
Without their support over this past many years, and in particular the past pandemic two years, this publication would have ceased to exist.

There is no doubt about it. Phil Mickelson loves Coachella Valley and the desert. After all, he won the Bob Hope Chrysler Classic in 2002 and 2004, a tournament he has competed in consistently for 30 years.

His love for charity is even greater though, as he and his wife Amy have a longstanding affinity for supporting charitable organizations.

With this in mind, Phil (and The Mickelson Foundation, which supports various family and youth initiatives) was an ideal host for the tournament (now known as The American Express and held annually in La Quinta, Calif.)—a partnership that began in September 2019.

Mickelson's, along with the American Express's, first year of involvement was very successful, as they oversaw a highly attended event that concluded with Andrew Landry's two-stroke victory over Abraham Ancer, leading him to join the likes of past winners that include Fred Couples, Johnny Miller, Jack Nicklaus and Arnold Palmer.

However, his second year of involvement was completely different, as there weren't any spectators or a three-day pro-am for the 2021 edition of the tournament.

"I'm grateful for The Mickelson Foundation's and American Express's support, as we were still able to host a professional golf





tournament," said Pat McCabe, executive director, The American Express, which is operated by SportFive, a full-service sports and entertainment agency. "The show went on anyways."

Improving Fans' Experiences

Beginning on January 19, 2022, the 63rd annual tournament will be held at the 7,060-yard-long La Quinta Country Club, as well as PGA West's 7,204-yard-long Nicklaus Tournament Course and 7,300-yard-long Stadium Course. Attendees will be welcomed back once again, as a three-day pro-am, which has already been sold out, will be contested again too.

The pro-am is unique, as it is the only one on the PGA TOUR that enables participants to play with six PGA TOUR players during three days at three separate courses—two at PGA West, along with La Quinta Country Club.

"We're not just welcoming back fans. We're also improving their experiences, while bringing back what made the tournament so fan-friendly to begin with too," McCabe stressed.

For starters, fans will be able to enjoy two nights of live music after the second and third rounds have been completed on Friday and Saturday. In addition, all ticket holders will have access to Casamigos Club 18's open-air venue, which will be located on the 18th green; while there, they can enjoy lunch and Casamigos cocktails as they witness the action of the tournament.

At the same time, every ticket holder will also have access to the Michelob Ultra Beers Fore Birdies venue, which has been moved closer to the 17th green for the 2022 edition of the tournament. Meanwhile, if patrons have tickets for the Champions Club, they will have preferred parking and access to climate-controlled seating on the 18th green, along with a full bar, a hosted breakfast and lunch, snacks, an upgraded concert section, updated restrooms (reserved for them), and all three of the tournament's golf courses.

"Along with providing them more areas to watch golf, fans will also enjoy a great food and beverage experience," McCabe stated. "And there will be more venues, as well as revamped venues, along with opportunities for local companies to entertain clients at VIP areas near the 17th green."

The 17th hole, known as the "Rock at Alcatraz", will also be the site of various open-air executive suites, featuring food service, a flat screen television and tiered seating.

"Aside from these viewing opportunities, we're also improving traffic flow and cell phone coverage, which will be especially important for guests as they take breaks from watching the tournament," McCabe added.

Volunteer Opportunities, Charitable Endeavors

As in the past, The American Express will also have a wide array of volunteer opportunities, ranging from admissions to gallery management. Every volunteer will receive an Adidas golf shirt, an Adidas jacket, headgear, a bag featuring the tournament's logo and a gift certificate. Registration is still fully opened on The American Express's website.

"We aren't able to do this without American Express—that's the bottom line," McCabe emphasized.

Along with The Mickelson Foundation, American Express will provide funding to organizations that support education, families, health and wellness, homelessness and youth sports. Last year, The Mickelson Foundation raised over \$1 million for Coachella Valley-based charities, despite the pandemic.

To help support American Express's and The Mickelson Foundation's charitable endeavors, fans can purchase tickets on The American Express's website. American Express Card Members will receive a 20 percent discount for each ticket they purchase.

