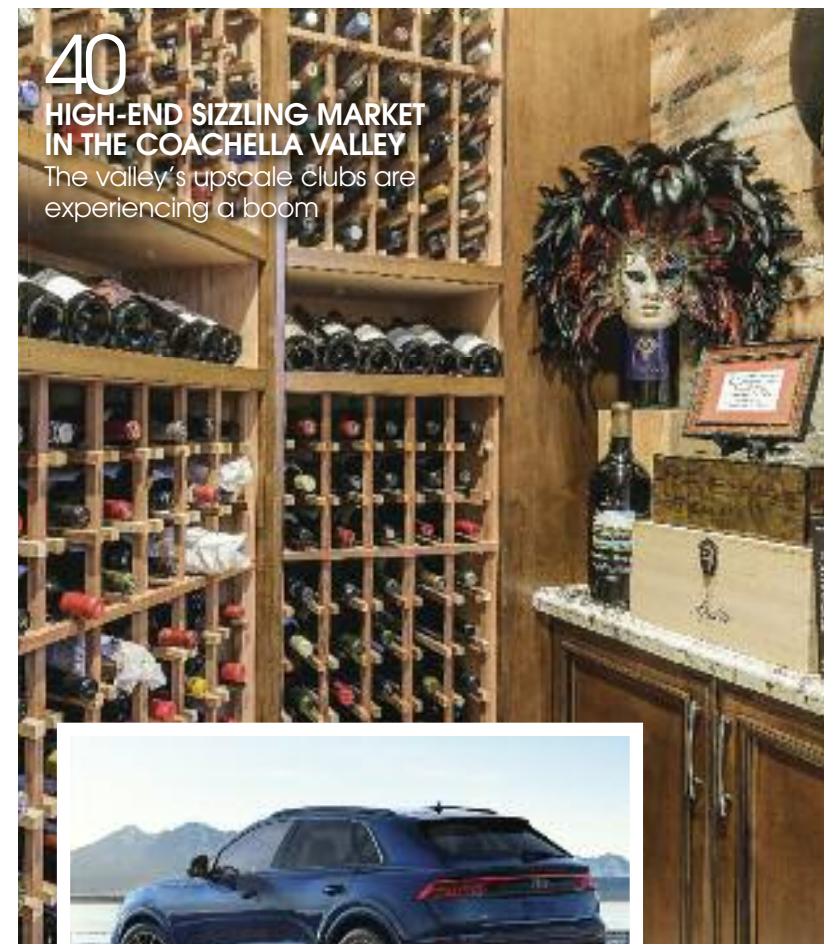

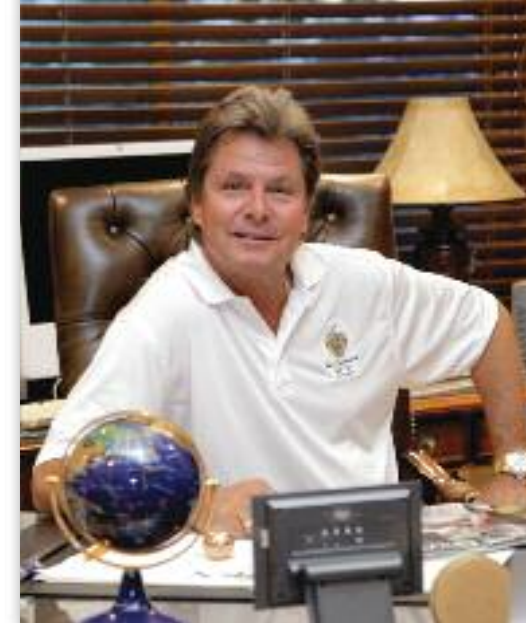

Naomi Osaka

Begins to Fulfill Her Potential

During the 1999 French Open, Leonard Francois witnessed the raw, natural talents of the Williams sisters firsthand—and decided right then and there that he would teach his two daughters, Mari and Naomi Osaka, how to play tennis in much the same way that Richard Williams had taught his daughters. After all Leonard, like Richard, was not a professional tennis player. But they both had two gifted daughters who would prove they had the “it factor” necessary to compete on the professional circuit.

Of the two Osaka sisters, Naomi has had the most success so far, as proven by her breakthrough 2018 season in which she won the prestigious BNP Paribas Open prior to earning her first Grand Slam victory at the U.S. Open. Naomi’s stunning season wasn’t overly surprising to those following her career closely. Since turning pro shortly before her 16th birthday, she has steadily worked her way to the top.

The Breakthrough Begins at Indian Wells

After reaching the fourth round of the Australian Open, her best result at a Grand Slam at that point in time, she eventually lost to world No. 1 Simona Halep. She returned to the top 50 of the WTA rankings and decided to compete in the 2018 BNP Paribas Open in March. Regarded as the most significant event in tennis aside from the Grand Slams, the BNP Paribas Open is not only a must-see tournament for tennis fans but also a necessary event for professionals to compete in. It helps them prepare for the rest of the season, gain momentum for the remaining Grand Slams and measure themselves against the circuit’s best players.

Prior to competing in the BNP Paribas Open, Naomi had never won a professional title. She hadn’t even played past the third round at a Premier Mandatory Event. The only driving forces she had for potential success were her natural talent, the top-50

In 2014, Naomi qualified for her first WTA main draw at the Stanford Classic and defeated former U.S. Open champion Samantha Stosur. Within a few months, she entered the top 250 of the WTA rankings and her rise continued from there. She eventually reached the top 100, and by 2016 was among the top 50 in the WTA rankings, the same year in which she was named WTA Newcomer of the Year.

Her progress stalled a bit in 2017, as her ranking didn’t rise above No. 44, yet it also didn’t decline lower than No. 68. But when she didn’t claim more than two main-draw match victories in 2017, Naomi decided to hire a new coach in the offseason: Sascha Bajin. That decision was arguably the best of her career thus far.

ranking, support from Bajin as well as family and friends, and belief in herself.

These driving forces appeared to be more than enough. She ultimately won the championship overwhelmingly, defeating opponents including Karolina Pliskova and Simona Halep before competing against Daria Kasatkina. With a 6-3, 6-2 victory in the finals, Naomi became the youngest winner of the BNP Paribas Open in a decade, as well as the first female Japanese winner in tournament history. The victory also substantially improved her world rankings, taking her up to No. 22, a career high.

“I’ve never won a title before. It feels new,” she stated afterward. “I’m really happy about this and grateful for the experience.”

The Momentum Continues at the U.S. Open

There was no doubt about it. The player who used to hit 100-mile-per-hour forehands when she was 16 was finally reaching her potential. She can now serve up to 125 miles per hour, among the ten fastest in WTA history, and just six months after becoming the first female Japanese champion at the BNP Paribas Open, she became the first Japanese woman to compete in the final of a Grand Slam.

It seemed like everything came full circle during the final of the U.S. Open as Naomi faced off against one of her role models, Serena Williams. Without Serena and the influence her father's coaching guidance had on Leonard Francois, Naomi may have never become a professional tennis player.

When all was said and done, Naomi did not appear to be a first-time participant in a Grand Slam final. Rather, she played like a seasoned veteran, dominating her role

model throughout the match—winning 73 percent of her points on first serve, committing only 14 unforced errors and out-acing Serena six to three as she claimed a 6-2, 6-4 victory.

Her potential, first envisioned by her father when she was just a little girl, has certainly come to fruition now. With a Grand Slam triumph, a BNP Paribas Open title and considerable prize money—\$6,394,289, the most on the WTA Tour in 2018—under her belt, Naomi believes the best is yet to come.

"I don't expect myself to just win one Grand Slam. The more confidence I put in myself, the more I play better," she says. "If I believe in myself, a lot of good things will happen."

If you're not a die-hard tennis fan or you haven't been in the Coachella Valley in March, you may not know what the BNP Paribas Open is. Once you know, however, you'll no doubt be among the nearly half million fans who attend the event each year.

