



Rita Hayworth is remembered for her sexy, glamour-girl image on and off the silver screen in the 1930s and '40s. A frequent guest at the famed Villa Altamira in Palm Springs, Hayworth was often seen on the golf course by day and dancing the night away at Casa Blanca Lounge by night.

During the second annual Rita Hayworth Invitational, however, the legendary actress will be remembered in a different light – for bringing worldwide attention to the disease she once suffered from,

she had to be cued for every line. It wasn't until 10 years later that Hayworth was finally diagnosed with Alzheimer's. Princess Khan cared for her mother until Hayworth's death in 1987 at the age of 68.





"The biggest misconception of Alzheimer's is that it only strikes the elderly. People do not realize that my mother showed no signs of early onset in her early 50s," says Khan.

A life member of the Alzheimer's Association National Board, Princess Khan is known worldwide for her efforts in fighting the disease. "I would like everyone to know," remarked Khan at a recent gathering, "that 60 percent of the monies raised at the tournament stay here in the desert to support programs and services provided to Coachella Valley

WHEN HISTORIC JENSEN QUARRY SHUT DOWN IN 1979, IT WAS UNFORTUNATE FOR THE COMPANY THAT HAD BEEN COAXING MARBLE AND SOME 88 VARIETIES OF MINERALS OUT OF THE ROCK WALLS SINCE THE DAYS OF WORLD WAR I. BUT IT WAS ULTIMATELY VERY FORTUNATE FOR GOLFERS, WHO NOW HAVE A COURSE THAT IS AS RICH IN DRAMATIC TOPOGRAPHY AS IT IS IN HISTORY

Crafted by the team of Champions Tour star Dr. Gil Morgan and Schmidt-Curley Design, the 7,002yard course is laid out in and around the old quarry, its holes named for the The course is best known for No. 14, also called Spinel Slide, a 214-yard par 3 with a massive white-faced rock wall framing the peninsula green. Ron Whitten, respected architecture



editor of *Golf Digest* said of this hole, "This is a national park of golf, the Yosemite of the golf world, and this rock wall is its El Capitan."


Not surprisingly, the 14th hole has been named both the prettiest and toughest par 3 in the region, and one magazine rated it the best par 3 in Southern California, an area with no shortage of famously designed holes. Oak Quarry itself was named the "Number One Golf Course in Inland California" by *Tee It Up* magazine.



minerals once mined here – Pyrite Perch, Gypsum Gully, Opal Outcrop, Garnet Meadow and Zircon Tumble, to name just a few. One of the only golf courses ever designed in an historic quarry, the Oak Quarry golf course is nothing if not memorable.

"When a golfer comes here," says general manager, Hank Schiller, "he remembers it; it is distinctly different than any other course."

In a world where golf-course oneupmanship has led to ever more dramatic and unusual design elements, Schiller is not exaggerating Oak Quarry's uniqueness. Even those who review golf courses for a living, those who have seen the most impressive championship layouts in North America, have said that no photo does justice to Oak Quarry (but go ahead, check out the club's website pictures anyway).



Word of the course has spread not just across California but also across the globe. "We've had people come from as far away as England, Switzerland, Ireland, Holland and Germany who tell us they've heard that this golf course has the incredible par 3 and they want to see it," says Schiller. "After seeing it," he adds, "they almost always stop in the golfshop to say that the course is even more incredible than they thought it would be from seeing the photographs."



Oak Quarry Golf Club, which was opened in late 2000 by Landmark Golf Company and is currently owned by Koss Oak Quarry LLC, has a lot going for it in terms of drawing players to its tees. It's ideally situated exactly 60 miles from both Los Angeles and Palm Springs, and it is easy to get to from major highways. It's also a daily-fee course open to the public, though it rivals area private clubs, too, offering several membership levels that come with such perks as advanced bookings for tee times and unlimited play. There are individual, family and corporate memberships available at several different price levels.

In spite of its dramatic setting and an acknowledged tough par 3, Schiller says that any golfer can play Oak Quarry and enjoy it. "Ability is not a factor because it's not an inherently difficult course – but it can be." He points out that even though there is a 400-foot elevation difference across the course, every hole plays on level ground – just another of Oak Quarry's unique design attributes.

