Are you up to the CHALLENGE?













In 2020, golf not only survived it thrived. According to the National Golf Foundation, 2020 ended with 502 million rounds played, the biggest year-over-year increase since 1997—even with many courses shut down in March and April as the pandemic hit.

That increase was driven by a combination of dedicated golfers playing more rounds and an influx of new and returning golfers looking to stay socially and physically active midpandemic.

Golf was a natural for pandemic success. It's conducive to social distancing, an easy-tostart alternative to other sports that were shut down, a mental and physical escape from confinement and it's a safe, healthy outdoor activity even if the world around it is anything but.

Private, public or resort, many Coachella Valley golf courses ended 2020 on a high note—and 2021 is looking good, too.

Brett Meabon, head professional at Marriott's Shadow Ridge Golf Resort, theorizes why play has increased across the country and locally. "I think it speaks to the fact that golf is something you can do safely. It's a testament to the industry and to the clubs and courses and all that they did to make playing golf safe and to allow folks to play."

Shadow Ridge reopened mid-May after the early closures. "We're part of a resort and timeshare property so 60 to 65% of our players are in-house members and timeshare owners. With the resort essentially closed, we didn't have any hotel guests that first month; it was all owners and club members," Meabon says.

Priorities were determined before reopening and Shadow Ridge followed guidelines set by the National Golf Course Owners Association. The goal was to provide a safe environment and a good golf experience. Steps taken included reducing tee times, cutting out twilight play and reducing staff. To keep players distanced, intervals between tee times were increased to 20-minutes and gradually shortened to 15 and finally 10-minute intervals, where they are now. Play is still limited to the hours of 6 a.m. to 1 p.m.

"Even with reduced hours, increased intervals and no hotel guests for a month, we did more rounds last summer than the previous summer," Meabon says. Additionally, he notes, "Although membership is limited to begin with, it has nearly doubled since 2019."

Looking forward, Meabon believes the first half of 2021 will be about recovery, but he's optimistic the second half will see growth and a return to pre-COVID normal, though what exactly that will look like is an unknown. Still, there are positives.

"We learned how to operate differently and more efficiently," he says. "We learned how to manage staffing and reduce inventory while still providing a good golf experience and we'll continue with that for now. The commitment to cleanliness across the resort will remain, which is a good practice going forward."

If there's one thing he wishes for, it's more consistency from the state. "The uncertainty and unknown," he says, "are hard."

John Cochrane, PGA, general manager at private Toscana Country Club, says 2020 round of golf were up more than 40 percent over 2019. Memberships rose, too. While Toscana doesn't have tee times and didn't have to reduce hours of play, modifications were made to food and beverage outlets in order to meet CDC guidelines. More delivery and take-out options were added, for example.

Cochrane says one positive effect of COVID-19 is that "Members had more opportunity to be reminded of how much they love the sport of golf."



Over at Indian Wells Golf Resort, a public course, the picture isn't quite as rosy. Michael Tebbetts, director of sales and marketing, notes that some months in 2020 were up but some were down. Then the mid-December lockdown brought all categories down.

More than 200 staff at the resort were laid off last March and hours of play were reduced by about three hours per day. Intervals between tee times expanded to 20 minutes in the early months but, Tebbetts says, "They're back to 10-minute intervals since cart dividers were installed."

As to the lasting impact of COVID, Tebbetts believes there will be positive advancements. "It will be all pre-payment. We'll have advancement in the online shopping experience, avoiding chokepoints in business flow to avoid gathering and waiting. Whether it's all positive," he says, "time will tell. But we'll have more reliance on better technology moving forward."


Private Ironwood Country Club is on an upward trend. "Golf rounds are up 26% over 2020 and 30% over 2019," says Josh Tanner, chief executive and general manager. And while member rounds are up, guest rounds are down as member family and friends aren't visiting.



Tanner says Ironwood gained 24 more members than in 2019 and 13 more than in 2020. "We continue to experience a lot of membership activity at the club and expect to reach our cap of 500 soon."

Even when all dining was closed per state rules, Ironwood averaged 200 to 250 to-go meals per night. The club never reduced hours of play but did increase tee times out to 10-minute intervals and

eliminate guest days and shotgun starts. While tournaments were held, no gathering was permitted afterward so results were emailed to members. Ironwood is currently back to full staff and Tanner says more rounds of golf are being played now than ever before.

