
Thanks for the Memories

A beloved tournament makes its final appearance in the Coachella Valley

Through all those years, this tournament has been played in the same place and on the same course: The Dinah Shore Tournament Course at Mission Hills Country Club in Rancho Mirage, California. For 50 years the much-loved LPGA tournament has been contested in the Coachella Valley. This year will be the last.

In October 2021, energy company Chevron signed a six-year sponsorship deal with IMG, the global sports, events and talent management company that operates the tournament. That deal changes everything. The newly christened Chevron Championship will be played one final time at Mission Hills before moving to the greater Houston area in 2023, where Chevron is headquartered. There's no word yet on which Houston-area course the tournament will eventually call home.

The 2022 event is also the last time the tournament will be played during its traditional late March-early April time slot. In Houston, it will be played at a later date in order to allow for network coverage on NBC and so it will no longer conflict with the (relatively recent) Augusta National Women's Amateur tournament.

The purse will also be increased from \$3.1 million to \$5 million, ensuring that it will no longer be the only LPGA major with a purse under \$4 million. The hefty increase will bring it in line with the other LPGA majors and top-tier tournaments.











The move to Texas is a blow to the Coachella Valley and many longtime fans of the tournament, which has traditions born in the valley that make it unique on the LPGA Tour. For one thing, until the Evian Championship became a major in 2013, the Dinah Shore was the only LPGA major played on the same course every year.

Its most beloved tradition, however the one everyone is asking about since Chevron announced the move—is the winner's leap into Poppie's Pond. Will Poppie's Pond be recreated at whatever venue is chosen for the tournament? There's talk, but it seems unlikely that it could ever be the same even if it is recreated. "The leap" started in 1988 when Amy Alcott celebrated her second win by unexpectedly jumping into the pond surrounding the 18th green at Mission Hills. She did the same in 1991 when she won a third time—joined by Dinah Shore herself, who had promised to take the leap with Alcott if she won a third time. It didn't really catch on until 1994 when Donna Andrews leapt into the pond to celebrate her victory, followed by Nanci Brown the next year. At some point, a white bathrobe—similar to the one Shore donned immediately after jumping in the pond with Alcott-became an indelible part of the tradition.



This all may seem insignificant or silly in the context of a serious tournament contested by the most elite women golfers in the world. But the joyous moment of victory captured by Alcott and all the others who leapt into the pond over the years, including a host of caddies and winners' relatives, brought humor and humanity to a golf tournament and made it something even non-golfers talked about

and wanted to see. It made the tournament stand out from all the others, made it beloved in the Coachella Valley and beyond. Whether the new Chevron Championship can recapture that joyful ethos—or even wants to—remains to be seen.

For this year, the leap and other traditions remain intact. All Nippon Airways (ANA), which sponsored the



tournament for seven years, will remain a partner in 2022. For this year, a white bathrobe will still be given to the winner following the leap into Poppie's Pond. For this year, the Coachella Valley will still be the setting of the first golf major of the year.

The powers that be at IMG and the LPGA are well aware what this tournament has meant to players and fans for the past 50 years. Mollie Marcoux Samaan, who became commissioner of the LPGA in May, said at the announcement in October that the tradition and history of the tournament would not be lost. "We do not make the move lightly. Since David Foster and Dinah Shore created this competition in 1972, it has held a special place in the hearts of our players and fans around the world. No matter where it is held, Dinah and her influence, along with the history built at Mission Hills, will be an

integral part of The Chevron Championship. We thank ANA and Mission Hills for their tremendous support and look forward to celebrating the many years of tradition as we continue to add to its footprint in the history of women's sports."

Nostalgia and tradition aside, there's consensus that Chevron can bring the tournament and women's golf to new levels. "We could not be more excited to announce our partnership with Chevron," Samaan said. "Welcoming another leading global company to our portfolio of sponsors that believes in the power of the LPGA to inspire women leaders, to showcase human performance at the highest level and to highlight the importance of diversity and inclusion in all facets of life, is truly game-changing for us. We are so grateful for Chevron's




extraordinary commitment to the LPGA and to the overall player experience and look forward to a long and successful relationship."

Lydia Ko, who serves as player director on the LPGA Board of Directors and who won the tournament in 2016, echoed those same sentiments. "Having a global company like Chevron to support women's golf is really exciting for everyone involved with the LPGA. Their aspirations for growing this major together with the LPGA and IMG are amazing for the future of our Tour. We have all made some lovely memories at Mission Hills over the years, which we will enjoy celebrating in 2022 and take with us to The Chevron Championship's new home, where I know we will make many more."

