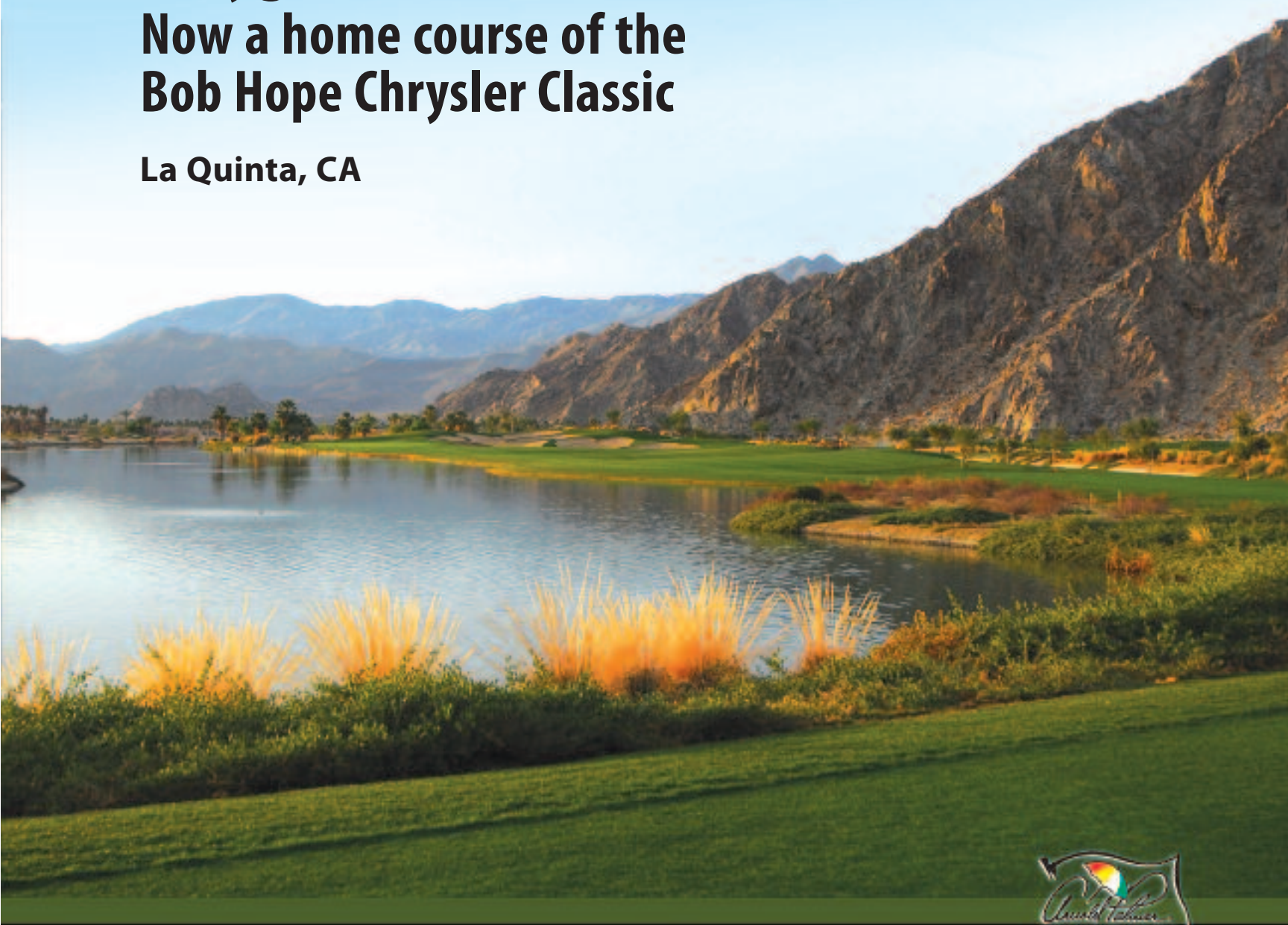

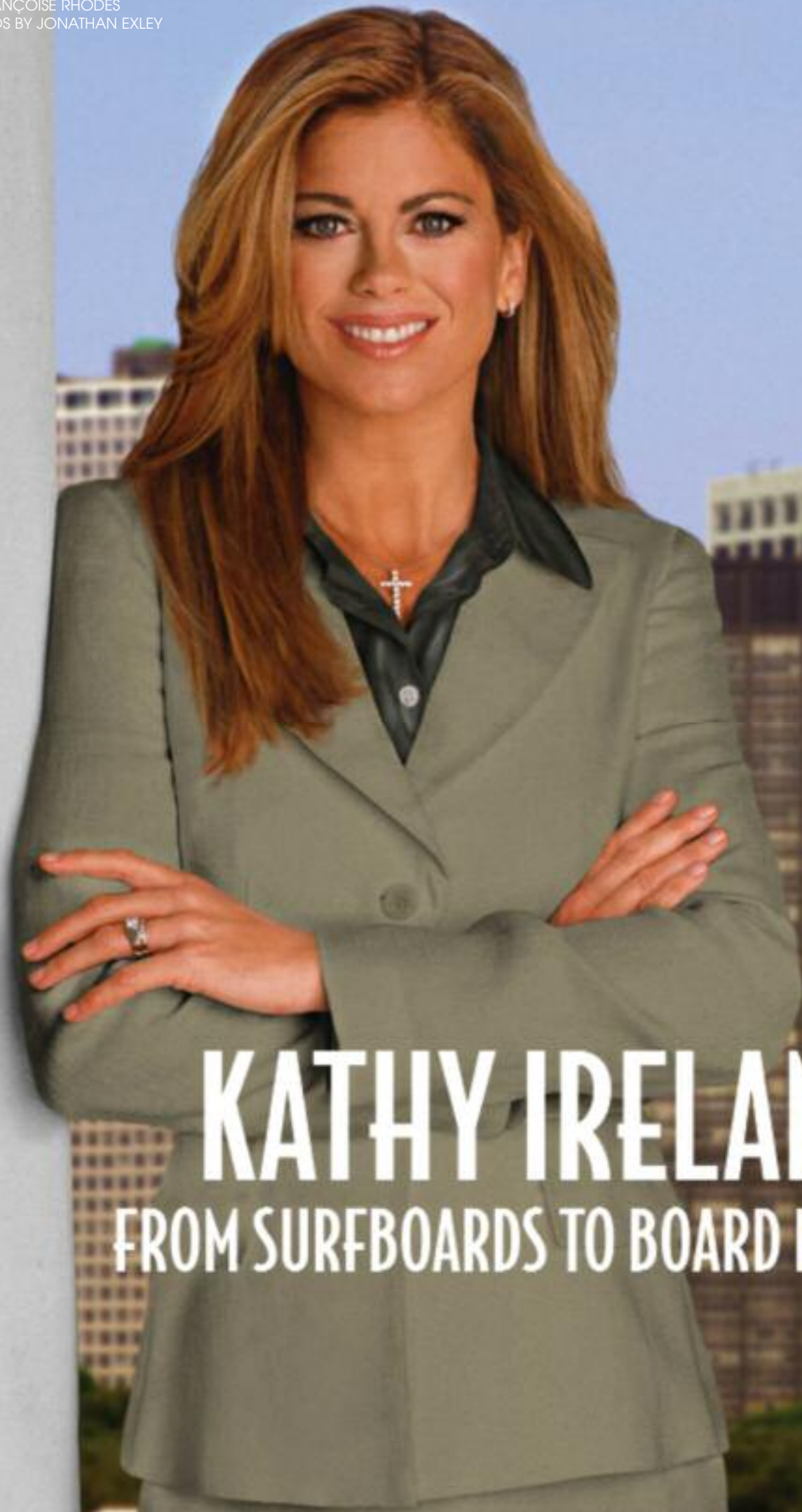

For some, Kathy Ireland will always be remembered as the gorgeous all American beauty gracing more covers of the famed *Sports Illustrated* annual swim suit issue than any other model in the magazine's history.

