



With 24 Grand Slam singles victories, Margaret Court still stands out from everyone else

After losing to Ajla Tomljanovi during the third round of the 2022 US Open, Serena Williams ended one of the most storied careers in the history of sports.

A winner of 23 Grand Slam singles titles, Williams was ranked No. 1 in singles by the Women's Tennis Association (WTA) for 319 weeks, including a joint-record 186 consecutive weeks. In addition, she was the year-end No. 1 player for five years.

With seven Australian Open titles, three French Open victories, seven Wimbledon triumphs and five US Open wins along with 14 Grand Slam doubles championships—there was little surprise that millions of fans were stating Williams is the best female tennis player of all time, as they shared their thoughts on social media.

However, unfortunately, many of today's tennis fans have forgotten about the one female star that even outshines Williams: Margaret Court, a winner of one more Grand Slam singles title than Williams (some of which were claimed during the pre-Open era). And Court wasn't afraid to share her opinion shortly after Williams's retirement.

"A lot of the press and television today, particularly in tennis, don't want to mention my name," she said. "The honor has not been there for what I did do. In my own nation, I have been given titles, but they would still rather not mention me."


There is so much to mention though. First, Court is one of only three players to win the "Grand Slam Boxed Set", which is every single Grand Slam title (singles, doubles and mixed doubles). And she's the only player to ever complete the rare achievement twice.

She also triumphed at six straight Grand Slam singles titles, was an 11-time Australian Open champion (the all-time record for the most singles titles earned in a single Grand Slam event until Rafael Nadal won his 12th French Open) and enjoyed an Open era winning percentage of 91.67 percent in Grand Slam singles titles.

Not to mention, she won 91.02 percent of all the Open era singles events she participated in, which, like her winning percentage in Grand Slam singles titles, is a record that has yet to be surpassed. And she won 91.74 percent of all singles—on every surface, from carpet and clay, to grass and hard—she participated in, a higher percentage than anyone else.

Additionally, her all-time win-loss percentage in Grand Slam tournaments was 90 percent, as she won 95.24, 89.90, 85 and 89.66 percent, respectively, of the matches she played at the Australian Open, French Open, Wimbledon Championships and US Open.

A Fed Cup winner with her home country of Australia on four separate occasions, Court even won three of her Grand Slam singles titles as a mother, an Open era record she shares with Kim



Cjisters, further proving her longevity. To compare, Williams did not win another singles Grand Slam after becoming a mother in 2017.

"Serena has played seven more years than I did. I finished in my early 30s. People forget that I took two years out," Court stressed. "I first retired when I was 25, thinking I would never return to tennis. I got married, had a baby, but then had one of my best years, winning 24 out of 25 tournaments."

In fact, Court won 192 singles titles during her career, 92 of which occurred during the Open era. She also earned 19 Grand Slam doubles victories, five more than Williams. And she won an astounding 21 Grand Slam mixed doubles titles,

leading to 64 Grand Slam victories in all (25 more than Williams).

"I came back after two babies," Court added. "After having the first baby, I won three out of the four Slams. [But] Serena hasn't won a Slam since [she had a baby]."

Aside from pointing out her record after having her children and the ways in which it compares to Williams's, she also mentioned that it was more difficult to compete during her era—not less difficult, as many tend to mistakenly believe.

"I would love to have played in this era. I think it's much easier," she stated. "How I would love to have taken family or friends along with me. But I couldn't. I had to go on my own or with the national team. People don't see all that."

She added, "We didn't have psychologists or coaches with us. It's a whole different world. That's what disappoints me—that players today don't honor the past of the game."

Unfortunately, Court believes even Williams doesn't honor the game's past either or even her fellow opponents.

"I think it was bad that Williams didn't mention her opponent more when she spoke [after losing to Ajla Tomljanovi]," she said. "We were taught to be role models for the young, in how we behaved. We were taught to honor our opponent. You learned from your losses. We respected one another."

As evidence of Court's feelings, concerning Williams's lack of honoring tennis's past, she doesn't think she's ever been admired by her, even though Williams still remains one Grand Slam singles title short of her all-time record, which has stood for nearly 50 years.

"Serena, I've admired her as a player," she added during her interview with the *Daily Telegraph*. "But I don't think she has ever admired me."


