In the United States it is estimated that almost five children die every day from child abuse. California Child Protective Services recently reported nearly 85,000 substantiated cases of child maltreatment during 2008. These reports are staggering; worse, year after year they increase in number and severity.

One organization is determined to make a difference in the lives of these children. Founded in 1959 by Sara O'Meara and Yvonne Fedderson, two Hollywood actresses, **Childhelp** has grown into a leading national nonprofit organization dedicated to helping victims of child abuse and neglect. O'Meara and Fedderson continue to actively lead the organization and to provide its vision, serving as chairman/CEO and president, respectively.

Childhelp's mission is to meet the physical, emotional, educational and spiritual needs of abused, neglected and at-risk

Palm Desert, Calif., Nov. 7-8. Desert Willow is a premium public golf resort named among the "Best Places to Play" by *Golf Digest*. Simply by signing up to participate in the tournament on this great course, valley residents can be part of the effort to give abused, neglected and at-risk children the hope they desperately need.

Monies raised *will* make a difference. Childhelp's programs and services are designed to help these most vulnerable members of our population experience the life they deserve — one filled with love and kindness. With the best possible treatment services offered in a positive environment, young victims of abuse can discover how special they truly are.

For O'Hurley, Childhelp is an organization that he is passionate to support. "I am involved with Childhelp because as a new parent I have become deeply sensitized to making the world safer for our children. This tournament will be our first effort to raise





children. The organization's approach focuses on prevention, intervention and treatment, as well as advocacy and community outreach.

Like other nonprofits, Childhelp depends on volunteers and charitable donations. One of Childhelp's newest chapters is in Indian Wells, Calif., and two of its Celebrity Ambassadors, Cheryl Ladd and John O'Hurley, are golfers committed to lending their talents to an organization they care about. Ladd is known for her work on *Charlie's Angels* while O'Hurley is best known as J. Peterman on *Seinfeld*.

According to Cheryl Kauffmann, president of Childhelp's Indian Wells chapter, "With golf such an integral part of the Coachella Valley community, it seemed only natural to launch a celebrity golf tournament in support of Childhelp. And we are thrilled to have John and Cheryl's commitment to this wonderful cause."

The **1st Annual Cheryl Ladd & John O'Hurley Golf Classic** to benefit Childhelp will be played at Desert Willow Golf Resort in

money and awareness for the fundamentally important efforts of Childhelp. I hope we are the beginning of a wonderful tradition."

Ladd agrees. "Since 1979 I have had the honor of being part of an astonishing mission to eradicate child abuse in America, she says.

"For thirty-one years I have grown alongside Childhelp and what I have learned is that only when you work to improve the world outside of yourself can you truly begin to learn who you are inside."

Included among Childhelp's programs are residential treatments facilities, known as villages. One of two such facilities Childhelp operates is in Beaumont, Calif., approximately 30 miles west of Palm

Springs. Spread across 121 acres of peaceful scenery, the Childhelp Merv Griffin Village has offered 24-hour-a-day treatment to severely abused, neglected and at-risk children since 1978. Committed to creating a genuine community environment, the Village houses as many as 84 children ranging in age from six to 14.

The children who make their home here are referred to this solution-focused facility by various judicial authorities and child welfare offices. They arrive exhibiting severe emotional and behavioral problems as a result of their abusive or neglectful situations. For many of them, the Village and its multidisciplinary team are their last hope in avoiding placement at a juvenile correctional facility.

The Childhelp National Child Abuse Hotline, 1-800-4-A-CHILD, operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and receives calls from throughout the United States, Canada, the U.S. Virgin Islands, Puerto Rico and Guam. Last year, nearly 200,000 calls were received. Childhelp's programs and services also include children's advocacy centers, therapeutic foster care, group homes, child abuse prevention, education and training.

With its Hollywood roots, Childhelp has been fortunate to have celebrities join the organization as Childhelp Celebrity Ambassadors. Legendary entertainer Merv Griffin was a longtime ambassador

"I am so excited to be co-hosting this golf tournament with my friend John O'Hurley," Ladd states. "We are hoping it will be the first of regular annual fundraisers for Childhelp. We are

kindred spirits when it comes to caring for children and he brings a lot of heart and compassion to everything he does.

John's dedication as a father has brought him to this place of love and concern for all children. That said, the minute we step onto the green...its war!"

