# The Man Behind

## Some of Golf's Best Development Projects

MIKE MELDMAN TURNED ONE FAILURE INTO AN IMPRESSIVELY LONG LIST OF SUCCESSES

If young Mike Meldman had passed his law school admissions test, gone to law school and become a lawyer, would Discovery Land Company have been created?

We'll never know. Because he *did* "bomb" his LSAT, he *didn't* go to law school and he *did* create Discovery, now widely recognized as the modern gold standard for residential golf-course developments.

Meldman, 59, is founder and CEO of Scottsdale, Arizona-based Discovery Land Company, a name that conjures images of the world's athletic, industrial and social elite enjoying the fruits of their labor in thoughtfully-designed spaces, on golf courses built by the best and in residential estates that melt into the landscape.

Yet he got into real estate development purely by chance.

After graduating from Stanford in 1981, law school plans scuttled, Meldman began dealing blackjack at Harrah's Casino in Stateline, Nevada. There, he met Bruce Ashwill, who'd just formed Bishop-Hawk. The rest is history.

"[Bruce] asked me if I wanted to make as much money as I wanted and work as little as I wanted, and I said, 'sure,'" Meldman recalls. "He put me in an area called Fremont, which was all farms. My whole training was, 'Put up a sign, someone will call.' It was all commission and I'd go to Tahoe on weekends to deal blackjack just to have some money to live on."

Then Fremont started selling and he said to himself, "Well, that was easy."

Meldman sold Fremont and spearheaded a development in Portola, California, learning to develop in concert with the environment. He turned to residential golf development in 1994, creating Scottsdale's Estancia with course-designer Tom Fazio. With its natural appearance, dream location, stunning golf course and dramatic residential lots, Estancia was an instant success.

"It's basically Pinnacle Peak mountain, where we dropped a golf course in without a lot of grading, de-veg[etation] or re-veg[etation]," Meldman says. "By the time we opened the course and started assigning real estate, it looked like it had been there forever."

One of Discovery's next creations was Iron Horse in Whitefish, Montana, where Meldman's growing boys, Hunter and Will, began to exert their influence on their dad's developments.

Iron Horse was created with an inter-generational intention, luring families with the promise of world-class golf and adventure in the Pacific Northwest. The boys were living in San Francisco, but soon became "mountain men" at Iron Horse, according to Meldman. Other member families, many from San Francisco, did the same.

"Once Iron Horse hit, I knew we were on to something," Meldman says.

The Montana experience drove Discovery's next projects. The Kuki'o development on Hawai'i was created with the same family-adventure theme as Iron Horse; however, instead of

conquering the backwoods, Kuki'o member families—and Meldman's boys—learned to become "Hawai'ian watermen," capable of surfing, scuba diving, canoeing and anything else involving water.

The boys, now 30 and 28, respectively (little brother Max is five), also helped make Discovery's golf experiences unique by inspiring the comfort stations that appear on every Discovery course. From a candy store to a Kobe beef slider bar to the Casamigos Taco Bar, players are never more than a few holes away from their next on-course delight—all because Meldman wanted the boys on the course.

"Next to some tee boxes I put a cooler with candy bars, Cokes, Sprites, stuff like that," Meldman says. "Instead of playing golf, the

five-year old goes to the first tee, opens the cooler, has a Coke, has a candy bar, then runs down the fairway to the next tee so he can have another candy bar. That was literally the beginning of the comfort stations."

The hits kept coming, including the Coachella Valley's own Discovery gems, The Hideaway and The Madison Club. Meldman says the time was right for developing a desert property in the early 2000s, and Discovery produced The Hideaway in La Quinta, a 36-hole facility







with Pete Dye and Clive Clark-designed courses. Lots and memberships sold out in 18 months.

With excess land from The Hideaway, and inspiration from Shadow Creek in North Las Vegas, Nevada, Meldman and Fazio teamed up to produce the Madison Club.

"I went to Fazio and said, 'Let's do a Shadow Creek with a limited amount of lots, because over the last 18 years you've learned a lot about architecture and I've learned a lot about land planning, so let's try to build the perfect golf club.' That's how The Madison Club came about. I still think playing at The Madison is one of the best days of golf you can have."

Building clubs that drew the world's professional elite soon had Meldman running with the planet's big dogs. He was befriended by film producer/talent agent Jerry Weintraub, who "immediately gave me credibility. We loved each other," Meldman says. The two remained close until Weintraub's passing in 2015.

Hanging with Weintraub led to friendships with Tommy Armour III and with entertainers George Clooney and Rande Gerber. The latter three's relationship developed at Discovery's El Dorado Golf and Beach Club in Los Cabos, Mexico, where they

were neighbors and partners in their Casamigos tequila, an exclusive spirit made specifically for the trio. The tequila is sold at Gerber's bars and Discovery properties and stashed in Clooney's liquor cabinets.

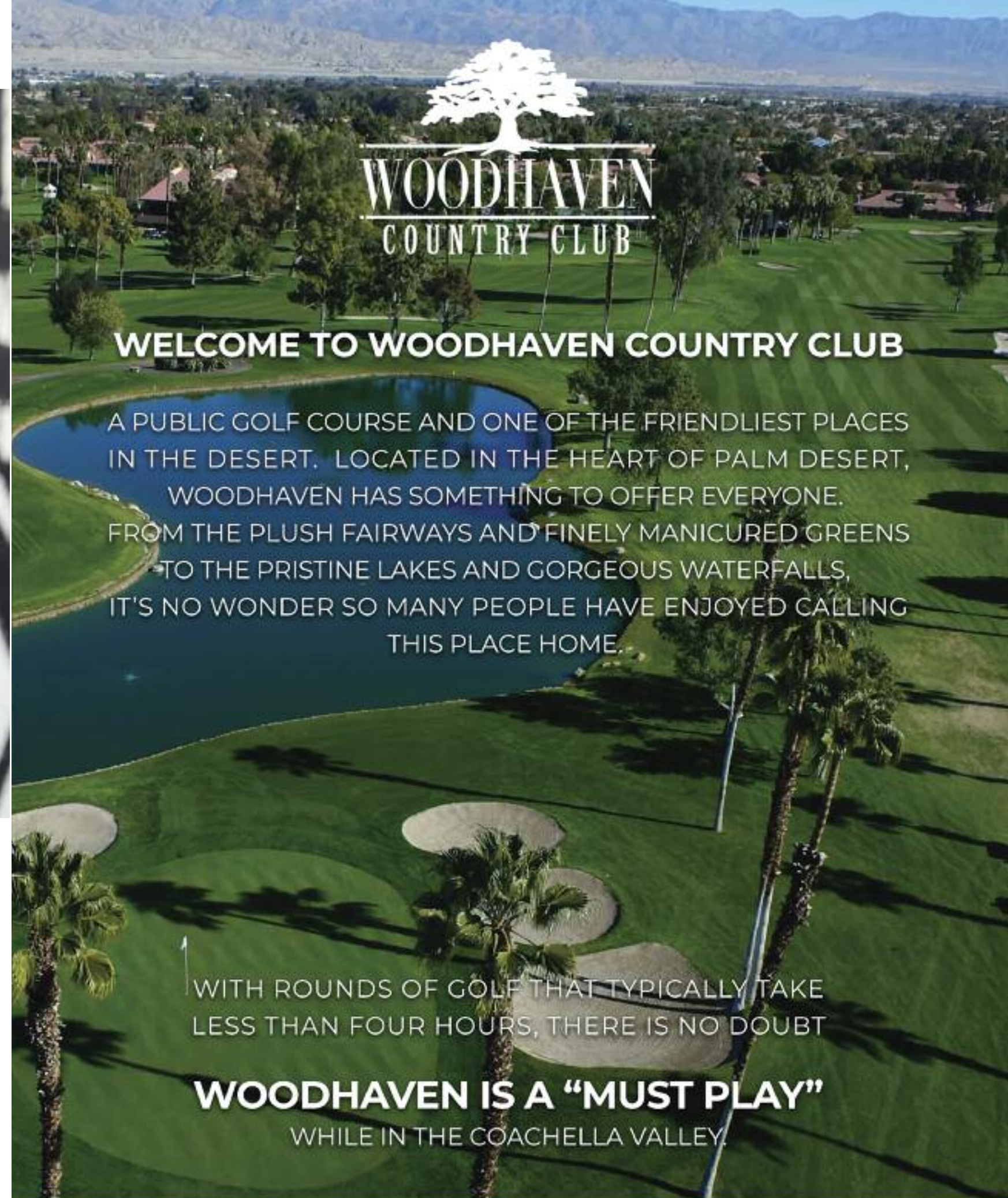
"When I did El Dorado, George and Rande both bought houses down there. We drank a lot of tequila. We liked a lot of different tequilas but figured we should just make our own," he says.

Meldman currently has multiple projects in the works and on the horizon.

"We have Vegas, we have Chileno Bay, which opened two years ago in Cabo. We're building new courses in Nashville, Tennessee, and in Texas. There's a new project in the Dominican Republic and Barbuda, and another in New York called Saddle Ridge," he says. "So yeah, we're busy."

While Meldman has already lived and achieved enough for several lifetimes, his story—and Discovery's—is still being written.

When we launched with the Sept/Oct issue in 1998, our publication was called *Desert Golf* magazine. It featured a photo of Indian Wells Country Club on the cover and included the news that the Skins Game purse had just been raised to \$1 million—almost unheard of at the time.

Compare that to the one-time, head-to-head match between Tiger Woods and Phil Mickelson in fall 2018, when \$9 million was the purse, not to mention millions of additional dollars in side bets. How times have changed!

