



### 2014 BNP Paribas Open

It sets records, it sets precedents, it's all about must-see tennis in a superb venue

o you like tennis? If you answered yes, you must have loved last year's BNP Paribas Open. The best players in the world were there. There were blowouts. There were close matches. There were improbable wins. There were just enough upsets to spice up the brackets. And it all took place over a two-week period at one of the game's finest venues, the Indian Wells Tennis Garden.

However, as sweet the memories and as crisp the competition in 2013, the 2014 version of the event promises even more when the tournament begins March 3.

The BNP Paribas Open is the largest combined ATP World Tour Masters 1000 and WTA Premier tennis event in the world. The event offers \$10.2 million in total prize money and distributes equal prize money to a men and women's 96-player singles draw and a 32-team doubles draw.

The field for the 2014 championship will be announced in late January, and it's expected the response from the top players in the world will be substantial and immediate, just as it has been in the past. In fact, if the tennis world had a fifth major, it's beyond likely that the BNP Paribas (pronounced "PAR-i-bah") Open would be that event. The tournament has always drawn the world's top players, has consistently made a healthy profit and has the best attendance figures of any non-major tennis event year-in and year-out.

Last year's finals are an excellent case-in-point. In the men's ATP singles, Rafael Nadal won the title playing as the world's fifth-ranked player, taking out No. 7 Juan Martin Del Potro in front of a capacity crowd at the Stadium Court. Nadal won the last two sets after dropping the first to Martin, who eliminated World No. 1 Novak



Djokovic in the semifinals. In the WTA competition, Maria Sharapova won her second title at the Garden by defeating Caroline Wozniacki, 6-2, 6-2 in the final.


The list of past men's champions reads like a roll call of the most accomplished players in the sport: Boris Becker, Michael Chang, Jimmy Connors, Novak Djokovic, Lleyton Hewitt, 2103 champion Nadal, Roger Federer, Pete Sampras and Roscoe Tanner all have multiple championships at the Garden, while Andre Agassi, Jim Courier, Stefan Edberg and Yannick Noah all claimed one title.

For the women, Kim Clijsters, Steffi Graf, Lindsay Davenport, Martina Navratilova, and last year's winner, Sharapova, are among the greats who have won at Indian Wells more than once.

The event is also known for its gender equality in terms of pay and promotion. After lobbying for years to put on the men and women's tournament simultaneously, rather than playing the women's tournament first and the men's tournament after, the two competitions ran concurrently starting in 1996 when the men and women's professional governing bodies approved the format. It's still the only non-major championship to contest both ATP World Tour Masters 1000 and WTA championships simultaneously.

In 2009, the tournament achieved another longstanding goal by providing equal prize money to men and women. In 2012, the winners of the men and women's singles titles each received \$1 million, making the BNP Paribas the first ATP-WTA combined tournament in which that occurred. The overall purse doubled from 2008 to 2012, and the 2013 singles champions earned \$1 million each for the second-straight year.

The venue, widely regarded as one of the best tennis facilities in the country if not the world, has seen an upgrade since the 2013 event. The new "Stadium 2" project, a smaller, 8,000-seat stadium court designed to augment the facility's spectator capacity and tournament logistics, is under construction adjacent to the original stadium court on the spot that used to serve as space for the food court and retail outlet. The original stadium seats 16,100, the second-largest tennis arena on the planet, eclipsed only by the Arthur Ashe Court at the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center in Queens, New York.

It's clear that expansion is necessary as the fans just keep coming. Last year's event was the 12th time in the tournament's 13year history that it set a new attendance record. The 2013 event drew over 370,000 fans, up well over 20,000 from the previous year, which was also a recordsetting figure. There's no reason to believe that 2014 will be any different.





## Indian Wells Tennis Garden

Where beauty, technology and extraordinary talent come together





n March 8, 2013, in Indian Wells, Calif, Larry Ellison and his guests donned hardhats at a much-talked about construction site, a photo was snapped and tennis ratcheted up another few notches in the Coachella Valley

The festivities celebrated a groundbreaking ceremony at Indian Wells Tennis Garden, marking a major expansion that will include the addition of Stadium 2, restaurant sites, a new entrance, four additional practice courts, public Wi-Fi, and landscaping that embodies the opulence of a lush garden in the desert, at least as seen through the eyes of the facility's new owner, Larry Ellison.

This expansion is huge news. Yet even before there was a Stadium 1, tennis was a thriving if unsung commodity in the desert, complete with star-studded events and athletes.

The early game-changer was an ATP fundraiser originally held in Tucson, Ariz. Seeing potential for growth and the need for a new site, tournament organizers turned to the Coachella Valley, where visitors were arriving in significant numbers to play tennis and golf, just as the Hollywood elite were doing.

The ATP event moved to the valley in 1976. At the same time, Rancho Mirage and then La Quinta experienced explosive growth, which contributed to the tennis scene in the valley bursting wide open. The world began to take notice as top-ranked players headed to the California desert



annually to compete in ATP and WTA events. The tournament transplanted from Tucson eventually became known as the BNP Paribas Open, one of the sport's most important competitions outside of the Grand Slam majors.

Former consultants-turned-partners Raymond Moore and Charlie Pasarell were responsible for growing the tournament and for a vision for the facility in which it was played.

As in every sport, the facility and location of a tournament is key to success; however, the fact is that facilities quickly become outdated, and that soon became true for the ATP event. In 1999, there was buzz about a new state-of-the-art, multimillion-dollar tennis facility. Local residents watched as the project in Indian Wells, Calif., unfolded. There were questions: Does the Coachella Valley really need a tennis complex that size? Will top-ranked players want to play there? The answer to both questions was yes.

Indian Wells Tennis Garden opened on schedule in 2000, easily living up to its buzz. The 54-acre complex included a 16,100-seat main stadium, two smaller stadiums, 44 luxury suites, nearly 6,000 box seats and first rate ancillary facilities that offered, among other things, a pro shop, fitness center, 23 lighted courts and expansive media facilities. The site was an instant hit. The tournaments grew, the



main event grew and millions of people around the world watched on television as elite players competed for millions of dollars in Indian Wells.