As Williams prepares for the next chapter of her life, one question remains: will she finally recognize the one person who won more female singles Grand Slam titles than her? Will she publicly speak about Court—with the admiration and respect she deserves—so that her fans know about Court's record and learn more about tennis's celebrated history? Or will she allow Court and her awe-inspiring achievements to fade away from the minds of today's and tomorrow's tennis fans and players?

Regardless of what happens in the future, Court knows one fact will likely remain unchanged throughout the entire future of tennis.

"The 64 [Grand Slam titles I won]," she emphasized, "I don't think anyone will ever touch."

In celebration of this year's tennis season, Desert Golf & Tennis spotlights each of the Grand Slam singles winners.



From a retiring legend, to a teenager being crowned a Grand Slam champion, to tennis greats overcoming injuries and controversies to yet again enjoy the glory of victory, 2022 was, simply put, the most exciting, drama-filled season that the tennis industry has witnessed in years—arguably decades.

In reflection of such an outstanding, historical season, here is a look back at each of the players that won Grand Slam singles titles this year.

Nadal Wins His Second Australian Open

Prior to defeating Daniil Medvedev 2-6, 6-7 (5), 6-4, 6-4, 7-5 in 5 hours and 24 minutes—the second-longest Grand Slam final in history—Rafael Nadal had contemplated retirement, due to ongoing injuries.

But then he became the first player since 1965 to come back from two sets down to win the Australian Open, and only the sixth to do so in any Grand Slam final, as he captured his record-breaking 21st men's Grand Slam singles title. He is also only the second man to win all four major titles twice in the Open Era, following Novak Djokovic.

In addition, he broke the Open Era record for the longest span between a first and a second title at the same Grand Slam championship: 13 years.

"A month and a half ago, I didn't know if I would play tennis again at a professional level, due to various factors, including the problems I've had with my foot," he said after his first-round victory at the 2022 Australian Open.

After his victory against Medvedey, whom he also defeated in the finals of the 2019 US Open, Nadal added the following during his post-match speech: "I am [now] here in front of all of you [with] this trophy. I can't thank you enough for all the support that I received since I arrived here."

Meanwhile, Medvedev, who was seeking his second straight Grand Slam triumph, was in awe of Nadal's victory.

"You're an amazing champion," he told Nadal. "Congrats—it was unbelievable!"



Ash Barty Retires After Capturing Her Third Grand Slam

While Nadal was striving to overcome injuries, in order to extend his career, 25-year-old Ash Barty decided to retire during her prime: just a few weeks after capturing the 2022 Australian Open. Ranked number one in the Women's Tennis Association's (WTA) rankings at the time of her retirement, Barty truly bowed out while on top.

By defeating Danielle Collins 6-3, 7-6(2), she became the first Australian player to win the Australian Open singles title in 44 years, while also acquiring her third Grand Slam singles title, in addition to the 2019 French Open and the 2021 Wimbledon Championships.

"[The] crowd the night of the final of the Australian Open was like nothing I've ever played in front of before," Barty reflected. "It was so much fun to enjoy that with them. It was a brilliant way to finish [my career]."

As she prepares for the next chapter of her life, she is looking forward to teaching future generations about the sport, including her nieces and nephews.

"Bringing them the opportunity to play tennis [is] going to be a beautiful way for me to contribute," she said. "I'll never stop loving the sport."



Nadal Claims His Second Straight Grand Slam

Proving that age is just a number and virtually any obstacle, including longstanding injuries, can be overcome, Rafael Nadal acquired his second consecutive Grand Slam singles title at the French Open, and his record 14th triumph in that championship alone.

Ultimately defeating Felix Auger-Aliassime 3-6, 6-3, 6-2, 3-6, 6-3, he was simply happy to have yet another chance to compete on clay, where he has dominated for several years—in a way that no one in the history of the sport has, in fact.

"I'm very thankful to play another year here," he said. "Every match that I play here, I don't want it to be my last match at Roland Garros. I'm thankful to keep living the dream."

And what a dream it has been. He has had four consecutive victories, followed by five straight wins (after not winning in 2009), followed by four successive triumphs again (after not winning in 2015 or 2016). In addition, he has never lost a finals match at the championship.

"I am a player living with an injury," Nadal said, as he looks ahead to the remainder of his career. "I'm going to try my best. I don't know what'll happen, but I'll fight until the end."

As evidenced by his career thus far, there is no reason to believe Nadal won't continue to fight and overcome all of the obstacles he faces in the future.

