n earthquake shook the world of women's golf in April when the No. 1 female player in the world — popular, friendly and vivacious Lorena Ochoa — announced young. Three years to the date that she first ascended to the top of the Rolex Women's World Golf Rankings, Ochoa held an emotional press conference and withdrew from the LPGA Tour. She will play in only a few events and in her annual invitational tournament in Guadalajara, Mexico, where she grew up.


A tremendously talented athlete and an explosive golfer with extraordinary abilities, Ochoa created a chain of friendship wherever she played. Fans and groundskeepers alike felt her generosity of spirit. She was even known to cook breakfast for tournament support staff. Unpretentious, giving, open and accessible, Ochoa marked golf indelibly in her short, meteoric career.

"Now is a new life," she continued, "a normal person's life, and giving back to my family plus working on my interests and the Lorena Ochoa foundation. I have always wanted to be remembered as a person, for what I do outside of the golf course."

Until her marriage last December to Aeromexico executive Anders Conesa, Ochoa was still living at home with her parents. Conesa, a father of three children, is 12 years her senior. Ochoa wants to have a year or so to travel with him before they start their own family.

Family has been key in Ochoa's journey. Alejandro, her brother and manager, has been her constant travel companion. Her father and other family members and friends have been present with her as she played her way to the top of the Tour. It's not just her amazing shot-making that will be missed but also her smile and spontaneity.

As a Rolex Ambassador, Ochoa will continue to play a role for golfand charity.



Perhaps nowhere was that more apparent than in Mexico City the night before her globally broadcast press conference. Friends, family and sponsors—Rolex, Lacoste, Ping and Banamex among them—came from across the world to share in an emotional evening filled with memories, good wishes, tears, laughter and joy. Ochoa is an icon like no other in Mexico, but she is also revered worldwide.

"This is a special day for me," she said. "I have been wanting this for a time, dreaming of it, a decision from my heart with joy. I am happy, in peace. Thank you all. I always wanted to play my last event in Mexico; it will be Morelia next week.

"We respect her decision. It is her life. Of course we are sad," declared Jean-Noel Bioul of Rolex at dinner the evening before the press conference. To Ochoa he declared, "You will still be with us, part of the Rolex family."

Since her first LPGA win in 2004 at the Franklin American Mortgage Championship, Ochoa amassed 27 wins including two majors—the 2007 Women's British Open at St. Andrews and the 2008 Kraft Nabisco Championship in Rancho Mirage when she famously jumped into the lake at the 18th green with her parents, brother, caddie and a slew of friends and family while a mariachi band played.

Her career seemed to be destiny. At the University of Arizona she set records with 12 NCAA collegiate golf victories. She made first team All-American in 2002 with the same stellar

performances that she had in Junior Golf. After turning professional in May 2002, she won three events on the Futures Tour and finished at No. 1, giving her exempt status for the 2003 LPGA season. She was 2003 Rolex Rookie of the Year, and her fiery, aggressive play catapulted her into the rankings and record books.

Yet even at the young age of 20 she was focused as much on life beyond golf as on reaching the highest pinnacle of her game. "By 30," she said, "I want to be number one in the world, then I will stop golf, get married and have children."

She echoed this thought several years later when discussing Annika Sorenstam's decision to step away from competitive golf. As she made that same decision





and to the organizations to which she has lent her support. There is no doubt that she will be remembered just as she hoped to be: for what she has accomplished on the golf course and beyond the golf course, too. Viva, viva, viva Lorena and hasta luego.

"This day may be the most special day to me. Just like the lake jump at the Kraft with half of Guadalajara in with me. So many memories we all started together, and we all finish together now."

Ochoa became Rolex World Number One in 2007, succeeding Annika Sorenstam. About Ochoa's departure from competitive golf Sorentsam said, "I was surprised, but not shocked when I heard the news. She has accomplished so much in such a short time. It is hard to play and play at the level you demand of yourself when your heart and mind are somewhere else. I am very happy for her."