Over the years our magazine has featured a slew of movers and shakers on our covers, including U.S. presidents Gerald Ford and Bill Clinton, both tied not only to their love of golf in the Coachella Valley but to charitable endeavors that have made critical differences in the lives of those in need. 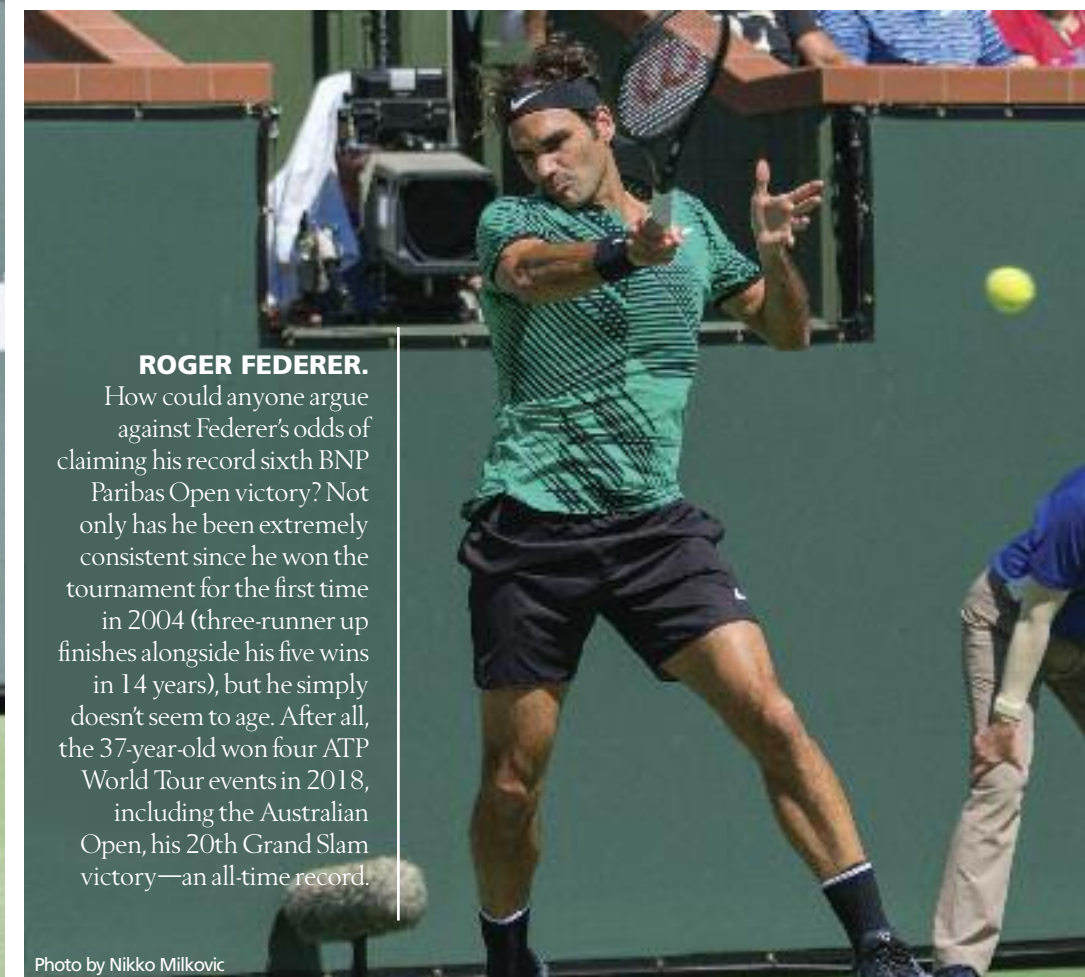

# BNP Paribas Open

ON MARCH 4, THE BRIGHTEST STARS OF TENNIS WILL GATHER TO COMPETE AT INDIAN WELLS TENNIS GARDEN

There's no tennis tournament quite like the BNP Paribas Open. Not only is it contested at renowned Indian Wells Tennis Garden—a venue regularly updated and expanded to provide fans the best viewing experience possible—and held in one of the world's most gorgeous communities, from its mountain vistas to near perfect weather year-round, it also welcomes tennis's cream of the crop.

And that's exactly why thousands upon thousands of fans travel to Indian Wells, California, every March. They want to witness the greatness of the game's best players firsthand.

Not surprising, each year the storyline is impressive, whether up-and-comers shock the fans with unexpected victories or longstanding champions claim the title yet again.

Last March, fans were enamored by Juan Martin del Potro's surprising victory over Roger Federer, as well as Naomi Osaka's rise from a relatively unknown to a BNP Paribas Open champion (then just a few months later U.S. Open champion as well). The outcomes

were certainly surprising, unlike recent years when the likes of Federer, Novak Djokovic and Rafael Nadal dominated.

So what should fans expect this year? The best of the best competing toe-to-toe, or perhaps some unexpected players challenging the world's highest-ranked professionals? Or maybe a little bit of both? Regardless of which players contend in the final matches, Philippe Dore, the tournament's media and marketing director, believes fans should prepare for remarkable storylines yet again in 2019.

"As usual, we'll have all of the top players in the world," Dore says. "There are so many great storylines happening on the ATP World and WTA Tours right now, too, from the old guard to the new guard."

In particular, fans should keep their eyes on the following players, due to their past performances at Indian Wells as well as their recent results.



#### NOVAK DJOKOVIC

Djokovic will also be seeking his record sixth win at the BNP Paribas Open. From 2014 to 2016, Djokovic enjoyed one of the tournament's most dominating stretches, earning three consecutive victories, a feat only matched by Federer. His momentum has stalled since then, however. He missed half of the 2017 season due to an elbow injury, which ultimately required surgery. But as evidenced by his performances in 2018—four ATP World Tour wins, including Wimbledon and the U.S. Open—the elbow is no longer slowing him down. Expect this positive momentum to continue in March.

# **RAFAEL NADAL.**

Although he hasn't won the BNP Paribas Open since 2013, the three-time champion is so consistent, talented and focused that no one should bet against him returning to the winner's circle. With an astonishing 11 French Open victories to his credit, Nadal is often regarded as the greatest clay surface player the game has ever seen, and rightly so. But don't underestimate his talents on hard surfaces either; he's also won six other Grand Slams on grass.

