

David Toms is the first champion of The Galleri Classic



David Toms became the first champion of The Galleri Classic with a 16 under par performance besting the 78 player field on the PGA Champions Tour newest stop. Toms fired a final-round seven under par, 65 giving him a wire-towire victory. Steven Alker, the reigning PGA Tour Champions player of the year, fired a final round 67 to move into second place at 12-under. The wire-to-wire victory which earned the 53- year old Toms a \$330,000 check from the \$2.2 purse was Toms second PGA Tour Champions win in his last three starts and fourth overall. Toms was one of 20 major tournament winners in the 78 player field. He stood on the final green with the Galleri Classic trophy in hand, thanked the fans and volunteers, but refused to continue the long tradition of jumping into Poppie's Pond, set by LPGA champions, saying "he did not like the color of the water."

It has been said that when one door closes, another one opens. And that was just the case for the Inaugural Galleri Classic golf tournament held at Mission Hills Country Club in Rancho Mirage, California March 20-26th. After fifty-one years of celebrating the best players in the women's game saying goodbye last April the PGA Tour Champions picked up where the LPGA left off with a fresh event in the California desert. It was a natural flow into the schedule for the senior men professionals having just completed their event in Newport Beach.

March 2023 marks the first PGA Tour Champions event in the Coachella Valley since 1993. Indian Wells Golf Club hosted the Gulfstream Aerospace Invitational, which was held in the Coachella Valley from 1983 to 1993.

This years field of 78 pros teed it up in the event claiming 20 major tournament champions and a combined 292 PGA Tour Champions titles. The tournament was played over the Dinah Shore Tournament Course that has been one of the deserts premier layouts for since opening in 1971. Many of the players remarked that it was one of the best conditioned courses that they play though out the year.



GRAIL, the host sponsor has committed to a five-year agreement to stay in the valley. Galleri is the name of the early detection screening test they have created where a simple blood sample can reveal warning signs of up to 50 different types of cancer. Fans attending the event were allowed to receive the free test on the grounds any day of the tournament. Bio-tech company Grail jumped into its first sports sponsorship believing it had an


excellent opportunity through golf and the desert population to reach its most sought after demographic - those 50 and older.

Tournament director Michelle DeLancy, says " it is a five-year commitment to start for the Galleri Classic and I think the opportunity for a major tournament is possible. A major has been here and I know it can play well here." We will do a great job and the players will feel like they are playing in a major" There are a lot of golf fans here in the desert that will come out and support such a move by the PGA Champions Tour.

Longtime Tour professional, John Cook, who lived at Mission Hills and played the tournament course hundreds of times before turning pro said "this is a major championship course and always has been, the ladies had a great run here for 51-years with the Dinah Shore and the ANA. It is classic and old-school," Cook chose this event to end his playing career and concentrate on his Golf Channel reporting job.

Over 500 tournament volunteers turned out in support of the Inaugural event to make sure it was a success. Great weather and snowcapped mountain views made it a most enjoyable place to watch some great golf with everybody already looking forward to next year's event. Toms said "this was a true test of golf on a classic course and I will be back next year to defend. The 2024 Galleri Classic will be played March 26-31st and who knows, maybe as a major on the PGA Champions Tour.

Grail: Shifting from one cancer at a time to one individual at a time

The future is now. Thanks to Grail, LLC, a visionary healthcare company based in Menlo Park, California, the way we detect cancer is changing before our eyes. Grail's signature development, the Galleri multi-cancer early detection test, is the namesake behind the first annual Galleri Classic, part of the PGA Tour Champions, which recently wrapped at the Mission Hills Country Club.

The half century age of 50 years old usually marks the point when we start scheduling mammograms and colonoscopies. Unfortunately, many cancers go undetected until they have progressed to an advanced stage and people show symptoms. Recent research shows that adding a multi-cancer early detection blood test, such as Galleri, to the currently recommended screening tests may shift cancers that can be detected to earlier stages and may lead to a 39 percent reduction in five-year mortality for cancers that can be detected (or an approximate 26 percent reduction in overall cancer deaths).

Grail's first product, the Galleri test, launched in June 2021, is a groundbreaking multi-cancer early detection blood test with the potential to transform cancer care by detecting a shared cancer signal across more than 50 types of cancer, over 45 of which have no recommended screening today. Designed for those over 50 and/or with elevated cancer risk, the Galleri test results have a false positive rate of less than one percent, whereas single cancer screenings each has a false positive rate of 5 to 15 percent.