Brittany Lincicome, 2009 Kraft Nabisco Champion who succeeded Ochoa, echoed the sentiments of many Tour colleagues. "She's been an amazing leader on the LPGA tour. She will be greatly missed but I'm soooo happy that she is putting herself first! I wish her nothing but the best in the future."

Ochoa has been true to her Mexican heritage, her faith, family, friends and golf. She has brought an image of warmth, excitement, respect and pride to the Tour

Shriners Hospitals for Children Open



or the 28th straight year, the PGA Tour makes a fall stop in Las Vegas. The event, which has undergone numerous name changes but for the past two years has been the Justin Timberlake Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, is set for Oct. 18-24 at TPC Summerlin, one of Vegas' impressive private courses.

The tournament is chock full of history, from Tiger Woods' first PGA Tour victory (1996) to Jim Furyk's back-to-back wins (1998 and 1999, in addition to his win in 1995).

experience. And I was really proud how I played. I hit it just as well today as I have any other day.

"Even though I was nervous coming down the stretch, my second shot on 16 was probably the best shot I ever hit. I had to hit it perfect to get over the water. The wind is to the left, I tend to hit a cut. It was a tough shot for me to start out left and not lose it too far right with the water. That was a do-or-die shot. To pull it off, and it was probably the best swing I ever made, that was a big moment."



But Las Vegas charities are the real winners in this tournament as millions of dollars have been raised over the years to help benefit those in need. With the recent addition of Shriners Hospitals as title sponsor, the tournament has helped shed light on the needs of families whose children require medical care. These hospitals, 22 of them nationwide, provide care to children up to age 18 with burns, spinal cord injuries, orthopedic conditions and cleft lip and palate. What's more, the hospitals provide these services with no financial costs to the families.

The tournament delivers much to the fans as well. Defending champion Martin Laird, the first Scot to win on the PGA Tour since Sandy Lyle in 1988, will return to defend his title. Laird won in a three-hole playoff with UNLV graduate and Vegas favorite Chad Campbell along with 2007 champion George McNeil.

After the victory, his first on Tour, Laird was emotional. "It's the first time I'm ever in the final group," he told the media. "It's the first time I'm really in contention in the last round. It's a learning

The Las Vegas tournament still has high hopes to move into the spring schedule on the PGA Tour, but whether that happens, and how soon, depends on many factors.

"It's always a goal for everyone in the fall season to get into the regular season with the bigger tournaments," said Mike Zampini, operations and marketing manager for the tournament. "But, we're on the right track. It all depends on other tournament sponsorships, giving back to the community and being successful. We're in a good position, but we know we still have work to do."

That work includes getting more fans out to the course during tournament week. "There are an awful lot of entertainment things to do in Vegas," Zampini added. "We're doing our best to make sure the golf tournament is one of those choices."

The field over the past two years has been strong and Zampini believes 2010 will be just as strong.

"Jim Furyk and Anthony Kim being here last year was great," he said. "And Fred Couples came here two years ago. The families get to come out to Vegas and it says a lot that these guys want to come out to Vegas and play the event."

Rickie Fowler, a new Vegas resident, made his pro debut in last year's tournament and finished tied for seventh. Furyk tied for fourth.

Then there's also the benefit of the host being a musical genius. Timberlake headlines a concert during tournament week each year and, obviously, it's a huge draw for players and fans.


So now it's up to the fans to come out and add their support to a tournament that makes a huge difference to the families of children in need of medical care. According to Zampini, more than 25 charities are out selling tickets to the event this year to support the tournament and the charities that benefit from it.

"It's a great tournament with a great field," he said. "And, it's in a great city — Las Vegas. That adds up to a great week."

Ryder Cup Matches



Can Team USA triumph in Europe to retain the Cup so valiantly won at Valhalla? All eyes are on Wales



ounded over 80 years ago on prestige, pride and golfing camaraderie rather than prize money, the Ryder Cup matches have grown and evolved.