For others, Ireland is known for her role as CEO of Kathy Ireland Worldwide

and it wasn't. Ever since I was a kid I've loved a good challenge. I think that's why golf intrigues me so much."

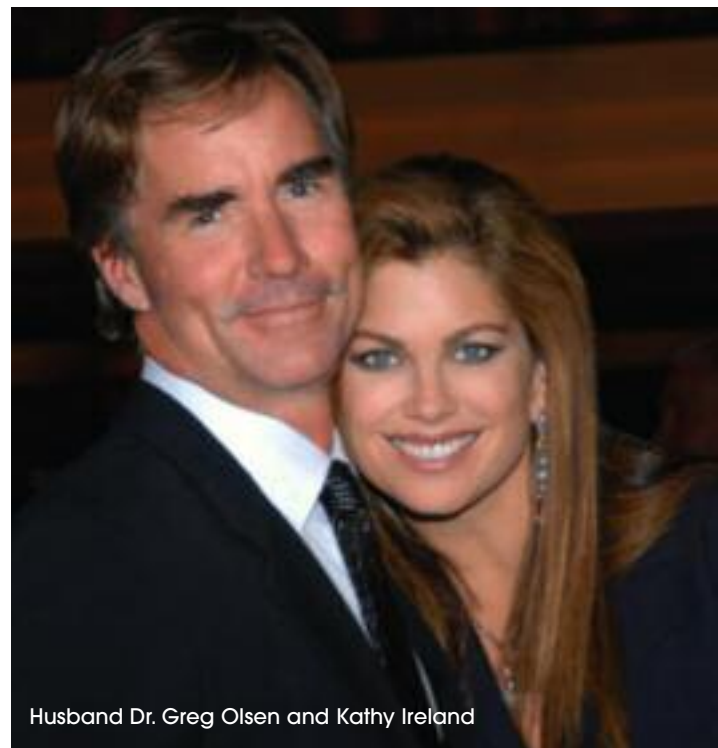
Indeed, she has always taken on life's challenges.

This supermodel-turned-super-mogul remembers fighting the "mindless bimbo baggage" that models typically have attached

to them, and she has definitely proved that stereotype wrong. She is currently the only woman in *INC.* magazine's list of the top-five celebrity entrepreneurs, and KIWW is the 23rd most powerful licensed brand in the world, according to *License Global Magazine*, reminding all that Ireland is certainly no bimbo.

(KIWW), a \$1.4 billion dollar design empire that includes more than 15,000 items from bedding to skincare. To her children, she is simply "Mom" who carpools their friends, teaches Sunday school and loves to go miniature golfing with the family, and she has been recognized in that role, too: The National Mothers Day Association recently named her Mother of the Year.

A California native, Ireland grew up in the seaside community of Santa Barbara, Calif, where she still resides with her husband, Greg, and three children: Erik, Lily and Chloe. Like many young Californians, Ireland was an accomplished surfer, but she was also intrigued with the game of golf at an early age.

"Does miniature golf count? That is really one of my strengths," she laughs.

"I was 10 years old when I picked up my first golf club; it was so much fun. I remember thinking that it looked so easy

Life is hectic for Ireland but not too hectic for visits to the Coachella Valley. "I love the desert, and I love Palm Springs," she says. "I have an uncle that lives in the desert, plus many members of our business family live there, including Chef Andre of ACafe, our food and entertaining expert." Ireland also has a design studio in Palm Springs and a number of retail partners throughout the valley, including Jensen's Finest Foods.

Playing golf is currently not her main priority; however, when Ireland is on the golf course her goal is to enjoy the moment, the outdoors and the people around her.

"I'm not good; I'm going to admit it. In fact, once people see my golfing skills they are usually a lot happier when I'm caddying," she notes with ease. "I love golf, and I have great respect for the athletes, the men and woman who are so skilled with this."

Ireland's admiration for tour players prompted her to enlist KIWW as host to numerous professional golf tournaments, including several LPGA events where she always offers to caddy.

A refreshing element of honesty exudes from Ireland and when asked who would be in her ultimate foursome, she ponders the question then answers with a question. "Can I say Jesus?"

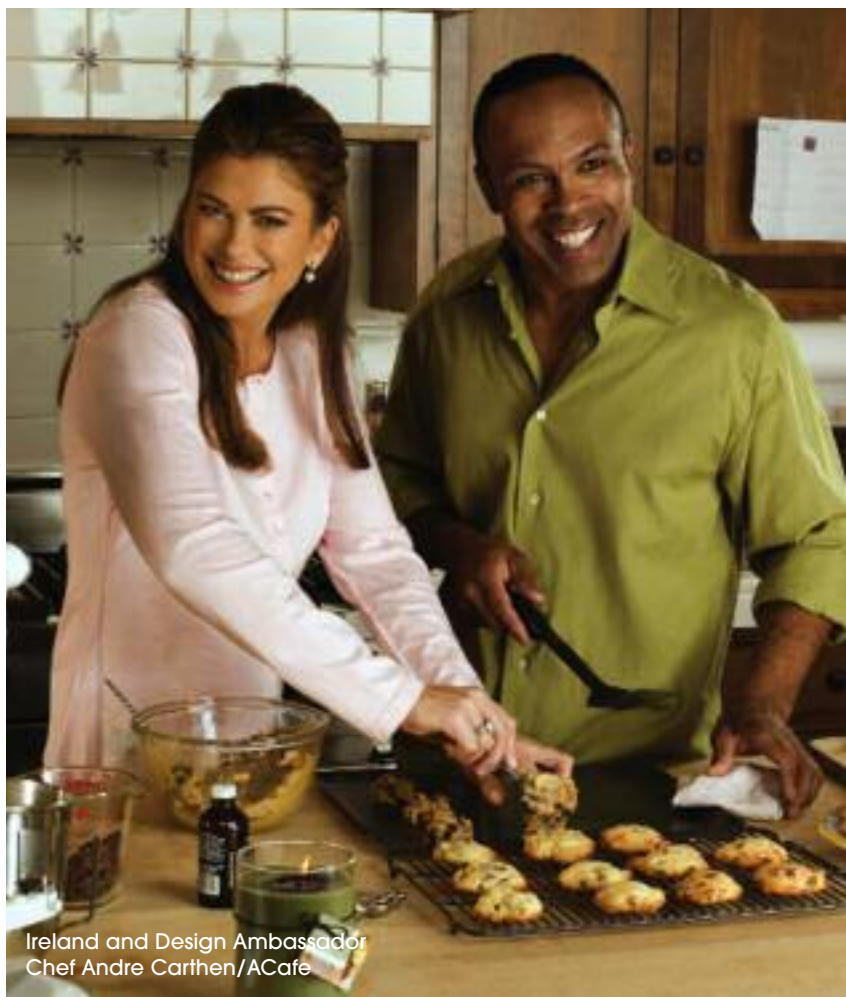
"I mean come on," she continues, "if he's with us, who can be against us and we'd totally win." Admittedly very competitive, Ireland rounds out her foursome with Sam Snead and Harvey Penick.

