





Welcome to this issue of Desert Golf & Tennis. We are proud once again to feature Roger Federer on our cover for the BNP Paribas Open at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden. Federer's career has been record shattering. He has won 19 Grand Slam singles titles, the most in history for a male tennis player, and has held the world No. 1 spot in the ATP rankings for a record total of 302 weeks, including a record 237 consecutive weeks. He won a record-tying fifth BNP Paribas Open crown last year, defeating Stan Wawrinka 6-4, 7-5 in an all-Swiss final. There are many who believe he's ready and able to take his sixth win at the tournament this year, which would make him the all-time leader in the event and make BNP Paribas Open history.

With this issue, our largest in 19 years, we are also proud to help promote the ANA Inspiration at Mission Hills Country Club. The event, which began in 1972 as the Dinah Shore tournament, is the first Major on the LPGA Tour, bringing the top women golfers to the

After the controversy of the four-stroke penalty assessed to leader Lexi Thompson last year on the 12th hole, So Yeon Ryu and Thompson went on to a playoff, with Ryu ultimately winning the title. The controversy came as the result of a television viewer contacting the tournament office to report Thompson for improperly marking her ball during the previous day's round, a twostroke penalty, and then she signed an incorrect score card, resulting in a second two-stroke penalty.

With the total of a four-shot penalty mid-round on Sunday, Thompson was stunned as the tournament came down to a one-hole playoff with Ryu. The final result was a bitter loss to Thompson and a shock to the gallery. Ryu earned her spot in history and a leap into Poppie's Pond at the 2017 ANA Inspiration. More excitement to come? Definitely. We'll see you at the 2018 tournament.

Also in this edition we feature the 2018 Warburton Celebrity Golf Tournament, which benefits St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. Now one of the largest rock-and-roll golf tournaments in the country, this funfilled event has become one of the not-to-be-missed events in the valley. Warburton brings his celebrity to the valley with many of his friends and legendary rock stars such as Alice Cooper, Robbie Krieger and Dave Brock from The Doors, Tommy Thayer from KISS, Kim Carnes ("Betty Davis Eyes"), REO Speedwagon, Mickey Thomas of Jefferson Starship and many others. Most importantly, it raises a lot of money for a hospital dedicated to helping children with catastrophic diseases. Last year's event raised more than \$2 million—the cost of operating the hospital for one day.

The desert is booming with golf and tennis events and all of us at Desert Golf & Tennis are pleased to be your go-to resource for what's happening in the sports across the Coachella Valley and the Southwest. Here's to a fantastic 2018 for all!

o further its commitment to U.S. tennis, Oracle Corp. last year revealed its Oracle U.S. Tennis Awards—two \$100,000 grants awarded annually to assist young American players as they transition from college to the

At the same time, the renowned tech company also worked alongside the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) to host the Oracle ITA National Fall Championships at Indian Wells Tennis Garden. The event, sponsored entirely by Oracle, featured the nation's top 64 men and women's singles players, as well as the top 32 men and women's doubles teams.

Interested in building upon its recent success in the tennis industry, Oracle has also decided to launch four new professional tennis tournaments in conjunction with the Association of Tennis Professionals (ATP) and Women's Tennis Association (WTA).

Presented as two combined women and men's events, the tournaments, known officially as the Oracle Challenger Series, will be comprised of two WTA 125K Series events and two ATP Challenger Tour events. The first tournament will be contested at Newport Beach, California, from January 20-28, coinciding with the second week of the Australian Open. The second will occur at Indian Wells Tennis Garden February 24-March 4, literally hours before the start of the BNP Paribas Open.

"Tennis players in the United States need more chances to compete at home and more chances to earn a living from the sport," says Oracle CEO Mark Hurd. "These events are designed to provide opportunities for players to make meaningful gains in both prize money and ranking points on their home soil."

Oracle is expecting a strong field for each event. One member of the Newport Beach player field is a U.S. Open singles finalist— Japan's Kei Nishikori, a former World No. 4 player on the ATP World Tour who accepted a wild card to play in the tournament. He will be joined by players such as Frances Tiafoe, ranked No. 79 in the world as of January, and Taylor Fritz, who was ranked just outside of the top 100 in early January.



"I am very excited and looking forward to getting back on the court," Nishikori states. "The Oracle Challenger Series is a perfect event in a great Southern California location to help me get some match play. This will be a great opportunity to face high-level

Chris Kermode, ATP World Tour executive chairman and president notes, "Our players in the United States are eager for more opportunities like this. We're so pleased to partner with a company like Oracle to further promote and develop tennis in the

All challenger events strive to help young, potential stars acquire further experience, gain more ranking points and earn additional prize money. But the Oracle Challenger Series has one unique distinction when compared to all other challenger events: as a combined men and women's event, it pays equal prize money to male and female contestants, resulting in \$150,000 in total earnings for each tournament.

Of equal importance, the top two male and top two female Americans with the highest accumulated points from each Oracle Challenger Series event will also earn wild cards in their respective singles main draws at the 2018 BNP Paribas Open, which runs from March 5-18. Since these players will be competing at the Indian Wells event shortly before the BNP Paribas Open begins, they should be fully prepared for the challenges of Indian Wells as they compete against some of the world's greatest tennis players.

"We are thrilled that Oracle is making this commitment to grow the pathway for young, emerging national and regional talent here in the United States, so that they can reach their goals of competing on the WTA Tour," says Steve Simon, chairman and CEO of the WTA. "This will lead to great things for tennis in

Prior to the BNP Paribas Open, the fourth annual Tennis With The Stars will benefit nonprofit ACEing Autism

ACEing Autism, a national nonprofit founded in 2008 by Richard Spurling and Dr. Shafali Jesthat, connects children on the autism spectrum to tennis. This year, it will once again receive financial support from Cliff Drysdale Management's Tennis With The Stars.

This fourth edition of the charity event will be held March 6 in Rancho Mirage, California, at Omni Rancho Las Palmas Resort & Spa, a renowned 444-room resort featuring a 25-court tennis center and a host of other amenities.

