ven now that he's 77, one can still look at Lee Trevino and say, without reservation, "Well played, Mr. Trevino. Well played." The six-time Major winner, PGA Tour icon, and legendary talker still doesn't allow golf shots to interrupt his conversations. But these days, instead of wearing out Jack Nicklaus with relentless discussion and rubber snakes, Trevino splits his time between The Greenbrier in White Sulphur Springs, West Virginia, and Bighorn Golf Club in Palm Desert, California, properties that are now the primary beneficiaries of his personal draw and entertainment value.

Trevino recently took up an ambassador position at The Greenbrier at the urging of owner Jim Justice, current governor of West Virginia. Trevino is the man when it comes to promoting the property and meeting and greeting on the golf course. He says it keeps him busy through the summer months and is the perfect job for him.

One of his immediate tasks was to help the course and property overcome the massive floods that resulted in cancellation of the Greenbrier's 2016 PGA Tour event. "As you well know, we were devastated by a 1,000-year flood [at The Greenbrier], so we put it all back together and we got the tournament off this year. The players just absolutely raved about the conditions and what we did to the golf course," Trevino says.

"I just kind of meet and greet and play a little golf and give a few lessons here and there. It gives me something to do. Besides that, I get out of that [desert] heat. [At the Greenbrier], we're in the mountains, about 1,700 feet above sea level, and it's a little bit cooler. Our average temperature around here is high 70s, low 80s. We've got the best of it right now, the best of it."

Good move, sir.



Come fall and winter, Trevino and his wife, Claudia, transition to the Coachella Valley where he's a prominent member at Bighorn. It's a lifestyle anyone would love to live, yet it somehow seems tailor-made for the Merry Mex.

At Bighorn, Trevino can often be found playing with friends in the morning and Claudia in the afternoon. This year, he's particularly excited to return to his desert home to take advantage of Bighorn's new clubhouse, which is shaping up to be among the most spectacular core facilities of any club in the valley, perhaps the entirety of Southern California.





"I hang my hat at Bighorn, as you well know," he says. "Two years ago, we tore the clubhouse down, and [Bighorn cofounder] R.D. Hubbard said the new one would be open the 7th of November 2017, so I will be back out there probably about the 5th of November. We'll have a big, big party on the 7th, and we have our proam a lot of the senior players come in and we'll have about 24 foursomes. We play a two-day pro-am and we have a lot of fun. And then the season starts for us there at Bighorn. There's another great place to hang your hat, baby, I'll tell you that. It doesn't get any better than Bighorn."

Trevino points to the many reasons why. "We have 36 holes, we're just fixing to open the new \$55 million clubhouse, we've got two driving ranges, another small clubhouse down in the canyons we have a lot of buddies that we play with every morning, maybe a couple of dozen guys, and they play a little gin in the afternoon. Then I golf with my wife in the afternoon. So, man, it doesn't get any better than that."

He was at the club in the spring for a look at progress on the clubhouse. "It looked like they were already working on the inside. So, it looked pretty good," he says. "It will be finished. Believe me, it will be finished."

The opening of the clubhouse and the Trevinos timely return to the desert almost seems an end to the Trevino means. The desert has a special place in his heart, and he seemed to know from the start that his future was inevitably linked to it. Everything he's done—all the accomplishments, all the failures, all the personal highs and lows—have led to this point where idyllic summers are spent hobnobbing with well-heeled fun-seekers in West Virginia, and gentle winters are passed at one of the Coachella Valley's great golf cathedrals.

"My first Hope tournament was back in 1968. I think that was the first one that I played in," he says. "I used to own a place at Indian Wells, a little three-bedroom condo. We sold that and moved to Florida. But we've always come back to the desert. I've got a lot of friends there, and if you love to play golf, who doesn't want to come to Palm Springs, Palm Desert, La Quinta? I mean, we got 120 golf courses, man."

It is, he points out, a paradise. "The climate is just absolutely fabulous, you know? We enjoy it. The golf course is always in immaculate condition. And you know, everyone plays in the morning, and in the afternoon if you want to go play, it's wide open. So that's another plus in my opinion. We sometimes play 36 holes a day."

Yet again, well played, sir.



Competition is fierce among 100 luxury country clubs in California's Coachella Valley. But 10 singular venues have earned a reputation as being the very best, consistently exceeding even private-club expectations.