With success came new investors, including the United States Tennis Association and tennis legends Pete Sampras, Billie Jean King and Chris Evert. The goal remained the same: to continue facility expansion and to grow professional tennis in the valley. In 2009, at least part of that goal was realized when the annual tournament became the BNP Paribas Open, bringing the premier sponsor of tennis globally to the Coachella Valley as the new title sponsor.



This also caught the attention of the one very wealthy tennis lover, Larry Ellison, co-founder and CEO of Oracle Corporation. In 2009, Ellison formed Tennis Ventures, LLC and became the new owner of both the event and Indian Wells Tennis Garden. Under Ellison, the BNP Paribas Open continued to set goals and increase prize money, and the Garden became one of the most high-tech tennis facilities in the world.

In 2011, the BNP Paribas Open became the only event in the world to offer the Hawkeye challenge system on every match court. And in 2012 it became the first and only ATP/WTA combined event to offer \$1 million in prize money to each of its singles champions.

With change comes change. Pasarell left his position with the event in 2011, and it was announced that Moore would be the new CEO of the tournament. When asked about working with Ellison,









Moore smiles. "He is absolutely the best. He is engaged, he knows the sport, he understands the sport and he is adamant about putting [money] back into the facility to continue to make it the best. There truly isn't one negative thing I can say about Larry Ellison; for me, it is a dream come true!"

As Stadium 2 nears completion in time for the 2014 BNP Paribas Open, patrons will notice changes such as the new entrance, improved parking, restaurants, video walls and information towers throughout and a total seating capacity of 41,500. Yes, Ellison has had his hand in all of this, but there's another element patrons can thank him for, something about which he's also passionate: the landscaping.

"I report to Mr. Ellison on a regular basis," Moore says, "and he does visit the site. Something that is very important to him is making sure that the property is a garden as the name states. With that in mind, we have brought in 500 palm trees and magnificent flora. The property is beautiful and we hope everyone enjoys the beauty."

Best of all, the facility is not just for professional players and tournament fans. Indian Wells Tennis Garden is open to anyone who wants to enjoy a superb tennis facility. A variety of membership programs are offered to fit every budget, lifestyle and level of player. Whether professional or beginning, it's all about passion and love of the game. If in doubt, just ask Larry Ellison.

### Top Golf & Tennis Resorts of the Southwest

Find your ideal for challenging play and luxury digs

ith months of near perfect temperatures and perennially sunny skies, the southwestern United States is the epicenter for exceptional golf and tennis. Competitive players in both sports, and some of the best teaching professionals in the world, are drawn to this region to live, work and play. Phoenix, Scottsdale and Tucson in Arizona and the Coachella Valley in California are home to a collection of outstanding resorts that offer both golf and tennis, to say nothing of exquisite accommodations, spas and a host of other top-line amenities. Here are 10 of the best.

#### PHOENIX & SCOTTSDALE, ARIZONA Wigwam, Litchfield Park

A beloved Historic Hotel of America, the Wigwam melds decades of hospitality tradition with today's coveted amenities, not the least of which is a trio of golf courses built for a pure golf experience—without encroaching development.

The superb tennis facility includes two pro-grade clay courts,

playground where all ages play. But serious golfers and tennis players are in paradise here, too.

Gainey Ranch Golf Club, adjacent to the resort, offers 27 championship holes—The Lakes, The Dunes and The Arroyo—rated among the top 75 U.S. courses by *Golf Digest*. The tennis facility is managed by International Tennis USA and home to WTA pro Meghann Shaughnessy. Four courts, night play and complimentary court time for resort guests head a list of features. Afterward, there's relaxation at Spa Avania.

#### The Boulders, A Waldorf Astoria Resort

There's hardly a more impressive setting—ancient boulders, adobe casitas and lush landscaping under brilliant blue skies. A serene spa aesthetic permeates the resort, but that doesn't preclude action. Swimming, hiking, rock climbing and horseback riding are among the options, in addition to golf and tennis.

The Boulders has two championship golf courses, and its Terraced Tennis Garden features eight courts with three surfaces.



six concrete courts and a full-size Premier Rubber Flexi stadium court with seating for 200. And then there's the resort itself: 440 lush West Valley acres complete with four pools, multiple dining venues, a bocce ball court and the opulent Red Door Spa.

#### The Phoenician, A Luxury Collection Resort, Scottsdale


#### Hyatt Regency Indian Wells Resort & Spa

ission Hills Country Club in Rancho Mirage, Calif., is well known as the tournament site for the first LPGA Major of the year, the Kraft Nabisco Championship, and deservedly so. "There is quite a history attached to Mission Hills Country Club," says Dave Sivertson, Mission Hill's director of tennis and athletics. 

# Kraft Nabisco Championship

Who will leap into Poppie's Pond this year?

uring the first half of 2013, no LPGA Tour player—and arguably, no professional golfer in general—played more consistently than Inbee Park.

With six LPGA Tour tournament victories in four months, she quickly rose to the top of the Rolex Women's World Golf Rankings. Her game was on fire from the start, as she won the Honda LPGA

competing, there is arguably no field in women's professional golf that compares to the Kraft Nabisco Championship.

In addition to the depth of the field, the championship is also renowned for its host course, the Dinah Shore Tournament Course at Mission Hills Country Club in Rancho Mirage, Calif. Designed by renowned architect Desmond Muirhead, the course has held the tournament for 42



Thailand in just her second tournament appearance of the season. The positive momentum continued a few weeks later, when she used her short-game prowess to capture the second major victory of her career, the Kraft Nabisco Championship.