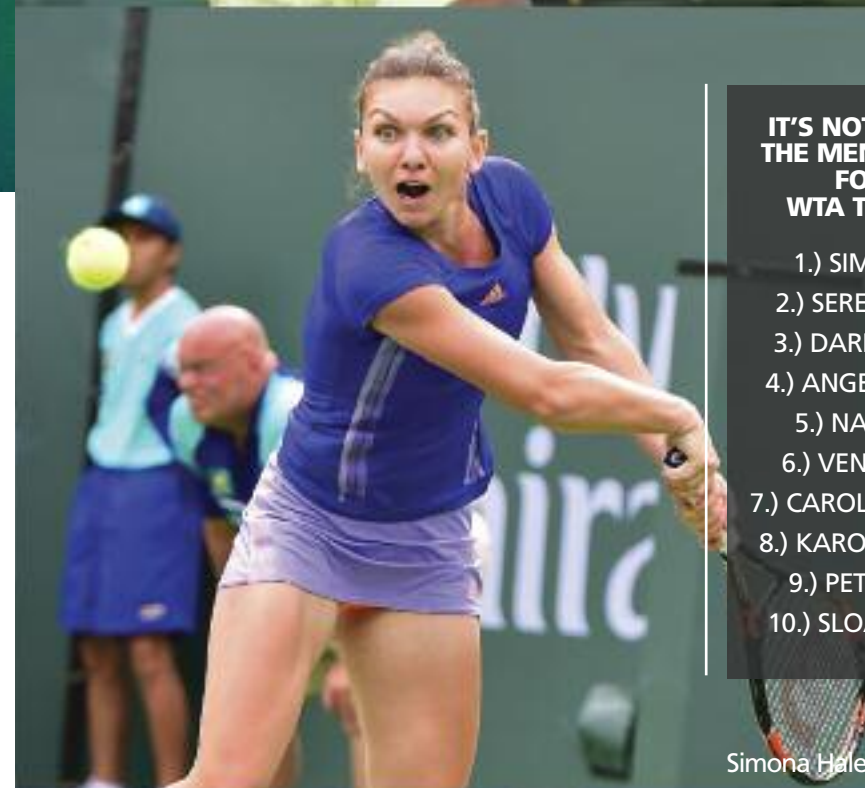

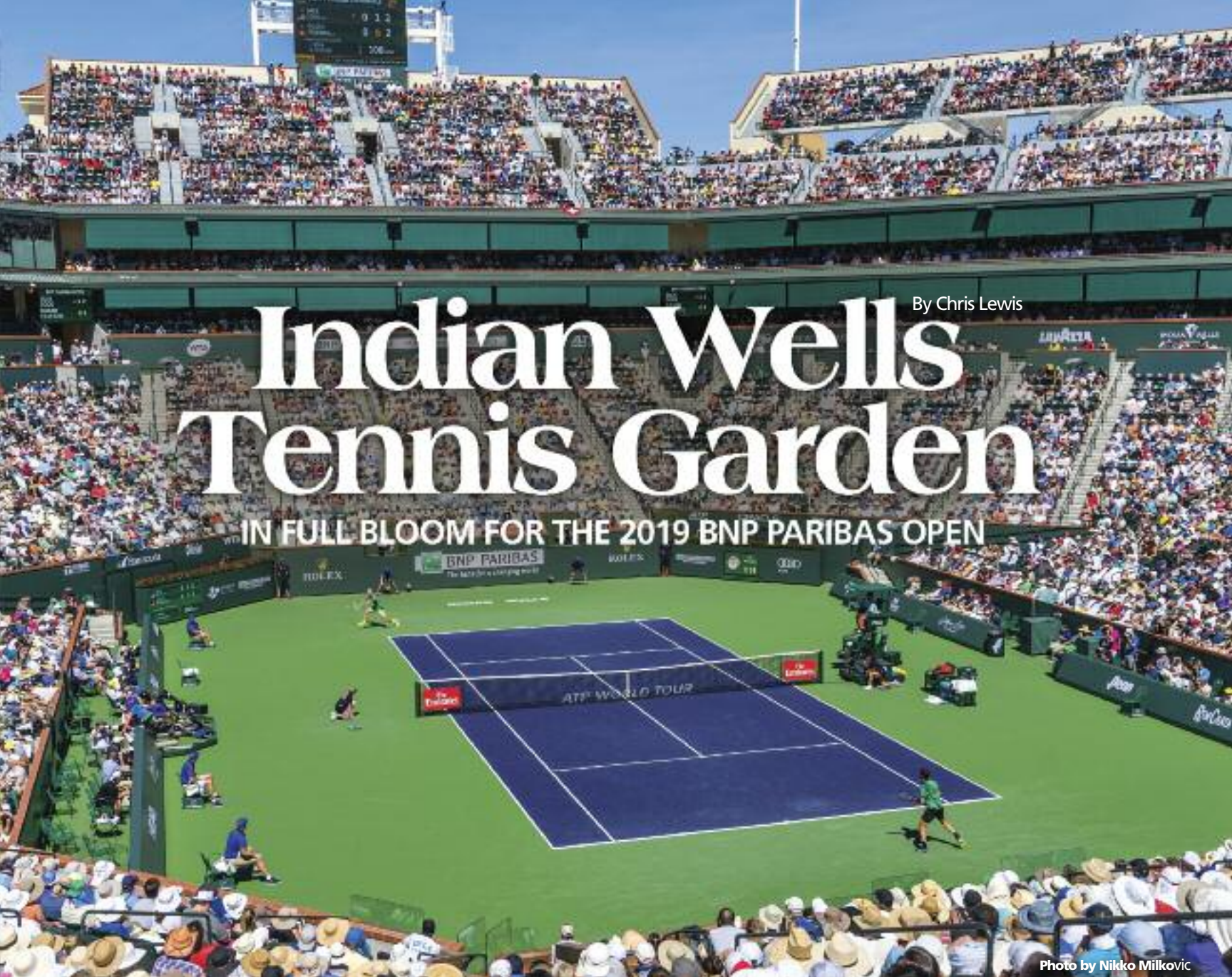

# **JUAN MARTÍN DEL POTRO.**

Although a defending champion shouldn't ever be considered a "sleeper pick," when compared to Federer, Djokovic and Nadal, del Potro most likely will be. His 2018 victory was surprising—some would even say shocking—as he has overcome four wrist surgeries to once again become a top-tier player. Currently ranked fourth in the world, del Potro could very well reach the final of the 2019 BNP Paribas Open. He's not only talented enough, but his perseverance is matched by few others—and perseverance is a necessity at Indian Wells.

"IT'S ALWAYS FUN TO SEE RETURNING CHAMPIONS COME BACK AND COMPETE YEAR AFTER YEAR," DORE SAYS. "OUR TOURNAMENT GIVES FANS THE OPPORTUNITY TO GET CLOSE TO THESE GREAT ATHLETES AND, WITH SO MANY IN ATTENDANCE, IT REALLY IS A MEMORABLE EXPERIENCE."





When Indian Wells Tennis Garden (IWTG) opened in 2000, tennis players and fans alike were captivated by the facility's beauty and size; it featured the 16,100-seat Stadium 1, which remains the second largest tennis stadium in the world.

Already impressive in size and grandeur, Indian Wells Tennis Garden has continued to expand since then. In fact, it seems the facility is now renovated on an annual basis. In 2013, the Garden's most substantial expansion project occurred, which was four years after Larry Ellison, co-founder and CEO of Oracle Corporation, became a major shareholder. In that year, the 8,000-seat Stadium 2 was developed just in time for the 2014 BNP Paribas Open.

In 2014, three new restaurants, including the elegant Nobu, along with a 19,000-square-foot shade structure (the second on the property) were also finalized. IWTG has 29 tennis courts and nearly 11,000 parking spaces on almost 90 acres of land.

With all of these additions completed, Ellison and his team turned their attention to Stadium 1. From 2016 to 2017, a significant renovation and development project occurred, as the Stadium Plaza was expanded, suites and hospitality spaces were modernized, new seats were added and restrooms were upgraded.

A new court surface was also developed so that television cameras could be lowered, and a VIP Champions Club (a lower bowl VIP box) was created. Additionally, 21 restaurants and concession areas were opened to the public, including Wolfgang Puck's Spago.

"In all, Stadium 1 was expanded by roughly 100,000 square feet," says Philippe Dore, media and marketing director for the BNP Paribas Open. "The Stadium Plaza's size also increased considerably. Known for providing fans an opportunity to simultaneously watch videos of more than one match, the Plaza now has a 'superwall' that displays up to five matches all at one time."

This technology isn't overly surprising; after all, the venue was also the first of its kind to purchase the highly expensive Hawk-Eye line-calling replay technology, which is featured on every single IWTG court. Regarded as an innovative addition at the time, the technology can now be found at many of the world's prominent tennis venues.

#### A Celebration of Nature

Aside from its expansions, renovations and impressive technology, Indian Wells Tennis Garden is also renowned for its location in one of the world's most gorgeous areas, offering fans an

opportunity to savor the picturesque views of mountains, deserts and palm trees while also enjoying the beautiful weather that Indian Wells offers nearly all year-long.

To celebrate this pristine setting, IWTG management decided to implement an integrated marketing campaign last year. The campaign, known as Full Bloom, focused on the tournament's topnotch field of professionals along with the venue's natural surroundings. Upgrades also occurred inside and outside the venue, including the addition of 62 palm trees and more flowers, foliage and plants.

"The palm trees were added between the venue's two 19,000-square-foot shade structures, as well as in the Food Village and retail area," Dore states. "Not to mention, two new fountains were also added to the property. One is located near the shade structures while the other was placed near the retail area—providing fans yet another opportunity to unwind and appreciate nature."

Another two renovations were announced last year: new video walls on the north and south ends of Stadium 1's court, as well as a new restaurant in Stadium 2, Wally's Desert Turtle, serving up contemporary California cuisine.

#### Further Improving Player and Fan Experiences

As the Garden prepares for the 2019 BNP Paribas Open, it's continuing its Full Bloom campaign while also maintaining another "tradition"—renovation.

Currently, the players' locker room is being upgraded to ensure that it's more comfortable and spacious. Player comfort is a key goal for the venue, which may be one reason why professionals have named the BNP Paribas Open the ATP World Tour and WTA Tour's top tournament for the last four years.



Additionally, 44 pickleball courts, along with a championship court, have been added to the property, as Indian Wells Tennis Garden recently hosted the 2018 USA Pickleball National Championships. To improve the experiences of fans attending events, the venue is also preparing to provide better foot traffic and parking options.

"More than 450,000 people attended the BNP Paribas Open in 2018," Dore says. "We're constantly improving the Indian Wells Tennis Garden and would like to one day have 500,000 attendees at the tournament."

## THIS WINTER, TENNIS'S FUTURE STARS WILL COMPETE IN NEWPORT BEACH AND INDIAN WELLS

In Indian Wells, California, no tennis tournament is discussed more than the BNP Paribas Open. After all, it features the game's most prominent players, including Roger Federer, the Williams Sisters and Rafael Nadal, names even people who aren't tennis fans recognize.

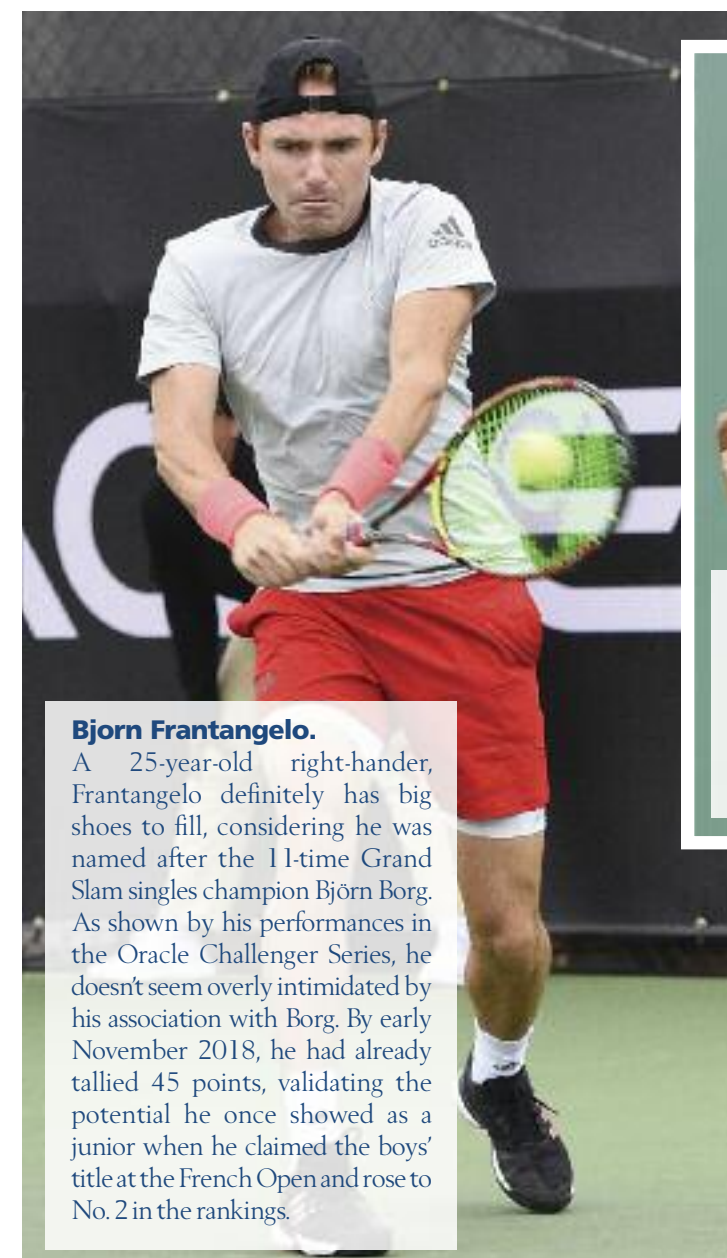
But what about the game's up and comers, the future of tennis, the names you may not be familiar with today but could very well be in a few years (or less)?

