





ary Player's accolades on Yani Tseng's 2011 season are memorable: "It is arguably the best story, but hasn't received the coverage it deserves. The 22-year-old Taiwanese dominated the game winning 12 tournaments including two Majors, was ranked No.1 in the world for 43 consecutive weeks and had the second highest annual LPGA winnings in Tour history. Most players never reach 12 wins in their careers...."



At 22, Tseng is the youngest player, male or female, to win five Majors. Who is this 22-year-old phenomenon with the nickname Nini? For one thing, she's a travel lover. She tries to do some sightseeing wherever she plays so she can learn about the people and their culture.

"Ilove trying different foods and dining out; finding cafés on a river or a beach is great," Tseng exclaims. "Paris is a favorite of mine. For vacation, I love being at home, too, as I travel so much. The Maldives interest me—a house on sticks over the water, but I worry as I can't swim! Venice is another place."

After her 2011 LPGA Championship victory, Tseng took off with friends for Niagara Falls. She also brought her mother, Yu-Yan Yang, to Evian for the 2011 Evian Masters. "Mom was so excited, her first time there and in France. We went on the boat to Lausanne," Tseng says. "And there was some shopping, too, with all the tempting French fashions."

Tseng has had a relationship with Lacoste since the beginning of her career. She loves the company's color palette—particularly purple, orange and green (her favorite color). "I always wear pink now on Sundays, starting this year," she confides. "I feel confident with Lacoste's clothes, and they make me look skinnier."

When not on the course, Tseng's casual look is jeans and Tshirts. For galas, she prefers pants or leggings. Off the course, she's also a cool pool player and says she would have been a pro had she not made it on the links. She even practices pool on the greens—with a putter and a golfball!

After several years in Beaumont, Calif., living near her sister, Tseng started apartment hunting in Florida for easier travelling. Annika Sorenstam, who was Tseng's idol, heard she was looking and suggested her home at Lake Nona. Tseng's first response was no, she couldn't afford it. "But Dad told me to buy it," she says, and as soon as she saw the house she loved it. "Annika told me that she knew the first time I was there that I would buy it. It's great. I feel comfortable, relaxed. I have a great view of the 16th hole and the Lake."

Tseng loves having friends over, playing pool, then going to the movies or singing karaoke. Not surprising, the game room is her favorite room. It has a pool table, ping-pong and her gym. And she loves her "Sing a Song at Home" karaoke machine with over 1,000 songs.

Another plus of the house: Sorenstam's trophy cases, which Tseng saw as so big and so empty when she first purchased the home. "They are my motivator," she laughs. "[I want to] to fill them up again." Tseng is moving quickly, and at this rate she may have to add more

2011 was Tseng's fourth year on Tour, and the year the LPGA staged its first event in Taiwan. The winner was Tseng, and enormous crowds flocked daily to see her play. Only time will tell, but Tseng very well could be the spark for Taiwanese golf that Se Ri Pak was for golfin her native South Korea.



With a busy schedule, Tseng has only limited time with family and friends. But when she does get home, the trip always includes a visit to Cash Box, a well-known dinner studio. "I go at dinner time for three to four hours," Tseng says. "Its fun, famous with great BBQ chicken and beef, and singing!"

Tseng has already accomplished much in her 22 years, but she still has a few things on her bucket list, including skydiving and winning the U.S. Open. For 2012, Tseng says she wants to get better, improve her game and win more tournaments, Majors and the U.S. Open.

Watch for the Tigress of Taiwan; great golf is guaranteed, and the way things are going for her, she's likely to accomplish all that she wants to.

Kraft Nabisco Championship 2012

Where golf and a quick swim are the stuff of tradition

ome golf events offer large galleries, which infuse the tournament's atmosphere and field with passion and electricity. But at the Kraft Nabisco Championship, it's the enthusiasm and energy of the players that electrifies the galleries.

"There's just an excitement during this tournament that's different because the players are so excited to be here," says fairways when they think of the Kraft Nabisco. What they can't feel from their Barcaloungers is the intensity of the players, their single-minded focus on winning what could be the LPGA's most prestigious title. It's the players' passion that ignites the galleries and produces the unique environment at the KNC.