The BNP Paribas Open is the largest ATP (Association of Tennis Professionals) Tour and WTA (Women's Tennis Association) combined two-week event in the world. It's an ATP World Tour Masters 1000 event on the men's tour, a WTA Premier event on the women's tour. It takes place in California's Coachella Valley each spring, set at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden.

Indian Wells Tennis Garden is arguably the most highly regarded and beautiful tennis facility in the world, its facilities and landscaping creating a striking and inviting oasis that raises the bar sky high on tennis complexes.

Put them together and it's tennis paradise, which is exactly what many fans are calling the two these days. It's not hard to understand why.

Indian Wells Tennis Garden opened in 2000 to universal acclaim. It's not just a favorite of fans but of players, too. Yet management at Indian Wells Tennis Garden never considered resting on laurels. Between 2013 and 2017 the facility was expanded and enhanced in multiple ways, including the

addition of a second state-of-the-art stadium, new dining venues, increased top-of-the-line technology and a host of improvement that elevate the fan experience, whether that's watching live action from a restaurants overlooking the court or taking advantage of the "Superwall," where patrons can relax and watch all the live action on screens—an experience similar to that at Wimbledon's Henman Hill/Murray Mound.

Dining is incomparable during the BNP Paribas Open and not remotely related to typical sporting event food. It includes restaurants from two of the world's most notable restaurateurs, Wolfgang Puck and Nobu Matsuhisa. Puck brought his famed Spago brand here, a desert version of his flagship Beverly Hills restaurant. Nobu may be the world's most recognized Japanese restaurant, and like others this one serves the chef's signature

You can count on the top tennis players in the world competing. Naomi Osaka and Juan Martin del Potro were the 2018 Singles champions. Past contenders have included Roger Federer, Rafael Nadal, Maria Sharapova, Novak Djokovic, Flavia Pennetta and Simona Halep.

The most challenging thing for newcomer fans may be the correct pronunciation of the tournament's name. Title sponsor BNP Paribas is a leading bank in Europe with a presence in some 75 countries and a history dating back to the 1800s. Its headquarters are in Paris thus the correct pronunciation of Paribas is French. Here's a close approximation of how to say it: Pear-y-ba. You don't pronounce the S.

BNP Paribas recently extended its sponsorship until 2023, so you have plenty of time to perfect your pronunciation.

cuisine—a melding of Japanese dishes and South American ingredients.

One of the things that makes the BNP Paribas Open so popular with players, in addition to the spectacular setting and cutting-edge facility, is the fact that it's one of the few tennis tournaments in the world at which male and female players are paid equally. Only the Grand Slams and a small handful of other tournaments do the same. The BNP Paribas Open is a shining example of how tennis tournaments *should* work but too often don't. For the 2019 event there will be more than \$14 million in prizes, split equally between the men's tour and the women's.

For now, what you need to know is that the BNP Paribas Open is one of the top tennis tournaments in the world, played by the top players in the world and set in one of the most phenomenal tennis facilities in the world right here in California's most desirable desert community.

Tennis paradise. That's no exaggeration.

The 2019 ANA Inspiration Championship

It's famous for some incredible finishes. Brittany Lincicome's eagle on the 72nd hole in 2009 marked the only time in history that one of golf's Majors—male or female—was won on the final hole with an eagle. Lincicome won the tournament again in 2015.

Last year, the ANA Inspiration Championship went to eight playoff holes—four on Sunday before the match was called for darkness, and four on Monday. That was the first time in the 47-year history of the event that two players returned to Mission Hills Country Club on Monday to determine the winner. Monday's playoff between Inbee Park and Pernilla Lindberg reached a thrilling conclusion when Lindberg dropped a 30-foot putt on the 10th hole and Park was unable to answer with her 15-footer.

But it's the last hole on the final round that brings the signature moment of the tournament—the leap into Poppie's Pond and donning of the white robe. Since 1988 when Amy Alcott spontaneously leapt into the pond to celebrate her victory, winners of the LPGA's first Major of the year have followed suit.

The championship, which is played on the Dinah Shore Tournament Course at Mission Hills Country Club, has a long history in the Coachella Valley. It has been called by various names including the Kraft Nabisco Championship, but it has been the ANA Inspiration Championship since 2015. Originally ANA signed on through 2019, but last year extended its sponsorship through 2022.

Over its five-year connection to the tournament, ANA has increased the purse several times. In fact, the airline made a bold promise in 2015 that by its fifth year as sponsor the purse would go up substantially. ANA made good on that promise, announcing that the 2019 purse will be \$3 million. Only five other LPGA tournaments exceed that amount, the other four Majors and the CME Group Tour Championship at the end of the year, which is slated to be \$5 million this year.

Of her win last year on the Desmond Muirhead designed Dinah Shore Tournament Course, Lindberg said, "I dreamt of this moment ever since I was a kid. I remember writing goals when I was in high school to win a Major and I thought it was too good of a dream to come true, but it has."

Lindberg shot 15 under to win with 65, 67, 70 and 71 in the four rounds. The only other winner to reach 15 under was Inbee Park in 2013.

For her leap into Poppie's Pond, Lindberg was joined by her caddy and both of her parents.

Lindberg is the fifth player to make the ANA Inspiration her first LPGA Tour victory, joining Helen Alfredsson (1993), Nanci Bowen (1995), Morgan Pressel (2007) and Stacy Lewis (2011). She also joins Alfredsson and Annika Sorenstam as the only Swedish players to win the tournament.

Although the roster for this year's event has not been announced as of this writing, it's a good bet that Lindberg will return to defend her title. Last year's players included Inbee Park, Jennifer Song, Ariya and Moriya Jutanugarn, Jessica Korda, Charley Hull, Sung-Hyun Park, Lydia Ko, Amy Olson, Lexi Thompson and Michelle Wie, who has played little due to a string of injuries and surgeries.

Wie tied for 30th in last year's ANA Inspiration and in October had to drop out of the Tour in order to have hand surgery. She's scheduled to start playing again in February, but whether the ANA Inspiration will be on her schedule is not yet known.

What is known is that the winner of the ANA Junior Inspiration, which takes place the weekend before the Major, receives the final player spot in the ANA Inspiration Championship. The junior event is played by 48 of the best juniors from around the world. It's a 54-hole competition that kicks off with the juniors playing alongside legendary LPGA greats on the first day. The legends also attend the ANA Junior Dinner.

But more buzzworthy than who is playing in the ANA Inspiration is the question of whether this will be the last year the tournament stays in its traditional spot on the LPGA calendar. This year the event takes place April 1-7.

The problem is that it will now compete with the new women's amateur championship. Augusta National chairman, Fred Ridley, announced during the 2018 Masters that the club's new championship will be played over three rounds, with the final round played at Augusta National on the Saturday before the Masters. That's the same week as the ANA Inspiration.

And the tournament wouldn't just compete with the amateur championship. It would compete for media attention and TV air time. Moreover, some of the top amateurs have traditionally played in the ANA Inspiration and they would have to choose.

For this year, the Coachella Valley Major will stay in its traditional spot. But going forward, the powers that be will have to make some tough decisions.

The New Woodhaven Country Club

Much has changed here in the past two years

What hasn't changed is that everyone is warmly welcomed at Woodhaven, located in the heart of Palm Desert. And by everyone we mean locals, vacationers, snowbirds, homeowners and long-term renters. The club's rich social life includes such events as a fine-dining night, bridge, poker, mahjong, tai chi and bingo.

At the core of Woodhaven's offerings, however, are tennis and golf.

The Woodhaven Country Club Tennis Center is a public facility with everything any tennis aficionado would want—including phenomenal instruction. The center recently welcomed its two new tennis professionals, Fabio and Amy Walker. Fabio is a former multi-year Canadian National Champion who competed at Wimbledon, the French Open and the U.S. Open as a junior. The two met at Texas Tech University where they both received full tennis scholarships. Amy is a former nationally ranked junior player who holds nine Top 10 Texas Tech Women's athletic records. They share a passion for helping beginners learn the game of tennis and experienced players advance to the next level.