The event is set one day before the first rounds of the 2018 BNP Paribas Open kick off. Starting at 2 p.m., 24 amateurs will play alongside tennis professionals and special guests of Cliff Drysdale Management, created by the International Tennis Hall of Fame member of the same name and specializing in daily tennis and fitness operations. Upon the conclusion of the pro-am—a doubles

Round Robin—four amateurs will have an opportunity to compete against the tennis celebrities in exhibition matches set to begin at 5 p.m.

"This is a once in a lifetime opportunity to share the court with elite professional players," says Scott Colebourne, vice president of operations for Cliff Drysdale Management. "There are many events throughout the year where you can watch the players, but here you can actually have personal interaction with them on the court."

World No. 1 Simona Halep, who finished runner-up at the 2017 French Open, won the 2017 Madrid Open and compiled a 45-17 record last year, will be one of the professionals to headline Tennis With The Stars. Known for her consistency, Halep finished inside the top five of the world rankings from 2014 to 2017. The 26-year-old Romanian finished 2017 with the extraordinary



huge hit. He's also been playing great tennis the last 12 months, so he's a great hope for American tennis going forward."


achievement of reaching the year-end No. 1 ranking for the first time.

here were you when it happened, when you first heard? Were you following along in the gallery? Were you in front of a TV? Did you see the numbers change on the scoreboard?

Where were you, that is, when Lexi Thompson got the news that she would be penalized for a mistake made the day before, a violation called in by a television viewer during the final round of last year's ANA Inspiration? It's just the type of lightning-strike event that always seems to happen at the year's first Major.

There won't be any call-in rulings at this year's event, scheduled for March 29-April 1 at Mission Hills Country Club in Rancho Mirage, California. The LPGA, and in fact, the PGA Tour, USGA and R&A, have all put the kibosh on that, assuring the golf public that when it comes to handing out penalties, they've got that under

But if this year's event follows the tournament's historical pattern, something memorable is going to happen. Remember 2012, when In-Kyung Kim missed a one-foot putt on the 72nd hole that would have given her the victory and the stunned South Korean eventually lost in a playoff?

Often, the tournament leaves galleries and TV audiences with the kind of surprised satisfaction that only comes from the thrills a golf Major can provide. Remember Brittany Lincicomb's shot into No. 18 in 2009, which led to an eagle and a one-shot win? Of course you do. How about 2006, when Karrie Webb holed out from the 18th fairway on her 72nd hole and went on to win in a playoff? Unforgettable. Or when Stacy Lewis made an impossible birdie putt on No. 17 en route to a three-shot win over defending champion Yani Tseng in 2011? Historic.

More than one golf maven believes these finishes are not just the product of a top field competing for a major title. In fact, Mission Hills' Dinah Shore Tournament Course has a lot to do with the drama. The aforementioned No. 17, a par 3 with an elevated green that typically plays to around 185 yards during the championship, and the par 5 No. 18, with it's partial island green, are just two of the components of the Desmond Muirhead design that collaborate to produce magic for four days and a champion on Sunday.

Of course, a top field competing for a major title also helps, and this year's championship will be no exception. There's little chance that any of the top 100 players will be missing unless it's through illness, injury or a compelling personal matter.



The field will also be enhanced by the presence of top amateurs, including the winner of the ANA Junior Inspiration. This year's ANA Junior Inspiration is scheduled for March 24-25 at Mission Hills and will be contested over 54 holes on the Dye Challenge and Dinah Shore courses. Last year's junior winner was Lucy Li, a 14year-old who made the cut and eventually finished tied for 70th.

For the patron of championship golf, this year's tournament also offers a slew of off-course attractions. The ANA Experience exhibit allows patrons to cool out (for a limited time) in a replica of one of the ANA's first-class seats, and also lets groups take a simulated leap into Poppie's Pond. Those who tweet their leap with the hashtag #anainspiration will be automatically entered into a drawing for two round-trip tickets to Tokyo on ANA.

The food courtyard is back this year, with its massive LED television screen, full-service bar and shaded dining tables throughout, all partially surrounded by food trucks offering an array of cuisine from street to haute. LPGA teaching and club professionals will also be on hand at the driving range, where they'll dispense lessons to patrons 10 minutes at a time. The autograph zone and merchandise tent, two old favorites, will also return.

Then there's the actual championship. The top 110 women golfers from more than 25 countries will be in the 2018 field, including defending champion So Yeon Ryu, who took advantage of Thompson's troubles last year to win with a birdie on the first playoff hole. Both players finished tied at -14 after 72 holes.

In Gee Chun, Juli Inkster, Eun-Hee Ji, Ariya and Moriya Jutanugarn, In-Kyung Kim, Sei Young Kim, Lydia Ko, Brittany Lang, Stacey Lewis, Inbee Park, Sung Hyun Park, Suzann Pettersen, Gerina Piller, Lizette Salas, Karrie Webb and Michelle Wie are among those expected to play this year. The final field will be set at the conclusion of the LPGA Kia Classic and the ANA Junior Inspiration. The winner of the Junior Inspiration gets the last remaining exemption into the championship.

Also returning this year is the Inspiring Women In Sports Conference, for which speakers will be announced in February. In the early morning hours of December 30, 2017, media outlets across the country opened their sports **L**reports with breaking news about amateur golfer Charlie Reiter securing a professional's spot in the CareerBuilder Challenge, played in January at PGA West in La Quinta, California.

Thanks to a sponsor's exemption, this was the first of its kind in the 59-year history of the tournament. Perhaps even more astonishing, it was gifted to a high school

So what was Reiter doing the morning of the announcement? Fielding the overwhelming number of calls and texts? Celebrating with family and friends? No, he was doing what most 18-year-old guys do on a Saturday when there's no golftournament scheduled: sleeping in.

At 6'l, tan and lean, Reiter casually walks into the First Tee Coachella Valley with a huge grin on his face, ready for his first interview of the day. "It's pretty exciting," he says. "I found out a couple of days ago. At first I didn't really know what to think, but it's a hometown course so I just want to go out there and have some fun."

If you're a little confused and not sure who Charlie Reiter is, we suggest you keep this article and get his autograph because he's got game!

A Southern California native born at Eisenhower Medical Center in Rancho Mirage, Reiter is playing to a plus 5 and currently drives the ball about 330 yards. His bio includes 86 junior tournament wins, back-to-back Palm Desert High School Golfer of the Year honors, an Individual Southern California CIF title winner as a sophomore, and a win at the AJGA Karsten Ping Invitational in Atlanta Georgia.

