drive between San Pablo and San Anselmo avenues. The center's driving range will be converted into a wonderland for golfers with displays, demonstrations, equipment galore and a selection of food and drink for those who work up a hunger and/or thirst sorting through all the gear. If there's a big name in the equipment industry, chances are it will be represented at the event, and most manufacturers will offer special discounts and pricing in conjunction with the expo.

Of course, one of the biggest advantages of conducting the expo at the College Golf Center is having plenty of room for all the vendors any golfer would hope to encounter. Another is that patrons don't just see equipment with their own eyes and hold it in their hands in a static environment. At the expo, golfers can take prospective purchases to the driving range or putting green and test them to validate their personal effectiveness.

Along with equipment displays and offerings of sustenance, there will also be attractions such as golf trick-shot artist Joey O, who will perform shows each day at 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. "Mr. 59," aka Al Geiberger, longtime desert resident with 20 wins on the PGA Tour, will also be on hand to conduct a short-game clinic each day at noon. Geiberger may be joined by one of his sons, who are also short-game masters. What's almost guaranteed, however, is that Geiberger will spin a story or two for clinic attendees. And of course, Pete Carlson's love of jazz will be reflected at the event as well, with George Cebra's Jazz Quintet also scheduled to perform.

While many of the valley's traditions require tickets, even if the cost of admission is beyond fair, it doesn't get any fairer than free, which is what it costs to take in the golf expo. The expo runs from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day, and parking is available in the COD's established parking areas.

Tred "The Hammer" Williamson was known for his aggressive nature and his "hammer" blow when he was a defensive back for the Oakland Raiders and Kansas City Chiefs during those teams' first brushes with greatness in the 1960s.

When his football career ended, he took his hammer act to Hollywood, where he became known as Tommy Gibbs in the films Black Caesar and Hell Up In Harlem, Jesse Crowder in Death Journey, No Way Back and Blind Rage; and Detective Bob Malone in Black Cobra 1, 2, 3 and 4.

These days, however, particularly in the Coachella Valley, Williamson is known for being a great friend to the Wounded Warrior Project, the primary beneficiary of his upcoming golf

The Fred "The Hammer" Williamson Celebrity Invitational Golf Tournament, benefitting the Wounded Warrior Project, is scheduled for January 11-12 at Eagle Falls Golf Course at Indio's Fantasy Springs Resort Casino. The event begins on the evening of Friday the 11th, with a registration and pairings party at the 12th Floor Cocktail Lounge and Wine Bar at Fantasy Springs. A silent auction will also be conducted.

Those who only know Williamson for his flamboyant style might be surprised to learn he was a member of the U.S. Marine



Corps himself, serving for six years beginning in 1955, so the connection with the Wounded Warrior Project came naturally.

"A lot of my old buddies, a lot of old washed up football players and a lot of my old movie pals are coming in, along with a lot of Marines," says Williamson, who will travel to Europe after the tournament to take part in two movie shoots. "It's a feel-good thing for me and it's a feel-good thing for them."



Pro Football Hall of Fame member Jim Brown, who starred in several films with Williamson, including Three The Hard Way and Take A Hard Ride, is expected to attend, as is former NFL wide receiver and Olympic sprinter Willie Gault. Also expected is Coffy and Foxy Brown star Pam Grier; Richard Roundtree, star of the original Shaft series of films; and former NFL/Azusa Pacific running back Christian Okoye, a.k.a. "The Nigerian Nightmare."

The main event occurs Saturday the 12th when the field gets its crack at Eagle Falls, the widely acclaimed Clive Clark design known



The Jerry Weintraub Celebrity Pro-Am Golf Tournament

An upscale event where integrity scores high for charity

"If something's good and you believe in it, and you care about it... it's going to happen."— Jerry Weintraub

Unless there's been some serious cave dwelling going on in your life for the past few decades, it's impossible not to have heard of Jerry Weintraub. The film and television mega-producer, promotor, writer and actor passed away in 2015, but his largerthan-life legacy lives on through numerous projects that bear his name, one of which is the upcoming "Jerry II," the 2nd Annual Jerry Weintraub Celebrity Pro-Am golf tournament, set for December 8-9 at The Madison Club in La Quinta, California.