Not that the excitement can't be appreciated from long-distance. It can leap from the television and grip fans regardless of their proximity to the Mission Hills Country Club, like when Karrie Webb holed out on the famous par 5 No. 18 to win in 2006, or when Brittany Lincicome made eagle in the final round on No. 18 to win in 2010, or when 2011 champion Stacy Lewis holed an improbable birdie putt on the par 3 No. 17 en route to her leap into Poppie's Pond.

This year's Kraft Nabisco will be held March 26-April 2. The Dinah Shore course, designed by Desmond Muirhead in 1972, is another aspect of the championship's draw, another reason the Kraft Nabisco is an event every player wants to play in and grows up dreaming of winning. And the golf holes aren't the only compelling experience.

"Most of the gals on tour now grew up watching all the players jump in the pond. When Yani Tseng was here doing the media tour last year she said, 'When I was a young girl I dreamed of growing up and coming here and jumping in this lake,' Codding says. "And that struck me. I said you know, we've got a generation of golfers who know nothing but the jump, even though it's only 20 years old and the tournament is 40 years old. All they know is they win, they get to jump in the pond and they get a robe."

One organizational aspect Codding and his staff never have to worry about is building the best field the LPGA can



tournament director Gabe Codding, now in his 16th year as a member of the tournament staff. "There's a passion level that's almost electric, because the players are almost giddy, like they've arrived at something so great and so prestigious and they're so happy to be here.

"Mike Whan told me a couple of years ago, 'You know, Gabe, yours is probably the only event where the players' excitement to be there outweighs the fans' excitement to be there and see them," said Codding. "It's unique to the game of golf, as far as I can tell."

The incomparable atmosphere is created not only by the players' enthusiasm, but also the tournament's rich history, the acclaimed Mission Hills Country Club Dinah Shore Tournament Course in Rancho Mirage where it all takes place, and the championship's nuanced traditions that add up to the sum. Many watching television sets around the world think of the lilting palm trees, the warm desert breezes, and the barren, rugged mountainscapes surrounding green

offer. As one of the LPGA's major championships, players must first meet one of the criteria for gaining a position in the field, such as top tournament finishes, top 80 on the previous year's money list, past champion status, being a member of the Solheim Cup team, or top 20 and ties from last year's Kraft Nabisco. Those guidelines assure the top players will be eligible, and every one of them shows up not only wanting to play but wanting to win.

"When you look at the history and tradition I mean, Mickey Wright walked the same fairways that Morgan Pressell and Yani Tseng walk today. It's an amazing event to work for," Codding says. "So to be at this kind of level in this sport is an absolute honor."



ission Hills Country Club, in Rancho Mirage, Calif., sports a list of amenities that is long and lush: 54 superb holes of championship golf, outstanding facilities, an abundance of nonstop activities and dining and social opportunities throughout the year. With nonequity memberships, dues remain stable without assessments and there's no minimum for club dining. But benefits go above and literally beyond with its Mission Hills Optimal Network Experiences (ONE) membership. The comprehensive plan includes half-off à la carte club dining, and reciprocal agreements with ClubCorp's network of more than 200 upper-echelon private clubs and resorts, plus 700 fine restaurants and hotels worldwide. Travel possibilities are endless. Club reps say members often spend a luxurious golf weekend in nearby cities at minimal expense. Others have embarked on cross-country, stadium-hopping jaunts for baseball, with complimentary golf and dining.

ffectionately known as "Frank's little party in the desert," the growth and grandeur of the Sinatra Starkey Hearing Foundation Celebrity Invitational would provide "Ol' Blue Eyes" opportunity to croon proud if the legend could witness what the event has become today.

Now entering its 24th year, the annual three-day golf and gala, founded and chaired by Barbara Sinatra, has grown into one of Southern California's most desert every year. It's rare that charity events are three days of parties and two days of golf—it's just a very glamorous event."