The Quarry Country Club


A beautiful and serene golfer's haven, this rock-solid club was actually built in an old sand quarry. Coachella Valley's only Golf Digest Top 100-ranked course has remained so for the past 10 listings, continually a Top 5 best-conditioned course as well. "The members have a passion for golf, and maintaining the world-class conditions is of the upmost importance to the entire staff," says GM Mark Scheibach. Quarry's Short Course is a 10-hole Tom Fazio design that players say rivals any Par 3 course in the world, "including Augusta National and Pine Valley," notes Scheibach. "We continue to enhance the courses and overall facilities on an annual basis, as we intend to maintain our position as the premiere private-golf experience in the Coachella Valley." The Vintage Country Club

Prestigious without being pretentious, Vintage Club's CEO Steve Cenicola says his golf community is the epitome of luxury, worldclass service, amenities and privacy—home to some of the most influential business people and leaders in the world. He calls it a "real modern oasis in the desert" with magnificent views and a combination of timeless architecture and lush, green areas in the desert. Amid state-of-the-art security, members enjoy two impeccably manicured golf courses, an 85,000-square-foot, awardwinning clubhouse, fine dining, plus a market, wellness center and spa. The club offers 11 tennis courts, plus Pickleball and bocce ball, too. In 2016, it was named California's No. 1 club, No. 5 in America and also listed among "America's healthiest venues." The Reserve Club

A championship golf course and homes that blend subtly into surrounding mountains make The Reserve a natural wonder. It has



garnered numerous landscaping awards while also incorporating water conservation and desert preservation into the mix. Mandy Polione, membership and marketing director, says she was stunned into silence by the club's amazing native-desert landscape on her first visit. A one-mile stone entrance bridge transports members and guests into a virtual decompression zone centered around the Tuscan-style clubhouse, with activities such as Pilates and 26 miles **PlayWorthy PlayWorthy**





of walking trails. The 21-hole Tom Weiskopf and Jay Morrish course features three trophy holes designed for a pre-round warmup or practice for golf novices. "What sets us apart is our members," Polione says. "They're the nicest, warmest, most down-to-earth members you could possibly wish for. There are no cliques and new members immediately feel welcomed." The staff are part of the family, too—most have 10 to 15 years of experience in their roles at the club. Tradition Golf Club

A "Platinum Club of America" honoree for 2017-18, Tradition is first and foremost a golf club, says GM/COO Al Castro. "It's as if Arnold Palmer saw this raw piece of desert and mountains and envisioned what fairways, greens and rough would look like as they became one with the mountain." White Augusta sand in 95 bunkers, replaced every year, complements 150,000 flowers planted each fall. "As beautiful as the golf course and the setting are," Castro says, "the culture of the club's membership is even better: a closely knit group who cherish Tradition's 'small community' feel." Tradition's understated elegance and tasteful individuality are reflected in every custom home exterior, making it an idyllic community. The original Ranch House and additional club cottages became a getaway destination for Greta Garbo, Joan Crawford, Katherine Hepburn and Clark Gable, as well as U.S. Presidents John F. Kennedy and Dwight D. Eisenhower. (La Quinta, 760.564.8723, traditiongc.com)

Mission Hills Country Club

"We are a complete package of amenities," says John Conroy, director of membership and marketing, citing the club's "worldclass" three championship golf courses (Arnold Palmer, Pete Dye and beloved Dinah Shore Tournament layouts), 34 tennis courts and one of the biggest and best croquet facilities anywhere. He says the club also features diversity in its membership, along with the added benefits associated with ClubCorp's network of venues. "Best value in the desert and elsewhere, hands down," writes one member on Facebook. Mission Hills' recent clubhouse renovation has refreshed its ambiance and inspired members' praise. There's no off-season here, with activities available year-round. (Rancho Mirage, 760.324.9400, clubcorp.com/Clubs/Mission-Hills-Country-Club)

