



## THE 2010 BOB HOPE CLASSIC

When the 2010 edition of the Classic is played January 18-24 in the California desert, the 2009 champion, Pat Perez, will be ready—and so will a host of celebrities, Tour players, and fans who help make this event so memorable




Maybe it took a special place and a special event for Pat Perez to finally realize that he's pretty special, too. During his seven-year career on the PGA Tour, Perez was known more for his temper than his talent. All of that ended when Perez traded hotheaded and volcanic for champion at the 50th playing of the Bob Hope Classic hosted by Arnold Palmer.

The 2009 playing of the tournament was his 198th start as a member of the PGA Tour, and a shot he hit early in the final round would probably have sent the old Perez into what could have been a final-round meltdown.

Standing on the tee box of the par-3 fifth on the Palmer Private Course at PGA West, Perez could only watch helplessly as the swirling winds that were sweeping through the valley pushed his ball first into the rocks and then into the water guarding the hole. Had this been Pebble Beach at the 2002 AT&T Classic, things would probably have turned out differently. It was there that Perez, locked in a final-round battle with Tiger Woods, hooked his second shot on the par-5 18th into the Pacific Ocean and then proceeded to demolish his 3-wood before a national television audience.

Not this Perez. Not this time.





"I hope I don't have to answer another Pebble Beach question," Perez said with a laugh to the media during his post-victory press conference. "I hope you guys will finally drop it."

Consider it dropped, especially since Perez handled his game and himself like a winner over the final 13 holes of his final round.

"I've learned from guys like Tiger, Phil Mickelson, Vijay Singh and Ernie Els," Perez said. "All of those guys are pretty even-keeled and they don't let things bother them. They put stuff behind them. Before, if I made a double-bogey on the fifth hole of the final round, the tournament was over. I look at that as a speed bump now."

Speed bumps aside, Perez did have to put the pedal to the metal going into the final round. Starting the fifth round of the Hope Classic, the only 90-hole medal-play event on the PGA Tour, Perez was three strokes behind leader Steve Stricker, who would later in the year be one of the heroes of the U.S. victory in the Presidents Cup.

By the time he made the turn, shooting 35 over the outward half despite the double-bogey on the fifth, Perez was locked in a duel with John Merrick. He ended any doubt on the par-5 18th when his 6-iron second shot from 200 yards finished three feet from the cup for a kick-in eagle. And there was no doubt in his mind when it came time to pull a club for what would be the second-to-last shot of his first PGA Tour victory.






























"I don't lay up," he said. "I hit a 6-iron. I mean, how hard is it? I'm not going to lay up with a wedge over here and then hit a wedge over there. It was a 6-iron shot and I was going to hit it."

He hit it perfectly.

As that second shot reached the putting surface and rolled toward the hole, the crowd in the grandstands behind the green erupted in cheers. Perez tipped his cap and didn't stop grinning until he tapped in the final putt.

His final-round 3-under par 69 gave him a 90-hole score of 327, three shots better than Merrick. Even the weather conditions that played havoc with most of the field that day didn't get to Perez.

"I actually didn't mind the wind blowing all the way around," he said. "If it had been a perfect day, somebody back in the pack could have gone out and shot 61 or 62. But it was tough. I figured if I could just play solid golf and hit some good shots and stay calm and think about what I was doing out there, I was going to be fine."

He was more than fine. And the second 50 years of the tournament appear to be in the same condition.

For more than a half century the Bob Hope has been one of the premier stops on the PGA Tour, all a credit to Bob Hope himself, who always held court on the first tee and shot zingers at every player in the tournament, even himself, much to the delight of

the crowd. And though Hope passed away in 2003 shortly after his 100th birthday, the traditions of mixing the best players in the world with amateur partners and celebrities from the world of entertainment and sports continues with Palmer, a five-time winner of the tournament, assuming the role as guest host.

"Bob Hope was one of the pioneers from the entertainment industry to support the PGA Tour," the man known as "The King" said. "Who knows what would have happened to the Tour if people like Bob, Bing Crosby and Clark Gable and their friends didn't support golf and make more people aware of the game? Their support helped the professional game and the PGA Tour."

Nowhere is that more evident than with this tournament. The participation of celebrities from the world of entertainment sports and even politics brings something to this event that doesn't happen around normal PGA Tour stops.

From the early days of the event, the Bob Hope Classic has attracted an unbelievable array of celebrities. Jackie Gleason, Sammy Davis Jr., Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin, Bing Crosby, Burt Lancaster and Kirk Douglas all participated during the tournament's early years, while Clint Eastwood, Kevin Costner, Cheech Marin, George Lopez, Bill Murray and Kevin Sorbo have represented Hollywood over the past few years. Johnny Bench, Willie Mays, Don Drysdale, Sandy Koufax and Joe DiMaggio have represented Major League Baseball, and the NFL has been represented by John Elway.