With its early November date, this tournament is a chance for desert golfers to get out and play on a superb course while other courses are still being re-seeded — all while making life better for children who have suffered unimaginable abuse and neglect. It's a win-win situation and Childhelp invites you to join John O'Hurley and Cheryl Ladd for this fantastic celebrity tournament.

The Prestige

Collegiate Golf's Premier Event in the Desert

This October, La Quinta Resort will host the top men's college golf teams in the nation, on a course set to PGA Tour standards

PGA West Stadium Course at La Quinta Resort

Every year, every tournament, countless times during a season, golf fans mutter to themselves, and it goes something like this: "Man, what a life those Tour guys have. Paid to travel around the country and stay in the best hotels and play the best golf courses? They've got it made in the shade."

The organizers of the Prestige at PGA West collegiate golf tournament have decided some of the country's top collegians should also stay in the best hotels and play the best golf courses, even if they don't get paid. No promises of shade are being made, either.

This year, the 11th version of the Prestige, co-hosted by Stanford University and the University of California-Davis, is scheduled for Oct. 9-12 at the PGA West Stadium Course at La Quinta Resort in La Quinta, Calif. Tournament director and co-founder Mark Weissmann says that giving some of the top men's college golf programs in the country a chance to compete on world-class courses at a world class resort were key components of the core concept.

"I talked with (TCU coach) Bill Montigel last week and he said his guys really love coming out here, love playing in the desert and love PGA West," notes Weissmann, who has an extensive background in sports public relations and marketing. "So that's a good testimonial from one of the great coaches at one of the top programs in the nation."



"Stanford coach Conrad Ray said the same thing: 'We want to play the best of the best at the best,'" Weissmann adds. "Stanford likes being co-host of this event because it helps everyone's program. It's a great experience for all the teams because we treat it like a major for the coaches, the players and the sponsors."

Montigel's TCU teams won five consecutive conference championships from 2001-2005, and have won the last two championships at the Prestige. The Horned Frogs will be back again this year to try and make it three in a row. Taking on TCU and the two co-hosts will be Arizona State, Cal State Long Beach, Michigan State, Pepperdine, Cal, Central Florida, Oregon, Pacific, Washington, San Diego, North Carolina-Wilmington and Vanderbilt.

The tournament started when Weissmann and UC-Davis men's golf coach Cy Williams were discussing the fact that there was no major college tournament in the desert, and there wasn't really a good reason for it. Weissmann's son Lee, who played on a California Interscholastic Federation state champion golf team at Palm Desert High School in 1998, was a freshman on the UC-Davis golf team at the

time, and Weissmann could see his son being a member of UC-Davis teams that would compete in the tournament as co-hosts.

That part of Weissmann's vision went unfulfilled. Lee played for a short time at UC-Davis before shoulder injuries ended his playing days. However, he went on to serve in the student senate and composed the referendum that helped UC-Davis move into Division I athletics. And the tournament is now moving into its 11th

locations and places like Washington and Oregon and New England and they come down here and get to experience perfect weather every day, great hospitality and great golf courses with emerald-green fairways surrounded by mountains. So the more people we can introduce to what we have here, the more people we send back to their hometowns to sing our praises."

Another aspect of the tournament that Weissmann is particularly proud of is the strength of the field — not just on the course but also in the classroom. Weissmann says the tournament has always been dedicated to having the top colleges in terms of scholarship by inviting schools that are also among the country's top 100 academic institutions. The goal is

year at its second venue, with UC-Davis still serving as co-host.

Davis Sezna, president of La Quinta Resort and former collegiate player at Georgia, says the tournament presents the resort and the greater Coachella Valley with a chance to show itself off to the collegiate field, coaches and parents. In turn, those players return to their home regions carrying their memories and endorsements of the hotel and courses with them.

"We have nine incredible golf courses at our resort. We have one more golf course than Pinehurst, which makes us the largest golf resort in the U.S.," Sezna says. "Anytime we can get quality people and quality golfers here to introduce them to what we're doing here, we create ambassadors.

"It's hard to come to La Quinta and experience the resort and PGA West and not be impressed," Sezna continues. "Many of the teams are coming from Midwest

always to draw teams from the country's best conferences to help maintain the high level of competition at the event, but also to reward or recognize programs from premier academies of higher learning.

Sezna points out that the tournament benefits go far beyond La Quinta Resort. When visitors come to La Quinta or any other valley destination, they rarely stay exclusively in one city or one resort.