He thinks the pandemic's lasting effects will ultimately be good for golf in the Coachella Valley—especially as businesses

learn that working from home is productive, which impacts far more than golf. "We've seen an increase in membership and home sales within the gates of Ironwood and the surrounding communities. Typically, there would be 60 homes for sale within Ironwood; there are currently 13. We've also seen a significant increase in young families moving to the desert and joining private clubs."

Brian Simpson, director of sales and marketing at Desert Willow Golf Resort, points out that the two months during which golf courses closed last spring due to the pandemic are typically the busiest months of the year. Fortunately, golf proved well-suited to the new world of social distancing and that made all the difference. "Our July 2020 rounds were up over 33%. Our August rounds were up 50%. Interest in golf continues to be strong."

As a public facility, Desert Willow has a loyalty program, which has proved very popular. "Our Platinum Club actually sold out in 2020," Simpson says.

He agrees that the pandemic has presented opportunities but cautions it's up to clubs to capitalize on them. "Golf is a great escape. It's four hours outdoors, away from the noise of the freeway and news cycle. While many new golfers may have started to play during the pandemic, it's up to the courses to provide a welcoming onramp and dynamic programming to keep them engaged for years to come."

At Desert Willow that translates to running engaging golf clinics, creating loyalty programs with pricing incentives such as \$25 per round starting June 1. "In the 24-year history of our resort, we've never seen such great demand for lessons. Our nine PGA golf professionals have been extremely busy helping players improve. We're projecting this summer to be quite



From April 1-4, Rancho Mirage, Calif.'s Mission Hills Country Club will be hosting the 50th edition of the LPGA Tour's first major of the year—the ANA Inspiration.

Like last year, when the tournament was rescheduled to September, due to COVID-19, fans won't be able to attend again, as the tournament, in close collaboration with partners like ANA, the City of Rancho Mirage, the LPGA and Mission Hills Country Club, is striving to ensure spectator safety first and foremost. In addition, the tournament consulted with the Riverside County Health Department, which is following the State of California Public Health Department guidelines.

However, fans can still enjoy every moment of the tournament in various ways, as it will not only be televised on Golf Channel and Sky Sports, but content, concerning the latest tournament news, will also be available on its social media pages (@ANAinspiration) and website (ANAinspiration.com).

Unlike last year's tournament, amateurs will not be competing this year though, as the two amateurs who were invited (2020 U.S. Women's Amateur champion Rose Zhang and 2020 British Women's Amateur champion Aline Krauter) have decided to not compete.

"The ANA Inspiration has a long history of celebrating the world's top amateur competitors and providing them with the opportunity to compete in a major championship," says Heather Daly-Donofrio, LPGA chief tour operations officer. "To broaden competition opportunities for LPGA Tour members as we continue to deal with COVID-19 and to ensure a manageable field size, the 2021 tournament has limited invitations to the reigning U.S. Women's Amateur and British Women's Amateur champions."

Due to these limitations and policies, the ANA Inspiration has been able to maintain its usual schedule as the first major championship of the LPGA Tour's season though, thereby ensuring players are able to compete in more comfortable weather conditions than last year (when the temperatures were roughly



100 degrees). Not to mention, Mission Hills Country Club's course conditions will be pristine as well.

This year, the course's renowned 18th island green—which is surrounded by Champions Lake and the world-famous Poppie's Pond, the concrete-lined pool named after former tournament director Terry Wilcox, known primarily for tournament champions' dives after their victories (a consistent tradition since the mid-1990s)—won't have any sponsor's walls, so it will look virtually the same way it did during the inaugural tournament in 1972.

In fact, last year, many golfers used the big blue sponsor's wall (originally designed to mimic where the fan hospitality area would typically be) behind the green on the par-5 18th as a backstop, so that they could carry the water that's in front of it.

One such player was 2020 champion Mirim Lee, who bounced her second shot off of the sponsor's wall during the final round and then holed out for an eagle three, resulting in a playoff with Brooke Henderson and Nelly Korda, whom she then beat with a five-foot birdie putt on the first playoff hole.

Upon earning her first major championship, Lee, who is from South Korea, joined the likes of World Golf Hall of Fame members who have also won the ANA Inspiration, including legends such as Betsy King, Nancy Lopez, Annika Sorenstam, Kathy Whitworth and Mickey Wright.





