Are you up to the CHALLENGE?











ickie Fowler is a colorful, interesting fellow and can win golf tournaments. He's good with crowds and talkative. So, what's the big deal about that? It's a big deal because for all the massive piles of cash at stake in pro golf today, the sport lacks the charming, more colorful players of vesteryear. It's not that pro golf attracts the very drab; it's more likely that there is so much money on the line that players today don't dare take their eyes off it. A missed putt these days might cost somebody six figures.

Dustin Johnson, in point of fact, earned more money in one week in a LIV event last year than the great Arnold Palmer won in his entire 52-year career!

Tournament crowds are already big and TV revenues are colossal, so today's players don't likely feel a need to entertain galleries with their personalities, like

Palmer, Trevino and the hard-partying Doug Sanders did in the old days.

Before prize money exploded like a nuclear bomb, there were a lot of players who used their Tour cards just to see the country and have fun. They knew they wouldn't get rich out there, so their goal was have the time of their lives before going back to work in the humdrum of a golf shop. But today, even the guys down near the bottom can line their pockets, so those guys who played for fun are gone.

Fowler is now on the comeback trail after two years in a slump. Okay, he isn't exactly a Trevino—the Merry Mex who told jokes on every tee and once spooked Nicklaus on the first tee of a playoff by tossing a rubber snake at his feet. But among a tour overloaded with painfully serious players, he is a crowd favorite who adds a needed spice to the mix.

First, Fowler comes from a working class background—his dad owned trucks and influenced Rickie to become a motocross daredevil till he broke bones in his ankle in a dirt bike crash when he was 13. That's when he got serious about golf. Palmer was the son of a working class club professional and he was not allowed to mix with members or their kids. With his muscled arms and unbridled swing, Palmer always looked like may be he'd just jumped down off the back of a truck.

In what is still a conservative sport that travels to stuffy places, Fowler has dared to get tattooed. He has more skin ink than any pro on the tour. His maternal grandparents are Japanese, his middle name is Tanaka, and the Japanese script on his left forearm honors his maternal grandfather, Yukata Tanaka. [His paternal grandmother is a Native American, a member of the Navajo tribe).

He has a small "F" representing his Fowler family name tattooed on his right wrist. Then there's a "G" tattooed on the outside of his left forearm, honoring Georgia Veach, the daughter of a Seattle minister who was diagnosed with a rare brain disorder when she was four months old. On his right forearm are the five Olympic rings, commemorating his selection to the 2016 Ryder Cup team, which competed in Rio as the first and only official Olympic golf event.

On the inside of his left wrist is a tattoo representing the signature of the late Barry McDonnell, Fowler's first golf coach when he was seven. The tattoo "XV" on his ring finger represents the Roman numeral for 15, the day he married Allison Stokke, a former professional pole vaulter—and the small cross on his right hand index finger commemorates his faith.

Fowler isn't known as a partier in the mold of Doug Sanders, but he has some similarity as a sartorial fan-favorite fashion icon. On the final day of every tournament, he shows up in the bright orange school colors of his alma mater Oklahoma State, and he tools around in an orange Ferrari. He actually does still have some fun with the guys: Since 2016, he has been going on spring break trips with golfers Jordan Spieth, Justin Thomas and Smylie Kaufman, to Baker's Bay, Bahamas.

After a fine amateur and collegiate record, he earned his Tour card in 2009 at just 20 years old. He managed one secondplace finish, then won nearly \$3 million his sophomore season on the Tour, and finally broke through with his first victory at the

Wells Fargo Classic in 2012. His best season has been 2017 when he won the Honda Classic and had a second- and a third-place finish on his way to his best season (\$6 million and a seventh place ranking in FedEx Cup standings). He finished second in the Masters the next year and won at Phoenix in 2019, but then his game suddenly went south. In 2020, he failed to crack the \$1 million mark for the first time since his rookie year. His winnings were only slightly more in 2021 and 2022 as he dropped way down the list to 133rd and 134th, respectively, and to 174th at the start of this season.

Without panicking, he started making changes. The first was to return to his initial coach from his early days on the Tour, Butch Harmon. Fowler says he feels bad that things didn't work out with coach John Tillery, but that he learned a lot from Tillery, allowing him to segue successfully back to Harmon and make changes. Harmon has worked with him to get a steeper swing plane to get his hands in a better hitting position. He was one of the top putters on Tour till he hit the slump, but he says feel and confidence have returned and he's rolling it like he used to.

As a result, in first four tournaments in this fall season, he has made three of four cuts with two top ten finishes. He put together rounds of 67-63-66-70 to finish one shot back of winner Keegan Bradley at the Zozo Championship in Japan in mid-October. For that finish, he pocketed nearly \$1 million, almost as much as he made in 22 events last season.

