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
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# THE TIME HAS COME FOR THE MULTI-BILLION DOLLAR GOLF INDUSTRY TO STOP, TAKE A DEEP BREATH AND RECALL THE ORIGINAL PURPOSE OF PROFESSIONAL GOLF TOURNAMENTS. THEY'RE NOT ABOUT MILLION-DOLLAR PAYCHECKS, EXPENSIVE GOLF EQUIPMENT AND WINDY COURSES. THEY'RE ABOUT GIVING, AND NO ONE BELIEVED THAT MORE THAN LEGENDARY ENTERTAINER BOB HOPE, WHOSE NAMESAKE TOURNAMENT WILL CELEBRATE 50 YEARS IN THE CALIFORNIA DESERT JAN. 19-25

It was 50 years ago that comedian, actor, entertainer and voracious golfer Bob Hope discovered a new medium to raise funds for those less fortunate in life. With celebrity friends Bing Crosby, Burt Lancaster and Desi Arnaz, and with fellow golf-lover President Dwight D. Eisenhower, Hope made golf fun to watch. He also helped to make it profitable for professionals, businesses and, especially, local charities.

Founded as the Palm Springs Golf Classic in 1958, today's Bob Hope Chrysler Classic (BHCC) maintains high standards for charitable giving in the desert community. To date nearly \$45 million has been donated too more than 190 Coachella Valley charities.

The "Hope" offers professionals, amateurs and celebrity golfers a week of parties, extraordinary golf, bragging rights and hefty prize money. The event's large galleries benefit, too. Excellent shots by the tour players, humorous celebrity antics on the course and, of course, the "Classic Girls," whose ranks once included Jane Powell, Barbara Eden and Lynda Carter, are all part of the entertainment.

Sadly, Hope is no longer with us to fulfill his annual hosting duties, but accepting this year's honor is Hope's longtime friend, five-time Classic winner and legendary golfer, Arnold Palmer. As one generation will never forget Bob Hope, another generation has never heard of Hope or his For Hope, it was all about playing it right and playing it often. It was in the 1930's that he became hooked on the game. Observing the Diamond Brothers, a vaudeville juggling act, going in and out of the hotel with their golf bags, the entertainer discovered they were hitting

balls at a nearby driving range. One day they invited Hope to accompany them, and the rest, as they say, is history.

"I play golf every chance I get. The world needs more laughter." \*

Hope played golf practically every day of his life, eventually playing to a four "I'm proud to introduce Dolores. Behind every successful man there's a woman...telling him to keep moving...or else!"\*

In 1934 Hope married Dolores Reade. On their first date, they discovered a shared passion for the game of golf. Their tablecloth reflected that ardor as it was covered with diagrams of the holes they both knew and enjoyed. The Hopes used to take their four children golfing every Sunday afternoon, and often centered family holidays around golf courses. Hope and Dolores continued to play together until at age 87, due to an accident, Dolores

Alaska to Australia—in the company of golfs top professionals, caddies, celebrities, generals and even presidents. In 1995, Hope and the Classic made history when the pro-am team of Bill Clinton, George H. W. Bush, Gerald Ford, Bob Hope and defending champion Scott Hoch teed up and Bush the most hits...me, I cheated better than ever."

"Take nine strokes off your score. Skip the last hole."\*

To date many think the BHCC is the only tournament Hope founded for charity; however, in 1948 at the Edgmont

could no longer take a full back swing. "This was one of the biggest disappointments of her life," Linda says.

"I play golf in the eighties. Any hotter and I won't play."\*

In his lifetime, Hope played over 2000 golf courses—from Brazil to Bangkok, for the tournament's opening round. That event marked the first time a sitting president (Clinton) played during a PGA tour event, and perhaps the first time three presidents ever played together. Hope remarked at the end of the day, "Clinton had the best score, Ford the most errors

Golf Club in Los Angeles, Hope teamed up with blind golfer Charles E. Tooth and the HOPE for the Blind Tournament was born. It drew 46 golfers and solidified Hope's association with the event. For 20 years, Hope and Tooth nurtured the blind golfers' program, and Tooth eventually

founded the U. S. Blind Golfers Foundation, Inc.