He played in the 2017 Australian Open, finishing 65th in the professional field, and has won the prestigious Ralph Miller Medal, which Tiger Woods also once won. With only a fraction of his accomplishments listed, take a moment to imagine that all of this has occurred in a span of 13 years, factoring in that Reiter won his first golf tournament at the age of five.

He admits to being obsessed with the game. "That's pretty much all I do; eat, sleep, go to school and play golf," he says with a

So how did it all begin? "I don't really remember when I started playing," the teen says, "but there's a picture of me in my crib with golf clubs. Talk to my dad about that."

Reiter's father, Mike, is an avid golfer himself, having taken up the game at age 24 "I played all sports in high school, but when I started playing golf I played 24/7," Mike says. "When Charlie was born, I knew golf was in the cards for him. We would do hand-andeve coordination drills when he was five months old, rolling golf balls back and forth with one hand and then two and as fast as he could catch them. I taught him how to count by hitting golf balls and took him to the course when he could walk. He's been playing ever since."

The world truly is Reiter's oyster. After high-school graduation, he'll head off to college at USC and its top-ranked golf program, but still keeping his current coaches within reach. "I have a swing coach, Paul Bucy, a putting coach, Dave Stockton, Jr., and my mental coach, Howard Falco," Reiter says.

"Howard has really taught me how to prepare and think out there, and that's when my game turned around for me. I'm learning how to deal with not playing well then going back out there and playing the

best that I possibly can and fixing what's not working."

Reiter has not forgotten his junior golf roots. "Junior golf programs are so important," he says. "They make it more enjoyable that just practicing, which can get boring for kids. The First Tee teaches you lessons on how to act out there and that's so important because there is more to golf than playing."


With all roads leading to Reiter becoming a professional Tour player, he's already working with sponsors Titleist and Ping, and others are starting to form a line. Bighorn Golf Club in Palm Desert, known for taking rising stars under its wing, bestowed an honorary membership on Reiter and he makes good use of it.

Seeing a local news van pull up for the next interview, Reiter knows time is short but shares a few more insights. His inspiration, he says, is Rory McIlroy. "He's a different style golfer, always hitting a driver, bombing it. That's how I play," he adds with a

As for his ultimate foursome, his choices are surprising. "Ben Hogan, Jack Nicklaus and Arnold Palmer," he states with pride and admiration. "I'm old school."

ate January/early February is always an exciting time in the Coachella Valley. The Career Builder Challenge brings the PGA Tour to town, momentum is building for the upcoming BNP Paribas Open tennis tournament, and the ANA Inspiration, golfs first major, is just around the corner.

There's also Pete Carlson's Golf & Tennis Expo, the festival of golf, which takes place annually at the College of the Desert (COD) in Palm Desert, California.

A staple of the Coachella Valley sporting scene for 15 years, the expo is scheduled to take place this year Feb. 9-10 at the COD driving range, located at Fred Waring and San Pablo. Once again this year, as in every year previous, admission to the show is free. Barney Adams, creator of Adams Golf, was the first to suggest the concept to Pete Carlson, who has not only employed the concept, he's

The show will operate from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day, and free parking is available on campus. Signage and attendants will direct patrons to the closest available parking, and shuttles from the parking lot to the driving range will be available.

Nearly 40 major manufacturers will be on hand, providing products ranging from the hottest new driver to the latest distancemeasuring devices. There will be club fittings, mini lessons and fullshot opportunities. Joey O, trick shot artist, will do two shows each day, and desert resident Al "Mr. 59" Geiberger and his boys are also scheduled to conduct a short-game clinic each day. Specials will be available to tempt customers in the checkout lines.

"After the holidays are over, we start thinking about the Expo and getting ready for it," Carlson says. "It's exciting to get to continue to do it. We're excited, the vendors are excited and the public is excited. People know they can see, feel, hit and purchase all the new stuffall in the same place."


Fitness trainers, nutritional representatives and a wide array of food and beverages will also be available, with food and beverage proceeds benefiting COD golf programs. Over 4,000 attendees made last year's festival, and the organizers are ready for an even bigger turnout this year.

The entire shindig is a spinoff of the retail store, Pete Carlson's Golf and Tennis, a 14,000-square-foot facility located at 73-741 Highway 111 in Palm Desert, long known in the desert as a onestop shop for the valley's country-club sports. Along with the Golf Expo, the store is also the home of the Jazz for Jazz Lovers concert

There have been years, including last year, when the event coincides with Super Bowl weekend. But this year, football will be in the rear view mirror, the CareerBuilder Challenge will have left its residual golf pixie dust in the valley, the ANA Inspiration will be straight ahead, and it will well and truly be the peak of the golf

essica and Nelly Korda are tall, athletic, sporty and ready for fun and play—especially golf. They're sisters, competitors and best friends. Jess, who turns 25 this year, has been going full force on the LPGA Tour since 2011 when she was just 17. She has four LPGA victories to date.

In 2017, Nelly, who will be 20 in July, graduated from the Symetra Tour. Her rookie year on the LPGA Tour was one to remember. She made it into the Evian Championship, but it was her Asian swing that became the highlight of the year. "Asia clicked after a poor midseason," she says. "I stayed patient, got a top 10 and then, happily, was on a roll."

Her best rookie LPGA memory is "seeing all the kids out at tournaments, little girls seeing us and wanting to play and join us."

The sisters come from a close-knit family. Their grandparents went along for Nelly's Evian debut, giving the group time to enjoy Prague's buzz and summer lifestyle. Jess was recovering from a forearm injury that forced her to abandon the 2017 British Open and U.S. Solheim Cup team, but she calls Prague "perfect for her rehab."

Also perfect is having her sister on tour. "Having Nelly on tour is super. We travel and room together. She's getting into tour life really well."

Nelly likes the closeness, too. "My sister is my most valuable role model," she says.

Though the sisters grew up in Florida, their Czech family roots are strong. Their tennis-legend father, Petr, was the 1998 Australian Open Champion. He caddied for both daughters in their amateur careers, and occasionally for Nelly on the Symetra Tour.

Nelly says her most memorable time with her Dad on her bag was qualifying for, "My first U.S. Open in 2013 at age 14, my first Major. I made the cut, too."