Things are looking bright ahead for Rickie Fowler. He turns 34 at the end of 2022, and while 34 might be an old timmer, he's still a fairly young golfer. It looks like there will be plenty of time for him to continue to make his mark on the Tour—a refreshing player who does not fit the cookie cutter mold. So, if you get out to a Tour event this year, look for the guy wearing the bright orange on Sunday and you should be in for an enjoyable time.














ow in its 64th year, the American Express tournament will take place at PGA West at La Quinta Country Club from Jan.16-22, with 156 PGA Tour pros competing from Thursday Jan. 19 to Sunday Jan. 22. The first three days of the schedule focus on the ever-popular pro-am—already sold out—during which 156 top amateurs have the opportunity to play with six PGA Tour professionals on three world-class golf courses at PGA West and La Quinta Country Club. It's the only pro-am on the PGA Tour that uses this format. The three courses in play are the Stadium Course at PGA West, the Nicklaus Tournament Course at PGA West and La Quinta Country Club.

Then there's the concert series. This year's headliners are Grammy winner and Voice coach Gwen Stefani on Friday Jan. 20 and Grammy winner and golfer Darius Rucker on Saturday Jan. 21.

Altogether tournament fans can expect a full week of compelling on-course competition and stellar entertainment.

Back in January 2022, American Express committed to sponsorship of the tournament through 2028, guaranteeing that the Coachella Valley tournament remains on the annual PGA Tour schedule for the next six seasons.

As of this writing, it's too early to say which PGA Tour professionals will take part in the 2023 edition of the American Express tournament. But there is one thing that we definitely do know: 2022 champion Hudson Swafford will not be returning to defend his title. Swafford is among the golf professionals who have left the PGA Tour and joined LIV Golf, meaning he's no longer permitted to compete in any PGA Tour-sanctioned tournaments. Whether the PGA Tour and LIV Golf will finally come to some



understanding in the future remains uncertain, but for now LIV players are excluded from PGA Tour events.

In addition to the concert series, there are a multitude of other amenities for tournament fans. All ticketholders have access to the Casamigos Deck, the open-air venue located on the 18th green, as well as to the Michelob ULTRA Beers for Birdies venue at the par-3 17th hole on the Stadium Course, aka Alcatraz. Each time a pro player birdies the 17th during tournament play, fans at this venue are rewarded with discounted brews. All ticketholders also have access to both concerts.

There are upgraded tickets available, too. Fans who purchase Champions Club tickets have exclusive access to the 18th green with prime views of the course as well as hosted breakfast, lunch and snacks all day, and a hosted bar. Champions Club ticketholders also have access to an upgraded concert-viewing section, adjacent to the stage with a hosted full bar, reserved upgraded restrooms, all three tournament courses and all public venues.

Club 18 is the tournament's newest premium venue. It's located directly behind the 18th green and provides premium ticketholders with a hosted lunch, beer, wine and cocktails, as well as the best seats to watch all the tournament action—perhaps while sipping a classic cocktail.

Grounds tickets start at \$50 (\$79 on concert days), Premium Passes start at \$125 and Champions Club tickets start at \$250. On concert days (Friday and Saturday, Jan. 20 and 21), Premium Pass and grounds ticketholders can purchase a concert upgrade for an additional \$100 per day that provides access to the VIP concertviewing area near the stage and a complimentary full bar during each concert.

While the tournament, entertainment and enviable perks for ticketholders are all central to the American Express golf tournament experience, there's another element that matters even more: charitable giving. The American Express organization, Impact Through Golf Foundation, is focused on providing funding to support health and wellness, youth sport, families, education and solutions for homelessness. Since the tournament's inception in 1960, this event has generated more than \$63 million for non-profit organizations across the Coachella Valley—and that amount doesn't include what was brought in from the 2022 edition of the tournament, which won't be announced until Spring of 2023.

Nonprofits have to apply each year to receive funds and finalist recipients are chosen from the entire applicant pool. This year's charity information includes a note that special consideration will be given to applicants from organizations that "are leading the way in Social Justice Reform, Diversity and Inclusion, and that support local small businesses."

Daily grounds tickets, Premium Pass tickets and Champions Club tickets are available online at www.theamexgolf.com through tournament week. Of course, there's a bonus for American Express cardholders. Fans purchasing tickets online with their American Express card receive a 20% discount off of their ticket order. To learn all you need to know, go online and check out the important spectator information at www.theamexgolf.com/spectator-info.

American Express brings two fan favorites to the tournament's 2023 concert series

Singer-songwriter Gwen Stefani, a California native, three-time Grammy winner and multi-platinum artist. She rose to stardom as the lead singer of No Doubt In the 1990s. Since then, she has not only had a highly successful career in music, she's also a successful entrepreneur, launching her own clothing line. Stefani is known for her eclectic personal style rooted in many different scenes and cultures, and for highly personal song lyrics based on events in her life. Today, she's well known as a coach on The Voice. She has collaborated with various current musicians, including husband Blake Shelton, with whom she shared a CMT award in 2020 for best collaborative video, and she had successful multi-year residency at Planet Hollywood's Zappos Theater in Las Vegas.