Then again there are the lakes originally created during excavation at Jensen Quarry, lakes that ultimately led to the quarry's demise. In trying to get to deeper minerals, workers hit the water table. Today, those scenic lakes are about 80 feet deep, so if your ball finds its way to the water don't even bother looking — the lakes can be a golfer's demise, too.

In addition to the much-heralded golf course, Oak Quarry also has a 7,200-square-foot clubhouse with dining (breakfast and lunch are served daily), as well as meeting space for corporate outings and private weddings, all graced with a most impressive backdrop. "Weddings are hosted on the putting green below the clubhouse," says Schiller, "overlooking two lakes and a quarry-wall feature."

Schiller is justifiably proud of Oak Quarry for its design and for the great golf that the course provides. But he points out that the club has also been important to the landscape and to the surrounding community of Riverside, Calif.

Before this golf club was sculpted out of the land in and around the historic quarry, the quarry had been abandoned for some 35 years. It sat unused, becoming an eyesore where people dumped trash. "We shaped the landscape and the neighborhood in a new and incredible way," Schiller says.

While golf courses are sometimes at odds with the natural landscape into which they're laid out, Oak Quarry has been a wholly positive and defining influence on the community of which it is a part.



"We at Oak Quarry have always been proud of our rich heritage," says Schiller. "Our entire image reflects our roots and the quarry gives the course a layout as dramatic as anywhere in the United States."

The Giddings Cup

THE GREAT SENIOR AMATEUR EVENT HAS AGED TO PERFECTION

For the past 25 years, an elite field of amateur golfers has converged on the Coachella Valley for four days of knee-knocking, unpredictable yet phenomenal golf. Introducing the Giddings Cup, one of the year's most popular senior amateur golf events, and one that annually boasts a stellar roster of players from across the country and the globe.

addition, players must be 55 years of age or older, have amateur status, carry a five handicap or less and find a partner filling the same criteria. If all that works out, you then have to hope that the golf gods smile upon you.

The Giddings Cup was the brainchild of World Golf Hall of Fame inductee Ernie Vossler and longtime Executive Director of the The first tournament was held in 1983, but the conceptual roots of the Giddings Cup date back to 1952 and a tournament in Phoenix, Ariz. where two excellent golfers, Ernie Vossler and Dick Giddings, met and began a friendship that would span four decades.

"There was never a question about naming the tournament in honor of Dick Giddings," Vossler says. "It was a


This year's tournament, April 9 - 12, will once again raise the competitive standard with a field of incredible golfers – but don't call to reserve a spot just yet. There are stringent requirements for those hoping to play. For starters, the tournament is by invitation only. In

Bob Hope Chrysler Classic, General Bill Yancey. The tournament was originally based on the idea of creating an event that would bring great amateur golfers to the desert, and consequently to the properties that the Landmark Land Company, Inc. was developing. natural. Dick Giddings was a great player, a loyal friend of Landmark and one of golfs great gentlemen."

Giddings played golf with many of the best including Walter Hagen, Denny Shute and Byron Nelson. He took several club championship titles, the first in 1930, won the Northern California Amateur and played in eleven USGA events. The host course for this year's tournament is The Golf Club at Terra Lago in Indio. Past tournaments have been held at Landmark Golf Club, Desert Willow Golf Resort and La Quinta Hotel & Resort.

"The Giddings Cup was created as a scratch competition where you get the best partner you can, come on out to the desert, have some fun and see who you can beat," remarked Giddings before his passing in 2002. What has now become Giddings' legacy is strongly supported by Carol Giddings, who remains very interested in her late husband's favorite event.

As a testament to this successful amateur tournament, each year more than 65 percent of the previous field returns, including consistently strong players Roger Brown, Bill Heldmar, John Olive and Bob Hullender. And as the golfers mature, the tournament continues to grow; a 'Super Seniors' division was added in 2002. To qualify for this division, the combined ages of both partners must be 135 years or more, and both must be at least 65 years old.

