TOM LEHMAN'S BRAND NEW GOLF COURSE IS JUST ONE OF THE REASONS PEOPLE ARE CHOOSING TO LIVE IN THIS DISTINCTIVE COMMUNITY

Nowhere is that more true than in one of the very first elements of Encanterra to open, the private championship golf course designed by Ryder Cup U.S. team captain, Tom Lehman. Encanterra is Lehman's first solo design after a successful partnership with golf-course architect John Fought. Open only since January, the par-72 layout is already receiving recognition for its beauty and for its quality of play.

LEHMAN'S DESIGN **INCLUDES** TRADITIONALLY STYLED BUNKERS AND GREEN **COMPLEXES TO** EMPHASIZE SHORT-GAME STRATEGY, PLAYERS WILL HAVE TO CHOOSE THEIR OPTIONS WISELY AND CAREFULLY CONSIDER SHOT SELECTION THROUGHOUT THE COURSE IN ORDER TO SCORE WELL HERE

Lehman describes it as a course that will challenge players but one that they will never find to be unfair. "Good players will appreciate the nuances of strategy that this course presents," he says. "We've worked hard to create situations where players can choose to play a variety of shots. The course does not dictate which shots a player must play."

Lehman's design includes traditionally styled bunkers and green complexes to emphasize short-game strategy. Players will have to choose their options wisely and carefully consider shot selection throughout the course in order to score well here. Part of the genius of the design, however, is that it allows players to make different choices on different days, so that the course remains fresh and interesting no matter how many times a member tees up

Leading the golfteam is Chris Schwartz, Encanterra's new head golf professional. Schwartz was previously head golf professional at Morgan Run Resort & Club in Rancho Santa Fe, Calif., and his experience includes a stint as assistant golf pro at Pinehurst Resort in the Village of Pinehurst, North Carolina. Schwartz has a deep respect for the history and traditions of the game, and he brings that sense of enduring tradition to Encanterra.

What sets this golf course squarely apart from typical new courses in Arizona these days is that it is a classic core-golf design, meaning its interaction with residences is minimal. Rather than opting for shoulder-to-shoulder premium lots lining the fairways, Shea Homes, developer of Encanterra, opted instead to provide a premium golf experience in a purer form. The layout features 140

Take, for example, the practice facility. It will be stocked daily with Titleist Pro VI practice balls. Members can also look forward to a full calendar of hosted weekly games and world-class competitive events, and the highest quality instruction for every level of player from beginner to advanced will be available.

When the club is completed it will include an expansive clubhouse with a fully equipped golf shop, as well as a luxury spa, state-of-the-art athletic club, indoor and outdoor pools, a casual cafe and elegant restaurant, indoor and outdoor event space, private



In a world where stardom is fleeting, Barbara Sinatra can rest assured that Frank Sinatra's legacy will live on. The words "hip" and "cool" are still used in reference to ol' blue eyes, and though the man has passed on, his extraordinary generosity continues to aid children in need.

February 21-24 celebrities will once again converge on the desert in support of the Barbara Sinatra Children's Center at Eisenhower Medical Center in Rancho Mirage, Calif. Opened in 1986, the non-profit remains dedicated to its mission: to counsel physically, sexually and emotionally abused children and to focus on prevention, community education and breaking the cycle of abuse.

Frank's motto from day one was, "No child will be turned away regardless of a family's ability to pay." In order to keep Frank's word, the Sinatras knew that funds had to be raised on an annual basis. In 1988, Frank turned his annual "party in the desert," during which his famous assortment of friends gathered for golf and good times, into a fundraiser. No one realized then that Frank and his friends were launching one of the most successful fundraisers of its kind, or that 20 years later the words "sold out" would still be used.

The Frank Sinatra Countrywide Celebrity Invitational is a celebrity/amateur golf tournament played on two consecutive days, February 22 and 23 this year, at Indian Wells Country Club in Indian Wells. Paired with a different celebrity each day, amateurs

participating in the event contribute \$10,000 for the Platinum Golfer tournament package or \$5,000 for the Gold Golfer package.