With a line of celebrity participants and alumni long enough to stretch a red carpet back to L.A., the tournament has contributed over \$7 million to the endowment of the Barbara Sinatra Children's Center at the Eisenhower Medical Center in Rancho Mirage, Calif. The Barbara Sinatra Children's Center provides counseling for victims of physical, sexual and emotional child abuse, seeing approximately 180 kids

The 2012 event takes place from Thursday through Saturday, March 1-3, and is being held at Fantasy Springs Resort Casino in Indio. Joining Mrs. Sinatra as cohost is film and television star Kevin Sorbo, and Tom Dreesen returns for his annual gig as tournament emcee.

"Even though Frank has been gone, his supporters and friends are still supporting this tournament," says tournament director Mary Martin. "We've moved around to some different places but it's still one of the premier events held out in the

trimmings of the weekend, the pros will duel for a \$10,000 purse on each of the two days. Payouts are awarded to the top five finishers on each day of play, with the top pro receiving a \$4,000 purse on both Friday and Saturday. Second place receives \$2,500, while the third place finisher is awarded \$2,000.

The four amateurs playing alongside their club pro duel in a team scramble while the pro plays his own ball. Prizes are awarded for the daily scramble Pro-Am winner as well as the overall champion recognized by the cumulative, two-day winning score. A traveling trophy has been crafted that will go to the winning club each year.

Martin envisions the added format enhancing the tournament's scope and goodwill. "A lot of our players have been coming for years




from worldwide locations," the tournament director says. "With our Celebrity Invitational field filling up, we wanted to be able to bring more money into the charity through a Pro-am."

With a host of local desert and Southern California clubs meshing with outstate competition, Martin anticipates firm turf for the Pro-Am's future. "We want to see what the response is and then come back next year bigger and better."








ou can play this course without hitting a single house and not necessarily because you're a great golfer but because there are no houses, a rarity on courses these

The distinct feel of The Classic Club is enhanced by it being in one of golfs quintessential desert communities but lacking the cliché desert features. No palm trees, no astronomical green fees and nothing but good golf and service found here. The Classic Club's staffis about one thing: making your experience world-class.

The Classic Club was one of four courses in the rotation of the Bob Hope Classic on the PGA Tour until 2009. The Club got a bad rap from PGA Tour professionals, and one left-handed major winner in particular who will remain nameless, who complained about high winds being a problem. The loss of a Tour event didn't faze the Classic Club; instead, management refocused and bolstered the level of service, only adding to the club's stature as one of the jewels in Palm Desert's crown.


The course is professional on every level. When it opened in 2006, Golfweek named it one of the Top 5 Best New Courses. That began a sandstorm of accolades including another Golfweek ranking as the No.7 Best Course in California (between Pebble Beach and Torrey Pines). A 2007 redesign to give it a bit more teeth



for the pros added length and some variety. And two par 3s, No. 6 and No. 17, have two sets of tee boxes, so golfers can play them as entirely different holes on different rounds.

If it isn't pretentious to consider a few holes comparable to "Amen Corner" at Augusta National, then The Classic Club has a similar series of challenges in 10 through 12. There's plenty of water on No. 10, making a wild drive a real problem and an errant approach wet. The water continues on No. 11, where you must

challenge it. The 12th is guarded like the crown jewels by water and bunkers.

The par-5 14th is a good hole to think about birdie or eagle at 560 yards from the tips. The 15th is drivable if you unload on it at 349 yards (at its longest) and makes for some interesting risk-reward decisions. The par-5 finishing hole gives players a good chance at birdie, rewarding gutsy short irons into the green.

The course is fair but tough. It has a slope rating of 144 from the back tees and a course rating over 75. The USGA expects a scratch golfer to shoot over par on this big dog. It isn't overly long at 7,322 yards but the presence of so much water in the desert makes it a brute. A good shot is fairly rewarded plain and simple. Classic.

The Arnold Palmer layout is owned by the H.N. Berger Foundation so rates are low and charities get especially sweet deals on tournaments. Rates through April are \$129 including a \$15 lunch voucher and commemorative golf towel. Resident rates are even less. You'll feel like a bandito after playing a round, eating lunch and riding off into the sunset with this experience under your belt.

A 63,000-square-foot clubhouse with two restaurants and a wine bar set the pace for the rest of the facility. More than 150




bottles and 30 wines by the glass make an evening exciting. The Bellatrix serves elegant meals while the Classic Grill is what you'd expect for lunch or an early dinner after a round. A beautiful outdoor seating area is perfect for private events such as weddings and parties.

