There is no doubt about it. As fans and players gather together at Indian Wells Tennis Garden for the 2023 BNP Paribas Open this March, a big presence will be missed.


This presence, of course, is five-time BNP Paribas Open champion Roger Federer, who announced his retirement from the professional circuit last September. Few have inspired fans and fellow players at Indian Wells quite like Federer, who is tied with Novak Djokovic for the most singles victories in the championship's nearly 50-year history.

Many—including those who are favorited to win—will be competing in honor of the living legend who, along with his five BNP Paribas Open crowns, also won 20 Grand Slam singles titles. In addition, he was ranked world No. 1 by the Association of Tennis Professionals (ATP) for 310 weeks, including an all-time record 237 consecutive weeks.

Here are some of the favorites who will, without question, be motivated by Federer as they attempt to add their names to the history books as BNP Paribas Open champions (some for a second or even sixth time).

#### Male Favorites to Win

*Carlos Alcaraz.* Only 19 years old, Alcaraz is the youngest to ever become ranked world No. 1 by the ATP. A Grand Slam champion (2022 US Open), he has already won six ATP singles



titles, including two Masters 1000 titles. Considered by many to be the future of tennis, Alcaraz would love to build upon his blossoming legacy with a victory at the BNP Paribas Open too. Given his wide array of talents and results so far, there's no reason to not choose him as a favorite.

*Novak Djokovic.* Despite the media frenzy of the past few months, regarding Djokovic's decision to remain unvaccinated for COVID-19, he is a favorite to win, as long as he's able to compete this year. No one can beat his record in the BNP Paribas Open, after all, as he has claimed the title a record-tying five times and finished runner-up once. He also won the tournament three straight times (2014-2016), another record he shares with Federer.

**Rafael Nadal.** A three-time BNP Paribas Open champion, the world No. 2 is still a favorite in the tournaments he competes in, despite his foot issues and age (36). Aside from Djokovic, no current player has had more experience—or success—in the BNP Paribas Open than Nadal. However, he has had a bit of a drought in the tournament as of late, as he hasn't won since 2013. He'll be striving to end that streak this year, as long as his health allows.







#### Others to Consider:

*Taylor Fritz.* The winner of last year's BNP Paribas Open, Fritz will attempt to become the first male to successfully defend since Djokovic in 2016.

**Daniil Medvedev.** The 2021 US Open champion, Medvedev will be seeking yet another significant victory at the BNP Paribas Open.

*Stefanos Tsitsipas.* Like Alcaraz, the 24-year-old winner of nine ATP singles titles is considered a future star as well.

#### Female Favorites to Win

*Coco Gauff.* A winner of two Women's Tennis Association (WTA) singles titles and six doubles titles, Gauff is another up-andrising star. Only 18 years old, she came close to winning her first Grand Slam singles title at the 2022 French Open, losing in the finals to Iga Świątek. Due to her early success, Gauff has become a pre-tournament favorite at nearly every event she enters now and will be a favorite at Indian Wells Tennis Garden too.

*Maria Sakkari*. Last year's runner-up, Sakkari has only claimed one WTA singles victory at this point in her career. But, as evidenced by her performance in the 2022 BNP Paribas Open, she's on the verge of becoming a top tier player. Thus far, the 27year-old has reached the semifinals of the French Open (2021) and the US Open (also in 2021), becoming the first-ever Greek woman to reach a Grand Slam semifinal. A victory at the 2023 BNP Paribas Open may be the jumpstart she needs for long-term success.

*Iga Świątek.* As the defending champion and No. 1 ranked player in the WTA rankings, wi tek will be the clear favorite among the female contestants at Indian Wells Tennis Garden this year. A threetime Grand Slam singles champion (2020 and 2022 French Open and the 2022 US Open), the 21-year-old will attempt to become the first female to successfully defend the BNP Paribas Open since Martina Navratilova in 1991. The WTA Player of the Year in 2022, she has won 11 WTA singles titles so far.



#### Others to Consider:

**Ons Jabeur:** Ranked No. 2 in the world, Jabeur finished runnerup at the 2022 Wimbledon Championships and the 2022 US Open.

*Naomi Osaka.* The 2018 BNP Paribas Open champion, Osaka will attempt to make a comeback to the big stage with yet another victory in the championship after dealing with personal issues the last few months.

*Jessica Pegula*. A winner of two WTA singles titles and five doubles titles, Pegula is currently ranked No. 3 in the world.