Competing against one of the LPGA Tour's strongest fields, Park fired a final round 69, after back-to-back 67s, to tally a four-round total of 273, 15-under-par. No one in the field came close to defeating her. In fact, runner-up and fellow South Korean So Yeon Ryu shot a highly respectable final round 65, and still finished four shots behind her.

Park continued her streak, also winning last year's Wegmans LPGA Championship and U.S. Women's Open for three consecutive major championship victories.

The 2014 Kraft Nabisco Championship will be played April 3-6 at Mission Hills. As Park prepares to defend her title, she will encounter a variety of challenges. With 115 of the world's top female golfers straight years. Other than the Masters Tournament, no other major championship in professional golf has been contested at the same course longer than the Kraft Nabisco Championship.

To beat Old Man Par, contestants will need to position their tee shots adequately so they have easier approach shots. After all, the greens are medium-sized and contoured, forcing golfers to hit pinpoint iron and wedge shots. Although the dogleg-left 6th hole, a daunting par 4, is the course's No. 1 handicap hole, No. 18 is without question its signature hole. A par 5, the hole's island green is surrounded by Poppie's Pond, named after former tournament director Terry Wilcox, whose grandchildren call him Poppie.

Back in 1988, Amy Alcott collected her second Kraft Nabisco Championship victory and celebrated by leaping into Poppie's Pond, much to the surprise of the crowd. After jumping into the pond once again in 1991 when she won the championship for a third time, an annual tradition soon began. Every year since 1994, tournament winners have followed suit by leaping into the pond, oftentimes alongside their caddies, friends and family members.

The victory leap typically occurs as a result of sheer joy upon overcoming one of the most challenging courses on the LPGA circuit, often rated the Coachella Valley's top course. This year the course, which features tight fairways, fast yet fair greens

and more than 50 bunkers, will be measured at 6,738 yards, just as it was in 2013.

The tournament became an official LPGA Tour major championship in 1983. Known then as the Nabisco Dinah Shore, it was renamed the Nabisco Championship in 2000 and acquired its current name in 2002, shortly after Kraft Foods bought Nabisco. Before its official recognition as a major, the tournament had been contested every year since 1972, with the likes of Mickey Wright and Nancy Lopez claiming trophies.

The Kraft Nabisco Championship will offer one of the LPGA Tour's largest purses this year—\$2 million, \$300,000 of which will be awarded to the champion. In addition to the prize money, the champion will receive a custom-designed diamond ring with her From its initial pro-am to its trophy presentation, the 2014 Kraft Nabisco Championship is sure to offer something for everyone, including one of golfs most celebrated finishes, the champion's leap into Poppie's Pond.

engraved initials, a replica painting from golfartist Graeme Baxter, a custom embroidered white robe and a personalized replica of the tournament's Dinah Shore Trophy.

The trophy was named for singer and actress Dinah Shore, who along with former Colgate-Palmolive CEO David Foster founded the tournament. Aside from Nabisco, no other name has been associated with the tournament as long as Dinah Shore's.

To ensure that it lives up to its status as one of professional golfs greatest tournaments, the Kraft Nabisco Championship will offer fans a variety of entertainment options in addition to four rounds of live LPGA Tour tournament action. On Tuesday, April 1, patrons are welcomed to watch the KNC Champions Pro-Am, which will feature former winners of the tournament. A second pro-am will be played the following day, as all members of this year's tournament field will play alongside celebrities and other amateurs. Past participants have included athletes (Oscar De La Hoya), actors (George Lopez) and musicians (Alice Cooper).

As if that weren't enough, the tournament also developed the KNC Fan Experience in 2013, which will be offered once again this year. Held in a 22,000-square-foot area, the Fan Experience will feature hitting bays, golf simulators and a 60-foot-long putting contest, along with various food outlets.



### **Ten Years and Counting**

Michelle Wie and Paula Creamer, at 24 and 27, respectively, are now seasoned veterans on the LPGA Tour—and still hoping to leap into Poppie's Pond



Michelle Wie was barely a teenager when she played in her first Kraft Nabisco Championship. "My favorite Kraft moment was when I was I 3 and playing the Kraft for the first time," she says. "I was in awe of everything I was in the final round with Patricia [Meunier-Lebouc] and Annika [Sorenstam]."

Like all players in the Kraft, however, Wie hopes for a moment that will be even better—winning the tournament and making the famous champion's leap into Poppie's Pond. "We all want to jump in that pond!" she says.

In the meantime, Wie has had a year with other important milestones and moments, not the least of which was being chosen in August to complete in the Solheim Cup at Colorado Golf Club. Although the U.S. team wasn't victorious, that didn't diminish the experience. "It is such an honor to represent your country," Wie says. "I had a great time with Team USA and my mentor, Captain Meg Mallon. You always want to win, but the honor is most important."

No less exciting for the 24-year-old is being named the 2014 Youth Olympic Games Ambassador, for which key activities will take place in Nanjing, China, in August. "I really hope to teach young people to have fun with their sport, to be competitive, to really want something, and the importance of having a dream," she says. Given how young Wie was when she started competing in professional golf, she should be a superb ambassador and an inspiration to the young athletes.

After graduating from Stamford in 2012, Wie moved to Jupiter, Fla., where she still works with David Leadbetter and practices at The Bear's Club. She had formerly been at Bighorn Golf Club in Palm Desert, Calif. "I felt living and practicing in Florida is better for me," she says.

#### The Pink Panther at 27

Paula Creamer, who has nine LPGA victories to her credit, was also a Solheim Cup team member in 2013. It was her fifth time on the team, and her singles defeat was monumental on several levels. At the match's end, England's 17-year-old Charley Hull shocked Creamer by asking her to autograph her Solheim Cup ball. "It hit me that I'm a veteran now at 27" Creamer says. "It really caught me offguard, but it was nice, cool. I wish I had done that at my first Solheim Cup."

Creamer, aka the Pink Panther, is a statuesque 5'9" and has not only stunned on the fairways, she has also enthralled male admirers with her adventure-loving, femme fatale style. They are in mourning since her December 16th tweet announcing her engagement to dashing pilot Derek Heath.