Jess remembers, "Some amazing amateur highs with Dad, winning at SALLY was awesome, then Dad helping me get my LPGA

card was super special. All the effort, the hours put into helping me achieve my dream—I'll always remember."

Both women say they received good advice from their Dad, but agree his best has been, "Stay in the moment, don't think ahead. It's key to any sport."

While 2017 was a seminal year for Nelly it was a difficult one for Jess with the injuries. "Team events aren't for selfish people," she says. "I had to withdraw for the team. But finishing with some good golffinally was fun. I love being in the hunt; that's why I play and practice."

Jaw surgery in December has helped eliminate her headaches, yet Jess' return to the Tour isn't clear. "I must be 100 percent ready," she notes. "Our season is too long."

Growing up, Jess tried lots of sports, including figure skating and gymnastics. "But I was too tall, so I tried golf and loved it. I still have lots more dreams, goals I want to accomplish on Tour," she promises.

Both sisters work with coach David Wheeler, and both have a few superstitions. Jessica always puts her right foot first onto the tee; she uses the same marker and wears the same jewelry. "No change once I've teed it up," she claims.

Nelly starts every tournament with three tees in her hair.

For chill time, Jessica enjoys the beach and reading. At Christmas, Nelly is Mom's "Santa's Helper" with the baking and preparations.

Jess is sponsored by Adidas, but her other shoe passion is Stuart Weitzman. Bags? Chanel, of course, with her wins.

Jessica and Nelly Korda are making a statement on the LPGA Tour. They have great swings, superb shot-making, they're fun and exciting. They've got game.

s it a charity golf tournament with a celebrity jam and soiree? Or is it a charity celebrity jam with a soiree and golf tournament? One could be excused for not knowing the difference when it comes to the weeklong charitable hullaballoo that is the Warburton Celebrity Golf

Since its inception in 201 l, the tournament—or celebrity jam or soiree or all three—has raised over \$7 million for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. Spearheaded by actor Patrick Warburton, known primarily for his TV roles on Seinfield and Rules of Engagement, "The Warburton" has become a staple of the season in the desert each year. Event planners anticipate adding significantly to that \$7 million total when the 2018 event is conducted March 1-4 in the Coachella Valley.

Originally a benefit tournament with a musical sideshow, today's tournament has evolved into a nearly a week of entertainment on and off the golf course. This year's event reprises all the elements that proved so successful in 2017. It begins on Thursday, March 1, with The Story Behind the Story: Songwriters Night.

Songwriters Night features a group of renowned Nashville songwriters performing their biggest hits while spinning vignettes about the circumstances that led to the creation of each tune. At press time, the participants in this year's Songwriters Night had not yet been announced, but the 2017 event spotlighted the likes of Tim Nichols, David Lee Murphy, Kelley Lovelace and Derric Rutan. Registration starts at 5:30 p.m. and the show begins at 7 p.m. at the JW Marriott Desert Springs Resort & Spa in Palm Desert.

On March 2, gear heads and speed freaks can get their thing on during The Rush, scheduled for 12 - 4 p.m. at the BMW Performance Driving Center at the Thermal Club. A day at the races will be followed by a night at the pairings party, which commences at 5:30 p.m. at the JW Marriott.

Things really kick into gear Friday night after the pairings party, when the Rheneypalooza Jam plays into the night. Once a loosely organized jam session with a few pals, the informal event has become so successful, organizers believe it's one of the key factors that keep the golfers—and donations—rolling in year after year.

The list of jammers for 2018 is still being formulated; however, Jeff "Skunk" Baxter (Steely Dan, The Doobie Brothers), Michael Bolton, Dave Brock (Wild Child), Felix Cavaliere (The Young Rascals), Alice Cooper, Kevin Cronin (REO Speedwagon), Micky Dolenz (The Monkees), Clare Dunn, Robby Krieger (The Doors), Huey Lewis, Robin Meade, Mike Mills (R.E.M.), Danny Seraphine (Chicago), Tommy Thayer (KISS), and Mickey Thomas (Starship) were among those highlighting last year's event. This year's Jam begins at 7:45 p.m. at the JW.

There's actual golf to be played beginning on Saturday with the first round of the tournament. The second round will be held Sunday, with tee times beginning at a very civilized 10 a.m., allowing Rheneypalooza groupies plenty of recuperation time. The Saturday round will be played at the JW Marriott while golf action moves to the Classic Club on Sunday. Both courses are in Palm Desert.

How much would you donate now? Well, that's not all. After Saturday's first round, the tournament's "Saturday Soiree" at kicks off at 5:30 p.m. at the JW with a red carpet and cocktail party. Cocktails will be followed by dinner and both silent and live auctions. Post-dinner entertainment by Sixwire, a band often featured on the television show Nashville, begins at 9:30 p.m. The entire shindig wraps up after the final round on Sunday with an awards party for all golfers.

here are many reasons to join a private golf club. If you're actually considering one, let's break down what that really means. Private. Golf. Club. If your No. 1 reason to consider membership at a private golf club is to be a part of a special place where golf is everything, there's a club in La Quinta that shares your priorities. Pull into the parking lot and it's immediately evident that The Quarry at La Quinta is just such a place.

The signs are clear. The cart staging area and pro shop are mere steps from the parking lot. The expansive, multilevel, double-ended driving range and practice facility are just beyond. The locker rooms and dining area are adjacent, complete with an outdoor dining area overlooking the grounds. There is a spa, but its primary goal is to treat sore golfers. Unlike many other private clubs in the area, The Quarry's members are not required to purchase any of the limited real estate offerings within the club gates. And there are cottages for use by members and their guests, situated just across the street from the clubhouse.

Adjacent to the cottages is an 18-hole putting course with similar slopes, angles and speed one might encounter on the club's par-72, Tom Fazio-designed course that stretches to 7,083 yards. Next to the putting course and on elevated ground "above" the clubhouse lies perhaps The Quarry's biggest ace in the hole—a 10-hole short course, also designed by Fazio and opened in 2005, with holes ranging from 117-218 yards from the back tees. Each hole is designed with the intention of providing a practice course where all holes would easily blend into any Fazio championship layout, complete with ponds, creeks, Fazio's extravagant bunker complexes and pacy, undulating greens. There's also tennis court, just one, in case members need a temporary distraction from golf.