Both packages include one golf spot, a tournament gift bag and admission tickets for the evening events. Platinum Golfers are also invited to the one-of-a-kind Post-Gala Nightcap Party, a star-studded





THE STARS ARE IN ALIGNMENT FOR ITALIAN-AMERICAN ACTOR JOE MANTEGNA. COMING OFF OF THE 2007 HIT TELEVISION MINI-SERIES, *THE STARTER WIFE,* MANTEGNA FOLLOWED ONE SUCCESS WITH ANOTHER BY JOINING THE CAST OF AWARD-WINNING DRAMA *CRIMINAL MINDS*

An accomplished actor who has portrayed an eclectic series of characters on stage, film and television, Mantegna's heritage, regardless of the character, is always on display with his handsome Italian good looks. Embracing his heritage proudly, Mantegna received a lifetime achievement award in 2004 at the Los Angeles Italian Film Festival. In case you're wondering, his favorite food is Italian beef, and mention the name Frank Sinatra and Mantegna immediately responds with a Sinatra tale.

"Oh my god, Sinatra," Mantegna remembers saying. "I then said, 'Tom look, I haven't played in 25 years, but if you can guarantee that I will see Frank Sinatra perform, and meet him, I'm there." Dreesen, a close friend of the Sinatra family assured Mantegna that it would happen.

Focused on meeting Sinatra and not on playing golf, Mantegna borrowed golf shoes, clubs and a bag from various friends. "I'm thinking that I'll only play one day, so I take all my borrowed stuff,



Born and raised in Chicago, Mantegna dabbled in golf as a child, caddying for his father and eventually playing golf with him at public courses. After his father's passing when Mantegna was in his early twenties, the actor took a break from the sport—for 25 years. When he finally picked up the clubs again, it was for a good cause: the Annual Frank Sinatra Celebrity Invitational.

"I was in Chicago making the film Baby's Day Out and I went to a charity fundraiser where (comedian) Tom Dreesen was emcee. Tom came up and asked me if I played golf; I told him I hadn't played in 25 years." Dreesen suggested that Mantegna participate in the Frank Sinatra Celebrity Invitational, which he was going to be emceeing, and said he would make sure that Mantegna would meet Sinatra and see him perform.

bring my wife and kids and go down to Palm Springs to relax and have some fun," he recalls.

"I ended up playing both days, and on the second day rotated into a team that was in second place. I knew we played well and thought maybe we placed. As I'm in my hotel room getting ready for the evening gala, I get a call saying our team won and to come down for pictures with Mr. Sinatra."

Shocked, Mantegna hurried to the ballroom. As he was being ushered down a hallway for his celebrity photo op with Sinatra, who does he see held back by security guards but Tom Dreesen. To this day these two goods friends tell a different tale. "No one tells it better than Tom," says Mantegna with a laugh, "we still talk and laugh about that tournament."



As a participant in numerous charity tournaments each year, Mantegna has priorities. "There is one tournament I regularly host, it's for a group called *HOME* (Home Ownership Made Easy). My oldest daughter is autistic and I'm also always involved with groups that deal with autism."

Toluca Lake, Calif., is home for Mantegna, his wife and two daughters, but Mantegna considers visiting the desert a treat. "I've stayed at different places in the desert and have played golf at different places and liked them all. I love La Quinta Resort; I stayed there when I was filming Bugsy. Ithink because my first time in the desert was for the Sinatra tournament, the desert has always seemed magical to me."

Mantegna played in the 2007 LG Skins Game Pro-Am, and he'll be back in the desert for the 20th Annual Frank Sinatra Celebrity Invitational this year. "I call myselfa Monday golfer where nobody gets hurt," he quips.

Not taking the game too seriously is how the actor enjoys himself on the course.



Mantegna has since been an annual participant in the Frank Sinatra Celebrity Invitational, winning for a second time as well as being offered the distinguished honor of co-hosting the event alongside Barbara Sinatra. It was through that first wonderful experience at the tournament that Mantegna also discovered an incredible way for him to help raise money for charities. "My index is about a 23, and I only play in charity events," he says.