"As we prepare to celebrate the 63rd edition of this historical event, we'll truly have something for everyone—the best players in the world, musical entertainment, perfect weather and great venues," McCabe said. "We can't wait for January!"

2021 BNP Paribas Open

A-Championship Unlike Any Other Before

Held for the first time since 2019, this year's BNP Paribas Open showcased the talents of tennis's up-and-coming stars.

There has never been a BNP Paribas Open quite like this year's—and there will likely never be one like it again.

Hosted in October for the first time in the tournament's history, due to COVID-19, the 2021 BNP Paribas Open also provided fans two other "firsts": the first British male singles champion and the first Spanish female singles champion.

As the talents of two of the game's potential future stars were shown to the world, the tournament also provided brilliant displays of tennis from professionals that have already proven to be formidable forces at Indian Wells Tennis Garden in the past.

Simply put, the historic fall version of the BNP Paribas Open provided something for everyone, as tennis's "fifth major" certainly made a worthy comeback after a 31-month hiatus.

Cameron Norrie Captures First ATP Masters 1000 Title

No one has appeared in more finals this year than Cameron Norrie, who was finally rewarded for his hard work and consistency with a 3-6, 6-4, 6-1 singles victory over Nikoloz Basilashvili, leading to a considerable rise in the world rankings the last few months from 71st early this year to the top 20.

As a result, he has become the highest ranked British player in men's tennis, surpassing Daniel Evans, while also winning a personal-best 47 matches for the year. Earning his first-ever ATP Masters 1000 title, Norrie also made history as the first British player to win a title of any kind at the BNP Paribas Open.

"It means so much, I can't even describe it," Norrie said shortly after his victory. "It's absolutely massive for me and my team. I can't really believe it. If you would have told me I would have won before the tournament started, I wouldn't have believed you. It's amazing. I'm taking in all the emotions."



Norrie, who is 2-4 in finals this year (only Novak Djokovic has appeared in as many finals this season), continued, "I've really been enjoying my tennis. I've lost a lot of finals, so it's nice to get the big one today."

Facundo Lugones, Norrie's coach, wasn't surprised by his performance in the slightest, believing his talents are limitless.

"He always had a bigger vision and woke up the next day and brought 120 percent, regardless [of] what happened the day before. When you have someone with that ability, there's no limits," he emphasized.

Paula Badosa Proves that Nothing is Impossible

Within the first 20 minutes of Paula Badosa's and Victoria Azarenka's women's singles final match, fans knew they were





witnessing something special. After all, only three games had been completed by then. One hour later, the first set was finally finished, as Badosa led 7-6(5).

Azarenka, a two-time BNP Paribas Open champion, made a comeback though, as she won the next set 6-2, proving yet again why she is a two-time major champion as well. As the temperatures continued to climb (rising to nearly 90), the drama increased too, as both players went back and forth until Badosa ultimately prevailed in the final set 7-6(2), winning the longest recorded women's final in BNP Paribas Open history (3 hours and 4 minutes).

To reach this stage and capture one of tennis's most renowned tournaments, Badosa had overcome a variety of personal issues off the court.

"There were moments when I thought I would never make it here. I suffered a lot, and I had to work on it a lot," she said. "Everybody was in a hurry, and I think I struggled a lot from the expectations, that by 20 or 21 you should be winning big tournaments."

Now ranked within the top 15 of the world rankings (a climb from No. 70 in late 2020), Badosa has proven that hard work and self-belief truly pay dividends.

"I've learned that nothing is impossible. In my case, I have been through tough moments, [but] I never stopped dreaming," she stressed. "That's what kept me working hard and believing until the last moment."

Doubles Championships Feature Seasoned Winners

For nearly 1.5 hours, John Peers and Filip Polasek and Aslan Karatsev and Andrey Rublev provided fans thrilling tennis action, as Peers and Polasek ultimately captured the men's doubles championship 6-3, 7-6(5).

"I'm really happy with the way we played," Polasek stated. "We came here early, which helped us adapt to the conditions. It was very different to play in the day than in the night sessions. We were probably able to adapt the best of all teams."