"I had the honor of interviewing Sam Snead, it was so humbling. In fact, I use a lot of his thoughts on life as examples for my children."

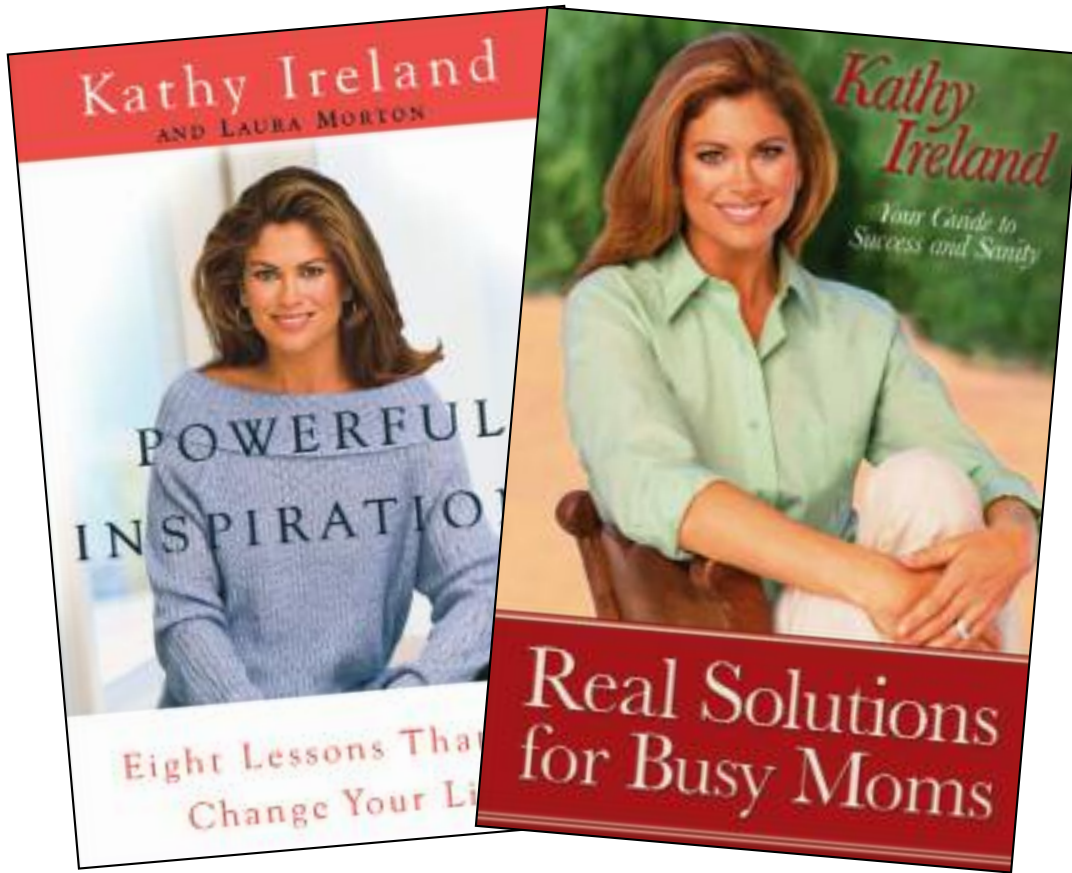
But wait, Ireland is not quite finished. "I should have another woman," she says. "I'd like to have Dottie Pepper play because I

know we would win with Jesus on the team and I owe Dottie a win."

Ireland's reference to owing LPGA player Pepper "a win" dates back to a charity event at which they were playing on the same team. Ireland to this day blames her bad play for the team's loss. "One of these days I'm gonna get good. I'm not giving up, and I will give Dottie her win."

There are many aspects of golf that Ireland loves: the outdoors, the walking and the diversity. "I love that you can play golf all over the world and that every course is different." She also loves the overall healthy facets of the game.

Being healthy and staying healthy are subjects about which Ireland is passionate. According to a poll conducted at UCLA, she is one of the Top 10 Women's Health Advocates in America. Ireland is the Ambassador for Youth for the National

PTA, and National Chair of Family Services and Parenting for Athletes and Entertainers for Kids. She's also active in the Special Olympics.

Not surprising for this woman of many talents, Ireland is also a bestselling author of five books. The most recent release is *Real Solutions for Busy Moms: Your Guide to Success and Sanity*.

"This world is nothing like the world I grew up in; moms frequently don't get the proper empathy and appreciation for the heroic work they do. I'm not alone being a crazy busy mom, I see it with moms everywhere," she says. "I feel it's so important that we get solutions for the challenges in our lives. In the book, we cover everything from financial crisis to being healthy."

As the kids in the background are calling, it's time for Ireland the "Mom" to be with her children. But there's one final question for her to ponder. "Can you describe your life in one sentence?"

Ireland's response is instant. "I'm a work in progress."

ON PAR | COURSE OF DISTINCTION

THE SOBOBA CLASSIC

AFTER A CONTEMPORARY FACELIFT, LENGTHENING AND THE ADDITION OF A NEW CLUBHOUSE, THE CLASSIC COURSE AT COUNTRY CLUB OF SOBOBA SPRINGS IS READY TO HOST ONE OF THE TOP TOURNAMENTS ON THE NATIONWIDE TOUR





A NATIONWIDE TOUR EVENT WILL BE PLAYED OCTOBER 1 TO 4 AT THE COUNTRY CLUB OF SOBOBA SPRINGS IN SAN JACINTO, CALIF. ON THAT DATE, A FOUR-AND-A-HALF-YEAR GOAL WILL BE REALIZED AND ALL THOSE INVOLVED CAN CELEBRATE "MISSION ACCOMPLISHED"

That first week in October all eyes in the golf world will focus on the venerable Country Club of Soboba Springs. The Golf Channel will televise each day of the event, and fans will be encouraged to come out and see golf's future stars play on one of Southern California's premier and challenging courses.

The Soboba Classic will be one of just three events offering \$1 million in prize money on The Nationwide Tour in 2009, joining the Nationwide Tour Players Cup in West Virginia and the season-ending Nationwide Tour Championship for that distinction. First prize at the Soboba Classic will be \$180,000, a significant amount in the race to the top 25. Only the top 25 money-winners are awarded PGA Tour Cards.

The PGA Tour and the Soboba band of Luiseno Indians have entered into a four-year agreement, with the goal and anticipation to run the tournament for many years to come.

"We are very pleased to bring this world-class tournament to the region, which will help generate valuable national exposure to the Hemet/San Jacinto Valley area," says Soboba Tribal Chairman Robert Salgado, Sr. "This is one of the most beautiful golf courses in the world, and we look forward to many years of hosting top players and tournaments, and attracting visitors to the community."