Bottom line: Don't miss a thing. Try the Classic Club. For more information call 760.601.3600 or log onto classicclubgolf.com

Warburton says, "Absolutely, my main concern is that everyone has a great time. Last year, people said they had more fun than at any other tournament in a long time. The board is fantastic and I'm thankful for all the volunteers. They're the ones who made it go so smoothly.

"I like the way we're set up with the

Warburton says, "St. Jude has an impact on the life of anybody who walks through those doors. The whole vibe you get is very special. Your first impression is seeing a lot of children without hair and you know that's the result of chemo. You know there is suffering, but a lot seem to be enjoying themselves. [The staff make] sure they're living life and their spirits are up as much as they can be. The work includes treatments and therapy so effective that cure rates have gone up dramatically throughout the decade. Knowing it takes \$1.7 million a day to open the hospital doors, it's easy to want to give and donate."

St. Jude reaches out across the country, including to Coachella Valley children who receive treatment there. Rheney grew up in Memphis and volunteered at the hospital in high school. "You've got to have passion about what you're doing. As parents, we all think, 'There but for the grace of God go I."

Understanding Your Alignment Trends You may think you know how to line up properly, but chances are good you may not

he next time you are on the practice tee with one of your buddies, ask him this question: "Where are you aiming?" Sometimes he'll say, "I don't know," or give you a general area in which he believes he is aiming. Other times he might give you a specific target, which is better than the first answer. Now as he set up to his shot, look where he is ACTUALLY aiming in reference to where he BELIEVES he is aiming and watch where a few of his shots go.

If you have ever see a player on the practice tee who lines up differently than where he is mentally aiming, you can understand where swing flaws like "over the top" and "excessive hand action" through impact originate from! The downswing flaws are reactions to the poor alignment at address. The body knows it is lined up incorrectly and is doing all it can to push, pull or curve the ball back toward your mentally selected target.

Whenever I point this out to someone during a lesson I usually get the following response: "Oh, I wasn't really taking my time aiming or paying attention." Which leads me to ask the follow-up question, "Then how do you expect to hit the ball where you want it to go?" I then ask them to line up and pay attention to where they are aiming and to hit the same shot. And you can bet the same poor alignment occurs more often than not, even though most students believe they knows how to line up properly.

All golfers struggle with alignment over time—Tiger, Bubba, me, you. It is hard to line up something from the side as we do in golf, so building a practice station is a must when you practice in order to always give your body the information it needs to build a repetitive and consistent swing motion.



A Sample "Practice Station

First you will need to buy several reflector sticks from a hardware store (as shown above), the type of sticks that you would place along the edges of your driveway so people don't drive on your grass when it snows. We will use three sticks to build your practice station.

- · The Target-Line Stick. Align this stick directly at the flag on the green you are trying to hit. This is your target-line, and in a perfect world the ball would sit on top of this line as you hit it, just like it would sit on the stripe on a road aimed at your target.
- \cdot The Body Alignment Stick: Place the inside stick parallel to your ball's target line stick as shown above. This will be the line your feet, knees, hips, forearms and shoulders will be set on.


Wait you say, my body isn't aiming at the flag! It's aimed parallel left of my target, is this correct? This is the "idea" of alignment that 99 percent of my students have. But remember, if you turn your body to aim at the flag, then the ball's target line will be parallel to that, placing your ball's actual aim out to the right of where you are trying to hit.

If this persists, you will grow tired of hanging the ball out to the right and one of two things will happen: 1) you will begin to come over the top so you can "pull" the ball back towards your target or 2) you will start to hit an exaggerated hook by rolling your hands through impact trying to curve the ball back to the pin.



In order to make the ball curve and/or hit special shots from time to time, you will aim your body across your target line; however, in most cases we would prefer that you stay parallel until you can master that fundamental.

· The Ball Position Stick: Place a stick between your feet at 90 degrees to your body alignment stick to mark where you will place the ball. When I place this stick people instantly understand where their actual ball position is in relation to their feet. The hard thing is that when you begin to aim your body to the left or right of your ball's target line, you will find that it gives you a false impression of where the ball is in your stance.