With the victory, Peers captured his fourth ATP Masters 1000 title, along with his 25th career title, while Polasek acquired his second ATP Masters 1000 title and 16th career title.

Meanwhile, Elise Mertens won her second consecutive BNP Paribas Open women's doubles title, although she had a different partner this year than in 2019—Su-wei Hsieh, a three-time champion now.

Defeating Veronika Kudermetova and Elena Rybakina 7-6(1), 6-3, Mertens captured her 14th WTA doubles title, while Hsieh won her 30th WTA doubles title.

"It's really fun to play with different partners," said Hsieh, who has won two of the eight tournaments in which she's partnered with Mertens so far. "I collect a lot of friends."

"We are really, really happy with the win," Mertens added. "And [we] qualified for the [Akron WTA] Finals, so [we're] very happy [about] that too."



f you have not played or at least heard of Pickleball you are missing out. I can promise you that there is at least one Pickleball court or one tournament in your town by now. The game has exploded with great numbers all over the United States and some report that it is the fastest growing sport in the world. Only to sky rocket due to the need for out door play brought on by the Corona Virus Pandemic. For those of us that play Pickleball, I think that we can all agree that winning is so much more fun then losing, so let's talk about how to do that! As a former professional Pickleball player and a leading instructor for Engage Pickleball I am here to give you one of the most important tips: slow the game down.

You might've seen professional pickle ball players hit the ball hard and fast with lots of power. But that's because they have tremendous amount of paddle control, feel and superior technique. For an average 3.5 4.0 4.5 player slowing the game down is crucial.

So what does that mean exactly? It means keep the ball in play, keep the rally going, keep your dinks cross court, be patient, hit lot more drops rather then drives.


I know this is lot harder then it sounds but keeping the ball in play is lot more fun then trying to hit winners and missing. So let's get into the details little bit more about how to slow the game down.



Let's start with a serve. To keep your serve more consistent and deep try to hit higher over the net and with less power. I understand that hitting a winner on your serve feels so good but hitting the ball out feels even worse and you let your partner down. If you think about it, with the exception of my good buddy, Morgan Evens, how often do you see the Pros aceing their serves. Not often at all, because the risk is greater then the reward.

Let's move on to the return of serve. Hitting the ball high with less drive will give you more time to come to the net and therefore a better position at the Non-Valley Zone aka The Kitchen. The harder and faster you drive the ball, the harder and quicker it comes back to you, giving you less reaction time and you will find yourself stuck in the dreaded No Mans Land. No Mans Land is the space between the kitchen line and base line. If you do find yourself in No Mans Land, it is very





important to slow the game down by split stepping and gradually moving your way to the Kitchen Line

Hitting more drops on your 3rd shot will allow you to stay in a point longer and have more time to come up is another great example of slowing the game down. Hitting the ball at 70% of your strength is perfectly fine.

As you can see slowing the game down is important in every aspect of the game. But does this mean that you should never hit hard, of course not. There's a time to put the ball away and a time to hit hard volleys. You just need to be patient and know when to pull the trigger. Enjoy the game and let's enjoy more rallies and I will see you in the Pickleball court.

BACKGROUND:

Nikki Gatch serves as Assistant Executive Director/Chief Operating Officer for the Southern California PGA section. Prior to that, Gatch worked for the PGA of America as a Player Development Regional Manager and then as Regional League Manager. She was previously a co-owner of Emerald Isle Golf Course for three years with her husband and fellow PGA member, Don.

Gatch joined the SCGA Board in 2014 and has served as the emcee for the annual So Cal Women's Summit, co-managed by the SCGA and the SCPGA. In 2021, she became the first woman elected to serve as president of the SCGA.

Gatch resides in San Marcos, CA where she lives with her husband, son and daughter.

You wake up in the morning — what's the driving

Working hard to make our game better for all those in it.

You just recently became the first woman selected as the incoming president of the Southern California Golf Association (SCGA). What will be your key priorities during your time in that position?

It's the staff of the SCGA who really do the work. Those of us in leadership positions on the Board are there to support them.

