As hard as it may be to believe, we're about to embark on the 2020 tennis season, one that's expected to provide fans plenty of entertainment as the game's greatest players prepare to continue to break records and up-and-comers hope to fulfill their potential and prove that the future of tennis is as bright as ever.

But first, let's take a look back at the remarkable year that was 2019—a year full of incredible play, record performances, surprises and extraordinary headlines.

Bianca Andreescu Teenage Sensation

Prior to the 2019 season, Canadian Bianca Andreescu was viewed by tennis analysts as a future star who would fulfill her potential in seasons to come. But by the end of the 2019 season, her talent was already fully realized as she became a household name. The magic began at the BNP Paribas Open, hosted at world-renowned Indian Wells Tennis Garden, where she defeated Angelique Kerber for her first WTA title.

A few days later she injured her right shoulder during the fourth round of the Miami Open, leading to a three-month recovery. She attempted a comeback at the French Open but was forced to retire before her second-round match and missed the entire grass-court season. The comeback truly began during the U.S. Open series as Andreescu acquired her second WTA title, defeating Serena Williams at the 2019 Rogers Cup in Toronto—the first Canadian to claim the championship in 50 years.

Two weeks later, the 19-year-old appeared in her very first Grand Slam final, ultimately defeating Serena Williams, who was seeking her record-tying 24th major championship, 6-3, 7-5. During the second set, Williams was down 5-1 but never gave up, ultimately losing only 7-5.

"I had some doubts because I've witnessed her come back from being 5-0 down," Andreescu said at the time. "I just told myself to stick with my tactics."

The tactics were certainly successful. She became the first Canadian to win a Grand Slam singles title, the first female to win the U.S. Open during her main-draw debut and the first player born after 2000 to claim victory at a Grand Slam championship. In addition, she rose to No. 5 in the WTA rankings, the highest ranking ever achieved by a Canadian woman.

Not to mention, Andreescu also became just the sixth woman to win the BNP Paribas Open and the U.S. Open in the same year, joining such luminaries as Serena Williams, Steffi Graf and Monica Seles. At the same time she also enjoyed another outstanding achievement, becoming the first teenager to win a Grand Slam singles title in 13 years; the last was Maria Sharapova in the 2006 U.S. Open.

"I'm beyond grateful and truly blessed. I've worked really, really hard for this moment," Andreescu stated after winning the U.S. Open. "This year has been a dream come true."

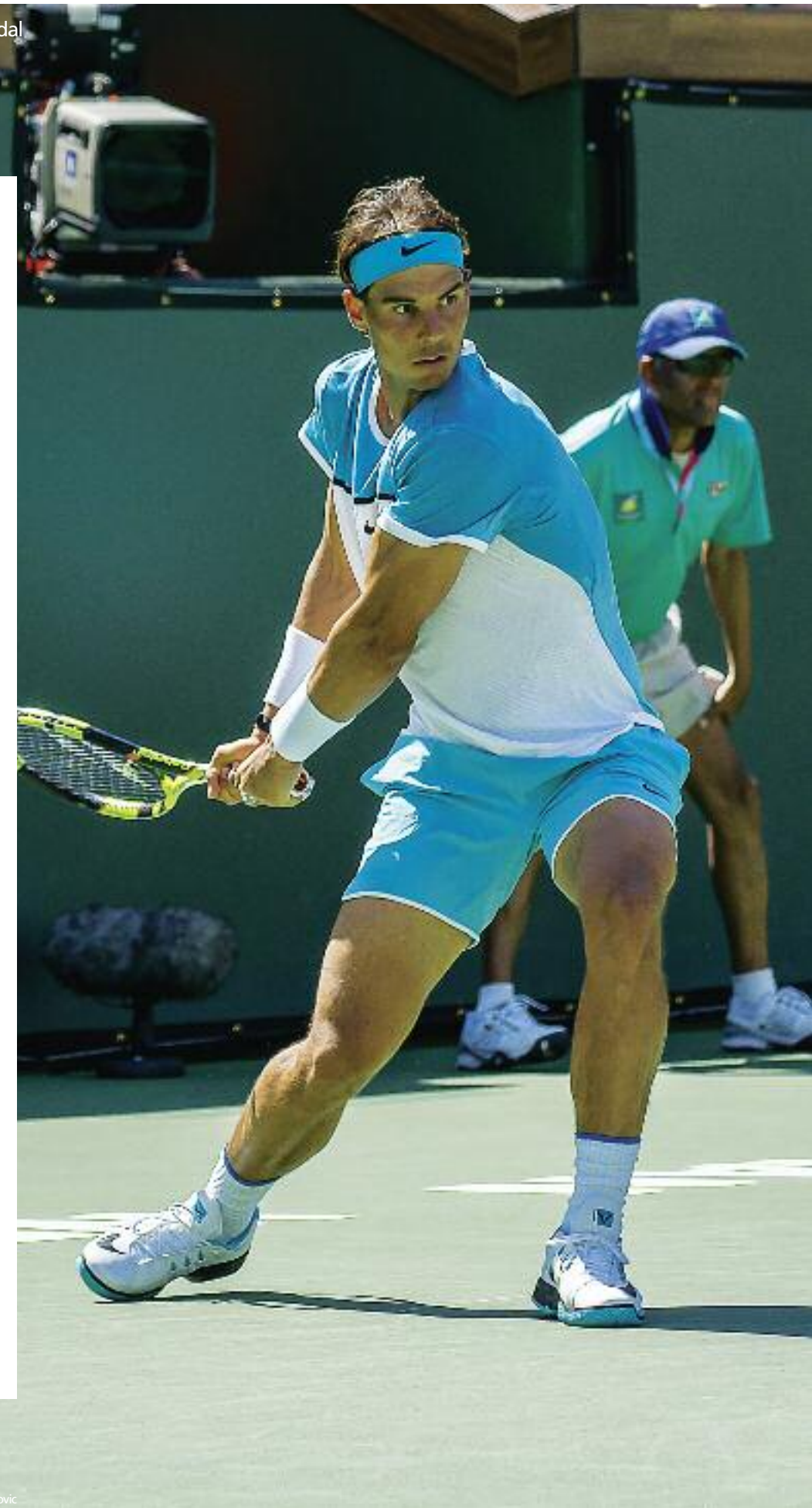

Rafael Nadal Back on Top Yet Again

If you look up the word “longevity” in the dictionary, you may eventually see a photograph of Rafael “Rafa” Nadal next to the definition. After clinching the year-end No. 1 ATP ranking for the first time back in 2008, he achieved the feat yet again 11 years later, the longest gap ever recorded in tennis history.

In November, he claimed the world No. 1 ranking for the 196th week—exactly one year after he last held it. A 19-time Major champion, including two Grand Slams in 2019—the French Open and the U.S. Open—Nadal has earned more than \$115 million in on-court earnings. Additionally, he’s had eight stints at No. 1 in the world (ranking thus far fourth place all time), has earned the No. 1 world ranking during nine of the last 12 years and is the second-oldest No. 1-ranked player in history, behind only Roger Federer.

“Rafa has made a habit of setting the highest of standards throughout his career and his return to No. 1 is just the latest example,” says Chris Kermode, ATP executive chairman and president. “It’s an incredible achievement and he continues to amaze me with his longevity at the top of the game.”

At the same time, he is also the oldest player ever to be ranked the year-end No. 1 world ranking, has acquired the year-end No. 1 ATP ranking five times (one year less than Pete Sampras) and is the first player to finish year-end No. 1 during five nonconsecutive years (2008, 2010, 2013, 2017 and 2019).

Aside from winning two majors and regaining his No. 1 world ranking, 33-year-old Nadal also won two other ATP tournaments and clinched the year-end No. 1 ATP ranking during the very last tournament of the year, the Nitto ATP Finals—the ninth time during the last 19 years that the year-end No. 1 ATP ranking was determined during the final tournament of the season.

“Since the inception of the ATP rankings in 1973, only 17 players can lay claim to finishing year-end No. 1,” Kermode adds. “Rafa had another incredible season and fully deserves this accolade.”

Roger Federer Looking to the Future

Last fall, Roger Federer announced he had invested in On, a Swiss trainer manufacturer. As a result, he'll become the public face of the company's sneaker label. Due to his lack of a footwear contract for over a year, some tennis analysts have wondered whether Federer would retire soon.