The Oracle Challenger Series was developed in late 2017 to support these rising stars. Hosted in four American cities—Chicago, Houston, Newport Beach and Indian Wells—the series provides up-and-comers an opportunity to acquire significant prize money; \$150,000 is awarded to the WTA 125, as well as the ATP

World Tour, at each of the four events, along with world-ranking points.

Every Challenger event features 32-player singles, along with 16-team doubles draws. Once the series concludes, four players (two men and two women) acquire wild cards into singles main draws at the BNP Paribas Open. These players earn this potentially career-changing opportunity as a result of the total points they earn throughout the Challenger series, a true measure of their consistency.

As the BNP Paribas Open nears, here are the male and female tennis players most likely to earn wild cards. Not only have they played consistently well lately, but they've also previously shown signs that they can eventually become successful members of the ATP World and WTA Tours.



### Bjorn Frantangelo.

A 25-year-old right-hander, Frantangelo definitely has big shoes to fill, considering he was named after the 11-time Grand Slam singles champion Björn Borg. As shown by his performances in the Oracle Challenger Series, he doesn't seem overly intimidated by his association with Borg. By early November 2018, he had already tallied 45 points, validating the potential he once showed as a junior when he claimed the boys' title at the French Open and rose to No. 2 in the rankings.

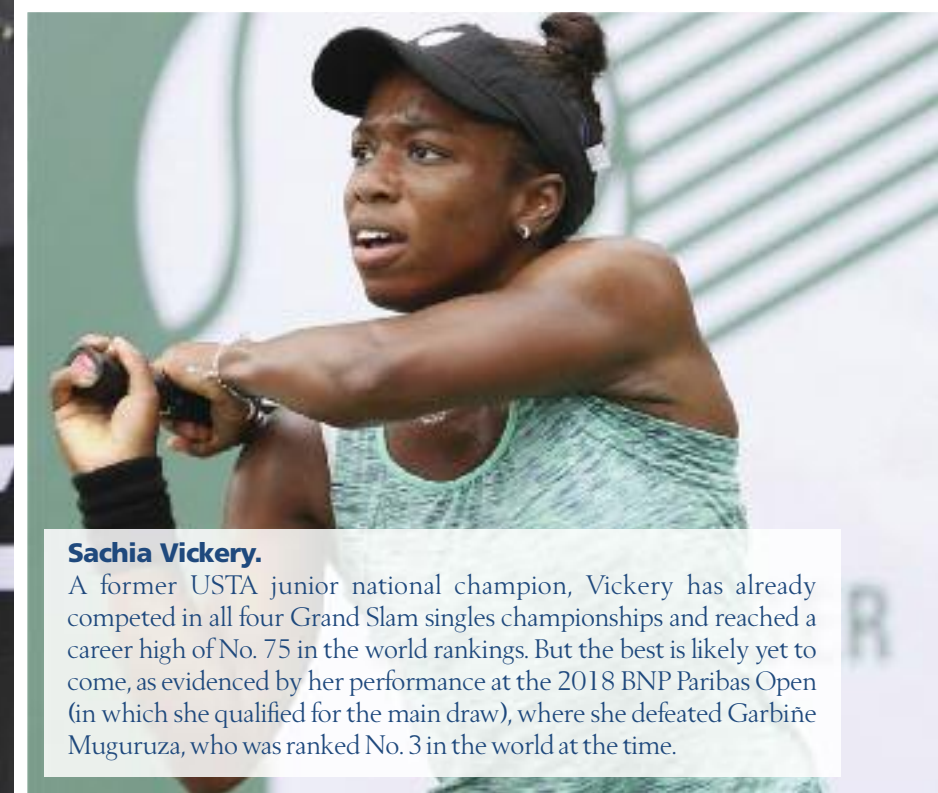
"The series is accomplishing what it was designed to do," says Philippe Dore, the BNP Paribas Open's media and marketing director. "It's giving up-and-coming American tennis players more opportunities to earn points and climb the rankings. And every point matters for players who are hoping to earn a wild card into the BNP Paribas Open."

### Looking Ahead to the Newport Beach and Indian Wells Titles

In 2019, the first Oracle Challenger Series event of the year will be hosted at Newport Beach Tennis Club, which features 19 hard courts. As was the case in 2018, it will once again be held at the end of January.

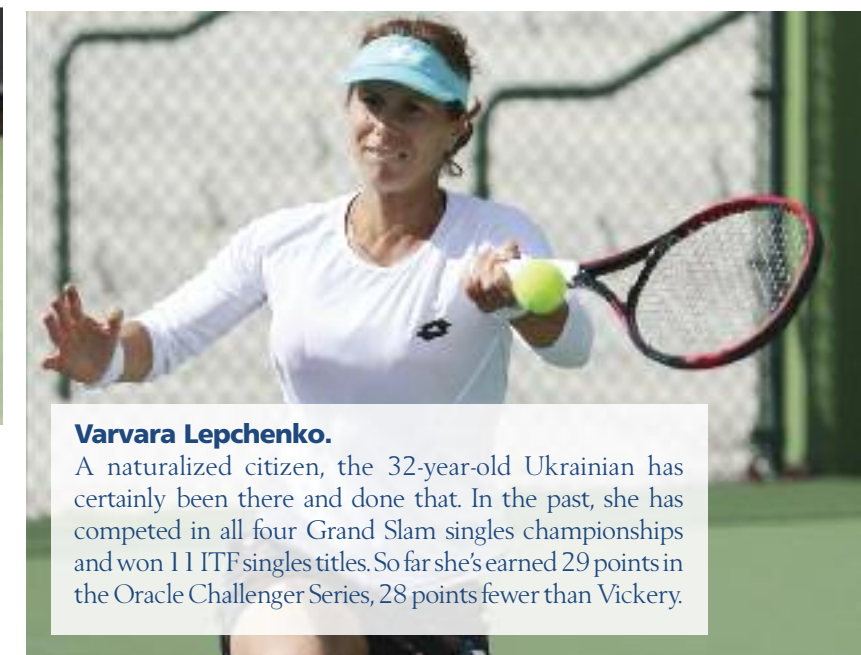
Roughly 12 months ago, 20-year-old Taylor Fritz defeated Bradley Klahn 3-6, 7-5 and 6-0 at the inaugural Newport Beach event. Two months later, he competed at the BNP Paribas Open; he wasn't eliminated until the fourth round, a further indication of his potential for future professional success.

In addition, 24-year-old Danielle Collins claimed the women's title 2-6, 6-4, 6-3 against Sofya Zhuk. The victory was a surprise at the time, as she was ranked 162nd in the world. She has apparently



### Sachia Vickery.

A former USTA junior national champion, Vickery has already competed in all four Grand Slam singles championships and reached a career high of No. 75 in the world rankings. But the best is likely yet to come, as evidenced by her performance at the 2018 BNP Paribas Open (in which she qualified for the main draw), where she defeated Garbiñe Muguruza, who was ranked No. 3 in the world at the time.



### Varvara Lepchenko.

A naturalized citizen, the 32-year-old Ukrainian has certainly been there and done that. In the past, she has competed in all four Grand Slam singles championships and won 11 ITF singles titles. So far she's earned 29 points in the Oracle Challenger Series, 28 points fewer than Vickery.

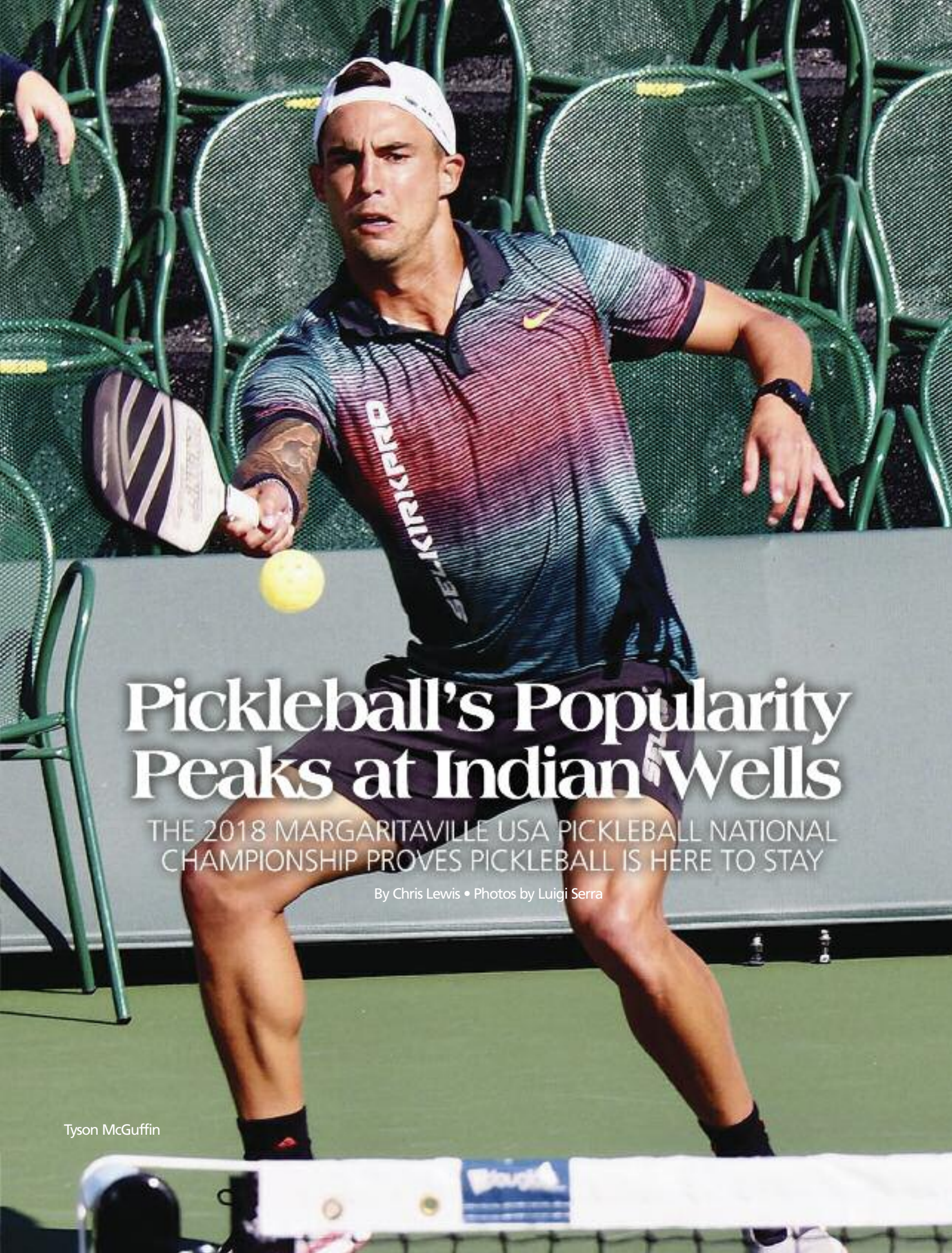
made the most of the triumph, since then rising to the top 40 of the world rankings.

