In anticipation of the 2022 BNP Paribas Open, fans should expect the unexpected.

As fans, media members, patrons and professionals prepare for the first March edition of the BNP Paribas Open since 2019—set to be held from March 7 to March 20-two names will especially stand out: Alexander Zverev and Garbiñe Muguruza.

After all, Zverev won the 2021 ATP Finals (his second victory in the championship and 19th in ATP singles tournaments), while Muguruza claimed the 2021 WTA Finals (her 13th WTA singles title, an aggregate that includes two major championships).

In response to his victory over Daniil Medvedev 6-4, 6-4, Zverev focused on the present, while also looking ahead to the future.


"I won against a player I lost five times to in a row, so I had to play one of my best matches," he said. "I'm happy about that [and] happy to be going on holidays with this win."

He continued, "There's no better way to end the season than winning here. I'm obviously happy, but I'm also very much looking forward to next year already."

Meanwhile, Muguruza became the first Spaniard to ever win the WTA Finals.

"I didn't think of all these things [in regards to becoming the first Spaniard champion] because I didn't want to have more pressure," she expressed. "But it feels amazing to be part of the history, and this is a very special tournament."


She added, "Only the best eight [play] and you feel like every match is a final—and I made it."

And now she, along with another fan and tournament favorite, Zverev, will look to join some of the game's other brightest stars, in order to "make it" yet again—as champions of the 2022 BNP Paribas Open.

#### 2021: A Year of Firsts

Last fall, the BNP Paribas Open was contested for the first time since 2019 and held in October for the first time in its history, due to COVID-19. The highly anticipated return of one of tennis's most popular tournaments—held after a 31-month hiatus—proved to be well worth the wait, as Cameron Norrie and Paula Badosa both captured their first victories





Norrie, who became the highest ranked British player in men's tennis as a result of his victory, defeated Nikoloz Basilashvili 3-6, 6-4, 6-1. In doing so, he not only earned his first-ever ATP Masters 1000 title, but also became the first-ever British player to win a BNP Paribas Open title.


"I can't really believe it," he said shortly after winning last year. "If you would have told me I would have won before the tournament started, I wouldn't have believed you. It's amazing."

Badosa was equally emotional, as she overcame various personal issues away from the tennis court in order to ultimately capture the BNP Paribas Open and climb to within the top 15 of the world rankings (all the way from No. 70 in late 2020).

"There were moments when I thought I would never make it here. I suffered a lot, and I had to work on it a lot," she stressed.

Her adversity off the court likely had a role in her ability to handle hardships on it, as she battled two-time BNP Paribas Open champion Victoria Azarenka for 3 hours and 4 minutes. Ultimately, she prevailed 7-6, 2-6, 7-6 in the longest women's final ever recorded in the history of the BNP Paribas Open.

"I've learned that nothing is impossible," she stated after hoisting the trophy last fall. "I have been through tough moments. [But] I never stopped dreaming."



#### The Future is Bright in Tennis Paradise

Renowned around the world for its host site, Indian Wells Tennis Garden, which is known as Tennis Paradise, the BNP Paribas Open has recently been voted the ATP Tour Masters 1000 and WTA 1000 Tournament of the Year for the seventh year, an alltime record.

As the world's largest WTA and ATP Tour combined two-week event, the tournament has captured these honors every year since 2014.

And now, as Norrie and Badosa prepare to defend their titles, they will encounter their fair share of competition, as a majority of the game's best players will be in the field to enjoy the tournament's highly anticipated return to its usual March occurrence.

From Novak Djokovic (who recently made news for reasons aside from his on-court achievements, as his Australian visa was temporarily cancelled, due to his unvaccinated status), to last year's runner-up, Daniil Medvedev—to the WTA's current No. 1 ranked player, Ashleigh Barty, to former world No. 1 Karolina Hrdli ková—this year's BNP Paribas Open will once again have an endless supply of talent.

Djokovic, a five-time winner of the event and 20-time Grand Slam singles champion, is typically the men's favorite. However, his status as a participant is presently unknown, as he may choose to remain unvaccinated. If he doesn't compete, look for Medvedey, the 2021 U.S. Open champion, to continue to prove himself as one of




On the women's side, Barty and Hrdli ková will be joined by Aryna Sabalenka.