IMG, too, has made a commitment to finding ways to honor the tournament's history and traditions while moving it into a new era. How exactly that will play out remains unknown. But the fact that they've established a special Players Advisory Board and enlisted Shore's daughter, Melissa Montgomery, to help guide the tournament's transition and shape its future, should be seen as a good sign to golf fans everywhere.



ission Hills Country Club and the "Dinah Shore." For 50 years, they've gone together like irons and woods inside your favorite golf bag until now. This April marks the end of an era as the LPGA major championship — a.k.a. the ANA Inspiration now called the Chevron Championship — is teeing off one final time in the Coachella Valley between March 28 and April 3,2022.

Chevron U.S.A. has stepped in as the new tournament sponsor for a six-year contract, which means that the tournament, which has been held at the iconic Mission Hills Country Club in Rancho Mirage since 1972, will move to the Houston area in 2023. ANA (All Nippon Airways) is still involved as a sponsor. With the move comes an increase in the purse from \$3.1 million to \$5 million, with \$750,000 going to the winner.

New spring dates for the tournament move will eliminate the timing conflict with the Augusta National Women's Amateur, played the same first week of April in Georgia, the home of the Masters. NBC Sports has also pledged to televise the event, while the tournament has been televised in its entirety by Golf Channel in recent years.

The tournament has a rich history, founded in April 1972 by singer and actress Dinah Shore and Colgate-Palmolive chairman David Foster. It made its debut as the "Colgate-Dinah Shore Winner's Circle," the richest event on the LPGA Tour, and became a major in 1983. It has held many official sponsored titles, all of which included Dinah Shore's name until 2000. Since then it has been titled as the Nabisco Championship, Kraft Nabisco Championship and ANA Inspiration as of 2014. Through 2022, it is one of two LPGA majors that has been held at the same course annually, alongside The Evian Championship.

The move has created some emotional divots from players, fans and organizers, given that the tournament is deeply intertwined



with the history of Mission Hills Country Club itself. Many past winners as well as prominent athletes and community members own residences at Mission Hills, often ranked as one of the country's premier private clubs. There are three championship golf courses (54 holes), tennis courts of various surfaces, a spa and sports center. It has been owned by ClubCorp since 1993.

The 1,760-acre master-planned recreational resort community with golf course homes, tennis condos and fairway estates features homes that range in price from the \$200,000s up to around \$4 million each in eight distinct communities.

The first course at Mission Hills was designed by Desmond Muirhead and opened 51 years ago in 1971. Now known as the Dinah Shore Tournament Course, this is where the ANA Inspiration has been played.

The second course was designed by golf legend Arnold Palmer and opened in 1979. A third course was added in 1988, originally called the Dinah Shore Course, but with Dinah Shore's name being transferred to the old course after her death in 1994, it was renamed as the Pete Dye Challenge Course.

In addition to hosting the ANA Inspiration for 50 years, which is golfs longest-running tournament continuously held at the same locale, Mission Hills has also played host to the American Junior Golf Association's ClubCorp Mission Hills Desert Junior since 1982. Other Club events have included the PGA Club Professional Championship, U.S. Open Qualifier, U.S. National Seniors, LPGA Section Qualifier and both the PGA and LGPA Qualifying Schools in addition to many others.

While golf often defines much of Mission Hills, the Club also boasts a noteworthy tennis history. The facility features 34 courts, with 10 grass and four clay surfaces. In 1976, former top-ranked American Dennis Ralston became Mission Hills' director of tennis, and a year later Martina Navratilova became the club's first resident teaching pro. In 1978, the Club hosted the Davis Cup hardcourt final, with the United States defeating Great Britain 4-1 and John McEnroe winning the final match. It was the first Davis Cup to be held west of the Mississippi. In 1977, Greg Norman, Dave Stockton and Jerry Pate participated in the World Cup Event.

Tennis great Roscoe Tanner nabbed victory twice in the American Airlines Tennis Games, the precursor to the current BNP Paribas Open, originally held at the Mission Hills Country Club for a five-year run from 1976 to 1980. In that first year, Bjorn Borg beat Arthur Ashe. In 1978, Tanner and Ray Moore took the winner's cup at the Games in doubles, garnering them the cover on "Palm Springs Life." (See the feature on Roscoe Tanner in

the February/March, 2022 issue of "Desert Golf & Tennis").

It's hard to know if a new tournament will adopt the annual tradition where the winner jumps into Poppie's Pond at the 18th green, initiated in 1988 by Amy Alcott, winner of the then-Nabisco Dinah Shore. The Pond is lovingly named after the nickname given to Terry Wilcox (longtime tournament director) by his grandchildren.

The other popular event linked to the ANA Inspiration/Chevron Championship is "The Dinah," officially known as Club Skirts Dinah Shore Weekend, a five-day series of wild weekend pool parties and concerts for the lesbian community. The event will remain in Palm Springs with event dates changing to September.

It will take some adjustment to process the move of the ANA Inspiration, but at the end of the day, The Mission Hills Country Club is much more than a tournament host. It is an institution that symbolizes the modern history of golf and tennis as well as the evolution of life in the desert, integral to drawing international tourist attention and adoration.