Weintraub's name is probably most closely associated with such films as Nashville, Diner, The Karate Kid (1984) and, of course, the 2001 remake of Ocean's Eleven, for which he founded JW Productions. In addition to producing the sequels Ocean's Twelve (2004) and Ocean's Thirteen (2007), he appeared in all the "Ocean's" films.

In 2018, his son, Michael Weintraub, in partnership with philanthropist Michael Milken, founder of the Prostate Cancer Foundation (PCF), spearheaded the effort to coordinate a golf tournament in his father's memory. "The Jerry" was launched primarily to benefit PCF, along with the Discovery Land Company Foundation and the Weintraub Center for Reconstructive Biotechnology at UCLA. What better location to hold the event than the posh Madison Club, of which Weintraub was a founding member.

What's truly jaw-dropping is the degree of star-power involved in the tournament. Celebrities and sports stars confirmed to play include George Lopez, Alfonso Ribeiro, Rick Dees, Dennis Haysbert, John O'Hurley, Bruce McGill, Patrick Warburton, Chicago bandmembers Jason Scheff and Danny Seraphine, Canadian NHL player Russ Courtnall, actor and athlete Vinnie Jones, baseball players David Justice and Robin Ventura and many others. Don Cheadle, Cheech Marin, Josh Duhamel, Dennis Quaid and Jack Wagner are among guests also invited.

The magnetism of the tournament goes way beyond the senior Weintraub's celebrity connections. Sure, he knew and worked with every power hitter in Hollywood, business and politics, but the deeper story is the respect his name engenders.

Michael says, "Dad was someone whom everyone loved. His career spanned decades, to every corner of the entertainment industry including television, film, music and the Broadway stage. And if you called him for help, he'd do anything he could."

Tournament director Chris Conway, PGA member and senior director of corporate development and sports initiatives for PCF, adds, "Jerry Weintraub was a man of great charisma and truly a friend to everyone. He and his family developed close relationships

with the talented people he worked with throughout his career. Jerry was extremely benevolent and this benevolence has been carried on by his son, Michael Weintraub, in projects like this."

In other words, the Weintraub name is synonymous with integrity, which is at the core of this second year of the pro-am. The tournament garners additional attention because of the venue. The Madison Club offers "comfort stations" on course, an amenity which translates into plenty of great food and drink, which is why it's earned the moniker, "home of the five-pound round."

The club is considered by many to be among the most exclusive golf clubs in the country. Its 18-hole course was designed by Tom Fazio, and membership in the Club is limited to 225 members. Famous members and residents include such luminaries as World Golf Hall of Famer Phil Mickelson, Nike chairman Phil Knight and music and entertainment executive Irving Azoff, although the club is known for its extreme privacy.

The Jerry II starts off with a welcome dinner and pairings party on Sunday. Dec. 8, which will be co-emceed by Michael Weintraub and close family friend, Billy Bush, nephew of former president George H.W. Bush and cousin of former president George W. Bush. As a matter of fact, Jerry Weintraub and his family's friendship with the Bush family goes back decades to when they were East Coast neighbors. The dinner will include a live auction and live entertainment from Chicago Transit Authority, led by legendary Chicago drummer, Danny Seraphine.

On Monday, the tournament day begins with morning warmups and a shotgun start at 10 a.m. Approximately 100 golfers are expected, each having stepped up to donate \$15,000 for one player spot and invitation with one guest to the welcome dinner. Each oncourse grouping features three amateurs, a pro and a celebrity.

Following golf, there will be an awards party and a shoot-out where four players will compete for closest to the hole, with the winner nabbing a "bucket-list experience" trip to Ireland, courtesy of Garmany Golf & Travel.