Aside from joining these world-class players as ANA Inspiration champions, Lee, who had claimed her fourth LPGA Tour victory, also received "The Dinah Shore Trophy", which was named after Dinah Shore, a film, recording and television star who had a considerable influence on the LPGA. Comprised of 100 percent sterling silver and weighing approximately 25 pounds, the trophy was designed in the early 1980s and presented to tournament winners by Shore until her passing in 1994.

"I can't wait to return to Rancho Mirage as the defending champion," Lee states. "It will be wonderful to be back there as soon as possible and have the chance to relive all the happy memories and feelings of winning there last year."

She adds, "We are all very grateful to ANA, the LPGA, IMG, Mission Hills, Rancho Mirage and all the partners for working so hard to make it possible for us to play the year's first major as scheduled."

Australian Open

Novak Djokovic and Naomi Osaka made history once again

Tor the ninth time in his career, Novak Djokovic appeared in the finals of the Australian Open. And, as he had during his previous eight appearances, he won yet again.

Defeating 25-year-old Daniil Medvedev (who was appearing in his second major final, as he was also a US Open finalist in 2019) 7-5, 6-2, 6-2 in cool conditions on Rod Laver Arena, Djokovic's record-extending victory (and third in a row), prompted praise from Jim Courier.

hours and 25 minutes less on the court than Djokovic). Medvedev had much less pressure too.

"I like that I don't have a lot of pressure, because he never lost in eight times that he was here in the final," Medvedev stated prior to the final. "It's him who has all the pressure he has, for sure, more experience, but more things to lose than me [too]."

After Djokovic's victory, he shared his admiration for Medvedey, along with some of his other younger opponents.



"Since these courts have turned blue [in 2008 when the Australian Open replaced its green Rebound Ace courts with blue Plexicushion], he's played 15 matches against top-five players," Courier, a four-time Grand Slam champion, said. "And he's won 15 of them."

The match, which was completed in 1 hour and 53 minutes, led to Djokovic's 18th Grand Slam triumph, just two shy of Roger Federer's and Rafael Nadal's record totals. Due to Federer's and Nadal's injuries (right knee and back, respectively), their records certainly appear to be within reach now too.

Overcoming Obstacles, Appreciating Tomorrow's Stars

Aside from the history involved with the victory, it was even more remarkable considering Djokovic's opponent, a rising star who was healthier than him (as Djokovic had an abdominal injury during various matches after being hurt during his third-round win against Taylor Fritz) and fresher than him (Medvedev had spent 4

"Medvedev was definitely a guy to beat today. I mean, 20-match winning streak," he stressed. "Tsitsipas, Zverev, Medvedev, they all won World Tour Finals, multiple Masters 1000 events and [have a] high ranking. They have all contested in semis and finals of slams, so it's just a matter of time."

Aside from battling Medvedev, Djokovic also had to encounter various off-court issues, including his injury, along with quarantines, leading him to describe the 2021 Australian Open as "emotionally the most challenging Grand Slam" he had ever had, as he had overcome a "roller coaster ride".

"It was very challenging for me to keep my mind serene. I have put a lot of energy and time, along with my team, to be here sitting with a trophy," he said. "So I'll take a lot of positives out of this month here in Australia."

He continued, "I would like to thank this court. I would like to thank Rod Laver Arena. I love you each year more and more—the love affair keeps going."



Osaka Claims Fourth Grand Slam

At the same time, Naomi Osaka also made history, as she joined just two other players during the Open era-Roger Federer and Monica Seles—by winning her first four Grand Slam finals. The winner of the 2018 US Open, the 2019 Australian Open and the 2020 US Open, the 23-year-old star, ranked number three in the world at the time, defeated Jennifer Brady (ranked No. 24) 6-4, 6-3 for the 2021 Australian Open crown, and her 21st consecutive match victory.

The match, which lasted one hour and 17 minutes, was her 10th career finals appearance, resulting in a 12-0 record in Grand Slam quarterfinals, semifinals and finals. Prior to the finals victory, she had saved two match points against Garbine Muguruza and defeated Su-Wei Hsieh and Serena Williams as well.

"I'd like to congratulate Naomi on another Grand Slam title," Brady said after the match. "She's such an inspiration to us all and what she is doing for the game is amazing in getting the sport out there. I hope young girls at home are watching and are inspired by what she is doing."

She continued, while referring to the trophy, "Hopefully I'm on this stage next time with this girl over here."