"To me golf is a social event; I enjoy the social part more than anything. I know I can improve if I really want to, but I like where I am and would rather play worse than my handicap. I don't need the pressure of being a good player."

Ask this non-serious golfer who would make up his ultimate foursome and with a laugh he replies, "Tiger Woods just because why not? And Annika Sorenstam. This way I would have the best male and female golfer in my group. Then Bill Clinton; I think his golf game is more on

my level and I could talk to him about what it's like to be president."


When not working or spending time with his family, Mantegna helps his wife, Arlene with her successful restaurant, Taste Chicago, in Burbank, Calif. "It's not a fancy restaurant," Mantegna says. "It's all my wife's recipes. We use paper plates and plastic utensils, the restaurant has a homecooking feel and everyone in the area goes there."

Life for Mantegna is "good." When asked to describe it in one sentence, he



pauses then mentions a Lance Armstrong mantra: "Every day is a good day, and some days are great."

GEARING UP FOR THE 2008

KRAFTNABISCO CHAMPIONSHIP

THEY'LL BE MAKING WAVES AGAIN AT THE LPGA'S FIRST MAJOR TOURNAMENT OF THE YEAR

THEY ARE CALLED THE "LADIES OF THE LAKE." THEY ARE ALSO CALLED THE CHAMPIONS. IT'S A TRADITION ON THE LPGA TOUR UNLIKE ANY OTHER, AND IT STARTED WHEN AMY ALCOTT PLUNGED INTO POPPIE'S POND FOLLOWING HER WIN AT THE KRAFT NABISCO CHAMPIONSHIP—IT WAS CALLED THE KRAFT NABISCO DINAH SHORE BACK THEN. SINCE THAT DAY, EACH WINNER OF THE LPGA'S FIRST MAJOR CHAMPIONSHIP OF THE SEASON HAS GOTTEN AT LEAST HER FEET WET

Last year, Morgan Pressel had to wait awhile before taking the plunge. Pressel started the final round of the 2007 Kraft Nabisco trailing—by a bunch. After signing for her final round 69 (she had improved each day of the tournament, previously carding rounds of 74-72-70), the 18-year-old Pressel couldn't do anything but watch and wait.

The wait was worth it as Catriona Matthew, Brittany Lincicome and especially Suzann Pettersen failed to climb past her on the leaderboard sitting behind the island green of the 18th hole on the Dinah Shore Tournament Course of Mission Hills Country Club. And when Pressel finally hit the water, she had company. She was joined in the swim fest by caddie Jon Yarborough and grandmother Evelyn Krickstein. Pressel had been raised by her grandparents after the death of her mother when Pressel was 14.

"I know that my mother is always with me," Pressel said after becoming the youngest player in LPGA history to win a major championship. "And I'm sure she is proud of me.

I would like to thank my grandparents for everything they have done for me and for all of their support and their love. I'm sure they are just as happy for me as I am."

Pressel will return to defend her title when the 2008 edition of the tournament is held April 3-6 at Mission Hills in Rancho Mirage, Calif. She'll be ready for another chance to hit the water, but she'll also have plenty of company in the fight to wear the famous white bathrobe that goes to the winner.


Player of the Year and No. 1-ranked Lorena Ochoa and three-time Kraft Nabisco champion Annika Sorenstam will be in the field, along with former champion Karrie Webb and defending U.S. Open



champion Cristie Kerr. Pettersen, who finished one shot behind Pressel last year but then went on a tear the rest of the 2007 season, is also expected to join the battle for the first-place check of \$300,000—and the right to become a "Lady of the Lake."

IT COUNTS THE PGA AMONG ITS FANS AND THE DRAMATIC BEAUTY OF THE TORTOLITA MOUNTAINS AND SONORAN DESERT AMONG ITS AMENITIES


WHEN WEATHER AND TOPOGRAPHY COME TOGETHER AS THEY DO IN ARIZONA, IT MAKES SENSE THAT GOLF BECOMES MORE THAN JUST 18 HOLES ON ANY GIVEN SUNDAY. AT LEAST A COUPLE OF DEVELOPERS HAVE CAPITALIZED ON THIS PHENOMENON

However, when "exceptional" becomes the norm in describing the lifestyle and amenities at numerous golf communities throughout the Southwest, "exceptional" alone fails to make the cut. The trick, then, is to be different.