All of this is tucked away in a back corner of La Quinta that one doesn't just happen to pass through, surrounded by history and the Santa Rosa Mountains. Private? Check. Golf? Check. Club? Check.



"We're the ultimate golf experience," says Mark Scheibach, general manager at The Quarry. "We obviously have a worldclass golf course, putting course, short course and clubhouse, with all the social graces necessary. But what really sets us apart is the experience. The service levels are so high, the amenities so complete. The member experience and the casual nature of the club are what makes us special."

Scheibach is a big part of the club's personality. While the facilities are first class in every way, the atmosphere at The Quarry is far from stuffy. In fact, members seem to interact as one big family, always checking on the rest of the family but quick with the needle at all times.

"There's two different kinds of people that will join The Quarry," Scheibach says. "The kind of person who's a true golf enthusiast, who likes the finest things in golf. And the type of person who appreciates the type of membership we have here. The members here are so special, the camaraderie we have with the members and all the different games we have with the ball tosses, it gives people a lot of options. It's a special membership full of a lot of special people."

The potential for some of the desert's largest and more populous clubs to have a tee-time backlog resulting in five-hour rounds is a big part of the reason The Quarry came to be, first opening its doors



in 1994. The club insists on keeping its member rolls at a lower level compared to many other valley clubs. The exclusive membership allows The Quarry to operate without tee times, and the typically sparse number of players on the course at any one time helps to ramp up the pace of play. Five days a week, there is some sort of member-organized game, which also promotes interaction and the feeling of "family" among the members.

At a club where golf is numero uno, it's Fazio's championship layout that's the biggest draw. Holes are routed through three distinct areas of what was formerly a working quarry that produced raw

materials for the Coachella Valley's development. There are seven holes that unfold along the quarry floor, while four holes sit atop a plateau, offering sweeping

"It's visually stunning," Scheibach adds. "You can play the golf course every day and never get sick of playing it. The number of different tees, the big size of the greens and the pin placements, the Fazio design—it's just amazing. Every day it's something different."



The LPGA kicks off the 2018 Majors with the ANA Inspiration at Mission Hills Country Club, March 29-April 1. The Mission Hills Country Club Tournament Course showcases four of the Coachella Valley's best par-3 holes, which will surely make a difference in the outcome of this year's tournament. Lets take a look at these holes that the world's best women golfers will be facing.

Hole 5. 182 Yards

Visually this is a beautiful par 3 with the majestic San Jacinto Mountain looming in the background. The green is guarded by water at the front, left and long as the green sits out on a peninsula. The most challenging aspect of this hole is traditionally the wind. Most often the wind comes directly into a player's face, which makes club selection difficult. The golfer's ability to control the trajectory of the ball into the wind is vital to clearing the water in front of the green and keeping the ball from rolling over the green into the water. The sides of the green are shaved down so any ball that just misses the putting surface is doomed to roll into the water.

Pro's Tip

On this hole, I prefer to aim the ball at the front right bunker and play for a right-to-left draw, working the ball into the middle of the green. This shape of shot will help the ball penetrate through the wind. Working the ball off the right bunker into the middle of the green helps utilize the ridge in the middle of the green to help land the ball softly on the putting surface.




Hole 8. 169 Yards

This challenging par 3 has three shelves on the green going from the lowest shelf on the front right corner, to a higher middle shelf that is a smaller section in the middle of the green, to the highest shelf that is in the back left corner. The priority of the tee shot is to position your ball on to the same shelf on which the hole is located. Not being on the same shelf will leave a challenging putt.

Pro's Tip

The location of the hole dictates the type of shot necessary here. I prefer to use the front left bunker as my aiming point and then work the ball according to the specific location of the hole. If it's at the back left corner of the green, I execute a straight ball flight. If it's located on the middle shelf or front right corner shelf, it's necessary to execute a slight fade into those locations.



Hole 14, 148 Yards

Looking down on the 14th green from the tee, this par 3 is the shortest of the four but could be the most dangerous. The front right water hazard stares in the face of golfers, but the real dangers are the bunkers hiding on the left side of the green. It's very common for golfers to avoid the water and over compensate, thus ending up in the bunkers, which leads to an extremely difficult sand shot hitting toward the water. The small putting surface is divided with a subtle ridge that runs from left to right through the middle of the green. A front-hole location is the easiest for golfers to attack, utilizing the ridge behind the hole to backspin the ball and get the ball close to the hole.

Pro Tip

I prefer to use the right edge of the left bunkers as an aiming point on this tee shot and execute a little fade into the hole location. With the hole in the front of the green, my little fade can use the ridge behind the hole as a backstop. When the hole location is in the back of the green, I take a club extra to create a flatter trajectory with that same fade ball flight.



Hole 17, 179 Yards

The final par 3 has been the hole in many past events that has played a pivotal role in the outcome of this Major. This par 3 has two deep bunkers that guard the front of the green, front right and front left. The putting surface has a large bowl in the front section, while the back section features a ridge that divides it in half. Again, positioning your ball in the same section of the green as the hole is critical. If your ball is not in that same section, a challenging putt remains, especially if the hole is located in the front bowl and your ball is in the middle of the green. That will require putting the ball down a steep ridge while trying to prevent it from rolling off the green.

Pro Tip

This tee shot is very difficult and whatever the golfer can do to get the ball onto the putting surface is key. I like to aim for the bowl in the front section and execute a straight ball flight into the heart of the green.







olfers and tennis players looking to balance out their bodies and gain a greater range of motion truly appreciate the first warm-up posture following the breathing exercise in Bikram yoga. Every posture in the Bikram series has its own benefits individually, but the combination of the entire practice, 26 poses (asanas) with two breathing exercises, gives the greatest therapeutic and functional result.

The postures are in a strategic order with the standing series getting practitioners ready for the floor series. The floor series, which includes the spine-strengthening sequence, structures each posture to prepare for the next. None could be accomplished as well without the extreme four-way stretch that the initial warm-up posture provides, starting with simultaneous side stretching, namely Half Moon Pose or as they say in Sanskrit, Pada Hastasana.

Once again the mirror is a powerful tool that allows the student to focus on correct form to maximize therapeutic benefits.