Even politicians from both sides of the aisle, including former vice president Dan Quayle and former speaker of the house Tip O'Neil, have teed it up together at the Hope.

And if the field—both professional and amateur—isn't enough to draw fans, the desert courses that have been part of this event have their own cachet. The original four courses for the tournament were Bermuda Dunes, Indian Wells, Tamarisk and Thunderbird, but over the years Eldorado, La Quinta Country Club, the Stadium Course at PGA West, and the Classic Club joined the rotation.

For 2010, SilverRock, La Quinta Country Club, the Nicklaus Private Course at PGA West and the Palmer Private Course at PGA West will be used over the first four rounds, with the final round slated fittingly for the Palmer Private Course at PGA West. Playing on

them will be a field of 128 PGA Tour professionals and 384 amateurs, making it likely that some of your favorite public figures will be part of the party.

And a party it will be. But when it comes down to the heart of the tournament, what's really special about the Hope is that it has benefitted Coachella Valley charities to the tune of more than \$47 million over the past 50 years—and it's still going strong.

## **HOW TO DO THE BOB HOPE CLASSIC**

Desert Golf Magazine's insider guide to joining the action on and off the course and hobnobbing with celebrities and pros at one of the desert's most beloved golf tournaments

All right. You love professional golf, you've got your fedora with turned-up brim front and back, and you fancy a well-prepared martini. It's clear you'll be attending the Bob Hope Classic when it hits the Coachella Valley January 18-24.

Your keen sense of fashion and love of Frank Sinatra means you're probably in a Hope frame of mind year-round and look forward with great anticipation to the desert's PGA Tour stop, be it your first or your 50th. However, even veterans can maximize their Hope experience with a few well-directed pointers.

The first thing to keep in mind is that the Hope is a five-round tournament. Don't show up on Wednesday expecting to see practice rounds. The real deal will be underway, with celebrities playing one course in the four-course rotation daily, before they drop off on Sunday to let the pros shoot it out amongst themselves.

Arrive early, perhaps Monday, and check into one of the many resorts or hotels in the valley, or even into La Quinta itself, where all four competition courses are located this year. La Quinta Resort, not surprisingly, is the host hotel for the event, meaning many players and celebrities will be occupying various casitas. Because of its accommodating size, there's still a chance of booking your room right where the glitterati are based.

You arrive Monday to settle into your room and get ready for Tuesday's practice rounds, the day celebrities and Tour pros walk amongst the lightest galleries of the week. Professionals are typically at their loosest at this time, and the relaxed, almost informal atmosphere at the Hope encourages players and celebrities alike to mingle with the heartiest of fans, the ones out for practice.

"Tuesday practice rounds is the time to get close to the pros and the celebrities," says Clarke Rheney, celebrity-relations manager for the tournament. "You can follow around, say, a Fred Couples, and he makes a putt and you say, 'Nice putt, Freddie,' and he's going to look up and say, 'Thank you.'


"Also, the crowds like to follow the celebrities," Rheney adds. "So, you can go out during the practice rounds and, if he's not playing with a celebrity, follow a guy like Charley Hoffman who's a great player and a super nice guy. He'll chat with you about pretty much anything while you're walking down the fairway. A lot of them are very accessible."

When the sun rises Wednesday, you hit the snooze button. An hour later, you're up and on the tournament website, bobhopeclassic.com, to glean the day's tee times and determine where your favorite pros will be playing. You check the shuttle routes to and from each course, and preview the Hope Village happenings that day and night at the













Palmer Private Course, which serves as "tournament headquarters." You're already armed with the knowledge that celebs play the SilverRock Resort Course on Wednesday, La Quinta Country Club on Thursday, PGA West Nicklaus Private Course on Friday and PGA West Palmer Private Course on Saturday, where the pros go it alone for the title on Sunday.

Palmer Private will also be home to the newest—and what will surely be the most popular—change: the creation of a "party hole" on the par-3 No. 17. Tournament officials are planning various competitions and contests for fans based in the No. 17 grandstands, capable of holding an estimated 2,000 fans.

Of course, every night in the Coachella Valley offers a cornucopia of dining and entertainment options; however, during the Hope, one must zero in on the spots famously frequented by tournament participants. Castelli's, the Italian institution in Palm Desert, is a favorite of the stars and Tour pros, and sightings are beyond frequent. The

> magnificent food and personal touches enhance the feeling that you're a somebody, even if you're surrounded by stars.

> The Beer Hunter sports bar in La Quinta is also a favorite gathering point/watering hole for Tour players and caddies alike. Another night should be blocked off for a visit to Devane's Restaurant in La Quinta's Old Town, owned and operated by actor William Devane and his son Josh. Hope week offers a great opportunity to meet both Devanes and dine with some of their close friends.