Since starting last fall the Walkers have taken lessons to a new level and increased competitive opportunities for the club teams. The tennis center features eight tennis courts (four with lights), a pro shop and racquet-stringing service. Players can take part in USTA leagues, Desert Tennis Leagues and private as well as group lessons. Perhaps best of all, tennis memberships are available for a day, a week, a month or a year.

Woodhaven's inherently friendly atmosphere holds true at its public golf course as well, where everyone is welcome to come and play. The course is meticulously cared for, an oasis of well-tended fairways and greens beside idyllic lakes and waterfalls, and it features multiple tee boxes to accommodate every level of player. In addition to a new fleet of quality golf carts, there's a relatively new golf staff comprised solely of PGA members or those in PGA's apprentice program. Private and group lessons are available.

Although the term "public course" may conjure up images of crowds and long waits, that is definitely not the case at Woodhaven. In fact, the opposite is true. Woodhaven takes pride in having rounds of golf that typically take less than four hours to complete.

If you haven't been to Woodhaven Country Club lately, you haven't been. If you've never been, well, you're missing out on one of the Coachella Valley's sweet spots.

In a region where joining a country club can cost a small fortune and playing a club course is often available only to a select few, Woodhaven Country Club's public offerings are a breath of fresh California air.

In 2016 a new management team came on board, and while they kept all that was beloved about the club and community, they also focused on making it even better, in part by spending money on areas needing improvements. Woodhaven's online presence includes a brand new website where members can book court and tee times. Maintenance on the golf course has improved, and in 2017 the club's lobby, ballroom and dining room were renovated using wood, stone and a lighter, more contemporary palette.

"I love the club and am very proud of everything we've been able to accomplish over the past two seasons," says Derrick Strub, Woodhaven GM. "I'm extremely excited about what is to come in the future."



Among the club's other improvements is a growing banquet business, headed up by new banquet manager, Bianca De La Garza. The club is now a full-service wedding venue with staff that can take care of everything from rehearsal dinner to service to reception. It's also able to offer

one of the loveliest sites in the valley to exchange vows, the Wedding Waterfall. And if members have a reunion or special occasion to celebrate, staff will make that happen, too.

The 92-acre Woodhaven community includes 504 homes within its gates, all of

them with golf-course views, as well as two options for meals—casual Mulligans primarily for golfers and The Vista Lounge, the club's dining room. Residents are mostly age 55 and older, yet Strub says, "It feels like a real young group."

Young or young-at-heart, most of the residents know each other, which contributes to the community's friendly atmosphere and deliberate "small-town" feel. Whenever new homeowners or long-term renters move in, Strub says members immediately welcome them and introduce them into the community. The group ranges from owners who have been part of Woodhaven for 35 years to those who have just found their way there.

If you haven't been to Woodhaven Country Club, put it on your must-do list for 2019. Should you choose to join, memberships are affordable with flexible options, providing one of the great values of the region.

Annalee Thurston Award Fundraiser to Honor Chris Evert

Love & Love Tennis Foundation—together we can do our best work

Even for pro players and seasoned supporters, it's fair to expect plenty of wide eyes and swiveling heads. The second annual Love & Love Tennis Foundation Annalee Thurston Award fundraiser is set to take place on Sunday, March 10 with Tennis-Hall-of-famer Rosie Casals at the helm. This year's event will be presented by the RumChata Foundation.

Annalee Thurston served as a senior consultant to the Virginia Slims Tour, was a sports executive and manager for the Indio Chamber of Commerce and special-events coordinator for the city of Indio. Her impact on the world of tennis is still widely felt, despite her sudden passing from a brain aneurysm in 2007 at the age of 55.

To celebrate her legacy, the Annalee Thurston Award Reception was established in 2011. For seven years, the reception raised money for a scholarship fund at the Warsaw Sports Marketing Center at the University of Oregon. Last year, with the fund becoming fully endowed, the event took on a new beneficiary, the Love & Love Tennis Foundation (LLTF). LLTF was founded by Casals and former Women's Tennis Association (WTA) tour player Tory Fretz, who took on the roles of president and vice president, respectively. LLTF offers grant donations to academies, individuals and organizations that support youth tennis throughout the Coachella Valley.

The reception will again be held in conjunction with the BNP Paribas Open at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden. Chris Evert has been named as this year's recipient of the annual Annalee Thurston Award, which recognizes individuals who have achieved unique success in tennis. Evert, one of the most familiar names in sports, is a retired American World No. 1 tennis player. She won 18 Grand Slam singles championships and three doubles titles during her career. Overall, Evert won 157 singles championships and 32 doubles titles. She reached 34 Grand Slam singles finals, more than any other player in the history of professional tennis. She also served as president of the WTA from 1975–76 and 1983–91. She was awarded the Philippe Chatrier award and inducted into the Tennis Hall of Fame.

Last year's awardee was Katrina Adams, chairman and CEO of the United States Tennis Association (USTA). Adams is the first African American and youngest person to serve as chair of the USTA, and she was also a highly successful tennis player with 20 career doubles titles to her name.

In addition to the Annalee Thurston Award, there's also the Vicki Berner "Heart & Spirit" Award. This year's recipient is Eduardo Contreras, a senior at Desert Hot Springs High School. The Vicki Berner "Heart & Spirit" Award recognizes outstanding leadership qualities.

Casals says there will again be a live auction, which last year raised \$45,000 in 15 minutes, contributing to the overall proceeds of \$80,000. Sought-after auction items last year included paintings by famed Warner Brothers artist Lee Holly, who animated such beloved Looney Toons cartoon characters as Bugs Bunny and Daffy Duck. Legend Billie Jean King purchased two of them. Chris Evert and Martina Navratilova also auctioned off two hours of tennis, making the event even more memorable, as if that were possible.

Other supporting sponsors for 2019 include Desert Stem Cell Project, STAR Ortho and Raj Sinha, MD, Rodney Strong Vineyards, Barbara and Gary Tolman, Billie Jean King, Ilana Kloss, Tory Fretz, Chris Evert and Martina Navratilova.

Thanks to funds raised, LLTF awards grants to junior tennis programs that request assistance. They can apply via an application available on the nonprofit's website. Those wishing to attend or support the event can purchase tickets for \$250 each or tables often for \$2,000 by contacting sportswomn@aol.com

Rosie Casals, tennis icon and pioneer of the women's professional game, was inducted into the International Tennis Hall of Fame in 1996. She is one of the "Original 9" who paved the way for the first-ever professional Virginia Slims Circuit in 1971. She was a founder of the WTA in 1973 and is much revered for demanding equal pay for women on the tennis courts. Best known for doubles, Casals won 12 Grand Slam titles, seven Wimbledon (five with Billie Jean King) and four U.S. Open mixed doubles titles. Her 112 doubles' titles are second only to Martina Navratilova.

As Casals puts it, "Annalee would be proud to know that she is still bringing us together to do good things in the desert!"

If you're thinking that Cliff Drysdale Tennis is on to something big, we're inclined to agree. The organization's Tennis With The Stars returns to the desert for its fifth year on Tuesday March 5, presented by the BNP Paribas Open. Hosted at the Omni Rancho Las Palmas Resort & Spa in Rancho Mirage, the charity gathering will benefit local nonprofit Desert Arc and national nonprofit ACEing Autism.