The fashion-forward Creamer has dabbled in designing her own dresses and shoes with Adidas. Among her favorite couturiers are Stella McCartney, Tom Ford, Zac Posen and Caroline Herrera, and she famously treated herself to a pink crocodile Hermes Birkin bag after winning the U.S. Open in 2010. Though pink is her trademark, she wears many colors well and favors black for elegance. As for wedding ideas, the first names on Creamer's list are Oscar de la Renta and Vera Wang.

Off the course, Creamer manages her eponymous foundation. "Lorena Ochoa was an inspiration for me," she says. "My annual event, Paula4Kids, benefits The First Tee of Sarasota."

With wedding bells looming, Creamer's bucket list still includes sky diving, landing on an aircraft carrier, getting an invite to *Dancing with the Stars* and, of course, plunging into Poppie's Pond.

Is 2014 the year when one of these two LPGA vets makes the leap at Mission Hills? Time will tell.

### The Golf Art Journey of Graeme Baxter

His gift is in finding the heart of each course and capturing it on canvas

rom a modest, well-lit collection of rooms within the Kraft Nabisco Championship offices at Mission Hills Country Club come the world's most celebrated golf paintings. Here, in Rancbo Mirage, Calif., is where artist Graeme Baxter works. The native Scotsman has been a desert resident since 2001.

Baxter's journey to international renown was as winding as many a cart path, and not without challenges. A talented painter as a youth and readying for secondary education at the Glasgow School of Art, the young artist experienced a deep psychological cut as a result of a 49 percent grade from a new high school teacher.

"He failed me, which completely destroyed me," Baxter recalls with his Scottish lilt.

Baxter was entering his third decade of life and working as a fineart dealer following a vexed career in fashion design when he was struck by a desire to try something new. He approached his father, an art gallery owner. He wanted to paint the 17th at the Old Course.



"My father said, 'What are you doing a golf painting for?" and I said, 'I don't really know. I just love golf, I love St. Andrews and I love painting," Baxter recalls the late 1980s conversation. "And he said, 'Well, what is a golf painting?" The answer I gave him was that I didn't really know."

Baxter was soon to learn. Upon completion of the work, he and his father took the nascent endeavor to a friend's gallery in Glasgow. Despite the owner's initial skepticism, two prints were sold within a week's time.

A quarter-century later (and now a member at the Old Course), Baxter has a third career that puts him among the globe's most sought-after recorders of golf history. In addition to having a seemingly endless portfolio of portraits, landscapes, commissions and alliances, Baxter is the official artist for the Ryder Cup, The Presidents Cup, The Solheim Cup, the European PGA TOUR, the World Golf Championships and the Kraft Nabisco Championship.

Baxter's work can be found in the clubhouses of the world's most lauded courses, and his clientele ranges from golf legends to contemporary champions to international figures. Highly active locally, he's captured the likes of Hideaway Golf Club, The Madison Club, Ironwood Country Club and his home courses at Mission Hills Country Club.

"These are the prettiest courses in the world, right here in the desert," Baxter says of the Coachella Valley.

Despite the prolific output, he's not a factory, and natural talent alone is not enough to create at such a lofty level. Baxter hustles, travels and works ceaselessly to ensure that each of his works (he maxes out at 15 paintings a year) captures the spirit of a subject and the soul of the grounds. To ensure the legacy of his paintings, Baxter uses the finest linen canvases and works with only the choicest oil paints (Winsor & Newton Artist Series).

And the tools extend to the method.

"My deal is to go out and find the heart of a golf course," the artist says of the reconnaissance stage. "And I can do that now quite quickly, almost within a day, to an area within 10 square feet. And it's a silly thing, but it's my thing."

For a landscape work, Baxter begins with hole suggestions from a given club before traveling to the site and capturing hundreds of photographs at different times of day and in a variety of different lights, creating a full-dimensional composition of foreground, middle distance and long distance.

"I love being on a golf course alone. It's like being in ... a church of God on a golf course," says Baxter of studying a course. "When you're out there on your own and there's nobody else around, it's just an incredible feeling. I get all arty and freaky out there."

In addition to his Scottish sense of golfspirituality, Baxter brings to his work an appreciation and an eye for the minute details of every course. It is perhaps this more than anything that makes him the singular artist he is.

"I take all the atmosphere back with me in my head," he says. "But that alone is not good enough. I also take obscure photographs of the grounds, such as ducks or rocks or the bark of a tree. All these things I have little memories of. So I can take myself back to where I was at that time, with the feelings I felt, and try to instill those feelings into a painting."

Revered for his overt attention to living and current detail, it's also Baxter's knowledge of history and vision of legacy that make his work both timely and timeless.



"I love the art and I love the golf," he says, "but for me it's about the golf course and the setting and the history and the art; it's not about the golfer. The golfer can come and go but the golf here forever. In a number of years, after I'm long dead, people are going to look at my paintings and say, 'That's a great record of golf history.' And that's very exciting for me. I'm working to make sure a painting lasts for many hundreds of years."

# The Complex World of Golf Course Design

What are architects thinking when they design a course? It may surprise you



Designing golf courses is an endless trail of intrigue and complications. It is as rewarding as it is complex.

There are a vast number of variables to take into consideration. The most important depends upon which golf-course architect you ask. I once had the pleasure of spending a couple of hours with Tom

Fazio, one-on-one, over dinner. One of the

questions I asked of him was, "What is the most important aspect when *you* design a golf course? Is it the aesthetic quality of the site, the skills of the shapers, the budget, or any other aspects?" I was expecting quite a long answer. Instead, Tom summed up his thoughts in just two words: "the Client."





It wasn't necessarily the answer I expected, but the more I thought about it the more I realized that it was a very good pick. Given a great client, many of the obstacles or problems that exist in course design can be solved. Both a client and architect's first thoughts usually go to the end of the process. In other words, what are the goals and what are the desired results? To a large degree, these will define the budget, the type of site and even the location.