> It's a good thing you have an extra night at the Hope because you can't miss having an Arnold Palmer at Arnold Palmer's Restaurant, also in La Quinta. Don't come for hamburgers and club sandwiches; Arnie's true good taste is on display at the upscale restaurant with a private club feel.

> After all that, it's either back home satisfied, or get on the phone to a real estate agent the Monday after the tournament to start living the Hope Classic lifestyle year-round.



# EAGLE FALLS GOLF COURSE AND FANTASY SPRINGS RESORT CASINO ARE HOST TO THE STARS



## **WELCOME BACK, ESCENA GOLF CLUB**

The revived venue with retro-glam ambiance is a return to Palm Spring's glory days

That's no desert mirage. Escena Golf Club is back and in a big way, re-opened in November after an extensive revival of facilities. With contemporary amenities and a "mid-century modern" style, its distinctive clubhouse is the centerpiece of a venue that evokes the "Rat Pack" glory days of the 1960s. Picture Dean Martin on the No. 1 tee with a golf club in one hand, martini glass in the other. While the club brings the experience of retro-glam golf back to Palm Springs, Escena's renaissance may also signal a return to better times.

"For golfers, it's like the welcoming home of a long-lost friend," says CEO of Sunrise Golf Management, Mark Tansey, whose firm now directs the club's operations. "But the rebirth of Escena represents the fact that no matter what's been happening to the economy or golf or the residential community, it's a bright spot—hopefully we can serve as a beacon to the industry that things are starting to look up. Our belief is that we will lead the way for other properties in the next wave of golf-course construction and development in the United States."

Escena was first developed in 2005 and immediately created a buzz in the Coachella Valley. Golfers relished its championship-golf layout, amazing views and overall ambiance, despite the fact it was still a work-in-progress. While the course was in place, the clubhouse and cart barn were temporary stand-ins for permanent structures being built. During an ownership transition in 2007, the daily-fee venue was closed to the public, but it wasn't abandoned. The turf was tended and maintained by Sunrise Golf staff. In April 2009, management was given the go-ahead to bring the course back to tip-top form, including the daunting task of adding nearly 50,000 plants and trees to enhance the look of a classic desert landscape.

Fittingly, the course is a classic Jack Nicklaus design, playing 7,200 yards from the tips with a layout that takes full advantage of spectacular mountain-desert surroundings. "It's a beautiful golf course, very player-friendly, while it also challenges expert golfers," says Jon Garner, design associate for Nicklaus Design.

Wide-open fairways lure big-hitters, and four sets of tees let all golfers choose their playing experience. Subtle '60s course design aesthetics include rounded stone on rock walls and bridges, as well as

the addition of the same type of palm trees that first lined golf courses during the area's heyday. The 16,000-square-foot clubhouse is a classic Palm Springs design, with a majestic restaurant and private dining room, full bar and multiple event lawns.

"Escena will become the centerpiece of the Palm Springs community," Garner predicts.

Golfers returning to Escena will be pleasantly surprised. "First and foremost, now it's a complete facility with a beautiful clubhouse and pro shop, putting and chipping complex, and it has a warm-up range that wasn't here previously," says Tansey. "It's a largely different facility and experience than the standard golf course, and we want our service to be consistent with everything else in the project. It was highly thought of and well-loved, and Sunrise is excited to be a part of Escena Golf Club."

While the club is available for all area hotel guests, management has already aligned with two properties. "Because of the eclectic nature of our clubhouse and golf experience, we have really positive programs in place with the Riviera Resort & Spa and Hotel Zoso. They are both also mid-century modern, a very retro experience, and what guests see at the hotel is what they will see at the golf course—an extension of their hotel stay."








New general manager and PGA member Todd Connelly brings almost three decades of industry experience to the club, including production of large-scale and qualifying golf events. "We intend to assemble the finest management team in the Coachella Valley and create a worldclass golf and social destination for visitors from far and near," he says.

Escena is a natural for special events. "The clubhouse is designed for weddings, banquets and parties with a private dining room for smaller events," says Tansey. "Part of the process was creating event space outside, right in front of the lake and Mt. San Jacinto—the views are stunning. It's more than just a golf facility, but also for events, and people should come here for the dining experience as well. It's hard to describe the patio, enjoying views of the golf course, lakes, big trees and landscaping.

"We get asked a lot about the course being closed and we're happy to answer that. But now that we're open, it's more exciting to say, 'Look what you have today."