Making sure that your ball, body and the ball's position are correlated is the KEY to building a consistent swing. I would bet that 75 percent of the people who come to see me for swing issues are incorrectly lined up, which can cause a host of issues. If you are hitting the ball poorly, begin by building a practice station and I bet you will "find" your swing once again.

or over 40 years, Coachella Valley residents and visitors have driven past Sunnylands in Rancho Mirage, Calif., the famous presidential escape and residence of the late Ambassador Walter Annenberg and his wife Leonore. Stately pink, yes pink, walls brought attention to a lifestyle behind those walls only few would ever experience. Yet we continued to wonder, dream and imagine ourselves passing through the guarded gates to celebrate an occasion with the Annenbergs and their guest list of presidents, royalty and celebrities.

The time has come to shed the mystique of the past. On February 11 and 12, an invitation-only formal dedication



well as the new Sunnylands Center & Gardens, is poised to make a new history. The project, the vision of Mrs. Annenberg who worked on it until her passing in 2009 at the age of 91, includes a \$35 million revitalization of the estate and restoration of the golf course to its original design. The Center & Gardens are completely new and environmentally sensitive.

Solely owned and operated by the Annenberg Foundation Trust at Sunnylands, the Retreat was established by the Annenbergs as a venue in which dignitaries, including the President of the United States and the Secretary of State, could host small, high-level retreats. The purpose of these retreats is to bring world leaders from the fields of government, philanthropy, education and the arts together to advance international peace and increase global understanding. "Another Annenberg gift to the nation," so aptly states Mary Perry, media and community relations for Sunnylands.

The airy state-of-the-art Sunnylands Center is the first jaw-dropping point of entry for visitors. Guests come into the Great Room, designed by Mrs. Annenberg to evoke a living room, though few living rooms are this large and house an original Rodin. The room has floor-to-ceiling windows that offer a stunning and unobstructed view of Mt. San Jacinto. Free Wi-Fi is available, and



there's a café, gift shop, theater and gallery. The center sits on 15 acres, nine of which are gardens boasting 54,000 individual plants of 40 different varieties, as well as more than a mile of walking trails—all free to the public.

The estate remains behind the pink walls and guarded gates. This 25,000-square-foot mid-century modern masterpiece was completed in 1966 and used by the Annenbergs approximately five months out of the year. There are two guest wings, three guest cottages and the addition of 22 sleeping rooms. The estate houses the original furniture, art, photographs and keepsakes the Annenbergs themselves enjoyed, many received from their impressive list of guests.

When the Retreat is not in use, the estate will be open for tours. The 90-minute tours are for intimate groups of seven and cost \$35 per person. Not only will visitors tour the estate, they will see the single tennis court, swimming pool, sculptures throughout the



property, the eleven interlocking lakes (fully stocked with bass and catfish for Retreat guests to fish), and of course the private golf course.

For golfers, it has always been about the golf course behind the pink walls. An unrivaled art collection is one thing, but stepping outside the front doors of one's estate to play golf with the President of the United States is quite another—and that is exactly what the Annenbergs did. Dwight Eisenhower was the first president to play on the Sunnylands course, followed by presidents Nixon, Reagan and George H.W. Bush. Of course icons of the sport also played there, Raymond Floyd, Arnold Palmer, Lee Trevino and Tom Watson among them. "The golf course wasn't overly challenging," Floyd says, "but it was a fun course to play."


The Dick Wilson design is parkland in style, with 46 bunkers and over 2,000 trees. Technically the course is nine holes; however, it is meant to be looped twice and has five sets of tees on each box for a very flexible 18-hole routing. During the restoration process, it was discovered that by using different tee and green combinations there are actually over 150 holes on the course. Total 18-hole routings range from 5,364 yards to over 7,200 yards, with bent-grass greens that break toward Bob Hope's house. Only guests of the Retreat will have access to the golf course. While playing, they will see the one magnolia tree that was a gift from President Nixon, the two palm trees from President Eisenhower and the totem pole sculpted by First Nations artist Henry Hunt in 1976. The greens are slightly elevated, the fairways are defined by low sloping hills and the peace and serenity on the course takes one by surprise. It is definitely a world apart behind those gates, so it's not surprising that a beautiful mausoleum on a grassy knoll marks the final resting place of the Ambassador and his wife.