I am often asked, "Where do you start when you're going to design a golf course?" The simple answer is, it's a process.

Although the process of producing layouts, grading plans, master plans, landscape plans and so on remains common to all projects, the parameters and conditions at each site can vary wildly. For instance, the first 23 courses I designed were in Europe and on the east coast of the United States. My next course was a whole different ball of wax—the Hideaway in La Quinta, Calif. The project was to include luxury custom homes, and the site was 600-acres of flat desert smothered in tumbleweed. There was only one tree on the entire site! This was a huge contrast compared to working in the forests of Maine and New Hampshire, let alone the foothills of Southern Spain or the glorious rolling countryside in England.

When designing a course, I normally try to incorporate all of the best features on the site, and I typically follow the path of least resistance with regard to moving dirt and to cost. Flat desert with custom homes, however, presented an entirely new challenge. Three parameters came straight to mind. First, we want to produce the best and most interesting golf course. We also want to give the



homes the best views possible. And as a minor but important consideration, the cart paths are more than just a function of getting from A to B; they should be concealed where possible, yet while players are moving along them they should show off the many features incorporated into the course design.

The best way of giving homes a view is to drop the golf course such that the holes run in valleys, and elevate the lots so they look over the golf course. Sounds simple, right? Well, after moving 2.5 million cubic yards of dirt at the Hideaway, we were almost there! I appreciate that minimalists would freak out at the prospect of moving that amount of dirt, but that was the magic number that



made the project work and evolve into a highly successful country club.


One of the directives from the developer was to include massive stretches of water with features such as waterfalls and babbling brooks. These features were not only meant to enhance the golf course but also to add enormously to the value of the lots. From a designer's perspective, this gives a lot of cosmetic scope; however, the trick comes in not only showing off the water features as an aesthetic element, but also ensuring that the golfer isn't fishing for his ball on every hole.

Fortunately, the site in La Quinta was large enough to contain these elements and still have a very playable golf course. That's the



way I design; I'm not a penal designer. My design partner back in England, Peter Alliss, was of much the same opinion. Peter was not a great fan of 'whoop-it-de-doo-dah' greens or narrow fairways with

long rough. He once said, "I've never known a golfer who came back to the clubhouse saying he'd had a great day in spite of losing eight golf balls and three-putting ten greens!"

I like to pose questions to the golfer with my design, making him think and giving him different options. I'm a great fan of riskand-reward holes; the heroic or brave shot should definitely reap a reward. Most of all, though, what I want is for the golfer to have an enjoyable round and have fun with his golfing buddies.

# Rockin' the Fairways with Patrick Warburton

4th Annual Patrick Warburton "Golf for Kids" Celebrity Golf Tournament, for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital is a must-do event

aising critical funds for a variety of organizations through golf tournaments is commonplace across the United States. Creating a charity golf tournament that stands apart from the others in a valley with more than 700 nonprofits and 124 golf courses is nothing short of astounding.

If the name Patrick Warburton sounds just vaguely familiar, hearing Warburton's deep, rich voice will quickly jolt your memory. The actor shot to fame as David Puddy, Elaine's boyfriend on *Seinfeld*. He then played one of the lead characters on *Rules of Engagement* for all seven years of the series, which ended in 2013. Warburton's voice is also heard in numerous animated movies and televisions shows.

On the personal side, Warburton is happily married with four children. He and his wife, Cathy, consider themselves blessed, and they're on a personal mission to help children live healthy, normal and fulfilled lives.

In the beginning, Warburton's idea of raising money through golf meant calling his celebrity friends to join him on the course and at a couple of parties. Without hype or grandstanding, this tournament quickly became well known on the charity circuit thanks to the extraordinary comedic talents and rock n' roll legends who participate—not to mention the Friday night jam session that kicks off the weekend. Past players include Robby Krieger, Alice Cooper, Orianthi Panagaris, Mike Mills, Don Felder, David Brock and Kim Carnes. Spurring on the laughs with Warburton have been his comedic friends Cheech and Chong, Michael Richards, David Spade, Anthony Anderson and fellow *Seinfeld* alum John O'Hurley as the emcee.

Warburton promises this year's event will be even better with the addition of several celebrities who are eager to join the fun and help St. Jude. Knowing that the success of the tournament depends on participation by amateurs, Warburton and the other celebrities are friendly, open, accessible and happy to pose for photos, sign autographs and chat it up with all who attend.

When asked how he thinks the tournament has grown, Warburton is clearly proud. "Last year the jam session was legendary," he says. "What stands out to me is how the whole tournament works from top to bottom, which I know is the result of having a charity such as St. Jude Children's Hospital that makes people focus. Then you bring the people together that we do, including [tournament chairman] Clarke Rheney, and that's what makes this tournament so successful."

As for his own golf game, Warburton is philosophical. "Every time I think I turn the corner and start shooting some low scores, something happens and I start to go backwards. Right now I'm struggling."

In an effort to reduce pressure during the tournament, the decision was made by Warburton and the tournament committee to take an unconventional approach to its celebrity field by closing the tournament to spectators. The goal is to offer a casual and relaxed atmosphere for celebrities and amateurs alike, giving participants a chance to have a great time and, with any luck, play some memorable golf at the Classic Club in Palm Desert, Calif. Entry fees range from \$2,000 per player to \$12,000 for a "Pick Your Own Celebrity" foursome.

Tournament aside, there's plenty over the weekend that is open the public, including the popular (and lengthily named) "Friday



Night Jam Session Featuring Rock & Roll Hall Of Fame Icons And Special Surprise Guests Providing A Night Of Great Music." Limited tickets are available for \$125 per person. If comedy tickles your fancy, there's the "Gala & Comedy Show Featuring Iconic Comedy Duo Cheech and Chong" on Saturday night. Limited seating is available for \$250 per person. ### Desert Dunes Golf Club Redefines Its Future

New development at the resort creates new opportunities

he Desert Dunes golf course has long been known by golf aficionados as one of the most underrated courses in the Coachella Valley. It has also been known as one of the most Canadian-friendly facilities in a very Canadian-friendly valley.