## REDISCOVER IRONWOOD COUNTRY CLUB

Coachella Valley's hillside venue sparkles after \$24 million in club and course enhancements

Perched on a hillside, Ironwood Country Club has enjoyed a bird's-eye view of the Coachella Valley since it was created in 1973. It's had a great reputation since day one, and why not? Two distinctive golf courses encompass the spectrum of playing experiences, one a U.S. Open qualifying site. Members and guests have continuously soaked up a myriad of club amenities and activities in one of the most incredible golf locations in Palm Desert with its dynamite panoramic views of the valley and adjacent Santa Rosa Mountains.

Life at Ironwood has been good. Now, it's even better. Ironwood has had an extreme makeover to the tune of \$24 million. Sparkling new facilities and a reconfigured golf course now offer a more accurate reflection of the club's core foundation of top management, solid finances and genial atmosphere.

"We're moving full-steam-ahead for the future, and concentrating on getting out the message to come and rediscover Ironwood's new facilities and redesigned golf course," says Gene Molenkamp, director of membership development. "People may have been here in the past, but now we have a new clubhouse and fitness center. We just want to get people inside the gates to recognize what we have here."

Old facilities were gutted and replaced with stylish counterparts. The new 50,000-square-foot Tuscan-style clubhouse includes a private dining area, meeting rooms and banquet facilities, plush locker rooms and an award-winning pro shop. The patio offers course and mountain views that are unparalleled in the area. At the turn, "Spikes" has been designed for a pleasant course-side breakfast or lunch. The original tennis facility was replaced with a state-of-theart fitness center featuring 14 new tennis courts, pool and resort-like spa area, as well as a comprehensive workout room with personal trainers.



Golf at Ironwood is unique. Two 18-hole courses provide diverse challenges for players of all abilities—from the short, target-golf design of North Course to the lengthy, championship layout of South Course. Ironwood's head golf professional, Mike Oberlander, says, "We have more grassland or 'parkland' than the newer desert courses." It sets us apart with a lot of greenery and a great look."

Unlike at many clubs, homes here are rarely seen, bordering only the North Course on nine holes. Desmond Muirhead and Ted Robinson created the original 36 holes in consultation with Arnold Palmer, and the recent course redesign was handled by former PGA Tour member John Fought.

"Now both courses complement each other and encompass players of all abilities," says Oberlander. "Members love the golf course, and rave about its great location and condition. It's always immaculate, just superb."



The North Course is a 6,100-yard, par-70 layout with small greens and strategically placed sand traps. Oberlander says there's a premium on scoring even though this course is shorter. The South Course is a true championship experience, playing a rugged 7,256 yards from the tips.

"It's harder to score [on the South] because although greens are larger, everything is proportional: bunkers are more challenging and there are more hazards, such as water coming into play," Oberlander notes. "The biggest challenge is the length, but six sets of tees allow golfers to choose their yardage."

Along with the elevated location and amazing views, elevation changes on both courses make Ironwood's 36 holes a memorable playing experience.


"The course has stood the test of time and it's always in excellent condition," says Oberlander. "Our course superintendant Mark Cupit does a great job on both courses. Each spring the South Course hosts a U.S. Open qualifying tournament and we buff it up for top players as well as everyday member play. It's outstanding; there are no tricks. It's hard to score on, but a fair test."

Members come from around the country, plus Ireland and England. Home ownership within the Ironwood community of 1,100 sites isn't a requirement, but it's a primary residence for many and secondary home for others. The club is known for its genuine camaraderie between the friendly staff and members; the same seasonal staff members return every year. With a plethora of activities, socializing is easy and the membership vibe so welcoming that close friendships are a given.


"It's easy for new members to get involved and make friends," Oberlander says, "The club has a full event schedule that members relish. They're proud of their club and when guests comment on what a well-kept secret Ironwood is, we know word is getting out on what a great and special place it is."

# DESERT WILLOW GOLF RESORT'S "NEW" MOUNTAIN VIEW COURSE

Re-contouring of the Mountain View course greens, bunkers and lakes has made the highly playable layout better than ever

First opened in October 1998, the Mountain View course at Desert Willow Golf Resort has been newly renovated with a redesign of the greens, bunkers and lakes. The greens, all the bunkers filled with new sand and the lakes have been restored to their original excellence of design and challenge. The Michael Hurdzan / Dana Fry layout shines even brighter now, giving all 18 holes a more consistent playing condition.

Hurdzan, who has a doctorate in Environmental Plant Physiology, is an industry authority on golf course environmental issues. The team, composed of Hurdzan, Fry and PGA Tour player John Cook, with assistance from local landscape architect Eric Johnson, created a plan that embraced the natural color and beauty of the desert landscape while respecting the fragility of natural resources necessary to maintain a golf course. A system of reclaimed water

and indigenous plants that minimize the necessity for that water were put into place. The result is not just a more environmentally attuned course but also a course that's terrific to play.

"Those who have played the Mountain View course before will notice improved playability and a quicker pace of play" says Director of Golf Darrell Souza.