But according to the 38-year-old living legend himself, retirement is not yet being considered. In fact, during an interview with *TODAY* show host Savannah Guthrie, he jokingly stated he will "never retire."

Renowned as an ironman who has never retired during a tennis match throughout his lengthy career, Federer experienced what life would be like after tennis as he recovered from an MCL tear in 2016. He didn't seem to mind it much.

"It was nice to be able to have schedules with friends—lunch on Wednesday, dinner on Friday and fun on the weekends," Federer says. "I'm really looking forward to that."

As the all-time men's leader with 20 Grand Slam singles titles, Federer has earned \$116 million in on-court earnings. Yet, despite all his record-breaking performances, he remains as passionate about playing as ever as he prepares for the next chapter of his career.

"The [On team] want me to keep playing, I want to keep playing and my fans want me to keep playing," he says. "I'll continue to play as long as the stars are still aligned."

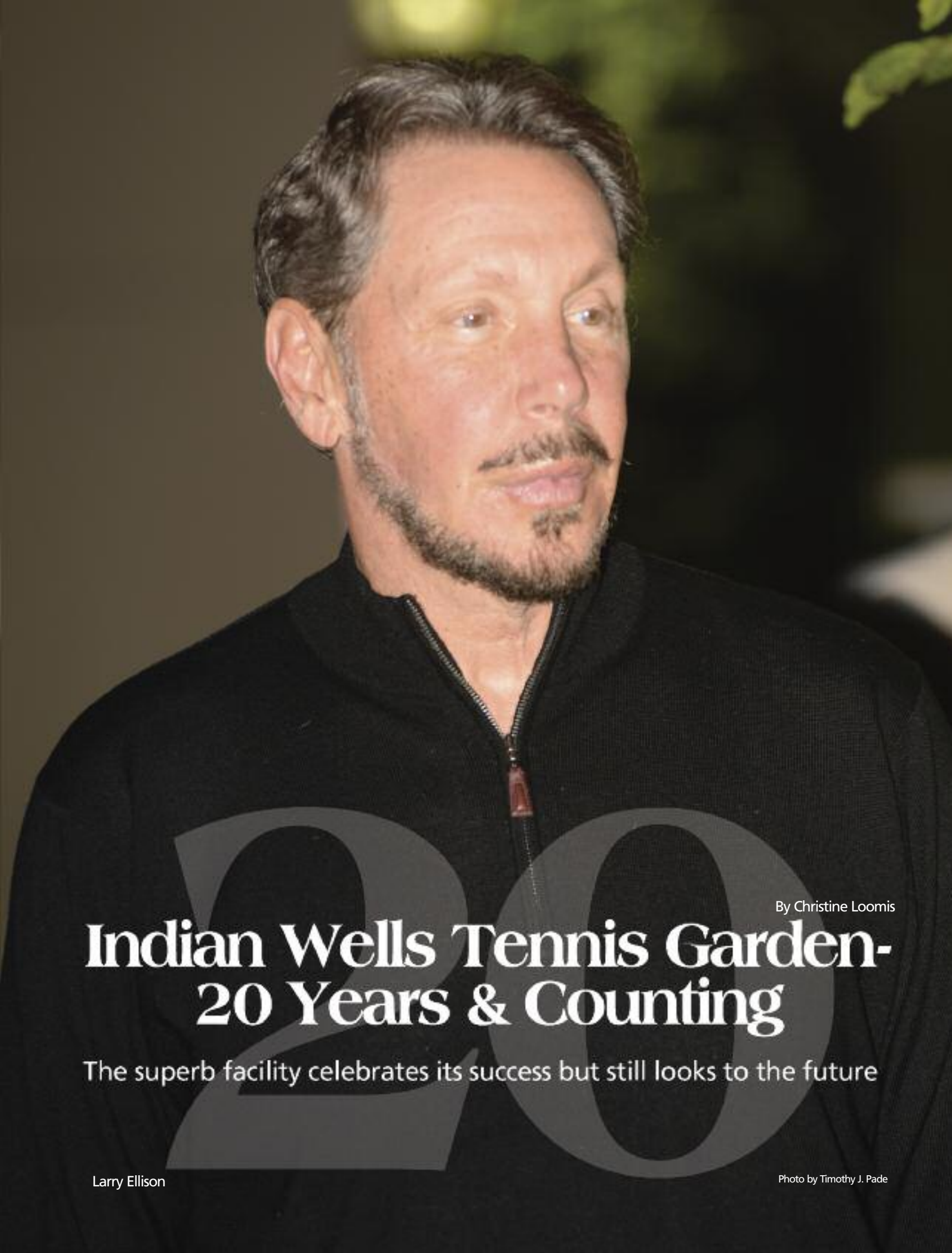

Indian Wells Tennis Garden- 20 Years & Counting

The superb facility celebrates its success but still looks to the future

From the start, the success story of Indian Wells Tennis Garden (IWTG) has been about partnerships. Tennis great Charlie Pasarell, who also owned the BNP Paribas Open, envisioned a world-class tennis facility in the Coachella Valley. But it wasn't until he joined forces with former tennis player Ray Moore and the late Mark McCormick that the vision evolved from dream to reality.

When Indian Wells Tennis Garden opened in 2000, it ushered in a new era of tennis.

Moore and Pasarell took the vision as far as they could with the funding they had, but IWTG wasn't yet where it could be. Carrying out the full extent of Pasarell's vision was handed over to Oracle co-founder and CEO, Larry Ellison, a passionate tennis fan with the millions required to carry IWTG to the next level; make that the next *multiple* levels.

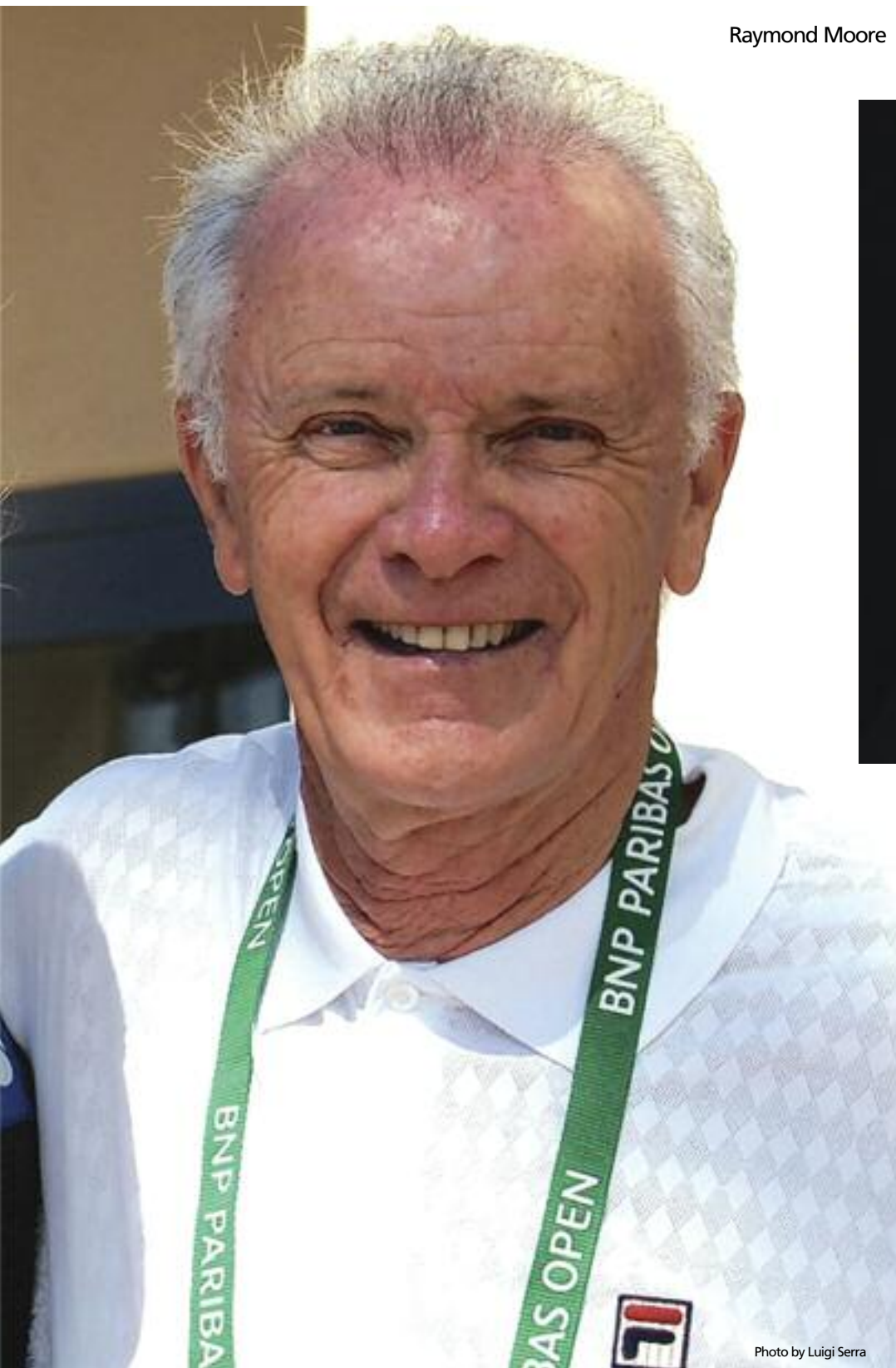
In 2009, Ellison bought both Indian Wells Tennis Garden and the BNP Paribas Open, a pairing that has elevated the sport of tennis in almost every way. And it isn't that he just handed over money; Ellison brought his own vision and an extraordinary attention to detail to the work of making IWTG one of the top tennis facilities in the world. In fact, every year since he's owned the tournament and IWTG, Ellison has overseen innovative expansions and additions. Ray Moore has continued to stay involved.