We can look forward to Mission Hills continuing to play an important role in the zeitgeist of desert life, shaped by and reflecting the values of everyone who lives and visits the Coachella Valley.



Gerald Ford is known to have had two hole-in-ones on hole number 11.



Rooted and where it continues to flourish, Tamarisk has locked within its archives thousands of special memories and stories. Bob Hope claimed Tamarisk as one of his favorite places to hang-out with his many friends. Dinah Shore enjoyed many golflessons from legendary teaching pro, Johnny Revolta in the 1970's. And the club served as host club to the Bob Hope Desert Classic for 19 years in the early days of the legendary tournament.

Members today rave about the newly remodeled clubhouse and furnishings with its modern and upscale look. 





For the first time since 2019, Indian Wells Tennis Garden hosted the BNP Paribas Open in March.

Held five months after last year's historic tournament (the first to ever be held in October), the 2022 BNP Paribas Open was a welcome return to normalcy, as thousands of fans gathered to watch a familiar face—three-time champion Rafael Nadal—strive to make history yet again.

The outcome wasn't exactly what Nadal's fans hoped for (as he was ultimately defeated in the finals match 6-3, 7-6(5), while competing against rising star Taylor Fritz). However, the championship's return to its usual timeslot proved that Tennis Paradise is, without question, back in full swing.

The First American Men's Champion Since 2001

After defeating Nadal, thereby ending his 20-match win streak and preventing him from winning a record-tying 37th ATP Masters 1000 title, Taylor Fritz not only claimed his second ATP Tour victory, but also lifted his first-ever ATP Masters 1000 trophy in his first Masters 1000 final appearance.

And to add yet another exclamation point to his win, he also became the first American male BNP Paribas Open champion since Andre Agassi won in 2001. Not to mention, he showed that the game's oldest stars can indeed be defeated by some of its youngest, as he became the youngest male champion at Indian Wells Tennis Garden since 2011 (when Novak Djokovic began to make his mark on the game).

Additionally, he is the youngest American to win a men's singles title at the BNP Paribas Open since Michael Chang in 1996, and the youngest American to win a Masters 1000 singles title since Andy Roddick in 2006.





Prior to his victory, Fritz struggled with an ankle injury, "thinking that there was no way [he] could possibly play". A few hours later, he achieved a dream he had been focused on achieving

"This is just one of those childhood dreams that you never even think could come true," Fritz said. "I just can't even—I just keep saying no, no, no way it's real."

As evidenced by his grasp on the trophy, the victory was certainly real, as are his prospects of becoming one of tennis's most prominent stars in the years to come.

Swiatek Claims Her Third WTA 1000 Title

For the second time in as little as two months, Iga Swiatek won another WTA 1000 singles title after defeating Greece's Maria Sakkari 6-4, 6-1. Securing her fifth tour-level title, Swiatek also achieved the second most significant win of her career thus far, after her 2020 French Open title.

As the first Polish person to win the BNP Paribas Open, Swiatek is enjoying a rivalry with Sakkari as well, who has risen to No. 3 in the world rankings (compared to Swiatek, who is No. 2, the highest-ranked Polish female since Agnieszka Radwa ska 10 years ago). Since losing three consecutive matches to Sakkari, wi tek has won her last two matches against her, while also claiming 20 match wins during this season so far—more than anyone else on the WTA Tour.

"We started a pretty cool rivalry," Swiatek said. "I think it's going to last for, like, 10 more years. I'm sure we're going to play many more finals."

Despite the loss, Sakkari is focusing only on the positives.

"I really believe I took a step forward, even though I lost. It was a week that will have a special place in my heart," she stressed. "I know it sounds kind of weird because I did not win the tournament, but I felt like I improved as a player this week. I'm just going to take that with me and move forward."

If the BNP Paribas Open is of any indication, women's tennis may very well have a special rivalry for fans to enjoy for the unforeseen future.

Doubles Champions Relish Their Victories

For the second time in four years, John Isner and Jack Sock won the BNP Paribas Open's men's doubles championship, defeating Santiago González and Édouard Roger-Vasselin 7-6(4), 6-3. Sock, who also won the doubles championship at Indian Wells Tennis Garden in 2015, was ecstatic about claiming yet another victory with his "big brother".

"It's an unbelievable feeling. To win this is always a good feeling," he emphasized. "To do it with basically a big brother is an ever better feeling."





Isner agreed, while focusing on the odds the duo had of winning in the first place.


"It's good to come back here with Jack," he said. "We were fortunate enough to get a wildcard—and we won it all."

On the other hand, Xu Yifan and Yang Zhaoxuan won their first doubles team titles, as they defeated Asia Muhammad and Ena Shibahara 7-5, 7-6(4).