Bighorn Golf Club


Why remodel when you can rebuild? This season, Bighorn's new clubhouse, described as a 75,000-square-foot living room for its members, shows off its sleek, functional design and four luxury penthouses. The club's distinctive Arthur Hills and Tom Fazio championship courses have hosted legendary PGA battles, drawing the brightest PGA and LPGA stars. Bighorn's renowned parking garage/museum for classic cars, The Vault, is a coveted ultra-exclusive club-within-the-club. Amid all the sparkle, philanthropy remains a guiding force for Bighorn's leadership and members. (Palm Desert, 760.341.4653, bighorngolf.com)

Eldorado Country Club

Member-owned, invitation-only Eldorado celebrates 60 storied years in 2017. Tom Fazio carefully crafted the 18-hole golf course after demolishing the original layout that hosted the 1959 Ryder Cup, and it continues to be maintained in tip-top condition. The club lists U.S. presidents and other luminaries among its members, but celebrates every single individual on its roster. Despite the fact that exclusive and private are club keywords, members rave about a friendly, accommodating staff and the gorgeous cove setting at the base of the Santa Rosa Mountains. 
The Madison Club

Known for its PGA-popular Tom Fazio golf course, Madison also features what has been called the "five-pound round." Those who indulge freely in treats at abundant comfort stations could

conceivably pack on weight after 18 holes with kid delights and adult temptations such as Kobe beef sliders, beef jerky, decadent

adult beverages and jellybeans. The club's sophisticated setting features a stylish Mediterranean-style clubhouse and stunning sunset views. With a regional airport nearby, lucky members who own one of the five luxury clubhouse suites experience maximum convenience and style entertaining guests. Andalusia at Coral Mountain

Inspired by the spirit and architecture of southern Spain's Andalusia region, this private club has been uniquely created to elevate the pure enjoyment of desert living. A Rees Jonesdesigned spectacularly scenic 18-hole golf course is the centerpiece. "For beginners, it offers generous greens and arguably the widest fairways in the desert, and for elite players the course will challenge even the best from 7,521 yards," says head pro Lindsey Winch. Meticulous attention to the tennis courts, fitness center, swimming pool and gourmet dining are enhanced by gracious personal service. "Andalusia offers a style of living that's as refined as it is fun and friendly. While we're one of the valley's premier private clubs, we have an uncommon level of cohesiveness and camaraderie. Our members are not pretentious or cliquish. We are all one big family, and we are always looking to come up with new amenities and enhancements for the club." 


The Hideaway Club

Elegant, with impeccably maintained grounds, Hideaway Club seems to inspire comments that begin with "gorgeous" and end with anecdotes about accommodating staff. The food gets raves, too, whether at the restaurant or one of the tempting "comfort stations." Clive Clark's 18 holes factor in the club's custom homes and local terrain with a nod to St. Andrews and a fair

By winning her 23rd major singles title at the 2017 Australian Open, Serena Williams proved once again that age is just a number.



Back in 1998, when Venus and Serena Williams competed in their very first Australian Open, no one—aside from perhaps themselves and their parents—could have predicted the type of influence they would ultimately

With 30 singles and 28 doubles major championships between them since then, the Williams sisters have, to say the least, changed the game forever. Of the duo, Serena has had the most success on the court, winning all four Grand Slam titles consecutively between 2002 and 2003, and retaining the No. 1 world ranking for 186 straight weeks, tying Steffi Graff for the all-time record.

Over the years, the sisters, who have partnered to win every Grand Slam doubles championship as well as three Olympics gold medals, have participated in one of the sport's most celebrated and exhilarating rivalries. This past January, the rivalry continued at the Australian Open, as the sisters competed against each other in a singles major championship final for the ninth time.

The final, as expected, was a nail-biter from the beginning, as four successive breaks of serve occurred. Serena eventually won the first match 6-4. Two more service breaks occurred before Serena won the second match 6-4 as well, thereby ending an already historic final—the oldest Grand Slam women's final in the Open era, as the sisters'

ages combined for nearly 72 years—and culminating in Serena's 23rd major singles title, only one behind Margaret Court's pre-Open era record.

Serena has now won 72 career singles titles, in addition to her 23 doubles titles (14 of which are majors) and two mixed doubles titles, each of which are majors. And she clinched the No. 1 world ranking once again, for the first time since September 12, 2016.

"I couldn't have written a better story," Serena said, after defeating her sister. "There's no way I would be at 23 without [Venus]—there's no way I would be at No. 1 without her. She's my inspiration. She's the only reason I'm standing here today."