The History

The initial informal matches were played in 1921 at Gleneagles, Scotland. The British trounced the Americans 9-3. In 1926, London's Wentworth hosted another unofficial match. Samuel Ryder, an ardent spectator at Wentworth and a wealthy English seed-packet magnate, was a late-in-life golfer who took up the game after his 50th birthday. Ryder's private pro was British star Abe Mitchell. Mitchell beat then reigning British Open champion, American Jim Barnes, 8 and 7 in the singles. He partnered with George Duncan in the foursomes to beat Walter Hagen and Barnes, 9 and 8. The U.S. team was overwhelmed again, this time 13 1/2 to 1 1/2.

According to his daughter, Joan, "When the Americans came over for a match he would give a 'small friendly lunch party' for both teams."

Play formats have changed several times over the years. The current format was inaugurated in 1979: four four-ball and four foursomes matches the first two days, twelve singles matches on the third day for 28 total points.

Before Continental Europe players joined the competition, the team made up solely of players from Great Britain and Ireland won only three times from the Cup's inception. Since 1985, however, the Europeans have won eight of twelve Ryder Cup Matches.

The Course

The 38th Ryder Cup Matches will be played at Celtic Manor in Newport, Wales, from Oct. 1 to 3. This will be the first time in the history of the Cup that the matches will be played in Wales. The host



At tea after the matches, Ryder met with British team members Duncan and Mitchell. Hagen and U.S. teammate Emmett French joined them. The idea of a trophy and matches came from the tea table. Ryder enthusiastically ordered a gold chalice with Mitchell's likeness on the top — the Ryder Cup. In Ryder's view the matches were not just about competition but also about building relationships.

venue is a stunning five-star resort with a course built especially for the Matches. It's nestled on 1,400 acres of breathtaking woodlands only two hours from London. Of course, Welsh golfers from Ian Woosnam to Brian Hugget have played significant roles in many of the past Matches, both as players and captains.

The Twenty Ten Course, which opened July 2007, is the first course to have been designed and built specifically for the Ryder

Cup. The par 71, 7,493-yard layout offers optimum challenge to the world's best golfers in various match-play formats — a maximum of risk and reward opportunities. Long rough and greenside swales will be prevalent, and water hazards come into play on half the course. Nine new holes meander along the floor of the beautiful Usk Valley, complemented by nine remodeled holes that were part of the former Wentwood Hills Championship course. This course is also the first to consider the viewing needs of Ryder Cup fans. Great vantage points for the public were built into the overall design.

The Captains

U.S. Captain, California native son Corey Pavin, has the critical mission to retain the Cup at Celtic Manor. Winner of the 1995 U.S. Open at Shinnecock Hills, the 5'9" UCLA graduate has won around the world since turning pro in 1982. Known for years as "The Bulldog," Pavin's impressive achievements include 15 PGA victories, 12 international victories and participation in three Ryder Cup and two President's Cup matches. Having recently turned 50, Pavin is now playing on the 2010 Champions Tour as well as the PGA Tour. He wants to "to stay in touch with the guys

[who will make up the team], playing as much as possible with them."

Pavin has an impressive 60percent win record in the Ryder Cup, with eight U.S. points. In 2006, he was Tom Lehman's assistant captain at the K Club in Ireland.

"I remember being part of the last U.S. victory abroad at The Belfry in 1993," he says. "Victory is our goal for 2010, but we all need to have fun and enjoy the moment."

Captain Corey is doing his all to fulfill his mission. He has appointed four assistant captains: Tom Lehman, Davis Love III, Jeff Sluman and Paul Goydos. He wants experience, communication, strategy and team spirit to be enhanced to the maximum for Team USA. A fine new addition to the behind-the-scenes team is his wife, Lisa Pavin, who is helping to coordinate the administrative side of Team USA and its commitments. She has even created Ryder Cup cupcakes!