"Age is only a number. However, in my case, it is a rather large number."\*

Arguably Hollywood's greatest golfer, Hope left an indelible mark on the game. Because of the allure of his name, a decision was made by the Hope estate, tournament organizers and corporate sponsor Chrysler to include the legendary entertainer's name on the tournament for as long as a substantial portion of its proceeds are given to charities. It has long been, and no doubt will forever be, known by one and all as the Bob Hope Chrysler Classic.

It has been said of Hope, "If he could live his life over again, he wouldn't have time." Hope passed away at his home in Toluca Lake, Calif. in 2003. According to one of Hope's daughters, when asked where he wanted to be buried, he said to his wife, "Surprise me."






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# THE BOB HOPE CHRYSLER CLASSIC TURNS 50 THIS YEAR. IT MAY TAKE A LITTLE MAGIC FOR IT TO REACH 51. GIVEN THE CURRENT ECONOMIC CLIMATE, NOTHING IS FOR SURE, ESPECIALLY WHEN IT COMES TO DOING BUSINESS

Banks are in trouble. Car companies are in trouble. Retirement plans are in trouble. Not even the magic of the PGA Tour can change all of that. While the Bob Hope Chrysler Classic has been a fixture in the desert for a half-century, nothing is a given any more. There have even been a couple of shake-ups within the structure of the tournament itself.

George Lopez is out as the host. Arnold Palmer is in. And the Classic Club, host course in 2006, 2007 and 2008, is out of the rotation, replaced by the Nicklaus Course at PGA West. The other courses in the rotation for 2009 are Bermuda Dunes, La Quinta's SilverRock Resort and the Palmer-designed Palmer Private Course at PGA West.

As the PGA Tour's only 90-hole tournament, the Hope will be played over those four courses on the first four days of the event, with the Palmer course serving as host facility and finalround venue.

Everyone is mum about replacement of Lopez. They aren't mum about the exclusion of the Classic Club, the course donated

to the tournament by the H.N. and Frances Berger Foundation of Palm Desert, which was never a favorite of tour professionals because of the high winds that raked the layout.

Two years ago Phil Mickelson walked off the Classic Club after his final round and asked the question that was on the mind of a lot of players. "Are they going to use this course again next year?"

The answer was yes. Mickelson didn't come back in 2008. Given that the tournament hasn't had a good record attracting the No. 1 golf attraction in the world, Tiger Woods, losing No. 2 didn't



help either the strength of field or ticket sales—especially since there were other players in the field who felt the same way as Lefty.

"For the good of the tournament, to protect the field, we felt like we had to react," said John Foster, a longtime tournament board member. "The issues we had were with the wind, especially when it was blowing at the Classic Club on days when the other courses didn't have any wind."

While the removal of the Classic Club from the rotation probably won't mean Woods will play (he's staying very mum about when he plans on returning to the Tour after undergoing knee surgery midway through the 2008 season), it might mean that more name players will participate, especially given Palmer's presence and the tournament's 50th birthday party.

Mickelson might be back. All of the other former champions are expected to return, and they won't be alone. The tournament features 128 PGA Tour professionals and 384 amateur players, comprising a list that includes some of the biggest names from the worlds of entertainment and sports. And if 50 years have taught us nothing else, they have shown that anything can happen in the Coachella Valley.



Seventeen times in the first 49 years of the tournament, it took a sudden-death playoff to decide the winner. It took David Duvall shooting a 59 in the final round of the 1999 event to defeat Steve Pate by one shot. And last year, D.J. Trahan had to overcome a four-shot Justin Leonard lead over the final 18 holes to claim the title, even though the unofficial odds-makers in the large gallery didn't give him much of a chance going into the final round.

"You certainly don't feel optimistic about your chances when you are playing against a guy like Justin Leonard," Trahan said after his final-round 65 gave him a three-shot victory over Leonard, who had back-to-back bogeys on the 10th and 11th and finished his round with another bogey on the 18th for a final-round 72. "I wasn't playing against a rookie who was in the lead for the first time."

Halfway through the final round, Trahan, who had just one PGA Tour victory to his credit, was still doing the chasing after Leonard played the first eight holes of his last round in 3-under-par. But then came the stretch from No. 9 through No. 11. Trahan sank

an eight-foot birdie putt on the 9th. He rolled in a 40-footer from the fringe for another birdie on the 10th and made par on the 11th. Meanwhile, Leonard made par at 9, but bogey at both 10 and 11.