As for the pink walls, the story goes that pink was a favorite color of Mrs. Annenberg, reminding her of the desert's pink-skied sunsets. However, it was the demise of pink oleanders surrounding the property that prompted the painting of the walls a beautiful soft pink, as if oleanders were still there blooming.







012 is the year to re-evaluate your real estate assets. What was once a viable asset in your real estate portfolio may have changed due to the decline in home values, and now is the time to find out.

The first step is to appraise the value of each of your assets. There are a couple of excellent websites that can help you get a ballpark figure, but I recommend contacting a real estate professional who knows your local market to give you an opinion. Once you know the current market value, you will have a benchmark to create a plan for that asset.

The days of expecting a yearly increase in property value are gone. That said, there is one bright spot for increasing the profitability of your real estate assets, and that is the rental market. The rental market is predicted to grow stronger between 2012 and 2015, making this the year to ask yourself some tough questions about each asset, its place in your portfolio and how you handle it in the future. The questions to ask: Does that asset make sense in my financial future and will it become profitable or not?

Asking the Tough Questions

Do you owe more money than a property is worth? If so, it might be time to consider a short sale, loan modification or a Deed in Lieu. Do you utilize the asset? If this is your primary residence then, yes, you do. If, however, this is a secondary residence that is underutilized, you might want to consider offering it as a seasonal or even full-time rental. Why? Because the rental market continues to gain strength in our weak economy as so many owners have lost their homes due to short sales and foreclosures. Many times, these people still have good jobs and long-term employment but their hours or salary have been cut back, or they might have suffered another kind of hardship, such as purchasing their home at the height of the market (ouch!).

What this means is that there are many renters out there who will be renters for the next three to four years as they rebuild their credit scores that took a huge hit as a result of losing their homes. And because many property owners who once rented their homes seasonally have turned instead to the more lucrative full-time rental market, the seasonal rental market is hard pressed to find lodging for vacation and seasonal visitors.

The advantage of a seasonal rental

Utilizing a second home as a seasonal rental has many advantages. First, you can still set aside time for personal use and rent it out the rest of the time. The second advantage is that the dollar amount for a seasonal rental is typically very lucrative during the designated high season for that area. Websites such as HomeAway (homeaway.com) and VRBO (vrbo.com) allow owners to rent out their vacation or second homes, while Airbnb (airbnb.com) and CouchSurfing (couchsurfing.org) take a more social mediainfluenced method toward matching travelers with available space. In many cases, just renting your second home for a few months of the year can cover the mortgage payment for the entire year. This is a great way to move your second home out of the "dog house" category and into "cash cow" status.

How Does the Seasonal Rental Market Work?

If you are thinking about your home as a seasonal rental, interview professionals in your area—either a real estate office that specializes in rentals or a property management company. The percentage these companies charge is justified in time savings to the homeowner as there is a lot involved with offering a seasonal rental, including a good contract that protects all the parties.

You should also make several other calls. If you are in a Home Owners Association, check to see if there are rental restrictions on

your property. Some HOAs only allow homes to be leased by the month, with no weekly or nightly rentals allowed. Also, check with your club to find out if you can offer your rental guests any club privileges, which can make your rental even more attractive. Call local government officials to see if you are obligated to pay your town or city any special taxes on rental income. And finally, once you have all of the relevant information, run the numbers by your accountant or tax planner to determine the best way to set up your new venture.

If you decide to rent the property yourself rather than utilizing a property manager or rental agent, heed the advice from Home Away on screening prospective tenants: Take time to talk to prospective tenants before accepting a booking. "It's amazing how much information you can glean about a person from a short phone conversation," Home Away's recommendations say. During the conversation, be sure to ask questions because questions can often uncover red flags. A few to consider: What's the purpose of your trip? Have you stayed in a vacation rental before? How many adults and how many children will be staying? What attractions are you considering visiting? Trust your instincts; as the owner you have the option to turn down any renters who set off your internal alarms. "Pretty much every owner we've talked to who has endured major property damage by a renter had a bad feeling about the guest before accepting the booking," Home Away says in its tips.