The Gallery Golf Club at Dove Mountain, located about 30 minutes north of Tucson International Airport, hangs its hat on a sublime desert ambiance where peacefulness and seclusion reign supreme. At the same time, the national spotlight, fascinatingly, shines squarely on the club once a year.

The World Golf Championships-Accenture Match Play tournament, an official PGA Tour event, found a home at The Gallery in 2007, bringing thousands of fans to the club and attracting the attention of millions of TV viewers. Tiger Woods and 63 of the top-rated golfers in the world participate in this tournament.

Although only The Gallery's residents and members typically enjoy the stunning real estate and amenities at the property, the club welcomes the brief window of major exposure it will receive each February. Club officials, along with the Conquistadors, the Tucson civic group that hosts the tournament, understand that whether the interest in The Gallery emanates from the PGA Tour or prospective club members, the reasons are the same.



"Our amenities almost speak for themselves," says Phil Satterfield, CCM, new general manager of the club, "Of course, we welcome the PGA into our community. We are excited about the national exposure the tournament brings to Tucson, Marana and The Gallery."

The Gallery Golf Club is private with a limited number of full golf memberships remaining. Club members have two championship courses to choose from, both of them tucked into the rolling canyons of the alluring Tortolita Mountains.

The North Course, designed by John Fought and Arizona resident Tom Lehman, was ranked the "No. 1 Course in Southwest Arizona" by *Golf Digest* and was acknowledged as



one of *Golfweek*'s "Top 100 Modern Courses." Fought also designed the South Course, which opened five years after the North Course, in 2003, and is characterized by a links-style topography. Both courses also are ranked by *Golfweek* in its current "Top 100 Residential Communities."

Approximately 200 residences are situated around each of the two courses. Build-out is expected to be complete in 2010 with the addition of the final two subdivisions.

Prospective members need not own property at Dove Mountain to join the Gallery Golf Club. However, considering amenities such as a 28,000-square-foot, award-winning clubhouse with six fireplaces, exquisite locker rooms and 100 pieces of fine art, it makes sense that most residents are members.

The community also boasts The Gallery Sports Club, a 12,000-square-foot multi-purpose facility complete with four tennis courts, swimming pool, certified personal trainers, massage therapists and

more. Miles of hiking, biking and equestrian trails also meander through the area.

"We don't sell the properties as much as the lifestyle," says Vince Smedes, manager of property sales. "When you arrive, you feel like vou're in vour own little world. Gated residential clusters of homes are interspersed among two world-class golf courses nestled in the Sonoran Desert."

The properties do not line the fairways as they often do at conventional courses, Smedes points out, and The Gallery owner/developer took care to protect the natural beauty of the surrounding desert while developing the real estate.

One way to experience the inspiring scenery at the club is through a unique trial membership program that has been a great success. The program allows prospective members to actually experience the community and lifestyle in a way that a mere community tour and round of golf do not. The trial period lasts an entire year, and nearly half of the deposit is refundable should a prospective member decide to go another route.

"It's a great way for people to have the 'Gallery Experience' before being totally committed to an initiation deposit," Satterfield says. "Trial Members can become both social and active in our sports club and golffacilities. This was the sensible



thing to offer because people have more time to make an educated decision and can become accustomed to the club environment. We want our members to become connected to our club, to make friends and find golfing buddies."

The Gallery Golf Club inherently draws attention to itself due to the area's incredible panoramas and natural beauty. Now the PGA Tour/WGC has taken notice, a welcome indication of the level of quality amenities available to members. The club welcomes you to visit, either during the tournament or for an arranged appointment.

Okay kids, it's time for class. The subject today is Match Play 101. To get us started, here is a little test: Henrik Stenson is?

C. A five-time winner on the European Tour


D. A player who was driving the ball so badly he walked off the course during the 2001 Irish Open.

F. All of the above


If you picked F, go to the head of the class. If you were forced to say "Who is Henrik Stenson?" go sit in the corner.