With Desert Dunes' newest phase of development about to launch, it's likely that the course will soon receive a great deal more recognition. And its reputation for being particularly Canadian friendly will likely be enhanced, too, when its Canadian friends can actually own a piece of the action.

Back in 2009, when the Desert Dunes Development Group originally purchased the golf course, the company also coveted the land surrounding it, which was free of development and owned by a national home construction company. In 2013, the group realized its dream when it was able to secure the 472 acres from the previous owners. That cleared the way for the construction of resort components that the group believes can move the development to the next level.



Construction will begin this year on a 900-unit resortthemed project, featuring distinctive villas with fractional ownership, swimming pools, tennis courts and other recreational opportunities related to the surrounding desert. The property will feature the group's 52/13 villa, named for its time-share program that allows for a 1/4 share of ownership in a two-bedroom, two-bath villa and owner access to the property and resort facilities for a full 52 weeks a year.

The design makes the program work. A cluster of four, onebedroom suites surround a great room with an additional bed and bath, full kitchen, dining space, living area and expansive verandah. The one-bedroom satellite suites can be occupied 52 weeks a year. The great room is available to each of the four satellite suite owners for 13 weeks a year on a rotating basis, ensuring that all owners get their fair share of the great room during "the season."

According to Mike Nyhuis, vice president of operations for Desert Dunes Development, the fractional ownerships allow owners to buy into a gated, five-star golf resort property for under \$200,000 (USD). The group is currently in negotiations to link the resort to a major hotel chain.

"The golf course is sort of the anchor to the development, and we bought the property thinking there was an outside shot to

buy this land around the golf course," says Nyhuis. "We secured the land in 2011, and we just closed on the land in 2013."

Nyhuis says the facility's target market will be part-time desert dwellers, aka snowbirds, from anywhere desert dreamers require winter relief. But a full 80 percent of the company's marketing efforts will be concentrated in Western Canada, where residents in cities such as Calgary, Vancouver and Winnipeg can board aircraft in snowfall and be carding a record golfscore in the 19th hole late in the desert afternoon.

Of course, the golf course remains the crown jewel of recreational opportunities at the resort. A Robert Trent Jones, Jr. design that opened in 1989 and measures 6,876 yards from the back tees, the course played host to the Canadian PGA Tour's 2010 and 2011 finales. Former Edmonton Oilers goaltender Grant Fuhr, a five-time Stanley Cup champion and NHL Hall-of-Fame member, is currently director of golf at the facility and a partner in the project.

As of now, Nyhuis says, there are no planned changes for the golf course and the course's aesthetics will not be compromised by the construction. A subset of golfers cherish the course's natural surroundings, but Nyhuis says that the only units fronting the golf course will be set well back from the course, and only single-level units will be set along fairway corridors.

### By Rob Stanger Golf's Common Threads: Executing Winning Shots at The Kraft Nabisco

#### Insider's Guide to the final three holes on Mission Hills' Tournament Course

The first professional major golf championship of 2014 will tee up in the desert at Mission Hills Country Club in Rancho Mirage, Calif, April 1-6. As the head teaching professional at Mission Hills for nine years, I got a good feel for how difficult the final three holes can be when an LPGA Tour player is trying to win the Kraft Nabisco Championship. These finishing holes test the golfer's ability to work the ball's flight in many directions. Here are my keys to executing those shots.



#### 16th hole: 407 yards, par 4

#### The Fade Off the Tee

The key to playing the Mission Hills Tournament Course well is the ability to shape your tee shots, and nowhere is that more important than on the 16th tee. The downhill shot is impacted by two large bunkers down the left side and a gigantic lone tree that sits on the right edge of the dogleg-right fairway. The shape of shot you want to execute off the 16th tee is a slight fade. In order to accomplish this, you have to align yourself with the left bunkers but spin your ball away from the bunkers into the fairway. The key is to use a slightly open clubface, which helps shape the ball's flight to the shape of the fairway. I like to go with a weak grip, one in which both thumbs are on top of the club, matching the clubface angle.

#### 17th Hole: 172 yards, par 3

#### High-Trajectory Long Iron

The 17th hole is a killer. What makes this par 3 so difficult is the size of the green. The green is small to begin with, and the fact that it is divided into sections makes it even smaller from a shot perspective. A ridge separates the front half of the green from the back half. The challenge is that you have to land your ball in only one section-the same one as the hole location. If you don't, you are faced with a very difficult putt. The key to getting your long-iron tee shot onto the correct section of the green is to increase the height of the ball's trajectory. Hitting the ball on a higher trajectory will give it a better chance of landing softer on the green and with less roll. You can give yourself an advantage on this shot by teeing the ball up. I suggest taking it to an extreme: In addition to teeing the ball up, also hit more up into the ball. This will give you a slightly higher finish in your swing.



#### GolfInstruction



#### 18th Hole: 531 yards, par 5

#### The Draw off the Tee

With the water looming up the left side of the 18th fairway and large fairway bunkers running along the right side, this tee shot is very intimidating. The tee box is aiming you out to the right bunkers on a fairway that is a angling left, running away from the bunkers towards the water. The tee shot requires you to aim at the left edge of the bunkers and to hit a shot that spins from right to left. If you over spin the ball to the left, it will find the lake. The key to executing this shot is to swing your club along your alignment, which is aimed at the farthest left edge of the bunkers. In order for the ball to spin right to left, you will need to go with a slightly stronger grip, that is with your thumbs positioned on the grip angled slightly right of the clubface. This shot takes a lot of trust for golfers to execute.