Darius Rucker also has three Grammy Awards. His career began with rock band Hootie & the Blowfish, for which he was lead singer and rhythm guitarist. Around 2008, Rucker turned to country music, not surprising given he was born and raised in Charleston, South Carolina. His third country album, *True Believers*, came out in 2013 and reached No. 1 on the U.S. Top Country Albums Billboard chart. His 2017 album, *When Was the*



Last Time, rose to No. 2 on the same chart. Darius Rucker the musician is well known. What may be less known is his connection to golf.

Rucker and his Hootie bandmates all played golf. He's been friends with Tiger Woods since they met in a bar in 1993 when Woods was 18. Rucker sang at Woods' wedding and at his father's funeral. He was a VIP guest of Team USA at the 2016 Ryder Cup, and he attended Arnold Palmer's funeral. The Darius Rucker Intercollegiate tournament is named for him. In 2019, Rucker was named an official ambassador for the PGA Tour and he's a brand ambassador for PXG golf. He says switching to PXG clubs took him from an eight to a 4-handicap without changing any other part of his game.

Rucker has played golf all over the world, but has a fondness for South Carolina courses, including Harbour Town, Dunes West, Dye Club at Barefoot Landing and Patriot's Point. His favorite, though, is Bulls Bay Golf Club, where he's a founding member.

"I like the pace of play and it's a beautiful course—fair but hard—which is what I ask of any course. Plus, it's my course and anyone likes their course. I love it out here."

LIV Golf vs the PGA Tour By Christine Loomis

The upstart tour has sent shockwaves through the golf world.
But does it have to be that way?



'n sporting events, competition is a good thing. In business, competition drives innovation and improvements. So, what's ▲the problem with the venerable PGA Tour facing competition from a new professional tour?

That's a loaded question, and the answer depends on whom you ask.

LIV chief executive Greg Norman and his LIV colleagues say the new tour will improve the sport as well as the bottom line and careers of its golfers.

Former LPGA great and longtime PGA Tour analyst Dottie Pepper has been quoted as saying LIV Golf is exhibition golf with no soul that's wrecking the sport, and that Norman's new venture is about "vengeance" toward the very organization that helped make him a superstar.

Tiger Woods, Rory McIlroy and a group of top PGA Tour players recently met to discuss how to "save" the PGA Tour in the face of this new competition. They reportedly worked on ways to reshape the Tour to be more competitive with LIV Golf, considering such changes as larger payouts to players, fewer tournaments and changes to tournament structure—which, frankly, sounds a lot like the LIV model.

PGA Tour supporters say LIV is all about money and its players are selling their souls. When you look at what LIV is offering its players, and what players have made so far on the events, it's hard to believe money isn'tt a significant factor.

Dustin Johnson just snagged \$4 million for sinking a putt in a sudden-death playoff at the LIV Golf Invitational-Boston, and his team won again, too, which added to his winnings.

In contrast, Cameron Smith took in \$2.5 million for winning the 2022 Open Championship, while Matt Fitzpatrick, winner of the 2022 U.S. Open, got \$3,150,000. Cameron Smith, No. 2 in the World Golf Rankings, earned nearly \$3.6 million in four majors this year, but could have earned \$4 million for winning just one event on the LIV tour, more than he won in all four majors combined.

PGA Tour players have traditionally had to commit to 20 tournaments per year vs. LIV Golfs current 14 annual events. Given that players are not employees of the PGA Tour but rather freelancers, they also pay their own expenses to tournaments, which comes out of their own earnings.



LIV has lured PGA and DP World Tour players with huge signing sums—Phil Mickelson reportedly received \$200 million to sign on, others getting \$100 million or more. The purse for each LIV event is \$25 million, with every single player getting a portion of that purse. Andy Ogletree finished 48th out of 48 players in LIV's first event and received \$120,000.

The structure of LIV Golf events has rankled many PGA stalwarts. Instead of 132 players or more for a PGA event, LIV events have just 48 players, which is why some have referred to them as exhibition golf rather than legitimate tournament play. LIV events are also only 54 holes vs. PGA's 72-hole tournaments. And LIV events feature a shotgun start, which some fans are finding confusing in terms of watching the players.

PGA Tour supporters have said the LIV model is going to shortchange young players, who won't be subjected to the same rigorous schedule and learning that older players experienced. As one noted, "The guys who join LIV are going to miss out on the

grind, what it takes to be a champion, to play in the great tournaments against the great players. It's hard work and you're not going to be a better player by playing 54-hole exhibition matches and getting paid 150-grand to finish last."