The sixth edition of the WGC-Accenture Match Play Championship will be played Feb. 20-24 on the John Fought-designed Gallery at Dove Mountain, an out-and-back par-72, 7351-



yard course that twists and turns its way through the desert in Marana, Ariz.

Now, here is the important part. There are three World Golf Championships played every year. We've already learned that Stenson won one of them last year. For extra credit, name the winner of the other two 2007 WGC events: the CA



Championship played at the Doral and the Bridgestone Invitational played at Firestone Country Club in Akron, Ohio.

If you said Tiger Woods you are right on both counts.

So why did Woods, perhaps the most dominate figure the world of golf has ever seen, whip the field in the other two WCG events but not even make it past the third round at Dove Mountain last year?

Simple. It's called match play. It's the way golf was originally meant to be played—man on man, one match at a time. You win a hole you go 1-up. If you are more ahead than there are holes remaining in the match, you win. You can play badly and win. You can play well and lose.



Last year Stenson defeated Zach Johnson, K.J. Choi, Aaron Baddeley, Nick O'Hern (the player who defeated Woods in the third round) and Trevor Immelman to move into the 36-hole final against Geoff Ogilvy. You remember Ogilvy; he's the guy who won the 2006 U.S. Open when players with better credentials like Phil Mickelson, Colin Montgomerie and Jim Furyk couldn't handle the 18th hole at Winged Foot on Open Sunday.

Ogilvy, who won the WGC-Accenture Match Play Championship in 2006 at California's La Costa Resort before winning his U.S. Open, got to the finals by defeating Steve Stricker, Jose Maria Olazabal, Niclas Fasth, Paul Casey and Chad Campbell. And before Stenson and Ogilvy were finished on Sunday, both were totally spent. Stenson won the final match, 2 and 1, but that was hardly the whole story.

In getting to the winner's circle and collecting the first-place check of \$1.35 million, Stenson played 120 holes in five days. Ogilvy, who banked \$800,000, played 114. And had not Ogilvy's putter gone south over the back nine of the afternoon round, they might be playing still. Neither player ever held more than a 2-up lead and only eight of the first 18 holes were halved.

"You just had to dig deep," said Stenson, who even played one shot off a cart path in the finals. He could have gotten relief, but he

would have had to take a drop behind a bush in the desert. "You couldn't let yourself give up," he said at the end of play. "But right now, I don't know what's up and down or back and forth."

It isn't a tournament for the faint of heart. In fact, it's an event for the young and strong. Of the 16 players who advanced to the third round, 12 were younger than 32. Of the eight players in the quarterfinals, six were 32 or younger. And, as the finals proved, it doesn't hurt to have been born outside the United States either.

Of the 64 players in the starting field—the tournament is only open to the top 64 on the World Golf Rankings—23 were from the states while the other 41 came from all corners of the globe. In total, 19 different countries were represented in the field. And when the desert sand finally settled in the shadows of the Tortolita Mountains, a Swede was the last man standing. Ogilvy had won 11 straight matches going into the final shootout against Stenson, but he couldn't make it an even dozen.



"In match play it makes you play one hole at a time," he said. "You can't stress about things that have gone past."

And if there is a simple lesson to be learned about match play, it's that. It's here and it's now. Class dismissed.





The fifth version of the Steppenwolf Theatre Company Annual Celebrity Golf Classic is scheduled March 13-16 with a number of events at exceptional locations in and around Indian Wells, Calif. Sinise concedes that it doesn't seem like the most natural fit—a Chicago-based theatre company heading to the desert for a golf tournament.

Barring schedule conflicts, those who are expected to participate this year include entertainers Ray Romano, Gregory Harrison, Peter Gallagher, Tom Dreesen and Richard Kind.

"Every body wants to support the theatre because the theatre gives such a great experience," says Kaufman.