## PGA Tour Champions reemerge at Mission Hills Country Club with

The Galleri Classic

Powerful partnerships support six desert cancer charities

For a brief moment, there was a void in the Coachella Valley with the departure of The Chevron Championship, a.k.a. the ANA Inspiration LPGA tournament, to Houston, Texas after 51 years.

The Galleri Classic swings to the rescue.

The PGA Tour Champions has not held a tournament in the Valley since the Gulfstream Aerospace Invitational took place at Indian Wells Golf Resort in March 1993. The debut of The Galleri Classic is about to end that dry spell. The inaugural event will take place March 22-26 on the Dinah Shore Tournament Course at Mission Hills Country Club, in partnership with Galleri as title sponsor.

The Galleri Classic will feature 78 PGA Tour Champions professionals, including World Golf Hall of Fame members, who will play 54 holes of stroke play for a purse of \$2.2 million. The tournament will be the latest addition to the PGA Tour Champions' annual schedule.

Galleri is a cancer-detection test developed by GRAIL, a healthcare company whose mission is to detect cancer early through its blood test for cancers not commonly screened for, especially for those over 50 years old.

A portion of proceeds raised through tournament entries, sponsorships and ticket sales will benefit six valley charities dedicated to cancer prevention, support and treatment, including American Cancer Society (Palm Desert), Desert Cancer





Foundation, Eisenhower Health, Hanson House, Pendleton Foundation and Shay's Warriors Life After Cancer.

The event is in experienced hands with tournament director Michelle DeLancy, who served as tournament director for the Boeing Classic, PGA Tour Champions event in Seattle for 13 years. She is currently one of the few female tournament directors, recognized for her career in sports marketing and all aspects of producing a multi-faceted tournament.

"We are looking forward to creating a new golf tradition in the desert, and I'm excited to get into the operational side of things with The Galleri Classic," said DeLancy. "We are proud to show how The Galleri Classic and its namesake cancer-detection test, as well as the beneficiaries from the tournament, can support the cancer journey at every step of the way."

As tournament week approaches, the tournament will be announcing pro players, who will include legends of the game and World Golf Hall of Famers 50 years old and over. DeLancy expects a strong field, many of whom have played The American Express (PGA Tour) in its previous iterations such as the CareerBuilder Challenge, the Humana Challenge and the Bob Hope Desert Classic.

Playing host to an annual stop on the PGA Tour and PGA Tour Champions events for 12 years, the Coachella Valley is distinguished for its rich golf history. Several current PGA Tour Champions professionals have won in the desert, including David Duval, who made history with his final-round 59 to win the 1999 American Express, Class of 2022 rookies Justin Leonard (2005 American Express) and Brian Gay (2013), two-time winner Corey Pavin (1987 and 1991), Mike Weir (2003), Joe Durant (2001), Fred Couples (1998) and Jay Haas (1988).

The Galleri Classic's ticket offerings for spectators include the following:

\$30 single-day grounds tickets (good-any-one-day grounds-only admission for pro-am rounds March 22-23 or tournament competition rounds March 24-26)

\$65 weekly grounds tickets (grounds-only admission good only for competition rounds March 24-26)

\$75 single-day clubhouse tickets (good any one day during competition rounds March 24-26, with access to clubhouse and upgraded dining and beverage options for purchase at the Champions Caféinside the clubhouse)



\$150 weekly clubhouse tickets (good only for all competition rounds March 24-26)

A VIP spectator experience (sold as group and corporate packages) is available in The Champions Club on 18, an all-inclusive ticket option during competition rounds March 24-26 with complimentary food and full bar service and situated beside the island green at the historic, par-5 18th hole, next to the legendary Poppie's Pond.

For those seeking to play, golf enthusiasts can take part in a bucket-list experience of joining PGA Tour Champions professionals on the course. Each pro-am foursome is paired for a round of golf with a pro player on either March 22 or March 23 and receives a package that includes an invitation to The Galleri Classic pairings party on March 21, a valet parking pass, breakfast, lunch and on-course refreshments on one proam play day (March 22 or March 23), a premium gift package and a grounds badge providing access over the entire tournament week.

The tournament plans to have approximately 550 volunteers participating the week of the tournament, and all rounds of The Galleri Classic will be broadcast on





GOLF Channel, reaching close to 70 million U.S. households and more than 170 countries and territories.

"GRAIL and PGA Tour Champions have a shared commitment to positively impact the lives of people and communities that we touch. At 50 years of age and older, Champions Tour players have likely had personal experiences with cancer and can inspire the next generation to improve health care," said Bob Ragusa, Chief Executive Officer at GRAIL.