The bottom line: No amount of rental income is worth compromising the safety of your family and your property. If it's not right for you, it's OK to walk away.

EXAMPLES OF GOLF COURSE SEASONAL RENTAL PROPERTIES

Indian Wells Country Club, Indian Wells, Calif.

The wildly popular Golf Channel program, *The Big Break*, is filmed at Indian Wells Country Club. This club provides a fabulous backdrop for this nationally televised golf show, and it's a prime location to rent an upscale luxury home or smaller condo unit. Homes rent for \$3,000–\$12,000 per month and condo units range from \$3,000-\$6,000 per month. The club is currently offering a temporary membership program called the "Discovery Golf Program," which includes full unlimited family golf, fitness and social privileges for both primary member and spouse. It also includes carts for a minimum of three months or a maximum of six months, with no initiation fee and \$1,600 per month prepaid for the length of the membership. This is a one-time trial membership offered for a limited time only and may not be extended.

Indian Wells Country Club offers 36 championship holes of golf on two exceptional courses, the Classic and the Cove. The Classic Course is the original 1956 course designed by founder Eddie Susalla, while the Cove Course, designed by Harry Rainville and Ted Robinson, was added in 1995. Additionally, the club has a 70,000-square-foot clubhouse with a fitness center, men and women's locker rooms and a slew of other amenities.

Example of an Indian Wells rental: A four bedroom, three-bath desert home with south-facing views, high ceilings and Fleetwood sliders throughout. Five-star appointments include flat-screen TV, upscale linens and towels and just about any luxury item a vacationer could want. In high season this home rents for \$8,000–\$10,000 per month and usually for multiple months, making it a good home to put on the seasonal market.

Palm Valley Country Club, Palm Desert, Calif.

A wonderful two-bedroom, two-bath home here entices vacationers with lake views and proximity to the pool and other club amenities. Additionally it offers high-end electronics, flat-screen TVs, luxury linens and all of the comforts of home. Well upgraded, it typically rents for \$5,000-\$6,000 per month in the height of the desert season. Palm Valley Country Club features two high quality courses: an 18-hole, championship course and an 18-hole challenge executive course. The championship course features wide fairways lined with palm trees and lakes, the challenge golfcourse holds true to the name with hazards and forced carries on almost every hole. Among the club's amenities are a 100,000-square-foot clubhouse, driving range with a short-game practice area, chipping and putting greens, rental clubs and more. There is a fitness facility that includes cardiovascular machines, weight-training equipment, personal trainers and classes, and the locker rooms for men and ladies have steam, sauna and Jacuzzis. Members receive special pricing at both the golfand tennis shops.

Incline Village Country Club, Incline Village, Nev.

Located on the 15th tee of the Incline Village Championship Golf Course is a rental surrounded by tall pines and fabulous views. The setting of this special home is pure magic. It is surrounded by tall pines and has wonderful views as well as a great deal of privacy. The home has three levels and three large decks, the spacious island kitchen features a glass-top Jenn-Air cooking center that seats five. There's also a formal dining room with table that seats 12, and the large living room has a stone fireplace, 47-inch HDTV, DVD, VCR, piano and wet bar. The home is located in an upscale neighborhood of luxury homes and rents for \$2,475—\$4,200 per week.

There are two outstanding golfcourses in Incline Village Country Club: the Champion Course and the Mountain Course. The Championship Course was completely renovated in 2004 and features tightly cut fairways bordered by towering pines that demand distance and accuracy. On almost every hole there are lateral water hazards and bunkered greens making it a challenging course. Robert Trent Jones Sr. described Incline Village as "the ideal mountain layout with a challenge you won't want to miss and views you will never forget." The Mountain Course demands more accuracy than distance with spectacular contours and green sites. To navigate the terrain, shot-making skills are necessary. This mountainous 18-hole course is a real joy and challenge to play, one of its highlights being that it's all natural and carved out of the pines with no artificial landscaping or harsh transition areas. The incredible views of Lake Tahoe and the surrounding Sierra Nevada Mountains make this course a true tribute to its designer, Robert Trent Jones, Jr.