In the meantime, the second Oracle Challenger Series event of 2019 will be contested at Indian Wells Tennis Garden Feb. 25-Mar. 3. Although the Indian Wells community will mainly be focused on the upcoming BNP Paribas Open, they should also pay attention to the Oracle Challenger Series field, which may very well include future BNP Paribas Open contenders.

"These players are the future of tennis," Dore states. "And Indian Wells residents have the opportunity to witness these upcoming stars firsthand, as they prepare for the next chapters of their careers."

# Pickleball's Popularity Peaks at Indian Wells

THE 2018 MARGARITAVILLE USA PICKLEBALL NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP PROVES PICKLEBALL IS HERE TO STAY

In 1965, three friends—Bill Bell, Barney McCallum and Joel Pritchard—decided to create a new game, one that combined a backyard badminton court with their makeshift wooden paddles. Believed to be named for Pritchard's cocker spaniel, Pickles, the game slowly gained a fan following, ultimately resulting in the formation of the USA Pickleball Association (USAPA) and the establishment of pickleball's first National Championships in 2009.

More than 400 players participated in the first annual tournament, which was held in Arizona. Over time, participation increased considerably—to the point where more than 2,200 players from 46 states competed in 4,293 total matches in 2018, the largest tournament in pickleball history.

The participation surge is not a surprise, however. After all, 3.1 million Americans currently play the game, which has even gained popularity all around the world. In fact, if the latest Margaritaville USA Pickleball National Championships provides any

indication—and it most likely does—the future of pickleball is brighter than it ever has been.

Not only did the championship offer the largest cash prize in the history of the sport (\$75,000), but it was also held at world-renowned Indian Wells Tennis Garden. Known primarily for featuring the world's second largest tennis stadium (16,100-seat Stadium 1), the venue is also preparing for the continuous growth of pickleball.

In preparation for the Margaritaville USA Pickleball National Championships, which was contested from November 3-11, Indian Wells Tennis Garden offered participants 44 pickleball courts, along with a championship court. Due to the prestige of Indian Wells Tennis Garden, as well as the rising popularity of the sport, the last four days of the tournament were broadcast live on ESPN3—yet another sign that pickleball has entered the mainstream.

#### A Sunday to Remember

Television viewers were definitely not disappointed. On Sunday, defending champion Tyson McGuffin (considered by many to be the best pickleball player in the world currently) competed against Tyler Loong. The pro men's singles gold medal match was very entertaining, as McGuffin won the first game 11-2, but lost the second 3-11. Suddenly a match that some fans considered a safe bet had become a nail-biter. Ultimately, McGuffin prevailed, winning the last game 11-7 and earning a gold medal for the second year in a row.

The pro women's singles championship was equally entertaining, as Lucy Kovalova was paired against Irina Tereschenko, who happens to be her doubles partner. In 2017, the pair fared well in the singles championship with Tereschenko winning a silver medal and Kovalova claiming the bronze. This year, however, Kovalova was victorious, defeating Tereschenko 11-4, 9-11 and 11-8.

"The level of professionalism that our players and fans experienced was unlike anything to date for the sport of pickleball. The venue, of course, is amazing—and Margaritaville was much more than a title sponsor," says Justin Maloof, executive director, USAPA. "Margaritaville assumed a very active role in many areas of the tournament, including 16 hours of live-stream coverage on ESPN3 and a one-hour nationally televised broadcast on ESPNEWS on Sunday, November 25."



#### Amenities Away from the Courts

When spectators weren't watching the matches, they were likely enjoying food and beverages at concessions inspired by Jimmy Buffet and Margaritaville: Boathouse, Feeding Frenzy and Tiki Hut, along with the License to Chill bar. Each concession offered signature dishes, from the Boathouse's Key West quesadilla and Lava Lava Shrimp to the Feeding Frenzy's Cheeseburger in Paradise to the Tiki Hut's Key Lime Pie. Meanwhile, the License to

Chill provided guests specialty drinks such as the Who's to Blame Margarita and the Pickleball Rita.

Furthermore, patrons were welcomed to play games like ping-pong and corn hole in the Interactive Zone, observe medal ceremonies and participate in parent/child pickleball round robins. Live music was also provided throughout the tournament, as well as one day prior to it, with entertainers ranging from The Killer Dueling Pianos and the Tad Sisler Band to the John Stanley King Band and The Smash Up.

Due to the success of the 2018 Margaritaville USA Pickleball National Championships, USAPA and Desert Champions, LLC (Indian Wells Tennis Garden) now have a five-year agreement in place, as the event will be hosted at the venue through at least 2022. As a result, Indian Wells Tennis Garden is currently implementing plans for permanent pickleball courts.

"We now have a true signature event that highlights our top players like never before," Maloof states. "Hosting the event at Indian Wells Tennis Garden, which is truly 'Pickleball Paradise,' is a major milestone for the sport."

# The Tournament That Was and is Again the Desert Classic

CHANGES AT THE CAREERBUILDER CHALLENGE  
WON'T AFFECT THE 2019 EVENT

La Quinta Country Club

Changes and improvements are happening so fast, and the event date is approaching so quickly, organizers of the 2019 Desert Classic can't drive 55. They're going 100 miles per hour.

The Desert Classic was the CareerBuilder Challenge until early November, when CareerBuilder's new parent company made the decision to pull out of its five-year contract two years early. The company will fund the upcoming event, meaning not much will change for this year's event other than signage. The purse is set at \$5.9 million, charitable donations to local charities are once again expected to range near \$1 million and Golf Channel remains the television partner, broadcasting all four rounds. This year's event is scheduled for January 17-20 at PGA West's Stadium and Nicklaus Tournament courses, and La Quinta Country Club.

With the name CareerBuilder Challenge no longer an option, organizers went back to the past and tapped the tournament's history, restoring the name it had when it first began in the late 1950s. That's a nice tie-in to the tournament's 60th anniversary, which it will celebrate this year.

According to the tournament's director, Pat McCabe with Lagardere Sports, as soon as the announcement was made, the tournament apparatus immediately began 1) the process of securing another title sponsor, and 2) making changes to the visible aspects of the tournament to reflect its new title.

He says changes will have to be made to branding elements, some of the signage and the tournament's website and social media outlets. "And we've had to let all of our volunteers, partners and sponsors know what's up," he adds.

"Other than that, things are just getting a little bit bigger. All three of our public fan venues are back this year, including the Michelob Ultra Beer for Birdies and the Casamigos Club 17, and the Von's Fan Pavilion is back bigger and better than ever," McCabe says. "And they're all available for the \$30 ticket; we didn't raise ticket prices, either."

One aspect of this year's tournament that will change are the performers for the Friday and Saturday concerts, conducted on the driving range at PGA West. This year's concerts will have a harder-rocking edge, as the Red Rocker, Sammy Hagar, and his band The Circle will play on Friday night. Saturday night, it's 70s English Rock giants Bad Company, with original members Paul Rodgers (guitar/vocals) and Simon Kirke (drums). The duo split from the band Free in 1973.

"We saw how well Huey Lewis drew last year, and this is certainly maybe a little bit harder rock, but still in that classic rock genre," McCabe says. "And I think the community will dig it, the kids and the older folks will enjoy it, so we're excited."

As for a future sponsor, Lagardere agents have fanned out with the company's substantial contact list. They're hoping to secure a long-term sponsor that, first and foremost, believes in the golf product. That sponsor will have to pony up the \$8 to \$10 million dollars it takes to put the event on, but the potential worldwide exposure, introduction to new business avenues and contacts and an association with the PGA Tour and Coachella Valley could make for a substantial return on its investment.

"We're out tilling the soil right now. Hopefully it won't take very long to get someone in, we truly believe that," McCabe says. "We don't have any specific targets but the bulk of our pro-am players are prominent individuals from corporations from around the world. So it's at least nice to know that they know this is an opportunity that's available."

The group is pursuing its list of longtime clients, of course. "But we're not looking for anyone or anything particular, no region, no exact needs so to speak," McCabe says. "It'd be hard to get a Palm Springs or a La Quinta company, but it would certainly be nice to have a Southern California company. That would make a lot of sense."

Bone sees no need to change what's already working. "The Andalusia Country Club team has done a wonderful job in providing members and homeowners with a beautiful community and a dynamic club that encourages the development of lasting friendships and relationships among owners."

Sunrise has retained the entire team to ensure a smooth transition. "We believe there are no major changes that need to be implemented and our plan is to come alongside the existing team and provide the support they need to continue their efforts," Bone says. "Over time, as we do in all of our communities, we will listen to



existing members to enhance and create events and activities that are important to them along with making improvements to the amenities that reflect the shifts in the club industry that happen over time. We will also evaluate the current trends in home design, with a view to keeping the housing product up to date."

Growth is one aspect of the housing and development side of the community, but always in keeping with what's right for residents and members—which is how the Drummond Company envisioned Andalusia as well.