But is that really true? Presumably, these guys still want to be the best and to win tournaments. To do that, they still have to work and practice and hire the right instructors and coaches and be among the top players or why would LIV want them? If LIV Golfsurvives the legal warfare with the PGA Tour, we'll soon find out.

An interesting aspect of LIV vs the PGA Tour is the addition of teams and a team championship to end the season. Currently teams are scheduled to received \$3 million, \$1.5 million and $\$500,\!000$ for coming in first, second and third in the team standings, and each player on the four-person teams gets a 25% cut of the team earnings. It seems likely that team competition could invigorate golf in the same way team sports invigorate and excite fans.

It's hard to argue that those players who have signed on with LIV are wrong for wanting more money and more time with their families. And if they believe that the new model will better the game of golf, why should they be attacked for choosing LIV over the PGA?

The PGA Tour seems intent on punishing players who make the jump to LIV. In addition to shutting them out of various tournaments, the players also no longer figure into the World Rankings, which seems petty. A top player is a top player no matter what tour he's playing in, right?

What's harder to debate are the very real human rights atrocities committed by the Saudi kingdom, primary backer of LIV. It's well known that 9/11 attackers were trained in Saudi Arabia. In May of this year, declassified FBI materials confirmed a direct connection between the Saudi government and 9/11. And the Saudi records on women's rights and on the murder of journalist Jamal Khashoggi are not in dispute.

The PGA Tour and its supporters have castigated LIV players for accepting "blood money" from the Saudis, and they label the Saudi financing as "sportswashing," an attempt by the Saudi government to improve its image and make the world forget its atrocities. The PGA Tour is using this angle to make its case against the upstart tour.

It seems straightforward and unassailable—except the attack is disingenuous at best. LIV is not the only golf organization benefitting from Saudi and other Middle East money. Supporters of LIV and lawyers involved in the LIV-PGA dispute point out that both the PGA Tour and DP World Tour benefit significantly from Saudi and Middle Eastern money. As one attorney noted, the DP World Tour's yearly major tournament schedule ends with The Race to Dubai.

According to an article on progolfweekly.com, the entire PGA Tour playoffs are sponsored by Saudi Arabia-allied brands and businesses. In fact, one of the Tour's biggest sponsors, FedEx, has long had a direct presence in Saudi Arabia. BMW also has business ties in the kingdom. Are all the PGA winners in those events also accepting "blood money?"

None of this disparaging, attacking and suing is good for the game of golf. The PGA and LIV could likely be embroiled in this debacle for years given the frustrating slowness of the judicial system. At what cost will a win for either side come? Most certainly at a cost to players and to fans.


May be the PGA Tour should instead welcome the competition and use it as an impetus to better its own program and the game for players and the industry and stop worrying about LIV. Wouldn't that actually keep many players with the PGA? Maybe allowing players to play in any tournament for which they qualify would make the game and competition stronger. If not, tweaks and changes can be made down the road.

The bottom line is that everyone who loves the game of golf—players, clubs, organizations, tournament sponsors—really want the same thing. Whichever side of the divide they fall on right now, they want the historic and terrific game of golf to thrive. That's the long game and that's what everyone should be focused on. Working together, they can make that happen.

uring the 1920s, La Quinta Resort & Club first became a hideaway for celebrities, as it provided them an oasis roughly 120 miles from Los Angeles.

As the resort and club became more and more popular, it ultimately became a destination for tennis, as it hired its first professional tennis coach, Fred Renker, in the late 1930s. From there, La Quinta's tennis offerings continued to grow, leading to the creation of a globally recognized tennis resort destination.

Additionally, a venue, featuring a sunken championship court and stadium seating, was developed. Known as Stadium Court, it served as the host facility for the BNP Paribas Open (previously called the Congoleum Classic and Grand Marnier/ATP Tennis Games) during the early 1980s. 





The Love & Love Tennis Foundation

s one of the pioneers of women's tennis in the 70's and part of the Original 9 who fought for equal prize money for women with Billie Jean King, tennis has always been a part of my life and so has giving back to the sport I love. After I retired in 1989, I worked with juniors both in the Bay Area and here in Palm Desert where I now reside. I inherited most of my kids from good friend and tour player Tory Fretz, who always asked that I come watch her kids. In 2015 we both decided that the best way to give back to the community and kids was to establish *The Love & Love Tennis Foundation* and introduce as many kids as possible to tennis. Tennis made a world of difference in my life, why could it not do the same for other kids?