Trahan took the lead for keeps by canning another eight-footer for birdie at 14 to reach 25-under, and ended his round with a fivefoot birdie putt on 18 to finish at 26-under.

Over the 90 holes of the tournament, Trahan had 35 birdies, 46 pars and only nine bogeys. He led the field in birdies, putts per round and putts for greens in regulation. Over the five days of the event, he averaged just 26 putts per round—a stat that amazed Trahan, who isn't known for his prowess with the flat stick.

"Pardon me for smiling," he said after looking over the final stats sheet. "But I've never had anyone tell me before that I'm a good putter."




team, tied for third at 338, four shots behind Trahan and one back of Leonard. It was just another normal final day at the Hope.

Don't expect anything different this year, except that Arnold Palmer will be greeting the winner behind the final green, which will make the win even more special. And that just might be the miracle needed to make next year's tournament more special, too.

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

Even if you're 79, 50 years is a long time. And when those 50 years are packed with some of the best career, business and personal moments of one's life, it's beyond

Hope. To start, he won the tournament five times between 1960 and 1973.

The only other tournament in the nation with a similar connection to a



While there are no stories of Palmer making similar arbitrary architectural adjustments to Thunderbird Country Club, it was there that the relationship between The King and the Coachella Valley began. As a blooming superstar reaching the height of his physical powers and the zenith of his popularity, the brash young Pennsylvanian swooped into the valley in the mid-1950s with a cardigan sweater and a pack of cigarettes.

Prior to Palmer's arrival, the Coachella Valley was building a reputation as a place for Hollywood-types to get away from it all. But in those modern times, the sleeping desert that was still home to native populations was being bought, leased, poked and prodded by golf-course and residential developers who saw the area as a potential haven for the wealthy, swinging West Coast population that celebrated the outdoors, including the game of golf.



fitting that Palmer was chosen as host of this year's event. It's perfect for the tournament, which needed an injection of class after an unfortunate relationship with comedian George Lopez. And it's perfect for Palmer, whose connections to the desert are equaled only by Orlando, Fla., the vortex of his golf empire, and his lifelong residence in Latrobe, Pa.

So, while the Hope will be celebrating its 50th anniversary, there's a strong chance that the event could evolve into a cocelebration of the history of the tournament and Palmer's involvement in it. For the two are nearly inseparable.

Any tournament on the PGA Tour would move whatever obstacles necessary to land Palmer as host. But arguably, outside of Palmer's relationship with Bay Hill, no tournament can boast the same type of historical connection that Palmer has to the








То promote their visionary developments, golf courses jockeyed for key events to enhance their reputations. Hollywood stars, entertainers and politicians, including President Dwight D. Eisenhower, spent many sunny days in the valley on exciting new courses such as the Canyon Club, Tamarisk Country Club and

Thunderbird. They were heavily photographed, and the photographs circulated among the social elite and those on its fringes who saw this new wonderland, just a short drive down a twolane road from the emerging West Coast power and population centers, as a place where they could rub elbows with movie and television stars under real stars, enjoy a weekend soak in glamour surrounded by mountains, palm trees and sparkling swimming pools.

Into this scene came Palmer, who had already won the 1955 Canadian Open and had scored international wins in Colombia and Panama before arriving in Southern California. Palmer played in the first Thunderbird Invitational at Thunderbird Country Club in January 1956, finishing sixth. But something happened down in Palmer's soul during that visit to the desert. Whether it was the outdoorsman in him, the climate in January (highly preferable to January in Latrobe), the distinct lure of Southern California in the 1950s or all of the above, Palmer knew from the moment he arrived in the valley that it would become a special place in his special life.

"During my first trip, there were only three courses there," said Palmer. "But my interest started from there. I could see that it was one of the great places in the world to





play golf. It was sitting on beautiful land and the weather was perfect, perfect golf conditions. It was pristine."

Much like the valley itself, Palmer's career took offin 1956. He went on to win two more tournaments that year, building his reputation as the people's champion. While he continued to develop business and personal relationships in the valley over the next three years, Palmer's first win in the area didn't come until the 1959 Thunderbird Invitational, where he shot a final-round 62 to overtake Jimmy Demaret.