From start to finish, the tournament is first class. But the takeaway here is the focus on charity, and in a big way. Last year's event netted \$400,000 in proceeds, and Conway expects that the 2019 event will bring in close to half a million dollars.

As Michael Weintraub says, "My dad left a legacy to my sisters and me, and we are proud to carry that on. He lived by a code of honor and beyond that, he made everyone feel that their presence mattered and made a difference. My dad was all about helping people, and that's what this signature tournament does."


There are two theories behind executing challenging tee shots with your driver. 1) Aim toward the trouble and then spin your ball away from that trouble. 2) Aim toward lesser trouble and then spin your ball toward the fairway while not over spinning it into trouble.

The Tee shot on the 18th hole at PGA West Stadium Course is a great hole on which to test these two theories, with water looming along the entire left side of the fairway and bunkers up the right. This intimidating tee shot will challenge many of the PGA Tour's best at the 2020 American Express, January 16-19.

Theory 1: Aim at prominent trouble and spin the ball away from that trouble

This is a technique I enjoy playing and challenging myself with in my own game, a technique I practiced when I was learning from Hall of Fame golfer Johnny Miller. He would have me go out on the golf course, aim at the trouble and make myself spin the ball away from it. In the case of No. 18 at PGA West, I like to aim at the water going up the left side of the fairway and swing as if I'm actually trying to hit the ball into the edge of that water. As I'm swinging through, however, I intentionally leave the toe of the clubface open through impact, which promotes a cut spin on the ball.

Since my swing path is moving in the direction of the water, my ball launches straight as if it's going to go into the water. But because I leave the toe open, my ball spins away from the water and lands safely in the middle of the fairway. You can see at the top of my backswing that I have my left wrist flat with a slightly open clubface. As I go into the finish of my swing, my left wrist is still flat, which means I've held off that clubface from turning over. The holding off of the clubface helps me produce a slight cut spin on the ball.





Theory 2: Aim at lesser trouble and spin the ball to the fairway

The tricky thing about playing the tee shot on No. 18 of the PGA West Stadium Course is that the tee aims you to the right where a group of bunkers wait for your golf ball. The fairway angles back to the left. This hole is calling out to players to hit a hard draw, which is right up my alley. In my setup, I aim at a group of small bunkers in the distance, which sit a little right of the fairway. These bunkers are my intended launch line on my ball's flight.

At the top of the backswing, you can see that my left wrist is flat. But near the finish of my follow-through, I have "released" my left wrist so it's no longer flat and I've rotated the clubface to promote a draw spin. I don't want to over spin the ball across the fairway into the water, so I need to have a good feel for how much to release the angle of the clubface to promote the appropriate amount of spin. Ball spin is controlled by how much the wrist releases the clubface. In this case, I released my wrist just enough so the clubface is at a slightly closed angle to promote a slight draw spin on the ball, just enough to have the ball spin into the fairway.







Pick a shot and trust it

It's critical to have clarity as to which type of shot you want to execute. I start by going behind the ball on my intended target line. When I hold my club up, I'm drawing a line in my mind on the direction I want the ball to be launched into the air. As I hold the golf club up pointing in the desired launch direction, I rotate the clubface to match the angle I want the ball to spin in order to land in the fairway. Taking the time to create that visual clarity helps me commit in my swing to the launch and spin direction I



Thether you're living it up in downtown Palm Springs, kicking back in Palm Desert or experiencing the good life in Rancho Mirage, you're enjoying a vibrant real estate market that continues to grow across the Coachella Valley. Sales are up over last year, and prices are pursuing an upward trend.

Condos, townhomes, single-family detached residences, country-club estates and masterful custom compounds are all popular in the valley today. Overall, the average median price, as of October 2019, is \$400,000, an increase of 3.4% over the same period last year. Detached homes represented the most gains, with 755 selling on average per month compared to 737 last year.