#### **50 YEARS OF TENNIS CHAMPIONS**

Through the Eyes of Luigi Serra 1970 - 2020





Susie Maxwell Berning, former professional golf champion and Coachella Valley resident, has been named to the World Golf Hall of Fame. She joins three other members in the 2021 induction class, including golflegend Tiger Woods, women's golf pioneer Marion Hollins and former PGA Tour commissioner Tim Finchem. Maxwell Berning was elected from the female category, beating out Beverly Hanson, Sandra Palmer and Dottie Pepper.

The Hall of Fame Induction Class was announced in 2021 and the awards presentation was originally scheduled to take place during the year, however due to the public health landscape it was decided to move the ceremony back a year. A special celebration will be held as the Class of 2022 on March 9, 2022 at TPC Sawgrass in Ponte Vedra Beach, Florida, along with the activities surrounding The Players, the PGA Tour's flagship event.

Others who have won the U.S. Women's Open three times or more, an achievement claimed by Maxwell Berning, are all in the Hall of Fame: Mickey Wright, Betsy Rawls, Babe Zaharias, Hollis Stacy and Annika Sorenstam. Maxwell Berning's election brings the Hall of Fame membership to 164 people.

"Quite an honor," said Maxwell Berning. "Just to be in the same room as Mickey Wright, Kathy Whitworth, Judy Rankin and Patty Berg – I tell you I remember when I first was on the Tour, just how nice Patty Berg was to me and I was scared to death, as it was the first time I ever played with Mickey. To be honored alongside them is something I thought would never happen. I never even thought about it. I'm now part of their family, which makes me very proud."

Maxwell Berning has become a treasured golf instructor-inresidence at The Reserve Club since its inception in 1998. Not only is she an honorary member there but also has become an integral part of The Reserve family.


Bill Lane, Club President at The Reserve, said, "Susie embodies every characteristic of a Hall of Famer: exceptional skill, integrity and passion and is dedicated to the sport and professionalism of golf. Her vast playing and teaching expertise is exceeded only by the personal attention she provides, enriching each lesson or playing experience. We are most fortunate she shares her time with members, and we are thrilled she has been elected to the World Golf Hall of Fame."

Growing up in Pasadena, California, and moving to Oklahoma at the age of 13, the four-time Major Champion began playing golf at the age of 15 and won three-straight Oklahoma State High School Golf Championships. She was the first female to be offered a golf scholarship from Oklahoma City University and played on the men's team. After becoming an LPGA professional in 1964, she earned the Rookie of the Year title. She won her first tournament in 1965 at the Muskogee Civitan Open and she was named Most Improved Player for 1967.

She went on to win 11 times including an impressive four Majors in the 1965 Women's Western Open and the U.S. Women's Open three times in 1968, 1972 and 1973, all while balancing family life as a mother raising her two daughters and driving a motorhome across the country to tour stops.

Maxwell Berning is also the recipient of the 2018 LPGA Pioneers award for her contributions to the game and was recognized during the LPGA's 50th Anniversary in 2000 as one of the LPGA's top-50 players and teachers.

"I'm excited for Susie," said Beth Daniel, World Golf Hall of Fame Class of 2000 inductee. "The thing that makes her stand out is her four Majors which she won while juggling a family. There are very few women in the history of golf that have been able to do that, and it lets female golfers know they can have a family and a career.




Nancy Lopez did it. Juli Inkster did it. But before them, Susie Maxwell Berning did it."

Beth Daniel, Nick Price, Annika Sorenstam and Curtis Strange are co-chairs of the 20-person Hall of Fame Selection Committee, which also includes media representatives and leaders of the major golf organizations.

The World Golf Hall of Fame celebrates golf and honors the legacies of those who have made it great. The Hall of Fame opened in Pinehurst, N.C. in 1974 where a total of 71 members were inducted before moving to its current location in St. Augustine, Florida in 1998. The Hall of Fame is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit institution and is allied with 26 national and international golf organizations, including the European Tour, LPGA, the Masters Tournament, PGA of America, PGA Tour, The R&A and USGA. More information may be found at worldgolfhalloffame.org.