Scotland's Colin Montgomerie, who has long brought his A game to the Matches,





will captain this year's European team. "Monty" played on eight Ryder Cup teams from 1991 to 2008. The 45-year-old, who will be the 22nd European and sixth Scottish captain, has been Europe's star and most forceful player with a 20-9-7 record in the Cup since his initial appearance.

Monty has never lost a singles match an incredible Ryder Cup record. But this year is something different for him. "This is the proudest moment of my career," he says. "Playing in eight Ryder Cups and winning eight Harry Vardon trophies [has been incredible], but to be named The European Team Ryder Cup captain is something to cherish."

Monty has never served as assistant captain or captain, so he's now learning the tournament's behind the scenes demands, studying them with his well-known dedication. He will lead a very strong European side to Wales.

2010 Teams

Twelve men compete for each side. The selection process has been modified for 2010.


Team Europe: European members will be selected employing the team's traditional criteria; however, new in 2010, Montgomerie will choose the final three players.

Team USA: The United States points system remains the same as the 2008 criteria for choosing the top eight players. These will be selected on August 15. Pavin will then select an additional four players on Sept. 7 to complete the United States

Team USA's defense of the Cup is not to be missed. Drama, excitement and great shot making will be present at the Ryder Cup Matches as always, and space for fans is still available. Captain Corey and Team USA want your support in their efforts to retain the cup abroad for the first time since 1993.

Whether you start them on their own brand or the brand you like best, kids should use golf equipment made especially for young players

When a child says the magical words to his father or mother, I'd like to play golf with you, part of the excitement is a trip to the golf store. It's exciting for the parent because visiting the golf store is always fun. It's exciting for the child because, as we all remember, new sports equipment gets the heart beating a little faster.

Many companies that sell golf equipment for adults also offer excellent junior clubs and accessories. If you're loyal to a manufacturer, there's a good chance your son or daughter can have the same type of equipment.

Ping offers two sets of clubs for juniors, the Pal and the Moxie (\$225). The Pal is for ages 6-8, the Moxie is for ages 9-11. Clubs have lightweight graphite shafts and junior grips; Ping junior clubs have the same perimeter-weighted technology as Ping adult clubs.

The **Nike** Tiger Woods Black Junior Set is for 8-11-yearolds; certain websites are offering the set for \$129, a saving of close to \$100. The nine-piece set includes a driver, hybrid, three irons, a sand wedge, plus EZ-Distance Gold balls.





The X Junior Set from Callaway (\$199) is for 5-8 year olds or players between 41 and 50 inches tall. The 320cc driver is almost as big as one of the adult 460cc drivers. The set also includes a stainless-steel fairway wood, a hybrid, a 9-iron and a sand wedge with "Mack Daddy" junior grooves. The Callaway set offers an XJ Odyssey 2-Ball Putter with the same 2-ball alignment as in the adult version. And because it's a junior set, it has a junior bag and because it's a junior bag, it provides a holder for an MP3 player. Cool.

TaylorMade makes several junior sets, including one for very young golfers age 4-6. Its Eight-Piece Junior Set (\$219) includes Burner clubs, a Burner Junior Carry Bag, plus a Burner hat and Burner towel.





Hippo Golf offers excellent value with its Hipfly Red Junior Set (\$99) for ages 6-8. The set includes a TiMattix oversize driver. The mallethead putter has a polymer insert for excellent feel. The four-club set includes a stand bag.

> TourEdge also provides excellent value with its Bazooka GeoMax junior sets starting at \$79. Buying a full set is not mandatory; TourEdge has individual irons starting at \$14.99.





CLUBS FOR GIRLS

Seeing as boys and girls are different, some companies offer clubs specifically for girls and these junior sets include a lot of pink.

The Callaway X Junior Girls Six-Piece Set is for 5-8 year olds and includes the prettiest golf bag made: it's festooned with pink, black and large flowers. For even more pink, the **Lynx** 2008 Pink Junior Set has a golf bag that's almost all pink and includes a driver, three irons and a putter.

SHOES & CLOTHING

Should you want your child to have the same brands of apparel and shoes that you wear, several companies have excellent junior options.