For the detached-home market, Cathedral City and Palm Springs saw the biggest price gains through the third quarter of 2019, with Cathedral City up 7.5% to \$338,500 and Palm Springs up 7.1% to \$624,450. Palm Springs is the first city in the region to surpass the "bubble highs" of 2006. Average days on the market for these homes in Palm Springs remain at about three months, even as prices rise rapidly.

La Quinta and Indian Wells are the only valley cities to experience reduced prices in detached homes. This October, the average price was \$450,000 in La Quinta, down 0.5% from 2018, while Indian Wells now averages \$1 million, down 4.8% from last

Results for other Coachella Valley cities are: Indio: \$340.000, +4.6% City of Coachella: \$267,000. +3.5% Desert Hot Springs: \$231.000. +2.7% Palm Desert: \$415,000, +0.9% Rancho Mirage: \$674,500, +0.5%

Desert Hot Springs joins La Ouinta and Indio in the attached-home market, with all three experiencing price reductions in townhomes and condos. Desert Hot Springs is down 34.1% from last year to \$100,000; La Quinta has dropped 7.8% to \$360,000; and Indio fell 7.5% to \$220.000.

Results for attached homes in other cities are: Cathedral City: \$189.960, +13.3% Indian Wells: \$420.000, +5.7% Palm Springs: \$260,000, +4.0% Palm Desert: \$292,500, +3.9% Rancho Mirage: \$340,000, +1.5% City of Coachella: No information available for attached homes.

As you can see, with only a few exceptions, the Coachella Valley real estate market is looking up, especially when drastic seasonal trends are factored in. We're welcoming a broader spectrum of residents than ever before, with millennials and Gen-Xers drawn to the desert away from the high-priced coastal cities of Southern California. Seniors still retire here, favoring high-end private communities, and people from San Francisco, the Pacific Northwest and beyond are making the desert their permanent or part-time home.

The region is also welcoming an array of new-home communities. Palm Springs is a hot market now for contemporary attached, zero-lot-line, courtyard and detached homes. New neighborhoods, including Vibe and Icon, are a hit. North Palm Springs' 309-acre guard-gated Miralon community is about to unveil models for several neighborhoods in what's being hailed as the city's first "agrihood." Once planned as a golf course, Miralon's



open space will be home to vast olive groves, expected to produce 15,000 gallons of olive oil every year when the trees mature.

Models are now open at Lido at Terra Lago in Indio, where residents will enjoy lakefront living. Cathedral City's District enclave was so successful that it will soon be joined by District East, and Prado Pointe is a hit with home buyers in the City of Coachella.

Of course, the desert region is renowned for its golf, shopping, dining and cultural attractions, and more are coming soon. Palm Desert's prestigious El Paseo shopping district is enjoying a fresh array of improvements and restaurants, and Palm Springs will celebrate the grand opening of the Agua Caliente Cultural Museum, plaza and spa in 2020.

As we look ahead to a new year, we do so knowing that our real estate market is strong and growing. Not only are more people choosing to make Coachella Valley their home, more are also making it their No. 1 destination for vacations, celebrations, weddings and spur-of-the-moment road trips. For Sale: Changes at Coachella Valley Golf Clubs Some have sold, some are up for sale and there's optimism for changes to come

esert Falls Country Club in Palm Desert changed hands recently and the new general manager, Mike Jick, is still getting used to his current surroundings. But that isn't stopping him from conjuring up big plans for the club, and the new owner is on board, providing the necessary backing, funds and encouragement.

"If it's the vision that we're talking about, and it looks like we're going that way, I like our chances," Jick says. "It's a good golf course. Things were done in the past that were corporate and unnecessary. If we can put that money into the course, it's going to have a big effect on member retention."

Formerly one of the desert crown jewels in the ClubCorp portfolio, Desert Falls CC was purchased by a private owner, Kelvin Jung, in mid-October. Jick says Jung, who is making his first foray into golf course and club ownership, bought the property because he'd seen how other nearby clubs and courses operate and felt he could do a better job.