There are, for example, no forced carries over desert areas or water as there are on the resort's more challenging Firecliff course. Souza points out that wider fairways on the Mountain View course "fit the eye of the average golfer," but notes, too, that players can get lost in the beauty of the golf course given that every hole has a 360-degree scenic view of the mountains.



Mountain View keeps its original length of 6,913 yards from the black tees, 6,507 yards from the blue tees and 6,128 yards from the white tees. It's on No. 6 and No, 18, both par 5s, that the green and bunkering changes are most noticeable. A total of 13 bunkers on the 386-yard, par-4 16th hole have been re-contoured, and the 11th green has been expanded, giving players a more relaxed feeling as they stand on the tee box of this pretty little par-3 over water. Whether you are a regular player on this course as many Coachella Valley residents are, or a first-time visitor, there is much to enjoy.

Both of Desert Willow's golf courses are attention-getters. Firecliff is the tournament-tested, highly challenging course, and even though Firecliff and Mountain View combined accommodate more than 85,000 rounds per year, players never feel rushed because they tee off at ten minute intervals. Firecliff was named the No.2 top public course in the desert in *Desert Golf Magazine's* 2009 and 2010 annual Top Ten Poll, voted on by golf industry leaders

of the region. Now the new Mountain View Course is ready to take its place among the best of the best.

If you have not been to this Palm Desert golf club you probably don't know what to expect when you turn off Country Club Drive onto the mile-long Desert Willow Drive. The manicured fairways and scenic desert landscape are just a prelude to the entire facility and experience. In addition to two superb golf courses, Desert Willow also has a well-appointed 33,000-square-foot clubhouse with expansive views of the Santa Rosa Mountains. Plaques on the wall attest to the fact that this place is special, noting that *Golf Digest* gave Desert Willow a 4 ½ star rating and listed its courses among the Best Places to Play. The club is also home to the Palm Desert Golf Academy, which offers one- to three-day golf schools as well as custom club fitting, under the leadership of Paul Bucy, director of instruction.





From start to finish Desert Willow Golf Resort is a place to which guests want to return again and again. It's a golf facility where players feel more like members than customers, thanks to exceptional personalized service and attention to detail. In short, in a state with no lack of phenomenal golf clubs, Desert Willow can lay claim to being one of the finest municipal facilities in California, and the city of Palm Desert can be justifiably proud of this desert gem, knowing that it just keeps getting better.

Or the first putter with a multi-layer insert surrounded by black copper? Thankfully, golf remains a sport in which craftsmanship, passion and simple good looks are just as important as performance. A visit to the PGA Merchandise Show, held in late January in Orlando, is three days spent with people who are passionate about golf and passionate about striving to produce and market the finest golf equipment made. This holiday season, if you're looking for something golf-ish, you're in luck. Remember the old saying that the best gift is a gift that you don't want to give away? You'll find it very difficult to give away any of the items that follow.

#### **APPAREL**

When the weather is cool but not cold, the classic sweater vest is always stylish. For the bold dresser, **the Golf Knickers argyle vest in orange and white** (\$79) is an affordable way to add some color to your wardrobe. For a more muted approach, the **Ben Hogan v-neck in merino wool** (\$119) is classically styled. For the ultimate in comfort and warmth, ladies should try the **Liz Claiborne turtleneck golf sweater in cashmere** (\$149). And although you may not be able to play as well as Ian Poulter, you can wear trousers that look exactly like his. How? He has his own line of pants—but because he's from England, we'll call them trousers. For the full effect, try the **Ian Poulter Limited Edition Jack Tartan Trousers** (\$199); make sure you have your sunglasses at hand.

#### **EQUIPMENT**

When it comes to golf equipment, drivers tend to get most of the publicity, but the number and variety of wedges has increased almost exponentially over the last few years. It's hard to beat those from **Cleveland**. The new **CG15 wedges** (\$125) are laser milled and available in a variety of finishes and, most importantly, a number of bounce and loft combinations. However, for sheer indulgence, why not ask for a custom-built wedge from **Scratch Golf**? The company (*scratchgolf.com*) offers the only PGA Tour department that's open to the general public. Pricing depends on the wedge built, but off-the-shelf models are competitively priced at around \$149.



The Callaway Odyssey putters are popular with Tour players and the selection has just expanded with the addition of the White Ice line. Callaway accurately describes the Sabretooth (\$250) as "radical" yet the fangs (yes, fangs) help with alignment. Callaway recently introduced a rarity for the company, a forged club. The X-Forged irons (\$899) offer the forgiveness that has made Callaway popular with average golfers but also offer the feel and workability that forged clubs provide. Titleist has some new irons coming on the market. The Titleist MB forged (\$135 per iron) are classic muscle-backs and the AP1 model (\$100 per iron) offers Titleist design and technology with advanced forgiveness. Taylor-Made has transferred some of its driver technology to the new R9 irons (\$999). They're forgiving with a large sweet spot but have a very thin face and thus lack the "clunkiness" of some newer game-improvement irons.