Multi-cancer early detection (MCED) is one of the most promising new tools in the war on cancer. Recent next-generation sequencing and machine learning advances have enabled the development of these tests that can identify a signal for many cancers from a single blood draw.

Multi-cancer early detection blood tests analyze DNA that has been shed by all cells, including cancer cells, into the bloodstream, looking for abnormal methylation patterns on those cell-free DNA fragments that indicate the presence of cancer. The Galleri test can also accurately predict the origin in the body from where that cancer signal originated.

Bob Ragusa, Grail's Chief Executive Officer, said, "This is the most direct applied application to change the mortality curve for cancer." As expected, Ragusa recognizes the significance for population health in democratizing access to cancer screening and saving millions of lives.

Megan Hall, Ph.D., Grail's Vice President of Medical Affairs, emphasizes that the Galleri test is a vital adjunct to standard of care cancer screenings (breast, colorectal, lung, cervical and prostate). She notes that we screen for these five common cancers, yet about 70 percent of people die from cancers for which screenings aren't taking place, such as pancreatic, brain, bone, stomach and others.

She notes, "The Galleri test doesn't replace our everyday cancer screenings. Rather, it's an important part of the equation to accurately detect and subsequently be able to diagnose cancer. The Galleri test complements these other screenings by extending the benefits of early detection."

Grail's President, Josh Ofman, MD, MSHS, said, "Cancer used to be a death sentence. This test changes all that, with early localized solid cancers being imminently treatable. Early vs. late detection is what leads to survival."

The test is currently an out-of-pocket expense for patients, but Grail is working with a coalition to find a pathway for insurance coverage and FDA approval. This will also help determine legislative measures required to gain Medicare and Medicaid (Medi-Cal in California) funding approval for administering the Galleri test to clients through CMS (Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services). These advances are aimed to make the test more affordable across various socioeconomic levels, incorporating the important elements of healthcare equity and access to care for patients.

In the meantime, Grail has forged more than 40 commercial alliances with employers, health systems and other stakeholders in 2022 and has over 60 partnerships. For physicians who are already implementing the Galleri test, Grail provides support services including education and awareness materials to make sure that patients can understand the process.

Clinical validation is key to demonstrating safety and efficacy. As such, Grail currently has over 300,000 people enrolled in clinical trials. This includes 140,000 people in the United Kingdom currently taking part in an NHS (National Health Service) trial, the largest-ever study of a multi-cancer early detection (MCED) test.

In addition to partnering with the PGA Tour Champions for The Galleri Classic in March, Grail brought a mobile blood draw unit to Rancho Mirage to the event to offer the Galleri test to attendees.

As for other projects that will impact public health, Grail is developing solutions to help accelerate cancer diagnoses, bloodbased detection for minimal residual disease and other postdiagnostic applications.

Ragusa said, "We are excited that Grail could work with the PGA for The Galleri Classic as a platform to inspire fans and peers to be proactive about their health. Patients with cancer are not statistics. They're real people with hope for the future."

This coming September 29 through October 1, partisan fans from both sides of the Atlantic will wildly cheer on their teams in the biannual Ryder Cup matches. As the top American pros square off against Europe's best, it is the first Ryder Cup to ever be played in Italy, at Rome's spectacular Marco Simone Golf & Country Club. This is one tournament where pros compete not prize money, but for national pride.

It all started in 1927 America professionals against England, with a cup donated by English businessman Samuel Ryder. The Yanks and Brits each won the Cup twice in the first eight years. But then the Yanks shut out the Brits from 1935 all the way to 1957 and again through 1983. It was so one-sided for America that most golf fans couldn't care less about the Ryder Cup. It was a ho-hum yawner, not even fodder for front-page sports news. Who cared?

Then in 1979, it all began to change when the British PGA started inviting players from all over the continent, including the likes of Spain's Seve Ballesteros and Germany's Bernhard Langer. The Europeans won two straight Ryder Cups in 1985 and 1987 and retained it with a tie in 1989. The rivalry was back on. It took losing to get American fans' competitive spirt spewing. In fact, since 1985, the Europeans are 11-6-1 while often playing the role of David against Goliath, winning several times against elite, highly favored US teams.