"Desert Falls assisted with the sale, so now you have this guy who owns several day spas buying the golf course and all the equipment and he has committed to making the club and the course spectacular. Now," Jick continues, "I'm the guy that gets to make all the new rules, adjust job descriptions and try not to upset too many people. I'm just going to try to smooth things out a little bit."

Desert Falls is just one of many golf courses in the Coachella Valley that have either recently changed hands, are in the process of changing hands or are on the block available for purchase. Because golf is so important to the valley and property transitions and sales involve such large investments, entities tend to play it close to the vest until a deal is actually on paper.

But it's a fact that other clubs and courses are considering their future in the current golf market. It's a constant battle between ownership, property value, revenue generation and recreational opportunities—opportunities that were a massive part of making the desert what it is today. When the invisible hand moves against any golf course, there's immediate blowback, be it from former members who no longer have a club of their own, property owners counting on a golf course nearby to enhance their home value or daily-fee players seeing another of their limited desert options disappear.

The legendary Bermuda Dunes Country Club has a new owner. South Korea-based SJS Tomorrow, which has purchased several high-end courses in Southern California over the last handful of years, bought the club in October with plans to make it more exclusive and more private. That's a new philosophy for golfcourse buyers who have typically purchased old-line country clubs with the intention of making them *more* accessible to the public.

The plan is to do just the opposite at Bermuda Dunes. The new owners intend to invest in areas that should make the club more of a sanctuary for existing members and more of a draw to younger and new potential members seeking a private-club option.

Monterrey Country Club and Palm Valley Country Club have also just sold and are now owned by National Golf Properties, which purchased the courses from American Golf Corporation. AGC will continue to manage the clubs through its private club arm, American Golf Country Clubs.

Meanwhile, Indian Springs in Indio hasn't changed owners; Canadian entrepreneur Ken Hanna is still running the show after purchasing the club in 2015. But it has officially changed its name to become more synonymous with the wildly successful Big Rock Pub on the golf course property. Now, perhaps appropriately, it's called the Big Rock Golf Course at Indian Springs, capturing the rock-and-roll essence of the pub together with the well-established course name regulars and out-of-towners recognize. The entire shebang is now referred to as Big Rock Golf & Pub at Indian Springs.

Back at Desert Falls, Jick and Jung are currently absorbed in plans to renovate the clubhouse, including the repaving of the front drive. Maintenance equipment, new automatic doors, electrical improvements and lighting updates are all on the drawing board. Jick says he and Jung basically move throughout the club on a daily basis, with Jung pointing out what needs to happen next.

"He's doing all the right stuff and he's going to make the place look a lot better," Jick says. "It's a very positive thing, It's a new thing for him and a little overwhelming at times. But right now, the members are hopeful for change and improvement and it's a work

Chef Andie Hubka's darling Cork and Fork is known for its addictively creative cuisine and wine dinners that sell out fast once posted online. In addition to fan



Tord's Shelby Mustang GT is as iconic a sports car as ever \dashv made. The 2020 Shelby GT500 bolsters the image of the American supercar by adding muscle and styling to rival anything on the market.

The hand-built 5.2 liter V8 is stunning. From the note of the exhaust to the ragingly aggressive horsepower, the Mustang isn't a mild-mannered show horse this year. With a nearly laughable 760 horsepower, the Shelby GT 500 is the most powerful Mustang ever made. It shoots out of the gate with a 0-60 mph time of 3.3 seconds. Yes, less than 4 seconds. That's McLaren fast and every bit the brawn of a Dodge Challenger.

The body lines on the new Shelby GT 500 won't disappoint aficionados of American muscle cars. A cobra on the grill and racing stripes harken to the early years. A spoiler adds muchneeded down draft and a sporty look that makes clear this Mustang is raring to go. Large 20-inch carbon-fiber wheels and a carbonfiber hood scoop round out a look that's going to be "posterized" on the wall of every red-blooded American boy's room.