The event begins with the Monday night opening party and ends with the Thursday awards luncheon. The format, which has remained unchanged since its




CONRAD LOPES AND JERRY HUTTON ANNUAL RETURNING CONTESTANTS, 2006 TROPHY WINNERS

SHELTER FROM THE STORM'S GOLF-AND-GALA FUNDRAISER WOWS 'EM YEAR AFTER YEAR

NO DOUBT ABOUT IT, PORCUPINE CREEK IS A STUNNING FIXTURE IN RANCHO MIRAGE. A SPECTACULAR 32,000-SQUARE-FOOT MANSION ON 240 MANICURED ACRES, THE PROPERTY IS HIGHLIGHTED BY WATER FEATURES AND A PRISTINE, CHAMPIONSHIP GOLF COURSE. FOR THE UNINITIATED, IT'S NOT A COUNTRY CLUB BUT THE ESTATE OF VIBRANT PHILANTHROPIST EDRA BLIXSETH. APRIL 20-21, BLIXSETH OPENS PORCUPINE CREEK TO THE PUBLIC FOR THE SIXTH TIME AS THE SITE OF THE SHELTER FROM THE STORM (SFTS) ANNUAL GALA AND GOLF TOURNAMENT. What makes the gala-and-golf weekend such a standout? Blixseth says that beyond the fun-focused festivities and superb setting, it's the warm and welcoming ambiance among hosts and participants alike.

"People are already in a festive mood when they arrive, because it's more like a party than an event at a home where the backyard happens to be a golf course," she says. "My four kids are all grown and I have five grandchildren, so the atmosphere here is people feeling it is a family place where they can enjoy the comforts of home. The property really is unique and this event exposes people to the cause There are charity golf events, but Porcupine Creek is totally private, for family and friends, so the draw may be that this is the only time most can play it. Feedback on the course is that [participants] feel at home and welcomed. Overall, people expect a fun time and plan on staying long and late."

A golf devotee, Blixseth always participates in the tournament, and for the last few years has put together a female foursome of good friends: Mary Hart of "Entertainment Tonight," Congresswoman Mary Bono and fellow SFTS board member Mary Heckmann. Blixseth says the group plays well, is usually in the hunt with their varied handicaps and has even won once or twice


The weekend generally garners half-a-million dollars for SFTS, a notfor-profit organization dedicated to helping adults and children hurt by domestic violence. A complete golf-and-gala entertainment package is \$2,250, a dinner-only ticket comes in at \$500 per person and tables for 10 with added perks are \$10,000 to \$25,000.

Lynn Moriarty, SFTS executive director, says, "It's a fun event, with dinner and dancing, entertainment and a live auction. It is probably the most spectacular event I have ever seen in the most magnificent setting you can imagine. It's breathtaking. The food is fabulous and it's decorated so that when people go down to dinner they are aghast — it's that beautiful. The golf course is exquisite, manicured to the nth degree. And the generosity of someone opening her home to this words cannot describe it."

The 2007 event is another in a series of annual sellouts and Blixseth hopes potential participants put it on their calendar for next year. "Or



we hope people will think of us when they're writing a check for a charity," she says. Before 2001, SFTS had a fundraiser gala already in place, but after Blixseth's golf course was

women and children," Moriarty says. "Somebody with kids goes to an emergency shelter with nothing but a plastic bag of belongings, then can get a job and leave with an emotionally intact family and savings from \$7,000 to \$10,000, and be a productive, stable member of society. It happens again and again — it's not an isolated case. In today's world of tight budgets and increased demand for services, without the funds raised at this event SFTS wouldn't be able to fulfill its mission."

created she was quick to offer it as a tournament fundraiser site. "There are so many good causes here, but this one is close to my heart."

In 1987, Blixseth wrote *Uncharged Battery*, her own experience and advice about domestic violence. After the book was published, she was introduced to SFTS, became a board member and subsequently board president. "I had been to a lot of shelters but was extremely impressed with [the SFTS] philosophy."

She says the goal is not a quick fix but more centered on long-term solutions to change the lives of women and children. SFTS has 11 counseling offices and more than 200 beds, with emergency shelters that can accommodate victims for up to 60 days and transitional housing for two years. The organization has been making an impact against domestic violence in the Coachella Valley for more than 18 years.

"Many people involved in this work were victims of domestic violence and want to help other

HALL OF FAME CATCHER JOHNNY BENCH IS HAPPY TO DISCUSS HIS AMAZING CAREER IN BASEBALL. INQUIRE ABOUT THE NEW ADDITION TO HIS FAMILY, HOWEVER, AND THIS 60-YEAR-OLD BASEBALL LEGEND BEGINS TO GUSH WITH EXCITEMENT

Justin Palmer Bench was born April 1, 2006 in Palm Springs, Calif. to Johnny and Lauren Bench. "Justin is named after Lauren's brother and Arnold Palmer," says Bench, who also admits to very little sleep and plenty of diaper duty since Justin's birth.