The Warm-up: Pada Hastasana

Following 10 minutes of pranayama breathing, which was covered in the last article (DEC/JAN), is a series of warm-up postures starting with bending the body in all four directions. The four asanas are combined together in what is referred to as Half Moon Pose, with Backward Bending and Hands-to-Feet Pose. The focus of this article is solely Half Moon Pose.

This initial movement is comprised of a side bend that forms the body into the shape of a half moon. The student starts in a solid foundation with feet together, heels and toes touching. Arms are raised above the head and hands are in an interlaced grip with thumbs crossed and index fingers pointing up to the ceiling like a church steeple, with wrists tightly pressed together. The arms are "glued" to the head against the ears, thus becoming an extension of the spine.

Students are instructed to always lengthen the spine by creating space between the vertebrae before going into this posture. They are then instructed to begin to bend their upper body toward the right side of the room while simultaneously pushing their hips off center of their ankles toward the left side of the room. The key is to not collapse into the side body but rather arc the body as if you are lifting yourself up and over a gigantic beach ball stuck to your side. Breath is important as it guides one slowly up and over with proper alignment. Unlike the breathing technique used in pranayama, in through the nose, out through the mouth, the breathing method for the rest of the asana is in through the nose and out through the nose with the mouth sealed shut.

With every exhale, one must move gradually deeper into the crescent moon shape toward an appropriate depth without distortion—no twisting or turning—then hold static. This posture is one full minute in length from the start of the movement until students reach their personal full expression. How deep that final expression is varies according to body type, flexibility and experience. Regardless, depth is not as important as form.

Often a Bikram teacher will instruct students to imagine gliding in between two panes of glass—one in front of them and one behind them—to give them a visual of moving in a straight line as many beginners find themselves twisted in this posture.

There was a famous picture of Andy Murray circulating back in 2013, shortly after he won Wimbledon. He was photographed on the tennis court in Half Moon Pose. The Iron You website featured an article that included the picture, "Andy Murray, A Bikram Yoga Enthusiast," and noted the imbalance of tennis players' bodies causing a dominant side. Half Moon Pose definitely helps to counter this imbalance.

Murray became such a Bikram yoga enthusiast that there were several pictures of him rocking a yoga posture while on the tennis court back then.

This pure lateral flexion of the spine strengthens the abdomen along with other core muscle groups. Additionally, Half Moon Pose increases flexibility of the entire length of the spine and flexes and strengthens shoulders and upper back muscles.

Sophie Scott, osteopath of the Lawn Tennis Association, the national governing body of tennis in Great Britain, told the BBC, "Bikram yoga has been extremely beneficial to our players. It provides a warm environment to engage in a routine of exercises that help flexibility, mobility, control and coordination—all key elements for a tennis player."

This posture looks easy but holding a static position with your arms over your head for 60 seconds and alternating sides for a total of two minutes, in a heated room to boot, proves to be quite


Visibly, students notice a firming and trimming of their waistline, butt and thighs, but the internal benefits, such as facilitating proper kidney function, are at the heart of the Bikram Yoga asanas. It doesn't matter how you look on the outside if your body systems are failing systemically.

Todd Pence, a student at Bikram Yoga El Paseo in Palm Desert and PGA professional at The Fairways Golf Course in Cheney, Washington, states, "When I do Half Moon Pose, I get an extreme stretch in my upper lats. It also helps to lengthen the sides of my body, allowing me to make a bigger turn and increase the width in my backswing."

Once students have completed the right side, they come back to center, re-engage their biceps against their ears, gluing their arms to their head and their wrists together. They take a deep breath and slowly repeat the asana on their left side in the same manner and for the same duration as on the right. They then come back to center and once again re-engage before moving into the next two parts of the initial warm-up, Backward Bending and Hands-to-Feet Pose, which we'll cover in the next issue.

ew homes are the big winners. We're seeing a boom in new-home sales inside and outside of country clubs, and in all price ranges. The new homes are light, bright and contemporary inside with vanishing walls of glass that take advantage of stunning views. Andalusia features an 18-hole Reese Jones championship golf course, and there are plans to add a second course.

Toscana County Club in Indian Wells has also had a banner year with 38 homes sold. The club recently opened new updated models with pocket doors, contemporary flooring and lighter finishes. Toscana offers two Jack Nicklaus Signature courses, a fitness center, topnotch tennis and an amazing clubhouse. A recently opened addition to the clubhouse and spa area includes al fresco dining. There's a large pool and in addition to tennis there's

pickleball. Toscana is offering a young executive membership program to attract the next generation of members.

Madison Club in La Quinta, which provides the best of the best, has also seen a banner year. The average sales price of homes sold was \$7.8 million, and the price of 23 vacant lots ranged from \$800,000 to \$2.5 million. That's impressive considering there are just 275 home sites here. The club's motto is 'If you can dream it, we can provide it.' Madison club offers the finest of everything, including a stellar Tom Fazio golf course.

Old Palm Springs continues to be a hot market in terms of midcentury home sales as well as new-built homes that are modeled in the mid-century style. Recent city ordinances restricting short-term rentals have caused some push back in the market for investors. Although prices were up 10 percent, sales were down 15 percent over 2016. In the past year, 174 homes priced over \$1 million have sold.

Established high-end clubs have seen a building boom. Many of the custom estates are spec homes that will give buyers another option. The Hideaway in La Quinta, for example, has 14 homes under construction.

One of the most exciting happenings in 2017 was the grand opening of the new \$70 million Big Horn Country Club clubhouse. Saying it is completely over the top is an under statement. It's the


first of its kind in the Coachella Valley and positioned to attract new members. It seems to be working. There were 21 home sales over the past year ranging from \$1.4 million to \$9.8 million.



SPAGO

For the second year, Chef Wolfgang Puck's Spago returns to Indian Wells Tennis Garden, bringing along world-class dining with the best in California cuisine for the duration of the tournament. The name Wolfgang Puck, renowned restaurateur and James Beard Lifetime Achievement Award winner, has become synonymous with an innovative style of cooking that once redefined fine dining. PIERO'S PIZZAVINO



Who says you can't have it all? Not Audi's SQ5



Audi designers embarked on a journey to give drivers everything they want in a car with the new SQ5 crossover. The Q5 platform is selling well for Audi, but execs aren't resting on their sales figures. The redesigned SQ5 improves like only a German-engineered auto can.