The front end is muscular. Huge air intakes juxtapose two headlamp slits that look cobra-like. Edges knife behind the doors while the roof curves in an aerodynamic move that screams speed. A view from the rear says everything: "Eat my dust."

Ford put enormous disc brakes on the front end of the GT to slow the ponies under the hood, and the handling of the GT 500 is second to none. While its front-end weight makes getting immediate rear-wheel traction impossible, keeping the horses responsive isn't a problem. Coming in and out of turns with this tight chassis is a dream; the soft brake pedal and responsive steering wheel let you know exactly what's coming and provide confidence in the corners.

With the optional track package, Ford boots the back seat to save weight, making it slightly less practical. But honestly, the back seat of the Mustang hasn't been useful for passengers since the 1960s.



The 7-speed, dual-clutch automatic transmission comes with several modes for making the most of the 625 lb-ft of torque the GT500 delivers. Drag Strip mode makes use of all the bells and whistles, from the dampers to the optimal engine rpm. Add to that an adjustable launch-control mode and you, the driver, are just along for the ride. Who needs skill when you have technology?

Inside the brain of the Shelby, timing is everything. Shift points happen after the computer simultaneously reads dozens of vehicle and environmental factors, including engine and transmission rpm, driver input and g forces. All these factors correlate to the optimum shift for every driving situation based on the selected mode. Steering-wheel-mounted paddle shifters are direct-wired to the transmission to cut milliseconds off the time between asking for a shift and getting a response. In a word, driving the Shelby GT

"Every aspect of the Shelby GT500 driving experience changes with the mode, be that the throttle responsiveness and snap of the shifts you feel in the seat of your pants, or the 'pop and burble' of the exhaust in performance modes," says Pat Morgan, Ford Performance powertrain manager. "It's a full multisensory visceral

And it's roomy inside, especially compared to others in the supercar category. While the cockpit is snug, the design is sensible and nothing feels awkward. The magnetorheological dampers keep the body under tight control and yet still take the shock out of hard impacts.

Fully loaded, the Shelby GT 500 will set you back about

Gowns dominate the Tom Ford Winter Collection

Dazzling dresses with attitude designed for strong, intelligent women

Designer Tom Ford knows his way around a catwalk, having served as creative director at luxury fashion houses Gucci and Yves Saint Laurent before launching his eponymous luxury brand in 2006.

His client list is powerful, including Beyoncé, Jennifer Lopez, Gwyneth Paltrow, Anne Hathaway, Daniel Craig, Tom Hanks, Johnny Depp, Ryan Gosling, Will Smith, Julianne Moore, Hugh Jackman and Jon Hamm, among many others. He designed Daniel Craig's suits for his last three James Bond films, Quantum of Solace, Skyfall and Spectre, and First Lady Michelle Obama wore an ivory floor-length evening gown designed by Ford to Buckingham Palace in 2011.

Ford has described the Tom Ford customer as international, cultured, well-traveled and possessing disposable income. His line is designed for "strong women intelligent women who know their own style."

Perusing the Tom Ford winter collection 2019-20, it's clear that the styles are confident and streamlined, direct and focused, just like the sensibilities of the women who dare to wear them.

A highlight for the seasonal collection, the Mirror Embroidered Column Gown is like no other, shaped into a column evening dress with long, sleek sleeves. Crafted of hand-placed mirror embroidery on a black tulle stretch base, the surface is constructed of a solid plexiglass mosaic with 100-percent plastic along with a blend of polyamide and elastane. The mosaic pieces are placed piece-by-piece by hand, requiring dexterity and concentration as if assembling an intricate jigsaw puzzle. An invisible tonal zip on the center back and sleeves lends for ease of dressing, and the dress has a back slit for comfort as well as a silk stretch crepe satin lining. It's well worth its \$39,930 price point, guaranteeing that everyone for miles around will reflect upon you.