I do wish to see more collaboration among the leaders in the game. We have come a long way — not as siloed as in the past. We can always do better though — ultimately that's what's best for the game. We are fortunate here with the relationship that exists between the SCPGA and SCGA. I hope I can play a role in setting a great example in how such groups can collaborate.

Junior golf is very important to me — I am an advocate in creating as many opportunities as possible for our youth.

Our game needs to look like the communities we live in. In my mind, golf is such a wonderful sport and it offers something for everyone.

During the pandemic golf has seen a spike in rounds played but it appears the bulk of those increased rounds came from existing / active players. How does golf make significant improvement in participation with Millennials, women and minorities?

Overall, we have a huge responsibility as leaders in the game to welcome everyone to the sport. We all need to do our part. We were all beginners at one point. We can't forget that - someone invited us. 3 million people played golf for the first time in 2020.

How do we keep them interested? We have to embrace new players into our game. The age group of 18-34 represents six million golfers. Now over 3 million junior golfers — and what's really impressive is that 34% are girls. Two decades ago, the percentage was 15%.

Related to that is the vexing issues within the sport takes too much time to play, costs too much and there's a lack of meaningful teaching at multiple levels especially those on the public side. How do you see those issues being faced in the greater Southern California area?

I look at the situation as a glass half full. Does it take an investment of time to play? Yes, it does. However, golf provides such a meaningful connection to all. If its valuable for people to play they will do it. It's all in how you look at it. If you enjoy it — you will continue to do that. Personal choice. I prefer to look at the positive

I also work with our PGA professionals teaching the game making themselves accessible to as many people as possible. There are professionals who are extremely qualified and available — if you access pga.com PGA of America

How is golf different today from when you first entered the game?

It's more accessible, more diverse and cooler.

The word "fun" is often bandied about as being a key element for golf's growth. Define the term and how it can be successfully implemented for the broadest range of people?

The meaning of fun can mean many different things. It can mean being with friends and family when golfing. Fun can also mean just going to the driving range — for others playing a few holes after work. Golf does not have to mean being serious for an entire 18-hole round.

If you could change one thing in golf unilaterally what would it be and why?

Ease up on dress codes and cell phone policies. I respect the history and traditions, but we have to evolve and bring more people into the sport.

You've got one round too play — which course do you play and who joins you in your foursome?



12th Celebrity Golf Tournament Returns

"The Hammer" spearheads Wounded Warrior benefit

In years past, professional football players would fade into the background once time on the gridiron came to an end. Fred Williamson had other plans in mind.

He parlayed a successful professional football career and used the fame generated into an even more successful Hollywood career spanning several decades. And the 83-year-old is still going strong. The Gary, Indiana native has lived in the Coachella Valley with a residence in Palms Spring since 1997. His most enduring

contribution, however, is in organizing and staging a golf fundraising event benefiting the Wounded Warrior Project.

The 12th Annual Celebrity Golf Tournament returns this January 2022. A pairing party is scheduled for January 14 (Friday) at the Fantasy Springs Hotel & Casino in Indio. The 18-hole event takes place January 15 (Saturday) at the Eagle Falls Golf Course. There will also be an awards party immediately following the golf at the Fantasy Springs LIT Ultra Lounge.

"After a long and difficult 20 months, we are excited to say we're back, Williamson says. "And once again Linda and I are looking forward to seeing everyone back at our 12th Annual Celebrity Golf Tournament which benefits the Wounded Warrior Project,"

"The Wounded Warrior Project provides support and care to our physically and emotionally wounded heroes, which they desperately need and truly deserve. They count on friends like you, and so do I."

Eagle Falls Golf Course, designed in 2007 championship golf course designed by renowned architect Clive Clark. The par-72 plays just over 6,700 yards from the eagle championship tees. Williamson established his presence on the football field in playing for Northwestern in the Big Ten Conference. In 1960 he was an undrafted free agent for the Pittsburgh Steelers where he played one season.