Tournament Director Doug Hoffort, adds, "There has been a tremendous amount of work and time that has gone into the development of the tournament. Seeing the response and reaction from the community, the golf patrons, the charities and sponsors tells me that we are on the right track for a successful event."

TICKETS FORE CHARITY

The Soboba Classic is proud to announce that 100 percent of tournament ticket sales will go to area charities through its Tickets Fore Charity program. Local area charities will be able to sell weekly tickets to the Soboba Classic and keep 100 percent of the revenue. The Tickets Fore Charity program is an incredible fundraising opportunity for nonprofit organizations, and there is no limit on the number of tickets that can be sold. This program has been executed with great success at other Nationwide Tour venues and has generated over \$2.5 million for nonprofit organizations in those markets.

GOLF COURSE RENOVATIONS

August 8, 2005 marked the beginning of a new era for the Country Club at Soboba Springs. Renowned golf course architect Cary Bickler and O & J Golf Course Construction Company began renovations on the 40-year-old course with the goal of creating a "masterpiece." What you see today is the result of moving dirt, rock, concrete and trees to create what some call the most beautiful golfing environment in Southern California. Outdated water features were replaced with rock walls, flowing creeks and beautiful new waterfalls. Existing lake shoreline received a facelift with strategically placed accent boulders to match the walls and waterfalls.

All 50 bunkers on the old golf course were demolished and rebuilt to match the 23 newly placed bunkers. The 73 bunkers now have beautiful white sand that contrasts masterfully with the expertly maintained grass surrounding them. Every tee complex was laser leveled and re-graded to add a "modern finished" look to the old-style, push-up tees. New "back" teeing grounds were placed on every hole to add over 250 yards of length, and the course now stretches to 7,105 yards from the tournament tees. New "front" tees were built to better accommodate the less experienced player and now golfers have four distinct sets of tees to choose from on every hole.

The golf course was originally designed by Desmond Muirhead and opened in 1966 as Soboba Springs Country Club. Bickler, a Muirhead disciple, was able to maintain the original playing

characteristics of this classic design while adding contemporary length and special features. The course reopened in early 2006 to a par of 72.

NEW CLUBHOUSE FACILITY

With the opening of the new 32,000-square-foot clubhouse facility in April 2008, the goal of creating the finest golf and hospitality establishment available anywhere was complete. The clubhouse's signature restaurant is the Maze Stone, "offering casual dining at its finest," and after a round of golf, players can relax and enjoy the view from the outdoor viewing bar at the 18th green.

Come October, thousands will have a chance to enjoy this view and witness world-class golf when the Nationwide Tour comes to Soboba.

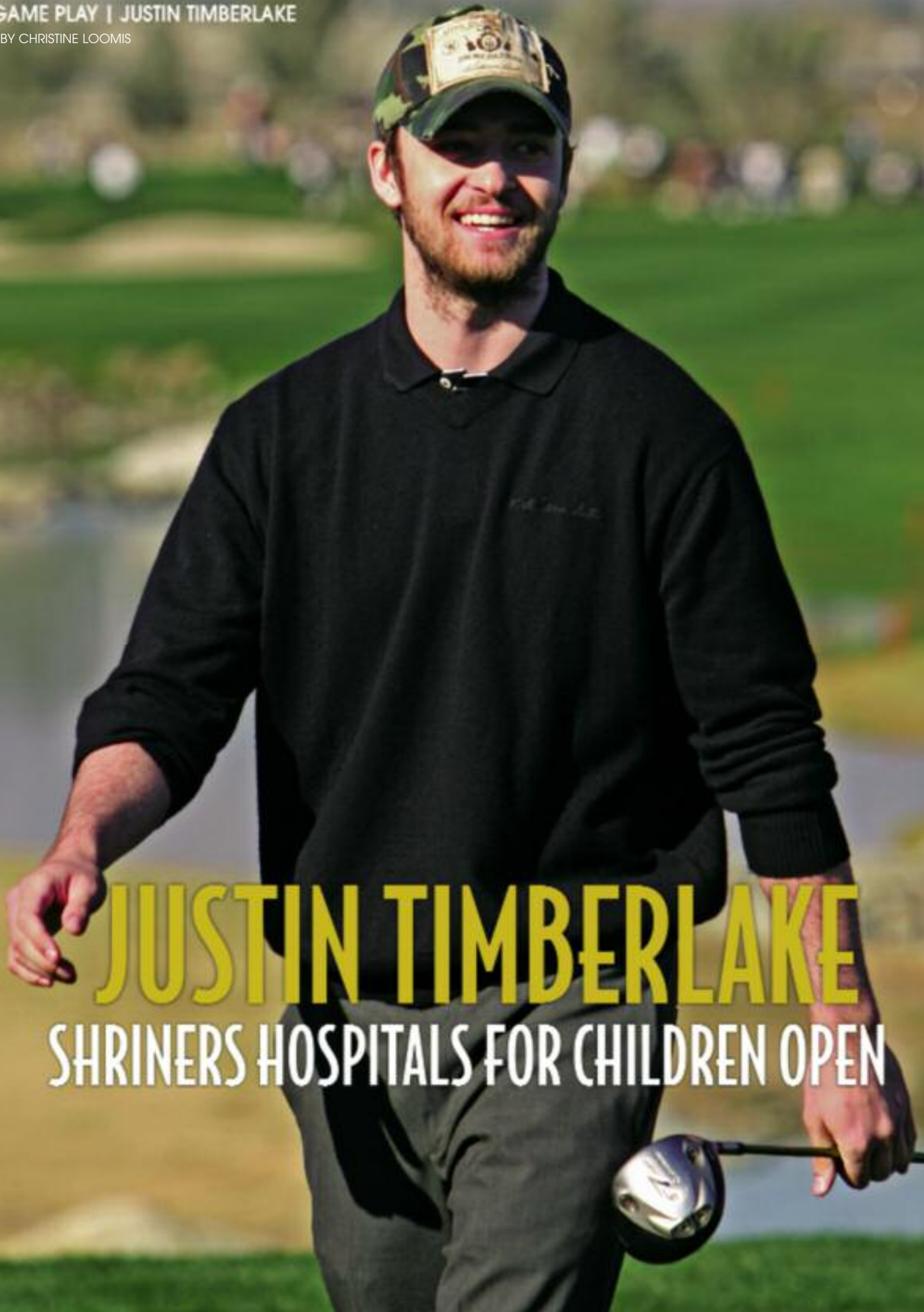

IT'S NOT SO EASY TO SAY, BUT THIS PGA FALL SERIES TOURNAMENT PROVIDES ONE OF THE GREAT "GOLF-ENTERTAINMENT EXPERIENCES" FOR FANS, AMATEUR GOLFERS, CELEBRITIES AND PROS ALIKE—ALL WHILE SUPPORTING AN ORGANIZATION THAT HELPS CHILDREN IN NEED OF MEDICAL CARE DEFY, AND BEAT, THE ODDS

He's a singer, Grammy winner, actor, record label executive, restaurateur and philanthropist. He also loves the game of golf and has played for years—reportedly to a six handicap.

Now, Justin Timberlake has a PGA tournament, and it's not just any tournament. It's the Justin Timberlake Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, the PGA Tour's only Las Vegas event and part of

Denters, the Jonas Brothers and Rihanna. JT's good friend Ellen DeGeneres taped part of her show during the Wed. Pro-Am, and singer Josh Kelley was among the celebrities playing in the event.