Rising American star Frances Tiafoe will headline the showcase. Currently ranked No. 41 in the world, Tiafoe will take part for the third consecutive year. 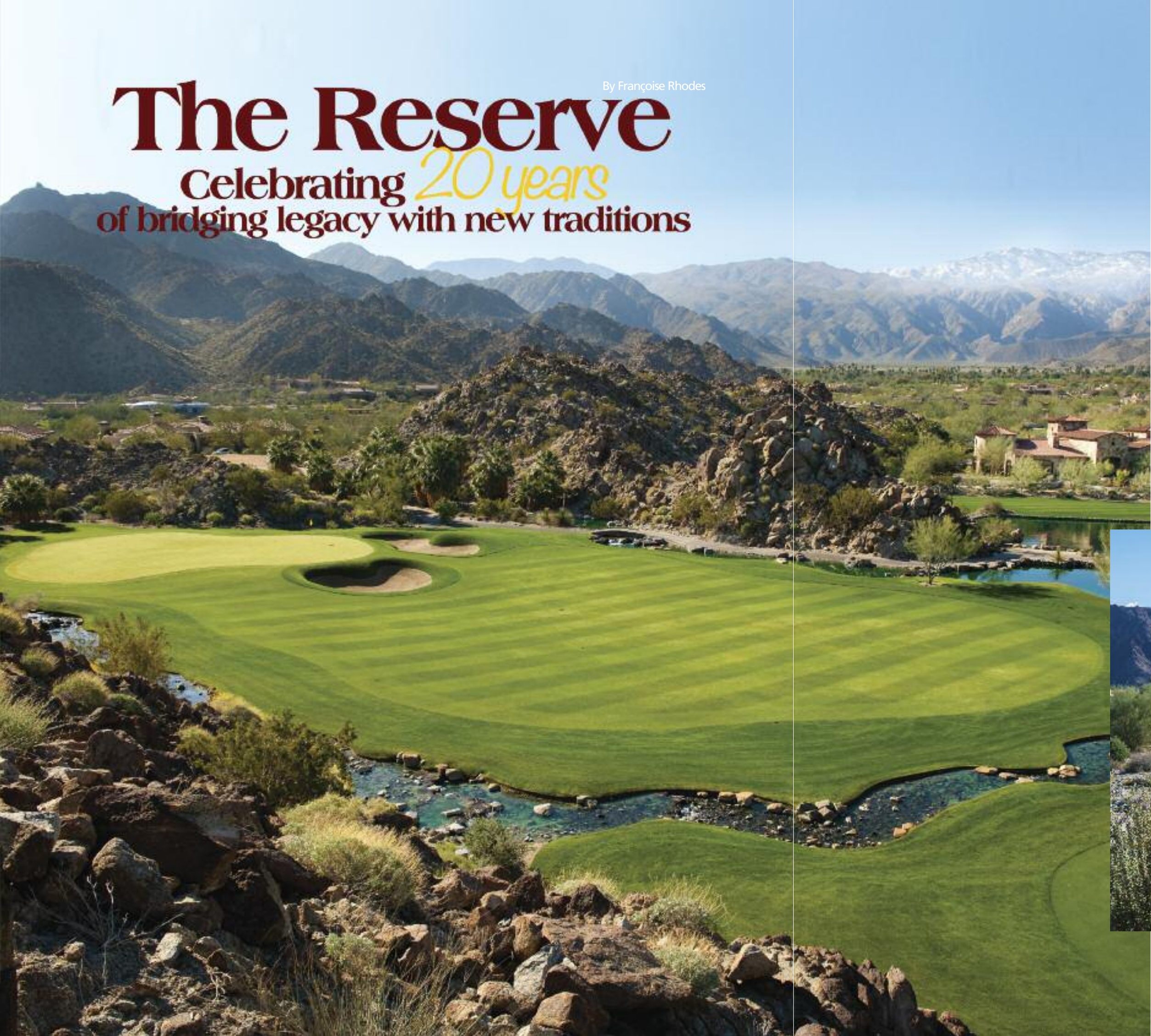

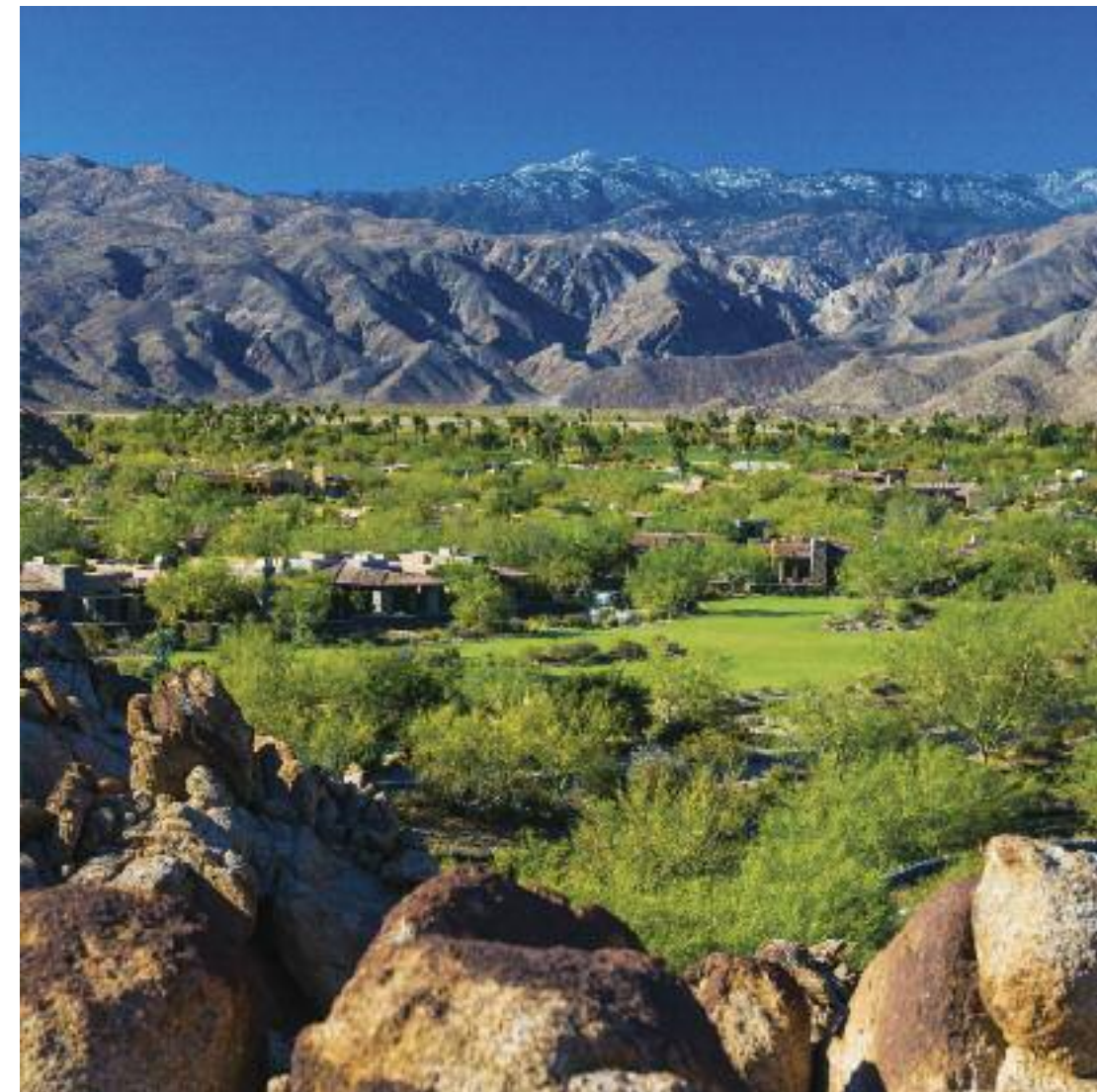

They work well for beginners, intermediate and advanced players, so you won't have to switch racquets as you improve your game.

Now grab yourself one, any one, and see your game take off in the New Year.

Babolat - Pure Aero

The Babolat Pure Aero 2019 is the update to the previous edition, which came out in 2016. But this racquet line's history goes back to 2003 when Rafael Nadal started using it. Spin is the leading feature due to the open-string pattern with oblong-shaped grommets; however, even though this Aero generates faster head speed, the 2019 model offers more control with longer contact between the ball and strings.

That faster head speed is owed to an updated aerodynamic frame with an optimized design for that purpose. Superior stability for increased precision comes as a result of a new generation of high-performance carbon fibers in the throat developed by Chomarat, added in the core of the racquet.

The Aero is an optimum choice for those spin doctors who play a defensive and aggressive style from the baseline but aren't afraid to mix things up now and then with a well-placed volley from the net.

Head - Graphene 360

Available in slightly different iterations, essentially the Graphene 360 offers increased torsional stability and better energy transfer. These racquets are engineered to provide more accuracy, which allows players to aim for the lines.