Justin brings a new level of activity into Bench's life, but it's a life that has been fast-paced and full of surprises since the start of his incredible career.

John Lee Bench was born in Oklahoma City and grew up in the small town of Binger, Okla. nurturing a dream of Bench is remembered primarily for his great offense, but he impacted baseball in another way, too, by being one of the first players ever to use a protective helmet in the field. At the plate, Bench popularized catching one-handed and kept his throwing hand behind his back to protect it from foul tips. As for that great arm, he once said his father taught him "to throw 254 feet, twice the distance to second base, from a crouch."

So why does a baseball legend name his son after a golfing legend? Because Bench is an accomplished golfer and Arnold



becoming a major league baseball player. It was his father who suggested that the position of catcher was the most direct route to realizing that dream. Taking his father's advice, Bench played behind the plate and was ultimately signed by the Cincinnati Reds in the 1965 amateur draft. The rest, as they say, is history.

Bench's many baseball triumphs include National League Rookie of the Year in 1968, National League Most Valuable Player in 1970 and 1972 and World Series MVP in 1976. He was an All-Star 14 times, won 10 Gold Gloves and was elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1989. Palmer is one of his good friends. "Arnold and I became friends through the Bob Hope Chrysler Classic; I've played with the King 10 times and spent many a jam session entertaining everyone on the bandstand."

Bench says he first picked up a golf club at the age of twelve with a neighborhood friend. "A kid moved into my hometown of Binger whose father had a set of golf clubs, which was actually unbelievable to us because it was such a small town. We would go out back in the plowed ground behind the cotton gin and swing at the golf ball. We'd hit it across the pasture and it was fun."

Later, it was his father who took up golf, prompting Bench's renewed interest in the game. Yet it wasn't until he signed his first professional baseball bat contract with Louisville Slugger that he acquired his initial set of clubs. "I had the choice of \$500 or a set of golf clubs and a bag," he says. "I took the clubs."

During spring training in 1966, golf became a large part of Bench's life. "We had finished the day and a couple of the



players asked me if I wanted to go play golf. I said sure, had my new set of clubs and I was on my way."

In 1970 the catcher joined Bob Hope on his around-the-world USO tour, and the two formed a friendship. Hope invited Bench to play in the 1971 Bob Hope Desert Classic – the first of 25 in which Bench has played.

Cincinnati is currently Bench's main residence, which allows him to stay close to his 16-year-old son from a previous marriage, who also lives there. "After my son graduates we plan on spending most of our time in the desert," says Bench, who has been a homeowner at Mission Hills Country Club in Rancho Mirage for 20 years.


Holding a single-digit index of 3.6, Bench is a member of the Celebrity Players Tour and plays golf as often as possible – when he's not working. He's still a consultant for the owners of the Reds and continues to work for the Bank in Cincinnati where he's been a spokesperson for 33 years. He also still has Johnny Bench Enterprises, which motivational involves speaking, appearances, clinics, outings and card shows. A new brand of Scotch called Five. in honor of Bench's jersey number, has also been in the works.

"I play in several charity golf tournaments each year," says Bench, "and one that I never miss is the Warren Smith tournament at the Cherry Hills Country Club. The event is about honoring the old pro there, Warren Smith. It's a two-day event that I look forward to every year."

When asked who would make up his ultimate foursome, there's no hesitation. "My dad Ted, Arnold and Freddie Couples. My Dad passed away but I know he would come back if I could set up that foursome," Bench quips with obvious affection.

And when asked to describe his life, the answer comes just as quickly. "Awesome!"

IN GOLF, THE WORLD HAS GONE SQUARE

CLUBS ARE ABOUT AS BIG AS THEY CAN LEGALLY BE, SO WHAT'S NEXT?