Iga Świątek Enjoys Her Second French Open Triumph

By defeating Coco Gauff 6-1, 6-3 in the French Open's women's final, Iga wi tek acquired her 35th straight match victory, along with her sixth consecutive tournament title. Equaling Venus Williams's victory streak, concerning matches, which occurred in



2000 (the last time such a streak has been recorded in the WTA), wi tek felt validated by the victory, her second in the championship in three years.

After all, she won her first French Open victory as a teenager in the fall of 2020, a time in which she admitted to feeling "confusion", as she "never really believed 100 percent that [she could] actually win a Grand Slam."

However, this year, she won more than 50 percent of points whenever she returned Gauff's first and second serves, while also winning 62 of the 101 points that were recorded during the final.

"In 2020 I just felt that I [was] lucky," she emphasized while reflecting on her previous French Open triumph. "[But] this time I felt like I really did the work."

Novak Djokovic Earns His Seventh Wimbledon Title

After missing the Australian Open, due his unvaccinated status, and losing to Nadal during the quarterfinals of the French Open (a championship he was defending), Novak Djokovic found some redemption at the All England Lawn Tennis and Croquet Club, where he won his fourth successive Wimbledon Championships title

Earning his 21st Grand Slam singles victory (second behind Nadal on the all-time list) and seventh Wimbledon conquest, Djokovic defeated Nick Kyrgios 4-6, 6-3, 6-4, 7-6 (3). During a year in which his choice to remain unvaccinated has been discussed



more than his on-court triumphs, the victory was one of the most meaningful of his career.

"[I'm] over the moon with joy and happiness of experiencing this moment once again," he stressed. "I've said it many times: this tournament is extra special for me because it [was] the first tournament that [I] ever watched as a kid that got me to start playing tennis."

He added that he doesn't "take any wins for granted, and particularly not in Wimbledon."

"In contrary, actually every time feels a bit different [and] special in its own way," he stated. "Of course, having family and close people in my life here to share this victory with them—it was beautiful."

Elena Rybakina Shocks the Tennis World with Her Wimbledon Victory

Ranked No. 23 in the world upon entering the 2022 Wimbledon Championships, Elena Rybakina became the first woman ranked outside of the WTA's top 20 to win the championship since Venus Williams in 2007, after defeating Ons Jabeur 3-6, 6-2, 6-2.

The youngest female to win the title since Petra Kvitová in 2011, she also became the first woman to claim the championship after losing the first set since Amélie Mauresmo in 2006. When one considers this—alongside the fact that she's not only the first player representing Kazakhstan to win a Grand Slam singles title, but also the first to reach a major final—there is no wonder why she said she was "speechless" shortly after winning.

Yet, her statistics paint a different picture; by focusing solely on them, it is far from surprising that she won. For instance, upon




entering the finals match, she had a tournament-leading 49 aces, 19 more than any other woman. And she had the second-fastest serve speed of all women: 122 mph.

"To be a winner is just amazing," she exclaimed after putting the final touches on her stunning victory. "I don't have the words to say how happy I am."

As evidenced by her performance, she'll likely have many more opportunities to explain just how happy she is after claiming further singles titles in the future.

As 19-year-old Carlos Alcaraz prepared for his first appearance at a Grand Slam final, he reflected on the advice his grandfather shared with him: to win, he would need "head, heart and courage". He certainly had all three as he defeated Casper Ruud 6-4, 2-6, 7-6(1), 6-3 to win the 2022 US Open.

With the victory, he became the first-ever teenager to become the No. 1 ranked player in the Association of Tennis Professionals (ATP) rankings since they began in 1973.

"This is something I've dreamed of since I was kid. To be number one in the world and champion of a Grand Slam is something I've worked really hard for," he said right after his victory.

The youngest US Open winner since Pete Sampras in 1990 (who went on to claim 14 Grand Slam singles titles, a record that remained until the Big Three surpassed it), Alcaraz may very well be tennis's next star, especially as Djokovic, Federer and Nadal prepare for the last chapters of their careers.

Aside from his raw natural talent, he also appears to have a strong support system, which will be critical in the future, as he mentioned that "all top decisions" are made with his "parents and team".

As a result, head, heart, courage and support will likely be a winning combination for tennis's next star.