A two-time Grand Slam finalist, Yifan was especially appreciative of her parents and friends, as they helped her achieve her dreams.

"I'm standing here not just by myself, but my parents and friends—I'd like to thank all of you from the bottom of my heart," she stated. "Without all of you and your support and encouragement, I [could] not stand here [as a champion]."



There is no shortage of private and semi-private pickleball options around the desert

nce upon a time, there were four pickleball courts in the Coachella Valley desert. Cahuilla Park in Palm Desert was one of the early oasis facilities. Fast forward eight years and the growth of the game can be seen in every park, country club, and gated community. The valley became a hotbed of pickleball activity, culminating with one of the world's leading sports venues, The Indian Wells Tennis Garden hosting the Margaritaville National Pickleball Championship.

If you are already an avid player wondering where to get your fix or perhaps a tennis player looking to relive former glory then here's a handful of the top destinations around the desert.

In the category of public parks, there are really only three hotspots that most pickleball junkies frequent. In the Palm Springs area, Demuth Park on Mesquite Ave is the place to go. With 12 courts and a delightful crowd of locals, you'll be sure to get a good game and plenty of laughs along the way. Heading east on Country Club Drive is the famous Freedom Park. This eight-court public facility was the evolution from the original offering in the Desert, Cahuilla Park. The city recently made some very welcome upgrades to allow for more seating, extra room around the courts, and most importantly, some of the best lighting you'll find outside of Indian Well Tennis Garden. During peak season from approximately 8 am - 11 am each and every morning and after 5 pm in the afternoon you'll find an eclectic bunch battling for bragging rights. South of Freedom Park, nestled near the La Quinta Cove is the last little gem in the public arena, Fritz Burns Park on 52nd Ave boasts 8 courts, and much like Freedom Park, it attracts a nice mix of newcomers and seasoned players alike.

There is no shortage of private and semi-private pickleball options around the desert, the old adage 'If you build it they will come' is alive and well. Pickleball is now a staple part of every major country club and gated community from Palm Springs to Indio and beyond. All of the most exclusive clubs have courts and member play, however, there is a handful that stand out for having more active programs and tuition available.

Indian Well Tennis Garden can't really be mentioned in the same light as the others, although it does host the national championships in November. Its pickleball courts only exist for that period and therefore can't be considered a club, per se. Let's start off on the eastern part of the Valley with PGA West in La Quinta, CA'. Known predominantly for its world-class golf courses, PGA West has 16 Pickleball courts and a drop-in fee for guests of members. If you're in the market for something closer to the heart of the desert then Desert Horizons Country Club, off Hwy 111 is certainly worth checking out. This little gem is also home to Kim Jagd, one of the game's best Senior Pro players and this writer's firstever mixed doubles partner. Tennis and Pickleball lessons are available with the resident coach Caroline Vis, former top WTA player. Speaking of great players, Sherri Steinhauer, former LPGA great and budding senior pro pickleball player is an honorary member and wonderful ambassador to the game and her stomping grounds, Mission Hills Country Club. With 12 courts, and lessons available from former WTA player, Anna Maria Ruffles, as well as veteran Ric Moore, Mission Hills caters to most levels and also has league play.

Toscana Country Club offers a luxury setting, befitting of its exclusive membership in all its sports offerings, pickleball being no exception. With six courts, superb lighting, and competitive league play, Toscana is a great experience, especially for night play. Just north is another pickleball haven, Indian Ridge Country Club. Legend of the Desert, Randy Berg and newly appointed head

professional, Mathew Yavorsky handle programming with ease and sunny disposition. Indian Ridge CC has seven courts and offers lessons, competitive play, and entertaining exhibition matches. Right next door is the former home to Marcin Rozpedski, The Lakes Country Club. As the world's number one singles player during the years 2015 - 2017, Rozpedski grew the program leaps and bounds. Donnie Felich, a 5.0 player and top instructor now runs the program with nine permanent courts used year-round.

We have saved the best to last because let's be honest, if you were just told about Palm Desert Resort Country Club at the beginning, then you may not have kept reading. PDR, as it's referred to, is the best of both worlds. It's a private club, for the public, offering yearly, monthly, and even weekly memberships to one and all. With 24 courts and over 700 members, PDR is truly the heart of Pickleball in the Valley. Regular league play, round robins, clinics, camps, and private lessons are all available. The best of the best come to practice with their peers and you'll find some of the best teaching alongside a team of highly qualified coaches, all under the watchful eye of the incomparable Charis Romano.

The Coachella Valley has always been known for golf and tennis. Slowly but surely, and thanks to the variety of people and facilities like those aforementioned, it's also become one of the world's most endearing pickleball meccas.