Stadium 2 opened in 2014, and there was an extensive renovation prior to the 2017 BNP Paribas Open, which transformed Stadium 1, including new seating, a VIP Champions Club, remodeled suites and a lowered court surface to accommodate recessed TV cameras. The Stadium Plaza was also added and the Superwall was expanded to display five matches at once.

Bringing fine dining to IWTG was another Ellison vision realized when celebrity chefs Wolfgang Puck and Nobu Matsuhisa were enticed to bring their signature restaurants to the BNP Paribas Open—Spago and Nobu, respectively. Revered local restaurants such as Piero's Pizza Vino and Fresh Agava, to name a few, are also part of the mix, giving Indian Wells Tennis Garden that special ethos of global and local simultaneously, a place where visitors from around the world and around the valley can feel at home.

Pasarell has been quoted as saying that handing over the facility and tournament to Ellison was one of the best decisions he and the other original partners made. He has said things keep getting better each year—and no one is arguing. What Ellison and his team have done is to create an extraordinary experience for everyone involved, right down to details of the landscaping.

It's not called a garden for no reason. From Ellison's first days overseeing IWTG he wanted to revamp the landscaping to create

the perfect backdrop for his tournament, one matching the grandeur of what nature already created in the valley and the mountains framed in the distance. Dozens of palm trees, flower gardens and water features were added throughout the venue, giving credence to the facility nickname the management team is fond of, “tennis paradise.”

But others have also noticed the paradise-like aspects of The Indian Wells Tennis Garden; there’s no question that it’s a place fans, players, media, sponsors and VIPs want to be, thanks to all that Ellison has done in the 10 years he’s owned the venue.

More importantly, perhaps, his vision for IWTG and the BNP Paribas Open and

the improvements he’s made have driven changes in tennis facilities and tournaments worldwide. Players and fans who experience IWTG want the same amenities and atmosphere at other tennis stadiums. Ellison has raised the bar higher and higher and other facilities and tournaments know have to keep up or be viewed as hopelessly outdated and insufficient.

One Coachella Valley resident and Tennis Hall of Fame champion put it succinctly when considering all that Ellison has done so far. “He has been good for tennis, period.”

Philippe Dore, marketing director for the BNP Paribas Open, says IWTG has remained true to the original vision. “The Indian Wells Tennis Garden was built to reflect the world-class event it hosts and the majestic backdrop of the Coachella Valley that surrounds it. It was built as a place for fans to enjoy world-class tennis matches, unparalleled dining options and some of the most scenic views anywhere in the world—and the recent renovations and improvement ensure that it remains as such.”

He’s also proud that the BNP Paribas Open has been voted Tournament of the Year for six years running by both the ATP and WTA players. “This honor is a



testament to the unbeatable facilities and amenities available at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden, as well as the dedication of the staff who work tirelessly to ensure that the players are comfortable, happy and able to perform at their best during their time in the desert.”

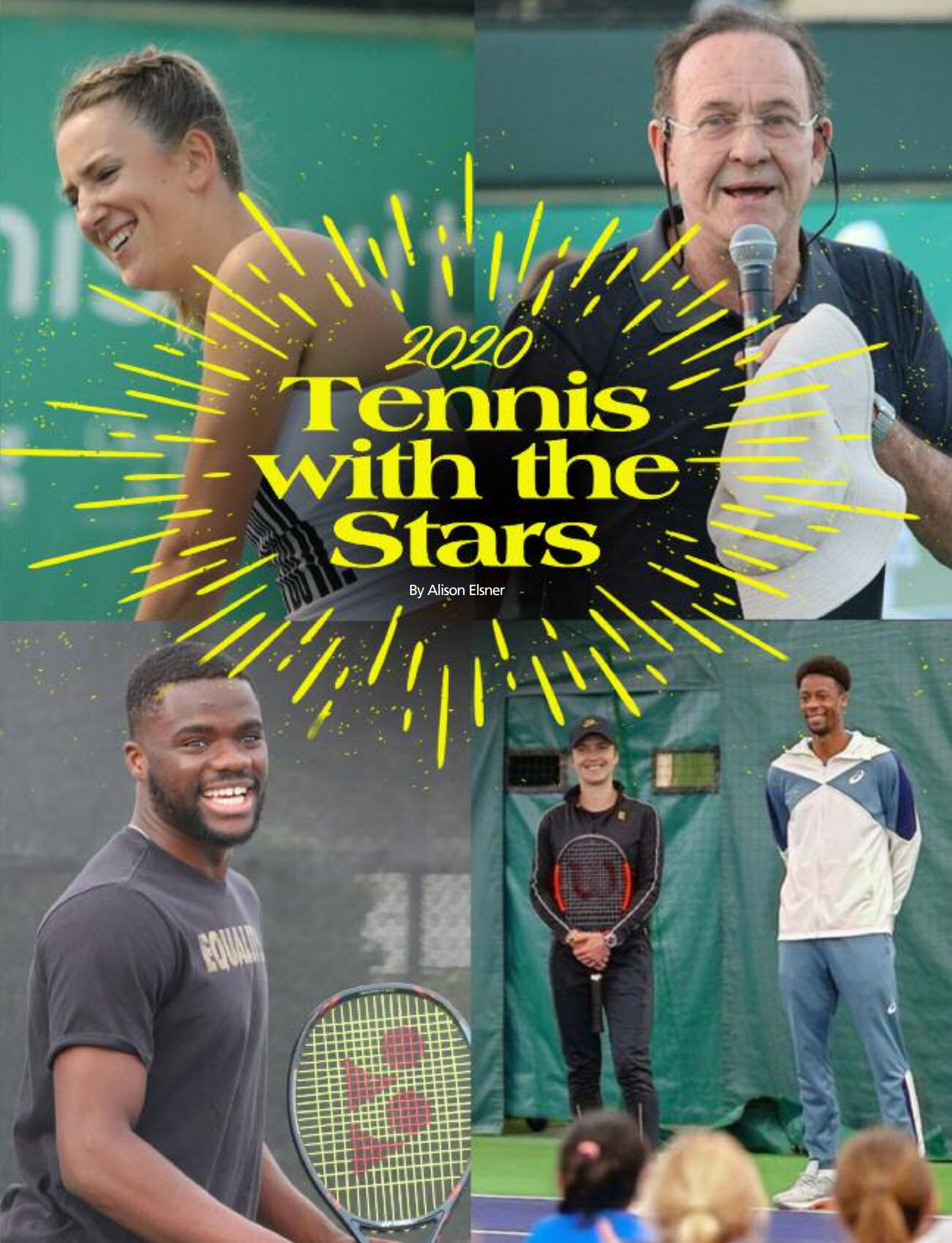
Yet all that begs the question: If IWTG has reached “paradise” status now, is there anywhere else for it to go? Dore says yes.