From 1961-1964 he played for the Oakland Raiders of the newly formed American Football League. During his time with the Raiders he was selected to the AFL All-Star team three consecutive years. Williamson's career reached its apex when playing for the Kansas City Chiefs from 1965-1967. His time with the Chiefs featured him playing in the first Super Bowl staged in Los Angeles on January 15, 1967.

Leading up to the game Williamson highlighted his "hammer" nickname — referencing physical blows he would deliver during tackles made.

Nonetheless, the Packets would go on to win the first two Super Bowls with wins over the Chiefs and Raiders respectively. Williamson's football career ended in 1968 with a one-year stint with the Montreal Alouettes in the Canadian Football League. Following in the path of acclaimed running back Jim Brown, Williamson was soon active within the film industry. During his time in Hollywood, Williamson's involvements included participation as an actor, producer and director. Action movies were at the core of William's career.

Among his successes included multiple movies and an appearance in one of the original episodes of the television series Star Trek. Interestingly, he also appeared for a short stint as part of the Monday Night Football franchise in replacing analyst Don Meredith. Among his most successful films was in appearing in the 1996 Quentin Tarantino movie, "From Dusk to Dawn," which featured another rising star, George Clooney.

The Wounded Warrior Project originated in 2003 and provides programs, services and events for wounded veterans of military actions since September 11, 2001. The motto is simple and direct: "The greatest casualty is being forgotten."

Those interested in playing can do so as an individual at \$275 or \$1,000 per foursome. Each entrant plays in an 18-hole scramble format round of golf, the pairings and awards parties and includes light buffet, no host bar, range balls and lunch.

A Bold New Vision of Community, Hospitality & Sustainability



TALUS La Quinta aims to set a new standard for resort communities in the Coachella Valley



lanning a getaway to the Coachella Valley? May we suggest late 2022 or 2023—that is if you want to be among the first to experience the newly imagined TALUS La Quinta, an ambitious rebranding of a resort and residential community that aims to set an extraordinary new standard in desert hospitality. To say there's a high level of anticipation and excitement surrounding the long-delayed development at SilverRock is an understatement.

Phase 1 of the 525-acre development includes two luxury hotels, spas, private residences, a new golf clubhouse, extensive dining options and more. The luxury Montage Hotel will feature 134 casita-style guest rooms, while the Pendry Hotel, a "lifestyle" brand, will offer 200 guest rooms. In between the two will be a 70,000-square-foot conference center, which will open concurrently with the Montage Hotel.

Randy J. Duncan, general manager and director of golf at SilverRock, says the completed project will elevate golf across the desert. "SilverRock opened on Valentine's Day, 2005. Since then, it's been a golf course, clubhouse, golf operations and some F&B, all surrounded by hundreds and hundreds of acres of undeveloped land. When this project is complete, it's going to be the mecca of the desert. The quality and high standards Montage brings to the community will have a positive impact on the golf experience. I'm

Work is moving full steam ahead. The Montage is slated to open in Spring 2023, while the Pendry will welcome its first guests in 2024. Both properties are part of Montage International. Jeff Yamaguchi, VP of real estate with TALUS, says the first of the 29 single-family Montage-branded homes will be ready in November 2022. Delivery of the first Pendry-branded condos is scheduled for February 2023. These 55 condo units will be built in 11 threestory buildings, five residences or "stacked flats" per building.

The design aesthetic across TALUS celebrates Desert Modernism, a low-profile style that welcomes the desert landscape in. Montage staff will manage the homes and owners can opt to put residences in a short-term rental program, providing another option for out-of-town guests wanting more than a hotel room for

The new golf clubhouse is scheduled to open at the start of the next fall season. Golf and F&B operations will move to the new clubhouse, leaving historic Ahmanson Ranch House ready for its transformation into an exciting new dining venue.

What won't change is the Arnold Palmer-designed golf course, which completed a significant renovation several years ago. It will remain open to the public—and to hotel guests when they arrive. And residents of La Quinta, wherever they live in town, will still have the La Quinta Resident Program available to them. Duncan says retaining the resident program was always in the plan. "Elements of the program may change," he notes, "but the program will remain."