Iga Świątek Wins Yet Again, as Serena Williams Retires

A key focus of the 2022 US Open was Serena Williams, and for good reason. The 23-time Grand Slam singles champion (and sixtime US Open singles winner) announced her retirement after losing to Ajla Tomljanovi during the third round.

As the tennis community—and sports world as a whole—discussed Williams's legacy, a player inspired by her, Iga wi tek, continued to enjoy one of the finest seasons in recent WTA history. Capturing her seventh victory of the season (the most by a woman since Williams in 2014, actually), wi tek defeated Ons Jabeur 6-2, 7-6 (5) for her third Grand Slam singles title. The No. 1 ranked player in the WTA since April, she also became the first woman to win multiple Grand Slam singles titles since Angelique Kerber achieved the feat in 2016.

"Coming back from winning a Grand Slam is tricky," she said. "I needed to stay composed and focus on [my] goals."

And that is exactly what she did, proving that she is not just a Grand Slam champion on clay surfaces.

"It [was] challenging," she added, in reflection of her first US Open title. "[But] I'm so proud of how [I] handled it mentally."

"The atmosphere all around will be great," says Philippe Dore, marketing director, Indian Wells Tennis Garden. "For 10 days, we will be transforming Indian Wells Tennis Garden into a Pickleball Paradise!"

Aside from the action on the 49 courts, Pickleball Paradise will also feature a thrilling atmosphere at the Championship Court, which will have professional matches every day. And it will offer a



sponsor village as well, providing patrons the latest products from the increasingly popular pickleball industry—one that has recorded 40 percent growth the last two years, as 5 million Americans now participate in the sport.

"It was a watershed moment for the sport when Indian Wells Tennis Garden first hosted the USA Pickleball National Championships back in 2018," says Justin Maloof, USA Pickleball chief operating officer. 
Additionally, if competitors receive pre-registration invitations, they can only compete in one event of the same type for each gold medal they potentially earn. For instance, if a player earns a gold medal at a regional in ladies doubles, she'll acquire a pre-registration opportunity to compete in ladies doubles (not necessarily in the same skill or age range that they did at the regional) at the Margaritaville USA Pickleball National Championships.

Moreover, international competitors must have valid USA Pickleball memberships throughout the entire timespan of the championships. To compete in the professional and senior professional matches, competitors should also have a 5.0 USA Pickleball Rating, at least, by September 19. Yet, some events may be open to up to 4.5 USA Pickleball rated players too, depending entirely on each event's participation levels.

Singles, doubles and mixed doubles competitions will be occurring according to nine age/skill brackets too: under 35, 35-49, 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79 and 80+. At the same time, juniors, aged 8 to 18, can compete in three age brackets, 8-12, 13-15 and 16-18.

Aside from purchasing general admission tickets to watch each of these age/skill brackets compete, patrons can also buy a Margaritaville License To Chill VIP Package. The package includes entrance to on-court seating, along with access to Indian Wells Tennis Garden's Margaritaville License to Chill Lounge. Package purchasers will also receive light snacks and lunch during each day they attend, along with two complimentary drinks on a daily basis,





from beer and margaritas, to non-alcoholic beverages and wine. In addition, they'll have a VIP parking pass every day.

Alongside the VIP package and general admission tickets, fans can buy a wide array of other tickets, including reserved or premium reserved seats on the Championship Court. While attending the championship, fans must keep the following in mind: Indian Wells Tennis Garden is completely cashless, leading to a contactless guest experience. All major forms of payment will be accepted, such as American Express, Apple Pay, debit cards, Google Pay, Mastercard and Visa.

Furthermore, the championship's schedule will vary from day to day, as the first day of action, for example, will feature male senior pro singles (50+), women's senior pro doubles (50+), women's age/skill levels 65+, 70+, 75+ and 80+, and men's skill/age doubles 65+, 70+, 75+ and 80+.


However, the final day of the championship will feature men's skill/age doubles 50+, 55+ and 60+, mixed skill/age doubles 19+, 35+, junior mixed doubles, women's pro singles gold, men's pro doubles gold, men's pro doubles gold and mixed pro doubles gold.

A Not-So Civil War: PGA Tour vs LIV Golf





ntil recently, the PGA Tour's version of the wonderful world of golf was spinning in greased grooves: Big, fat TV contracts, huge crowds, enormous purses — and best of all, none of that annoying competition.