While the leaderboard listed the names of many well-known PGA Tour pros, the ultimate star of the professional tournament was a rookie. When Sunday's round was history, Marc Turnesa

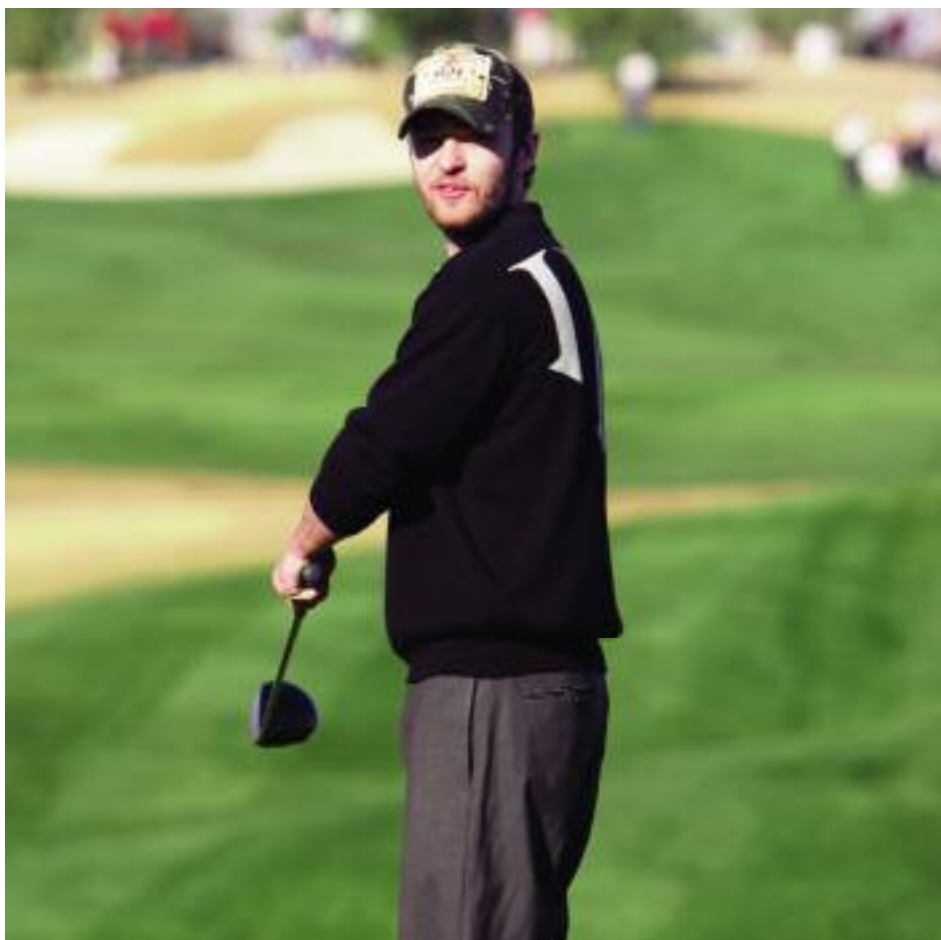


the PGA Fall Series. JT's 2009 event will be played on the venerable TPC Summerlin, Oct. 12-18, and if last year's tournament is any indication of the level of interest by PGA pros, celebrities and amateurs, 2009 will be a smashing success.

To start, the purse is \$4.2 million with a winner's share of \$756,000, and 132 PGA Tour professionals will be vying for the honor of receiving the trophy from JT himself. Timberlake will be doing more than handing over the trophy, though. He'll be playing in the Wednesday, Oct. 14 Championship Pro-Am, and on Saturday, Oct. 17 he'll host a golf clinic with Butch Harmon.

He will also once again headline a charity concert on Friday, Oct. 16. Last year, Lionel Richie made a surprise appearance at the concert, and a slew of other popular performers also took to the stage during the evening, including 50 Cent, Boys II Men, Esmée





designed by Bobby Weed with player consultant Fuzzy Zoeller. TPC Summerlin has been ranked by *Golf Digest* as one of "America's Best" golf courses, and it is listed among the "Top 100 Modern Golf Courses in the United States."

Given the title sponsor (JT) and the location (Vegas), it's hard not to think "Party!" Timberlake himself calls Las Vegas "the perfect place for the golf and entertainment marriage," and we all know about Vegas marriages. But there is a very serious side to this tournament, too, and it's all about raising money and awareness for Shriners Hospitals for Children so that the innovative, critical and lifesaving work done in these hospitals can continue.

Shriners Hospitals for Children is an international health care system of 22 hospitals that provide pediatric specialty care, research and teaching. The first Shriners hospital opened in 1922 with a focus on treating orthopedic conditions related to polio. Today, Shriners hospitals treat children suffering from a variety of medical conditions: burns, spinal cord injuries and cleft lip and palate, and Shriners Hospitals continue to be at the forefront of research and care in pediatric orthopedics.

Most importantly, children receive all services at these facilities at absolutely no charge, making fundraising efforts like this tournament critical.

claimed his first PGA Tour win, finishing with a four-under 68 to hold off Matt Kuchar by a stroke. He'll be back to defend his title this year.

SPOTLIGHT | TOM LEHMAN

TOM LEHMAN HITS A HALF CENTURY

ONE OF GOLF'S GREAT PLAYERS TURNS
50 WITH NO SIGN OF TAKING IT EASY

ON MARCH 7 TOM LEHMAN REACHED ONE OF MANY MILESTONES. HE CELEBRATED HIS 50TH BIRTHDAY WITH A SURPRISE GETAWAY TO BORA BORA, ARRANGED BY HIS WIFE, MELISSA. GOLF WAS BANISHED FROM THE ISLAND UTOPIA—ALMOST. LEHMAN ADMITS TO HAVING FUN “HITTING BALLS ON THE BEACH IN BORA BORA INTO THE SURF”

At 50 years young, Lehman is still aspiring to win not only on the Champions Tour but on the PGA Tour. His plan is to play a minimum of 15 events on the PGA Tour and about seven on the Champions Tour.

Lehman's debut as a Champion player will come at the Legends of Golf in Savannah, Ga., where he will partner with former Ryder Cup rival Bernhard Langer. Lehman, who ranks 20th in career earnings on the PGA Tour, has his sights set on all the Champions Tour Majors. He'll also play the British Open in Turnberry and likely return to Loch Lomond for the Scottish Open, where he had such a great win in 1997.

The Big 5-0 is a moment for reflecting. Looking back, Lehman feels his best accomplishment was always being competitive and never giving up, exactly what helped him win the 1996 British Open at Royal Lytham and St. Annes—his first major. He also broke the Links course record with a sizzling 64.

He views the 1999 Ryder Cup as his second great accomplishment. “After playing on three Ryder Cup teams, finally winning the Cup back in 1999 at Brookline was so special,” he says. He contributed in a large way to that win by putting the first mark up for the U.S. team in its drive to come from behind to take the Cup. “Playing for my country,” he adds, “was always a primary objective.”

The Ryder Cup has loomed large in Lehman's career. He was honored to be nominated captain of the 2006 United States team, whose mission at the K Club was to win back the Cup held by the Europeans since 2001. Lehman's leadership and toughness earned him the respect of his players.