For the better golfer, **Ping** introduced the **i15** driver (\$399). It has a slight fade bias and a 460cc deep face design; it's a good choice for the low-handicapper who wants to fade or draw the ball off the tee.




#### **ACCESSORIES, BOOKS & DVDS**

SkyCaddie's HoleVue provides an image of each hole using SkyGolf's maps and there's even a zoom function. Do you like Caddyshack? If you love the movie or if you have a friend or relative who loves the movie, then this writer's book will make everyone happy. The Book of Caddyshack...Everything you Always Wanted to Know About the Greatest Movie Ever Made is available from bookstores and Amazon.com (\$16.95). The small and portable **Kodak ZI8 video** camera (\$179) is perfect for filming your swing or capturing the beauty of a golf trip to Scotland. If your golf gear is all over the garage and you're the type of person who likes life to be organized, the **Proactive Golf Bag Organizer** is a steal at around \$90; it can handle two bags plus shoes, balls and all that 'stuff' that tends to get lost in the crevasses and crevices of the golfer's garage. Finally, if you are a fan of all those Golf Channel Golf Academy shows, then you'll be delighted to know that the best of the Jim McLean episodes is now available on DVD (\$29.95).

Will you be able to wrap any of these, or will these items find their way into your golf arsenal?



## THE LAST "FBR OPEN"

It's going to get a new name after the 2010 tournament is played, but it will likely still be the "greatest show on grass"

The PGA Tour tournament that has been played in the Phoenix/Scottsdale Area since 1932 has been called a lot of things.

It's been the Arizona Open. It's been the Phoenix Open. It's been the FBR Open.

It's been the world's largest cocktail party held on a golf course. It's even been the largest outdoor insane asylum on the face of the earth.

And now, it's looking for a new name. With the tournament's title-sponsor contract with FBR expiring after the 2010 playing of the event at the TPC Scottsdale on Feb. 25-28—new dates that will get the event off Super Bowl Sunday—the Thunderbirds, the local organization that administers the tournament's many charities, are currently searching for a new sponsor.

"FBR has been the finest partner a tournament could ask for," said Tim Lewis, Big Chief of the Thunderbirds. "Together we have become the leader in charitable giving on the PGA Tour. While we are extremely disappointed that we need to find a new sponsor, we are pleased that we were able to work out a plan that gives us a reasonable timeframe to replace FBR with as little impact or disruption as possible. When FBR told us of their decision not to continue beyond 2010, we concluded that this early transitional strategy made the most sense for everyone involved."

And given a year for the Thunderbirds, with help from the PGA Tour, to find a new title sponsor, there is no reason for the party to stop.

"We appreciate FBR's effort to help elevate the visibility of the tournament over the past six years," said PGA Tour commissioner Tim Finchem. "We will begin working diligently with the Thunderbirds to find a new title sponsor. In the meantime, we look forward to FBR's continued involvement with the FBR Open in 2010."

And if 2010 is anything like 2009, it won't be over until after it's supposed to be over. Kenny Perry, the PGA Tour's ageless wonder, defeated Charley Hoffman on the third hole of a sudden-death playoff to hoist the crystal trophy that goes to the winner. After both the 48-year-old Perry, who was playing in the event for the 22nd time in his career, and Hoffman went bogey-par over the first two holes of sudden-death, Perry finally ended things by rolling in a 22-foot birdie putt from the fringe of the par-4 17th at the TPC Scottsdale.



"The playoff was pretty ugly," said Perry, who had won four times in 2008 and was a star for the victorious U.S. Ryder Cup team. "We were hitting it everywhere and having to scramble from all over the place."

With the victory, Perry became the oldest player to win the tournament, breaking the record of Julius Boros who was 46 when he won in 1967. But playing with the kids is nothing new for Perry, who had one of the hottest hands on the PGA Tour over the 12 months leading into the FBR Open.

"It feels kind of funny playing with all these young kids nowadays," Perry said. "But to me, this was a place I felt like I could always win."

That feeling took wings when his birdie putt on the third playoff hole found the cup.

"It had a little more speed on it than I thought, but then it kind of just hugged right inside that right edge and the hole sucked it down," Perry said. "Pretty exciting, pretty nice way to win one."

Hoffman, who won the Bob Hope Chrysler in 2007, got into the playoff when Perry bogeyed the final hole of regulation.

"Kenny gave me a few opportunities, I gave him a few opportunities, and he happened to close the door," Hoffman said.