"Whether it's Palm Springs or La Quinta or Indio, we're all rooting for each other," Sezna says. "And we not only have a great competition, we create a three-day event that will bring a lot of old friends together and introduce new ones."

To complete the experience for the teams, sponsors and community, a junior clinic is scheduled for 11 a.m. on Oct. 9 at the PGA West Stadium Course practice range. The College-Am tees off later that afternoon with players teaming with amateurs and key sponsors. Tournament rounds are scheduled for Oct. 10-12 with

18 holes each day, as opposed to the usual 54-hole college format of 36 on the first day of competition, and 18 and a quick getaway on the second day. There is an

awards dinner as well as a pre-tournament dinner, and all the teams will be housed in La Quinta's world-famous accommodations.

The tournament itself will be contested on the TPC Stadium Course at PGA West, one of Pete Dye's most famous and controversial layouts. Weissmann says that the course will be set up to the same standards as those used when PGA Tour qualifying school is played at PGA West. "We're replicating as close as we can the qualifying school condition with respect to green speeds, rough lengths and general course conditions."

A world-class course in Tour condition, lodging at a legendary desert getaway, delectable resort dining and only 18 holes a day? The evidence shows that the life of a college golfer can now be envied on a regular basis just like the Tour guys, thanks to events like the Prestige. If only they could do something about those pesky exams....

U.S. team named for **World Golfers Championship**

Amateurs from around the world compete in an Olympic-style golf competition

Representing your country in any international competition is usually reserved for the elite from a sport, like the golf professionals playing in the Ryder Cup at Celtic Manor in Wales this fall.

WORLD-CLASS AMATEURS

But Bil Criteser of El Mirage, Ariz., and four other amateurs from the United States will get this once-in-a-lifetime experience when they travel to Thailand for the World Golfers Championship Nov.3-6.

As winners of their respective flights in the U.S. finals at the Wigwam Resort in Litchfield Park, Ariz., joining Criteser will be

Paul Goering of Dallas, Texas, Bill Nitcholas of Carrollton, Texas, Shauna Federico of Wellington, Fla., and Stuart Cunningham of Singer Island, Fla.

Criteser, who switches to southpaw on the greens, proved the most steady player in the 11-15 flight with 69-73—142, finishing two strokes in front of James Adams of Florida and five ahead of Doug Bisson of Texas. Goering, who carries a +2 handicap at Castle Hills Golf Club in Carrollton, Texas, posted a pair of two-under-par 70s for net 72s to claim the 0-5 flight by a comfortable five strokes over Ray Madrid of Arizona. Californian Mark Pirtle followed at 151 and earned an exemption to the 2011 U.S. finals along with the other second and third finishers.

Nitcholas, the golf coach at Irving MacArthur High School, posted net 68-70—138 to cruise to a comfortable margin in the 6-10 flight as nearest rivals Chris Borkowsk (Arizona) and Wayne McCollum (California) finished at 147 and 148, respectively. Parker Smith, the 6-10 representative in Spain last year, had to withdraw during the final round after opening with a 72.

Federico, a member of the Executive Women's Golf Association, breezed to a five-stroke margin over defending champion Tony Ott of West Palm Beach in the 16-20 flight with net 68-65—133. Texan Gray Hagen placed third at 144.

Cunningham, a member of the President Country Club in West Palm Beach, overcame a five-stroke deficit to win the 21-25 flight with 71-73—144, a stroke ahead of 18-hole leader Richard Waldie of Penbrook Pines, Fla. Frank McInerny, a member of the 2009 U.S. team from Yonkers, N.Y., placed third at 73-75—148.

The five amateurs will join competitors from 36 other countries in a 72-hole competition to be played at the Banyon Golf Club, Black Mountain Golf Club, Palm Hills Golf Club and Springfield Royal Country Club in the resort area of Hua-Him, about two hours from Bangkok. The low four scores will be counted each day to determine a team score and each of the players will compete for individual honors within flights.

In addition to expenses to Thailand, allowed by the United States Golf Association under an exception to the rules of amateur status, each player will receive golf bags from LT Golf, umbrellas

from Gustbuster and sunglasses from Canadian company Sundog Eyewear. Zoom Boom will also provide its training aid for the team.

HISTORY OF THE EVENT

Anders Bengtson, captain of the U.S. team, likens the World Golfers Championship to a true Olympics of golf. "It's where amateurs compete on equal terms just the way Pierre de Coubertain envisioned when he created the Olympics," Bengtson says.