DESERT ARC 11TH ANNUAL GOLF CLASSIC

Rick Dees,

Renaissance man

From "Disco Duck" to BYO Channel, the entertainment genius is always ahead of the times

Then most people hear a reference to "Disco Duck," the first person that usually does and should come to mind is the ubiquitous Rick Dees, the mega-talented entertainment master who created and performed the satirical number-one hit in 1976 while a disc-jockey in Memphis, Tennessee. The song earned a 1977 People's Choice Award for Favorite New Song in addition to staying on the Billboard Hot 100 for a week before remaining in the top 10 for 10 weeks and hitting the top 20 on the Billboard Hot Soul Singles chart peaking at number 15. The song sold six million copies.

In our interview with Dees, when asked if he minded the ongoing association to "Disco Duck" by the general public, his answer is, "I love it!" He graciously acknowledges that the song changed his life, getting him booked on American Bandstand as well as being played in the film, "Saturday Night Live."

Rick Dees has become known around the world as a comedic performer, television host and renowned radio personality with an enthusiastic charm and witty manner. His number one internationally syndicated radio show, "The Rick Dees Weekly Top 40", is heard each weekend by more than 70 million people around the world, including virtually every city in the United States (including in the Palm Springs area), 125 countries, 27 ships at sea, and on the Armed Forces Radio Network. He's even heard in Beijing, China, representing the English-speaking radio show to entertain Chinese listeners on weekends.

Dees may be recognized most readily for having hosted the toprated morning radio show in Los Angeles on KIIS-FM for 23 years, turning the station into the number one revenue generating radio station in America shortly after joining in 1981. Dees has been the recipient of numerous awards, including being named Billboard Radio Personality Of The Year ten years in a row. Additional honors have included the Marconi Award, induction into the National Radio Hall Of Fame, and induction into the National Association Of Broadcasters' Hall Of Fame.

Rick Dees is all about making other people feel good, for which his life and his gracious temperament are integral parts of the playbook. In school, Dees says that he was extremely ambitious, becoming an Eagle Scout at 15. While at the University of North



Carolina in Chapel Hill, as a member of Pi Kappa Alpha, he gained notoriety for being the first Amway salesman, going on to inspire others to find Amway success.

Part of the formula behind his marketing brilliance has been to play only number one hit songs. He determined early on while doing radio and television work, including his time as host of "Solid Gold" in 1984-85, that this was what people wanted to hear. He's always been ahead of the curve in terms of predicting what would resonate with audiences.

Dees' innate ability to "read his audience" and to hone-in on what the world finds funny has distinguished him as a consummate businessman and entrepreneur outside the radio world. He is the founder/partner of what is now the "Cooking Channel" on Discovery Networks. He loves to bake and is an accomplished pastry chef. He has published a desserts cookbook, "Rick Dees All-Time Top 40 Greatest Desserts," which has received rave reviews. Dees graciously donates all proceeds from book sales to the Salvation Army. He also has a handicap of 6 on the links, and he caddied at The Masters in Augusta, Georgia for PGA champion Mark O'Meara.

One of Dees' more recent joys includes spending time at his sustainable farm in Kentucky where he grows organic wheat, corn, and a variety of crops and where he raises Angus cattle. He's proud of what he's created at Sweetbrier Farm, where he's also built a recording studio giving him the freedom to work when he's away from his Toluca Lake home.

There's an example of Dees' good will, a story we received permission to share, that involves his visit to Shields Date Garden in Indio while in the Coachella Valley recently to participate in the Patrick Warburton Celebrity Golf Tournament to benefit St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. When Dees went inside the store to pick up date shakes for his family, in walked six very weary firefighters. Dees immediately decided to "pay it forward" by covering the tab for all of the firefighters' shakes before tipping the clerk with a new, crisp \$100 bill. Finally, one of the firefighters realized what was happening and just who was treating them to shakes. He protested, but of course Dees insisted on taking care of the bill and reminded the firefighters of his and everyone's gratitude for their life-saving work in the face of danger. For Dees, these are the personal experiences that matter the most.

As Dees says, "The world is coin operated, so why fight it? It's fun to over tip — it makes people feel valued. Give that bit of extra to the valet!"

Dees enjoys visiting the Coachella Valley and especially loves to dine at his friend Bob Cunard's La Quinta restaurant, Cunard's





Sandbar. Dees says, "I get the biggest kick every time I go in there and see Bill Baker on the piano. Sure enough, Bill starts playing 'Disco Duck', and I'm not sure who loves it more — the other guests or me."

The most recent entrepreneurial endeavor from Dees is the creation of his innovative hit music mobile app, called "BYO Channel." The app streams an ever-expanding array of music channels and invites users to build their own personalized channels for free using the app's growing 40-million track song library. And, the "Rick Dees Hit Music" app now puts the "Rick Dees Weekly Top 40" and "Daily Dees" directly into the hands of every smartphone holder.