Brady's words rang especially true, as Osaka has actually discussed her interest in inspiring others.

"I feel like the biggest thing I want to achieve is hopefully I play long enough to play a girl that said that I was once her favorite player," Osaka stressed. "I think that's the coolest thing that could ever happen to me."



An Induction for Nine Female Trailblazers

After changing women's tennis forever in 1970, the Original 9 will be inducted into the International Tennis Hall of Fame.





n September 23, 1970, the Original 9-comprised of seven Americans (Peaches Bartkowicz, Rosie Casals, Julie Heldman, Billie Jean King, Kristy Pigeon, Nancy Richey and Valerie Ziegenfuss) and two Australians (Judy Tegart Dalton and Kerry Melville Reid)—signed \$1 contracts with World Tennis Magazine publisher Gladys Heldman.

The contract, created due to the disparity in prize money and playing opportunities between men and women, resulted in the creation of a new tournament for women only: the Virginia Slims Invitational. Won by Casals, the tournament, which was hosted at the Houston Racquet Club, also led to the formation of the Virginia Slims Circuit in 1971, along with the WTA Tour in 1973.

Due to the Original 9's boldness and sacrifice (participating in countless clinics, media events and pro-ams, as they continued to overcome prejudices), the WTA Tour now has more than 50 events in approximately 30 countries, leading to over \$150 million in prize money. And female tennis players are typically the wealthiest female athletes in the world. To compare, when Casals captured the Virginia Slims Invitational, she earned \$1,600, which was considered a high sum at the time.

For their longstanding influence, the International Tennis Hall of Fame's Voting Group (comprised of Hall of Famers, historians and media members)—alongside various fans who also voted decided to reward the Original 9 as the first group inducted in the Contributor Category, which was previously only awarded to

"It's extremely rewarding to see the impact the Original 9 made 50 years ago can still be felt around the world today," says Billie Jean King, who has already been inducted into the International Tennis Hall of Fame on an individual basis, alongside Casals and Richey. "We're all so excited because of what we went through together."

Stressing that the Original 9 was "willing to give up [their] careers for the rest of [their] lives and never play again for this opportunity to start something", King, who founded the WTA Tour, added that there were three key goals they hoped to achieve.

"Number one, that any girl born in this world would have a place to play and compete. Number two, that women would be appreciated for our accomplishments, not just our looks," she states. "And number three, that women would finally be able to make a living playing professional tennis."

Casals agrees with King's sentiment, adding that the Original 9 could have easily quit back then. Yet, instead, they were very courageous. And, in turn, people began to not only pay attention to female athletes, but truly respect their talents and achievements.




"The impact we made was that, yes, we can—we can do this. We can earn a living. We can have a career in sports," Casals explains. "History speaks for itself when you look at what the WTA is now and where it's come from."

The Induction Ceremony for the Class of 2021 (the Original 9, two-time Grand Slam champion Lleyton Hewitt and legendary coach Dennis Van der Meer) is scheduled for July 17 at Newport, R.I.'s International Tennis Hall of Fame. Due to COVID-19, the Class of 2020 (Conchita Martinez and Goran Ivanisevic) will also be honored.


"We are moving forward with plans for a terrific celebration to honor not just one, but two inspiring induction classes of Hall of Fame greats," says Todd Martin, CEO, International Tennis Hall of Fame. "Skn in the Game"

Campaign Launched Globally to Combat Skin Cancer

Join your fellow golfers in this critical fight

What you don't know can kill you.

At no time is that truer than when you're talking about skin cancer, the most prevalent cancer in the world—and the one with the fewest organizations and accessible resources behind it.

One group is on a mission to change that, and education, technology and science-based information are the tools they're wielding.

SknVue is a nonprofit (approval is nearing completion) working with a host of well-known partners to change dire statistics related to skin cancer—a cancer that's particularly relevant in the golf industry given that day in and day out PGA and LPGA Tour pros play the game outdoors and often under harsh sun, as do many golfing amateurs and weekend warrior across the globe.

Fact: Full sun is not the only danger. Being outdoors on a cloudy day without proper protection is equally high risk for skin cancer.

Not only is skin cancer the most prevalent cancer, it's also increasing. In 2016 one person died every 59 minutes of skin cancer; today, that number is two people each hour, yet skin cancer is the most curable of all cancers. So why aren't more of these deaths being prevented?