"Jimmy was leading the tournament and I remember he holed out his second shot on the first hole for eagle," said Palmer. "I could hear the crowd yipping and yelling and I told myself I knew I was going to have to play like hell to catch him."

It was the first of six desert victories for Palmer, the last of which came in 1973 at the Hope when he overhauled Jack Nicklaus in the final round, then held on during a three-way back-nine duel with Nicklaus and Johnny Miller to win with a four-round total of 274. For Palmer, it was his fifth Hope title and, as it turned out, his last win on the PGA Tour.

Between 1959 and 1973, Palmer won two Hope tournaments and two Palm Springs Invitationals, the forerunner of the Hope. Just one year after he claimed his first desert win at Thunderbird, Palmer won the 1960 Palm Springs Invitational, taking the title again in 1962. After narrowly losing in the 1966 Hope, Palmer won his first Hope title in 1968, and repeated the win in the 1971 Hope by defeating Raymond Floyd in a playoff.

"I just enjoy the golf tournament and the conditions there very much," said Palmer. "It was fun. It's just fun."

# ARGUABLY THE GREATEST LPGA PLAYER, AND ONE OF THE GREATEST GOLFERS PERIOD, ANNIKA SORENSTAM IS WALKING AWAY FROM COMPETITION. NOW HER PASSION FOR GOLF TAKES A NEW DIRECTION

On May 13, 2008 Annika Sorenstam surprised the golf world with notice that she would be "stepping away" from professional golf at the end of 2008. The news was all the more surprising given that she had already won three tournaments, climbing back to number two in the Rolex World Rankings, just behind Lorena Ochoa.

Since May, Sorenstam—one of the few women to hold a career Grand Slam as well as 10 majors titles—has been on her "farewell tour" around the globe. Fans have flocked to pay tribute to this living legend that has impacted women's golf, just as Tiger Woods (her neighbor and good friend) has impacted the men's game for more than a decade.



In December she'll defend her title at the Dubai Ladies Masters, the final tournament of a brilliant career. About whether her "stepping away" is permanent (she has deliberately not used the "r" word, retirement), Sorenstam isn't definitive, leaving the door slightly ajar for the future.

"If it's forever, I'm not really sure, but it's definitely for now," she said in May. "This is obviously a very difficult decision for me to make, because I love this game very much...I have a lot of dreams that I want to follow, I want to live and I'm getting married Mike (McGee) and I want to start a family.


"I'm going to miss the adrenaline pumping when you walk down the last few holes having a chance to win...golf has been tremendous to me. I've dedicated my life to golf since I picked up a club. It's over 20 years. It's been living, breathing, eating and sleeping golf. I want to make sure that I can give back by helping and inspiring young kids to develop and reach their dreams."

Sorenstam has been a formidable competitor during her professional career, and while she says she will miss the competition, she also says she's satisfied knowing that she's given the game her all and that she's leaving it on her terms.

But she's not really leaving golf, just tournament play. It's more a shift of focus. Instead of focusing on winning tournaments or trying to shoot another 59 (she was the first woman to break the 60 barrier), she plans to dive into to a variety of projects, many of them themed with her trademark phrase, "Share My Passion."

But first things first, Sorenstam and McGee will marry in January. "Our February honeymoon is skiing for three weeks at Whistler, then to Montana's Yellowstone Club, and returning to Canada to finish offour schussing."

New challenges for Sorenstam include continuing with golf course design—her fifth course, in Canada, is underway—and becoming a USGA ambassador, involved in the Rules of Golf program and programs aimed at growing the game. She also joined the Golf in 2016 Olympics panel, which hopes to bring golf back to the Olympics. It was last an Olympic sport in 1904.



Among her primary passions is her foundation, which helps aspiring junior golfers in a variety of ways, including scholarships and grants. In January, she'll team with the American Junior Golf Association (AJGA) for the ANNIKA Invitational, an event featuring the world's top 60 junior girls and hosted by the foundation. She will also increase her activities related to ANNIKA Academy, a school dedicated to both golf and fitness.

"I care a lot about nutrition, a lot about health education," she said. "Looking at kids today, they might not always have the best role model nor get the best education on how to eat right and exercise."





Sorenstam earned the respect and admiration of legions of fans, but also of her fellow competitors. Lorena Ochoa, current Number One woman golfer in the world and the player who ended Annika's reign, says Annika was an important role model for her.