Then along came the Saudi-bankrolled LIV Golf International Series with its bottomless well of oil money, snatching away stars like Phil Mickelson, Dustin Johnson, Brooks Keopka, Bryson DeChambeau, and a still-growing number of other defectors. Only eight events in 2022, but bonuses and prize money so titanic that it made those "turncoats" set for life. For next season, LIV announced 13 events with a maximum of 48 players and four-man team events.

The real soap opera hit prime time when some of those LIV defectors tried to come back and play in major championships and the FedEx Cup, spots they had earned fairly with World Golf Ranking points. PGA Tour Commissioner Jay Monahan banished them all. He hasn't announced how long those suspensions might last, but the PGA Tour's long arm even stretched to Great Britain when the R & A informed LIV CEO and two-time British Open champ Greg Norman that he was persona non-grata to play in the Open Championship at St. Andrews this past summer!

The banishments seem peculiar because the PGA Tour's long standing tradition has been if players satisfied the requirement of playing a minimum of 16 PGA Tour events during a season, they were free to play wherever and whenever

PGA Tour for the right to play both tours. Monahan's reply: "We welcome good, healthy competition. The LIV Saudi golf league is not that. It's an irrational threat; one not concerned with the return on investment or true growth of the game."

Norman countered that the whole anti-trust suit could have been easily avoided because all the PGA Tour needed to do was to "sit down and take a phone call from us and just say, 'Hey, let's work this out. We can do it.' It's such an easy fix it's ridiculous."

The question might be, what does Monahan define as "good, healthy competition" rather than a threat? He could be right to say the Saudi's aren't in it for the long run or to even make a make a profit. They could never recoup the billions they are dumping into the LIV Tour to buy players and ramp up prize money. They also might not care about



they wanted, in Europe, Asia, Australia anywhere. But that courtesy did not apply to the LIV Tour. Monahan said LIV defectors were in breach of the contracts they signed at the beginning of the year, promising not to play in "competing events."

A handful of LIV defectors, among them Mickelson and DeChambeau, quickly filed an anti-trust suit against the

"growing the game," though that may already be happening on its own, through the healthy competition.

Mickelson said in a newspaper interview months before he made the choice to join the LIV Tour, that the Saudis are "sports washing," a critical term for a corrupt group or country attempting to change its image by hosting major sporting events. It is a diversionary tactic that



harkens back to Hitler's Germany and the 1936 Berlin Olympics. In that same interview, Mickelson also identified the Saudis as "scary mother***ers" who murdered Washington Post reporter and United States resident Jamaal Khashoggi and who allegedly execute homosexuals.

The Saudis believe that they are highly disliked in the US, but in many cases even loathed. A 2019 a VOX poll indicated that more Americans considered the Saudis enemies than allies. So their "sports washing" is most likely to try to lure outside business investment in their kingdom to keep it rich and prosperous if and when one day, fossil fuels might not be in such big demand. And what better place to find deep-pocket investors than around the world of golf? A recent Harris poll indicated that lots of US golffans are either watching the LIV Tour events, are planning to, or are at least "LIV curious."

Tiger Woods, however, sees issues beyond money. Woods rejected an rumored astonishing \$700 million up-front bonus from the Saudis and decided to stay right where he is, which is on the PGA Tour players advisory board. LiV Tour's Norman denies the amount as a one-time payment. Woods believes his LIV Tour brethren have turned their backs on the very organization that made them rich and famous. He and vocal fellow PGA Tour board members Davis Love III and Rory McIlroy argue that events like the FedEx cup and other major championships cannot be cherry picked: players must earn the right to compete by playing week in and week out on the PGA Tour.

While Woods, McIlroy, Love, and Monahan are also quick to crow about how much money their tour raises for charities, a 2013 investigation by ESPN's "Outside the Lines" found that the PGA

Tour events averaged donating just 16 percent of its revenue to charities — far below the 60-percent mark considered responsible as a nonprofit.

Forgetting just for a moment that it's the Saudis running the show — isn't America still the land of opportunity? A bastion for free enterprise, where competition is not just *good*, but practically *holy*!? So, then, why can't golfers play on both tours?

In the early 20th Century, President Teddy Roosevelt started busting trusts like Standard Oil of New Jersey, American Tobacco, J.P. Morgan's Northern Securities Railroad Corporation and other monopolies, using the Sherman Anti-Trust Act of 1890 as his big stick to file federal lawsuits. Roosevelt and, in particular, his successor William Howard Taft, held that monopolies and corporate greed are harmful to the nation's economy and consumers. By eliminating competition, monopolies can then fix prices and they don't even have to deliver a good product.