Kevin Na, who rallied from six strokes back early in the final round, finished third, missing the playoff party by just one stroke when an eight-foot putt on the 72nd hole didn't find the cup.

"I couldn't have gotten off to a worst start," said Na, who was second at the 2005 FBR Open and finished fourth in 2008. "I was all over the lot, but I've got a great short game and I made every putt I could except the last one. But I'm going to win here someday."

And Na won't care what they call the tournament, the fourth oldest on the PGA Tour.

"The Thunderbirds have made this tournament one of the crown jewels of the PGA Tour," said Eric Billings, chairman and CEO of FBR, which began sponsoring the tournament in 2004. "Given the scale, unique attributes and overall quality of the event, we expect there will be little difficulty in securing another title sponsor."





## **BIRTH OF THE NEW HYUNDAI**

The Genesis is a true luxury car that won't break—or even dent—the bank, and it's turning heads in the most well-heeled circles

Hyundai isn't the first car that materializes in most minds dreaming of luxury machines. Such is the fate of an automaker with a sordid past. But the Hyundai Genesis is a leaf turned over by the automaker, giving luxury models with centuries of awards real competition for the hearts and minds of us discerning buyers.

Is the Genesis truly a new beginning?

Let your imagination run wild with this new arrival on the main stage of high-end cars. The Genesis sedan is a rear-wheel drive auto with spirit and grace. Mature beyond its years, the Genesis was only released last year, and immediately Hyundai captured North American Car of the Year honors with the sleek powerhouse.

The 2010 sedan's 4.6-liter V8 bundles a 375 horsepower engine with a six-speed, automatic transmission. The Genesis coupe packs 306 horsepower in its V6 engine and has the look of a lion after a gazelle. Both are bold moves for the South Korean automaker whose reputation has been more discount than debutant.

The sedan's interior feels upscale—think Audi or Lexis. Leather, wood and chrome trim out a spacious cabin, and all-leather seats say executive level position if not, perhaps, of a Fortune 500 company. State-of-the-art controls compete on every level in their simplicity and functionality.

"The Genesis comes fully loaded for thousands less than the competitors," says Elias Mearz, sales associate at Wiley Hyundai in Cathedral City, Calif. "I'm more impressed by this one car than any of the other cars I've sold."

Ripping through the six gears, the sedan feels like it always has a little more to give. The redesigned V8 engine that helped captured Car of the Year awards is long in power, while the rear-wheel drive gives the car an aggressive feel even though it weighs more than 4,000 pounds.

"When customers see it, they say, 'wow,'" comments Mearz. "Then they drive it and realize how quiet and smooth it is and they are 100-percent sold."

Everything in the Genesis is made to compete with the Big Dogs on the road, from the touch-screen navigation system to the laser-guided cruise-control system. The stereo is one of only two models on the market made by Lexicon. The other: in a Rolls Royce. It's a 14-speaker system that pours into the cabin like sunshine. Clear and pure, there appears to be no expense held back on this sometimes overlooked feature.





The cooled driver's seat is a nice touch on those Indian summer days, while the heated seats make a drive to Tahoe enjoyable even on the worst of winter mornings. The rear seat has a ski pass-through that makes the trip to Tahoe even easier.

An optional rear backup camera gives an added touch and shows that Hyundai isn't backing down from adding features that many of its higher priced competitors offer. Tack on the famous Hyundai ten-year, 100,000-mile power train warranty and you have a keeper. As one sales manager said, "Hyundai isn't offering that warranty because they have to. They are offering it because they believe in the product they are putting on the market."

An interesting fact about the 2009 Genesis that has some dealerships a bit stuck: there are very few models being traded in. Hyundai's certified used car sales departments can't seem to find any owners who want to get rid of these cars, which makes reselling them very difficult. It's unlikely the 2010 model will have any higher trade-in ratio as its added interior features and growing cachet have only helped Hyundai.



"We've had owners trade in their Audi, Mercedes and BMWs for a Genesis," says Mearz.

The trend is likely to continue as consumers realize that the Genesis is the beginning of a beautiful friendship between car and driver—all the amenities you want with none of the bloated price tag.

The Genesis sedan comes fully loaded for about \$42,000, while a base model coupe is around \$22,000. Try that in a BMW 328i and you'll shell out nearly \$50,000 for about 150 less horsepower.

Of course, you'll have that really cool emblem on the hood.

But Ernie's is far more than a place to meet before, after or during a game—football or golf. The restaurant has long been a vision of Davis Sezna, president of PGA West and La Quinta Resort & Club, and he could not be more proud.

"The double cheeseburger and the New York style buffalo wings are a must have" he says.