As Greg McLaughlin, CEO of World Golf Foundation said, "With four Major Championships to her name, Susie's legacy really speaks for itself. Her life and career will impact today's golfers and future generations to come. We are looking forward to celebrating Susie and sharing her story as a Hall of Fame inductee."

Imagine gazing out at a lush, verdant expanse of freshly trimmed lawn with a nine-iron in one hand and an icy-cold margarita in the other. This is just the beginning of the Woodhaven Country Club experience. Located in the heart of Palm Desert just off of Washington Street, the Club is nestled within a tree-lined gated community and surrounded by breathtaking views of the San Jacinto and Santa Rosa mountains.

The dual pillars of strength that support the recreational nirvana of Woodhaven are the golf and tennis programs, under the stewardship of President and General Manager Ray Wytman.

The pristine, 18-hole community golf course - open to the public yet with the immersive vibe of an exclusive and welcoming enclave - is unparalleled in its scenic beauty. A wide variety of tiered pricing levels is offered, and surprisingly reasonable member and non-member annual and semi-annual golf rates are available, including unlimited golf and use of practice facilities.

Kaitlyn Ellis, head golf professional and PGA Associate, says, "The experience here is not just golf it's a hospitality endeavor. When people enter our gates, they are happy to be here. My goal is to keep them happy."

Ellis, who was named the Women's Player of the Year for the Women's PGA Desert Chapter in 2021, puts her leadership prowess to use by directing a robust schedule of tournaments and player events.

Club treasurer and tennis program chair, David Galpine, notes that this is a friendly facility that welcomes everyone with pricing that fits the needs of each participant. Galpine, at 85 years young, still plays a vibrant game of singles tennis himself. The Club's allaccess, seasonal membership includes golf, tennis, pickleball, driving range and even use of the gym and is available for \$300 per month (single) and \$475 per month (couple). On top of all this, golf is only \$20 per round.

The tennis program has thrived under the direction of tennis pro Rhenn Ramirez, who has an impressive tennis background in the desert as a pro and instructor for the past 20 years.

Ramirez has revamped the tennis program in the 15 months he's been at Woodhaven. With seven tennis courts and four pickleball courts, the Woodhaven tennis center is known as "The Players Club." Co-ed mixed doubles, also known as the "Woodhaven Open," are a series of socials that take place on Wednesdays and Saturdays,



attracting couples as well as weekenders, with everyone encouraged to sign up. Players are often at the 3.0 and 4.0 levels and up, but The Players Club is open to everyone.

Ramirez' influence has been seen in the expansion of the junior tennis program which has partnered with tennis legend and desert resident, Rosie Casals, and her Love & Love Tennis Foundation to benefit youth tennis. Pickleball has also become popular here, just as it has in many sports centers.

Ages of residents and players vary, however the culture is highenergy, and skill levels run the gamut. Case in point is Dori De Vries, USTA senior award winner who has found Woodhaven to be her tennis home and plays weekly at the Club.

Food and beverages options abound with lunch, dinner and happy hour and full cocktail bar in The Vista Lounge. Sandwiches, snacks and refreshing drinks are available at Mulligan's Bar & Grill. The fresh new look in the recently remodeled Pro Shop augments the warm, congenial environment for everyone who enters (and likes to shop the highest quality gear).

Weekend tennis and golf enthusiasts have been known to make Woodhaven a rather permanent habit by purchasing one of the



well-appointed and affordable condominiums, all with private veranda views of the golf course and resident benefits.

Whether a full-time resident or weekend tournament player, it's easy to fall hard for the Woodhaven lifestyle, reinforced by viewing the website (woodhavencc.com) replete with images of the way life should and can be. Ultimately, all paths here lead to active living and close friendships at Woodhaven Country Club.



#### An interview with tennis great

### Roscoe Tanner

#### Scoring a win by bringing the gift of tennis to kids in need

Is name and his story are legendary. In the 1970s and early 1980s, Leonard Roscoe Tanner III, known as Roscoe, aced his position as one of the most prolific tennis players of the modern game, earning the nickname "The Rocket" for his deadly left-handed serve characterized by a full body lunge.