At an age in which most tennis professionals have already retired, the 35-year-old is showing no signs of slowing down. In fact, she is now the oldest female tennis player to win a Grand Slam singles title in the Open era, and the oldest to attain the world No. 1 ranking.

Not to mention, she has also won 10 major singles titles since turning 30—another record, as no other woman has won more than three singles titles after reaching that age. And, with her record seventh Australian Open singles title, she remains the only tennis player—male or female—to claim 10 or more Grand Slam singles titles in two different decades.

"Congratulations, Serena, on No. 23," Venus Williams stated, as she and Serena participated in the awards ceremony. "Your win has always been my win. I'm enormously proud of you."

Although Venus's longevity and tenacity should not be understated, as she has participated in major singles finals for 20 years (and returned to a finals match for the first time since the 2009 Wimbledon, as well as the first all-American women's semi-finals at the U.S. Open since 1981), Serena's long-term success will remain her legacy for years to come. Not only has she won 70 or more matches at three of the four Grand Slam championships, she has also now captured 316 Grand Slam singles match victories in all—another record for either gender.

As if 2017 weren't memorable enough, Serena, who is the highest earning female in all of sports with regard to prize money (grossing over \$84 million so far), also gave birth to her first child, a baby girl, on Sept. 1. As she celebrates yet another milestone with her flancé, Alexis Ohanian, Serena is now looking forward to joining her sister on the courts in 2018, in preparation for yet another season in the professional ranks.


"Long story short, I don't think people actually understand the significance of what



they see—these two players who, literally for generations, have been able to transcend what they do," Isha Price, Serena and Venus's half-sister, explained. "To keep your body in optimal shape to perform at this level consistently [for] 20 years is an incredible feat."

resident Donald Trump started playing golf at the age of 12. He is the 16th of the past 19 American presidents to have a passion for the game of golf. Like past leaders, Trump is a staunch advocate for the game; unlike most, however, he has also made millions on the business side of the fairways and greens via the 17 golf courses in the current Trump Golf portfolio.

With a number of past presidents also having great affection for the Coachella Valley, it stands to reason that the Trump Corporation might start eyeing the California desert for a new Trump National golf facility. Only time will tell. Yet there are already many presidential golf stories in the Coachella Valley.

It's hard to beat Dwight Eisenhower getting his first hole-in-one at Seven Lakes Country Club in Palm Springs at the age of 77. John F. Kennedy was known to frequent Indian Palms in India, the site of the Cochran-Oldham Ranch and its golf course. Richard Nixon, George H.W. Bush, Ronald Reagan, George W. Bush and Bill Clinton spent many a desert day on the area's courses, often at Sunnylands as the guests of Walter and Leonore Annenberg. Gerald Ford lived at Thunderbird Country Club in Rancho Mirage and was seen daily trying to hone his game. Barak Obama, like Ford, recently purchased a desert home that's set up against the mountains at Thunderbird Heights in Rancho Mirage.

So what is it about golf that attracts our country's leaders? We know the game provides a challenge, and can even cause anguish

and stress. We also know there is a peace and tranquility in golf and it's easy to get lost in the game and forget the troubles of the world. Perhaps that is golfs most powerful allure for leaders who face no end of world troubles.

The first president to play was William Howard Taft (1909–1913). Taft was a 20 handicap and was said to always play out every hole.

Woodrow Wilson (1913-21) played as often as possible, logging more than 1,000 rounds while in office.

Warren G. Harding (1921-23) played twice a week, often scoring in triple digits. His legacy to the game: The outstanding TPC Harding Park golf course in San Francisco.

Calvin Coolidge (1923-29) played out of obligation, shooting double-digits on each hole. The story is told that when successor Herbert Hoover moved into the White House, the only thing left behind was Coolidge's bag of clubs.

Before he contracted polio at age 39, Franklin D. Roosevelt (1933-45) was an avid and accomplished golfer. His greatest legacy to the game was the funding of public-works projects, which included dozens of municipal golf courses.

Dwight D. Eisenhower (1953-1961) was often criticized for his obsession with the sport. His friendship with icon Arnold Palmer helped lift golf to new levels of popularity. During his tenure, the number of golfers in America more than doubled. He also installed a putting green on the White House lawn.