When I started tennis, little did I know that it would take me outside of my neighborhood to all corners of the world and give me a wonderful life. I was born to immigrants from San Salvador and brought up in San Francisco by my great aunt & uncle. My great uncle Manuel who I referred to as Father, gave me my start in tennis. Since he could no longer played Soccer, he started playing tennis with his cronies at Golden Gate Park. I'd watch him every weekend put on his tennis whites and take the rackets out of his wooden press and set out for the park. I cried until he finally took me with him. I made myself a nuisance while they were playing so they would give me 25 cents to go ride the Merry-Go-Round at the playground, which didn't last very long. Soon I wanted to play too and I would go to the backboard and hit a million balls. I can't remember when I couldn't hit a tennis ball I was a natural. I was in love with tennis and that is all I would ever want to do for the rest of my life! I was so fortunate that tennis gave me a new outlook on life and a sense of accomplishment and confidence in myself as I worked my way up the junior ranks and onto the world stage. Again, little did I know that I would be playing our first Virginia Slims Tournament finals in 1970 at the Civic Center Auditorium, five blocks from where I grew up on Grove Street and making a statement for women's equality not only in tennis but other sports and the work place. Yes, I was poor, spoke Spanish and was a little different from the rest of the tennis world, but it proved to me that given the chance to succeed, I did!

Since 2015 the LLTF has spread our love of tennis to youths throughout the Coachella Valley by providing free tennis clinics at the *Boys & Girls Clubs, Desert Recreation District Public Parks and High Schools.* We hope to give all kids who want to learn tennis the opportunity to play and enjoy the game that has given us such fulfillment.

Our top fundraising event is The Annalee Thurston Awards Reception. This event is dear to my heart as Annalee was a very close friend of mine and many in the tennis community. She passed away in May of 2007 from an aneurysm and her close friends wanted to do something special to celebrate her life, we established The Annalee Thurston Scholarship Endowment for Women in Sports at the University of Oregon Warsaw Sports Marketing & Business School which is now fully endowed. The Annalee Thurston Award Reception now benefits The Love & Love Tennis Foundation and its' local junior programs in the Valley.

The Love & Love Tennis Foundation will host The Annalee Thurston Award Reception March 11, 2023, at Palm Valley Country Club. This event honors women who have reached the highest level of success in their field or sport. We have honored past Champions and Hall of Famers like; Chris Evert, The Original 9, (King, Casals, Pigeon, Heldman, Richey, Bartkowicz, Reid, Dalton & Ziegenfuss) and last year's recipient Billie Jean King and Martina Navratilova will be the 2023 recipient of The Annalee Thurston Award. Golf Instruction

1/2 Swing, 3/4 Swing, Full Swing

This editions golf tip topic is: ½ swing V's ¾ swing, V's full swing. If you are getting back into golf, or all the way up to feeling like you are an advanced golfer, theses 3 basic golf terms and basic golf swings are vital to your golf foundation and success.

Here are some keys golf swing points to ½ swing, ¾ swing & full swing: (do all theses with a 7 iron, ball in the center normal iron width stance)



1/2 SWING:

- By definition: a half swing is club is only traveling to the waist height (or approximately on both sides)
- If your body feels like a clock: (I use the golf ball as 12:00 noon), you would swing your golf club to "3pm to 9pm"
- If your physically able: (the TURN or TAKEAWAY FOR A ½ swing)
 - Ground your feet
 - Turn your hips to approximately 45*
 - The club started 4-6" from the thigh, in the TURN that distance doubles (because the hips turn around to the left)
 - Your shoulders turn to a 90* (depending on your physical condition)
 - Your golf club will be "parallel to your feet" ("butt" of the club pointing at the target")
 - Your back will be facing the target
 - Weight will be centered but more on the right side of your body, & inside of both legs / thigh & interior of the feet



- The follow through:
 - Start with your FEET: both heals will go to the RIGHT (ground force)
- Then knees, then hips, then stomach, then chest, arms & club head LAST!
- Club will be pointing at target (slightly left of the target line)
 - Club face will "mirror your spine" (the toe of the club we be pointing at approximately 2:00 pm) or SQUARE TO THE TARGET LINE
 - BODY LINES / spine: body angle is in a tilted / RIGHTSIDE BEND POSITION
 - Spine Angle: head down, RIGHT EAR POSITION, pointing down at the ball
 - Hips are gonna feel at the target or left of the target (depending on your flexibility)
 - Right foot: is off the ground (push off your RIGHT SIDE FOR GROUND FORCE / power / distance)



34 SWING:

- By definition: a ¾ swing is club is only traveling to "L" position (or P5 to P7 / P8 position)
- You have added a "lever" or "Wrist cock" at this point (this level is huge for ball height & speed of club head)
- Your club is "pointing up to the SKY"
- Your forearm is approximately across your chest & hands / club are higher than a ½ swing (1-2 feet higher / depending on your physical condition/ injuries)



- The follow through: See above
- Good ¾ swing drill: PAINT BY NUMBERS
- HIT THESES KEY POSITIONS, HOLD THAT 5-10 seconds work up to 15-30 seconds
- Weight shift is 90-100 % on the left side
- Club is exiting left
- Body / spine angle (see above information)
- FOLLOW THROUGH DRILL: TROPHY FINISH....HOLD YOUR FINISH FOR 5 seconds... then work up to more

Set for February 11, 2023 starting at 9 a.m. and benefitting the Desert Cancer Foundation, the exposition will again be held on the scenic grounds of the Indian Wells Tennis Garden.