“We can’t wait to welcome patrons to the Indian Wells Tennis Garden for the 2020 BNP Paribas Open, and for many years to come. Every year, we strive to improve and ensure an even better experience for everyone who attends the event, from players to fans to media and sponsors. We are always considering new amenities and offerings that will enhance every aspect of the onsite experience so that we can continue to be the premier destination for tennis fans around the world, and the pre-eminent stop on Tour for players.”

It took Ellison’s millions to get IWTG to where it is today, but money alone hasn’t made the difference. All of the partners who dreamed big, who saw potential to create one of the greatest tennis facilities in the world to serve as the venue for what is fairly described as the greatest tournament outside of the Grand Slams, all of the teams who put heart and soul into the work, have been as critical as the funds.

We can all look forward to where Indian Wells Tennis Gardens will go in the next 20 years.

Talk about your heavy topspin. Just like the fast-forward effect on a tennis ball, Tennis With The Stars will rebound back into the Coachella Valley for yet another exclusive gathering of some of the world's top tennis players as a kickoff to the BNP Paribas Open tournament in Indian Wells, California. The exhibition presents a rare opportunity for a limited number of amateur tennis players, spectators and VIPs to get up close and personal with tennis stars on and off the court. What started six years ago as a modest event to complement the BNP Paribas has taken on a powerful presence, its impact felt long after the event concludes each year.

The 6th annual celebrity event will return to the Omni Rancho Las Palmas Resort & Spa in Rancho Mirage, California, on March 10, 2020. The event will benefit the Elina Svitolina Foundation and is supported by Desert Champions, LLC. So far, seven star players are positioned to highlight the lineup.

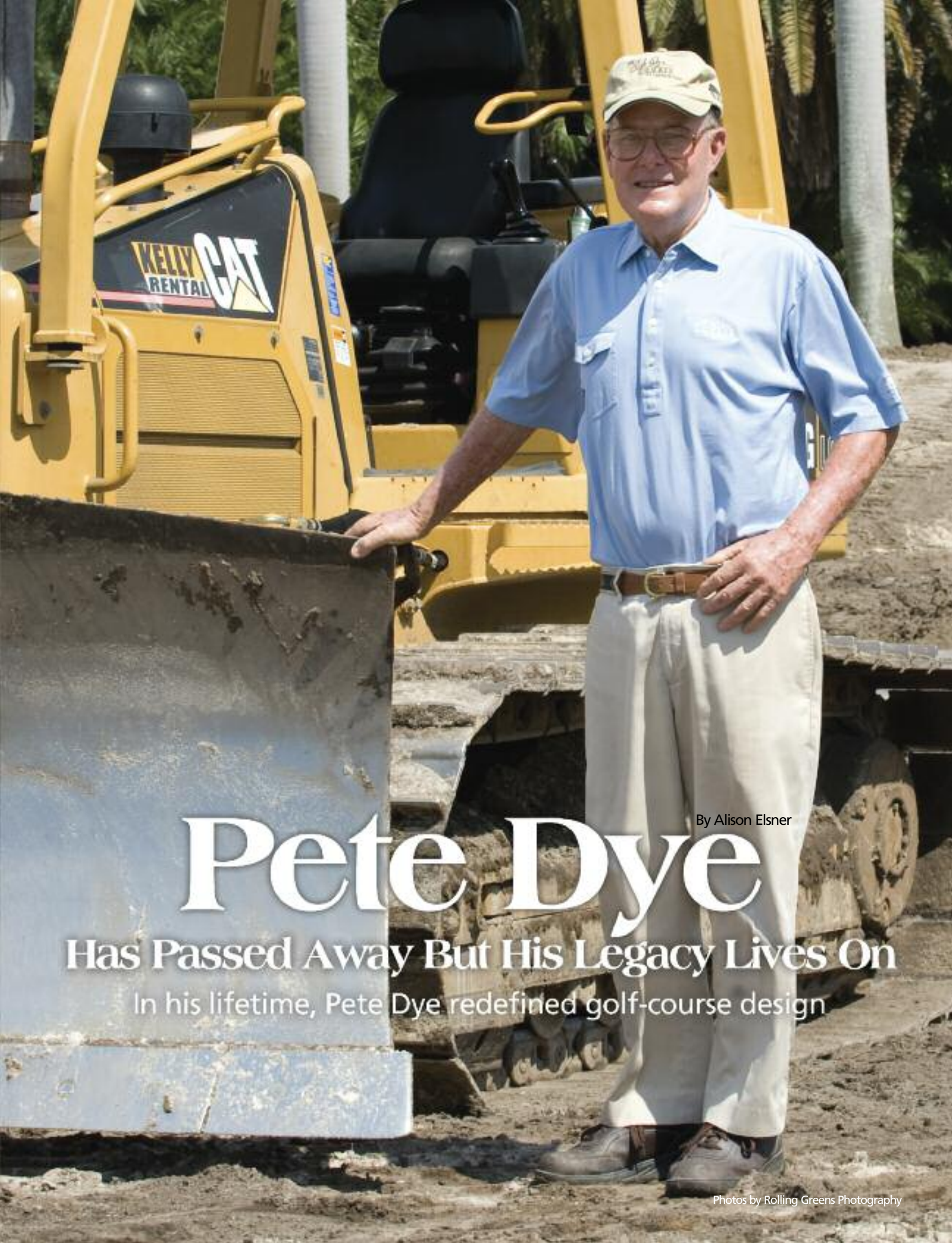

Pete Dye

Has Passed Away But His Legacy Lives On

In his lifetime, Pete Dye redefined golf-course design

The world of golf has lost a legend. Pete Dye, the genius responsible for designing golf courses such as PGA West Stadium Course in La Quinta and The Westin Mission Hills Resort & Spa South Course in Rancho Mirage, passed away on January 9, 2020, at the age of 94. He spent his last days in the Dominican Republic, the site of several Dye family courses.

Dye is considered one of the most influential course architects in the world. As a matter of fact, he's often referred to as the Picasso of golf-course architecture. Often collaborating with his wife, Alice, who died in 2019 at age 91, and in later years with their two sons, Perry and Paul Burke (known as PB.), Dye designed more than 100 courses in two dozen U.S.

states, Europe and around the world.

Small greens and the use of railroad ties to hold bunkers were among the hallmarks of his designs. His plan for the Brickyard Crossing golf course at Indianapolis Motor Speedway utilized the dismantled outer retaining wall from the racetrack. Dye's designs have been credited with returning short- and medium-length par 4s to golf.

Dye and his wife were best known for the "island green," the par-3, 17th hole at TPC Sawgrass in Ponte Vedra Beach, Florida. The green instills fear in even the most skilled golfers, especially at the Players Championship, an unofficial fifth major tournament, even though the green is only 135 yards from the tee. Surrounded by water and connected to the rest of the

course by a narrow land bridge, it's one of the most photographed images in the sport.

Dye began playing golf as a boy in Florida. He went on to win the Ohio state high-school golf championship, and while serving in the Army during World War II, he continued to play in Georgia and North Carolina. He and Alice were married in 1950, settled in Indiana and sold insurance.

Dye played in the United States Open in 1957, and in 1959 the couple designed their first course, the nine-hole El Dorado Golf Club in Indianapolis. With no professional training, they struggled with the design aspect at first. Then in 1963, after Dye competed in the British amateur championship on the Old Course at St. Andrews in Scotland, he and Alice made a breakthrough. Dye's memoir states, "My new understanding of the use of small greens, wide fairways, the impression that ground-level greens were elevated, contrasting grass mixes, severe undulations in the fairways, pot bunkers, railroad ties, blind holes and the inclusion of gorse-like vegetation to frame holes would affect all our future designs."

Dye collaborated with Jack Nicklaus in designing the Harbour Town Golf Links on Hilton Head Island, South Carolina. Nicklaus said in a statement, "It was Pete who inspired me to start designing courses more than 50 years ago, and so in many ways I owe my second career to him."

Dye liked to create courses that reflected a sense of adventure and there's no doubt he was a risk taker. In addition to a multitude of awards throughout his career, he received the PGA Tour Lifetime Achievement Award in 2005 and was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 2008.

Dye suffered from Alzheimer's disease in his final years, a cruel irony that prevented him from fully embracing the extent to which he defined the golf experience for thousands of golfers around the globe. He impacted the sport of golf for generations to come, and golfers who play on his courses can pay tribute to him each time they take a swing.

with a few new additions

When patrons turn out for this year's ANA Inspiration, they won't notice many changes; if it ain't broke, as they say, don't fix it.