HUDSON VALLEY. NEW YORK

Located in the heart of Hudson Valley, Trump National features breathtaking views of Stormville Mountain, making this spectacular course both highly competitive and visually stimulating.

John F. Kennedy (1961-63) had a famously bad back as well as Addison's disease, which prevented the 35th president from reaching his enormous potential as a golfer. Though he played often at Burning Tree, it was said he skipped around the course, hardly ever playing a full round of 18 or even nine holes.

Lyndon B. Johnson (1963-69) played with an ulterior motive after realizing golf was the perfect activity for political negotiations. The votes Johnson needed to pass the Civil Right Act of 1964 were secured on the golf course.

While serving as vice president under Eisenhower, Richard Nixon (1969-74) dutifully took up the game and became a solid player, once breaking 80 and playing to a 12 handicap.

A few errant drives in pro-ams contributed to the 38th president's reputation as a klutz. But Gerald Ford (1974-77), a former Michigan offensive lineman, often broke 90. He became the first president to join the USGA, doing so in a ceremony at the White House and was honorary chairman of the first Presidents Cup (1994).

Ronald Reagan (1981-89) did not play much, but he had a powerful swing.

George H.W. Bush (1989-93) was born into a family with a rich golf tradition. His maternal grandfather, George Herbert Walker, was president of the USGA and founded the Walker Cup. His father, Prescott Bush, also was a USGA president. It was for his dedication to the game, not his playing ability as an 11-handicap, that President Bush was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame.

Bill Clinton (1993-2001) had an undeniably positive impact on the game of golf, perhaps most notably through his involvement with the charity tournament now known as the CareerBuilder Challenge. Clinton also re-installed the White House putting green that Richard Nixon removed.

George W. Bush (2001-2009) played to a 15-handicap before giving up golf at the outbreak of the Second Iraq War. After leaving office, he returned to the sport, establishing the Warrior Open honoring U.S. servicemen.

Barack Obama (2009-2017) is the eighth left-hander in the White House but the first to play golf.

Golfing presidents are by far the majority. Only three presidents since Taft—Herbert Hoover, Harry Truman, and Jimmy Carter—did not play the game.

As for Trump, he lists his handicap as 2.8 on the USGA's Golf Handicap and Information Network, making him an extraordinary golfer at any age, but truly phenomenal for someone who is 70.

Perhaps just as extraordinary is his income from Trump Golf holdings. In 2016, Trump released his Personal

Financial Disclosure (PFD) forms revealing over \$300 million in income from his golf courses and resorts.

Having had a tumultuous relationship the past year with PGA of America, Trump has been seen playing golf with the new PGA president and Toscana Country Club resident, Paul Levy. Will this help future relations? The game should hope so. Currently the PGA is scheduled to hold the 2017 Senior PGA Championship at Trump National in Virginia, and the 2022 PGA Championship at Trump National in New Jersey.

From Scotland to Palm Beach, Los Angeles to Dubai, Trump Golf offers some of the most iconic golf properties and courses in the world, representing world-class luxury and excellence, synonymous with the Trump brand.

Whether you like Trump or not, his presidency will shine a different light on the game that seems to be recovering at least slightly from a major slump. As a golf course owner, designer and player, maybe President Trump will help make golf as a business "great again."

It's on every golfer's wish list to play the Old Course at St Andrews. Visiting St Andrews and playing The Old, which is incredibly special and steeped in history, is unforgettable. Where else can you play over a bunker called Hell; drive over a corner of a substantial five-star hotel; be in bounds and play from a


road that looks as if it were made for a horse and a cart; play down a main street where, if you knock the ball out of bounds, you can buy a cashmere sweater in a store while retrieving your ball; and drive over a pathway called Granny Clark's Wynd—or as I unfortunately called it my first time commentating for BBC, Granny Clark's WIND? And where else can you play the first and eighteenth holes without any trace of a bunker?

Add to all of this numerous semi-blind second shots, massive double greens whose hole numbers always add up to 18 (e.g. 4/14 6/12), and the fact that if you wound the clock back 70 years or so you could enjoy a steam locomotive charging along within a few vards of the 16th fairway. Those trains always contained a number imprinted on the boiler (the front engine) and, as the ubiquitous Henry Longhurst once said during a live BBC TV commentary, "Ah, there goes the 2.15 from Levin heading toward Luchars. I do believe I can read its number—242433—which is a darn sight better than Mr. Palmer's score over the last six holes!"