"Currently 211 homes have been sold and closed," Bone says. "There will be approximately 520 homes at the completion of the community. The count may shift slightly as we finalize the areas that are not currently available but will be very close to what Drummond Company was planning. 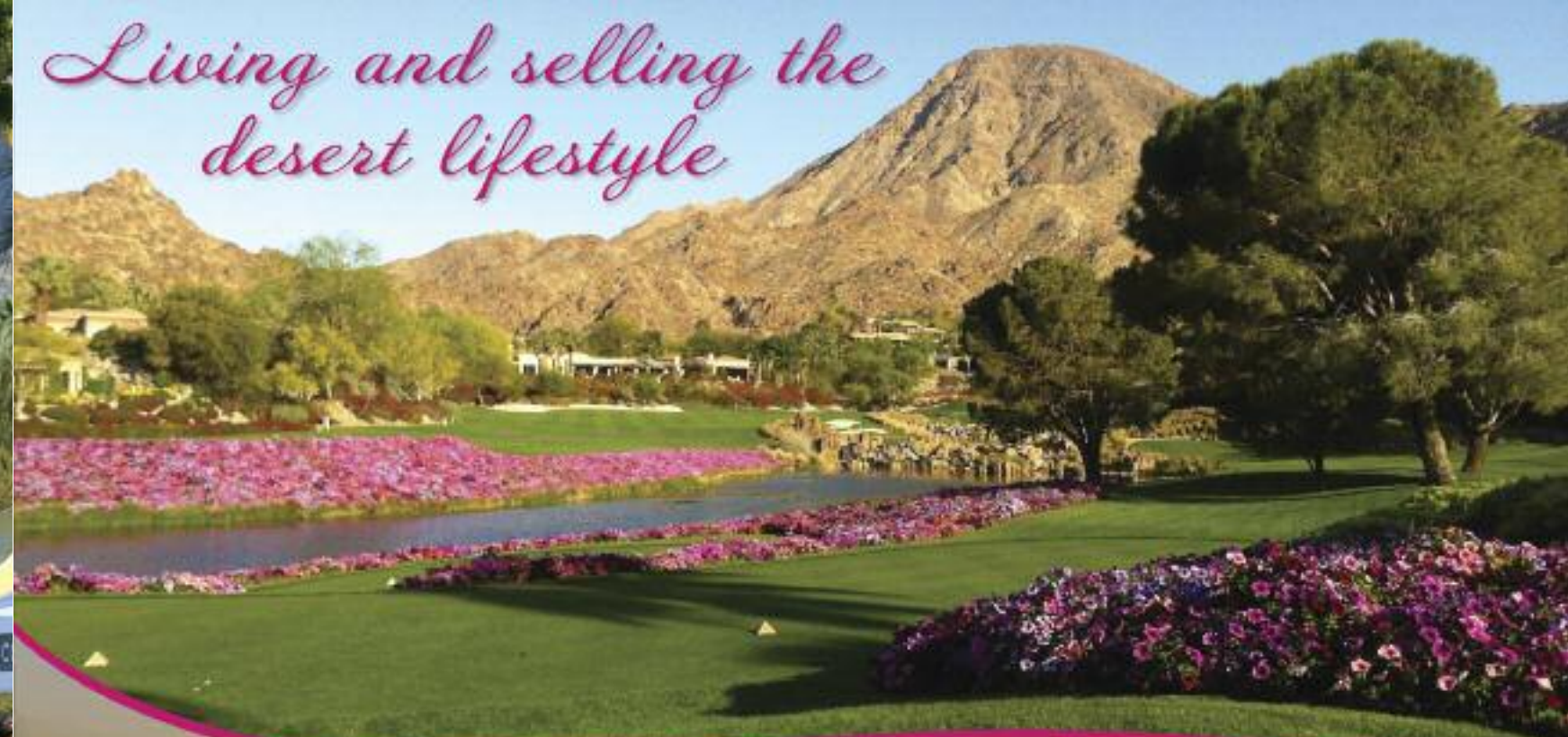

# Golf's Glamour Club

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT DRIVERS

The Driver. It's *the* glamour piece of equipment in golf. Where else is more R&D, more science and technology, continuously devoted to improving one's game?

Callaway, Wilson, Cobra, Titleist—all the sport's heavy hitters are big players when it comes to producing state-of-the-art drivers. Why? Because they know no other club provides the immediate gratification of a well-stroked tee shot that correspondingly sets a player up for a good score on that given hole.

The pure adrenaline of hitting it long—and accurately—is simply one of the great joys of the game for pros and amateurs alike.

For the average recreational golfer, perhaps more accurate than Sam Snead's maxim of, "Drive for show, putt for dough," is the observation, "If you can't putt, you can't score; if you can't drive, you can't play."

Bad driving balloons up one's score more than any other club in the bag.

On the surface, putters appear more important. Players typically use a putter for 30 to 40 shots in a round compared to using a driver for about 14 shots. But the way par is set up for each hole, it takes into account the potential of you hitting the green in regulation and having two putts.

Clearly, there are other ways to make par, but whether a hole is a Par, Par 4 or Par 5, it's based on how many strokes it should take to reach the green, along with two putts. Thus, one cannot say that the 30 to 40 times you use your putter is more than twice as valuable as the 14 drives you hit. If you're inconsistent off the tee, your driver affects your score more than your putter.

In other words, if you compare the best putter averaging say, 1.5 strokes per green, and the worst averaging 3, he's giving up 1.5 strokes per hole. However, a single handicapper more often than not sets himself up well with an accurate tee shot, whereas a poor driver rarely gets the opportunity to birdie a hole. Poor accuracy off the tee can potentially add up more strokes.

Then there's the mental anxiety when golfers worry about making others wait while they search for tee shots in the woods

or bushes. Anxiety can result in rushed shots, making things worse.

Here's where club manufacturers can lend a hand. Regardless of your handicap, it all starts with making the right choice when you purchase the club.

"The first thing every golfer should do prior to purchasing a driver, or any golf club for that matter, is to get custom fit," says Josh Tälge, vice president of golf-club marketing for Titleist, which just introduced its new TS2 and TS3 models. "It's the quickest and easiest way to improve. Spend a half hour or 45 minutes with a good fitter and you'll leave not only with a driver that will provide you more distance, accuracy and consistency, but with confidence in the fact you have optimized your launch conditions, which will ultimately contribute to better results."

Callaway's Jeff Newton concurs. "Fitting is huge," he says, adding, "Look for a driver that can help your big miss. If you're a slicer, look for a draw model or a driver with a sliding weight. And find a shaft that fits your game. Flex standards vary between shaft brands, so look for a weight class that gives you the highest swing speed with control."

The need for speed with the driver is always in play and the tech-led trend continues to roll along.

Jon Claffey of Tour Edge speaks to those trending innovations. "Weight movement for self-custom fitting, hosel adjustability for loft and lie adjustment, face technology that straightens miss-hits and lightweight speed all are part of driver technology."

Golf is a game of confidence and nowhere is it more important than when you have that driver in your hands staring down at those dimples on the ball. As you get ready to *grip it and rip it, bomb down the fairway, hit for show*, let club manufacturers' mad scientists help you.

## Which Driver is Right for You?

Manufacturers of today's drivers are driven by demanding pros and discerning amateurs looking for ways to capture that powerful combination of speed and stability and high launch with low spin to increase distance. Here's how some leading manufacturers aim to achieve that.

### Titleist - TS

The key has been streamlining. A new shape enhances the aerodynamics and reduces drag by up to 20 percent. Optimized weight redistribution has resulted in the lowest center of gravity Titleist has ever produced in a driver, creating higher launch and lower spin.

### Callaway - Rogue

An updated version of last year's successful Epic model promoting higher ball speed and longer distance, The Rogue uses "Jailbreak Technology." Jailbreak bars join the sole to the crown of the club to make the structure more rigid, which returns more energy to the ball and increases ball speed and distance. The Rogue also has added stability for off-center hits and is one of the more forgiving drivers.

### Tour Edge - Exotics EXS Adjustable Driver

From a tech standpoint this driver is loaded, including Dual Carbon Fiber placement for better weight distribution and a new SlipStream sole for faster clubhead speed. Its Flight Tuning System (FTS) includes interchangeable weights and a hosel adjustable in multiple ways to achieve spin and ball flight "tuning." This is the most forgiving driver Tour Edge has produced.

### Wilson - C300

The C300 has the first driver-head design with power holes on the crown and sole near the face, expanding the sweet spot for greater ball speeds across the entire hitting surface by flexing more at impact. More flex equals greater ball speed. More ball speed means longer drives. The C300 offers adjustable sole weights for custom ball flight and an adjustable hosel to fine-tune launch.

### Cobra - F-Max Superlite Driver

This new version of the F-Max Driver is re-engineered for increased clubhead speed by reducing weight in the grip, shaft and head. Available in two versions—Straight Neck and Offset (which promotes a draw-biased ball flight)—it's targeted for players with moderate swing speeds. A thin forged 6-4 titanium face insert is designed with E9 Technology, a variable thickness face structure that enhances ball speed and distance on centered and off-centered hits.

# Golfer's Playbook

## Mastering Short Putts

In golf, a short putt has the same stroke value as a 250-yard drive. That makes mastering your short putts a very high priority for lowering your scores. Here are my keys to making those shorts putts become more automatic.

### ESTABLISH YOUR SPEED TO CREATE YOUR LINE

On any putt the length of a putter or less, you want to focus on increasing the ball speed in order to reduce the amount of break in the putt. On a breaking putt from short range, I like to play the line on the edge of the high side of the hole and give the ball the necessary speed to keep it from breaking across the hole.

### SET UP SQUARE TO YOUR LINE TO THE HOLE

Taking my grip, I place my thumbs on top and matching the leading edge of the clubface. The palm of my right hand is square to the putter face. This way, I have a direct relationship between my hands and the clubface to "steer" my ball along the path into the hole.



Now, when I tilt from my hips to address the ball, I feel that my hands and putter face are connected and square to the path on which I want the ball to roll. I place my ball position on the inside of my forward (left) foot. As I make the stroke, the putter face will ascend slightly up through the ball to give it a true roll to the hole. My posture in my setup has me tilting enough from the hips so that my eyes are over the ball and the target line to the hole. Having my eyes over the intended line helps me direct my putting stroke straight back and straight through with the hole.