"I have good memories," Ochoa says. "When she won the Nabisco Dinah Shore, I won the best amateur. I got a sponsor's exemption. I remember getting the award and our taking the picture together. I still have the picture.

"Annika told me, 'You look great. Congratulations. I hope we'll see you later here on Tour.' She's been for sure a motivation to me...I actually called her before I turned professional. I told her, 'I need some help.' I didn't know what to do and where to go. She gave me good advice. She's always been there, and that shows how good a person and champion she is. I'm going to miss her. I feel honored to be able to play with her...I can say I played with her, and it's been great."

Sorenstam was also a role model for Norway's Suzann Peterssen, ranked number four in the world, who says, "I will miss her greatly...Annika has contributed more to women's golf than anyone else."

Golf Hall of Fame member Juli Inkster adds, "Annika works so hard at her game. She has so much respect for all and the game. She plays it right, doesn't take anything for granted. She has changed the game; now we all work out and we are more business."

Evian Masters 2007 Champion, Natalie Gulbis says Sorenstam always gives 120 percent. "She searches for only the best, gives the best and expects the best in everything—golf, cooking, working out."

Sorenstam will be missed on the fairways for her great shot making, determination and will to win. But she will continue to be 'the' role model for many golfers in the years to come, and that will be her enduring legacy as well.

Thank you, Annika, for sharing your passion.

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


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# GOLF AND GORGEOUS GIRLS ARE A WINNING COMPETITION IN PALM SPRINGS




Eagle Falls is a masterpiece of design carved out of the California desert in a town hardly lacking for spectacular golf courses. The 6,715-yard, par-72 layout, which opened in 2006, has plenty of challenge for low handicappers yet remains enjoyable for every level of player. It includes five lakes, two waterfalls and running streams, and though it features panoramic desert vistas, it is more reminiscent of a links-style course. Among its most distinguished features, in fact, is the par-3 No. 6, an exact replica of the famed "Postage Stamp" on Troon Golf Course in Scotland, except that the green has been extended slightly to make the hole a bit friendlier.

In a short time, Eagle Falls has become one of the highest rated public golf courses





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# RECEIVING HIGH MARKS IN COMPARISON WITH OTHER ARIZONA PRIVATE CLUBS, THIS NORTH SCOTTSDALE VENUE OFFERS INVITING AMENITIES, A FAMILY ATMOSPHERE AND A CLOSE-KNIT COMMUNITY

When Terravita Golf Club opened in 1994 against the scenic foothills north of Scottsdale, the area was populated more with desert critters than humans. From metro Phoenix it's just a short 30-minute drive to nirvana, but the location was considered a little remote at the time. These days, Terravita has abundant company with the influx of residents and luxurious clubs and resorts—including

The golfclub has been member-owned and run since 1998, and Mallory reports directly to the board of directors. Until recently, members have been homeowners in Terravita's gated community who chose to join. But the facility, with a membership cap of 345, has now expanded its circle to include non-residents. That's good news for out-of-staters considering membership in

another golf club or a second home.

"We have a great location," says Mallory, "ultra-scenic and near metropolitan attractions. The amenities are outstanding." But he believes that it's the intangible and often-elusive quality of a cohesive membership that makes this club so appealing.

"Golf is the reason people come to clubs to get to know others. You find a community and get to know people. It's like starting a new school; [at first] you don't know anyone or fit in. What we offer is friendliness. We have a strong couples membership. And with men and ladies' nine-hole and 18-hole associations, there are all kinds of opportunities to get involved and get to know people."

A luxe 34,000-square-foot clubhouse features a grill and a fine-dining restaurant, nice settings for dinners and cocktail receptions. Members also get together for activities beyond the golf course, such as local outings that include Octoberfest, Diamondback baseball games and Cardinal football games.

"Terravita has a family atmosphere; it's a friendliness and openness. That's what attracts our members," says Mallory.


The golf course was created by former PGA Tour player Billy Casper and local designer Greg Nash, and it's consistently lauded by publications and the public. Readers of *Arizona Business Magazine's* 



The Boulders, just a stone's throw away. In this gorgeous and golf-saturated region, you'll hear claim after claim about the fabulous amenities of each venue.