Realizing that golf was becoming a global sport, Sven Tumba of Sweden organized the World Golfers Championship 16 years ago as an invitational event to give amateurs of all skill levels a taste of an international competition. He then turned it into a separate team concept later. In addition to being hosted at Palm Springs and top resorts in the United States such as PGA National, Mission Inn and Doral, the competition has been held previously in the Dominican Republic, Malaysia, South Africa and Thailand.

HOW TO QUALIFY

U.S. players who would like to have a chance to advance to the 2011 World Golfers Championship in South Africa should contact Bengtson at worldgolfersusa.com or call 561.313.9083 to discuss having a qualifying event at their clubs starting in January.

"We will announce a site for the 2011 U.S. finals after returning from Thailand," Bengtson noted.

How Golf Clubs Thrive in a Down Economy

By Richard Gotcher

Faced with a challenging economy, private golf clubs are finding new ways to make membership a great deal

Bing Crosby made a lot of money singing “Straight Down The Middle.” Many golf courses today, faced with an economy that has double bogey written all over it, could likely use the crooner’s ability to turn green fairways into green cash.

Like most other industries, the golf business is subject to the economy’s ebbs and flows. Golf clubs have adapted to seasonal slow-downs and consider any extra money made during those times a windfall. However, few businesses can expect to live on

windfalls while trying to survive a prolonged recession; that may especially apply to the golf industry. Yet it’s not all doom and gloom. In fact, potential members may be able to get some good deals on joining the club of their choice in this economy.

Jane Lopez is the concierge/membership administrator at The Hideaway, she says there has been some slowing in membership. The club is getting creative by offering incentives to current members and prospective members, and focusing more than ever on programs that enhance the value for existing members. But the



club also reduced some golf event entry fees to entice more members to join in the fun. Lopez notes that The Hideaway doesn't have reciprocal agreements with other clubs, stating, "Once you're a member here, you're strictly a member here." For more information on The Hideaway call 760.777.450.

Unlike The Hideaway, The Springs Country Club in Rancho Mirage, Calif., does have playing arrangements with other golf courses in the area. Ronda Dorrell-Allen, the club's membership and marketing director, says reciprocity is one way for a club to bring in extra revenue.

"Most other clubs are pretty much in the same boat right now, and we're all hunting around and getting very creative, getting very innovative about ways to attract members," Lopez says. "Right now is certainly not a time when golf clubs can rely on waiting lists to provide new members." That creativity and innovation can

translate to great deals for potential members. Contact the Springs Country Club at 760.324.8292.

Geoff Hasley is the Chief Operating Officer at Eldorado Country Club, another Coachella Valley club. He says the economy demands the club provide "more and more value" to members whose financial picture has changed during the recession. He wants members to feel Eldorado is "exceeding their expectations" when comparing fees to what the club offers. Hasley says the club has made some changes in how it operates, but that is simply because "every club is in the dues justification business."

Hasley notes that membership levels are critical and how clubs respond to changes even more so. "When club memberships dip below a certain level, and clubs try to raise dues, then they've lost their pricing power and it starts a death spiral. The dues go up and they lose members, they lose members and they lose money."

That “death spiral” is out there, and it will likely hit a number of golf clubs, of which there are too many, Hasley says. Yet many clubs are remarkably resilient in these challenging times. Membership and staff levels at Eldorado, for example, have remained fairly constant, most likely because the club continues to provide a lot for its members. Learn more about Eldorado Country Club at 760.423.1511.

At Arrowhead Country Club in Phoenix, the initiation fee has fallen a bit. Club Membership Director Chris Robinson says there appears to be “an across the board” reaction by most clubs as they attempt to find new revenue sources.

“I’m not sure that’s going to be the MO for all the other clubs, but for us, we’ve dropped the fee a little bit,” Robinson says. “As soon as the economy turns around, it’ll go back up.” He adds that it’s only fair to the membership to keep entry fees fairly constant; otherwise, how do you explain to a member who paid \$15,000 to join a few years back that newcomers can get in for just \$4,000?



Arrowhead Country Club

Arrowhead's monthly dues have remained fairly level, and are among the lowest in the Phoenix area, a positive for members. Like other clubs, Arrowhead depends on referrals from active members to attract new members. Arrowhead can be contacted at 623.561.9600.

Desert area golf clubs are in a seasonal slow-down that ends in October. The good news for those who are considering joining a club is that there will likely be some enticing membership deals as the desert prime season gets into full swing. In all truth, keeping memberships at or near quota levels is worth more than money. It helps solidify members' appreciation of what a club offers and invigorates a great game played among friends. The economy notwithstanding, now may be the best time to join the club of your choice.