"You would never walk into the Cliffhouse and expect it be a Pacifica Seafood restaurant," says Mitch Epstein, managing partner of the Pacifica Restaurant Group, which recently started operating the popular eatery. "That being said, if you're a fan of Pacifica Seafood restaurants, you'll definitely be able to see some blending, whether it's uniforms, the menu or the décor. "



In Palm Springs, the early 2012 opening of Workshop Kitchen & Bar has Southern California palates abuzz. With a seasonal menu drawing from area farmers markets, the new addition to desert dining will fast welcome those interested in the movement of eating local.

fyou're in the market for a car that waves a \$100,000 price tag from its rear view mirror, you should save yourself some time and just go to the Jaguar dealer. The new XJ is lighter, longer and more Luxurious than its predecessors in the XJ line, and the addition of Supercharged and Supersport models adds punch and pizzazz to the flagship. Sitting in an XJ is like few other experiences. Leather and wood wrap you in a cocoon of class. This is not for the faint of heart. The growl that signals ignition of the V-8 gives a rush that is sure to send your pulse through the roof.

The roof, by the way, is entirely glass. This full-width glass roof opens the car's interior to light and space. Watch as the clouds whizz by and the sun pours in on you as you careen down the interstate.

Although your heart may be pounding with exhilaration, you'll also feel a sense of calm at the helm of this large sedan. Imagine yourself as president of the United States (or some other lesser known nation if you don't want to get carried away) and you have a sense of what I mean. At once you have both awesome power and state-of-the-art technology at your fingertips. The legacy of Jaguar seems to leap forward in the XJ, much like the Jaguar icon herself.





The line has myriad options so choose wisely. The XJ is the standard model with a 5.0-liter, 385-horsepower motor driving its intensely beautiful body. The XJL signifies a longer wheelbase, giving five inches of extra room in the back seating area. A Supercharged model adds nearly 100 more horsepower in its turbo, while the XJ Supersport ramps up the muscle to 510 horsepower and add features



like 20-way adjustable front seats with massage.

When was the last time you got a massage while you waited in gridlock?

"With the X.J, you get the most bang for the buck on the market," says Jim Mcclain, sales manager at Jaguar North Scottsdale. "I'm biased but I don't think the (BMW) 7 Series or (Mercedes) S Class even compare."

You won't find plastic trim and levers in any model of the XJ. Jaguar has taken its calling to luxury seriously. While the navigation and electronic features aren't cutting edge, they do everything you want them to without fuss or frustration. The dashboard is entirely digital and complements the interior features with its styling. The shift control continues as the round dial that rises from the center dash upon ignition. Controls that operate with the latest in voice-recognition software respond to your commands.

Buying an XJL Supercharged or Supersport puts you in a category of your own. The exclusive nature of the XJL makes it a car that isn't seen often and has a high head-turn factor; from the street corner, the XJL looks like it must be carrying a dignitary. The front end is so distinctive it can be nothing but a Jag. The

back end seems to be downplayed a bit in the 2012 XJ, yet the way the emblem sits on the face of the trunk lid is brilliant branding. You'd expect nothing less from Jaguar.

The performance of the XJL Supercharged and Supersport are impressive. The aluminum chassis cuts out significant bulk of similar models in the class. At 206 inches long, it weighs in at 4,300 pounds. Compare that to the BMW 7 series at 205 inches and about 5,000 pounds.

Lighter weight means faster speeds. The top end on a Supersport is over 150 mph. The Supercharged does 0-60 in under five seconds. All are driven by a six-speed transmission that can be dialed up or down in Dynamic and Winter modes to alter the responsiveness, traction control and handling.

This car is smart, too. As you drive, it learns what you want. The XJ will adjust its handling and transmission settings to suit your preferences. You don't say anything, just drive and it learns.

Interior lighting also adjusts to match the drive setting you've selected. Choose the Sport feature in the Supercharged X.JL and the lighting turns red. Choose the Winter mode and cool blue lighting sets the mood. This kind of customization is characteristic of the entire XJ experience. More leather colors than you could possibly want, wood options and features galore make selecting your Jaguar a pleasure of the process.