You might well ask who would design a golf course like this. As it evolved some 600 years ago and many of the bunkers were born through sheep burrowing into the sand dunes for shelter, it's hard to establish who was, in fact, the architect of this masterpiece. Further, in centuries gone by, the course used to be played backward to how it is played today.

The question is: Would a modern-day architect design a golf course like this? I doubt it, but I tell you what, it sure is fun to play!

The experience of addressing the ball on the first tee, with the large bay window of the 'Big Room,' part of the Royal & Ancient clubhouse, looming down on you, plus the golfing gods bearing down on you from above, is enough to give anybody wobbly knees and the wish for a quick tot of Scotch whisky to settle the frayed



now in his 80s and from time to time I play golf with him. One hates to bring the subject up, but I once dared to ask him how often he thinks about that missed put. In his usual colorful manner and with a wry smile, he replied, "Really not that often only three times a day."

Apart from the wonderful golfing to be had on The Old Course, Kingsbarns is definitely also worth a visit as it is less than 15 minutes by car from the center of St Andrews and exudes many of the qualities of the great links golf courses. Farther up the east coast of Scotland is Castle Stuart. The developer, Mark Parsinen, did an exceptional job by building a very playable links course that has a multitude of interesting features together with amazing views of the Moray Firth. The course turned out so well that it has now hosted several Scottish Opens, which is contested just prior to The Open Championship. A few other courses also come to mind on the east coast of Scotland, including Muirfield, Carnoustie and Royal Dornoch. And there are a host of others that may not be household names but that represent a good day's golf in Scotland and likely will be accompanied

Mentioning the golfing gods bearing down, I had the pleasure of playing with Jack Nicklaus in the 3rd round in The Open Championship at St Andrews in 1970. As we approached the 1st tee, there standing before us was the then Prime Minister of Great Britain, Edward (Ted) Heath.

Jack opened the conversation, "Mr. Prime Minister, it's wonderful that you have taken time out from No.10 Downing Street to travel up to Scotland and greet the players on the 1st tee." Heath's swift retort was, "I'm probably doing a great deal more good here than I would be at No.10!" And so the game was on!


Jack and I were lying 3rd and 4th in The Open at that stage and we both made par at the first hole. As we walked to the 2nd tee, Jack said, "I have now played 37 holes without a bogey." It would seem that the golfing gods have exceptional hearing. Jack immediately three-putted the hole for a bogey!

He did go on to win The Open that year in a play-off with Doug Sanders. Many of you will remember the short putt that Doug missed on the 18th green that would have given him the outright win of The 1970 Open Championship. Doug is

Team USA's win in the 2017 Solheim Cup was a display of great shot making and especially great putting— LPGA pro Lexi Thompson shot a 7 under par 29 on the back nine of her singles match on Sunday's final round. Putting is all about confidence and feeling comfortable over the ball. I have earned a lot by watching great putters such as Lexi Thompson, improving my putting stroke and ultimately making more putts. You can, too



Pre-shot Routine

The key to being a great putter is to get a good feel for the slope of the green. In her pre-shot routine, Lexi likes to walk around the putt to establish the slope. The slope of the putt helps her feel if the putt is a downhill or uphill putt, which in turn influences the speed with which the ball will roll to the hole. Establishing the slope also helps her create a feel for how much break to play in the putt.



Setup

There is a common fundamental in putting technique: Have your eyes over the ball and on your target line. But Lexi likes to have her eyes a few inches inside the ball and target line. This creates a stroke that has the putter face moving on a slight arc rather than straight back and through. When Lexi makes a practice stroke, she sometimes likes to swing the putter right-handed only in order to get a feel for the speed with her dominant right hand. I have even seen her do this on the practice green many times. It's a good exercise for any golfer to get a feel for the speed.





Tempo in the Stroke

All good putters have a tempo or rhythm to their stroke. The same is true for Lexi. The key is to figure out what type of tempo works best for you. One of the big changes that Lexi made in her putting-stroke tempo was to increase the speed of the tempo. She felt that her stroke was actually too slow. Although it seems counter-intuitive, increasing the tempo actually gave her a better feel for controlling the putts. A good

way to check your tempo is with a metronome. Listen to the "tick - tock" of the metronome to find the tempo that works best for you.