Another update includes wider cross-string spacing for added power and spin, as well as a brand new mold with a thicker beam. While depth and pace are easily attained, the Graphene is particularly maneuverable, allowing players to adjust their shot type at the last instant. Whether you're defending in the corners or moving through the court on approach shots, you won't struggle to get head speed and control on the ball.

Wilson - Pro Staff 97

With the venerable Wilson brand and Roger Federer teaming up, expectations are high and the RF97 does not disappoint. With a fine blend of power, spin and maneuverability, its key offering is that it transfers plenty of power to the ball at the time of contact and the extra weight it has really helps to make your shots unforgiving.

Though it has a comparatively small head size of 97 sq. in, this racquet offers superior control and power. It's a bit heavy at 315 g (when unstrung), but the effect is that this really helps to transfer more energy in your shots when swinging the racquet.

Highly maneuverable, it offers great comfort in your hands for your volleys and more precision in your serves. Overall, the Wilson Pro Staff 97 can really help you gain more control of your game.

Yonex - Ezone Dr 100

Speed and power are what Yonex features in this model. Dynamic Repulsion frame technology allows for a wider sweet spot, which begets additional power. Its isometric head shape allows for a wind-resistant feel, increasing swing speed.

These are the world's first racquets to feature premium grade Nanometric DR carbon graphite, providing increased flex and more flexibility and resilience to the frame, which results in a faster frame snapback for improved ball speed as well as the larger sweet spot.

Excellence simply doesn't come just from skills developed practicing on a consistent basis; it also requires the right gear. That's exactly what these are. They're the best tennis racquets made by the best manufacturers in the sport today.

Golfer's Playbook

Mastering Dogleg Tee Shots

Many of the holes we play in golf are not perfectly straight. Golf-course designers add difficulty by giving holes a variety of bends known as "doglegs." A dogleg hole is one that bends, changing direction at a certain point along its length.

One of my favorite golf courses in the Coachella Valley is The Tournament Course at Mission Hills Country Club. Being the Teaching Pro at The Golf Academy at Mission Hills for nine years gave me ample opportunities to master the tricky doglegs that Desmond Muirhead strategically placed on this course.

Dogleg Right to Left

When I come to a hole where the dogleg creates a severe angle of change, I leave my driver in the bag and go with my fairway wood to better control the spin direction of my ball with the extra loft from the clubface. This puts me in a position of more control off the tee. Course designers will often position a fairway bunker on the outside portion of a dogleg to collect errant tee shots. I like to use these fairway bunkers as an aiming point for my tee shot on these holes. I align myself on this dogleg left hole as though I am going to execute a straight shot at the bunker.



The main adjustment I make is in how I grip my club. With the dogleg angling from right to left, I want to have the ball spin in the same direction as the angle of the dogleg, so I will angle the club face slightly closed as I take my grip with my thumbs on top in a 12:00 position. The technical name for this is a "strong grip / closed clubface."



As I make my swing, I want to be sure that in transition I have my golf club on the correct swing path, as though I'm going to hit the ball into the bunker. However, as I make my way through impact, my strong grip will rotate the club face into a slightly closed angle, which will create a right-to-left spin on the ball. The result will be that the shape of the ball's flight will match the angle of the fairway.

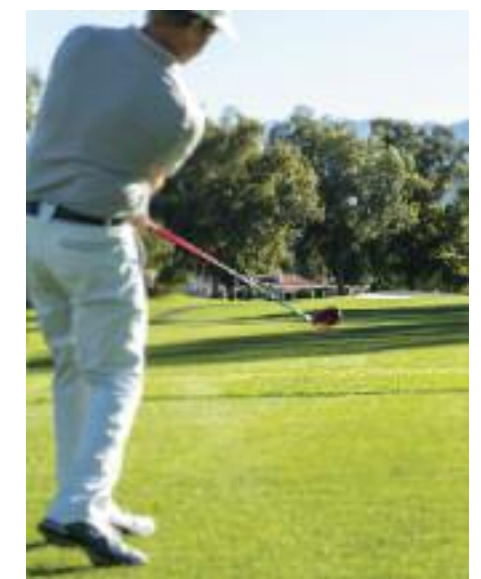
Dogleg Left to Right

On a hole like this one where the dogleg is going from left to right, I'm again going to use the fairway bunker on the outside of the dogleg as my aiming point. My swing path will launch my ball into the air toward the right corner of the bunker.



Once again I will adjust my grip in order to achieve the desired result. I want to angle the club face slightly open with my thumbs positioned on top of the club at 12:00. This is technically known as a weak grip, which will influence the ball to have a left-to-right spin through the air.

My main goal in my swing is to feel like I am going to execute a straight ball flight to the corner of the bunker. At the top of my swing, I can see that I have the shaft "on-plane" as it angles directly to the target line, which will launch the ball in the direction of the target. The key to fading the ball off the bunker into the fairway is the slightly open clubface created by my weak grip. This open club face through impact will create the desired left-to-right spin on the ball to help move it off the bunker and into the middle of the fairway.

The Benefits of a Multi-Modal Approach

Knee replacement or stem-cell therapy combined with other treatments?

Diana B. thought she would have to get a new job. The four-hour weekly commute to Las Vegas and back was killing her knees. She'd been diagnosed with patellofemoral arthritis and had tried the usual remedies: anti-inflammatory medications, cortisone injections and physical therapy. Although the treatments initially controlled the pain, they eventually became less and less effective, so much so that the thought of making the drive to Las Vegas filled her with terror. At age 52, the prospect of knee-replacement surgery, which had been discussed, was not pleasant.

When she saw first saw me, I confirmed the diagnosis of patellofemoral arthritis,

based upon X-rays. But other issues were also evident, including the kneecap tracking off to the side and muscle weakness. Although total knee-replacement surgery allows me to address multiple sources of pathology within a knee joint, and thus address the myriad causes of pain, in younger patients it often comes with the trade-off of having to decrease their level of sports activities. As an avid cross-fitter, weekend golfer and Pilates enthusiast, Diana did not want that. Rather, she wanted to stave off knee replacement as long as possible.

In order to prevent knee replacement, we had to take a multi-pronged approach. First, we needed a source of analgesia

because without pain relief, other treatments would be of limited benefit. Second, we had to address the mechanics of her kneecap. Third, we had to give the cartilage, which was wearing away, a biologic boost.

For pain relief, we did a short course of high-dose anti-inflammatories along with laser treatments. For the mechanics, we re-ordered PT with an emphasis on the VMO, the muscle that keeps the kneecap from sliding to the outer side. We also added K-T taping. For the biologic boost, we injected platelet-rich plasma (PRP) and amniotic-derived graft and cells. The result: Diana will tell you that the first two weeks after the PRP and stem-cell injections she actually experienced increased pain and had serious doubts that the treatments would work. But then, aha! The pain relief kicked in. She was able to make the four-hour drive pain free. Now, eight months later, she remains pain free in all of her activities.

This sounds like a success story for stem cells. But as an orthopedic surgeon and expert in stem-cell biology, I'm the first to caution prospective clients. Stem cells and other regenerative treatments do have tremendous potential for success; however, they cannot do it alone. The mechanical issues must be addressed simultaneously with the stem-cell treatments. And we know that in order to achieve durable pain relief, multiple treatments are frequently required.

The bottom line is that you need a thoughtful and multi-modal approach in order to stay in the game. At STAR Orthopaedics, we give each patient a tailored treatment plan to help them achieve their goals. We treat you, not just your pain.

Overcoming Lupus, Depression and Anxiety

A yoga and healthy diet transformation

At age 21 Jasmine wasn't feeling well. She was suffering from chest and digestive pains and was ultimately hospitalized. She was diagnosed with Lupus Nephritis, an autoimmune disease affecting her kidney; a pulmonary embolism (blood clot in her lungs); and edema from her kidneys leaking over nine grams of protein. She knew she had a long healing journey ahead. Once released, she decided to look into yoga classes at a local college in San Diego, where she was living.