Said DeLancy, "It's been a really favorable experience working with the community here so far. Everyone has been very welcoming, and we are delighted to align our efforts with the spirit of giving back that is so prevalent in the Coachella Valley. Mainly, we want participants and spectators to know that we are thrilled to collaborate with them and that The Galleri Classic is here to stay."

# **Mission Hills Country Club**

## Pride of the desert is rich in history and tradition

The Arnold Palmer Signature Course Hole No. 16







Pride and success came early to Mission Hills Country Club when in 1971 saw the grand opening of the first course by legendary designer Desmond Muirhead. The club and course soon gained fame when the LPGA named the Dinah Shore Colgate Invitational a major tournament for the ladies Tour.

Even after a few name changes, this event continued a tradition for fifty one years as the longest running tournament on the LPGA schedule. Many milestones have been hit along the way given credence to its existence. Not only golf but the world of tennis witnessed major events over the years like the 1978 Davis Cup that featured John McEnroe. Jimmy Connors and Roscoe Tanner played a match in 1976 that received national recognition in the sports world. Also In 1976 the World Cup was played with the Seve Ballestros European team defeating Greg Norman's USA team. Famous names have always been attached to the Mission Hills Country Club.

Tradition has always been a part of the success, like the clubs first golf professional, John Revolta and Dennis Ralston, Director of Tennis. A second course was added in 1979 with the addition of the





Arnold Palmer designed layout. Landmark Corporation purchased the property in 1981, added a new clubhouse in 1986 and saw the addition of a third 18-hole golf course, the Pete Dye Challenge course.

Club Corp, the largest private club management company purchased Mission Hills in 1993 and continues to manages it to this day under the Invited Clubs name. A private community featuring 54-holes of championship golf on three extraordinary courses, tennis facilities second to none, with 43 courts, a world class 55,000 square-foot clubhouse, a vibrant membership, sports experiences such as croquet, pickleball and more, together with



robust social facilities and programs check all the boxes for first class private club enjoyment.

The Dinah Shore Tournament Course has been voted the No. 1 ranked golf course in the Coachella Valley many times, since its inception. For fifty-one years. The Arnold Palmer Signature Course was Palmer's first design in the desert. The Pete Dye Challenge Course is also a true test of any skill level. Pete Dye's trademark of water hazards are highlighted throughout the course.

Before teeing off on these legendary 54 holes, a newly renovated practice facility is the perfect place to warm up, complete with dual-sided driving range and sculpted greens and bunkers.

## Eisenhower Health Foundation and its culture of integrity

World-record athlete Laura Fritz aligns compassion with excellence

"Here in the Coachella Valley, we have world class golf and tennis as well as world class healthcare." There's no one better to carry that message than Laura Fritz, Senior Vice President for Eisenhower Health Foundation and former world recordholding swimmer. Oh, and she happens to be the aunt of tennis champ Taylor Fritz. He is ranked American No. 1, world No. 8 in singles and world No. 104 in doubles and revered in the desert for his ATP Masters 1000 victory over Rafael Nadal at 2022's BNP Paribas men's finals in Indian Wells.

Laura Fritz explains, "Residents of the Coachella Valley have an expectation for

the finest physicians and care. Our Foundation manifests these high standards by ensuring our hospital, Eisenhower Health, can meet the needs of local patients, whether treating lung cancer with the newest therapeutics, employing the use of state-of-the art robotics for hip replacements or establishing life-saving behavioral health programs for victims through the Sexual Assault Forensic Examiner (SAFE) Program."

It follows that generous community support of the Foundation leads to exceptional health and patient recovery, including decreased complications and length of hospital stays and procuring the most advanced medical equipment. These factors empower Eisenhower to attract the highest caliber of physicians.

From its very inception, Eisenhower Health was the product of a blue-ribbon brain trust that knew how to flex their philanthropic muscle. In 1961, W. Clarke Swanson — as in Swanson Foods collapsed and died of a cerebral hemorrhage while playing golf at Thunderbird Country Club in a foursome that included former President Dwight D. Eisenhower. Swanson's widow, Florence, embarked upon a mission to establish a hospital mid-valley, which she believed would have increased her husband's chances for prompt medical care and likely survival.

Mrs. Swanson worked with luminaries such as Bob and Dolores Hope, Ambassador and Mrs. Walter H. Annenberg, Peter Kiewit, John Curci, Ernie Dunlevie, Justin Dart, Leonard Firestone and other powerhouse players.

The capital project was incorporated in 1965 with Dolores Hope named president of the founding board of trustees. The Hopes donated 80 acres of land in Rancho Mirage for the new facility, designed by architect Edward Durell Stone. He was also the mastermind behind the Museum of Modern Art in New York City and the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, D.C.