ORLANDO, FLORIDA – IN THE PAST FEW YEARS AT THE PGA MERCHANDISE SHOW, THE "NEXT BIG THING" HAS BEEN SIZE. SINCE 2002, THE GOLF WORLD HAS BECOME INCREASINGLY SUPERSIZED WITH DRIVERS, IRONS, WEDGES AND PUTTERS ALL GETTING A LOT BIGGER. WITH DRIVERS NOW AT THE LEGAL LIMIT OF 460CC AND IRONS AND PUTTERS AS BIG AS CAN BE CALLED LOGICAL AND SENSIBLE, THERE IS A GENERAL SENSE THAT MANUFACTURERS ARE SCRATCHING THEIR COLLECTIVE HEADS TO FIND THE NEXT INNOVATION THAT WILL ENTICE GOLFERS TO PLUNK DOWN THEIR CREDIT CARDS

The PGA Merchandise Show is the annual gathering of the golf industry; it takes place each year in late January in Orlando. Approximately 45,000 people in the golf industry attend the show each year. Most manufacturers have traditionally displayed their new and current products here; however, several major manufacturers, including Nike, Titleist and Ping, did not attend this year's show.

Proof that the focus of golf manufacturers may be shifting can be seen in current advertising and marketing, with several prominent and second-tier names starting to stress accuracy over raw distance. TaylorMade even went retro with the return of the Burner (\$299-\$399); the new version is significantly lighter to promote faster clubhead speed for the average golfer. The new Burner looks like a solid option for TaylorMade fans who find the variable weights of the weight-technology systems in clubs like the SuperQuad to be a bit much. Buyers looking for the ultimate TaylorMade driver should opt for the new flagship TP r7 SuperQuad 460 Titanium (\$699); new cone technology means a larger sweet spot, plus there's a proprietary shaft for added distance.

For a company that's produced its share of visually remarkable clubs, *Callaway* has outdone itself with the new **Ft-i Tour drivers (\$499)** that come in neutral and draw biases. The club is square with an oval titanium face; it has composite construction that has helped *Callaway* develop what it calls the straightest driver on the market. The better player should opt for the neutral model while the less-accomplished amateur with a bit of a slice should look at the draw bias model.

Hybrids continue to provide the golf industry with growth and every major manufacturer is now solidly in on the action. Far and away the best-looking hybrid on display belonged to *Ben Hogan*, part of the *Callaway* empire. The **Hogan CFT-ti Hybrid (\$139-\$155)** offers more distance and height than previous models and even includes the famous 'speed slot' from many moons ago. The **Hippo XXL Weighted Tech Hybrid (\$59.99)** is an excellent choice for the budget-conscious golfer who wants a solid hybrid with some adjustability; the club comes with separate weights. The **Srixon AD Hybrid (\$149)** has clean lines and offers a larger sweet spot than some comparable models.

For those who have come to love their hybrids and have been thinking, "If I could only have a full set of these, I might be a pretty good golfer!" then your day has finally arrived. *Tour Edge*, one of the first companies to produce serious hybrids, now offers a full set of hybrids up through pitching wedge in the **Bazooka JMAX**

Iron-Wood (\$599). For the golfer who prefers the look and feel of an iron with hybrid-like benefits, the **Bazooka** JMAX QL Irons (\$550) are a good choice. There's even a set for those who can't decide between the two: the JMAX Combo set (\$599) lets you mix and match between the Bazooka JMAX Iron-Wood and the JMAX QL Irons. *Nickent* is also offering a complete set, the **3DX Hybrid** Irons (\$750) with a low center of gravity that makes it easier to get the ball up in the air.

These are, for the most part, generally bad times for purists who like irons that look like a work of serious craftsmanship. Led by industry leaders Callaway and *TaylorMade*, irons have become significantly easier to hit but are not getting any better visually. Still, results are results and mid- to high-handicappers should take a serious look at the TaylorMade R7 Draw Irons (\$599-\$799), which use the same technology as the line's popular drivers. TaylorMade has positioned the center of gravity back and toward the heel and built in expanded COR for greater yardage. The most technology-packed iron set is probably the Callaway Fusion Wide Sole Iron (\$800-\$1,299). The set features a combination of materials, including titanium; the design includes tunite sole weighting for a very low center of gravity and a wide sole design to increase playability. While the R7 and Fusion irons are clearly designed to help just about any golfer hit more greens, they are perhaps the ugliest clubs ever made.