Phil Mickelson clearly stated team sentiment when he said, “Tom is what true professional golfers should be. The way that he treats people, he's a perfect captain for us. We look at him as a role model and as a leader.”

Lehman pursued all the viable strategies and did his utmost to captain the U.S. team to a win, but it was not to be.

A late bloomer in golf, Lehman got a last-minute golf scholarship at the University of Minnesota and turned pro after graduation in 1982. During the next decade he was off the tour more than on it, and played a variety of mini-tours from South Africa to Asia. He boils down that vagabond existence this way: “You haven't been a golf pro if you haven't slept in your car.”

One thing he has never lost is his sense of humor.

Since 1992 Lehman has been a fixture on tour and on the leaderboards of most Majors. He was the 1996 Player of the Year, a Vardon Trophy winner and has topped the official money list.

But it was a 2007 recognition that brought much emotion with it. “Being presented the Byron Nelson Prize in 2007 was humbling,” he says. “I have been inspired in my life by Byron Nelson to be a better golfer, but more importantly to be a better person.”

Lehman donated the \$100,000 prize to the McKenzie Monks Foundation, which helps kids cope with cancer. “This was really such a special accomplishment for me,” he adds. “It is right up there with the number-one world ranking.”

Lehman has always been a man of faith, of family and friendships. “My parents, Melissa, my kids, my friends all have poured effort, support into making the milestones of my life. We have achieved together. God has been very good to me for putting wonderful people in my life.”

He is committed to helping others. Currently his main focus is directed to several organizations: Hope Kids in Minnesota and Phoenix, and the Phoenix Rescue Mission and its Phoenix Changing Lives Center.

Lehman has also joined the ranks of players-turned-golf-course-designers. He started out collaborating with some big names in design, then in 2003 formed Lehman Design Group with Chris Brands. They have created outstanding new courses and worked on great remodeling projects across North America.

“I will continue to be active in design,” Lehman says. “Sadly, the current economic climate isn't helping any of us.”

While the economy may be faltering, part of Lehman's enduring legacy will be the quality golf courses he and his team have created.

In looking back at his past quarter century in golf, Lehman says there is one thing he would do differently. “I did a complete overhaul on my putting; it didn't work, and after three years of frustration and not the success I wanted, I went to the long putter.”

Along the way, many offered support and advice, but one letter in particular touched Lehman. The letter came from Tom Day, a North Dakota golfer and quadriplegic.

“Stop thinking about the 19 missed putts when you finished second on Tour,” wrote Day, “or the ones to win the Masters or U.S. Open; you can't change them. They are gone.”

Day's fortitude and focus helped Lehman, and the two have stayed in contact.

“With today's hindsight,” says Lehman, “I would have stuck with my putting and chipping technique but worked on being more consistent, grooved with the same stroke. You have to believe in your system in putting to win. To win, you must be a good putter.”

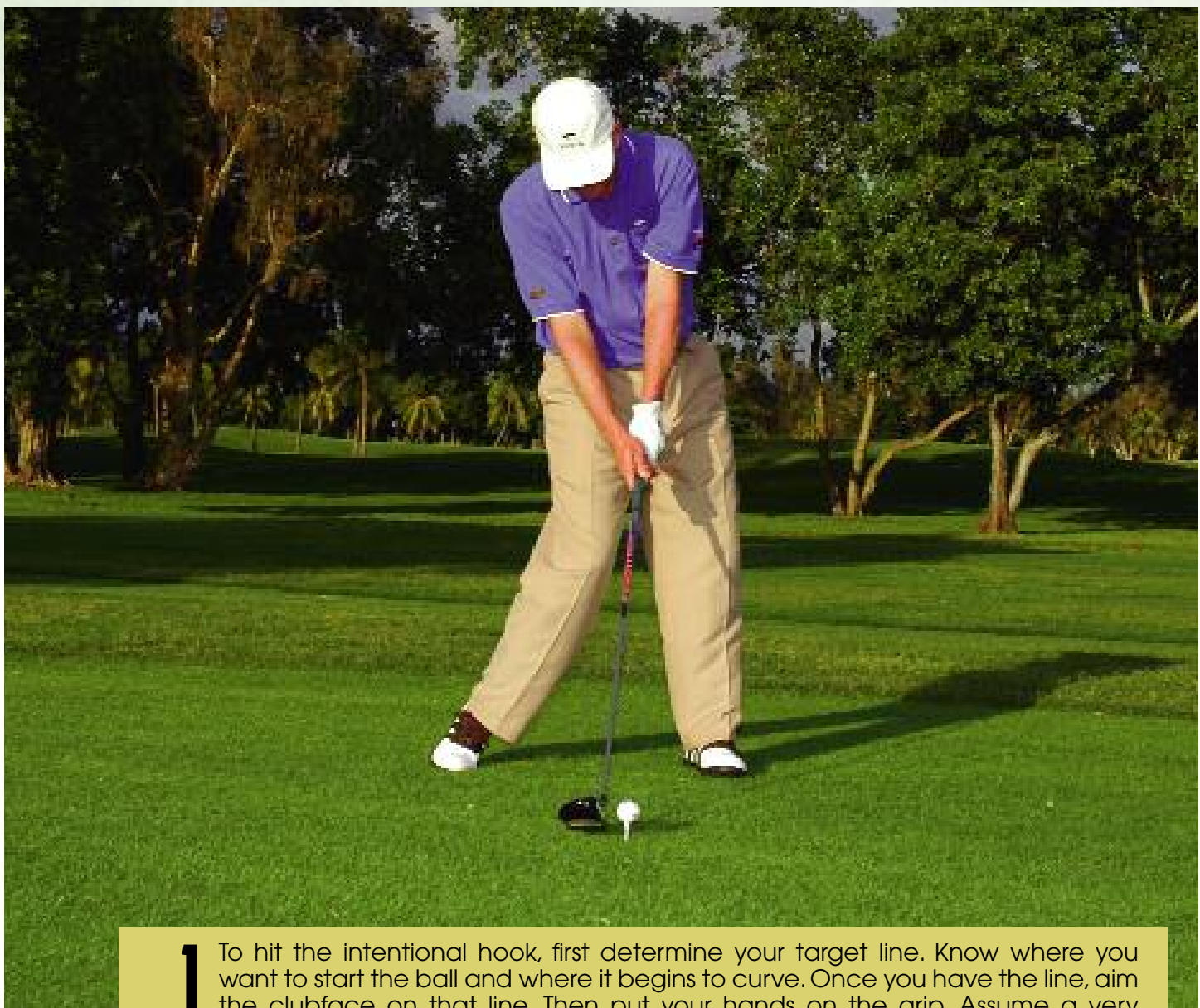
Turning 50 does not mean slowing down for Lehman, who remains one of golf's great personalities and true gentlemen. There are more tournaments to win, more courses to design, more children to help and family and friends with whom to share those special moments—all while accomplishing *new* milestones.