While legal precedent and the spirit of the Sherman Anti-Trust Act favor the LIV Tour players' lawsuit, the federal government hasn't paid much attention to monopolies and trusts since about 1980—taking a posture that if a company makes money and pays taxes, the hell with Sherman.

The suit isn't slated for trial until January of 2024, but a major blow to the LIV Tour plaintiffs hopes came in a California court in mid-August when a federal district court judge dismissed their bid for a temporary restraining order against the PGA Tour. She ruled that missing the FedEx Playoffs would not cause those players





irreparable harm, which needed to be shown for the restraining order to be issued. Basically, the message said that anyone making hundreds of millions of dollars will have a hell of a time proving "irreparable harm" in a court of law.

But a glimmer of good news for the suit is that in June, the Department of Justice (DOJ) began contacting players' agents to investigate claims that the PGA Tour indeed operates as a monopoly. There has been no recent news about the progress of that investigation because the DOJ does not comment on ongoing investigations.

It's anyone's guess how this multi-billion-dollar soap opera will play out. It's unlikely, though, that those LIV Tour players will get a lifetime ban from the PGA Tour. More likely, the PGA Tour will get weary of this pesky fly buzzing around its face and threatening to kill its golden goose. More probably, the PGA Tour will hammer out a settlement with the LIV Tour players. The two groups would never likely merge, but it's possible they will find a way to coexist.

Whether they win or lose their lawsuit, these LIV Tour rebels have already forced the PGA Tour to make some of the very alterations they themselves had long wanted. For example, in August — probably to keep more PGA Tour players from jumping ship— Monahan announced changes that include more tour events structured for the elite players (similar to the FED Ex Cup and the Tour Championship). That is certainly in direct response to what the LIV Tour is already doing. Then starting next year, there will be no wrap-around season and players can at long last take more time off to be with their families, which is a big advantage of the LIV Tour. Those changes likely wouldn't have occurred except in direct response to the LIV Tour.

Also at the end of August, Woods and McIlroy announced a new golf league they developed, the TGL, showcasing team matches fusing advanced technology and live action from a custom-built venue to complement the current PGA Tour schedule. The league's inaugural season will kick off in January 2024, featuring 15 televised prime-time Monday night matches including six teams of three players each. Players won't have to walk between shots and holes so it will be a faster pace game than traditional PGA Tour events — 18 holes in maybe two hours.

There is absolutely no doubt that Woods and McIlroy's new "league" would not been even considered without the competition from the LIV Tour series and is an obvious copycat of the team format the LIV Tour already has.

All of those innovations, and perhaps others coming around the bend, prove that the game will grow best and fastest from healthy competition and the absence of monopolies — and that money not only talks, but when you have deep enough pockets, it screams.







Welcome back to the Desert! Let's have some golf fun feeling this winter. Today's golf tip is "DRIVER VS FAIRWAY" set up, the similarities & the differences. Many golfers most common mistake is on "set up," especially with two different woods. Here are two great simple sample set up photos that should help you feel the difference between the two clubs.



Similarities:

They both are some of the longest clubs in your golf bag

They both have a large shaped clubhead

They both go a long way

They both are hit from the farthest part on the golf hole

Differences: Driver:

Ball position is off the "front foot" .typically the width of the club head from your heal (I'm right handed so my left heal)

BALL POSITION: easy way to remember is LEFT for LOFT LEFT for LAUNCH LEFT for LIFT LEFT for LONG SHOTS

Width from the thigh: 6-8" off thigh, stand taller Arm hang: slightly at an angle down from the chin Seven -1 3* loft for the driver (get fitted by me or your local golf professional)

Tee it up: typically you use a "tee" (ball should be way above the Driver head, depending on the golfer)

Hit: "up on the ball – NOT DOWN" Width of feet: bigger/ wider than hips (22" or so wide) depending on your height

Fairway wood:

BALL POSITION: is left of the center line, depending on "which fairway club you are hitting" varies (six -eight") off left heal or where your "DIVOT IS"

Width from thigh: closer six -seven" Arm hang in more down from shoulder 13-21* loft for most fairway woods 22-28* loft for most hybrids