A year and a half later, she moved to the desert and looked for the nearest yoga studio. Her first Bikram yoga class was so difficult that she left her mat at the studio and was barely able to drive home. She had a headache until the next day and told herself she would never do that yoga class again.

Doctors warned her not to have children because it would exacerbate her Lupus. They said she would need daily injections to prevent blood clots within the placenta. Jasmine was determined to have children despite this advice.

She soon became pregnant, gained 50 pounds and felt miserable. Fortunately, she delivered a beautiful baby boy, Vijay. She still wasn't feeling well and was dealing with post-partum depression and crying daily on top of battling lupus.

After eight months of feeling depressed and still 35 pounds heavier than before her pregnancy, she needed a change. She decided to do the thing she told herself she would never do again, Bikram yoga. It had been three years since her first class and although she was nervous about it, she bravely went back.

That was 12 years ago. Since then, Jasmine regularly practices five to seven days a week and commits to the 30-day challenge almost every January and June here at Bikram Yoga Plus. She became pregnant a second time seven years ago, and practiced Bikram yoga almost daily up until the day she gave birth to son Josiah. She gained only 28 pounds during this pregnancy. Her sense of wellbeing returned slowly and now she's back in the Hot Room almost daily. She's learned to tune in and carefully listen to her body and has been amazed at the potential she never knew she had.

Jasmine was encouraged to enter the USA Yoga West Coast Regional Competition by her yoga coach and close friend, Kim Tang. She's able to do things with her body that she never imagined possible for herself. Just this year alone, she is able to do Locust Scorpion, Full Camel, Tiger and Tiger Scorpion. She feels stronger than ever in mind, body and spirit. She's excited about getting up each day now. The prior daily anxiety and depression she experienced has been replaced with a sense of peace, joy and wellbeing. All her lab-work levels have normalized, she weighs 120 pounds now compared to her average of 150 pounds at age 21 and her overall health is better at 41 years old than when she was at 21.

She knows the battle for health is fought with consistency and discipline. Jasmine is happy to share with the yoga community what is possible in overcoming health challenges and living life to the fullest. She loves coming to the studio and feeling the warmth and support of the community here at Bikram Yoga Plus.

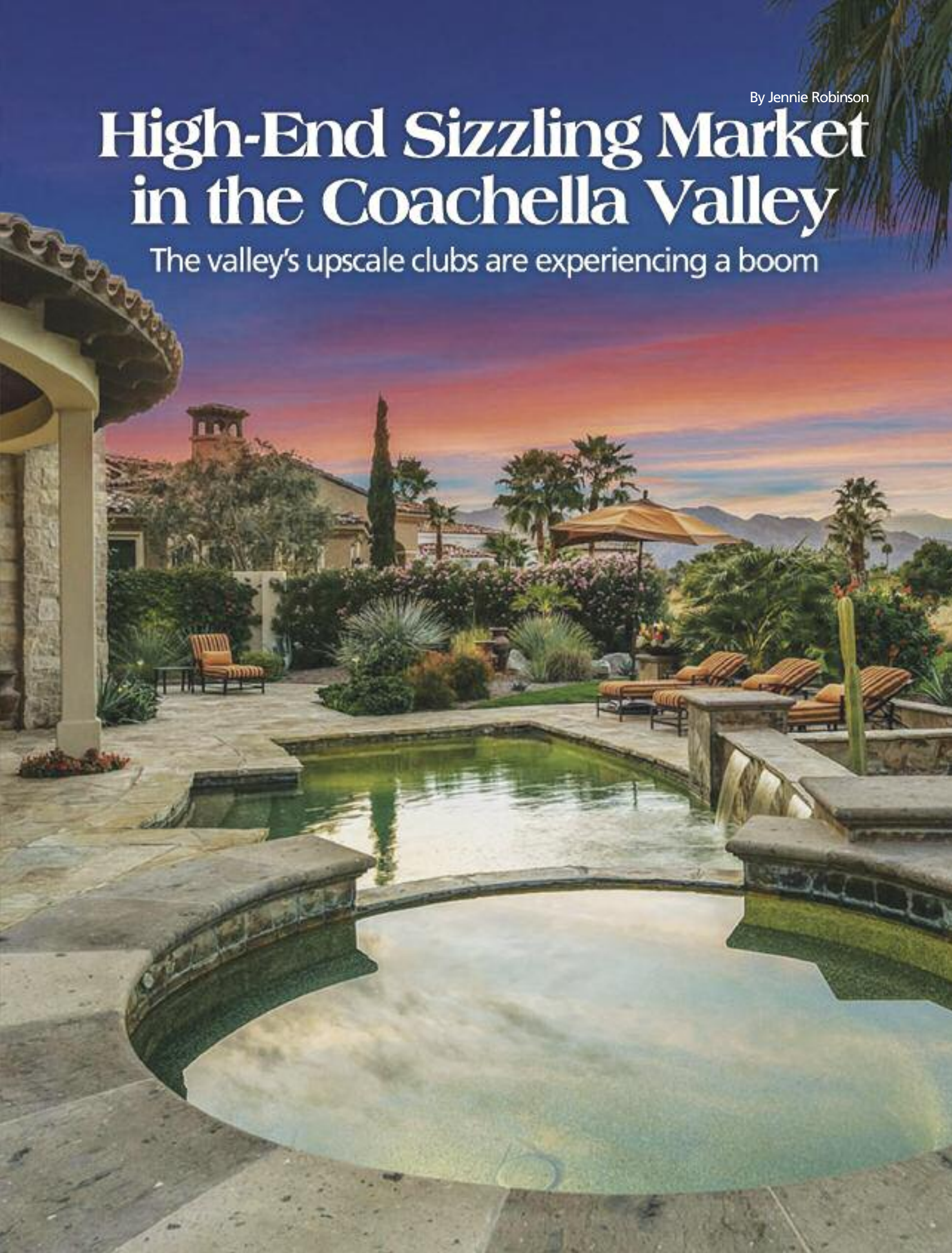
With the upcoming yoga competition, she's decided to replace her fears with faith, to bring awareness of the healing power of regular yoga practice.