Aside from a couple of minor operational tweaks, a Japanese LPGA Tour exemption, a couple of new ticket options and the knowledge that Augusta National Golf Club is having its nibble at the field, the tournament will be immediately familiar to the loyal fans who return year after year. When the championship is contested April 2-5, they'll see that the features that make the ANA the ANA are all in place.

Food options, player access, covered grandstands on No. 18, Poppie's Pond and more, all centered around the acclaimed Dinah Shore Tournament Course, will be there again in 2020 just as long-timers remember them. Did we mention a field that includes a huge percentage of the best female golfers on the planet?

Garrett cites reigning Women's British Open champion, Hinako Shibuno, as a primary reason for specifically singling out Japan and the JLPGA.

"If you watched the Women's British Open last year and caught the winner, the Japanese girl that won that event, wow, what an unbelievable performance," he says. "But better than that, she smiled and high-fived her way all the way around. It was an incredible scene to witness, and if we can extend an invitation to someone like that, we're happy to do so."

The new reality for the ANA Inspiration is that it must compete with Augusta National Golf Club's women's amateur tournament, which is played on the same weekend. However, Garrett says, the ANA has already issued its amateur invitations for this year's event and the response has been more than satisfying. The amateur field will be announced in early February and, once again, the winner of

"One of the great things about the ANA Inspiration is we never have to worry about our field," says Chris Garrett, the tournament director. "We're going to end up with 50 of the top 50 players in the world, and probably on down further than that. As long as players are healthy enough to play, no one is skipping the ANA Inspiration for a number of reasons. Obviously, it's the first major championship of the year, [it has] a great purse, people love coming out to the desert and they love the tournament course at Mission Hills."

Adding a Japanese LPGA Tour exemption for 2020, Garrett notes, was an easy decision, and not just because the championship's title sponsor is based in Japan. The exemption was an intentional move toward global recognition and inclusion, and

the ANA Junior Inspiration, played the week before the actual championship, will also play her way into the field.

"We've extended our amateur invitations and we're very happy with the field we have," Garrett says. "Obviously, Augusta's going to continue to do its event, and it is going to get a number of players. But there's also a group of players that look forward to the opportunity to play in a major championship on a tour where they're going to make their living in the future."

Garrett and his team were pleasantly surprised by the number of players who told them if they got an invite, they'd choose to play the ANA.

"That's not to take away from what Augusta's doing; they're doing something wonderful there," he adds. "But I think the idea

that half the field gets to play Augusta on Saturday versus a chance to play in a major championship on a tour where you want to chase your dreams...I think we're in a good position to get a really, really good field."

Tickets are available beginning in mid-to-late January at anainspiration.com, and consumers will notice the tournament is offering various levels of ticketing this year.

"We just wanted to give fans a couple of different levels of ticket options, depending on how they want to enjoy their experience," Garrett says. "There will be grounds tickets and a couple of versions of hospitality tickets with some upgraded options. We're excited about those options and look forward to rolling them out."

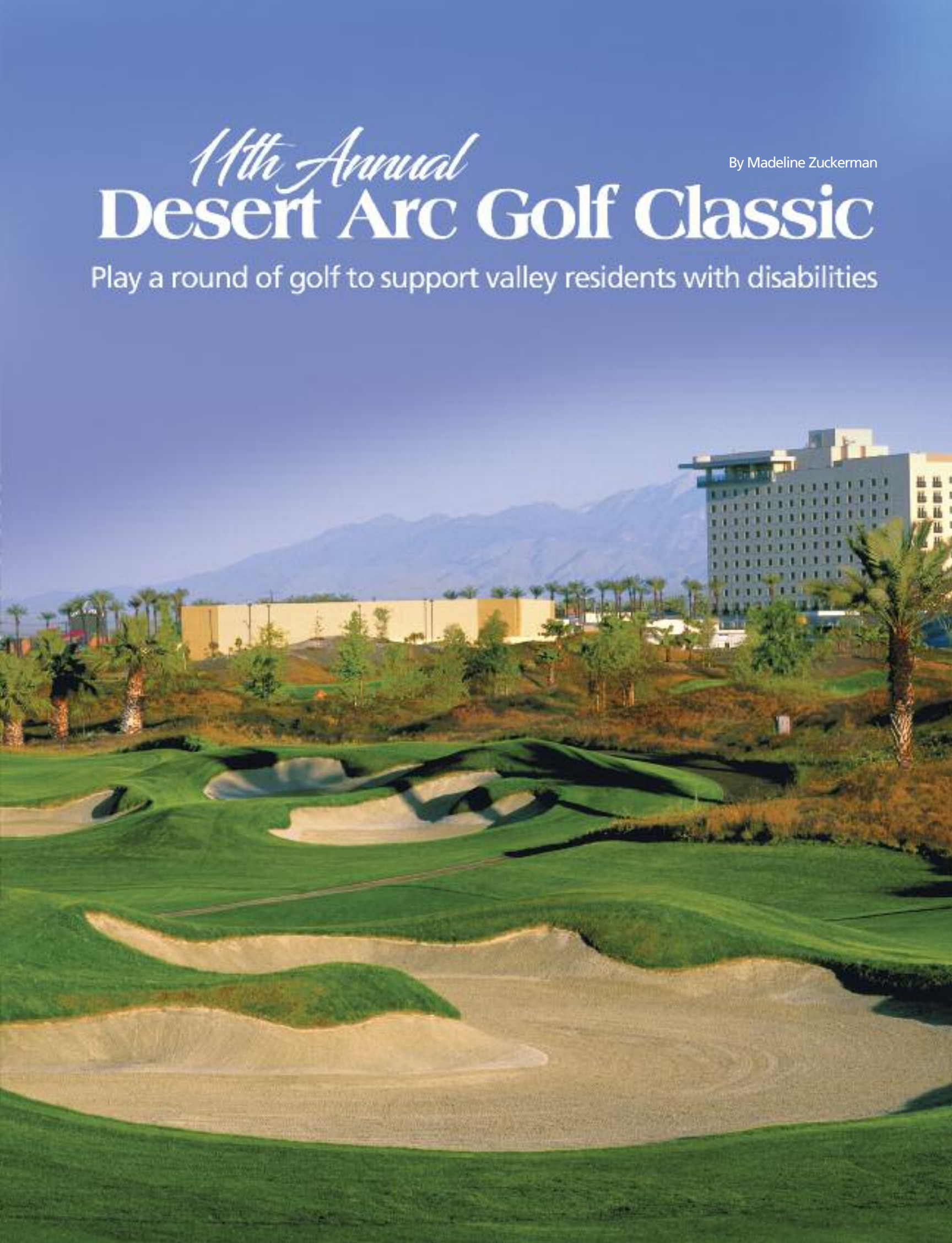

According to Warburton, local organizer Clarke Rheney deserves a hefty pat on the back as well. “Between Clarke Rheney and our board, and all the people out in the desert, we’ve had really great results. And we all feel blessed for that,” he says.

“The projection this year is very high. It’s the 10th year and we’re all feeling the pressure on that. But we wanna keep it going. I don’t think any of us expected results like this. Everyone has worked hard and it’s all worked out well. Clarke is a real pro and knows what he’s doing. We were fortunate to get him involved. He’s worked really hard for 10 years and that’s why we are where we are.”

Because the format has been so successful, Warburton and Rheney plan to adhere to the script when it comes to the 10th anniversary event—with the possibility of a few new wrinkles.

“We’re pretty much sticking with what works,” Warburton says. “There’s a couple of ridiculous things going on, we’ll see what happens there. We’ve got some silly ideas for some new things and we’ll see if they come to fruition. Other than that, we always work really hard on the music, and once again this year we should have some really fantastic acts that perhaps we haven’t had or seen before.”

When “The Warburton” convenes for the 10th time March 5-8 at the JW Marriott in Palm Desert, participants will once again get together to sing, dance, play golf and share good times.

They’ll also celebrate adding another chunk to the grand total the tournament has raised for St. Jude Children’s Research Hospital in those years, a total that blew past the \$10 million mark last year.

2020 Annalee Thurston Award

Honoring Billie Jean King & the Original Nine, Benefiting the Love & Love Tennis Foundation

In the 1970s, nine brave women boldly broke away from the body that governed the sport of tennis and risked their careers to fight for equality on and off the tennis courts. They were suspended from participating in the Grand Slam tournaments as well as their own national and team tournaments as punishment for bucking the establishment.