Tee: it up only on the "teeing ground" (nicknamed is the "tee box") The tee should be all the way in the ground (tee it extremely LOW). If you choose to use a tee for like a short parthree, par four, or you are in the fairway or second shot .no tee allowed, only the first shot of every hole you can (or may) use a tee if you choose to

If you tee it up to HIGH: you will pop it up or sky ball it & hit more tee that golf ball

Hit: "down on the ball" ...hit the ball, then the ground .take a divot or thump the ground

Width of feet: slightly bigger than a seven iron (16" approx average)

Hvbrid:

Hybrid: five , six, seven hybrid (ladies): play more centered (1"-2") forward of your seven iron

Hybrid: three, four, five hybrid (guys): play two -three" forward of seven iron

Too many golfers have the ball position too far forward in your stance

DRIVER DRILL:

Speed drill: Tee up three golf balls

Hit One ball slow speed, hit One ball medium speed, hit one ball as fast as you can (without falling over)

Repeat as needed= This drill helps with club head speed, balance, muscle memory, you might pick up a few yards on your driver!

FAIRWAY DRILL:

Hit DOWN: Tee up three TEES (no golf balls on the tee) & three golf balls alternating set up

Drill: put tee 1/2 way in the ground, then a ball, then a tee, then a ball, then a tee (objects about four -six" apart from each other) Hit the first object: tee (with no ball on it) or ball, repeat until line is done

This drill, promotes hitting "down", hitting the "tee will fly outta the ground" (helps you not "TOP" or whiff, or skull the ball) Repeat: hit the tee, then ball, keep observing where your club bottoms out on the turf (your divot)

I look forward to seeing how you feel about the similarities & differences on a DRIVER V's FAIRWAY WOOD. Hopefully you can feel the difference after theses simple set up tips & amazing golf drills. 



ave you ever asked yourself, how much horsepower is too much? Of course not! That's what Lotus is banking on in its newest supercar the Evija. The Evija is a flagship in the race to find a ceiling on what the discerning driver can harness.

The all-electric, hyper car boasts 1,972 horsepower. That's nearly double a Formula 1 car and leaves vehicles like the Ferrari Enzo or Porsche 918 on the sidelines with meager numbers in the high hundreds. The Evija's four engines create neck-snapping torque more like a NASA product than a production car. Taking off, you'll ask yourself if this is what John Glenn felt when he orbited the earth. Before you know it, you'll see an astronomical number on the dash in front of you and wonder if you have lift off.

With just 130 models scheduled to see the road in 2023, the Evija may be more exclusive than a trip to space. The price tag may also mirror a seat on Elon's next shuttle.

Recent test drives of the prototype confirm that Lotus is launching a new icon to compete with the most exclusive names with price tags over a \$1 million. The Evija is slated to retail at \$2.3 million. In this

rarified market air, the product needs to put up or shut up. The Evija has all the chops to contend with the biggest names in the industry.

Estimated track times, while still unofficial, look impressive. The 0-60 mph time will likely break below the 3 second mark. Rumors suggest that the Evija will go 0-180 mph in 9 seconds — or less. The reason for the torque at such high speeds lies in the one-speed transmission. It delivers torque through the entire powerband, providing as much punch at 150 mph as at 50 mph. Unlike most vehicles, the Evija won't back down as you get faster. Some drivers have said it feels like the torque actually amps up as you speed up. With electronic stability control and active aerodynamics, air is getting pushed and force placed exactly where it's needed to make speed the byproduct of design.

Design is a religion at Lotus.

"Lotus has all been about input=output," says Gavan Kershaw, Director, Attributes and Product Integrity. "Through testing we can work on every element, like how connected you feel to the car, the driving position, location of the primary controls and visibility. It's all about validating how the thousands of hours of computer simulations actually translate into the vehicle. It's a two-fold process: proving they were the correct targets in the first place, and that the results are accurately translating into the car. I've got a big smile on my face because it's the latest tech, it's a Lotus and we're at the forefront again."

Lotus began with a blank slate. While most electric vehicles mount the battery cells low in the center of the frame, or in a t-shape, the Evija stacks the battery cells in a pyramid behind the driver. Designers wanted drivers to feel as if they are in a c-class racer.



The cockpit feel flung forward with mass constantly pushing. The all-wheel drive makes turning on a the head of a pin possible then with some help from electronic stability controls.