His lighting fast 153 mph serving speed (clocked in Rancho Mirage, California in 1978) was the fastest ever recorded in tournament competition, surpassed subsequently only by Andy Roddick with a 155 mph serve.

In an interview, Tanner is affable and down-to-earth with a sense of humor and sincere introspection. Retired from competitive tennis, today Tanner lives in Orlando, Florida where he has parlayed his vast tennis experience and his passion to help others into broadening horizons for underprivileged children.

Roscoe Tanner was born in Chattanooga and attended Stanford University where he was named to the NCAA All-America team three years, was runner-up in the NCAA singles twice and, with Sandy Mayer, won the NCAA doubles. As a collegian, Tanner also won the U.S. Amateur Indoor Championship and the U.S. Amateur Tournament.

After turning pro in 1972, he reached World No. 4 in 1979. He is also well-known for winning the men's singles title at the Australian Open tournament in 1977, defeating Guillermo Vilas. Tanner reached the Wimbledon final in 1979, losing to Björn Borg in five sets, although Tanner is credited with close to 30 aces

during the match. Tanner avenged this loss to Borg by beating him in four sets in the U.S. Open quarterfinals two months later, a match where Tanner's 140 mph serve brought the net down during the fourth set.

Tanner points out that some of his fondest memories are those of living and playing competitively in the desert in the 1970s, where he nabbed victory twice in the American Airlines Tennis Games, the precursor to the current BNP Paribas Open, then held at the Mission Hills Country Club in Rancho Mirage, California. In 1978, Tanner and Ray Moore took the winner's cup at the Games in doubles, garnering them the cover on "Palm Springs Life."

After his retirement, Tanner found himself involved in conflicts with the law, which resulted in jailtime on several occasions.

But, as Tanner says, "When one door closes, another one blows open."

In 2016, Tanner moved to Orlando, Florida where he began teaching tennis to kids who would never normally have the opportunity to learn or even be exposed to the sport. He realized that success in tennis is often a function of privilege, where coach-to-student ratios are far more favorable than for kids in low-income environments. And he decided it was time to change that.

He began his own tennis coaching program at a church starting with seven and eight year-olds and working towards the goal of college scholarships. Tennis sessions are held inside the church while Tanner and church officials pursue permits for outdoor courts.




acknowledge when something isn't working. Things I did were stupid, but it's all led to this purpose of helping others."

Tanner's 16 year-old daughter, Lacey, lives in Orlando with him and is already a tennis phenom as well as a straight-A student. A lefty like her dad, she is hoping to attend Stanford University, also like dad. Tanner has four other daughters and two pet pooches, and he also provides tennis instruction at an area resort.

One of the differences between tennis in the 1970s and today is the level of collegiality, Tanner believes. He notes that players were friends with each other in those earlier days, whereas today there are more outside influences. He remembers playing with the best, including Jimmy Connors, John McEnroe, Ivan Lendl, Björn Borg, Dennis Ralston, Pancho Gonzales, Arthur Ashe the list goes on.

To some, Tanner's life story may sound like the makings of a movie. As it happens,

Tanner says, "Nothing is a coincidence in this life, and looking back is more accurate than seeing things in the moment," attributing his devotion for lending his time and talent to a series of events in his life during periods of challenge. While in prison in Germany,





several co-prisoners befriended Tanner and introduced him to bible study. Subsequently, a guard spent time reading the bible with him. While in jail back in Florida, Tanner was assisting an illiterate prisoner to write a letter home to his mother when he realized his purpose in life: to help kids improve their lives through the vehicle of tennis.

"In my past, I realize I gave lip service to people who were there to help me, like Pastor Jim Stump [Stanford University] and Stan Smith [International Tennis Hall of Famer]. I'm a people pleaser. I always believed that with pro sports the secret was to never give up and I could achieve it. But that's not true in real life, and sometimes you need to be willing to

there are talks taking place with producers and writers to share his journey on the big screen.