More spectacular than the finest chandelier, the Crystal Embroidered Lace-Up **Dress** is a bold mini covered in crystal embroidery constructed of 100 percent plastic on a mix of polyamide and elastane on a silk georgette base. This short and spunky sheath is fully lined in stretch silk crepe satin. The deep v-neckline—deep as in all the way to the waist—is designed with metal loops along the neckline to accommodate grosgrain lacing that ties around the neck. Individual crystals, made from plastic and glass upon a silk backing, are embedded on rings mounted on organza. All of this flash is intentionally styled in a subdued gunmetal color. This feisty frock sells for \$25,000.

The mildly wild **Leopard Fringe Embroidery Gown** makes a solid choice for galas and parties alike, featuring an intricate column style crafted of silk fringe on a silk leopard base. Designed with a keyhole neckline, invisible back zip and silk satin stretch lining, the dress also displays a delicate silk satin georgette piping around the neckline. Long sleeves contrast with the deep opening along the bust, connected by two small bands while leaving just enough to the imagination. Constructed of silk and elastane to follow the body's contours with every move, this black and chalk animal patterned delight may be purchased for \$23,900.

Another flirty and ferocious style, the **Embroidered Leopard Silk Fringe Gown** is a mixed media halter-neck column evening dress with delicate embroidered 100percent silk fringe that falls in freeform from waist to floor. The detachable panther printed, pony hair leather scoop neck peplum top is bonded with leather and features





silk and satin piping around the perimeter. The hand-stitched embroidery uses silky yarns that require 72 hours to complete for each gown. The dress displays a gunmetal center back zip on the bustier and an invisible central back zip on the skirt. Available in fawn beige, the gown retails for \$17,500.

The Degrade Embroidery Twisted Front Dress is a sassy little mini with a deep v-neckline and bell sleeves. The small silk georgette shoulder pads balance the silhouette. The sleeves are crafted from single layer stretch tulle, finished with cuffs and mother-of-pearl button accents. A twisted construction along the center front has a stretch tulle layer draped by hand on a mannequin, meeting in a gathered section at the front of the waist. The fabric is a blend of degrade embroidery on stretch tulle with 100-percent plastic along with polyamide and elastane. Fully lined in satin, this fluffy number is available in royal purple or gray, the latter which transmits an ombré effect by the

positioning of the light and dark accents. The dress sells for \$16,500.

Just as the name suggests, the Liquid Sequin Mini Dress indeed looks like it could have been poured on. This longsleeve mini has a simple round neck, and its overwhelming simplicity adds to its high sophistication. Crafted of signature sequin embroidery, the sparkly shift is designed with an invisible zip at the back and fully lined in stretch silk crepe satin. Again applying the unique mix of plastic with polyamide and elastane, the light is refracted in such a way as to lend an appearance of pure liquid, fluid and grace throughout. This dress is presented in three vibrant colors: acid yellow, pink and purple, which means you should probably acquire all three in the interest of being thorough. All colors are available for \$5,890 each.

Adornments for today become heirlooms for tomorrow

There's a lot to be said for a thriving family business. Maison Picchiotti is a sparkling example of the years of passion, dedication and talent invested by generations of a lineage, not only to ensure success but also to cultivate customers' trust and loyalty.

Picchiotti was founded in 1967 by Giuseppe Picchiotti. Today, the family still operates the business, with each and every piece handcrafted in Valenza, Italy. Picchiotti designers create adornments for today that are destined to become heirlooms for generations yet to come. These pieces are architectural, featuring calibrated stones in well-proportioned shapes that support a minimalist aesthetic. The artistry lies in the tendency to not over-embellish yet to add just a dash of flair.

Seven members of the Picchiotti family oversee the company, channeling the culture and history of Italian tradition into the collections, often leaning toward acquisitions of colored stones such as rubies, sapphires and emeralds, particularly unheated, natural gems. And, of course, diamonds are a mainstay of the designs. Baguettes are cut one-by-one in a process called buff-top, lending a luminescent effect to each stone.

Umberto Picchiotti has said, "What I have learned in my life is to be respectful to others. Respect for others is a value that passes from generation to generation in our family."