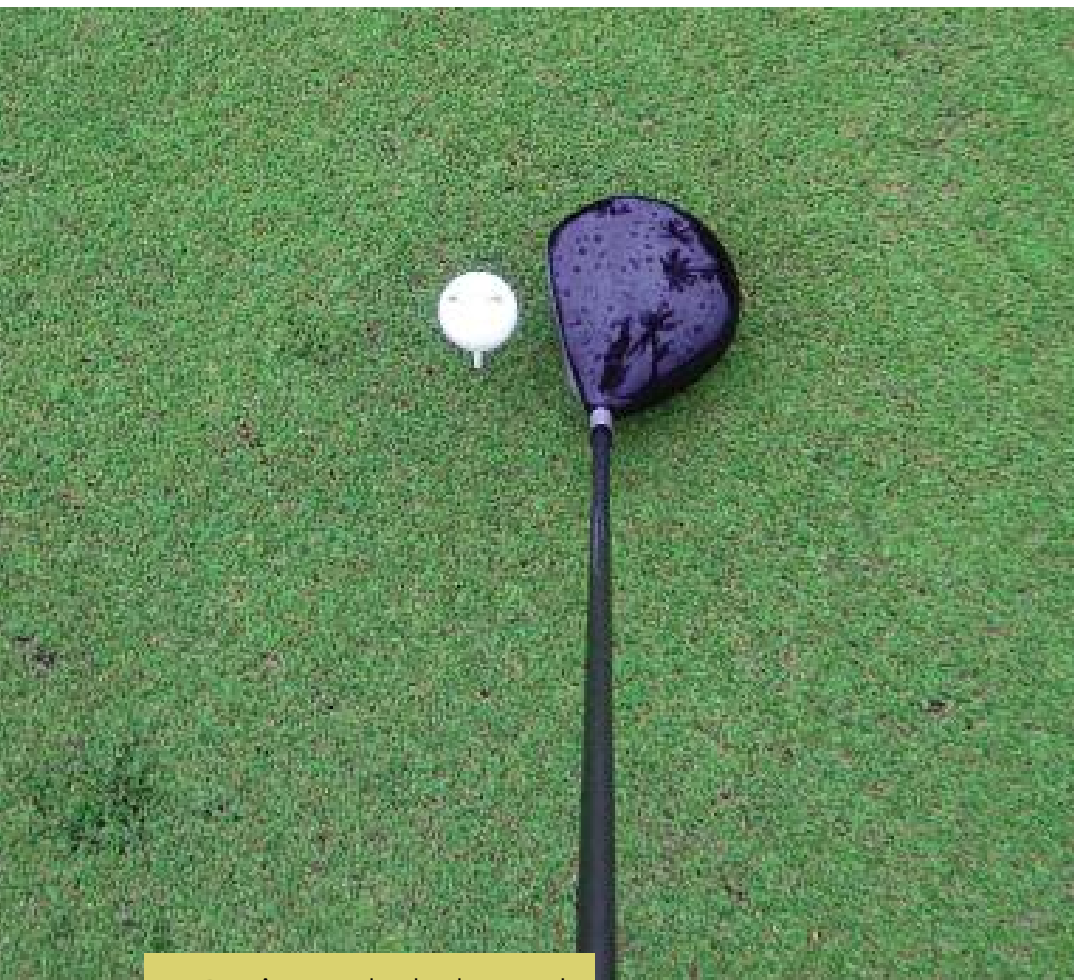
THE INTENTIONAL HOOK

MASTER THIS SHOT AND IMMEDIATELY IMPROVE YOUR GAME

LEARNING TO HOOK A GOLF BALL ON DEMAND IS VERY IMPORTANT FOR THREE REASONS. FIRST YOU WILL BE ABLE TO HIT SOME FANTASTIC RECOVERY SHOTS. SECOND, YOU WILL GET A NEW APPRECIATION OF SETTING UP FOR ANY SHOT. THIRD, YOU WILL LEARN THE IMPORTANCE OF CLUBFACE CONTROL



1 To hit the intentional hook, first determine your target line. Know where you want to start the ball and where it begins to curve. Once you have the line, aim the clubface on that line. Then put your hands on the grip. Assume a very closed stance, far to the right of the target line (for right handers). Turn the left toe inward toward the ball. Flare the right toe out, away from the ball. Close the upper body so it, too, is far right (parallel) to the toe line.



2 As you look down at the ball, the clubface now appears very shut, or closed. This is correct. The toe of the clubface is far ahead of the heel.

3 Waggle the club head along the toe line and visualize a big inside-out arc. Do this prior to making your golf swing. Before you swing, make final checks and keep your swing thoughts in mind. Check your hands and shoulders for tension. You must stay light and relaxed with minimum tension.

Your key swing thoughts are to make a smooth and full backswing. Stay slow at the top (no quick moves during transition). Keep the shoulders back as you start down; that will ensure the inside-out swing path. As you go through the ball, turn the right hand

over the left. To do this you might feel “knuckles down on your left hand” or “palm down” with the right hand.

It is a similar move to hitting a topspin forehand in tennis or ping-pong.

Remember the toe of the club must get to the golf ball first. That’s why setup is so key and why we pre-set the closed clubface before we do anything else.

Once you fully comprehend that the clubface controls curve, you will understand why we pre-set.

To practice, pick out one or two main swing ideas from this article that allow you to consistently hook shot after shot. Mastering this shot will put more power in your game and prove the importance of adjusting stance lines for different situations in golf.

JOURNEY AT PECHANGA

THE NAME MAY BE DIFFERENT, BUT THE COURSE AND
THE LAND IT'S ON OFFER A CALIFORNIA GOLFING

Perhaps the most notable feature of the land is "The Great Oak," one of the largest natural growing indigenous coastal live oak trees in the United States and estimated to be anywhere from 850 to 1,500 years old. To the Pechanga people, the land and the Great Oak that stands upon it carry deep meaning that transcends mere physical presence. The Great Oak, for example, has

The 62,000-square-foot clubhouse was inspired by Frank Lloyd Wright and features a Falling Waters-style waterfall as a visual focal point that pours from the third floor all the way to the ground-level locker rooms. The well-appointed men and women's locker rooms give guest a country-club-member-for-a-day feel. In addition to hosting one of the most



and the adjacent mountainside, weaves its way through numerous stands of mature California live oaks.

If Journey at Pechanga has a theme, it is variety—in terms of the topography, the individual holes and the different sets of tees. The front and back nines are also markedly different: The first nine holes meander through old oaks with many elevation changes, while the back nine plays through harsher terrain and along the dry wash of Pechanga Creek, a captivating hazard that comes into play on several holes. Then there is the wind, which is typically absent in the morning but gusting by afternoon.

"It's really two different courses in the morning and afternoon because of the wind. You can set your watch by it," says co-designer, Forrest.

Each hole bears a Luiseno name, and the course is host to some cultural exhibits that chronicle the history of the Pechanga people. Andrew Miranda, director of golf, is extremely proud of his course and boasts, "Our goal is for people to really enjoy their experience, not to be rushed by the group behind them. If they want to stop for lunch, they can."