Of course, being an EV, everyone wants to know what range the Evija will have. That depends. With five modes, the Evija can reportedly drive as far 250 miles on one charge in its most conservative (i.e. bridled) mode. Charging the battery to 80 percent will take 12 minutes using a 350-kilowatt DC fast charger.


Somewhat ironically, cars at this price/performance ratio don't pack many frills. The cabin is access through dihedral doors, adding the ooh factor that Lotus has inspired for generations. The Evija will come with Bluetooth and an infotainment system. In front of the steering wheel, the car's only screen will display pertinent information like battery charge and remaining range. Features like Apple CarPlay and Android Auto are standard, and Lotus has installed an onboard modem that facilitates connection to the cloud. An app is available that allows drivers to monitor the Evija from any location, checking on things such as battery status

If the Evija is any indicator of the direction Lotus intends for its future, the future looks promising. With this much power, who can stop them?

The button down, spread collar neckline adds a hint of menswear allure with a concealed button front. For a bold edge, the outline incorporates subtle, drawstring cut-out features at the waist. \$475.

The Little Black Dress rulebook certainly allows for some surprises here and there, easily qualifying the **Teagan Gown in Zebra Burnout** for the LBD category with a dash of panache. Crafted with lightweight, sheer fabric of 40 percent viscose and 40 percent polyester, this eye-catching gown with a column silhouette is adorned with a zebra-like pattern in black accented with a







subtle, sheer gold burnout. It features a round crew neck, cap sleeves, and a zipper opening, and it falls to a fit-and-flair, floorgrazing hem. \$895.

Another bold variation on the standard LBD, the Kel Catsuit in Chiffon Sequins nevertheless channels an element that evokes feminine charm. Paying homage to Halston's belief that pants were a revolutionary addition to women's couture options, this classy and exciting piece in 100 percent nylon can easily transition from a day to evening look. It features a one shoulder neckline and an asymmetrical overlay with scores of shimmering sequins and flowing accents. The legs are skinny and cropped at the ankle, accentuating length especially when paired with sandals or stilettos for a distinct look. \$525

The Ashlynn Dress in Matte Jersey showcases the perfect blend of drape and structure, with textural surfaces that wrap around the body giving it visual movement. It's framed by an asymmetric neckline, half of which forms a sweetheart contour. How jewelry designer Coomi connects our past and present worlds



In case you're struck by the obvious architectural elements of Coomi jewelry, you should know it's not an accident. Founder Coomi Bhasin, a Mumbai native who has spent her whole life as a creator, spent many years studying construction management as well as working as a textile designer and landscape architect.

Stunning selections in her Coomi collection feature colorful gemstones, with bracelets as our focus here, and there is a diamond placed somewhere on every single item she creates so that the purity of their sparkling energy can be released by touching the skin.

Coomi made the switch from the drafting table to the diamond saw in 2002, choosing to follow her dream as a way to inspire others. She has traveled the world, seeking out and refining her approaches for one-of-a-kind jewelry compositions. Mixing concepts embedded in our past with today's cultural influences showcases the unique quality in every work. Knowing that she can give her collectors an understanding of history while also sharing a part of herself in the process captures the core of her work that connects our worlds, past and present.

The Coomi x Muzo Emerald Fringed Splendor Bracelet displays a surface of 20K yellow gold "fringe" that extends around the wrist, with seven irregularly shaped Muzo Colombian emeralds (12.93 tcw.) bordered by black enamel accents along the top. The formation of the emerald is a geological miracle, requiring the beryllium in magma to come into contact with the chrome in seawater, crystallizing into a coveted gemstone. Numerous petite, round white diamonds (1.50 tcw.) are sprinkled throughout the textured gold fringe strips, relieving the heaviness of the emeralds and offering balance through the reflection of light. \$78,000.



Trinity Diamond Statement Bracelet

The Trinity Diamond Statement Bracelet is a wonder of workmanship, with hundreds of small white diamonds (11.05 tcw.) in varying sizes arranged in an art deco theme. Coomi developed the Trinity Collection as a representation of the harmony between the three dimensions of our existence: earth, divine energy and ourselves. One can sense the influence of China, Japan and Egypt with the motifs of fans and masks evident in the cuff. \$100,000.

Five Opera Link Bracelet with Diamonds

The Five Opera Link Bracelet with Diamonds lies flat along the wrist with five parallel rows of 20K yellow gold discs accented with rose-cut diamonds (9.46 tcw.).