Hold the Finish

Early on in Lexi's career, she used to have what she calls a "recoil" in her putting stroke. What that means is that after her putter face made contact with the ball, the putter would actually move in reverse away from the hole as the ball rolled to the hole. A big focus on her putting stroke is to have an exact "finish point," and then hold the finish at that exact point until the ball rolls into the hole. This holding the finish helps Lexi stay down through

her putts and not look up prematurely. Holding the finish will help you stay down through your putts as well, which will result in more successful putts.



SHOULD YOU HIRE

A REAL ESTATE AGENT OR LAWYER

TO BUY A HOUSE?

Real estate agents are not authorized to practice law. This means that they can help negotiate and fill-in blanks on a form selected by the parties or act as a scrivener in recording the parties' agreement, but that's about it. Lawvers, on the other hand, are specifically trained and authorized to practice law without limitation. Moreover, lawyers owe their clients a duty of competency, including a duty of diligence that far exceeds the duties of a real estate agent. This means that lawyers are supposed to think about and anticipate potential problems in the transaction that agents often overlook (often resulting in expensive litigation), and lawyers must advise their clients accordingly.

■ AGENTS ARE PAID ONLY IF THE SALE IS COMPLETED

This may sound like a benefit to a homebuyer, but the fact that a real estate agent only earns a commission if the deal closes creates inherent conflict and bias in the agency relationship. The agent is obviously incentivized to make sure the transaction is completed so they can get paid, even if the closing may not be in the buyer's best interests. This conflict is even more pronounced when the agent represents both the buyer and seller in the transaction, since a buyer's interests are in direct conflict with the seller's interests—the buyer wants the lawest possible price while the seller wants the highest possible price. Recognizing this inherent conflict, some states actually prohibit such dual agency. Lawyers, on the other hand, typically charge an hourly or flat fee, such that they are unaffected by the transaction itself.







here's fast and then there's OMG fast. The new Tesla Model S P100D with Ludicrous mode is the fastest production car you'll drive. Period. The specs on the S are as sexy as they are surprising. The new Model S clocks 0-60 mph in 2.28 seconds. A Space X rocket doesn't do that, but it and the Tesla weigh about the same. The S weighs in at 4,891 pounds and its twosecond run is like King Kong winning gold in the Olympic 100-meter dash. Ludicrous mode is well named and redefining fast.

Compare the Model Sto its next-closest competitor in production car speed. The Porsche 911 Turbo S nips at the heels of the Model S and weighs less than 3,700 pounds. The Model S is the automotive equal to Mohammed Ali. It flies like a F-14 fighter jet and stings like a scorpion.

With rocket speed and room to seat up to five adults, the Model S doesn't disappoint. There's no car in any manufacturer's showroom that can deliver this level of G-force power. Engineering types have calculated all kinds of fancy figures that prove, without a doubt, that the Model S flat out flies, accelerating at 1.4Gs. You have less acceleration falling out of an airplane! The LaFerrari is at 1.2 Gs.

How does Tesla do it? The company has an attitude that comes through in its design. Take the "Ludicrous" mode for example. To tell the computer that you want to try to orbit the earth in a 5,000pound car, you access the settings mode and follow the steps. At one point, you'll be asked: "Are you sure you want to push the limits? This will cause accelerated wear of the motor, gearbox and battery." The two buttons below are marked, "No, I want my Mommy" and "Yes, bring it on!"

Tesla begs the world to "bring it on" with continued innovation.

The way Tesla has paired its electric engine to the transmission so eloquently shows in one more key stat: torque. This lesser-compared stat for muscle cars is stunning when you look at the difference between the battery-powered Model S and the gas-powered Porsche 911. The tesla produces 920 lb-ft of torque compared to 516 lb-ft of torque in the Porsche 911s. This translates to immediate punch that makes you feel like you're on Space Mountain every time you drive to the grocery store.

The interior, too, is full-on Tesla technology. The navigation is incredibly easy to manage along with other tech items. The most important feature is autopilot, which brings you as close to autonomous



driving as you can get and still be legal. The autopilot mode keeps the designated distance between you and the car in front of you. It will change lanes. The car can manage stop-and-go traffic with no screaming or rude hand gestures.