Find the best golf ball for your game

Desert Golf Magazine's equipment expert tells you what
you need to know about choosing the right ball for your game



Fifteen years ago, golf ball choices were stark. Golfers could choose between a soft, high-spinning ball with a fragile balata cover and a wrist-jarring two-piece ball with what seemed like a concrete core and cover hard enough to shatter the face of a persimmon wood. Construction advances have narrowed the gap significantly between the rock and the soft place, but compromises exist. If you're looking for a ball that's long, durable, totally controllable around the greens, a breeze to hit in the wind and also costs less than \$20 for a 24 pack, it's not happening.

The most convenient way to group golf balls today is by price. A good and perfectly serviceable ball costs under \$20 per dozen. The ball will feel fine off all clubs, reward good shots and perform well enough for most golfers. The primary drawback is in durability: To keep costs low, manufacturers use a cover material like ionomer in the cheaper balls, which tends to get scuffed up fairly easily. Solid options include the Wilson D-25 Distance, the Srixon AD333, the Top-Flite Gamer V2 and the Top-Flite Eagle.

In the past three years, manufacturers have dramatically improved the mid-tier golf balls in the \$20 to \$35 range. Balls in this 'better' category typically have three-piece construction and will hit the brakes fairly quickly on chip shots and pitch shots. However, cover materials can still be lacking. A well-struck wedge, especially one with extra grippy grooves, can leave an impression on these balls. Players looking for a ball with a urethane cover, which is the most durable, might like the TaylorMade TP Black LDP. Other solid choices in this price range include the Bridgestone E6, the Titleist NXT Tour and the Wilson Staff C:25.

The frugal golfer may become a bit perturbed when facing the option of spending \$45 for a dozen golf balls. Ironically, the most expensive ball may be the best option for you if you're value conscious, provided you're a player who keeps the ball out of water, waist-high rough, barrancas and other ball-munching hazards. The urethane cover found on most of the top-tier balls stays blemish free unless you send a bunker shot 144 yards. These premium golf balls reduce the trade-off disparity: You get distance off the tee, workability, beautiful feel, durability and control around the greens. The most famous ball in this category is the Titleist Pro V1 and V1x, but Nike (One Tour/Tour D), Srixon (Z-Star/Z-Star X) and TaylorMade (the five-layer Penta TP) all make superbly crafted balls. Callaway has the Tour i(s)/i(z) and Bridgestone offers four balls in its premium family of B330 balls, providing more options for more golfers.

Golfers will quite correctly spend hundreds on a fitted driver then fail to ask their PGA or LPGA professional about the best golf ball for their game. There are two key variables: spin and launch angle. A player who naturally spins the ball will benefit from a ball with lower spin; a player with low spin (and probably low ball speed) may benefit from a ball with higher spin. Is it absolutely vital for precise short game scoring to use a ball in the premium range? Absolutely not. An inexpensive ball will spin around the green and a good player can adapt around the green. While there are exceptions, typically a less



expensive ball will have a higher launch angle than a more expensive ball. If you hit the ball a mile in the air, you may need a ball with a lower launch angle.

The United States Golf Association has approved well over a thousand golf balls,

among them the Chromax Metallic. There are two models: the Metallic1 and the Metallic2, available in six colors, none of which are white. The balls are the product of chemical engineer and avid golfer Stuart Chin who lives in Taiwan and purchased a

golf-ball manufacturing facility four years ago.

In Japan, the ball is second in popularity only to the Titleist Pro V1. The Metallic1 is a 75-compression ball and is best for juniors and ladies. The Metallic2 is an 85-compression ball and is an excellent choice for the “average” golfer with clubhead speeds in the 85 to 100 mph range. The ball uses two-piece construction, has soft feel and putts and chips well; the cover material is a trade secret.

Golfers buy the ball initially, according to the manufacturer, for the novelty but keep playing it for the performance and the visibility — the ball is significantly easier to see past 150 yards. Clearly the ball has something going for it. It’s in the premium price bracket of \$3 to \$4 per ball and moves off the shelves.

The number of ‘green grass’ locations stocking the ball is increasing but retail locations are primarily limited to the state of Colorado. However, the ball is available through several websites including The Golf Warehouse (tgw.com).