In 1971, Eisenhower Medical Center officially opened. Today, Eisenhower Health is the only not-for-profit hospital in the Coachella Valley, receiving no funding from the state or federal government.

Foundation president Michael Landes said, "Our ability to raise money enables us to support the hospital in its choice to prioritize patients over profits."

The Foundation relies on gifts from the community, and donors of all levels are vital to sustain and grow levels of performance excellence. Eisenhower is the first hospital in the valley with an accredited residency program and is proud to have 56 physicians-in-training in internal medicine and family medicine. The facility has grown into a valley-wide health system,

especially with the 90,000-square-foot La Quinta health center named for benefactors George and Julia Argyros.

There is a lengthy tradition of local championship golf tournament proceeds being directed toward the work of the Foundation, dating back to The Bob Hope Classic as well as from The Galleri Classic taking place in March, 2023.

Fritz points out that there is close symbiosis between the hospital and the Foundation, with the hospital leadership regularly communicating priorities to the Foundation's board of governors so that donors can best support community health needs and attention to trends. Those trends reflect programs such as interventional cardiology with the only heart failure clinic in the desert, cutting-edge orthopedic treatment so patients can regain mobility and expanded surgical facilities for more efficient outpatient procedures.

As a member of the core leadership team focused on cultivating relationships, Fritz maintains that gift-giving should always be a positive experience for the donors.

Fritz said, "It's important to us that we work with contributors who are in a position of abundance so that we are never invading their own financial stability or comfort. The Foundation is marked by a strong sense of integrity."

Fritz' own background mirrors her current position as a community and business role model. She was one of the top female sprint freestyle swimmers in the United States during the late 1960s and early 1970s with her highest ranking of world No. 5, and she swam for Santa Clara University 1969-1971 seasons and San Jose State's 1973-1975 seasons. As a Spartan, she was a 1973 AIAW honorable mention All-American in the 50 freestyle, 1975 team captain and school record holder in the 50 free. And, she was inducted into the San Jose State University Sports Hall of Fame Class of 2020.

In her college career, Fritz earned 11 AIAW All-America awards including a national championship honor in the 100-meter freestyle.

She competed in the 1968 and 1972 U.S. Olympic Trials and won a gold along with silver and bronze medals at the 1970 World University Games in Turin, Italy.

Fritz said, "I found my passion in fundraising." Clearly an understatement, Fritz' can-do approach is an example for why U.S. News & World Report recognized Eisenhower Health as #1 in the Inland Empire and #20 in California, as of September 11, 2020, placing Eisenhower among the top five percent of hospitals in the state.

For Fritz, what matters isn't so much the metrics but rather the human connection that positions Eisenhower Heath as the best of the best and transforms the quality of life for patients.

The Foundation's story is one of compassion and partnership, probably best summarized by Fritz who said, "Eisenhower Health Foundation's guiding principle is, 'Show People You Care.' Our future trajectory, as a world-class hospital known for excellence, depends on donors who share those goals."

#### 65 Grand Slam singles titles. 268 career victories. 838 weeks as the No. 1 ranked tennis player in the world

Between them, Roger Federer, Serena Williams and Rafael Nadal attained a level of success in tennis that few have ever achieved.

And for more than 20 years, tennis fans were able to witness a new epitome of greatness firsthand, as the trio triumphed in one Grand Slam after another.

But now, a new era appears to be on the horizon, as one of the three tennis legends has already announced his retirement, while another has likely played her last match already and the third may potentially join them in the relatively near future.

To celebrate their historic careers, *Desert Golf & Tennis* is reflecting on their recent announcements, along with what's to come for the three history-making athletes.

#### Roger Federer Bids a Heartfelt Goodbye to Professional Tennis

On September 15, 2022, Roger Federer shared a video with the world, via his Twitter page. In the video, the 41-year-old mentioned that he had played more than 1,500 matches over 24 years and that the last 3 years had been especially challenging, due to various injuries and surgeries.

Yet, despite the ongoing challenges, he strived to return to his full competitive form for several months. Unfortunately, regardless of his comeback attempts, last summer he realized the next chapter of his life was about to begin, as he had endured one injury after another.

"I know my body's capacities and limits, and its message to me lately has been clear," he said. "Tennis has treated me more generously than I ever would have dreamt, and now I must recognize when it's time to end my competitive career."

One week later, Federer played in his final Association of Tennis Professionals (ATP) event—the Laver Cup, as he competed in a doubles match alongside his longstanding rival, Nadal. The pair ultimately lost their match against Jack Sock and Frances Tiafoe.