TALUS La Quinta has been described as a community focused around wellness, activity and sustainability, within the context of respect for and enjoyment of the natural desert landscape. "TALUS is your wellspring in the desert, alive with opportunities to nourish body, mind and soul," it says on the website. Another spot proclaims, "You feel powerful, yet unusually peaceful as you connect with the cadence and rhythm of the land. It's the next chapter of SilverRock, a place to truly be alive and well."

It may be marketing hype, yet the passion of developers for this project makes one wonder if a community, this community, actually can offer all that up in a tangible, meaningful way. Yamaguchi says TALUS absolutely can and will. "There's a distinct energy derived from the mountains and the land. 'Talus' is defined as

a gathering of rock fragments at the base of a mountain, and that was the inspiration behind the name change. Our goal is to create a gathering place and a unique assemblage of experiences for every family generation."

When asked about the more esoteric goals of the project, Yamaguchi's passion is clear. In terms of sustainability, he says solar energy is a core element of the residences. And though recycled materials won't feature in construction until after Phase 1, he points out that they've reduced concrete and steel in the residential construction in favor of expansive use of glass, which simultaneously helps connect residents to the outside environment and reduces energy costs. "Glass helps keep homes warmer in winter by allowing heat in, and in summer, the double-paned glass will make the homes both cooler and more energy-efficient," he says.

The health of residents and visitors was also a consideration in construction and hospitality practices. "We're putting in an air purification system attached to HVAC, which filters out particles down to .03 microns," Yamaguchi notes. "Given the events of the past 18 months, air quality is a huge consideration for everyone. We want to create an extra level of confidence for residents and their guests by providing a safer, healthier living environment."

Most exciting is the vision for a farm in the next development phase. "We're hoping to create a farm where we'll grow products for culinary and spa programs, and also create an opportunity for organic composting," Yamaguchi says. "Additionally, we want to curate a farm-totable culinary experience that will be available to residents, hotel guests and people in the local community. "Agriculture," he continues, has been integral to the Coachella Valley's history and identity. With the evolution of plantbased palates and dietary requirements, we think it's time to make it a priority going forward."


Another goal is to-take wellness to the next level by establishing regimes and protocols that tap into the spiritual aspects of wellness. There are no concrete plans on that yet, but Yamaguchi says they'll likely come toward the end of next year."

In the end, he says, "We want TALUS to be a sanctuary, a place where you not only connect with the land, the sky and the mountains, but also where you reconnect with family and rejuvenate your soul."

That's a tall order for a desert golf resort. But TALUS La Quinta is focused on setting a new standard altogether. "To be able to bring this level of luxury hospitality to the valley is really exciting and really *important*," Yamaguchi says. "The Coachella Valley has never had a 5-Diamond, 5-Star resort; given the history of this destination, that's hard to believe. We believe TALUS will change that."

Hype? Maybe. But our bet—and hope—is that TALUS La Quinta will live up to everything it's meant to be.

Happy Holidays! Today we are going to focus on bunkers. This bunker shot that we are going to feel today is a tight front pin bunker. This months golf tip will be for the intermediate to advanced golfer. Some of theses bunker keys are used to help you feel a more accurate distance & ball control.



SET UP: (DO THESES IN A PRACTICE BUNKER)

- 1. Check your ball position (draw a line in the sand, place practice ball directly in front of the line in the sand). Ball position should be off your LEFT INSTEP
- 2. Stance: wide base, open stance (feels like width of driver)
- 3. Hands: also in line of sand, very close to your legs & down
- 4. Grip: will be stronger (face blade to SKY height, I like my blade open)
- 5. Head: in line of sand
- 6. Feet: dig in sand according to texture & feel of sand (today at least "2 digs down")
- 7. Weight: will be on the LEFT SIDE (80%) & feel like your "sitting on left side of body"
- 8. Hips & shoulders: match slope & point up to sky

SWING KEYS:

- 1. Keep your weight on LEFT SIDE (no lateral movement) stay
- 2. Takeaway: more steep angle of attack, swinging across your feet line, tight arc, feel like the wrists are "setting fast"
- 3. Divot: enter into sand by the "line in the sand"