#### Lay-up 3/4 Wedge Shot

If you choose to lay up your second shot short of the island green, you will be left with a 60- to 90-yard wedge shot over the water onto a green that slopes severely from back to front. The key here is to go to a less-than-full swing and with less power in order to take the spin off the ball. Notice in the photo of my backswing that my left arm is level to the ground at the top of the backswing. When I make my forward swing through the ball, I am going to make an abbreviated follow-through into my finish, keeping the club in front of me and pointing to the target in the distance.

# Tennis Reigns in the Coachella Valley

The connection between the valley and tennis goes back to the heyday of Hollywood glamour

ennis has a rich history in the Coachella Valley and is poised to expand in popularity and participation. The year-round dry, sunny weather of the Palm Springs area and proximity to Los Angeles has lead to a mutual love affair with Hollywood celebrities since the 1930s. Tennis was so popular that Charlie Farrell and Ralph Bellamy founded the area's first tennis club when they had difficulty getting court time at the El Mirador resort. The Racquet Club was known as a Hollywood hangout frequented by such luminaries as Lana Turner, Kirk Douglas, Elizabeth Taylor, Clark Gable, Natalie Wood and Robert Wagner.

"I guess the Racquet Club was one of the only places not affected by the Depression," Charlie Farrell said in a 1968 interview. "If anything, it helped us because our members could make their own entertainment. When the gang in Hollywood found they could come here and not spend much money but make their own fun, they began flocking to the Racquet Club." to contribute to an increase in participation is the continued awareness of the health benefits that tennis provides all players, regardless of age. In surveys of players, "health and fitness" continues to be a top reason for playing tennis. And now, the USTA's 10 and Under Tennis initiative is joining with First Lady Michelle Obama's Let's Move! initiative to combat childhood obesity and give kids the 60 minutes of daily exercise they should have.

With the major expansion of the Indian Wells Tennis Garden and ever increasing interest in the BNP Paribas Open, tennis is a major economic driver in the Coachella Valley. 

fireplace, kitchen and barbeque enhance the large patio area, 11,000 square feet of which is undercover. This magnificent home features its own tennis court and includes two guesthouses—one fashioned after the Beverly Hills Hotel and the other modeled to resemble the Plaza Hotel in New York City. This tennis estate is the epitome of entertaining and opulence in Rancho Mirage, "Playground of Presidents."

"I was fortunate enough to purchase an irreplaceable property on El Paseo 15 years ago and waited patiently until I found Mario Marfia to fulfill my dream of building and designing a true Italian restaurant constructed with all natural materials, stone, glass, marble and 100year-old wood flooring."

Now, Il Corso is poised to become one of the Coachella Valley's dining stars, a combination of outstanding food and an authentic, dynamic ambience. It's old-Italian-farmhouse-meets-hip-restaurant, and diners won't be disappointed.

"After providing outstanding southern Italian cuisine at Tiramisu for the past seven years," Chef Marfia says, "we are now fulfilling our passion in partnership with John Wessman, offering an authentic Tuscan dining experience on El Paseo"

You might start that experience sipping a signature Il Corso Negroni (Carpano vermouth, Aperal, Compari and Bombay Saphire), followed by a starter such as 18month-aged prosciutto de Parma with bufala mozzarella or grilled octopus with



potatoes, red onions and frisee salad in an oil lemon dressing. House-made pastas come in many variations, including glutenfree served with mushrooms and a creamy tomato sauce. The list of fish and meat dishes is substantial, from grilled salmon with a caper pesto and vegetables to a 32oz. Thone steak marinated with aromatic herbs and served with spinach. The food is hearty, but save room for a sweet such as baby cheesecake topped with raspberry sauce and drizzled with white and dark chocolate or mascarpone cheese served with strawberry and 25-year-aged balsamic vinegar. Of course, ending a meal with gelato is always *perfetto*. Dinner is served Mon.-Sun., 4:30-10:30 p.m.; the bar is open until 1:30 a.m.







an greatness last forever? It is said that nothing lasts forever, and that's apparently true even for Mercedes-Benz. This year the company will give its iconic SLS series a last hurrah in the SLS AMG Final Edition GT and roadsters. Mercedes is clearing the way for a new S series that packs more punch than Mike Tyson in his prime.

The SLS has had a storied career of turning heads. The varied models have included Gullwings, electrics, roadsters and coupes, and the Final Edition GT is no less exceptional than its predecessors. The twin turbocharged engine does 0-60 mph in 3.6 seconds. The additions to the aerodynamics and contours are fantastic. The SLS is unparalleled in its attention to detail, and Mercedes has spared no expense to make car and driver comfortable while careening down the road at breakneck speeds.

It's easy to understand why superstars such as tennis great Roger Federer choose to rep the car and drive it, too. When you see an SLS, you slow down, take notice and probably dream about driving it. It's a super car for a superstar—and the AMG lives up to the standards of those who tout its attributes.

Being extremely limited is among those attributes. Just 350 units of the Final Edition AMG will roll out of the factory, but Mercedes has ratcheted up exclusivity for the finale of this beauty.

This 6.2-liter engine is a V8 with 583 horsepower. Nothing was noticeably changed from 2013 on the power train, but you wouldn't try to improve the Mona Lisa would you? With an electronically regulated top speed of 196 mph, there's more than enough power. The note of the engine is legendary, and you'll undoubtedly know that you are harnessing something special when you crank up the RPMs on the SLS. Think hungry tiger meets lap cat. Between the roaring and the purring, you'll feel adrenaline pulsing.

The exterior lines juxtapose sleek with aggressive. Nothing about the SLS is subtle, however. Even casual observers will know that you have something entirely unique when you pull up at the light next to them. The new carbon-fiber hood, for example, is a feature that adds the most modern look Mercedes has attempted in any model but modernity doesn't sacrifice tradition.

The honeycomb grill with the instantly recognizable encircled star is all Mercedes-Benz. All of the lines launch forward. The rear spoiler and front splitter will have you glued to the track and eating up the road, while custom-designed tires at 20 inches in the rear and 19 in the front will provide added handling benefit. The forged alloy wheels are a welcome and sharp addition for the SLS. A look from behind gives you a glimpse of the struts, which Mercedes finished in high-gloss black.