Dees is especially proud of his expansion into the app universe to bring customized entertainment to even more listeners and fans. As Dees says, "When people ask me, 'where are you on?' my answer is literally 'everywhere!"




SET UP: wide stance (hip or shoulder width), ball of left instep (LEFT ball position for "LOFT /. LAUNCH), spine & shoulders slightly tilted up to the target, feet balanced but a few (5-10 %) more on the left leg, tee height (1/2 way above) golf ball (experiment with tee height), grip a bit "stronger" (turned a click to the right more than a seven iron), arms connected to chest.



ROTATION & EXTENSION / TURN:

depending on injury & body, & any limitations (turn with your BACK & HIPS) turning to about 45*, left knee is pointing down to the ball, back is facing the target as best as your body can do, both arms extended to what I call the "shelf" in the take away (3:00 pm or ½ swing position), club will be parallel to the feet line.



"L" OR HINGE / LEVERS: WRIST COCK / HINGE: Add in a lever, most golfer add in too much "left elbow" bending. Try to push out your left arm into a long/possibly locked position & create a "L" feel with your wrists. The left & long left arm is your "fulcrum" for your radius of your golf swing. The left arm is like a "spoke on a tire" for the swing".



TOP OF THE SWING: the club will go up as far as your body will allow (some it's ¾ swing), if you have limitations or injuries. Some golfers might be able to get to the top (club parallel to the feet lie, pointing the club to the flag pin, thumbs will feel like they will be hitch hiking toward the flag.



DOWNSWING: you want to start with the ground & your feet (so many golfers start with the hands / incorrect).. start with the feet , turn both knees toward the flag in, the heals will spin to the left, Sitting / squatting feel, both heals will spin to the right, you will rotate your weight to the LEFT side of the body will pushing off the floor, then you rotate your hips & push off the ground (it's called ground force). keeping your angles (keeping your wrist Hinge), rotate your weight, impact will be next.



IMPACT: you will feel more weight shift to the left, pushing off the floor, both arms are elongated, club face square to where you want to start the ball, the hips & stomach will be at an angle at impact (not facing the ball set up), but starting to face at approximately 11 am on your swing (if the golf ball square was 12:00 noon).



JUST PAST IMPACT: extension & turn: the arms are going feel super long, hips are starting to follow the ball/target.



RELEASE OF THE CLUB: the club will "release" as the body turns & the forearms cross each other. The legs, stomach, feet, chest, etc will face the target.



FINISH: the club, finish, momentum will pull your body around to a high weight shift finish, your entire body with will be on the left foot.

DRIVER DRILLS:

- 1. Shot punch drill: 10-50 punch shots / swing working on your angles, balance, weight transfer (start slow then add speed). This creates muscle memory & skill building
- 2. **Fast V's slow:** two golf balls super "SLOW Motion", then two golf drivers as fast as you can (without falling over). This drill creates speed, balance, distance
- 3. **Swing Heavy items**: two-three clubs stacked, momentous, club stick pro (weighted trading aids), kettle ball or sixeight lb. ball in the gym
- 4. **Speed drills**: run in place 30 seconds (as fast as you can), take a 15 second break, repeats as many times as your body allows



That said, customers are chomping at the bit to return to the joy of dining on site at their favorite restaurants, many of which have now added and kept outdoor seating areas lending capacity and ambiance.

Mitch's on El Paseo Prime Seafood

Mitch's on El Paseo is an example of promises delivered and expectations exceeded. This upscale eatery draws attention and keeps it solidly fixed with its inviting façade and its enticing menu concoctions.

Mitch's serves lunch and dinner, including prime seafood, sashimi, featured wines and sake, martinis and other craft cocktails. Its high ceilings and expansive interior showcase scenic mountain views and the desert skyline. With dining spaces on upper and lower levels as well as on the picturesque patio, there are also two bars with flat screen televisions, a sushi bar, eyecatching artwork and welcoming fire pits. Guests can often anticipate a greeting from friendly owners Mitch and Milissa Epstein.

You'll do right to start with bi-color beet salad or dynamite baked oysters. Dinner entrées from the sea serve up Chilean sea bass Misoyaki, jumbo shrimp and scallops, grilled Atlantic salmon and Canadian lobster tail duet, among others. Land selections include grilled beef tenderloin filet, bone in pork chop and roasted maple leaf duck, any of which is delicious with a side of shoestring truffle fries or sauteed spinach.

The wine list is top quality, with selections such as Rombauer zinfandel and Grgich Hills chardonnay.

The sushi bar with its own seating area

is worth a separate visit to sample the crunchy shrimp, caterpillar and orange dragon rolls accompanied by hot Sho Chicku Bai sake or cold Urakasumi (Junmai Ginjo) sake.

Desserts are part of the cheer, with chocolate balloon cake, strawberry butter cake, baked apple dumpling and more. By all means, do not share.