For the first time, the post-tournament cocktail reception and awards dinner is being held at Blixseth's mansion. The well-known philanthropist attended the third Classic and was so enamored that last year she offered up her private golf-course for the cause and this year additionally donated her expansive residence as site of the closing gala. There, look for Sinise to take the stage, bass guitar thumping, as he performs with his own Lt. Dan Band (named for Sinise's role in *Forrest Gump*). Live-auction "Golfer's Paradise" remains a perennial crowd favorite, and includes unique bid items such as golf and a day on the set with Sinise. Those who don't play in the tournament can participate throughout the weekend in a celebrity-led "Cocktails & Conversation" session, plus two luncheon discussions with various actors, as well as a spirited poker tournament. Participants stay at the Renaissance Esmeralda Resort and Spa, site of a lavish welcome reception and the non-golf-events.

In addition to Sinise and Blixseth, other tournament co-hosts include Congresswoman Mary Bono and athlete-turned-actor Jack Scalia. "We have really made our presence in the desert known with the phenomenal support of our co-hosts," says Kaufman. "The fact that people of stature have graced this event and have the opportunity to play on Edra's exclusive golf course has enabled this event to really be positioned as one of the most prestigious in the country and it's a dream come true for us. Everybody is so appreciative and nothing is taken for granted. Golfers say that playing at Porcupine Creek is the most magical day they've ever participated in and they play all over the world."

Steppenwolf Theatre Company transcends Chicago borders. Kaufman says, "Steppenwolf is bi-coastal with a new play on



Broadway that is being billed as the most exciting New York has seen in a long time, "August: Osage County." We now have a featured presence on the East and West coasts, and are at home in Chicago."

Members of Steppenwolf's ensemble include John Malkovich, Joan Allen, Laurie Metcalf and John Mahoney, along with Sinise. "There is no question that Gary Sinise's leadership and enthusiasm for the event is pivotal for its success. I can't say how appreciative we are, not only to people like Edra Blixseth, but to new friends we are making in the desert."

WHEN RON CORTI PURCHASED LUMPY'S IN 1983 AS A PALM SPRINGS FACTORY-OUTLET GOLF STORE, HE WASN'T A GOLFER YET IT SEEMED LIKE A GOOD BUSINESS DECISION AT THE TIME

"He and mom were professional shoppers with a sixth sense about how to run a business and how to treat people," says son Randy, who recently assumed ownership after years working in the family business. "The desert was, back then, even more of a retirement community than it is now. Initially [my father] was going to work for six months and then close for the summer like most businesses did then. But he saw more opportunity than that."

Not only did the family guide Lumpy's into a full-service retail golf venue in Cathedral City, Calif., they built on their success, adding a 12,000-square-foot superstore in La Quinta and a third location in Fort Myers, Fla. Somewhere in the process they also morphed from nongolfers into players. Even so, devoting time and energy to the business continues to be the first priority. "We are able to golf some, but spend more time working," says Corti.

With the multitude of retail golf outlets available, what makes Lumpy's stand out? "The simulators and the training of our staffare how we are different," says Corti. "If you are considering new clubs, there is no better way to [to make a decision] than

inside the full-swing simulators. You can compare one club to another in order to determine which is the best for your swing and your game."

Each Southern California location features two of the simulators, which Conti calls the most accurate in the golf industry. They are also the most expensive.





"It's the technology, he says. "The ball passes through two infrared fields instead of microwave or radio waves. It's simple and effective. Hit balls with a variety of new clubs. We'll be there to help. When you're done, the simulator data will show you which clubs will improve your game the

Every Lumpy's store also includes a fullservice repair center, club rentals and personalized service that starts with a detailed discussion of each customer's game. With that information, employees are able to recommend the gear that is best suited for would-be buyers. "Our staff is trained to know the products," says Corti. "With as fast as new products are introduced these days that's a big benefit. Every employee completes more than 50 hours of training each year just on technology."

The stores host a number of onsite manufacturer-specific equipment demos throughout the season, each one a handson, try-and-buy opportunity. Which





products and trends are big in 2008? "GPS or laser range-finders are like having a 15th club in the bag. Everybody is on board," Corti says. "And 'geometry' is the buzzword for drivers—using the shape of the clubhead to control ball flight. Playing to your potential is important. We have also committed more retail space in our stores to apparel. Now, with all the technical advantages there, that is part of the golf experience as well."