"This is a bittersweet decision because I will miss everything the Tour has given me. But, at the same time, there is so much to celebrate," the 20-time Grand Slam singles champion emphasized. "I consider myself one of the most fortunate people on Earth. I was given a special talent to play tennis, and I did it at a level that I never imagined, for much longer than I ever thought possible."

During the Laver Cup, Federer and Nadal were photographed crying and holding hands in support of one another, depicting the epitome of sportsmanship, as well as the ways in which rivalries can develop into true friendships.

"With Roger's farewell, a part of me has left with him," Nadal said at a press conference, following the duo's loss.

Virtually everyone in the tennis industry will agree with Nadal's sentiment, while hoping the legend, who won an astounding 103 ATP singles titles, remains in the game in some capacity. He has discussed participating in exhibition matches and ultimately becoming a tennis commentator. And he'll continue to be involved in the Roger Federer Foundation, which has created educational opportunities for more than 2 million children in Africa and Switzerland.

Perhaps the final words of his retirement video say it all?

"To the game of tennis," he stressed, "I love you and will never leave you."



#### Serena Williams and Rafael Nadal Ponder Their Futures

Although Federer's future, concerning professional tennis, has been firmly established, Williams may eventually return to the game, while Nadal continues to pursue history, as he's fresh off of a 2022 season in which he won two more Grand Slam singles titles and became the winningest male champion of all time.

Thus far, Williams—who, like Federer, is 41—has mentioned that she's "evolving away from tennis". She received tributes from millions of fans, along with her colleagues, during the 2022 US Open, which, to date, is her last professional tennis appearance. And she even waved goodbye to the crowds at USTA Billie Jean



King National Tennis Center after losing to Ajla Tomljanovi during the third round.

However, despite the farewells and praise from millions, concerning her wide array of achievements, including her 23 Grand Slam singles titles, Williams may come back to the professional stage again, after all.

While speaking at a conference in San Francisco last October, in promotion of her investment company, Serena Ventures, Williams told attendees directly: "I am not retired."

"The chances [of me returning] are very high," she added. "You can come to my house—I have a court."

Williams's remarks aren't entirely surprising, especially when one considers just how passionate she's been about the game her entire life. Not to mention, she shared the following thoughts in a *Vogue* article last August.

"I have never liked the word retirement. It doesn't feel like a modern word to me," she said. "I've been thinking of this as a transition. Maybe the best word to describe what I'm up to is evolution, [as] I'm evolving away from tennis."

The question now is this: What will Williams evolve towards? At this point, all tennis fans can do is sit back and wait to receive an answer.

Meanwhile, 22-time Grand Slam singles champion Nadal, who, like Federer, has endured his own share of injuries recently, has shown he's still focused on competing professionally.

During a post-match press conference at the United Cup, after being defeated by Cameron Norrie, he was asked if he planned to retire soon.

"When this day arrives, I'm gonna let you guys know," he responded. "But don't keep going with the retirement [questions] because I am here to keep playing tennis."

And why shouldn't he? After all, he won the Australian Open and the French Open (his record 14th victory in that Grand Slam alone) in 2022. And, despite his foot issues, he remains as focused as ever on winning.

"When it will be, it will be," he added. "Despite my body, my mind says I still want to keep going."

Until that day truly comes and Nadal ends his professional career, the tennis industry, as a whole, should celebrate his career and ongoing legacy by enjoying the present—yet another season with the greatest clay court tennis player of all time still determined to win.



# How the Indian Wells Tennis Garden & BNP Paribas Open Came to Be

ou don't create a premier tennis venue loved by players and fans alike without vision, passion, persistence and the right partners and investors. Indian Wells Tennis Garden is proof of what that winning formula can create.

The vision began with tennis great Charlie Pasarell, who saw the Coachella Valley as exactly the right place for a world-class tennis facility and tournament. There have been ups and downs along the way, but the vision and passion remained constant.

"The Indian Wells Tennis Garden (IWTG) is undoubtedly one of the finest and most impressive sport venues in the world, and The BNP Paribas Open is now recognized by many as the Fifth Major in tennis," Pasarell says. To understand how it all came about, he adds, you have to understand the history of tennis in the desert.

The first ATP men's tennis tournament in the desert was played in 1974 at Mission Hills Country Club. In 1980, ATP decided to move that tournament to Florida. For Pasarell, that was opportunity knocking.

"I saw an opportunity to replace that departing event and I successfully secured a new sanction to stage a men's tennis event at La Quinta Resort Tennis Club. The tournament was held there from 1981–1986. From the very beginning of running that tournament, I had the ambition and dream of building one of the most important tennis events in the world."