Ultimately the Original Nine, with tennis legends Billie Jean King and Rosie Casals at the eye of the social hurricane, triumphed against the odds and launched the women's professional tennis tour known as the Virginia Slims Circuit. It became the most successful in the world with the highest prize money for women. In 1971, Billie Jean King became the first female athlete to win \$100,000 in one year.

This year marks 50 years since the Original Nine changed the course of women's tennis, leveling the field so that women can enjoy equal prize money in all Grand Slam tournaments and ATP and WTA events. In addition to King and Casals, other members of the Original Nine were Valerie Ziegenfuss (Bradshaw), Nancy Richey, Jane "Peaches" Bartkowicz, Kristy Pigeon, Judy Tegart-Dalton, Kerry Melville Reid and Gladys Heldman.

The Love & Love Tennis Foundation, established in 2015 by Casals and Tory Fretz, will celebrate this historic development with a tribute to Billie Jean King at the Annalee Thurston Award fundraiser on Sunday, March 15, from 4 to 6 p.m. at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden. Organized by Tennis Hall of Famer Casals, the event will be presented by sponsors RumChata Foundation, Joan Oloff Shoes and Rodney Strong Vineyards.

Established in 2011, this is the tenth annual Annalee Thurston Award reception. For seven years the reception supported a scholarship fund at the University of Oregon. Two years ago, with the fund becoming fully endowed, the event took on a new beneficiary, the Love & Love Tennis Foundation (LLTF), which provides grant donations to academies, individuals and organizations that support youth tennis throughout the Coachella Valley.

Annalee Thurston served as a senior consultant to the Virginia Slims Tour and was a sports executive for the Indio Chamber of Commerce. Her impact on the world of tennis is still widely felt,

despite her sudden passing in 2007 at the age of 55 from a brain aneurysm.

The reception will again be held in conjunction with the BNP Paribas Open. Billie Jean King, this year's recipient of the annual Annalee Thurston Award, is a former world No. 1 tennis professional, the winner of 39 Grand Slam Titles and widely celebrated for defeating Bobby Riggs in the "Battle of the Sexes" tennis match at the Houston Astrodome in 1973. King and her lifelong partner, Ilana Kloss, established the Billie Jean King Leadership Initiative to address the issue of inclusiveness in the workplace.

As for powerhouse Casals, her tennis career spans more than three decades starting in the early 1960s. She was involved in the establishment of the WTA in 1973. Best known for doubles, Casals won 12 Grand Slam titles, seven Wimbledon championships (five with Billie Jean King) and four U.S. Open mixed doubles championships. Her 112 doubles titles are second only to Martina Navratilova. She's also a desert resident, clearing the path for the advancement of youth tennis programs in the Coachella Valley through her foundation.

This year, Lydia Rodriguez, No. 1 at the Coachella Valley High School Girls Tennis Team, will receive the Vicki Berner "Heart & Spirit" Award.

The evening will include live and silent auctions and a raffle, and Mary Carillo will serve as the emcee for the dinner and reception. Golfer's Playbook

Executing precision wedge play

The 16th Hole on the Stadium Course at PGA WEST is a very difficult par 5 with a small multi-level green. When executing the approach shot to this difficult green, I like to hit a slight cut shot to help me control the distance the ball is traveling to the flag. Here's how I execute that shot.

Setup – Backswing

On my setup, I want to aim slightly left of my target to allow the ball to launch left of my target, knowing that I'm going to spin the ball from left to right through the air.

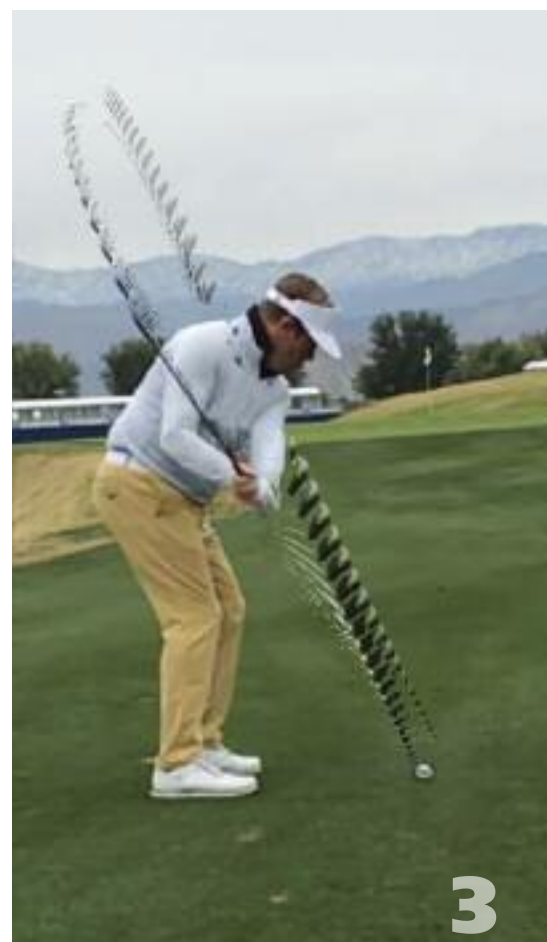
As I make my takeaway from the ball through a good core turn, I like to have my club swing path slightly outside my hands, making the path slightly vertical or steep on that backswing. That swing path takeaway opens up a lot of space for my transition into the forward swing for the golf club to drop and transition my clubface swing to go through my right arm.

Forward Swing – Finish

The key to executing great wedge shots is through impact. My ability to flush the ball on the clubface helps me control my ball flight. The main element that I try to feel through impact is for my hands to “shallow off” inside of the clubface. This helps me keep the shaft leaning forward and controls the depth of my clubface. In the photo sequence, I look for my hands staying inside the clubface all the way to my finish. That way there is no “flip” in my hands and I can very easily control the toe of the club.

Custom Total Knee Replacement

If you're considering total knee replacement, read on

Total knee replacement has been popular since the early 1970s. At first, surgeons worked to prove that it provided pain relief. But there was an issue with the limited number of implant sizes, so manufacturers catalogued the variety of sizes of the human femur and tibia bones that make up the knee. Based on averages, most manufacturers offer eight to 10 sizes, all with a single shape, and the surgeon chooses the best fit during surgery.

During the 1980s, surgeons and researchers focused on developing accurate instruments to shape the bone and make the operation reproducible in most surgeons' hands. Fortunately, these tools were quite good and are commonly used today. But during the 1990s, we learned that some manufacturing techniques resulted in implants that weren't durable. Surgeons and researchers then focused on how to improve durability,

with good success. Today's implants are expected to last 20 to 30 years.

Over the past two decades, we've found that 15 to 20 percent of knee-replacement patients have residual pain and stiffness, and thus are dissatisfied with their surgery. Clearly, we need to improve that rate. Research has revealed several potential issues: implants that are too small can result in instability and pain; implants that are too large can result in stiffness and pain; mal-positioned implants can cause pain and stiffness; if the metal overhangs past the bone, it impinges on the surrounding tissue, causing pain and stiffness; if the implant shape is too different from the patient's natural bone shape, it causes stiffness. Thus, to achieve better outcomes, we need to be more accurate in positioning implants. Implants need to fit the bone well without overhang, and they need to recreate the natural shape of the patient's bone so that the replaced knee can move more like a native knee.

To make the operation more accurate, we first tried intra-operative computers and robots, but the patient dissatisfaction rate was unchanged. We tried implants that could accommodate higher degrees of flexion, but the dissatisfaction rate was still unchanged. Then we tried more sizes of implants. Again the dissatisfaction rate was unchanged. We even tried better anesthesia and pain control, but—you guessed it—the same 15 to 20 percent of patients remained unhappy due to residual pain and stiffness. The only logical conclusion was that the metal and plastic implants, as designed, were the rate-limiting factor.

In response, a group of surgeons, along with a small implant manufacturer named

Conformis, designed a customized implant to address the shortcomings of traditional off-the-shelf implants. I was fortunate to be part of that design team. We developed a method to more accurately shape the bone, using a CT scan to create a 3-D model of each patient's leg. We calculate the correct alignment of each patient's leg. A 3-D printer is used to make the cutting tools that snap onto the patient's bone like a Lego and are extremely accurate. Then the implant, using the same 3-D information from the CT scan, is manufactured to be a perfect size and shape fit of the patient's bone, recreating the individual anatomy and biomechanics.