The Adidas Golf K Gazelle Golf Shoe comes in a variety of colors including pink. It has suede uppers that give the shoe a cool retro look. The shoe also has ample room toward the front for extra comfort. The Adidas Girl's White Based Sleeveless Top will help your future LPGA player feel trendy.

The **Nike** Junior Boys TW 2010 Golf Shoe also comes in a variety of colors and it features Nike's Power Platform Flex systems. The Nike Boys Sphere Dry Blocked Polo is made with Sphere Dry fabric to keep young male golfers looking and feeling cool.

FootJoy offers an extensive selection of shoes for juniors in sizes 1 to 6. The line features easy-care synthetic uppers and full cleats from Softspikes. The collection comes in numerous color combinations. FootJoy's MyJoy program offers customization and sizes start at size 7 for men and size 5 for women.

ACCESSORIES

Accessories are vital for juniors and there are plenty of extremely cool ones on the market. Fanciful head covers by Winning Edge come in various themes including a lion, panther, duck and Popeye.

Gadgetry is vital to children in the 8-13-year range. A great first golf gadget would be a rangefinder, especially now that prices are coming down on golf GPS systems. The Golf Buddy Pro GPS is around \$110 and includes numerous features with no monthly or annual fee.

Finally, what about golf balls? While not designed specifically for juniors, the Chromax Titanium ball from Chromax Golf is very popular with younger players. The ball has a metallic layer that reflects sunlight, which makes it extremely easy to see. It also comes in some bright colors and meets USGA specifications. With a relatively low 75 compression, the Chromax helps juniors with a little extra distance and is soft around the greens.

"The ball is a lot of fun for juniors because it looks cool," says Greg Jenkins with Chromax.

The Chromax Titanium retails for about \$3 to \$3.50 per ball. It's available in six-packs, a pack of three or individually.

CLUBFITTING

Serious golfers know that fitting is a vital part of ensuring that a set of golf clubs performs well. Fitting is particularly important for juniors. A junior who is eight years chronologically may well need golf clubs built for a 12-year-old. A 12-year-old might need a set build for a nine-year-old. The best way to find out for sure: take that always-exciting trip to the golf store where professional fitters can help.



Unlike most adult communities, SaddleBrooke is open to residents 40 and over and offers world-class amenities and numerous social activities. Built on the side of the mountain range rises 9,100 feet above sea level, residents can walk out their back door and enter the 1.78-million-acre Coronado National Forest. This national forest offers outdoor enthusiasts hiking and biking trails, access to ski resorts and campgrounds.



Because of its higher elevation, summers here are cooler and the air is cleaner. Normal city congestion is a non-factor and within just 10 minutes of the community residents have access to retail shopping, grocery stores, pharmacies and restaurants.

"SaddleBrooke has a special quality that makes it a highly desirable retirement choice, especially when located in an area with near-perfect temperatures year-round," says Vicki Palmer with Long Realty Company in Tucson.

There are three clubhouses on the property, two 18-hole championship golf courses that are semi-private and a 27-hole SaddleBrooke Country Club course for members only. much more. An activities director is on staff to coordinate all residents' needs. The DesertView Performing Arts Center has stadium-style seating for over 450 people and hosts a variety of theatrical performances and guest speakers.

There are a limited number of new construction homes available through the builder. The weather-blessed city has an embarrassment of riches when it comes to golf, recreation, culture and vacation amenities



est known for its near-perfect weather and abundance of outdoor activities, San Diego is consistently rated among the country's top vacation destinations. And it's not just about golf, although the area is home to some of the top resort facilities and golf courses in the nation. Whether you take a day off from the course or want to get out and play in other ways come evening, there are plenty of options.