### GAUGE THE STROKE

As I make my stroke, I have an exact length of stroke in mind and I use my stance width to help clarify that length. The length of my backswing will always be to the instep of my right foot, meaning that on short putts I have a narrower stance than on longer putts. I also want the backswing to keep my putter low to the ground so that in the forward stroke through the ball, my putter face is on a slight incline into a designated finish located just outside my left foot. I want the feeling of a stroke that rotates from my core and allows the angle of my wrist to remain constant and quiet through impact.



### HOLD THE FINISH

Holding the finish at the end of the stroke is key for success with short putts. By keeping my focus on holding my finish, I'm committed to my stroke rather than anticipating the result. A good drill that many tour pros use is to listen for the ball to go in as they hold their finish. This is good practice for any golfer putting from short range.

# Stem Cells and Osteoarthritis

Within the past decade or so, stem cells have garnered tremendous attention and rightfully so. The potential to use one's own cells to heal injuries and reverse chronic conditions such as arthritis is truly cause for celebration. However, as with all new technologies, doctors must be careful not to use them incorrectly, thus making them less effective. And patients must avoid unrealistic expectations.

It's important to understand what a stem cell is. Many people think of embryonic stem cells as those being used for treatments and they have ethical concerns about that. However, embryonic stem cells are *not* currently used clinically. Our bodies have stem cells in almost every tissue. They can be harvested through minimally invasive techniques and then concentrated and used to treat various conditions. In fact, these *adult* stem cells form the cornerstone of a developing field of medicine known as regenerative cellular therapy.

In the United States, our ability to use stem cells that are more than "minimally manipulated" is restricted by the FDA. Despite tremendous advances being made in the laboratory with stem cells of all sources, clinically we're limited to just three: umbilical cord cells, fat-derived cells and bone-marrow-derived cells. Each has specific indications, depending upon the injury and body site being treated.

In other countries, clinics make outrageous claims of curing Alzheimer's disease, multiple sclerosis and dementia but buyer beware! These are unsubstantiated claims with no scientific support. In this country, similarly, many clinics take a "one-cell-type-fits-all" approach. This is also fraught with danger; treatment can be both costly and ineffective.

As a hip-and knee-replacement specialist, I have over 7000 joint replacements under my belt, and have treated more than 150,000 patients. I also have over 20 publications in stem cell biology. The constant among all of those patients is that each is unique. While the orthopedic diagnosis may be similar, how it affects each patient is different. It's incumbent upon doctors to parse out the specifics of the condition, the source of the pain, how it's creating lifestyle limitations and then tailor an approach that meets the needs of the patient. This tailored approach may include physical therapy, bracing, laser treatments, surgery, medications and stem cells. Then, within each of these treatments, there are similarities and differences in what we order for each individual patient. A single treatment modality is rarely sufficient, and in most cases, we use combinations of these treatment options.

Stem cell and regenerative therapy play a role, especially in addressing the biological abnormalities of orthopedic conditions. At STAR Orthopaedics, we are the only practice in the Coachella Valley offering four different types of biological treatments, and we make recommendations that are specific to each patient's needs. The options available to us are platelet rich plasma (PRP), amnio-derived tissue grafts, fat-derived cells and bone-marrow-derived cells.

PRP is obtained from your own blood. It's a 45-minute procedure in the office. PRP contains hundreds if not thousands of growth factors that signal your cells and can stimulate tissue repair or blunt pain. Amnio-derived tissues are harvested from live births and are processed and maintained sterile as with any other tissue graft. Like PRP, this treatment provides growth factors that can stimulate tissue repair or blunt pain.

Fat-derived cells are obtained in a trademarked, FDA-approved office procedure in which we perform a mini-liposuction, harvest the fat tissue and then process it by breaking it into small particles. These particles contain fat cells and stem cells. The fat cells provide cushioning in joints, while the stem cells provide signals to the joint cells to stop producing cartilage-breakdown chemicals and pain-producing chemicals.

Bone-marrow-aspirate concentrate, or BMAC, contains true stem cells. We harvest the bone marrow from your hip in the office, spin it in a centrifuge to separate



the cells and generate PRP, and then inject the cells and some fraction of the PRP into the injured or arthritic site. BMAC can stimulate tissue healing and injury repair, and some studies even suggest that BMAC can regrow cartilage with repeated treatments.

Whether you have a sports injury, chronic tendinitis, bursitis or arthritis, we can tailor an approach to help you get back in the game—your game!

# Improve Your Swing With Bikram Yoga

DISCOVER WHAT HIGH-PROFILE ATHLETES AND PROS ALREADY KNOW

Are you feeling like your swing is losing its power and consistency? Chances are that you are also losing some of your flexibility and strength. Fear not! You can turn that around with some willpower, determination and a little yoga in your life.

Vaclav Burger, tennis professional at Indian Wells Tennis Garden (IWTG), chose a Bikram yoga practice to regain his range of motion and strength after having surgery on his cervical spine. He says this yoga practice was instrumental in helping him get back on the court quickly.

He believes this yoga practice can also help the “weekend-warrior” tennis players he sees at IWTG, whose common problems include flailing arms, no spinal twisting flexibility and uncontrolled torso twisting.

“In tennis, you use a lot of rotational power so you have to have a very healthy spine. There’s a lot of active pulling in yoga, which

lengthens the muscles while you’re strengthening them. This creates power with muscles extended,” Burger says.

“In tennis and golf,” he continues, “the arms are extending away from the body while the hips and torso are twisting. For me, yoga provides a way to help keep my entire body connected, creating a more controlled consistent swing. This increased flexibility gives me a much bigger range of motion, which also means more power. Power and consistency in your swing is a winning combination.”

## Start With the Half Moon Series

With your feet together, lift your arms over your head and interlock your fingers. Take a deep breath, stretch up, squeeze your glutes and activate your quads. Bend your torso to the right and then to the left a few times back and forth. Breathe normally as you do this motion, which warms up your spine. Now, keeping your arms stretching up, take another deep reach up and over to the right;

exhale. Breathe normally as you hold this pose. Push your hips to the left, continue reaching to the right and notice how your body releases and you stretch more with each shallow breath. Hold this for 20 seconds, come back up to center and take a deep inhale then exhale. Inhale again, stretch up and repeat this action to the left.

Now you’ll go backwards and forwards. Stretch up, inhale. Keeping your eyes open, drop your head back, look up at the ceiling, push your hips forward, tighten your glutes and pull up on your quads. Now reach back with your arms. Lift your chest and reach back more. Breathe normally and hold that for 20 seconds. Come up and take a breath. Inhale, exhale and reach forward now. Separate your hands and reach for the floor, bending your knees. Breathing normally, bend one knee, then the other, loosening your hips. Do this for 30 seconds, then grab your ankles or the back of your heels if you can. Hold on tight as you suck your stomach in, pull with your arm and hand strength and start to straighten your legs. Feel the lengthening in your hamstrings and lower back. Hold this for 20 seconds, come up slowly, bring your arms down and notice how you feel. If you repeat this entire sequence, you’ll see

how much more flexible you are the second time.

This is only one of the 26 postures in the Bikram yoga series. Imagine how much better you’d feel doing the entire series with proper guidance and instruction.

# The Pickleball Factor

Pickleball is the fastest growing sport in America. It's a paddle sport with elements of badminton, tennis and table tennis. Two or four players use a solid paddle made of wood or composite materials to hit a perforated polymer ball, similar to a Whiffle ball, over a net. Pickle Ball was invented in the mid 1960s as a children's backyard pastime and named for the founder's dog, Pickle, who constantly chased the ball.

It's played on a court with the same hard surface as a tennis court but half the size of a full tennis court. Pickleball's popularity comes largely from the fact that it's a game all ages and skill levels can enjoy and it's easy for beginners to learn. It also doesn't have the same physical impact on the body as tennis. It can be enjoyed as a single or couple's sport and costs are minimal, primarily a pair of court shoes and a racquet that on average costs about \$65. Add to that the fact that it's played quickly without a lot of time wasted standing around, and while it can be competitive it's also easily enjoyed in a social setting, such as a golf or tennis club and the communities surrounding them.