A highlight is the sweepstakes for a brand new 2023 Elkhart Lake blue metallic Corvette Stingray Convertible with the Z51 performance package. It's equipped with a 495-hp 6.2L LT2 V8 engine and 8-speed transmission, normally on the market for \$93,000. This expansive showcase of over 1,000 antique and vintage vehicles includes hot rods, muscle and exotic cars, 1950's classics, trucks, motorcycles, luxury rides and movie cars. As anyone who's attended this day-long extravaganza knows - and there were 8,000 attendees who passed through the gates in one day at the last gathering - there's a lot more to the adventure than cars, although that's plenty. Guests will be able to snack on breakfast burritos, pizza, hot dogs and burgers from 10 different vendors, and the Indian Wells Rotary Club will be offering craft beer. Prize trophies will be awarded in several categories and there will be a raffle and silent auction while kids can take part in a pedal car race. The Dr. George Charity Car Show is organized and produced each year by the all-volunteer nonprofit Palm Springs Cruisin' Association (PSCA). The show honors the late valley oncologist and founder of Desert Cancer Foundation, Dr. Sebastian George. Over the years, the show has become the association's largest and most prominent presentation. Many of PSCA's founding car club members were patients of the late Dr. George and remain grateful for his life-saving care.

The Car Show benefits Desert Cancer Foundation (DCF) and supports local Coachella Valley residents undergoing cancer care and treatment, especially those who lack health insurance or sufficient funds to pay for their medical care. DCF is the only local nonprofit that ensures direct payment for cancer care and treatment on behalf of residents who cannot access or afford vital care.

During the two years of cancelled shows, leaders of the car association continued to engage in fundraising activities to strengthen the critical work of DCF to provide financial assistance for cancer care. The 2020 Dr. George Car Show raised \$120,000 for DCF, translating to over \$1.2 million in care. Desert Cancer Foundation has longstanding strategic partnerships with the local healthcare community, including social workers, case workers and advocates, who share the availability



of the program with the community. Program applicants are individually reviewed by a volunteer patient assistance committee, which includes medical professionals, financial counselors, board members and program staff. Since inception, DCF has paid for cancer related screening, diagnosis and treatment for more than 8,000 local residents valued at more than \$82.4 million, at a cost of only \$ 9.4 million. Every dollar donated translates to over \$ 10 million in cancer care.

Proceeds directly assist patients and their families in a time of greatest need and vulnerability. Over the years, PSCA has donated more than \$ 1.1 million. The Dr. George Charity car show has become a signature fundraising project for the organization.

"We are truly grateful for an allvolunteer team who works hard to organize such a large event, and we are grateful for the generosity of the PSCA and steering committee members. This is a huge impact to provide access to care and saves lives," said Eevet Edens, Executive Director of Desert Cancer Foundation.

"After a two-year hiatus, we are determined to make the 2023 show the best one ever, in support of the Desert Cancer Foundation's important work," said event Co-Chair, Craig Korthase.



hen you want something done right, do it yourself. It's the mantra of those who are outcome-driven and excel at what they do in order to self-actualize a vision. It's also the very essence of the dynamo that is Barbara Hankey-Rogers, author of the cookbook, "It's a No Grainer," released earlier this year.

The book is the result of many years of exploring how food can be used as a positive force in our lives instead of something we need to battle. After years of visiting doctors and experiencing fluctuations in her weight, Rogers discovered that gluten and grains were not her friends and that the solution was to live grain free.

Rogers explains, "People don't always understand that grain free doesn't mean gluten free. So many times, foods are labeled a certain way but they are loaded with hidden sugars." Like many of us, she used to think that fat was the evil element in our diets, not sugar, as we now know.

Finding inspiration through Joseph Scherger, MD, MPH, Rogers decided to write her own cookbook which includes over 180 flavorful options, far more than most books featuring recipes. Dr. Scherger is the author of "Lean and Fit: A Doctor's Journey to Healthy Nutrition and Greater Wellness." He is an Eisenhower Medical Center primary care 365 physician and founder of Restore Health Disease Reversal in Indian Wells. He is also past president of the Riverside County Medical Association.

Rogers is now the portrait of unbounded energy. She ran her first New York marathon at 64 years young and proudly finished the race. She stays active by playing regular pickleball games on her own court at her Bighorn home and she is not taking any medications. She is now 73, and at five feet, three inches she maintains her weight at 110 pounds. At her heaviest point, she was 139 pounds which simply was not acceptable to her. Her diet is mostly paleo/keto but with variations to include some fruit and meat in moderation. She also restricts legumes as they are very high in lectins which can damage stomach lining. And switching out white wine with its high sugar content for red wine has become standard procedure.