With over 100,000 implantations, we've dropped the dissatisfaction rate to under 10 percent for the first time, and 91 percent of patients even forget which knee was replaced! One study showed that 100 percent of these customized implants fall within a two-degree margin of alignment error. That's better than an intraoperative robot (which uses an implant designed in 1997) or intraoperative computers, which only reach 90 to 95 percent. Another study showed that the custom knee implant reproduces natural motion more so than any off-the-shelf implant. Lastly, the United Kingdom registry, which follows all surgeons and all knee replacements implanted, shows that the custom knee implant has the lowest infection rate and lowest re-operation rate of any implant.

It stands to reason: If you make the implant to recreate the patient's individual shape and size, you avoid the reasons we know lead to residual pain and stiffness. And most insurers cover the implant as it doesn't cost any more than off-the-shelf varieties. So for the latest knee replacement technology proven to improve function by following form, the choice is clearly iTotal by Conformis, exclusively designed and available at STAR Orthopaedics.

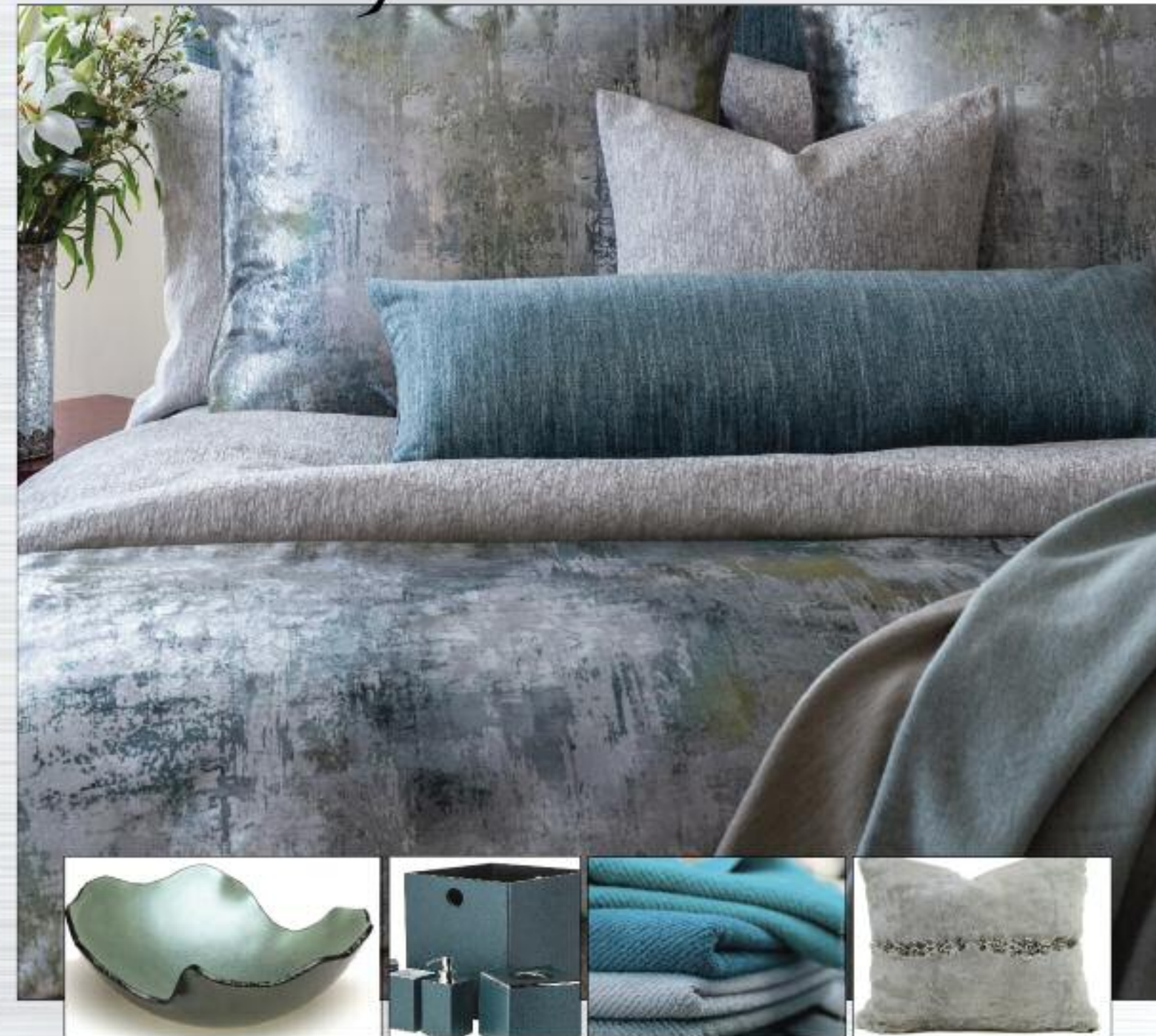

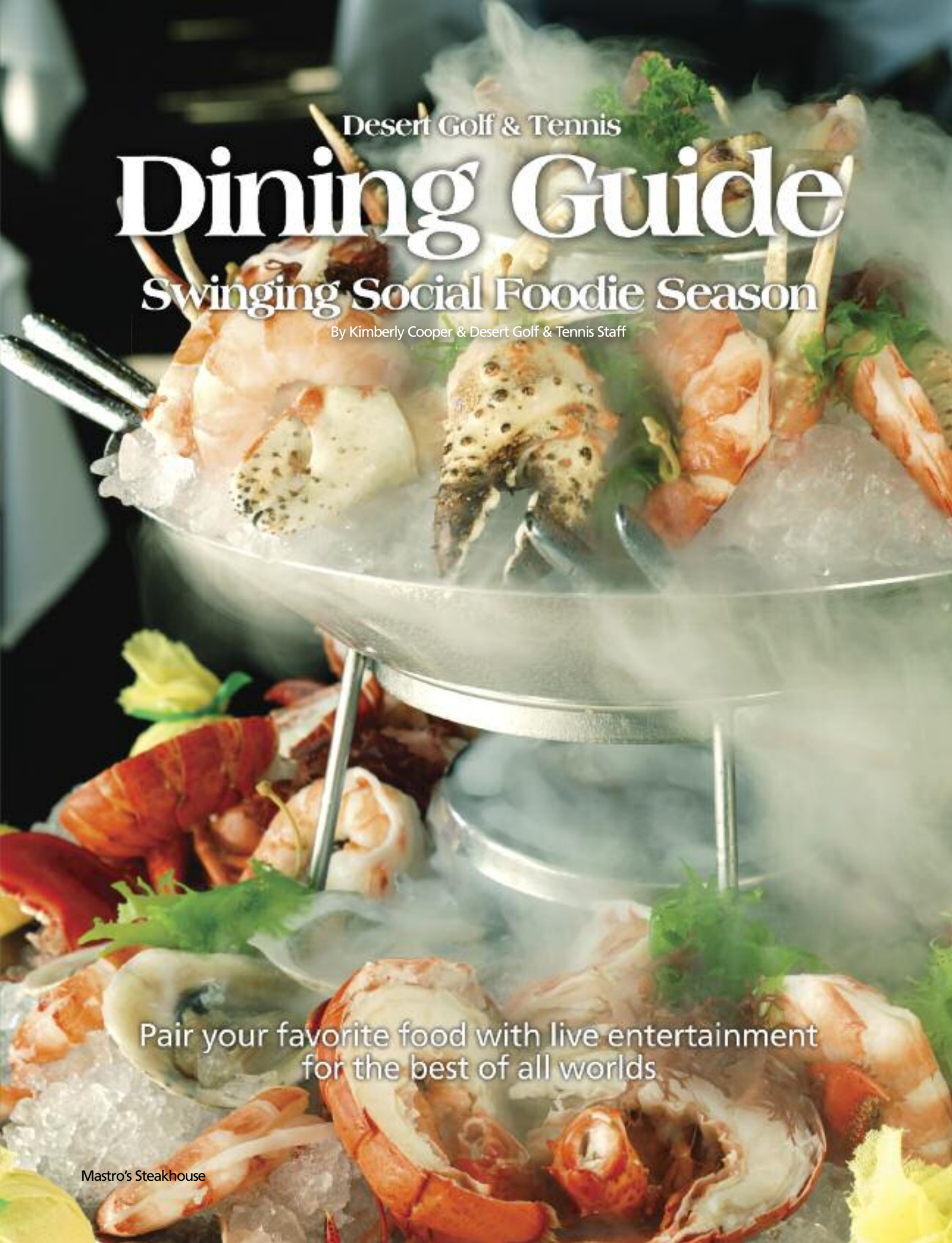

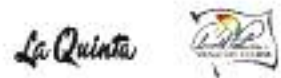

Bugatti Chiron-

a Class of its Own

You're going to need a moment. That's all you can say when gazing upon the new Bugatti Chiron. A moment for the Chiron is a lifetime for other lesser machines.