The Corti family gives back to the community with proceeds from Lumpy's Scramble for Autism. The fifth annual tournament is set for April 25 at Trilogy Golf Club at La Quinta, and benefits a




cause close the family's heart. "Last year we raised \$80,000 for autism camps, therapies and other resources for local families dealing with the autism epidemic," says Corti. "Today, one in 150 kids is diagnosed on the autism spectrum. Lumpy's is blessed with a lot of great customers who care."



For the desert real estate markets of California, Arizona and Nevada, it's not about being loony; it's about the Canadian loonie. One of the bright spots for the market has been the big bang for their buck Canadians are now getting since the Canadian loonie reached parity with the U.S. dollar for the first time since 1976. The loonie actually peaked last November at \$1.10 U.S. dollars for every loonie. Compared to the 62 cents the loonie was worth five years ago, Canadians are now living large and buying large in this down U.S. real estate market. The cost of a \$350,000 home is currently \$318,182 loonies. That's down considerably from the \$564,516 loonies the same home would have cost five years ago.

Although the media continues to fuel fear about the market, many builders feel home building will begin to pick up again in 2008 due to an increase of jobs. Remember that times of crisis often turn out to have been times of great opportunity in hindsight.

CALIFORNIA

The Coachella Valley is all over the map, literally and figuratively. Local real estate agents say that homes priced at \$1 million or more continue to sell, as do the low-end homes. The condo resale market is also strong. According to DataQuick Information Systems, condo resale numbers grew 15 percent in October 2007 and are holding the upward momentum. Also in the October 2007 data, all valley areas saw fewer homes sold with the exception of the 92264 zip code area of Palm Springs, where there was an 18.9 percent increase in the number of units changing hands.

Regardless of the numbers, the Coachella Valley managed to score a B-for its overall economy and quality of life in a recently released economic report card. Obviously, quality of life is a prime reason for moving to the valley. Between 1990 and 2007 the Coachella Valley's population grew from 230,865 to 408,624—a gain of 77 percent—with almost 100,000 new residents arriving since 2000.

DOWNTOWN RESURGENCE

Even in the 1970s, urban San Diego was a sleepy Navy town full of warehouses, bars and tattoo parlors, says Todd Voorhees, vice president of public policy and communications for Downtown San Diego Partnership. QUICK: WHERE IS THE NO. 2 GOLF DESTINATION IN THE WORLD FOR U.S. GOLFERS LOOKING TO PLAY AWAY FROM HOME? IF YOU SAID MEXICO YOU ARE CORRECT. IT'S OUT-RANKED ONLY BY HAWAII

Among the things Mexico has going for it is that it's a heck of a lot closer than Hawaii. There are non-stop flights that will get you from your home airport to the first tee in a matter of hours. Add to that a rich culture, stunning diversity of landscape, a history that goes back many thousands of years and every sort of vacation pleasure or adventure you could want—from fine dining and exquisite resorts to pyramids, world class deep sea fishing and superb scuba diving—and Mexico is hard to beat. In fact, the Mexican government isn't planning to accept that second place ranking for long.




Golf is positioned as a major component of tourism efforts south of the border, and if you haven't experienced the breadth and depth of what Mexico offers, well, you're lagging behind the times in the brave new world of brilliantly designed layouts slicing through verdant jungles and perched daringly along the edges of soaring seaside cliffs.

Here's a sampling of the top golf courses in Mexico's prime vacation destinations, from the Caribbean to the Pacific, Cancun to Baja.

LOS CABOS

Los Cabos has long been the premier golfing spot in Mexico, a place where the rusts and reds of the stark desert environment meet the blue depths of the Sea of Cortez.



The courses at Cabo del Sol frequently top lists of the best golf courses in Mexico, particularly the much-lauded Ocean Course, one of many Nicklaus designs south of the border. The No.17 par 3 is often rated one of the top holes in Mexico. The **Desert Course**, a Weiskopf design, is no less impressive.