Cocktails such as the West Indies bomber and the prairie smash pair well with linguine pesto Genovese, striped bass, filet mignon with green peppercorn sauce, grilled lamb chops, roasted leg of veal, tagliatelle Emiliana (flat noodles with peas, ham and mushrooms) and numerous others.

Desserts are house made, meaning you will regret it if you don't try the tiramisu or

the cannolo filled with sweet cream and cheese.

Il Corso Palm Springs is situated adjacent to the Kimpton Rowan Hotel in downtown Palm Springs, and, like the Palm Desert locale, the design features wood flooring, tile, slate and marble accents and natural elements throughout.

Chef Claudio Marfia, Mario's son, has taken the helm here, bringing a more regionalized approach to the Italian cuisine, with selections such as pollo Vesuvio (bone-in stewed half chicken), cioppino, ravioli ricotta e spinaci and many others.



The Need for Speed The new Bentley Continental GT Speed



hat do you do when you have a history of more than 100 years building luxury, custom cars that knock the doors off the competition? You make something a little bit better.

The new Bentley Continental GT Speed puts performance first in the design elements so this Grand Tourer. None of the luxury or comfort is lost in the making of this adrenaline-pounding machine. The GT Speed comes equipped with an upgraded version of Bentley's renowned 6.0-litre W-12 TSI engine, delivering 650 horsepower. The 664 pound-foot of torque is neck-breaking for a large car weighing over 5,000 pounds. Top speed? The GT Speed reportedly hits its limit at 208 mph and boasts a 0-60 mph time of 3.5 seconds. While these are modest increases from the previous model, even a modest increase over the 100 years would put the GT in stratospheric territory.

Both engine and transmission keep drivers' needs first. When in SPORT mode, the response of the twin-turbocharged W-12 is mind-number as the throttle stays in the power band longer by upshifting later, or downshifting earlier. This Bentley is at home on the track as well as on the showroom floor.

Noticeable improvement has been made in the transmission response. The eight-speed, dual-clutch transmission shifts twice as fast in SPORT mode as in the standard model. Bentley doesn't give the Speed moniker to every model, but this GT deserves the name.

Not only does the Continental GT Speed offer impressive performance, to maximize efficiency the model benefits from Bentley's Stop-Start technology. At rest, the engine stops — not unusual for vehicles looking to build efficiency into function — what's unusual, is that also at near-to-stop speeds.

Bentley's Variable Displacement system shuts down half of the engine's 12 cylinders under certain conditions with the transitions between the two being imperceptible to the driver. Intake and exhaust valves, fuel injection and ignition are all shut down on defined cylinders, with the engine running as a six-cylinder for improved fuel efficiency.

Bentley's new chasis system is adding excitement in its maneuverability. At low and medium speeds, the GT Speed's rear wheels are steered in the opposite direction to the front wheels to aid a rapid change of direction. This feature creates a turn-on-a-dime sensation. Drivers can feel certain that they have what it takes



to take turns and respond to the unexpected when they need it. At high speeds, the rear wheels steer in the same direction as the front. This improves stability.

For the first time in a Bentley, the latest generation of the Continental GT Speed introduces the use of an electronic rear differential (eLSD).

Paired specifically with the traction control and active chassis systems, the eLSD makes the GT as stable as a tanker ship in a storm. The rolls laterally and longitudinally are minimized without sacrificing a connection to the road.

In SPORT mode, the eLSD has been tuned to balance on and off throttle adjustability, improved turn-in response and increased straight-line performance. Now drivers can dial in the feel they want and gives themselves a completely customized driving experience.

Cornering is a dream in the GT and you can't help but look for the next opportunity to lean into a hairpin and carve through an sturn. This system of eLSD and four-wheel steering create precision like few other vehicles of this kind. The wheels seem to cling to the asphalt like a spider on a web. Power gets delivered to the rear wheels in the acceleration band so that nothing is wasted from accelerator to wheel.

Obviously, no luxury is sparred when it comes to the cabin. The handcrafted hide and matching Alcantara, seats and steering wheel feel as if they belong in a luxury linen collection as much as in a car's interior. The "Speed" insignia winks to the well-informed who know that this car is beyond special.

Bentley built its business on the ability to customize for discerning buyers. With 15 main and 11 secondary hide leather colors, few GT's will look the same. The center console can be finished in new dark tint engine-turned aluminum, adding something truly unique to the inside of a traditional space.



As with all Continental GTs, the Speed offers four seats and exceptional luggage capacity considering this machine is hitting quarter mile speed in just over 11 seconds. You would imagine that the GT Speed has a luxurious price tag too. You'd be right. The retail on the hard-top runs \$27,000 and the convertible eclipses \$300,000. Chances are, you'll need speed of your own to get one before they're all sold.