Clearly, every Picchiotti design reinforces that reverence toward the company's clients.

The designers' strongest style signature lies in architectural silhouettes and graphic mosaics achieved with an extensive use of baguette-cuts. The **Stunning Studs** collection includes a perfect ring and earrings twosome, composed of meticulously plotted and expertly gauged buff-topped rubies surrounding eye-catching emerald-cut diamonds set in white gold. The ring's center diamond (12.64 tcw.) is nestled into a border of rubies measuring 12.30 tcw. It sells for \$597,100. The coordinating earrings showcase matching diamonds (14.21 tcw.) with similar buff-topped rubies all around (15.68 tcw). They're priced at \$448,900.

The Special Gems collection is devoted to the rarest and most vibrant colored gemstones with no indication of heating. A classic ring in this collection is set with an oval Sri Lanka vivid blue sapphire (22.03 tcw.) surrounded by signature, baguette-cut diamonds (2.63 tcw.). The shank is three-dimensionally set with a diamond micro-pavé on the sides (0.99 tcw.) and baguette diamonds along the center, all set in white gold. It's perfectly acceptable to call this one a "rock," and it's available for \$344,000.

Fit for a Queen collection includes a contemporary classic suite of pieces designed to highlight the cut and shape of octagonal emeralds set in white gold. The necklace displays a

series of these stunning Zambia vivid green emeralds (45.91 tcw.) alternating with linear geometric outlines of baguettecut diamonds (19.08 tcw.) and round diamonds (8.99 tcw.). This beauty retails for \$792,600. The coordinating earrings keep the focus on the sizable emerald (5.37 tcw. combined), again accented with dazzling baguette-cut diamonds (2.71 tcw.) and round diamonds (1.01 tcw.). These are available for \$97,000.

The **Flower Brooch** is the ultimate statement piece, ensuring that the world will look and listen. At the center lies a rare, cushion-cut, gem-quality, unheated Nigeria spessartite, a gemstone renowned for its brilliance and intense orange-red color, in this case measuring 28.67 tcw. This exotic gem is enhanced by sinuous petals of round white diamonds (26.39 tcw.) that gracefully radiate outward. This sparker sells for \$ 247,700.

Inspired by the geometry of Art Déco, the Décoratif **Collection** is a special ring design set in a platinum one-of-akind frame. A single cushion diamond (5.26 tcw.) is positioned inside a seamless border of flawlessly recut baguette diamonds (4.68 tcw.) accented with round white diamonds (0.26 tcw.). This striking ring is available for \$416,500.



Warm and inviting, a rare and precious oval vivid green Zambia emerald (19.34 tcw.) is masterfully set into the Bombé Ring, designed as a complex arrangement of pearshaped diamonds (10.13 tcw.) and round diamonds (0.68 tcw.) encircling the verdant centerpiece and set in platinum. This finger bauble is priced at \$839,100.

Coordinating exquisitely with the Bombé Ring, the Chic Earrings communicate the very essence of life and love. They showcase an eye-catching design of a double outline of elegant baguette diamonds (2.12 tcw.) and a rich marquise diamond framework (3.99 tcw.), accented with round diamonds (0.43 tcw.), encircling two extraordinary cushion emeralds (9.48 tcw.). Also set in pure platinum, they're available for \$195,200.

Conjuring up the rich legacy of the far east, the Burma Star Ring features a spectacular oval-cut Burma ruby (8.11 tcw.) placed against a unique mounting of baguettes (2.23 tcw.) with round diamonds (3.98 tcw.) and square buff-topped rubies running parallel to the row of diamonds. The stones are highlighted by a platinum and yellow-gold setting. The Burma Star retails for \$343,000.

A majestic necklace, the **Unique Art** features a rare selection of heart-shaped (46.76 tcw.) and pear-shaped rubies (61.45 tcw.), all of which are certified Vivid Red Pigeon's Blood.