The Chiron delivers 1,479 horsepower in its 8.0 liter, 16-cylinder engine. Yes, you read that correctly: 1,479 horsepower.

Now take a moment to consider these startling facts: The Chiron will accelerate from 0-62 mph in less than 2.5 seconds, 0-124 mph in less than 6.5 and 0-186 mph in under 13.6. At a constant top speed, the Chiron will drain its entire fuel tank in nine minutes.

The Chiron replaces Bugatti's Veyron model, but it's no stand-in. Rather, it carves a new legacy for the family name. In fact, it unseated the Veyron as the fastest production car ever made, clocking an astonishing 304 mph after a weeklong series of test runs.

"We have shown several times that we build the fastest cars in the world," says Stephen Winkelmann, Bugatti president, in the official release on the record. "Bugatti was the first to exceed 300 mph. Its name will go down in the history books and it will stay that way forever."

The Chiron goes big—and that may be the understatement of 2020. More than 60,000 liters of air per minute are pumped through the engine via cooling ducts and fans. Ten radiators pump more than 800 liters of coolant per minute through the Chiron engine housing.

The tires are uniquely made for the Bugatti. The 20-inch wheels in the front and 21-inch in the back are also wider than the





Veyron's. They must withstand up to 3.8 Gs of force from the monster beneath the hood. We're talking a rocket on wheels. Much of that force is created by four turbos working together through 70 percent of the engine's operating RPM. In other words, when you punch it, you go. No questions asked.

Those turbos, combined with state-of-the-art exhaust, are the recipe for power delivered. The exhaust is made from titanium. Six tail pipes rid the car of back pressure, four terminating out the rear of the car and two exiting directly under the car to create more down force. This same design structure was banned in Formula 1 racing machines.

The electronic steering is a thing of genius, more the Einstein type than Michelangelo. Seven algorithms combine to make the rack respond exactly as it should at 200-plus miles per hour. The all-wheel-drive shuffles the power between wheels so there's no need to think about which tire is losing grip and which is holding. The Chiron puts it all together to show the world that another level in automotive experience exists.

Imagine the sound of four turbochargers whirring and the W16 growling. The sound of the Chiron has been described as everything from angry to naughty. Both are probably excellent descriptors and the split personality is a

compliment in this setting. The Chiron's brilliant sound dampening and glazed windows do their best to keep the right amount of "angry" out while cruising. However, as the owner of a Chiron, you want the world to know that this gentle beast is capable of something shocking.

In an elegant move, Bugatti chose to make the speedometer analog. It tops out at an even 500 KM/H, 310 MPH. The rest of the cabin is a stylized, minimalist work of art. The stereo system is literally diamond plated; the tweeters use a diamond ring to amplify the right notes. The electronics are intuitive and beautiful and the cabin is even functional, which is saying something compared to other cars at 1/10th the horsepower.

Owning a Chiron will be a moment in the imagination for most. The price tag of over \$3 million—again you may need a moment to process that information—puts the car into the category of unicorns and snow leopards. Bugatti will make fewer than 500 for the entire production model. The company says 120 are already accounted for. If you're lucky, you'll see one on the street and recognize it as something so rare that you'll take a moment to admire it.

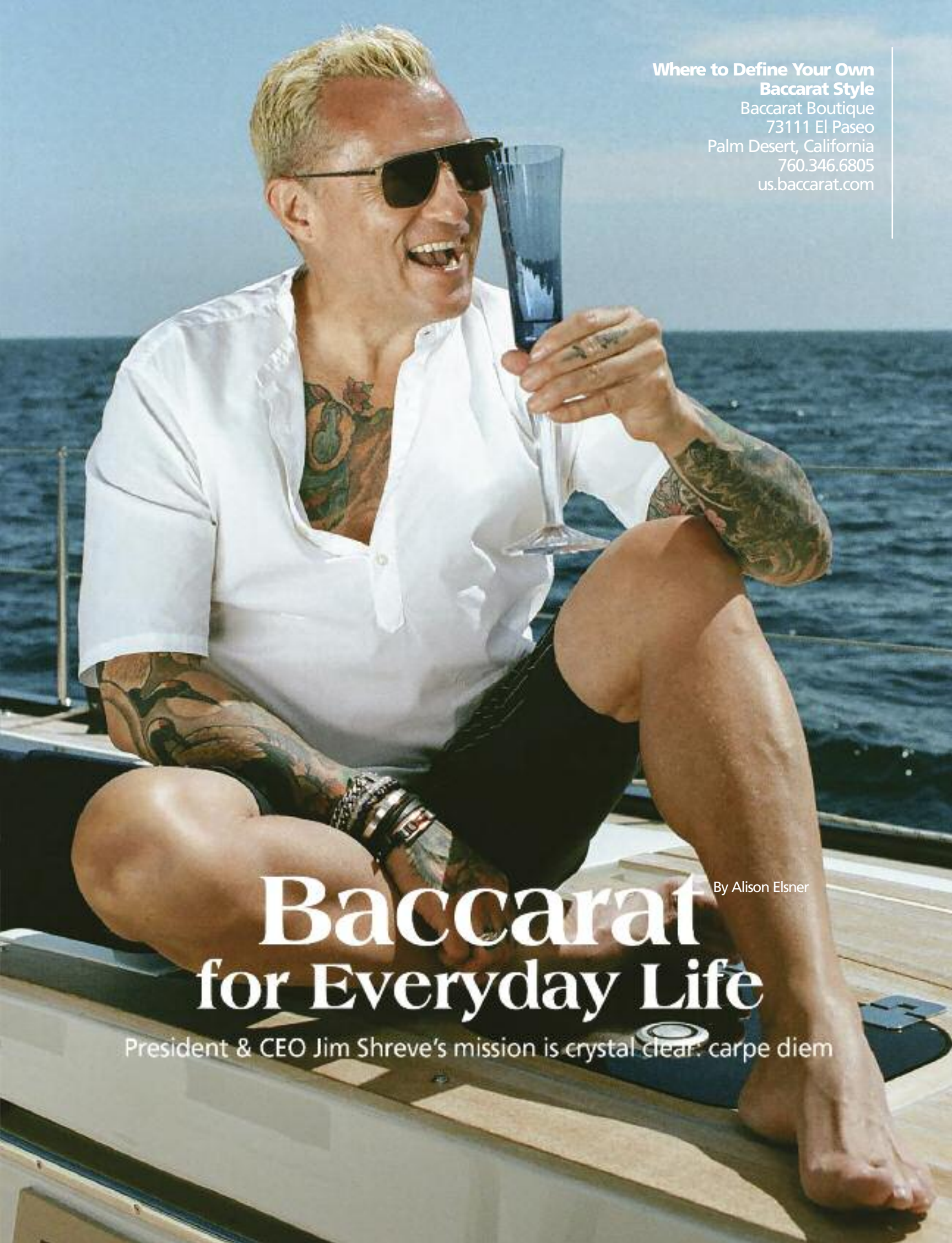

Working with large retailers such as Neiman Marcus, Bloomingdale's, Geary's and others helps clients to visualize a guide

for using fine crystal, augmenting the revival. "Our team is proud to help serve as style editors for homeware," he notes, "to help make sure people are comfortable mixing and matching styles and colors of crystal. It's easier to implement when it's modeled in a template that can be customized."

In an era of mass production, Baccarat has maintained its tradition of hand-crafted elegance and excellence. The global brand

remains synonymous with luxury but should never be considered precious. The team behind its success wants to banish the concept of "don't touch."

As Shreve says, "Every day is all we have." Words to live by and cheers to a resplendent new habit.