Many things would have to fall in place to make it work, not the least of which was the construction of a proper tennis stadium capable of accommodating large audiences and attracting major sponsors. It also needed to incorporate adequate facilities for media and television coverage. Finally, the venue needed to have enough courts and facilities for the players to secure the highest-level sanctions from the ATP and the WTA.

The path forward required partnerships and investors. Enter another tennis great and Pasarell's friend, Raymond Moore. The two joined with others to build a hotel in Indian Wells that would

include a 10,000-seat stadium. "This was the Grand Champions Hotel, now the Hyatt Regency," Pasarell notes, "and through the financing of that hotel we were able to include the cost of constructing the stadium."

Grand Champions Hotel opened in 1987 and the tournament moved from La Quinta to the new stadium, which allowed triple the former attendance and the addition of 12 new sponsor skyboxes to increase revenue. With increased revenue, they were able to double the prize money and eventually to secure a WTA women's event to be played the week prior to the men's event. The new stadium also gave the group the highest sanction from the ATP and ultimately from the WTA.

Dream realized, right? Not quite. By the mid-90s it was clear that the venue at the hotel had limited capacity for growth and the search was on for a new site. "Eventually, we found the current site where the Indian Wells Tennis Garden sits and, in 1998, in partnership with IMG, Raymond and I purchased the 180-acre property." This partnership with IMG and the personal support from the late Mark McCormack and Bob Kain were key to getting IWTG financed and built.

Indian Wells Tennis Garden opened in 2000 with a 16,000-seat stadium and the tournament was played over a 10-day period. That first year drew over 200,000 spectators, and with 44 stadium skyboxes in place the group saw dramatically increased revenue. That should have been the start of an easy road ahead, but things don't always work out the way you plan them.

"In 2000, we had sold all of our sponsorship and media rights to a European sports management company," Pasarell says. "Unfortunately, that company filed for bankruptcy in 2001. That bankruptcy, plus the effects of the tragic events of 9-1 l, put us in a difficult position with a big financial hole to fill. We not only lost all sponsorships, but our ability to secure new sponsorships became impossible. For the next three years, we experienced financial



losses. Fortunately, from our side, we were able to borrow money to cover our 50-percent share of the losses, and IMG and Mark McCormack covered the other 50 percent. Even though the tournament experienced losses for multiple years, we never sacrificed the quality of the event."

It took time but by 2004, with increased ticket sales and enough sponsorship revenues recouped, the partners began to break even on the tournament. Unfortunately, Mark McCormick passed away in 2003 and IMG was sold to a new ownership that failed to see the huge potential of the project. "All they saw was three years of losses. They wanted to sell the event to China," Pasarell says.

Pasarell and Moore were determined to keep the tournament in the California desert. "Bob Kain convinced the new IMG ownership to give us a year to find new investors who would purchase IMG's interest in the tournament."

Pasarell credits Moore with finding the majority of those investors who ultimately purchased IMG's 50 percent. Among the investors were Billie Jean King, Chris Evert, Pete Sampras, and organizations including the USTA and *Tennis Magazine*. "And from 2005 onward," Pasarell says, "the tournament made sufficient profit to give all the investors a nice return."

As the tournament grew increasingly successful, the partners were able to negotiate a full two-week sanction in the calendar with both the ATP and WTA. That put the tournament among only a handful with an exclusive sanction for a two-week combined event—four of them being the four Grand Slams.

With success comes complexities, and Indian Wells Tennis Garden and the tournament now known as the BNP Paribas Open were no exceptions. Foreign entities soon became interested in buying out the group and its two-week franchise. Large financial offers came in but the location in the California desert remained at the heart of what Pasarell, Moore and the others had built. Still, they had to present the lucrative offers to their investors, who might reasonably want to make a deal. Moore once again came to the rescue. He approached tennis superfan and Oracle CEO Larry Ellison about buying the tournament and IWTG.

"Larry Ellison's purchase was the best thing that happened to the tournament," Pasarell says. "Mr. Ellison has great vision and the resources to implement changes and improvements—and he has done so."

From a 10,000-seat arena in 1987 to a total of 24,000 seats, 29 courts, multiple luxury suites and five-star dining in 2023, Indian Wells Tennis Garden is the culmination of dreams, vision, persistence and partnerships. The attendance at the BNP Paribas Open has grown to nearly 500,000 and BNP Paribas and Larry Ellison are both committed to long-term investment. The result is one of the most impressive sports facilities in the world and a tournament that has truly lived up to its unofficial moniker as the Fifth Major in tennis.