- 4. Speed: accelerate through the shot add more "SPEED" to create the "splash / thump" sound & feel (which equals an amazing shot)
- 5. FINISH: chest & body will face the sky
- 6. Weight at finish: will be almost all on left side
- 7. Hands: on this shot I choose a "high hand & high club finish"

DRILLS:

- 1. Divot drill: Draw 2 lines in the sand "4 wide", place 3 balls inside line & check your divots (is your divot: early? Late? Too steep, repeat until happy)
- 2. Alignment rod in sand: vertical (place right outside your golf balls) this checks your ball position, spine position & finish on LEFT SIDE of alignment rod, this also helps remind you get to the left side

I look forward to working with you on your bunker at SilverRock! Hopefully these intermediate-advanced tips will help you feel better about your tight bunker play.

Plaid is the New Red
The new Tesla Model S



Tesla is nothing if it isn't cheeky. From it's "Bioweapon Defense" setting for the Model X air filtration system to its "Ludicrous Mode" to kicks its Model S into hyper drive, Tesla's quirkiness is something drivers have come to love. The latest Model S Plaid is no exception.

Plaid is a reference to the movie $\ensuremath{\textit{Spaceballs}}\xspace$ in which the pattern of stars zipping past the cockpit of ships at light speed becomes plaid to represent extreme speeds. This reference to the cult classic keeps Telsa CEO Elon Musk in the press and probably makes his engineers proud. He's one of them. Yes, he may have a net worth north of \$250 billion, but he's still a nerd at heart.

The Model S Plaid is the automotive equivalent of Weird Science, another cult classic where two teen scientists create the perfect woman. The Plaid is nearing perfection as a high-tech machine with super powers. The 1020 horsepower Tesla is the girl next door when it comes to looks. Compared to supercars like Mclaren and Lamborghini, the Model Sis pedestrian. A rear spoiler and some carbon fiber set it apart from the standard Model S, and a simple nameplate stating "plaid" on the back end.

At 200 miles per hour, you won't be able to tell the Plaid apart from the Model S. On a drag strip though, you'll know the Plaid from every other car, because it'll be the one in front.

The twin front and rear motors in the Model S Plaid are covered in a carbon sleeve that Tesla engineers claim allows the rotor to spin at 20,000 rpm. This gives the Plaid a powerband that peaks at 80 mph and continues to top speed — regulated by the computer at 163 mph but said to extend beyond 200 mph with a software upgrade and 21-inch wheels.

With every electrical car, the big questions owners will want to know is how far they can make it before they have to recharge. Tesla is touting nearly 350 miles with their improved cooling and







wiring system on the 100 kWh battery system.

Now let's talk about speed. If you're buying a Plaid, it's because you want speed above all else. To get the most out of the Plaid, you must go deep into the settings menu and choose Drag Strip mode. From here, the car will take several minutes (8-15 minutes) to prepare the car for something extraordinary. Next press the brake, floor the accelerator, say a prayer and call your chiropractor because you will be whiplashed into another dimension. The Plaid takes several seconds to enter its Cheetah stance before going into absolute

seconds with a top speed of 152 mph. MotorTrend testers recorder 1.22 g of force from the initial launch from the Plaid's Cheetah stance. It claims the Plaid

is the quickest production car its ever tested.

Getting off the test track actually accentuates the Plaid's best features. The

interior is dynamic. The redesigned infotainment center is now wider than previous models. The air suspension and damper system gives a ride worthy of a super hero, even if its dressed more like Clark Kent than Superman. The knock is the rectangular steering "yoke" that replaces a traditional steering wheel. Good in theory, leaves something to be desired in the real world.

You'll need a healthy dose of self discipline to reign in the urge to go beyond ludicrous every time you have a straight stretch of road longer than a football field or a healthy highway patrol fund from which to draw.

The fully loaded Plaid costs about \$150,000. It's rather unthinkable that a contender for the fastest production car on the road in 2021 is a sedan, named for a clothing pattern.

If candy apple red was the color to have for sports cars of years gone by, plaid is the new red.