Dan Mechem, chairman and co-founder of Skn Vue, believes it comes down in large part to education and access to meaningful resources and tools, and that's exactly what Mechem and co-founder and CEO Randy Wyant plan to put directly into the hands of people everywhere.

Although they're focusing first on domestic outreach, the goal from the start has been to go global, something they say no other organization related to skin cancer has done. They've already partnered with the LPGA, and a cadre of industry veterans sit on SknVue's board, including Dottie Pepper, Nancy Lopez, Juli Inkster, Helen Alfredsson, Andy North and Randy Jones. The organization has also garnered support from skin-cancer survivors, including Charles S. Mechem, Jr., former commissioner of the LPGA and Dan's father. Eventually the plan is to connect with partners on the European and Asian tours, among others.

"We'll be reaching out to a broad mosaic of partners," Dan Mechem says. "But we're putting our domestic program into place first."

The group has already launched its first campaign, Skn in the Game, which aims to get the message out about the danger of skin cancer and how to prevent it. "Skn in the Game is an immediate, urgent global call-to-action campaign



for everyone to pay attention to their skin wellness," Wyant says.

May is Skin Cancer Awareness Month, the perfect time to launch a new fundraising and awareness effort they're calling, A Dollar A Day In May. Mechem hopes everyone will give at least \$31 (just one dollar a day), which will put free skincancer apps in the hands of five people. Donations of \$50 to \$500 help provide services for those who can't afford them, from a telemedicine consult with a skincancer specialist to a complete skin-cancer screening and more.

This is just the start. It's too early to talk specifics about future initiatives, but they'll collectively push to get solid information and cutting-edge technology for skincancer detection into the hands of individuals. Mechem and Wyant want to empower golfers and others by providing them with the tools they need to direct their own well-being.

One element of Skn Vue's forthcoming program is something they're calling Skn Stories, featuring golf pros and others telling their personal and powerful stories about skin cancer. The organization is working on social media, videos, podcasts and marketing programs to promote these efforts. Mechem is particularly excited about these stories, which he believes can be transformative for the audience. May be that's because for him, skin cancer is very

In 2020 his best friend died of the disease, very quickly; he had never even been to see a dermatologist. And his father had several surgeries to remove cancerous cells, which fortunately were caught early. Additionally, Mechem says, "It turns out a lot of first responders from 9/11 have skin cancer from various chemicals they were exposed to. Some have already died and some are dying now."

Skin cancer is insidious but knowledge can halt its advance. Wyant, who has been in the healthcare industry for decades, points to examples of critical facts many people don't know. "Some sunscreens have chemicals in them that actually damage your skin," he says. "Some people think you get benefits from tanning beds and they won't harm you—not true. There are diagnostic tools used by doctors in other countries that aren't widely used here because of our fee-based system, meaning doctors don't get reimbursed for using them so they don't."

The good news is that technology, programs and resources exist that




everyday people can use to protect themselves from skin cancer and the folks at Skn Vue want them to be available in one easy, accessible place. How exactly that rolls out will be revealed over the coming months but think of it as a survival kit loaded with powerful but simple tools that can keep you from becoming a statistic in this very treatable disease, tools to ultimately turn the tide on skin cancer's deadly advance.

Mechem doesn't mince words. Our goal with this Dollar a Day in May campaign is to reach out to people and say, "Donate. You can help us save lives." Over the long term, he says, "We believe we can—and we will—save thousands of lives with this organization and this campaign."

Today I felt like giving you two fun feeling golf putting drills. The gate drill (repetition drill) & the pile drill (random drill)

1st Putting Drill: "gates"

You will need: 2-4 tees & 3 golf balls (If you are doing this indoors : replace tees with place solo cups upside down)

1st set of gates: You will place 2 golf tees just wider than your putter. I leave about 1" on each side of the putter to allow for the putter & ball to go through .

I feel like starting out at 10 feet - work longer (15, 20ft) You can place the gates any place you feel on the target line. For this one, I feel like working on my path, so I'm placing the gates about 4" in front of the ball. (See photos of set up)

The goal is to feel a square face & square path as you start the ball rolling on your start line.

If your putting stroke is "open" (toe of the putter facing the right) the ball will roll off line. (See photos)

If your putting stroke is "closed" (toe of the putter facing the left) again your golf ball will not start on the intended starting line.