"What Larry has done with the tournament and The Indian Wells Tennis Garden has exceeded my dreams and expectations," Pasarell says.

Moore, who stayed on with the tournament after Ellison's purchase, says there's much to be proud of, including the fact that the BNP Paribas Open has won Tournament of the Year eight consecutive years. "The award is handed out by the ATP and WTA Tours and is voted on by the players. No other tournament has won this award for more than two consecutive years. Ours is a record that will stand for a long time and we're not done yet. This achievement has been due to the support provided by Larry Ellison and the confidence he's shown in our management team along with access to his resources, which undoubtedly helped us achieve this award."

But there are others to thank as well. "The team I've assembled over the past 25 years are amazing in their dedication, creativity, passion and professionalism," Moore says. "Without them, this could never have been accomplished. It makes waking up in the morning and going to work pure pleasure. I am truly blessed."

Perhaps the greatest beneficiaries are the residents of the Coachella Valley, who have a year-round, state-of-the-art sports facility and one of the great tennis tournaments of all time in their backyard. They have the enduring vision and passion of Pasarell, Moore and Ellison to thank for that.


Desert High School State, CIF finalists, Tennis Tournament Chairperson for Save a Pet 2013 and Kittyland 2015.

## "SO SUE ME" Patrick Reed adds defamation suit to LIV-PGA Tour Litigation barrage rbdMD

ark Twain once speculated that if there were only one lawyer in a town, that lawyer would starve. But if there were two lawyers in that town, Twain predicted, both would get very rich.

Much of the news about pro golf today isn't so much about who is winning tournaments. It's about what's going on in the courtrooms. Mostly about the lawsuits that the LIV Golf tour players have filed against the PGA Tour, alleging anti-trust violations.

However, Patrick Reed, 2018 Masters champion, who jumped to the LIV Golf tour last June, has filed a lawsuit against Brandel Chamblee and the Golf Channel that has nothing to do with anti-trust issues, but is about his reputation.

Reed's lawsuit claims he was defamed by comments that Chamblee made as a Golf Channel analyst, alleging that Reed is a cheater. Reed's lawsuit says Chamblee's onair comments "misreported information with falsity and/or reckless disregard of the truth."

Chamblee accused Reed of cheating in the 2019 Hero World Challenge, where Reed was assessed a two-shot penalty for improving his lie in a bunker. Reed had no argument that the penalty was fairly assessed, but declared he in no way did it on purpose.

Reed has been accused of cheating dating back to his college career at the University of Georgia, but he claims he *was* not and *is* not a person who cheats at golf.

A cheating allegations by one player against another isn't anything new. Perhaps the most well-known confrontation where one player accused another of cheating was in 1983 at the Match Play Championship. Tom Watson accused Gary Player of improving his lie with a greenside chip shot. Watson didn't want to cause a scene on the course, so he confronted Player in the parking lot, with PGA Tour Rules Chairman Joe Dev standing next to him and Jack Nicklaus listening intently a few feet away. A sports writer overheard the exchange and took the story public. Player denied that he cheated and has always maintained that his conscience is clear.

Tour players usually know who among them cheats and who among them plays by the rules. Patrick Reed's penalty came in a natural dune where he was allowed to ground his club. That was not the violation. But as the TV camera caught and recorded, Reed's ball was in a footprint, almost a friedegg lie. When he grounded the club and took it back as a practice swing, the face of



his sand wedge moved some sand behind the ball, not once, but twice—considerably reducing the size of the footprint. Rules officials examined the TV footage and assessed Reed a two-shot penalty. Reed claims he had no idea that he had moved the sand and was fine with the penalty.

Reed had another incident after that, where fans thought he'd cheated. It was during the Farmers Insurance Open at Torrey Pines in 2021. A lift/clean/place rule was in effect because of heavy rain the night before. Reed's errant shot was embedded in long grass. He properly asked the marshal if he'd seen the ball bounce before it hit. The official said no, so Reed called for a ruling. What he was criticized for was lifting the ball out of its embedded position before asking for the ruling. The proper action would have been to ask another player to have a look at the ball before picking it up. Reed was given a favorable ruling and went on to win the tournament.

After being called out publicly as a cheater, and after the incident at Torrey Pines, many fans in the galleries began loudly booing Reed, even screaming "cheater!" when he'd hit a shot or strike a putt.