For the traditionalist looking for a degree of playability and exceptional feel and feedback, the star of the show was the **Mizuno MP-67 (\$850)**, which is the latest of the company's impressive cut-muscle line. The key to these irons is the neutral center of gravity placement in each club. The long and mid irons have a mid-high trajectory while the shorter irons have a slightly lower trajectory for more accuracy.

Wilson brought a solid line of new equipment to the show, including the sensibly priced **Ci6 irons (\$499-\$599)** that are perfect for the weekend warrior midhandicapper, and the 8862, a version of the 8802 combining the classic look with the latest insert and material technology.

Now that manufacturers have conquered large and gone (mostly) ugly to help golfers find more distance and achieve more accuracy, what's next? With very little wiggle room left when it comes to USGA regulations, the upcoming years will be curious – at least based on the offerings at this year's PGA Merchandise Show. Will the golf ball soon become square?

mountain golf. Also in the news, developer Mayer Luce Companies put its ambitious 505-acre, \$1 billion Tuscan Hills development on hold until the sluggish Desert Hot Springs housing market shows signs of rebounding, thus making local residents wait a while longer to enjoy Tuscan Hills' 18-hole Johnny Millerdesigned course.

Arizona is showing market stability

Phoenix seems to be Arizona's hot ticket item right now as seen in its recent rise in home sales. Analysts are looking at an exceptionally sound February during which sales were up 14.4 percent and the price-per-squarefoot increased \$4, up to \$171. REAR-SEAT PASSENGERS ARE TREATED TO AN UNPRECEDENTED LEVEL OF COMFORT, NOT TO MENTION THAT THE CAR PARKS ITSELF Lexus may put driving instructors out of business. Yes, those unsung heroes of our culture should start looking for new jobs now that the Lexus LS 460 is on the market with its innovative Advanced Parking System. This car practically parks itself. Even better, it parallel parks itself!

Ask Oprah Winfrey, who demonstrated the prowess of the LS on her show. Says New Car Sales Manager at Desert Lexus in Cathedral City, Calif. Gabriel Marshall, "While she was parking it she kept screaming, 'This is so cool!'"

She's right. The navigation screen prompts drivers to indicate where






they would like to park. Touch the screen, press the brake and the LS does the rest, whether it's backing into a space or negotiating a tricky parallel-only spot. The LS needs only about two more feet than the length of its body to park, which is less than some human drivers require. So cool.

Lexus is also eliminating the need to curse other drivers in stop-and-go traffic. The touch screen navigation system has a new feature that gathers traffic information and displays the trouble areas on your route — roads with gridlock turn red, smooth sailing is green. Your blood pressure drops and all is right with the world because you avoid trouble.

The LS is innovative down to its core. The eight-speed transmission, for example, is the first of its kind in a production car. Lexus engineers have one thought in mind when developing transmissions: seamless. They were so successful drivers will ask, "Does the LS 460 even shift?"

"It's almost like an electric golf cart," Marshall says. "You can *barely* feel it shift. I mean barely."

An electric golf cart with 380 horsepower and a 4.6-liter engine – try to get that past the course marshal next round. This eight-cylinder is



getting up to 27 miles per gallon using both port and direct fuel injection, and it gets off the line fast, going from 0-to-60 in 5.4 seconds. The LS is a luxurious lightning bolt.

Trying to capture one of your own may be as difficult as catching lighting.

"I've got 30 orders that I haven't filled," Marshall says. "If you want one, absolutely get on a list. I could safely say I could get one for you, as long as you don't want the executive seat package end of May to mid June."

The executive seat package is worth the extra wait. It turns the right rear seat into the next best thing to a spa treatment with a massage system hidden under a layer of soft leather. The seat also reclines and has a legrest. Then there's the wood-trimmed table hidden between the two rear seats and the DVD system that drops from the ceiling. With all of this rear-seat luxury, Lexus may put an end to another of our cultural staples — the fight over who gets to ride shotgun.

"Everyone is pretty amazed by this car," says Billy Johnson, New Car Sales Manager at Lexus of Las Vegas. "Versus the competition, there is nothing that compares when it comes to the technology of this car."

This fully loaded brush with perfection will run around \$94,000, including rear-seat massage and all the extras. One of those extras is a sound system so sublime it brings tears. A Mark Levinson 19-speaker system gives the LS a true surroundsound experience. Seven channels dedicated to music make Beethoven's Fifth sound like its coming straight from the orchestra pit with percussion in the back and violins on the right.