But amid all the hubbub, Terravita continues to quietly and confidently make a name for itself with a simple formula: a top-quality championship golf course, inviting private-club amenities and an extremely welcoming atmosphere. Genial members socialize on and off the course, and when they talk about the club you'll hear the word "family" repeatedly as they describe their experience.

"Our community friendliness separates us from other clubs," says Steve Mallory, Terravita's Director of Golf. "There are huge golf clubs with big names—high-end and expensive, with six-figure initiation fees. I don't want to say we're a value, but we're a nice alternative."





annual "Ranking Arizona" poll have named it as a Top 3 private venue in the state for the last six years—voting it No. 1 three times on a list considered the best publicopinion poll in the state.

Known for its bent-grass greens, the course is carefully tended year-round against Arizona temperature extremes. How would Mallory describe the playing experience?

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"High Sonoran desert golf at its best. We have large, undulating greens and constantly changing hole locations. If you play the course on a daily basis, it's different all the time—a lot of different types of looks, so it never gets boring. The course was designed to highlight mountain views. One of the nice things is that it's playable for everyone with five sets of tees. It's one of the most difficult in the state for single-digit players. For the average player, it opens up a lot and away from visually intimidating desert areas."

A two-way practice area allows plenty of room for golfers to warm up by the first tee, while those who want more concentrated practice can do so a little removed from the clubhouse. The staff is made up of PGA Class A professionals, and even the course superintendent is industry-certified.

A centerpiece of Terravita's 823-acre community, the golf course was designed so that players rarely see the 23 neighborhoods of 1,380 homesites. Homes range from 1,350 to 3,750 square feet, from \$350,000 casitas to \$1 million estates, encompassing second homes to year-round residences. This was Del Webb's first Sun Belt project that didn't have an over-55 age requirement for its residents. Homeowners automatically receive membership in the community's separate, non-golf country club with recreational and social activities, which adds to the superb resort lifestyle at the heart of Terravita.

In truth, Terravita has it all. "When guests come in from out of town, they talk about the contrast of the green grass up again the backdrop of the desert—it's spectacular," Mallory says. "All of the golfers love our patio area, especially watching the sun go down. We have some of the most beautiful sunsets in the world. The personality and friendliness of our members and staff speak to our overall experience as well. Most members live next to one another and play golf together. They say it's like having a family you see on a daily basis—on the course, having lunch or working out. We have an extremely close-knit membership."



With apologies to the Super Bowl, the FBR Open again lived up to its name as the "Greatest Show on Grass." It's never sold out. It's played on a perfect stage. And it never fails to thrill. So while the Giants and Pats were warming up, the golf action was already hot.

Phil Mickelson and J.B. Holmes were going head-to-head in a sudden-death playoff to determine the FBR title, and most in the gallery had their money on Lefty to claim the crown. But nobody told Holmes, the long-hitting Kentucky native who had claimed his only PGA Tour title at TPC Scottsdale in 2006. Making birdie on the 18th hole twice in a span of two holes, Holmes, who would later in the season be a teammate of Mickelson on the winning U.S. Ryder Cup team, knocked out one of the biggest names in the world of professional golf in the stare-down playoff.

"I thought I had the advantage going into the playoff," said Holmes, who was playing several groups behind Mickelson in the final round. "He'd been sitting in the clubhouse for a while and I was loose. Plus, the hole favors me."

Clearly. Holmes jerked his tee shot left of the lake guarding the left side of the fairway on the long par 4, and almost into one of the hospitality tents. He got a drop from a decorative fence and proceeded to stick his second shot 13 feet from the hole, then drained the birdie putt to force the playoff. Returning to the 18th for suddendeath play, Holmes ripped his second chance right down the heart of the fairway—359 yards from the tee and just a flip wedge from the green.

"I just smoked it," the Kentuckyan said. "I thought it was going to go farther than it did."

It went far enough. Mickelson found the green with his second shot, 28 feet from the cup. Holmes' second shot finished eight feet away. Mickelson missed. Holmes didn't.