Carts are equipped with a state-of-the-art GPS system that includes course tips and narration by U.S. Open champion

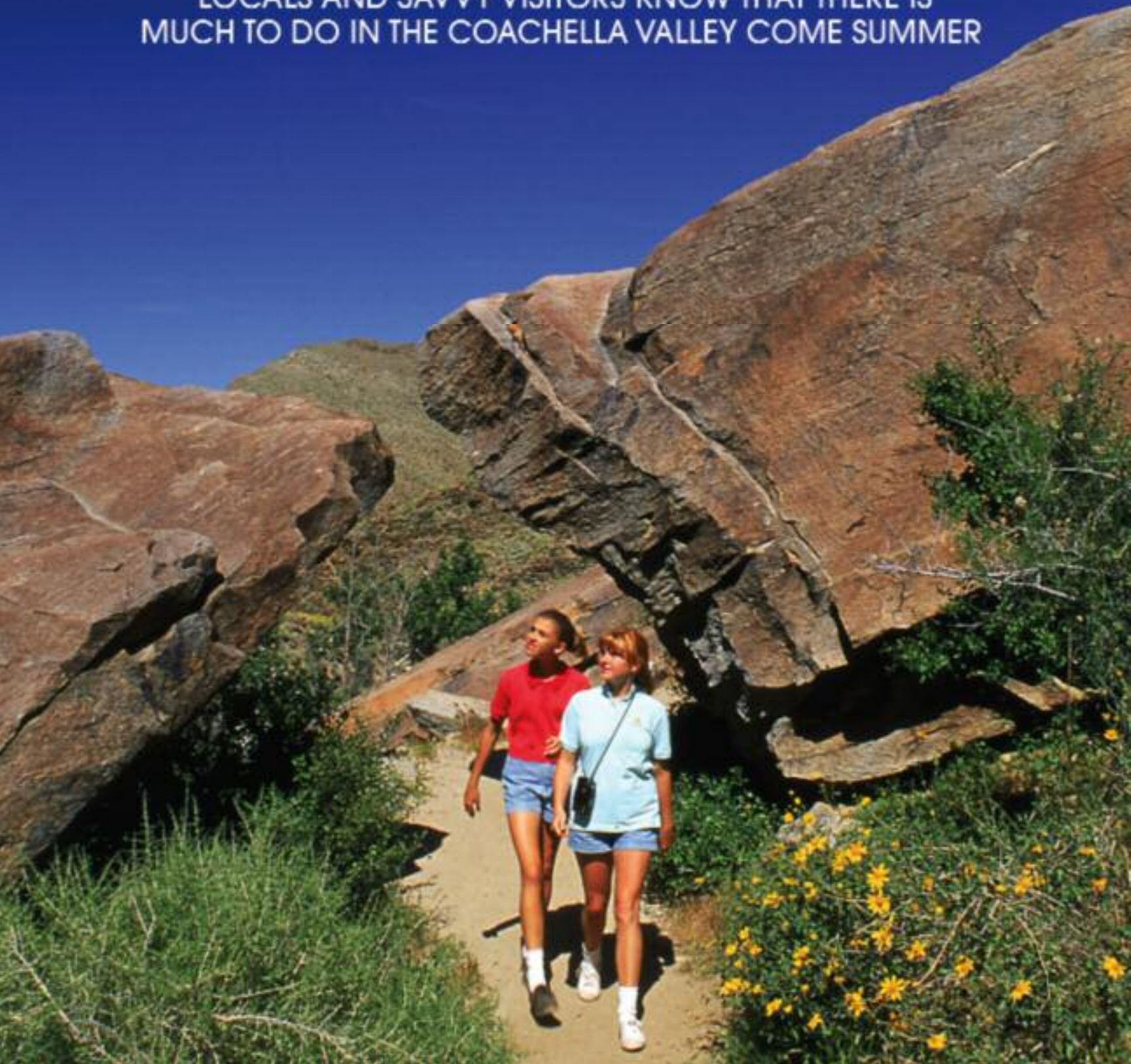

BMW'S PREDICTABLY POWERFUL ROADSTER
IS ALSO COMFORTABLE AND STYLISH

THE BMW Z4 HIT THE SCENE WITH GLITZ AND AWE IN 2002. BUT CHRIS BANGLE'S DESIGN WASN'T FOR EVERYONE. FOR THE REDESIGN, BMW EMPLOYED ITS CALIFORNIA TEAM AT DESIGNWORKS. STILL WINCING FROM THE LASHING THEY TOOK OVER THE PREVIOUS VERSION'S MULTI-ANGLED, FLAME SURFACING, THE TEAM TONED DOWN THE LATEST VERSION OF THE Z4. BODY LINES ARE A BIT SOFTER, SIX INCHES WAS ADDED IN LENGTH AND A HALF INCH TO THE GIRTH. THE RESULT IS A MORE MATURE LOOKING, COMFORTABLE SPORTS CAR

The Z4 is powerful and stylish without a doubt. Unlike some redesigns, the Z4 didn't lose any of its identity in the 2009 body. It gained what could become a reputation for excellence in blending technology with raw power.

Perhaps most noticeably, the new Z4 has an addition of a retractable hard top, no longer giving drivers of the roadster a need to shun cloudy afternoons.

"With top up, it's essentially a coupe," says BMW Client Advisor Brad Reicks at BMW North Scottsdale. "With the top down it's a roadster. It's the best of both worlds."

The roof folds and stows in just 20 seconds and fits nicely in the rear storage area. Adding the roof also makes the Z4 more practical for those prospective BMW buyers who want a daily driving machine that defies monotony.



That excitement comes from two engine options. Both inline-six cylinder engines pack power in an exotic looking front end.

"I haven't had anyone look at it and say they like the old design better," says Reicks. "A lot of people were waiting for hard top. They are very pleased to see that. The back end has some six series flare and the front stays aggressive."

The sDrive 30i has 255 horsepower in a naturally aspirated model. The super powerful sDrive 35i is a twin turbo with direct fuel injection. This hard charger competes with the best of them delivering 300 horsepower and 300 foot pounds of torque.

Marry the engine upgrade with the seven-speed, double-clutch transmission and you have one of the best roadsters on the market. The double clutch option dedicates one clutch to odd-numbered gears and another to even numbered gears. Shifting is instantaneous and exponentially faster than any human could achieve.

option. Upgrade the navigation system and find that it folds out of the dash and allows owners to upload locations directly from their home computers into the car's system. There is an on-board hard drive that connects with devices like an I-Pod and Blackberry. User interface with the controls is intuitive.

Control allows you to choose how aggressively you want the transmission, suspension and engine to respond. This standard feature gives you options for every long commute and Sunday drive you take. BMW continues to make driving an experience that you can enjoy over and over.

Take this to the track or the opera and you'll feel right at home. The Z4 is anything but boring and won't bang you around while you put it through the paces. Options abound and can put the price of a fully loaded Z4 upwards of \$70,000. A very nicely equipped version comes in around \$65,000 with models as low as the upper \$50s.

Head-turning rating: high.
Power: Phenomenal.
Gotta' have it: Definitely.

Ripping through the gears isn't just easy, it is heart-pounding.

While the Z4 doesn't look profoundly different than early versions, the slight changes in style and features make this redesign an improvement. Larger doors and more legroom inside also give drivers space to get in and out. The only thing folding is the roof, not the drivers' bodies contorting on entry.

The interior got an overhaul that is both classic and classy. A wood trim package frames out the controls and shift lever. There is also a brushed aluminum

The adaptive M suspension is responsive beyond belief. You want need to understand the technology behind struts to know they are working overtime in a subtle dance between the road and onboard computer. Bumps, potholes and other hazards relay messages from the front suspension to the rear suspension so quickly that the back suspension has a chance to adapt. The feeling is a tightly woven glove.