Marshall gushes, "To recreate this in your home would cost about \$110,000. You also get a 30-gigabyte hard drive that can store up to 2,000 songs. There's no need to take a CD in your car again."

Of course, the keyless entry eliminates the need for anything but pushbutton ignition, and there will be no more fumbling with keys to get into the car either. Instead, the LS recognizes the key in your pocket approximately three feet before you arrive and unlocks the doors for you. All of this technology is made possible with a Bluetooth component that also operates with cell phones.

After introducing your LS 460 to your cell phone, your calls come over a speaker by touching a control on the steering wheel. The controls are designed to keep drivers more focused on the road; however, Lexus understands that accidents can happen and has endowed the LS with a few safety features to help.

The pre-collision system Lexus has developed scans the road ahead. If an accident is eminent, the LS 460 pre-

collision system tightens seat belts and begins emergency braking to help minimize the damage and eliminate your need for medical care.

With the LS, Lexus brings us closer to the time when we'll actually say to our grandkids, "I remember the days when we had to park the car ourselves."

Tiffany & Co., one of the world's authorities on diamonds, recently launched the new Tiffany Novo ring. The Novo is a modern diamond cut and setting that is designed for brilliance, with a new facet pattern and slightly squared outline.

"Through a unique faceting arrangement, we created a brilliant cushion cut that gives the finished diamond a fantastic sparkle and a modern new spirit," says Melvyn Kirtley, Tiffany's chief gemologist.

The cut of the ring maximizes brilliance with perfectly aligned facets in a customized setting of four sleek, tapered prongs. In addition to its cut, the setting is also what sets the Novo apart. The diamond is positioned on a bead-set diamond band in platinum. The handset diamonds also circle platinum, 18-karat yellow or rose gold wedding bands that match the ring. Novo bands are designed to be worn stacked, in a seamless statement of glamour.

Hyde Park Jewelers, with retain stores in Denver, Phoenix and Las Vegas, has launched a new square-cut diamond that is available exclusively at Hyde Park and is turning heads for its innovation and beauty. Called the Classica, the cut is available for diamonds sized 3/4 carats to two carats.

Hyde Park owners Michael Pollak and Steven Rosdal, with Mark Imlay, the company's director of diamond merchandising, worked closely with diamond cutters to define precisely the proportions in a square stone that will flash the rainbow of colors normally achieved in a round diamond. The Classica incorporates a step cut on top and a modified brilliant cut on the bottom, with 70 facets in all. The corners of the stone are cut at a 135-degree angle and the tolerances for proportions are exceedingly tight, leading to incredible brilliance.

"The Classica is a Hyde Park signature," says Imlay, noting its square shape with beveled corners is designed for optimal beauty. "There's been a real renaissance in diamond cutting. This is the result of jewelers wanting to be more unique and innovative." Imlay also notes an advantage of the Classica diamonds is that they are mined in Canada in a regulated diamond mining industry, so there is no question about where the diamond came from or how it was acquired.

The Tycoon cut is another popular designer cut at Hyde Park. The Tycoon cut is a simple design with nine crown

facets and 20 step-cut pavilion facets. Its step-cut pavilion design accentuates the stone's color, and the nine-crown facet design hides inclusions better than do traditional square designs. The Tycoon-cut diamond is available in rectangular, tapered, square, trapezoid and cut-corner shapes.

"The Tycoon is an emerald cut that has been improved upon for light performance," Imlay explains. "It sparkles more than the average rectangular cut."

Hyde Park is launching a new exclusive cut, the Virtu, expected to debut in the fall. The Virtu, which will be a modified version of the popular

round cut, has already been under development for several months. "We're trying to create something with even more beauty," says Imlay.


Developing these new cuts is an expensive process; as much time and money is spent on prototyping as on actual diamonds. "It takes a lot of planning and refining," Imlay says. "We're trying to create a real brand image with these exclusive signature cuts."

When shopping for a diamond, Imlay stresses the importance of letting your eyes do the work. "So many customers rely on certificates and the facts of the 4 Cs. Those are valuable, but always remember that a diamond is a piece of art that should please your eyes and speak to you."