Downtown, the pleasantly walkable Gaslamp Quarter features a lively dining, music and nightlife scene, and California's diverse and colorful history is brought to life in Old Town's historic sites as well as its shops and restaurants. San Diego boasts a collection of world-class attractions including Sea World, the San Diego Zoo and the USS Midway Museum to name a few. Balboa Park, the nation's largest urban cultural park, is home to 15 museums and The Old



Globe Theatre. North of the city is Legoland California and to the northeast lies the zoo's amazing Wild Animal Park. The East County area offers casino gaming and gorgeous desert and mountain landscapes. And out in the bay, across an easily accessed majestic bridge, is Coronado Island with spectacular lodging options including the historic Hotel Del Coronado, one of the nation's last remaining Victorian seaside resorts. Both bay and ocean beaches, 15 miles of recreation paths, an island golf course and popular restaurants and shops round out Coronado's appeal.

That barely scratches the surface of what this area offers. The truth is that few "stay-and-play" destinations offer as much on and off the course as does this breezy California city blessed with nearly perpetual sun.

SWEET SPOT FOR GOLF

With more than 90 golf courses in every conceivable setting from mountain to desert to ocean, it's no wonder that Golf Digest named San Diego one of the Top 50 golf destinations in the world. Better yet, the weather is so idyllic that Weatherbill.com awarded San Diego top billing for having more perfect days for golf than anywhere else in the nation.

LOCAL PROS

San Diego has been nurturing championship golfers for decades. In the 1960s, PGA pros Billy Casper, Gene Littler and Phil Rodgers were the 1-2-3 punch from San Diego. Casper, a two-time PGA player of the year and two-time U.S. Open winner was inducted into the World Golf Hall Of Fame in 1978. Littler, a San Diego State University alum, won the U.S. Open in 1961 and was inducted into the Hall Of Fame in 1990. Rodgers, a winner of many tour tournaments and a Top 100 Teacher, still teaches today at The Grand Del Mar. Another U.S. Open winner, Scott Simpson lives here when he is not on the Champions Tour. Phil Mickelson, four-





time major winner, lives in Rancho Santa Fe and is often seen playing area courses to keep his game sharp. San Diego is also the birthplace of Mickey Wright, winner of 82 LPGA events.

GOLF EVENTS

City owned Torrey Pines Golf Course has hosted many PGA tournaments. Among the most memorable was the 2008 U.S. Open won by Tiger Woods in historic fashion — 91 holes including the dramatic playoff with Rocco Mediate. The Callaway Junior World Championship, held at various courses throughout San Diego County since 1968, brings rising young stars from around the world to compete before agents, pros and fans. In March of this year the LPGA and its top women golfers competed in the J Golf LPGA Classic at La Costa Resort and Spa in nearby Carlsbad, Calif.

LEGACY OF RENOWNED GOLF-COURSE DESIGN

Several famed golf-course designers have made their mark on San Diego's landscape. Rees Jones brought his skills to the scenic South Course of Torrey Pines Golf Course for the 2008 U.S. Open. Arnold Palmer's masterpiece at Park Hyatt Aviara Resort has been cited by golf publications as one of the best resort courses in America. Gary Roger Baird preserved the surrounding natural environment while designing Barona Creek Golf Club. Gary Player created a

course within a working ranch at Steele Canyon, and Pete Dye's name is on the course at Carlton Oaks. Tom Fazio, architect of courses worldwide, has called his work at The Grand Del Mar among his best. Fame and popularity notwithstanding, San Diego golf courses typically have reasonable greens fees. Municipal courses in Coronado, Balboa Park, National City and Oceanside may offer the best prices, but all area courses set fees low enough to keep golfers coming back for more.

GOLF IN THE MORNING, RACETRACK IN THE AFTERNOON

Racing season at Del Mar Racetrack runs from mid-July to early September and the long days give golfers plenty of time to play a round and watch thoroughbred racing on the same day. Many courses are no more than 30 minutes from the track. Just up the road is The Grand Del Mar, where Fazio's masterpiece is open to the public. The luxury AAA Five Diamond resort opened in the fall of 2007 and is already among the world's most lauded hotels. La Costa Resort and Spa offers two 18-hole gems that have played host to many PGA events through the years, and Park Hyatt Aviara Resort has what may be the prettiest 18 holes in all of Southern California. 