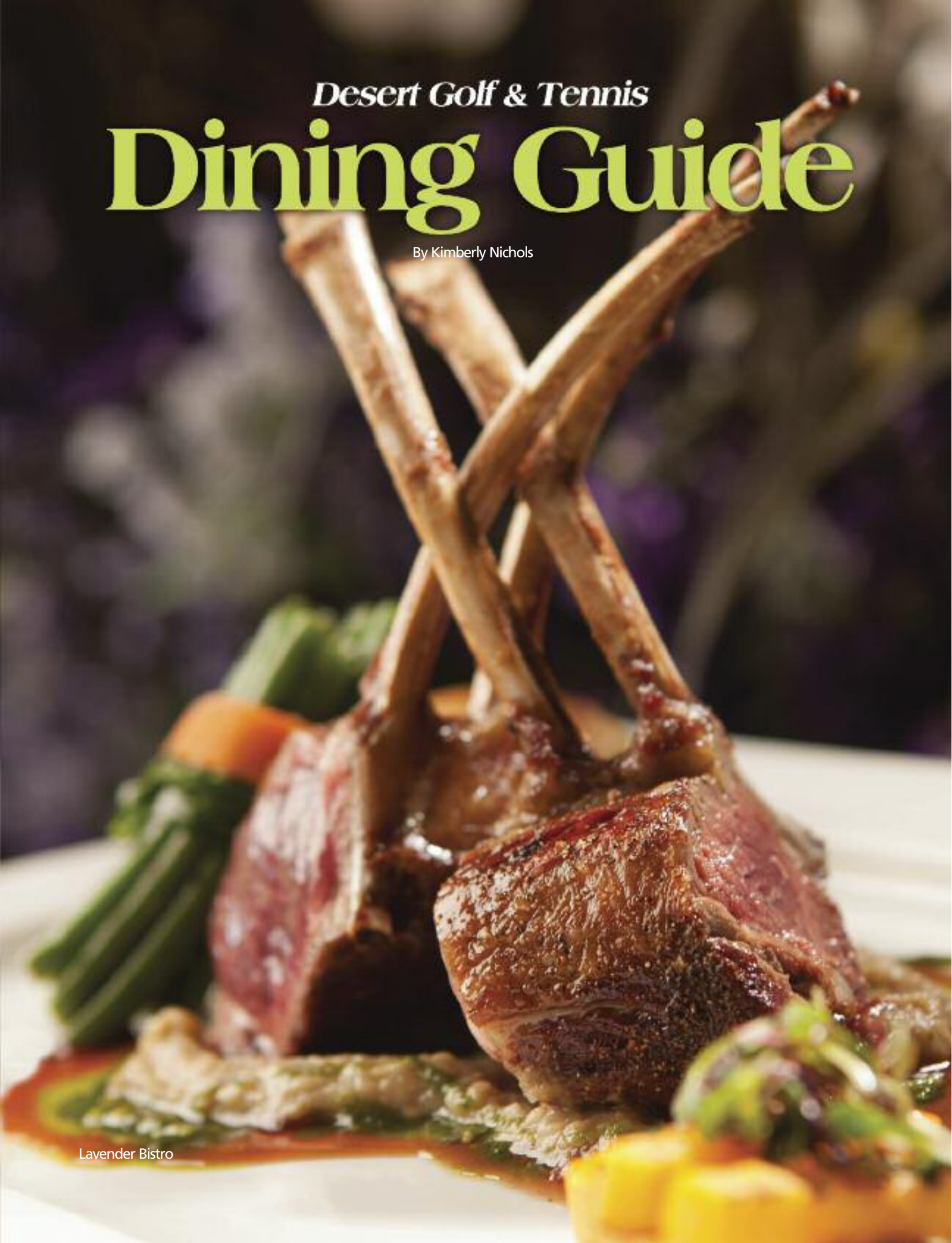



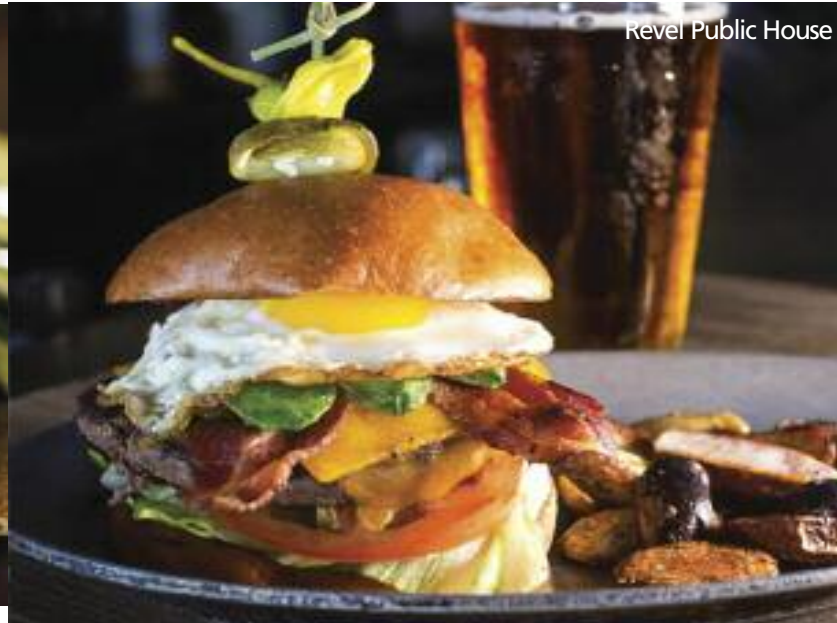

Audi Q8 & Audi e-tron

The largest carmaker in the world is on a roll

Audi designers have long been busy making SUVs that make news. Audi has set the pace for luxury SUVs since its Q7 model hit the North American market in 2007. The newest model in the Audi SUV family is the Q8 and it's perfect.

The Q8 is made with a sensible balance of comfort and handling. Realizing that most families aren't taking their Audi off-road, so handling the ups and downs of life is more important than navigating a hairpin turn with 30 degrees of incline, Audi designed the Q8 to handle life like a champ. The newly designed 3.0-liter V6 engine cranks out 335 horsepower and 369 lb-ft of torque, and engineers blessed the Q8 with an eight-speed transmission. The transmission handles the low-end torque of the turbo charger perfectly and flies through the gears like butter.

This new V6 engine delivers performance exactly when you ask it to. The position of the twin turbos pulls power better than the Q7. In fact, the Q8 delivers more power over a wider range of RPMs than the Q7, turning in a respectable 0 to 60 mph time of 5.6 seconds—1.5 seconds faster than the Q7. Take that little brother!

The Q8's driving-mode options allow for off-roading if that's what floats your boat. The off-road mode can raise the suspension, but you can also choose to lower the ride when you need to load cargo (read groceries) in the back.

Audi has always been known for intuitive, bleeding-edge technology in its infotainment packages and the Q8 is no different.

The all-new MMI Touch Response system replaces the signature rotary dial so common to Audis. The MMI system features touch and voice feedback so users can hear and feel a click as confirmation when their finger triggers a function. The system can be personalized and drivers can speak requests such as "I'm hungry," to which the Q8 will suggest nearby restaurants.

Engineers at Audi didn't stop with just one new SUV for 2019. They unveiled Audi's first all-electric vehicle in the Audi e-tron. The e-tron takes a direct strike at Tesla and Jaguar, which have the only other electric SUVs on the market. Audi, owned by Volkswagen, is the largest automaker in the world. Jumping into the deep end of this pool is going to make the splash of a linebacker doing a cannon ball off the high dive.

The Holy Grail of electric vehicles is range, which is always set officially by the EPA in the United States. While the e-tron's EPA

estimate isn't in yet, Audi is suggesting the range may exceed 200 miles on a full charge. Of course, you'll compare that to the Jaguar I-pace with a range of 234 miles. The Tesla Model X 75D states a range of 234 miles. However, with 30 minutes of high-speed charging, Audi states it beats both with a range of 160 miles versus 140 miles for the other two.

Along with range there's the power of electric vehicles, which makes them both exhilarating and pure joy. The e-tron delivers 355 horsepower from its two electric motors. With "boost mode" activated, the horsepower jumps to over 400. That power displays itself in a 0-60 mph time of 5.5 seconds and a towing capacity of 4,000 pounds.

Typically electric vehicles whine at low speeds. The e-tron designers virtually eliminated the whine and the road noise. With an acoustically insulated windshield, rubber-coated battery boxes and a rubber-insulated frame, the noise from outside simply can't get inside.

In the battle for electric SUV market share, buyers will want to consider that the world's largest automaker is about to roll out a vehicle that looks exquisite and shares a manufacturing plant with several other models. There is about 100 years of car-making history at the plant where the e-tron was built. Nothing is missing from this pacesetter.

The entry-level Premium Plus package will retail at \$74,800 before any government incentives.

One of the best places you could possibly go to compare the E-tron to the Jaguar I-pace is the Desert European Motorcars campus in Rancho Mirage. Home to nine brands ranging from Lamborghini to Audi, the white-glove treatment here is an experience unto itself and the 10-acre playground of luxury vehicles will give even the most discriminating buyer much to admire.

Owned by the Indigo Auto Group, this cacophony of style is defined by interactive, ultra-personalized and world-class service.

It's important to bring it bigtime, whether taking your seat in the stands or winning and dining in your VIP box. Effortless functionality is key, and Stella McCartney's collaboration with Adidas channels this sensibility, from her Barricade tennis range collection to her running, training and yoga wear—all just in time for the BNP Paribas Open at Indian Wells.

McCartney's designs give women free reign to influence those around them while defining their own style. The British designer's partnership with Adidas began in 2005 when the first line of high-performance sportswear was launched. Sleek cuts, precise lines and fit, feminine tailoring and earth-friendly production practices and materials characterize the collections, which follow a modern code of ethics and contribute to women's empowerment.

A standout in McCartney's line is the Barricade tennis range from the Adidas by Stella McCartney collection. The portfolio channels a hearty dose of the U.S. Open, bringing inspiration from the Grand Slam tournaments. McCartney has created technical pieces that move with the body, emphasizing color and performance.