Perhaps Roscoe Tanner's iconic serve has been a metaphor for his approach to life, going all in. Today, he has chosen to redefine personal boundary lines to focus on supporting kids and the community and strengthen pathways to success, both for kids learning tennis as well as for himself.

The ball is squarely in Tanner's court, inspiring fans and followers alike.

I placed a few alignment rods around the flag & 3 water bottles to have you putt from 3 different distances. I feel some simple items can help you stay focused on your lag putting. It would feel awesome to make these 10,20 & 40 foot but, but let's focus on getting the golf ball in that 3' circle. (So less 3 putts);



#### **Putting set up:**

Ball of left (front) instep/heal
 Bow to feel eyes over the ball
 Arms relaxed
 Entire body is SQARE TO TARGET




#### **Drills:**

- 1.3 golf balls at each station
- 2. Start with the close target (15-20 feet away)
- 3. Then move farther away from the flag (20-30)
- 4. The last station putt from longest water bottle (30-40)
- 5. I prefer to start closer then work back
- 6. You can mix it up & then put 1 ball from each station

# Lucid Dream

### New carmaker scores with dream car





The Lucid Group is a car company that didn't happen overnight. Since 2007, CEO Peter Rawlinson has dreamed of taking on the task of launching electrical vehicles on the open market. As Vice President of Engineering at Tesla, Rawlinson led the redesign and launch of the Model S. Now he's taking on his former employer, the EV super power, with his rollout of the Lucid Air, the first production car for his company.

The Lucid Air comes in several models: Pure, Touring, Grand Touring and Dream Edition. The Dream Edition has specs that make Space X look more like the target competition Rawlinson set his eyes on. The Dream is coming off the production line with 1,111 horsepower. You should probably read that line again.

A new company, launching a first car with 1,000+ horsepower sounds, well, like a dream. However, cars started rolling off the factory floor at Lucid's factory in Arizona in September. The Lucid Air is a 5,000-lb. vehicle slotted into a luxury sedan category but has super-car performance. With the dual motors running in sport mode, the Dream Edition is covering a quarter mile in 9.9 seconds. The 0-60 mph time is 2.5 seconds according to Lucid reports. That sort of track work is something you'd expect from McLaren, not a new kid on the block that looks more like a Bentley than a Bugatti.

The Air provides three driving modes: Smooth, Swift and Sprint. Each offers a combination of braking, motor output, steering response, and damper controls to make the experience different and interesting. There will be no problem producing neck-breaking torque in any mode given the presence of an accelerator.

Rawlinson has emphasized interior comfort and maximum battery range as design aspects of the Air. The performance aspect seems to come almost as an afterthought. The 113kw battery gives the Dream a range of 520 miles in the 933-horsepower model. Compare that to Tesla's Model 3 at 353 miles. That 170 miles is the difference between having to stop to recharge on your drive from Los Angeles to Phoenix, or just keep on trucking. The charging platform on the Lucid Air can accept any charging station, making the world you're virtual charging oyster. Recharging on a 300-kW DC connection can should replenish the battery from 10 to 80 percent in 20 minutes. The 19.2-kW onboard charger should take seven hours to fully charge, given the source is strong enough.

The interior has leg room for days. The front seats have legroom fit for a sumo wrestler. The rear seats have more room than a Mercedes S-class sedan, which Car and Driver monikered "the gold standard in large luxury sedans." A thin, 5K digital display runs east to west across the front dash. Designers were clearly going for elegance, and they hit the mark. The leather and alpaca interior is everything you'd expect from a \$170,000 vehicle. The roof is an allglass canopy letting passengers really sense the roominess of this

If there's anything about the Lucid Air that is more nightmare than dream, it's the fact that all the 2022 production is sold out. If you want one, you'll have to settle for a lesser version in the 800horsepower Grand Touring or the 620 horse Touring model. The price on those of course goes way down as well with the Touring retailing at \$95,000.

As Lucid rolls into 2022 and 2023, Rawlinson has big dreams. He has already announced the plans for an SUV and has raised money to increase production at the plant to almost 400,000 cars in the next decade. If the Lucid Air is any indicator, this is more than a Dream and a ride you'll want to take.