In his lawsuit, Reed is asking \$750 million in damages from Chamblee and the Golf Channel. Like all those PGA Tour members who jumped to LIV Golf, Reed is now banned from ever playing in a PGA

Tour event. However, the Masters, maybe fearing litigation and a diluted field, will allow LIV players to compete in this year's Masters. Reed, as a former Masters winner, is among the eligible.

As to all the litigation filling the air like anti-aircraft fire, Tiger Woods recently remarked that nothing is going to get solved between the PGA Tour and LIV Golf as long as there are so many lawsuits.

The court action by LIV golfers alleging anti-trust violations has resulted in the Justice Department launching what is now an ongoing investigation into those claims. "All this litigation is going to have to be paused so that both sides can talk," Tiger said. "Until that happens, we can't sit down and solve anything."

As for Reed, whether he is or isn't a cheater, only he and the man in the mirror know for sure. It was avid golfer and 1930s Hollywood legend, W.C. Fields, who once quipped, "Anything worth having is worth cheating to get." But Fields was a comedian and he was making a joke.

The more appropriate quote might be this anonymous and oft-repeated gem: "He who cheats at golf cheats at life."

## The New 2023 BMN 4 Series Coupe is a specimen of sportiness

There are two reasons to throw the back seat out of a car. The first for chastity. The second to save weight. Only one works every time and the new BMW M4 CSL takes full advantage of the weight savings in the heart-racing performance coupe.

The M4 CSL ("Competition, Sport, Lightweight") specs look more like a competition GT racer than a production car. The exhaust note roars like a stadium of lions. Use of dampers and the open rear cabin space make this sound unique to the M4 CSL. Carbon fiber seats don't make the M4 CSL something you might drive across America, but if you choose to, you'll see the other coast in record time. Make your first stop a chiropractor.

BMW will only produce 1,000 "examples" in 2023. Rumor has it that they've all been pre-sold. If not, you can get on the list to expect performance like an automotive version of the Georgia Bulldogs football team. It will hit you in the mouth and you'll ask for more. The twin-turbo, 3.0-liter V6, produces 550 horsepower. While it's 0-60 time, 3.3 seconds, isn't the fastest in the BMW fleet, it makes up for it on the top end of the power band. The CSL boasts a top speed of 191 mph and you get the sense that this German bulldog could do more if the computer would allow it.

Engineers and designers at BMW took a proverbial scalpel to the CSL cutting all the fat. The back seat and restraints were perhaps the most obvious of the ballast. Modifications to the chassis, springs, wheels and brakes dropped about 50 pounds. Somewhere a design specialist decided that traditional soundproofing was too heavy. A lighter version was found and 33 pounds shed. Apparently seats that adjust also weigh too much or distract from the driving experience, so the seat adjustments were jettisoned. Who needs anything more than one ultimate driving position anyway? The end result is a 3,640 pound car that flies like a kite in a hurricane.



To make all the weight modifications work without the car crumpling on the first corner, it needs rigidity. The motor mounts and transmission got special placement to transfer power while making the car stiff. Carbon and titanium through the body and exhaust magically add strength without feeling chunky. This combination makes it possible for the CSL to produce 479 lb-ft of torque from 2,750 to 5,950 rpm. The CSL features two storage areas for helmets. Need we say more? Instantly on takeoff, you'll





notice that CSL is lighter, spry and perhaps a little unhinged if left unsupervised.

If you like to customize, you'll find options with the drive settings on the M Drive. With options for comfort, sport and sport+ you can adjust the braking, steering, throttle and suspension response. M Drive gives you pre-sets that you can customize and program. Most drivers seem to like "with significant other" and "flying solo" presets that toggle between car-chase and nothing-to-see-here driving. Tweak the settings and you can turn the steering into a feather with the throttle and transmission responding like cadets to their drill sergeant.


The CSL is only offered in a rear-wheel drive version. Purists of the world cheer as the power isn't displaced by another two wheels wanting attention. It's all-wheel drive sibling, the M4 Competition weighs another 240 pounds completely unacceptable. The 20-inch rear wheels hold to the pavement so well that trust comes easily. The eight-speed automatic transmission delivers speed instantly from a gearbox that seems forged in the fires of Mordor.

The CSL gives a nod to BMW's 50 years of history with specialty badges on its hood, trunklid and wheels. The racing genes shine through in the almost retro pain accents. The yellow daytime running lights scream track car. The rear spoiler exudes a subtle, elegance to its dynamism.

At just over \$140,000 MSRP, the CSL isn't for the casual BMW driver. This car deserves a owner who will tweak every feature to squeeze another bit of marrow from its bones and get a tenth of a second on the straightaway. Drivers who like fast are going to love this light heavyweight. It's a sure champion for the ages.