The **Blue Barricade Skirt** is a bouncy little number with a slim fit that features engineered structure for optimal performance. With built-in tights that hit thigh-level, the Climacool fabric made of 71% polyamide and 29% elastane keeps the skin cool and dry. The collection's logo is displayed on the front of this piece, which sells for \$65.

Designed to coordinate with the skirt, the **Blue Barricade Tank** sports a seamless structure for optimum stretch and a premium feel. Also constructed of 71% polyamide and 29% elastane, this flattering body-con top is available for \$70. Look for the logo prominently yet modestly emblazoned on the front center of the tank.

Completing the set are the **White Barricade Tennis Shoes** featuring blue detailing with logo on the heel and a granite-hued upper. These shoes have a comfortable, lock-down fit with "Boost Powered" cushioning designed to respond reflexively to the wearer's energy output. With splashes of teal and lime green on the heel and tongue, along with the trademark trio of Adidas stripes along the side, this pair retails for \$150.

For post-match wear, it always makes sense to bring along a warm-down suit, and this collection has that covered, too. The **White Barricade Sweatpants** are full-length tennis pants with tapered legs and elasticized ankles,

made from Climacool that's 88% polyamide and 12% elastane. A zipper runs the full length of the leg from ankle to thigh, providing ease of wear and a quick change for the next match or lunch in the clubhouse. The logo is discreetly positioned on the right hip of these flattering warmers, which may be purchased for \$100.

The **White Barricade Jacket** finishes the look, with a drawstring funnel neck and front zipper. Wide bands of elastic accent the waist and cuffs of this topper which has 71% polyamide and 29% elastane. This fun and functional piece, with the logo stitched onto the left upper bodice, sells for \$150.

For those who prefer one piece instead of separates while on the court or at the awards ceremony, the **White Barricade Tennis Dress** features seamless fabric on the top and engineered structure on the skirt for optimal performance. Another Climacool construction with 92% polyamide and 8% elastane, this tennis wardrobe staple displays a front logo on the upper chest, slim fit and thigh-length tights under the skirt. Tennis fashionistas can purchase the Barricade Dress for \$130.

The Barricade collection includes multi-colored options as well as shorts and accessories. McCartney has been quoted as saying, "We are still one of the only collaborations between fashion and sport that truly targets the high-performance arena, and I am really proud of that."

It's refreshing to know there's a designer out there who has women's backs (and fronts and sides), whether on the tennis court, the running track or at the yoga studio. McCartney's sensitivity was rewarded during the run-up to the Olympic Summer Games in 2012, when she was appointed Team Great Britain's Creative Director by Adidas—the first time in the history of the games that a leading fashion designer has designed the apparel for a country's team across all competitions for both the Olympic and Paralympic Games. In 2016, the designer was once again appointed as Team GB's Creative Director by Adidas for the summer Olympic Games in Rio.

Thanks to her talent and creativity, McCartney has made it socially acceptable to fuse fashion and athleticism. The Adidas by Stella McCartney collection fully prepares us to serve that ace in the sport of life.

A CONCERT OF YELLOW, WHITE AND ROSE GOLD BANGLES STEAL THE SHOW

Gold is a relatively rare element, a precious metal that has been used for coinage, jewelry and other arts throughout recorded history. In the past, a gold standard was often implemented as a monetary policy, but gold coins were phased out as a circulating currency in the 1930s, following the Great Depression. Even though the world gold standard was abandoned after 1971, the term “gold standard” persists today, colloquially referring to the best, most reliable or most prestigious thing of its type.

Pervasive in jewelry, art, décor, currency and even medicine and industry, gold is an element defined by an infinite number of personalities, depending on the artist’s vision. Beautifully colored gold alloys include distinctive 18K rose gold created by the addition of copper, and spectacular white gold resulting from the addition of palladium or nickel.

Treatments such as hammering, engraving and embossing can completely alter the reflection of light on a piece, just as incorporating angles rather than curves can totally transform gold jewelry.

The Italian design house of Vendorafa is known for bringing the purity of gold to a higher level. Vendorafa owners, Augusto Ungarelli and his wife, lead designer Daniela Lombardi, guide the small dynamic family-run business steeped in the rich history of goldsmithing. The couple painstakingly oversees each piece and process from its creative inception through casting and design.

The **Vendorafa 18K Gold Wide Hammered Design Bracelet** measures two inches wide, exclaiming its striking statement on the wrist. An intricate hammered pattern covers the surface of the bangle, which features an angled design with a hinge for ease of wear. This eye-catching piece may be purchased for \$38,000.

The **Vendorafa 18K White Gold Wide Hammered Design Bracelet** is similar to its yellow gold counterpart, also characterized by a wide, angled structure with a side hinge. The underside of the bracelet is smooth as a sheet of glass, offering a pleasing contrast to the opposite side. The white gold version measures 1.5 inches wide and is available for \$26,600.

Vendorafa is known for bold geometric shapes, exemplified in the **Vendorafa 18K Rose Gold Beveled Hammered Design Bracelet**. The cuff measures just over one inch wide, showcasing a beveled design that’s both delicate and bold. This lovely piece sells for \$20,600.

The **Vendorafa 18K Gold Wave Bracelet** takes advantage of the malleable consistency of pure gold, applying both smooth and hammered finishes to the bangle, which takes on a wave contour, almost resembling a lovingly hand-formed fluted pie crust. Approximately 1.5 inches wide, the piece retails for \$24,500.

A sensuous variation on the wave theme can be seen in the **Vendorafa Onda Hammered 18K Gold Wave Bangle**, crafted with pure 18K gold. The broad, undulating waves of this bangle stretch 2.5 inches wide with a side hinge to facilitate comfort, and the overall shape forms a continuous infinity symbol. The Wave Bangle is available for \$18,985.

Another of Vendorafa’s trademarks is its reliance on organic figures and classic patterns. True to theme, the **Vendorafa Anaconda 18K Gold Bracelet with Diamonds** takes on linear shapes and a spotted design, reminiscent of a snake’s skin. From the Anaconda Collection, the bracelet is crafted from 18K yellow gold and accented with pavé white diamond trim (0.63 tcw.). Marked by impeccable execution and artistry, this bangle sells for \$11,750.

Buccellati is yet another classic design house lauded for its exquisitely textured jewelry, showcasing gold and silver spun together in sophisticated webs, often punctuated with precious stones. Launched in Milan in 1919, the brand is represented by family members who still personally design each piece before it's handcrafted by Italian artisans. The meticulous metalwork manifests its way into spectacular cuffs, bracelets and bangles.



The **Buccellati Étoile Cuff Bracelet with Diamonds** features thick 18K yellow gold strands shaped into an elaborate rope pattern, intertwining and crisscrossing its way along the entire length. Large, leaf-shaped white diamonds accent the bangle (4.91 tcw.), nestling between the twists of rope, each individually set in delicate white gold. The piece measures 2.5 inches wide and 1.5 inches thick atop the wrist. It retails for \$41,400.

Buccellati's Macri Cuff Bracelet with Diamonds is crafted in brushed 18K yellow gold, shaped into a gently curving form with split opening for dressing simplicity. Round white diamonds (0.75 tcw.) are positioned in polished 18K gold hardware stations, each surrounded by eight smaller round diamonds. Petite accents of white gold run parallel around the cuff, available for \$26,000.

A similar version of the **Buccellati Macri Cuff Bracelet with Diamonds** is available with an inverse design of brushed 18K white gold accented by round diamonds (0.77 tcw.), each set in 18K yellow gold and surrounded by smaller diamonds. This piece also sells for \$26,000.

Buccellati's AB Macri Gold Diamond Cuff is a wider iteration of the Macri, created with a finely brushed 18K yellow gold frame. Three rows of alternating round white diamonds (1.48 tcw.) are arranged along the surface of the cuff in groupings of four. Each cluster is set in 18K white gold assuming a vivid contrast against the yellow gold background. The AB Cuff may be purchased for \$34,500.