AMG's

Go Anywhere, Do Anything

Brawn, luxury, safety, performance – the impressive
G55 may just be worth its hefty price tag



It began as a military wagon. It has become a symbol of strength. Worldwide, armies have ordered tens of thousands of the Mercedes-Benz G series in one form or another over the years. Today, families are taking this tamed tank to the battle of the Joneses and winning in style.

The latest and most powerful G-series is the AMG G55. This super-charged V-8 carries all the power and speed that you'd expect from Mercedes and its uber custom line AMG. If you see one on the street, you know you're seeing something special.

Not only is the G55 fast, it's impressive to look at if for no other reason than its sheer girth. This heavyweight is tall and beefy. At 184 inches long and 76 inches high, the G55 cuts a swath on the highway or the trail. The boxy shape is unmistakable. Calling an AMG boxy feels sacrilegious but the G55 wears its profile with pride.





"It's my favorite SUV," says Michael Floyd, president of Platinum Mercedes in Palm Desert, Calif. "The look is rugged but the interior has a cast of class. Don't get me wrong, you know you are in a truck, but it's refined."

Don't let the bulk fool you; this vehicle flies like a butterfly. The 5.5 L engine pounds out 500 horsepower. Through





high-tech engineering and modern materials, the Germans have kept the weight to just over 5,000 pounds, meaning the G55 can launch like a rocket off the line. It rifles 0 to 60 in 5.4 seconds.

Yet just because the G55 is fast doesn't mean you can underestimate its ability to travel off the pavement. The five-speed automatic transmission hasn't been replaced by the popular AMG seven-speed because the five-speed delivers more torque — over 500 ft/lbs at peak RPM. The solid axle front suspension is the best configuration you can buy for off-road driving. Remember, this is a fighter.

"You just won't get a better off-road vehicle from the factory," says Floyd. "The G55 takes you from the driveway to the trail seamlessly."

With three different driving modes, full-time "4Matic" four-wheel drive locking the three hubs and a traction control option, the G55 is equipped for nearly anything. The length of the four-door model sold in the U.S. may limit some of the places you can take this beast, but probably not as much as the six-figure price tag does on its own.

When you decide to purchase the G55 you are deciding you want the best. The Mercedes Electronic Stability Program rivals anything of its kind on the road. When the vehicle's computer senses shake, yaw or other factors affecting safety, it adjusts engine torque and braking to correct for the condition. Mercedes is spending millions on it safety features and

the G55 is a flagship. Smart airbags and numerous features you'd expect from one of the top automakers in the world keep drivers coming back.

You aren't likely to buy this vehicle if you'd be fine settling for a Land Rover or other such SUV that ably handles off-road excursions. Buyers who choose AMG choose it for its superb quality in an already superb line of vehicles. Mercedes knows this and keeps the AMG brand apparent in chrome stamping on the running boards and throughout the interior. The brilliant extras act as medals on the lapel of a brave warrior — demanding respect and, in some cases, inducing humility.

The Mercedes brand name doesn't disappoint in the G55 either. Though it may look like the muscle of the AMG family business, it's no less distinct and defined inside. Luxury leather seating reminds drivers that they are driving a luxury vehicle. Rich wood trim lines the gearshift, doors and steering wheel. Of course, the rear-folding seats create storage space to get even the largest of families' pets, groceries and golf clubs home all in one trip.

The state-of-the-art telematics console controls everything from the environmental details to the entertainment. With 4 GB's of space for music and additional universal adapters for nearly any device that carries music, you are prepared for a lifetime of tunes and movies. The HD navigation system gives a 6.5-inch screen and aerial-view capability.

The G55 retails for \$123,000 and is hard to find. You can almost guarantee you'll be the only one rolling this parade vehicle through the neighborhood — which makes it a contender in the contest for awe-factor as well as performance. Owners will fight the urge to mount an insurrection on the ski slope because they know they have the power to do it with the G55.

From the Pope to Hillary Duff, owners of the G-series are in good company.



This leaves the entire top to serve as a platform for the intricate, bejeweled sculptures. The ornate watch designs include one with three miniature golden bees in 18-karat yellow gold with sapphire eyes and mother of pearl and amber honeycomb detail, set on an 18-karat gold case. Another design of a sea turtle features textured 18-karat yellow gold, emerald eyes and a pave-set light brown diamond body. These works are referred to as "beautiful vessels," and, similar to a Judith Leiber purse, they are works of art but meant to be worn, dazzling on the wrist.