Sea of Dreams



Boat or waterborne rocket? Today's custom powerboats may have you wondering.




magine skimming across a glass highway at nearly 200 miles per hour — with no brakes. You've just entered the dream world of powerboating.

Sleek jet boats ride on trailers across the desert southwest like sultans in an ancient caravan. They are adorned with chrome and gloss. Coats of wax make them reflective while their bodies scream speed. For those who've never experienced the boating scene, powerboating is a subculture all its own.

"These are folks who love to go fast," says Billy Frenz, executive director of the National Powerboat Association based in Greenwich, Conn. "Some of these guys like to build their own boats. Others are wealthy and have boats built for them."

Roaring engines and electric paint jobs get people's attention. Take a closer look and you find that these are true muscle boats. Bob Leach, founder of Eliminator Boats in Perris, Calif., says that his custom-built manufacturing company has seen a lot of changes over the years.

"We've been doing this for 40 years," explains Leach. "We started with a flat-bottom boat and probably got 200 horsepower and 40 miles an hour out of it. Today we're putting in twin 1,200 horsepower engines and reaching speeds around 170 miles per hour."




Case in point: Eliminator's 36 Daytona Speedster, powered by two Teague Custom Marine engines that put out 1,200 horsepower each. The engines drive dual 39" propellers to give the boat some serious torque.

In the boating world, they don't clock 0-60 time. Rather, they measure how long it takes to get "on plane." When a boat is on plane, it's in position to reach its top speed with the nose down and engines working full steam ahead. The faster a boat gets on plane, the faster it reaches top speed. The Speedster takes just over five seconds to get there. This 36-footer gets off the line in a hurry and handles the waves with ease. Professional golfer Bob May is a proud owner of an Eliminator 36 Speedster. eliminatorboat.com

Cigarette Racing, out of Opa-locka, Fla., is another manufacturer of high-end, custom powerboats. Its name is virtually synonymous with the sport. As such, buyers expect nothing but the best and Cigarette rolls out some very hot models for its enthusiasts.

LuxuryBoats







A recent upgrade to the Cigarette line is the result of collaboration with the Mercedes-Benz AMG division. The Cigarette 46' Rider shares components of the new hand-built, 563 horsepower AMG. Cigarette Racing President and CEO Skip Braver is a longtime Mercedes customer and he was looking for inspiration for his newest model.

"The boat isn't a 'copy-cat' boat; neither [of the companies] wanted that," says Braver. "The boat is truly inspired by what makes AMG the performance brand of Mercedes — it embodies perfection."

More than 30 coats of paint, the exact paint used by AMG, give the boat an iridescent sheen. Two-tone upholstery and instrumentation that model the AMG



look and feel set the Cigarette 46 apart from your average cruiser. Redesigned twin turbo-charged engines utilize a framework that requires no headers. Instead, the air induction and water-cooled exhaust create a simple and sophisticated new marine technology.

The twin 1,350 horsepower engines required Mercury to create an entirely new drive to handle the torque put out by this sea monster. Yes, in case you just missed that, this is a boat with 2,700 horsepower. The M8 drive handles an all new propeller system as well to give the 46 a unique powerhouse. Retail starts at \$900,000 and it takes about four months to complete a custom build. cigaretteracing.com


The boating world isn't all style and sexy. In fact, powerboating has a fun side too. Many enthusiasts participate in "poker runs" in which boats race from point to point. At each location, drivers receive a playing card. At the end of the run, whoever has the best five-card hand wins a prize. Of course, regattas and races of all kinds dot the national map wherever there's a body of water large enough to handle groups of rockets racing at lunatic

Both Eliminator and Cigarette customize boats that can cost owners well over \$1 million. GPS navigation and speedometers, upholstery upgrades and cabin amenities can give buyers options they may have never expected to choose when thinking about a floating car. Features like high-end stereo systems quickly reach six figures when outfitted for life at sea.