"I guess that proves I can play under pressure," a relieved Holmes said after the win. "I didn't have my best stuff today, but I still came through and won. I didn't give up, I played hard and when I needed to make it,

Mickelson's runner-up finish was the 21st of his career. "Starting the day, I would have gladly taken getting into a playoff," said Mickelson, who birdied three of the final six holes to force the playoff. "But you have to give J.B. credit for making birdie twice on the 18th. That's pretty impressive golf."

businessmen who have been involved with the event since 1939—long before it was known as the FBR Open. The tournament may change names, but the money it raises keeps on coming.



Charles Warren finished third at 13under, one shot out of the playoff, while there was a five-way tie for fourth at 12under—meaning there were eight players within two shots when the final counting

But that's nothing new at the FBR Open. The final four holes at TPC Scottsdale are made for drama. The par-5 15th plays to an island green, the real estate where Holmes dunked his second shot last year on his way to making bogey. The par-3 16th is unlike any hole on the PGA Tour, with the massive gallery cheering players when they hit the green and booing them when they don't. The par-4 17th, which plays just 332 yards from the tips, is reachable, and then you have the finishing par-4 with its mounds defining stadium golf.

It's a dream tournament at a dream place doing a dream job. The tournament has raised more than \$53 million for Phoenix area charities, largely thanks to the Thunderbirds, a group of area



# YES, KENNY G IS "THE GUY WITH THE CRAZY HAIR" WHO HAS MADE A SUCCESSFUL LIVING PLAYING THE SAXOPHONE. PERHAPS, THE WORD "SUCCESSFUL" IS AN UNDERSTATEMENT, CONSIDERING THAT G HAS SOLD OVER 75 MILLION ALBUMS WORLDWIDE AND IS TOUTED BY MUSIC-INDUSTRY LEADERS AS THE MOST CELEBRATED SAXOPHONIST OF ALL TIME. OFFERING LISTENERS A MIXTURE OF ADULT CONTEMPORARY AND SMOOTH JAZZ SOUNDS, G IS A STAPLE ON BOTH POP AND JAZZ CHARTS

What many of his fans don't know is that Kenny G carries a +.3 handicap and admits to a possible obsession with golf. He is also a knowledgeable and enthusiastic fan of the Ryder Cup competition. It was just after the 2008 Ryder Cup that *Desert Golf Magazine* caught up with him.

"Wasn't the Ryder Cup amazing?" he exclaimed. "I really wanted J. B. Holmes to make the winning putt because of the Kentucky crowd and everything, obviously it turned out great but that would have been even more amazing."

Originally allowed only a limited time with the star, we found

out that for Kenny G, golf is a great persuader.

"As long as we are talking golf it's okay, this is fun." he said.

Born Kenny Gorelick in Seattle, Washington, G started playing both saxophone and golf at age ten. With Seattle's notable rainfall, he found more time for music than golf, but he loved golf from the very beginning.

It was his older brother Brian who introduced him to the game. "I played nine holes with my brother and his best friend at Jefferson

Memorial in Seattle," recalls G. "I was about a foot and a half shorter than everybody because they were five years older than me. I played just as well as they did and thought, 'wow, this is a game I can play as well as the big guys,' and it was really, really fun. I loved it. I can still remember it."

Today G plays about once a week and claims that maintaining his +.3 is easy. "I can shoot three under par when everything's working my way, but I haven't had a hole-in-one. I keep wishing and telling myselfit's going to happen on the par 3s, but it hasn't."

A resident of the Los Angeles area, G is married to Lyndie Benson. The couple has two children: Max, 13, and Noah, nine. Both boys have an interest in the saxophone and piano, but so far not golf.

Given the man's phenomenal success in music, it's seems a pertinent question to ask him how he divides his time between multiple homes. "I'm just a regular normal person with one home," he says.

G's home course is Sherwood Country Club in Los Angeles and he plays there with a regular foursome that includes actor Craig T. Nelson, Steve Parks and Milton Kim.

"We always play together, that's my dream foursome," G says. "They are my friends, and we get on the tee and go 'regular game' and there we go. I like playing for money, I like getting nervous because it makes me play better. People need to play for something that makes them nervous; otherwise, when you are nervous you'll be paralyzed and unable to perform."

For G it's playing and finding his game on the course, not on the driving range.

"If you would have asked me this three years ago, I was a 'driving-range person.' Now I would rather work on my game while playing."

One of his most memorable golfing moments was playing with Tiger Woods in a pro-am. "He's real easy to be around and likes to have fun. Tiger is relaxed on the course and a little cocky, but really fun. He's also confident and not afraid to show it; I enjoy playing with people like that."