Keep working on it until the ball & putter feel like they are going through the center of the gates (not getting to close to either

For intermediate - advances golfers: add a 2nd gate

You might feel like you want to add a "second gate" (can be any width that you feel 3" wide or ball width)

Place your 2nd gate at the high point of the break or about 1 feet away from the hole.

The 2nd gate can help you feel the break speed or high point in a putt. If your putt doesn't get to your second gate, feel it out... was it aim? Was it speed? Was it read wrong? Was it stroke? Adjust and repeat as needed.

Putting Drill #2: Pile Game (see photos)

You will need: 3 tees & 9 golf balls

This is a random putting drill. It feels more realistic to real golf.

Place "3 piles of 3 balls " in:

- · 3 different distances (small, medium & large) I chose 2 feet, 10 feet & 15 feet
- · 3 different angles to the hole (each pile has a direct line to the same hole) You can play the pile game 2 different ways: putt all 3 then move to another pile, repeat until done

Or you might putt 1 ball, move to another pile & repeat

The next round, pick up your golf balls & make 3 new "piles of 3 balls") (different distances & different angles to that same

This round might be 5 feet, 15, 30 feet. This is why I love the feel of random golf drills, it moves you around & created a realistic feel.

Round 3, pick a different hole or add major breaking putts

Repeat and have fun. Both these drills you can putt on your own or with a spouse or friend.

Make putting fun feeling. I hope you enjoy the gate drill & pile drill. Come join me at SilverRock in LaQuinta!





Aston Martin Valkyrie

It's hyper price, hyper speed, and hyper design are unprecedented





f you've ever wanted to know the feeling of raw power, you can now for a cool \$3.5 million. Yes, the Aston Martin Valkyrie is the ▲ latest hypercar to hit the market. It's hyper price, hyper speed, and hyper design are unprecedented.

The Valkyrie took nothing for granted in the design process, which has been touted with the release of prototypes for nearly three years. It's curves would make Marilyn Monroe look like a skinny schoolgirl. It's technology and engineering puts everything else on the second shelf. In partnership with Red Bull Racing, Aston Martin took aim at developing a car that mirrors a Formula One platform but could qualify as street legal in countries the world over. The result is jaw dropping.

The Valkyrie's powertrain is a Cosworth-built, naturally aspirated 6.5-liter V12 engine. This main engine is paired with an electric motor to add power boost — because someone in a design meeting decided the V12 wasn't adequate. The V12 puts out a mere 1,000 horsepower. You should read that again, it's outrageous. The electric motor adds another 160 horsepower. That's a grand total of 1,160 horsepower. Peak output clips the redline at 11,100 RPM. Unthinkable.

The Valkyrie does all this with a curb weight that is anything but bulky. The engine weighs under 500 pounds; most riding lawn mowers weigh more than that. The entire chasis is made without one steel component. Each carbon fiber member of the frame utilizes essential components of the vehicle to add strength and support. Both the engine and gearbox casing act as stressed members of the vehicle structure. The gearbox provides mounting brackets for the rear suspension, while also helping provide even greater structural rigidity and eliminating the weight of an additional rear subframe. The entire vehicle weighs in at around 2,400 pounds.

Aston Martin has yet to release official performance numbers but you go to the bank on the fact that it will have a 0-60 mph time in the low 2 seconds. As for top speed, it will undoubtedly be limited by some stick in the mud government official somewhere who has no heart. However, Aston Martin is releasing 25 models of the Valkyrie that are not street legal but restricted only to the track.

In early testing, eight-time Grand Prix winner Max Verstappen came away elated by his first laps in the Valkyrie. "To be one of the



first guys to drive an insane car like this was really exciting," he said. "It was amazing to get a first taste of it."

All the aerodynamic work put into the roller coaster body serves up downforce that is essential in taking corners at high speeds and staying on pavement instead of lifting off. In fact, the roof is used as an air-intake and pushes the car hard into the ground, making a rear window impossible. But who needs a rear window when you have downforce. Side mirrors are jettisoned for cameras that send a video image to screens mounted to the A pillars inside the cabin.

Driver and passenger are equipped with four-point harnesses and sit reclined like a F1 driver. A six-point harness is optional. The gull-wing style doors give the car a truly elegant look while the wheel wells that arch skyward reflect the fact that this thing is a rocket. Inside a simple OLED display gives all the information you need; just the essentials.

Sadly, all 150 models slated for production are spoken for in 2022. However, if you have an extra \$3.5 million burning a hole in your pocket, there's always next year.