In addition to the food, much thought was given to the atmosphere and spaces inside and outside the restaurant. An evening can be enjoyed around the fire pit on the patio overlooking the fairways







and the mountains in the distance. Ernie's private wine room is an ideal setting for a special gathering. The open and friendly bar is a place to savor that well-deserved beverage or simply take in the views that include the legendary TPC Stadium and Jack Nicklaus Tournament courses. 
Not to mention location, location, location. The restaurant's location inside PGA West's Tournament Clubhouse makes it special, indeed. On entering the large clubhouse lobby you are immediately drawn to the PGA Hall of Fame Wall showcasing the many tournaments and golfing events hosted at PGA West. Photos of golf's greatest professionals and celebrities take you back to singular moments in the history of the game, many that you probably witnessed in person or on TV. Arnold Palmer, Jack Nicklaus, Bob Hope, Lee Trevino, David Duvall, presidents Gerald Ford and Bill Clinton—they're all there letting you know this is one special place to be. On the floor is a Walk of Fame with the names and dates of all of the winners of the Bob Hope Classic over the years of its great history.

There is no question that Sezna dreams big. Everything inside and outside of Ernie's, including the clubhouse, well-appointed pro

shop and the patio with its outstanding views, came from the extraordinary vision of Sezna and his team.

The Club at PGA West opened for membership in 1985, and the enthusiasm of members was evident even before the first course opened for play in 1986. The facility earned the title "Western Home of Golf in America" by hosting an impressive collection of notable tournaments, including those on the PGA Tour, Senior PGA Tour, LPGA Tour, and NCAA. 

PGA West is still host of the Bob Hope Classic and PGA Tour Qualifying School finals. But it is also a place where nonprofessionals can play and challenge themselves on some of the finest golf courses in the nation. No one is suggesting that's easy. Pete Dye said of his Stadium Course, "Thanks to Ernie Vossler and Joe Walser, I had the opportunity to design and build the Stadium Course. Love and hate can be found here."

So go ahead. Challenge yourself. And after the last putt drops, Ernie's is the place to gather for a recap of your day and to strategize how you're going to take on the next course. Whatever your score, the food and atmosphere will do you good.

"The champagne diamonds are cheaper than white diamonds yet have the same clarity, and a wonderful contrast. They have a lot of brilliancy, are fairly clean and large and the response has been good."

The Stars For Africa Collection allows clients to look good and do some good at the same time. Masica donates five percent of each sale to charity, and clients may select a charitable organization when they make their purchase. ## A COURSE IN COURAGE

## Jack Nicklaus and others in the golf world step up for American vets


This past November, Jack Nicklaus, the Golden Bear himself, presented "A Course in Courage: Healing America's Veterans through Golf," to members and invited guests at Bighorn Golf Club in South Palm Desert. Joined by Ken Still and Pepper Roberts, Nicklaus shared stories of "golf and good deeds," and hosted a golf clinic as part of a fundraising effort to benefit the expansion of American Lake Veterans Golf Course and the disabled veterans who want to play golf there every day.

Guests gathered for a "speaker's evening" to launch the event November 16th, hovering in crisp air and candlelight by the Bighorn clubhouse pool. Overlooking the darkened golf course, twinkling lights in the valley below and rugged silhouette of the Santa Rosa mountains, the entertainment area was festive, the mood respectful, even impassioned.

"It's not about us, it's about them," emcee and comedian Tom Dreesen said, after the singing of the National Anthem. He delighted the audience with trademark humor, but also praised the efforts and sacrifice of American veterans, reminding everyone that it's the soldier—not the journalist, the entertainer, the golfer, the real estate tycoon—who has given us our freedoms.

"By serving under the flag, these men and women are telling each one of us, 'you're worth dying for," Dreesen said.





American Lake Veterans Golf Course is located near Seattle, Wash., and it's the only golf facility in the country dedicated entirely to the needs of disabled veterans. The relevance of this course reaches across the nation and through generations. Those involved in building and expanding American Lake hope that it will serve as a prototype for similar locations throughout the country.


The Palm Desert event was hosted in part by the R.D. & Joan Dale Hubbard Foundation. Mr. Hubbard, chairman of Bighorn Golf Club, urged guests to contribute generously with their hearts and checkbooks. He hoped to raise \$1 million over the two days to facilitate construction of a new golf course, clubhouse and rehabilitation center, and to provide customized equipment at American Lake. The Jack Nicklaus organization will donate designs for the anticipated golf course.

Among the speakers and participants at the presentation were three disabled veterans who have benefited from the American Lake course physically, as well as in less tangible but more deeply personal ways, including confidence, camaraderie and joy for life.

One of the younger veterans, who has been deployed seven times and lost his arm throwing a grenade away from his unit, got a little choked up as he looked out over the crowd. He made perhaps the simplest and most sincere statement of the evening.

"I don't know what to say besides, 'Thank you,"