One & Only Palmilla Resort has 27 Nicklaus-designed holes; this course, always rated highly, was one of the first to put Los Cabos on the golfing map.

Nicklaus also designed the course at Eldorado Golf Club at Casa del Mar Resort & Spa, a luxury boutique hotel that is part of the expansive Cabo Real development.

Another Cabo Real layout is the Robert Trent Jones II course at Cabo Real Golf **Club**. The par-4 No. 7 is considered among the most challenging holes in Los Cabos.

Cabo San Lucas Country Club features a Dye Corporation designed golf course carved out of the magnificent mountain and desert landscape.

PUERTO VALLARTA AND RIVIERA **NYARIT**

This area stretched along the Pacific is one of the hottest golf destinations in Mexico—and growing. When the next two courses open this coming summer—a Nicklaus course at the St. Regis Punta Mita and a Greg Norman design at nearby Litibú—there will be nine championship golf courses to choose from. Meanwhile, there's already enough to keep golfing vacationers here for many days.

In Nuevo Vallarta, a short drive from the Puerto Vallarta airport, is a trio of excellent courses. El Tigre Club de Golf, with nine bodies of water to challenge even the best player's precision, was designed by Robert von Hagge. **Flamingos Golf Club**, a design of British architect Percy Clifford, is the oldest course in the area, while Mayan Palace Golf Club features a Jim Lipe design tucked between the Pacific and the Rio Ameca.

Punta Mita, north of Puerto Vallarta, is making a distinctive mark in the golf world. Among the first courses here is Four Seasons Golf Club at Punta Mita. a Nicklaus Signature course. Conde Nast Traveler's readers voted the Four Seasons Best Golf Resort in the World in 2006.

In Puerto Vallarta itself choices include two courses at Vista Vallarta—one designed by Nicklaus and the other by Weiskopf—and the Joe Finger course at Marina Vallarta Golf Club. Then there's El Tamarindo Golf Course, a Robert Trent Jones II design that is often rated one of the top five golf courses in the country. Robert von Hagge created the 27 holes at Isla Navidad, a mega resort area guaranteed to wow U.S. visitors.

CANCUN, COZUMEL AND THE RIVIERA MAYA

Over on the Caribbean, golf takes on a different feel, many of the courses here carved out of tangled jungles. The Nicklaus Signature course at Moon Palace Golf & **Spa Resort** is among the top venues here, but it's Greg Norman's El Camaleón at Mayakoba, between Cancun and Playa del Carmen at the ultra-upscale Fairmont





Mayakoba, that distinguishes itself as host for the first ever PGA Tour event in Mexico. This month (February), the PGA Mayakoba Golf Classic returns for its second year.

Other top resorts and golfcourses in this area include the **Hilton Cancun Golf & Spa Resort** with its course meandering past Mayan ruins, **Cancun Golf Club at Pok ta Pok** with its Robert Trent Jones

Jr. course right in the famous hotel zone, Norman's Playa Mujeres Golf Club course, the golf course at Iberostar Playa Paraiso Golf Club designed by PB Dye and Playacar Spa & Golf Club with its Robert von Hagge layout.


Just across the water on the island of Cozumel is yet another Nicklaus Design Group layout, that at **Cozumel Country Club**. Cozumel is its own vacation destination, a popular cruise stop and easily accessible for a golfing daytrip from Cancun and the Riviera Maya.

MAZATLAN

The seaport of Mazatlan is the only Mexican colonial city on the water. Its historic city center retains its 16th century architecture and old-world charm, but the golf courses are definitely of today. **Estrella del Mar**, about 30 minutes from the city, is the indisputable king of courses here. Robert Trent Jones II created a truly exceptional course that fits into the exquisite surroundings of the upscale resort. Conveniently located right in Mazatlan is **El Cid** with 27 holes designed by Lee Trevino in the heart of the "Golden Zone" near the El Cid marina.

There are other areas of Mexico with excellent golf courses and enticing vacation amenities of their own—Ixtapa, Ensenada (drivable from San Diego) and the Sonoran region among them. The truth is that wherever you vacation in Mexico, you're likely to find world-class golf and every reason to return year after year,