You can also "summon" the Model S to drive to you while you're standing somewhere nearby with the key in your hand—who needs valet parking? The cameras in front and behind watch for danger or obstructions.

The entire car could be run on the Tesla app. With the app, you can honk the horn, change the climate and generally mess with everything. Seeing this technology in action, you get the sense that the future has arrived.

Perhaps the only downside for the Model S is that it's an electric car. That means you still have to charge it at least every 315 miles. As a daily commuter car, this is not a big deal; road trips, however, get tricky. Finding a charging station still is not as easy as finding a gas station. But having a charging station in the garage of your home makes owing an all-electric car nearly as easy as owning anything else on the road,

and the wow factor easily overcomes the inconvenience.

The Model S is the total package. It gives you flat-out speed, acceleration and tech features most drivers don't know they need until they see them in action. Now that Elon Musk, founder of Tesla, has introduced the Model S, the competition will scramble to out-do him.

This writer says, "Bring it on!"



A special, high-quality fabric called Supplex is used, which has the feel and flexibility of cotton and advanced durability through fiber technology. Supplex is generally a blend of 90 percent polyester and 10 percent Lycra, sometimes with higher or lower percentages of each depending on the thickness of the specific product.

Current sizing of active wear is geared for small to medium, however the company has just started manufacturing a medium to large size which will be available for purchase in the near future. Bela Fit's reasonably priced designs gravitate towards explosive color, feisty animals and friendly florals. Leggings and capris run from \$29 to \$89, with each and every design clearly displayed on the company website.

One of Bela Fit's most popular designs is Hibiscus. A happy palette of bright pink and yellow hibiscus flowers dance amid a canopy of green split-leaf philodendron with rich, sky-blue in the background. Somehow

having a garden of these trumpet shaped petals climbing up one's legs instantly creates a connection with nature, transporting the wearer to the Caribbean, where the hibiscus is the national flower of Haiti, or to Hawaii where the blossom is also the state flower. (Either destination is fine by us). Hibiscus leggings are available for \$72.

The Palos Verdes Peacock design captures the beauty of the natural environment, representing the large, majestic birds that are known for their stunning blue and green iridescent tails. Donning a pair of leggings might actually lead people to believe you are a moving train of tail feathers, boasting a canvas of colorful "eyes" with the characteristic markings in blue, gold, red and green. Extending from waist to ankle, these soft and stretchy knit leggings will whisk you away to the tropical locales of Sri Lanka, Java or Burma, where the birds are indigenous. They are priced at \$72.

Capris

Several of Bela Fit's capris and leggings have common patterns, however there are numerous designs that are exclusive to the line of cropped pants. One of these is the Pineapple design, a bold print with dark pink and red pineapples, including vivid green crowns of pointed leaves set against a dramatic black background. Stretching three quarters of the way down the calf, the capris are breathable and fast drying while also strong enough to resist abrasions, punctures and tears. Pineapple capris retail for \$49.

Peace capris evoke images of carefree days of the 60s, with memories of flower children, freedom of expression and Woodstock. The neon pink, purple, green and blue peace signs, white geometric shapes and bouncy blue and pink hibiscus flowers are nestled in a blanket of black, comingling to create a light-hearted nudge to get the heart rate up. A message of acceptance and affirmation seems to underscore the harmony inherent in the design. "Peace for our time" can be achieved for \$29.

Vintage Jean capris are an incredibly lifelike recreation of trendy, ripped denims in hues of light, medium and dark blue. Constructed from a comfortable, high-performance fabric with elasticity that stretches up to five times, these capris compact the body and make everything look a little tighter. The attractive crops can be worn while exercising as well as running errands or lunching on the patio, all the while providing gentle support, a firm fit and protection from the sun. They may be purchased for \$68.

Bela Fit workout wear is available at various gyms, yoga and Pilates studios. Representatives regularly present private trunk shows. The products may also be found at fairs and festivals in southern California. In the Coachella Valley, Bela Fit is sold at private clubs including The Hideaway and The Madison Club, both in La Quinta, California.



Set in bright 18K yellow gold, this necklace is likely to make one feel like a princess, no matter the season. It's priced at \$340,000.