The SLS Final Edition comes with a 7speed, dual-clutch automatic transmission. Four shifting modes give you the option to drive the machine the way you want it to feel. Race start mode glues you to the seat and keeps a smile on your face—and there is nothing unfortunate about being glued to the interior of an SLS AMG.

The diamond stitching is exquisite. Black, gray and silver are woven throughout in the perfect styling that is sure to surprise. And a label on the front dash indicating which numbered vehicle



you are driving—seven of 350 for example—oozes exclusivity.

There is carbon fiber coming from everywhere on this machine. Mirror caps, doorsills and backrests can all be upgraded, and don't forget the aforementioned hood and rear wing. The Final Edition will be instantly recognizable and unforgettable in its features.

Speaking of exclusivity, pricing hasn't been announced for either the 2014 SLS AMG GT Final Edition roadster or coupe. The 2013 SLS counterparts started at \$204,525 and \$211,025, respectively, and you can safely bet that the Final Edition series, scheduled to hit the U.S. market in February, will retail a bit higher than those.

n 2002 Harry Winston created a custom tennis bracelet for Serena Williams to wear on and off the court during the U.S. Open. It was the most notable accessory complementing her famously skintight black Lycra one-piece outfit, a startling headturner on Arthur Ashe court at that ime. A \$29,000 version of the bracelet was later available in Harry Winston stores.

Before Serena, other players sported tennis bracelets, including Steffi Graf. But it was Chris Evert who made sports and jewelry history in 1987 when she halted her U.S. Open tennis match to find the diamond bracelet that had slipped off her wrist. In that unexpected moment, Evert and her elegant bracelet with its single row of diamonds launched a fashion phenomenon. The term "tennis bracelet" became known across the globe.

It was a new name, but the classic design had been around for years, known as an eternity or in-line diamond bracelet. It is sometimes still listed as such in fine jewelry collections and catalogs. There's no question that the bracelet's popularity rose as athletes embraced the notion of wearing a light diamond bracelet during matches, bringing a heightened sense of fashion to competitive play.

After Evert's Grand Slam mishap, many jewelers wisely started fitting tennis bracelets with a small safety chain to prevent them from falling even if the clasp failed, and that has been a benefit for active women everywhere.

More than 25 years later, the tennis bracelet's popularity continues. Riki Stein, vice president of **Leeds and Son Fine Jewelers** in Palm Desert, Calif., says, "The tennis bracelet has become a classic wardrobe item, a must-have for its versatility—from the tennis court to the golfcourse to a desert gala."

The bracelet is noted for its

classically simple design of set diamonds that encircle the wrist, but variations abound. Leeds and Son, for example, carries traditional diamond-only bracelets, as well as those that incorporate other gemstones such as sapphires and emeralds for a pop of color. "There are also different ways to set a tennis bracelet, with shared prongs or the use of three or four prongs," Stein says. "Or they are set in yellow or white gold or in platinum. It is very versatile."

Whether classic or contemporary, sterling or platinum, there's a tennis bracelet for every woman. Pricing typically varies according to the metal used and the total carat weight (ctw) of the diamonds.

By any name or variation, the tennis bracelet remains the single piece of jewelry most closely connected to sport fashion. Wearing one creates a sense of enduring style and elegance, on or off the court or course. Roberto Coin Jewelers, which has a boutique on El Paseo in Palm Desert, Calif., brings contemporary styling to the bracelet, adding appeal for today's wearer. The Cento Amuleto Bracelet, for example, features alternating links of

white gold and pave diamonds along with round-cut, bezel-set Cento diamond drops. With 8.75 ctw, this bracelet is priced at \$120,500; it is also available in yellow gold. Also in the Cento collection is the 18-karat white gold Cento Tulip Tennis Bracelet, 3.25 ctw, priced at \$14,500, and the 18-karat white gold Cento C-Profile Line Bracelet, 6.50 ctw, at \$34,000. *robertocoin.com* 

Blue Nile, founded in 1999 and now one of the largest online retailers of certified diamonds and fine jewelry, has a huge selection of tennis bracelets starting at about \$2,600 and reaching \$41,000. The \$2,600 bracelet available at the time of this writing, for example, is 18-karat white gold with 1 ctw. A tennis bracelet priced at \$28,070 is platinum with 10 ctw. The Cushion Diamond Bracelet with its single row of 41 spectacular cushion diamonds (12.46 ctw) sells for \$41,000. And for women who prefer yellow gold, there is an 18karat bracelet with 3 ctw priced at \$4,600, and another with 7 ctw priced at \$10,500. bluenile.com


**Nordstrom** also offers the popular bracelet in several variations on its website, and some pieces are available in Nordstrom store locations as well. For parents who have a young daughter starting out in tennis or golf,

Nordstrom features a sterling silver tennis bracelet with cubic zirconia in place of diamonds. It could be the perfect gift before a first tournament, and it's well priced at \$128. There's also a traditional bracelet in 18-karat white gold with a single line of radiant, round-cut diamonds (1.05 ctw) listed at \$3,995, as well as the Riviera Diamond Line Bracelet by Kwiat in 18-karat white gold with 2 ctw for \$5,000. *shopnordstrom.com* 

**Bloomingdale's** also has a selection of tennis bracelets, ranging in price from \$7,000 to \$28,000, some of which are also available in Bloomingdale's stores. Bracelets in 14-karat yellow gold start at \$7,000 for 2.50 ctw, and top out at \$28,000 for a total weight of 10 ct. Bracelets with 3.50 and 8.0 ctw are priced at \$9,000 and \$21,800, respectively. The same bracelets are available in 14-karat white gold, and there's also a white-gold bracelet with 6.0 ctw, which retails for \$15,000. *bloomindales.com*