A methodical approach to making everything better on the SQ5 has resulted in exactly that. The new SQ5 imagines a driver that wants a vehicle to do it all, and the SQ5 comes very close we're still waiting on our breakfast order but maybe that will arrive with next year's model. Speed, handling, tech and styling all deliver in a package that pleases.

To take full advantage of everything in the SQ5, you must choose a loaded model. Take our advice and don't skimp on features. You'll get suspension features, steering and speed that make every extra worth its weight in enjoyment.







The new engine, a 3.0-liter V-6, delivers 354 horsepower. This is the same as the previous model but the new engine is turbocharged, giving a nice long toque band from lower ends of the rev range. The Quattro all-wheel-drive can deliver up to 100 percent of the power to just one wheel if needed, so the car is continually putting the power where you want it.

The combination of features that you can set, adjust and control makes for a completely customized feel. Dial in one of either: Auto, Comfort, Dynamic, Individual, All-road or Off-road to find the suspension feel and handling you want. In Dynamic mode, the engine note turns from a hum to a growl. The power shifts to work the corners aggressively and get the SQ5 in front of the pack.

The adjustable air suspension option makes the SQ5 ride lower (seven inches) on the road for better handling. Drivers can vary ride heights using the Off-road mode to raise the height to nine inches of ground clearance for days when the scenic route is calling you. There's also a loading-height feature, activated by a button in the cargo area, which lowers the SQ5 to five inches, making loading your groceries that much easier.

Audi has a very competitive market for the SQ5 with Porsche, Jaguar and Alfa Romeo all clamoring for attention with their luxury crossovers. The body design of the new SQ5 walks a delicate balance between understated and eager. Bodylines running along the front shoulders of the hood present a hint of aggressiveness. The spoiler and five-spoke tires allude to a mean streak. The four-ringed grill is classic Audi, giving a stability and consistency that brings assurance.

Even the performance numbers seem under-reported. In Dynamic mode, most road testers swear the 0-60 mph, reported at 5.1 seconds, must be lower. Perhaps Audi is under promising and over delivering?



There's nothing missing from the interior. The leather-wrapped shifter and steering wheel are perfect. A touchpad and an infotainment control center give drivers features that make toggling

between navigation, entertainment and communication simple. Drivers can use voice recognition to speak their commands to the computer or write their selection on the touchpad. Everything is at your fingertips.

Audi has long been an innovator in driver-assisted technology. In recent years, it has cleared nearly every hurdle to autonomous driving. The features on the SQ5 make safety second nature. It seems a virtual lock that Audi will have a fully autonomous car soon. In fact, in road tests last year, the SQ5 drove across the U.S., 99percent computer-aided.

The Q5 platform takes a step forward in the 2018 SQ5. Drivers get a car that does everything but doesn't look like it's trying to brag about being the best on the block. Yet there's no doubt in anyone's mind that the SQ5 contends for top prize in the

At around \$65,000 fully loaded, the SQ5 punches above its weight. This is a luxury car. The performance numbers don't lie. Audi has quietly built a better crossover to deliver exactly what its owners want—a car that can do it all.



Fabric flower appliques, arranged into a mini floral bouquet, accent the vamp, and the lining and sole are constructed of pure leather. Lily of the Valley sells for \$865.

Also part of the Aquazzura Spring 2018 Preview, the Harlow Pearlescent Satin Pump has a 5.5-inch covered stiletto heel with platform, knotted strap bands, cutout heel, open toe and a d'Orsay silhouette. The satin cherry print, with leafy green vines and blooming white cherry blossoms, is accented with double rows of star studs and a trim of glossy pearls underneath the foot bed, against a background of pale pink. The leather sole includes Aquazzura's trademark gold-dipped metal pineapple logo, and the padded leather insole displays the "Aquazzura Firenze" brand stamped in gold. Harlow is available for \$950.

Selections from the Aquazzura 2018 Resort Collection make packing for a trip an exhilarating experience. The Goddess Sandal is an ideal inclusion for any travel itinerary, crafted in Italy from silky satin with a series of intricately braided straps along the sides and center. The stiletto heel features an alluring open-toe, elegant straps that hug the foot and a back zipper for ease of dress. The style looks smashing with a cocktail dress, rolled denim or pleated shorts, and the best part is that they are available in a bright, vibrant azalea pink as well as in soft and gentle powder pink. Pick up one – or two – pair for \$950 each.

Osario has said of his upcoming collections, "After being in India, I wanted to start the collection there. You see the colors, the embroidery, the fabrics, the idea of embellishments. There are a lot of embroideries inspired by the saris."

The inspiration is evident in the Aquazzura Sunflower Studded Mule Slide, also from the 2018 Resort Collection. The flat mule slide is made from azalea pink silk moiré, with nine sweet little sunflowers with studded gold-tone centers adorning the upper. The metallic flat heel and pointed toe are flattering to the leg and comfortable for long wear. The Sunflower Slide may be purchased for \$695.



RENÉ CAOVILLA

Well known for his opulent, elegantly detailed shoes, Italian designer René Caovilla has worked with some of the world's most prestigious haute-couture houses, including Valentino, Christian Dior and Chanel. Taking over the family business from his father in the 1960s, his own René Caovilla collection features sculptural shoes that are considered wearable works of art. In 2000, he began creating his famous jeweled shoes, many of them encrusted with precious gems. As almost coveted pieces of precious jewelry, Caovilla designs have often been displayed by glitterati such as Kate Beckinsale, Robin Wright, Jennifer Aniston, Gigi and Bella Hadid, Jessica Chastain and Adriana Lima.

Caovilla's Resort 2018 Collection doesn't disappoint, with a range of materials and heel heights for any scenario. The René Caovilla Embellished Printed Fabric Slingback Pump is a lively design in painterly printed fabric with splashes of pink, peach, yellow, blue, green and purple along with a soft pink leather insole. The René Caovilla Multi-Embellished Sandal, also from the Resort 2018 Collection, will definitely make you the center of attention, so be prepared. The delicate calf leather sandal is crafted with a column of crystal embellishments in colors such as bright pink, fiery orange, sapphire blue, vibrant teal and lemony yellow, varying in shape and size as they climb the foot and ankle. The 4.1-inch stiletto heel slenderizes the leg and features an open toe with thin strappy bands, an adjustable ankle strap, soft pink leather lining the insole and the signature glittered outsole and inner heel spike. These are available for \$1,095.