From the Black Pearl, the pirate ship in the ◀ movie "Pirates of the Caribbean," to "Girl with a Pearl Earring," the world-famous painting by Dutch artist Johannes Vermeer, the glistening pearl has inspired imaginative symbolism for centuries. Ancient lore considers the pearl to be the daughter of the Moon, as well as associated with the planet Venus, because, like pearls, the Roman goddess of love Venus came from the sea.

In the late 1950s and early 60s, pearl purveyor Salvador Assael was the first to bring South Sea pearls to the West, and he single-handedly introduced Tahitian pearls to the world in the late 1970s. The founder of the House of Assael, along with his successor and wife Christina Lang Assael, established a legacy that continues to lead the fine jewelry industry today. Assael maintains a focus on conservation and the importance of healthy oceans for pearl farmers to cultivate beautiful gems.

Today the "pearl revolution" has been embraced by both female and male stars such as Penelope Cruz, Julia Garner, Nick Jonas, Pharrell Williams, and Harry Styles, as well as on screen in period pieces like "The Favourite," "The Crown," "Bridgerton," "Downton Abbey," "The Gilded Age," and "Spencer." Sarah Jessica Parker was rarely seen without her pearls in "And Just Like That." Lily Collins proudly wore a Chanel pearl double strand necklace in "Emily in Paris," and Lady Gaga glammed it up with oversize pearls in "House of Gucci."

Considered the most exclusive and coveted of all cultured pearl varieties, South Sea pearls are exceptionally high quality and among the rarest pearls to be found. The Round South Sea Cultured Pearl Necklace is a sublime example of this prototype, featuring 25 large pearls (16mm-16.4mm) accented by a dazzling platinum ball clasp blanketed with 72 white diamonds (6.11 tcw.). Large, luxurious, and long-lasting, this classic yet bold piece measures 17 inches around. \$298,000.

Winter Branches Earrings, part of the Four Seasons series, look elegant any time of year. Two stunning silvery blue South Sea pearls (14.3mm-18mm) fit at the earlobes and connect to a series of delicate platinum branches that lead to 48 blue Akoya pearls (7.5mm-9mm), dangling gently like iridescent leaves. Each pearl "leaf" is unique, like a snowflake. Forty oval briolette diamonds (14.82 tcw.) accent the branches along with 48 round diamonds (0.67 tcw.). Clip backs provide comfort, and each earring measures 3 inches. \$116,000.

Elegant and just a bit edgy, the Aquamarine and **Tahitian Pearl Earrings** are a dreamy set, inspired by the serenity of the sea. The smooth, glassy surface of the four natural-colored Tahitian cultured pearls (11.6mm-12.1mm) in each earring reflect the cool blue of each elongated emerald cut aquamarine (44.79 tcw.) positioned between the pearl sentinels. Each aquamarine is set in platinum, measuring 2 inches each in length and finished with clip backs. \$48,000.



The Baroque South Sea Cultured Pearl Necklace is a sensuous dreamscape of multicolored luster. The 47 non-round pearls (14.1mm-20.6mm) in this 34-inch opera-length strand are beloved for their "perfectly imperfect" organic shapes, the defining feature of baroque pearls. The round ball clasp, displaying 312 sparkling, pavé white diamonds (3.01 tcw.), is set in 18K white gold. Naturally beautiful, these pearls are to be appreciated in their natural state, with no faceting or cutting. \$100,000.

The Yellow Diamond and Golden South Sea Pearl Earrings feature two fancy vellow radiant cut diamonds (11.74 tcw.) surrounded by intricate 18K gold borders resembling frames of tightly woven gold threads. Two detachable round golden South Sea pearls (15.6mm X 15.5mm) imbued with luminosity and warmth are attached each diamond, to complementing the rich hues of the diamond and gold composition and bringing out the best from every angle. \$258,400.

The "In Reverse" Bi-Color Tourmaline and Tahitian Cultured Pearl Earrings present a magnificently mismatched statement that results in a harmonious unity. The inverted geometry of the single round natural colored pearl (14.2mm) and the single drop pearl (17.7mm X 12.8mm) combines with a single pear shape Nigerian bi-color tourmaline (11.34 tcw.) on one earring and with a single round Nigerian bi-color tourmaline (11.08 tcw.) on the other. Set in 18K rose gold, these ear drops measure 1 inch each. \$42,000.

The breathtaking South Sea Pearl and Diamond Tiara-Necklace by Sean Gilson for Assael cleverly converts from crowning glory to contemporary choker. The pearl and diamond bubble element simply lifts off the tiara to attach to a half-strand of 45 round matching South Sea cultured pearls (8.72mm-14.68mm). Nestled in between the bubbles are 18 European "old-European-cut" white diamonds (6.25 tcw.), sparkling like little stars among the heavens. The piece, set in platinum and 18K white gold, is connected to a detachable pearl assemblage and measures 15 inches around. \$140,000.