When she set out to write her book, Rogers had to create numerous recipes, as healthy options and substitutions simply didn't (and still often don't) exist. She decided to fend for herself in largely uncharted territory. She's mastered the art of swapping mashed cauliflower for starchy potatoes and riced cauliflower for white rice. And one trick she uses when crafting a skinny Margarita is to ditch the simple syrup and replace it with erythritol, a sugar alcohol popular on keto diets and with the same taste and texture as sugar yet not laden with the carbohydrates and with virtually no calories.

Dr. Scherger said, "Barbara's book is beautifully illustrated and contains a great variety of recipes. She makes no-graineating delicious and healthy with alternative flours."

The book took eight years to complete, involving intense research, product testing, professional photography of the dishes, personally editing copy, production and marketing refinement and a few disruptions including the unexpected death of her son. However, Rogers prides herself on accomplishing everything she starts, so she knew she had to finish the book. She did finish it, and when the book was published by El Camino Publishing, it hit number one on Amazon in its category. Along with helping people live their best lives, Rogers donates 20 percent of all book sale proceeds to the charity Loving All

A native of California, Rogers grew up in Los Feliz and Marina Del Rey, California. After graduating with a business degree from USC, she spent many years working in the family car business in different capacities. She was in her 20s when she developed a passion for cooking. In the early 1970s, cooking legend Julia Child had an influence on Rogers, therefore cooking soufflés and baked Alaska became a regular occurrence as did taking cooking classes in Santa Monica, Indian Wells, La Quinta, San Miguel de Allende, Cabo San Lucas and Italy. Her other passion is a love for animals. She serves on the board of Loving All Animals in Palm Desert in addition to offering her time, treasure and talent to the boards of The Joslyn Center and the McCallum Theatre Muses & Patroness Circle.

Rogers is currently enrolled in the Escoffier Culinary School to continue her culinary education. She resides in Palm Desert, California with her other half, Gary and her two dachshunds, Sushi and Tinker Bell

She likes to say that her cookbook is for everyone. Her proactive spirit and desire to help others achieve health harmony reflect her entire way of life, which Rogers describes as "from the heart." Her guidelines for healthy eating and living transcend the kitchen and embrace empowerment for life and health.

As Dr. Scherger says, "Barbara is living proof that eating only healthy foods is about abundance, not deprivation."





f you were a patron of the arts, and money was no object. If you loved cars, ▲and money was no object. If you desired to have your name remembered in the annals of the most prestigious company on the planet, and money was no object.

You'd build a Rolls Royce Boat Tail. Yes, you would build it. Meaning you'd become part of the Rolls Royce coachbuild team with the title: Future Owner. You would travel to England routinely, on your private jet, and meet with the designers and engineers onsite. If money was no object.

The Rolls Royce Boat Tail has the prestigious honor of being the most expensive car ever made. Talk across the industry suggests that the starting price is \$28 million but could run north of \$30 million with some added features. So far, Rolls Royce has built and publicly displayed two Boat Tails. Rumors suggest that Beyonce and Jay Z commissioned the first. A third is reportedly slated but it is unknown if the owner will allow Rolls Royce to display the finished work.

Entirely handmade and dreamt up by some of the most intensely avid Rolls Royce owners, who the company calls luminaries, the first thing that stands out about the Boat Tail is its mass. Measuring more than 19 feet long, this nauticalinspired craft isn't built for hairpin turns. It's



proud to be called a boat and embraces the moniker in all of its class and style.

The windshield wraps around the front of the car like a speedboat. The rear deck, which houses the Boat Tail's unique 'butterfly-design' hosting suite, is swathed in Royal Walnut veneer. In the second Boat Tail built, the deck was inlaid with rose gold-plated pinstripes with a satin-brushed finish to ensure a sensitive and sophisticated appearance. The Royal Walnut was specifically selected by the client for the way it was expected to weather over time. The rear deck houses a complete set of cutlery and a temperature controlled cooler to store champaign at six degrees celsius. Once opened, the content below the decklid, is raised to a 15-degree angle to be presented to the owners. This area also houses two picnic tables that fold out. Rolls has also provided a unique umbrella (parasol) housed under the centerline of the decklid.

If money was no object, of course you'd build a car with a champaign chiller, a picnic table and parasol.

Rolls Royce brings so much custom work into the design of its coachbuild process that the client gets to dream big. The second Boat Tail released was purchased by a man whose family was in the pearl business. He suggested that the paint color should have the reflective qualities of a pearl shell, changing colors in the son and at different angles. The rose gold paint truly was something never seen

before. The matching rose gold cutlery in under the decklid was also unique. The clock incorporates mother of pearl from the client's personal collection.

Up front, the iconic pantheon grille was milled from a single, giant piece of aluminum and, unlike any other Rolls-Royce, does without a triangular aluminum top. Above that sits the Spirit of Ecstasy mascot, made from rose gold.