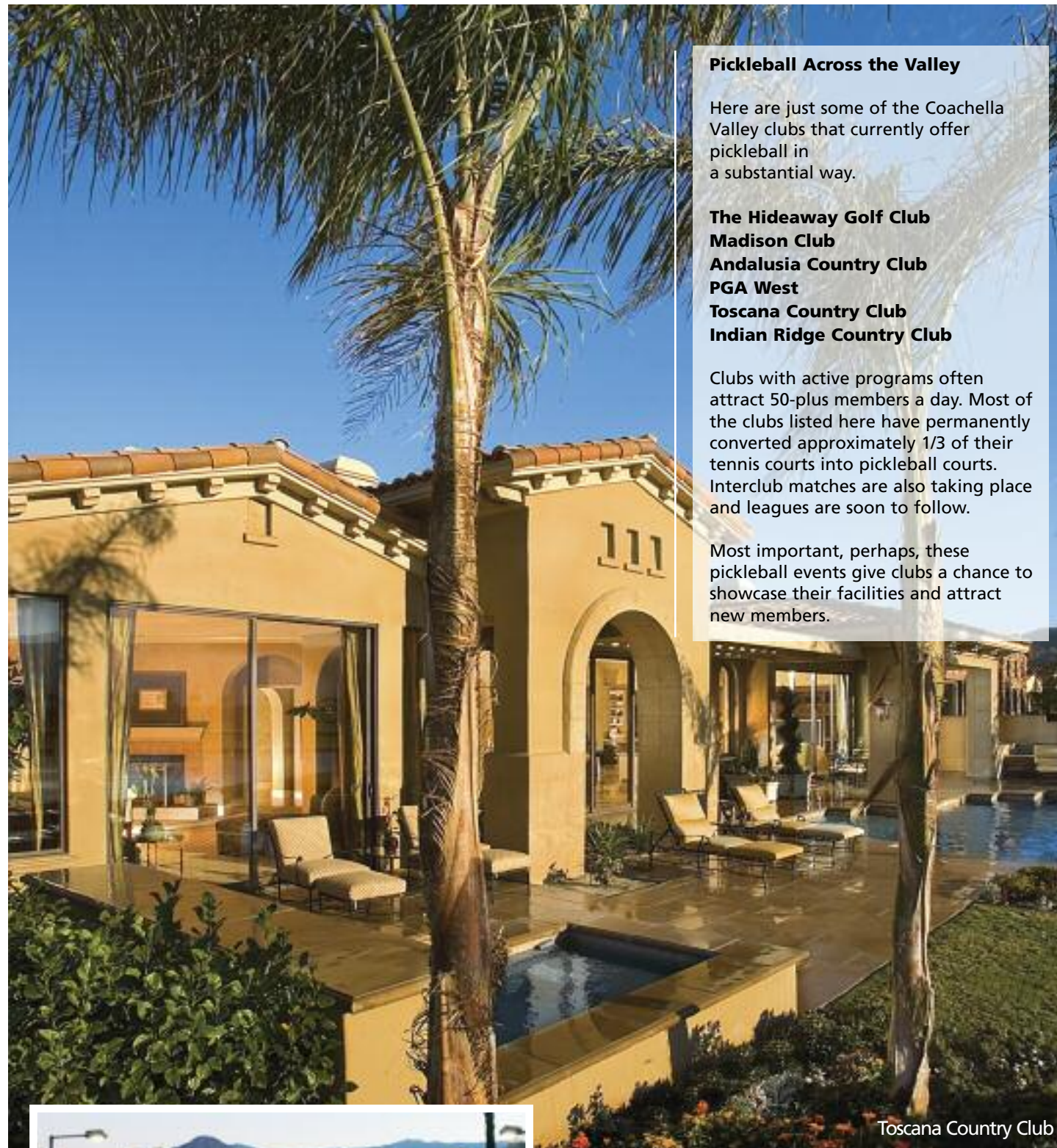
This year for the first time the USA National Pickleball Championship was played at prestigious Indian Wells Tennis Garden, and it looks likely to be an annual event going forward.

All of that makes it no surprise that when realtors in the Coachella Valley are showing country club properties these days, they're more and more asked if the club also offers pickleball. It has become a priority for many homebuyers.

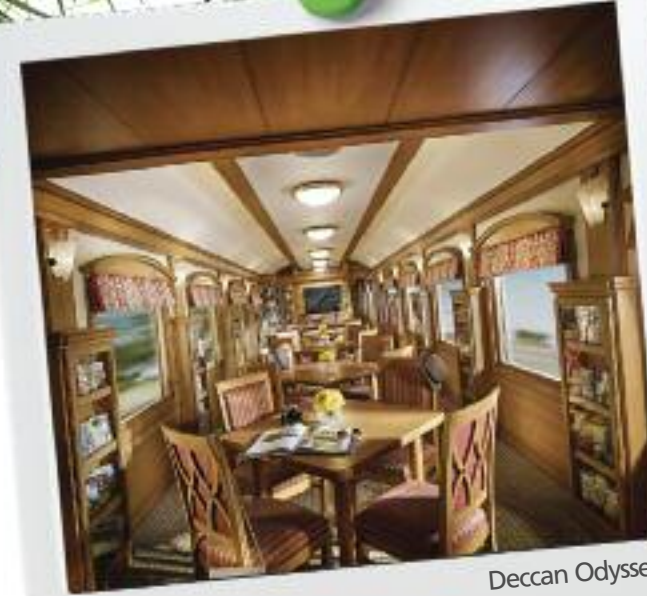

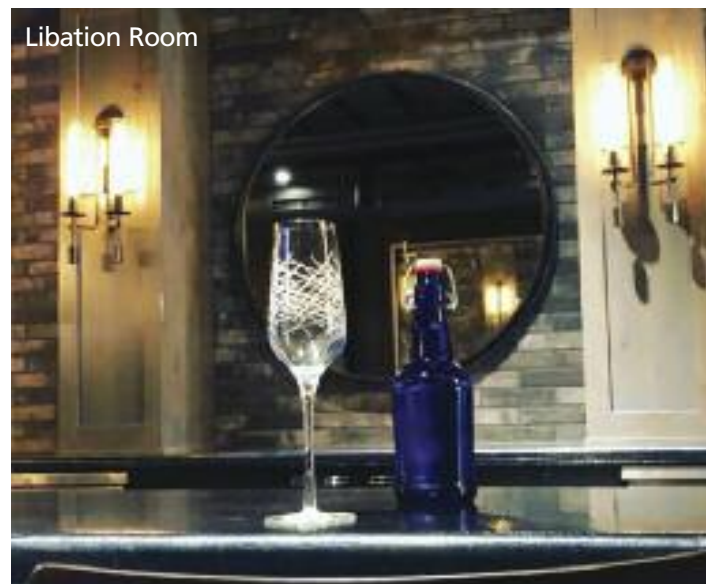

# A McLaren for Everyman

## ENTRY LEVEL AT \$250K? YES!



McLaren is the car dreams are made of, and the 600LT makes dreams come true for a new breed of customer. Though it's hard to call anything with a \$250,000 price tag "entry level," the 600LT puts the power of a supercar within the grasp of a few more would-be buyers.

The Long Tail, LT for short, is a redesigned version of McLaren's 570S, which made it possible for average millionaires to realistically consider owning one of the sexiest car brands ever made. Now the 600LT takes sexy and adds serious power and futuristic spin to the supercar category.

Crafted from McLaren's base-model 570S, the 600 LT has an added 1.9 inches on the rear end and 1.1 inches at the front. The numbers don't tell the whole story. The goal behind all LT modifications is to create better power, better aerodynamics and a

has effectively jumped a segment, with the ultra-low zero-to-60-mph time and an 8.2-second zero-to-124-mph time—making it quicker than the Ferrari 488GTB (\$300,000+). The top speed on the 600LT is a whopping 204 mph. To bring it back to earth from there, the 600LT's carbon-ceramic brakes were borrowed from the 720S, while its brake booster is straight off the company's flagship track car, the Senna.

Of course, anything with the McLaren name is a sight to behold. You won't have to look long to notice that the 600LT boasts an unusual top-exiting exhaust system. Not only did shortening the pipes save weight, it was a necessary maneuver them to create clearance for the huge, rear diffuser. The result is an angry-throated engine that engineers decided should be able to shoot flames on the overrun. Yes, flames.

better driver experience. In true McLaren fashion, the LT delivers these and more with the urgency of limited production and jaw-dropping track ratings.

The 600LT is carbon fiber from nose to tail. Using this composite technology not only strengthens the car's skeleton but drops pounds where needed most. The exhaust piping arrangement was shortened to save more than 28 pounds. The 600LT lost more than 200 pounds from its 570S predecessor. Weighing just a feather over 3,000 pounds, this supercar is set to go toe-to-toe with anything on the road or track.

If there's such a thing as an entry-level supercar, the 600LT defines the class. The 3.8-liter V-8 produces 592 horsepower. While not the top of the field, a Lamborghini Huracan Performante punches in at 631 horses, and the 600LT is at least 200 pounds lighter. The 457 lb-ft of torque is likely to put drivers into orbit. It will roll on Pirelli P Zero Trofeo R tires and have quicker steering and more responsive braking than the 570S.

The 600LT will have a zero-to-60 mph time of 2.8 seconds. Designers claim that its handling on the track will outperform the \$350,000 McLaren 675LT. Using bits and pieces from McLaren's superb existing lineup, the 600LT is a conglomeration of excellence. The Brits didn't back down when faced with the specter of making the 570S obsolete. Rather, they pushed the pedal harder and made something exquisite.

McLaren touts the 600LT's ability to easily handle more speed in the corners than the 675LT, though it gives up some muscle on the long straightaways. Company specs also show that the 600LT

The exhaust pours hot gases directly into the the midsection of the wing. This would typically be a problem, but a special heat-resistant coating was added, capable of handling temperatures of up to 482 degrees Fahrenheit.

McLaren knows how to create demand. The 570S didn't make it off the production line before every unit was spoken for. Production of the 600 LT was slated to start in October, so you may want to camp out at your local dealer to get a crack at reserving one. Pricing is expected to start around \$250,000, about a quarter of McLaren's Senna model.

This high-style dress is a perfect example of the modern Balmain woman and retails for \$13,300.

Keeping it refined and a wee bit racy, the **Michael Kors Collection Chine Floral-Embroidered Cocktail Dress** is not like anything else you're likely to see at the upcoming gala. Chine wool and silk is the base for this tea-length dress with a solid, open back,

square neckline and adjustable, thin straps. Embroidered red fabric flowers stand out in contrast to the deep black background. A classic sheath silhouette progresses downward to a pleated train at the back. This dress proves to be another show-stopping gown from American designer Michael Kors and is available for \$9,500.

It's hard to steer off course with a basic black beauty. The **Zuhair Murad Short-Sleeve Embellished Long Evening Gown** is ideal for any high-profile social or black-tie event, with sparkling beaded embellishments throughout the nylon and silk sheath. A high neckline, keyhole front, velvet waistband and short sleeves keep the floor-length gown flirty and dignified at the same time. Lebanese Designer Zuhair Murad masters the art of showing off a woman's curves and evoking a feeling of sensuality mixed with femininity. Made in Lebanon, this gown retails for \$8,100.

A perennial favorite on the red-carpet, Monique Lhuillier is best known for dreamy evening gowns and cocktail dresses intended for the most special occasions of a woman's life. The **Monique Lhuillier Three-Quarter Sleeve Macro-Paillette Tulle Evening Gown** has a high neckline, fitted bodice, full skirt and floor-

length hem. This nylon confection is covered in large, round sparkly paillettes, like little mirrors on the surface of the dress. Made in the United States of imported materials, this couture party-gown may be purchased for \$4,995.

Offering a departure from basic black, the **Oscar de la Renta Full-Skirt Evening Gown** is classic with a hint of playfulness. A strapless neckline extends to a fitted bodice and full, tea-length circle skirt.