He enjoys playing in charity events when time permits. "It's all

about the money for the charity," he remarks. "When you can play golf and raise money for charity, it's pretty cool."

Even though G considers his regular foursome his dream team, his ultimate foursome would include Arnold Palmer, Tiger Woods and President Clinton.

"I'd take Arnie because I've played golf with him and he's amazing and fun to be around. Tiger, because he's Tiger Woods. Then I'd pick President Clinton, because he is really

interesting and never at a loss for words. Plus when I played with him he was very gracious to everyone who wanted to meet him, from the guys raking the leaves to my newfound friends, it was a great experience."

G's enjoyment of the game is derived from being able to test himself and his reactions when he wins or loses, as well as from getting to meet people that he wouldn't normally get to meet. He takes his golf clubs with him wherever he goes.

With the release of the SL 63 AMG, Mercedes-Benz is bringing back the shine to the AMG brand. Gone are the Norse-like Viking ships powered by star cruiser power. Instead, a trend toward blending style and sportiness into a world-class competitor in the sports car market appears to be on the horizon. The SL 63 AMG is more muscle than meekness and Mercedes-Benz got the handling right on this one.

"It's a horse," says Mark Chaney, new car sales manager at Phoenix Motor Company. "But the cool thing about it is that it

thunderbolt harnesses the power and panache that comes with tuning an engine breathing raw air without the aid of super chargers or turbo. The roar that comes from the tail pipes alone is enough to turn heads and make gawkers ask if they've met you somewhere before.

This flirtatious appeal for a ride won't work with you, though; you have business you must tend to. Putting a spur to this stallion is magical. You expect a bit of a bulky, under-steering ride based on your previous experiences with Mercedes-Benz, but the SL 63



won't beat you up while you drive it. Some roadsters just bang you around and you wouldn't want to drive them from Phoenix to California. The SL 63 is comfortable."

Lancelot's steed is sleek as ever and you get about as many looks driving through town in the SL 63 as you would if you galloped through on a horse. The look is one of awe—with good reason. The mischievous front end hints at a playful side. The start button on the shifter is different and lets everyone know this isn't business as

"The lines are much more aggressive than the SL has ever had," says Noel Burkin, a sales consultant at Mercedes-Benz Palm

The winged side vents are trimmed with "6.3 AMG" emblems in a matte silver finish, adding a sense that this horse may be ready to fly. And fly it does—0 to 60 in 4.3 seconds.

"When people see it, it's just 'Wow,'" says Sonny Lee, sales consultant at Fletcher Jones Imports in Las Vegas. "People who are looking for an AMG usually know as much about the car when they come in as I do. They've done their reading before they come to buy."

AMG prides itself on building engines by hand with one technician working on one engine at a time. The SL 63 is powered by Affalterbach's naturally aspirated 6.2-liter V8. This handcrafted



shocks you with its fast and responsive handling. The Active Body Control system keeps things level and where they should be even while punching it out of turns, while the performance options give drivers the capability of letting computers handle some of the reigns or turning off the cheaters and taking all that the road has to

The Multi Clutch Transmission (MCT) must be made from silk. Four driving modes to choose from—Comfort, Sport, Sport + and Manual—mean there is a driving preference for every occasion. The seven-speed gearbox is leading the way in electronic shifting, and if this catches on, we may never see a stick shift again, and never

"You can floor it, work through all the gears and never even feel the shifting," Chaney says. "The car adapts to the way you drive. There are computers calculating constantly to adjust to your driving style and to keep you safe."

A lowered ride height and stiffened suspension add to the SL 63 fairy tale. An optional AMG Performance Package adds ceramic front brake discs, wider rear tires, a flat-bottomed steering wheel with paddle shifters and an AMG-modified Active Body Control

"The brakes are larger and really add to the feel of control," Lee explains. "When a car accelerates as fast as the SL 63, you want it to



slow down just as fast. Mercedes-Benz thought this through."

Not only does the car turn heads, it has a practical side as well. The retractable roof stores itself neatly away in the back. There's

actually a trunk with storage room that you won't find in cars like Porsche or Ferrari. The interior is as functional as ever with the soft leather and perfect trim you expect from Mercedes.