Referring to the owner of the rose gold Boat Tail, Thorsten Müller-Ötvös, CEO of Rolls Royce told Forbes: "With this car the gentleman who commissioned it is forever — forever, I really say forever — a part of the history of Rolls-Royce Motor Cars and he is written into the company archives. This is super compelling, it is something money can't buy."

Though Rolls isn't talking much about what's under the hood, it's likely the 12 found in the Phantom. The new car features more than 1,800 entirely new and totally custom-made parts. Even the stereo hasn't escaped untouched, with Rolls adapting the 15-speaker system to use the whole floor structure as a resonance chamber. Was that Jay Z's idea?



Carolina Herrera's Euro-Latina styles capture casual elegance and menswear sexy

The First Lady of Fashion's design remains the arbiter of sophistication

The Venezuelan icon who became the fashion ambassador to the New York social set remains a powerhouse of design on the catwalk and the café. Carolina Herrera introduced shoulder pads for women to the world in the 1980s, and her classic menswear looks combined with full ball skirts redefined sexy for more than one generation. Not so much minimalist as refined and "chic luxe", her tailored looks celebrate the collared dress shirt accessorized with jewels adapted for formal wear, resonating for over four decades now with female fashionistas around the globe.

Given the intensity of the dress, it is best styled with understated, tonal accessories. \$12,990.

The Wrap-Waist Trench Gown in 100 percent silk offers a feminine twist on the signature trench gown, cut from blush-pink faille. It's designed with a fitted shirt bodice and a flattering



crossover waist with wrap detail that falls to a full, floor-pooling hem. Elbow-length sleeves and side pockets reinforce the casual yet sophisticated vibe of the garment. Fully lined, there is a concealed zip fastening at back and shell-buttons along the front closure. Full length is 64.5 inches. \$4,990.

Preparing you for another dramatic entrance, the Two-Tone Strapless Draped Overskirt Column Gown in iris multi is again a hypnotic combination of warm purple with rich red emerging in the lining and throughout the front of the skirt. Featuring a strapless neckline, the style is strapless with a column silhouette. Floor-length with a draped floor-sweeping overskirt, there is a center-back vented hem and invisible back zip. Constructed of polyester satin, the texture is smooth and straightforward. \$5,990.


Infusing some floral delight, the Floral-Print Halter Ruffle-Trim Gown in poppy multi presents in chiffon with a fluffy ruffled trim cascading vertically along the entire skirt, adding a bit of whimsy and even more femininity. Measuring 65 inches from shoulder to hem, the dress is crafted from 100 percent silk and has a back zip. \$6,990.

Another delicious and high-energy design, the Embroidered Drop Shoulder Gown in geranium multi is enhanced with handembroidered tonal sequins, providing more than a dash of subtle sparkle into the sumptuous gown. Crafted in 100 percent silk faille with dropped shoulders and floor sweeping hem, a sash tie belt cinches in the waist. Fully lined and with a concealed shell button placket, side pockets maintain the relaxed dignity. The dress measures 64.5 inches from shoulder to hem. \$6,990.

The Posy Print Trench Gown in blush multi again balances delicate floral femininity with the confidence of trademark menswear looks. To him, the designs recognize the triumph of both nature and man, combining the most highly prized gifts of the earth with the most precise hand craftsmanship and architectural integration.

Given Picchiotti's lifelong dedication to colored gemstones, it's no wonder that color has been the focal point of the work for over five decades. The most spectacular specimens of rubies are from Myanmar (formerly Burma), including the famed "Pigeon's Blood Ruby," which has become more and more scarce and for which there is practically no more extraction. According to Giuseppe, the profound blue color of sapphires "holds the vastness of the sky and the depth of the ocean." Emeralds are valued for their rarity, despite the fact that they lack the hardness of diamonds, their deep green hues being highly coveted. And, spectacular yellow diamonds obtain their unique bodycolor from small amounts of nitrogen contained within the diamond's crystal structure, making the rich, pure yellow stones the world's most valuable yellow gemstone.

The Thousand and One Nights Necklace from the Masterpieces collection explodes with rare and vivid Red Pigeon's Blood rubies (107.67 tcw.) collected over years. A diamond rivière necklace is accented by hanging motifs of diamonds and rubies, combining heart-shaped and pear-shaped rubies, the intensity balanced by a series of pear-cut, round and marquise-cut white diamonds (50.81 tcw.). Each single drop alternates with one heart ruby or one pear ruby, except for the center where two distinct shapes are appreciated together. The visual effect is undulating, creating a wave of color. \$2,087,700.





Yellow Diamond Heart Earrings

The irregular octagonal shape is crisp and precise, sporting a no-nonsense facade of superlative stones that communicates confidence and fearlessness. \$464,100



Fine Jewelry Gem Ceramic Bracelet