Perfect for knocking about the farmer's market or an al fresco lunch, the René Caovilla Flower-Tie Flat Thong Sandal is a sweet, casual style with flirty flower motifs, making it appear as though a delicate green vine traces the ankle with pretty white and yellow flower accents. The flat-thong sandal is a timeless expression. It's easy to see why it's included in the Resort 2018 Collection, with a T-strap along the vamp, a self-tie ankle wrap and tiny covered heel with golden trim. Lined in leather, the signature glittered outsole has a bright

white heel insert. This sandal retails for \$795, exclusively at Neiman Marcus.

Your toes won't be in the sand the whole time, so these shoe styles will set you up in style for whatever your social calendar has in store. Plus, you can always wear stilettos in a hammock.

Galstyan says, "I have a huge passion, sometimes obsession, with diamonds and gems, and I love to design my own styles. It is really fascinating to see the process through from start to finish." Galstyan sources his jewels from all over the globe, and each piece is manufactured in the United States or Europe. He is also a bench jeweler with a degree from the Revere Academy of Jewelry Arts in San Francisco.

Frizzante has been able to maintain and grow its clientele from the previous business, particularly through those customers who had developed a solid relationship with Galstyan. The store's reception has been extremely positive, especially since Frizzante now offers repairs, custom design and appraisals. Galstyan has a signed agreement with all of his vendors certifying that all sourced diamonds and gems are conflict free.

One of Frizzante's most spectacular showcase pieces, perfect for spring, is the Violet Tanzanite Cocktail Ring, which features one large GIA-certified tanzanite (9.20 tcw.) surrounded by petite, round white diamonds (1.54 tcw.) set in 18K gold. Measuring approximately half an inch in diameter, this rare blue-violet-hued stunner sells for \$13,650.

Designed by Galstyan himself and displayed in Frizzante's store collection is the **Double** Amethyst Ring. A dramatic piece appropriate for a special occasion or simply as a signature expression by the wearer, this original creation features two dome-shaped purple amethyst stones (20 tcw.) positioned side-by-side, set in shiny 18K rose gold. The ring band twists whimsically, creating elegance and grace with mini white diamonds (1.0 tcw.) set into the band to gently surround the finger. The price tag for this exclusive Frizzante design is \$4,250.

Frizzante's pièce de resistance is a unique Yellow Diamond Cocktail Ring, a true sparkler as the store's name suggests. The GIA-certified stone, measuring approximately half an inch in diameter, is fancy yellow and internally flawless (6.06 tcw.) with two white diamonds (1.22 tcw.) framing the square center stone on either side. This eye-catching beauty retails for \$11,000.

Frizzante Fine Jewelers

The sparkling and spectacular new addition to El Paseo

rizzante Fine Jewelers may be the new kid on the El Paseo block, but by no means is it the novice. Owner Greg Galstyan, GIA GG accredited jewelry professional, has been around jewels and gems his entire life, having started in the jewelry business cleaning floors and making coffee for his late father, Gerry Galstyan, who had a jewelry manufacturing company in Los Angeles. The younger Galstyan was heavily involved in the manufacturing and high-end retail parts of the business, and he graduated as a gemologist from the Gemological Institute of America (GIA) in 2004.

Taking over the space previously occupied by Roberto Coin, where Galstyan served as part of the team, Frizzante officially opened its doors in November. Frizzante, which means sparkling in Italian, features well-known luxury brands as well as its own creations. Timepiece lines include Arnold & Son, which was established in 1764 and produces fewer than 1,000 pieces a year, and Ernst Benz, sports watchmaker, with unique varieties of dial and strap designs.





The Arnold & Son Nebula Watch is an example of timekeeping at its best. Set in an 18K rose-gold case measuring 42 mm with a crystal display back, the three-dimensional, openwork movement and dial offer views into the very heart of the in-house manufactured calibre. Two mainspring barrels provide a healthy 90-hour power reserve, achieving near mirror symmetry with the small seconds display and dial-side balance. Nebula, Latin for cloud, displays its allure through meticulously calculated proportions and ratios of diameter versus height and the size and placement of every gear and wheel. The Nebula "dial" actually acts as a bridge in supporting the intricate gearing. The strap features hand-stitched brown or black alligator leather. Nebula is available at Frizzante for \$27,400.

Another showcase timepiece at the store is the **Arnold &** Son HM Perpetual Moon Elegant Watch, part of the Royal Collection, which pays tribute to watches produced for King George III and members of the royal court. This piece includes rich guilloché dials and a three-dimensional big moon set in a 42 mm, 18K red-gold case. The 27-jewel calibre offers one of the most accurate moon phases on the market, with only one day's deviation every 122 years. The Elegant model is created with a blue guilloché dial in a stylized sunray pattern, blue guilloché moon disc with golden stars and the hand-engraved moon, accented with a hand-stitched alligator strap. The watch retails for \$29,950.

Also available at Frizzante is the Ernst Benz Traditional ChronoLunar Watch, a spectacular 47 mm creation set in polished stainless steel and exhibition back with sapphire glass. The watch's crown is knurled and double-O ring sealed. The watch dial is distinguished with a domed sapphire glass crystal that includes an anti-reflective treatment on the lower side. The unique dial features a rich black background with green, luminous numerals. Water resistant up to 165 feet, the ChronoLunar is finished with a handmade classic alligator strap and sells for \$7,225.

Galstyan says, "Since opening the store, many clients have already asked me to redesign their own jewelry. One of my favorite things is to buy colored gemstones and then, with very little idea in my head as to what I'm about to create, to put the stones on my desk and let the gems design themselves. I believe that gems, diamonds and jewelry talk to me, and I have an incredible telepathic connection with them!"

Galstyan encourages wearers to determine their own individual style. He says, "There is no right or wrong for jewelry. You can wear as much or as a little you would like, and if it is quality, it speaks for itself. Classic jewelry never goes out of style. A diamond ring, diamond studs, diamond necklace or diamond bracelet will always be sought after. Life is short. Buy and wear whatever you want."