With this regenerated rivalry, there have been haunting chokes and unforgettable comebacks on both sides. There was Europe's "Miracle at Medinah in 2012. Down 10-6 the final day, Europe won eight of the twelve singles matches and tied one to retain the Cup and leave Americans everywhere shell-shocked and humiliated.

The most remarkable comeback for the USA was no doubt in 1999 at The Country Club in Brookline. Europe led by the same 10-6 margin that had faced them at Medinah. They seemed a cinch to clinch. The night before, team captain and golf historian Ben Crenshaw had rallied his American troops by reminding them that there was magic at this old club. That it was here in 1913 that Brookline former caddy Francis Ouimet shocked the world,



winning the US Open by catching English legends Ted Ray and Harry Vardon the final day then whipping them in a Monday playoff.

In his press conference after the third disappointing day of matches, Crenshaw wagged his finger emphatically at the cameras and said in a prophetic tone that now sounds like a premonition: "I'm gonna leave you all with one thought. I'm a big believer in *fate*." He let that sink in a few beats then added, "I have a *good* feeling about this."


The American team caught fire in the morning, winning the first six matches and clinching in the afternoon when Justin Leonard—down four holes after ten—holed a 45-foot putt to close out José María Olazábal and secure a 14.3-13.5 victory as Leonard's emotional teammates stormed the green. It seems almost spooky that Brookline's #17 green is directly across the street from Ouimet's boyhood home.



This year, the Europeans surely should be obsessed with revenge after getting trounced in 2021 at Whistling Straits. The youngest American team in the history of the Cup roared to a 19-9 victory, the largest margin in a Ryder Cup since 1967.

And while the war between the PGA Tour and the Saudi-backed LIV tour rages on, the American team will have to make a decision about allowing LIV players on the team. The Europeans have already said that LIV players can make the team by earning points in various ways. But the Americans are still balking. US Team Captain Zach Johnson publicly warned Americans playing the LIV tour that they may not be eligible for the team. Spain's Jon Rahm reacted in a recent CBS television interview. "I hope the PGA of America and European Tour make a decision together," Rahm said. "I don't think it would be smart to have one team allowing LIV players and one not to."

Rory McIlroy has been one of the biggest detractors of PGA Tour players who defected to the LIV tour. But he recently admitted that LIV golf has made a positive impact on the professional game. In an interview in early March, he said, "I'm not going to sit here and lie; I think the





emergence of LIV or the emergence of a competitor to the PGA Tour has benefited everyone that plays elite professional golf."

No matter which way that LIV controversy falls, one thing is sure: Everyone who loves the game and can't be there in person will be glued to their TVs as the drama unfolds in yet another historic battle for national pride.





A New Era has Dawned?

2023 men's singles **BNP** Paribas Open champion Carlos Alcaraz

Without question, the future of tennis is here-right now.

There's no denying that the future is bright for Carlos Alcaraz, a 19-year-old Spaniard who has already claimed eight ATP Tour singles, including the 2022 US Open and three Masters 1000 titles.

His third Masters 1000 title was the 2023 BNP Paribas Open, as he became the tournament's youngest men's singles champion and the first teenager to win it since Boris Becker—36 years ago.

Defeating 2021 US Open champion Daniil Medvedev (who entered the finals with a 19-match winning streak) 6-3, 6-2 in 1 hour and 10 minutes, Alcaraz reminded the tennis industry yet again that he could be the sport's next "big thing".

After all, he not only easily ended Medvedev's spectacular streak. He also never dropped a set, an achievement no one has accomplished since Roger Federer in 2017. And he claimed the No. 1 world ranking once again. Not too shabby for a 19-year-old.

He's quite humble for his age too, as evidenced by his encouraging words for 18-time ATP Tour singles winner Medvedev.

"You are an amazing player. You are working very hard," Alcaraz told his opponent after his victory. "I want to congratulate you for the work you have done in the last few months. Winning three titles in a row and reaching the finals here is an amazing achievement."

Medvedev, who, like Alcaraz, was playing in his first-ever singles final at a BNP Paribas Open, also praised his opponent. While reflecting on his latest winning streak and the ways he had overcome an ankle injury, he couldn't help but focus on Alcaraz's stunning achievements, too.

"I would like to congratulate Carlos. You already have amazing achievements in your career, and I'm sure many more to come," he emphasized on court during the post-match trophy ceremony. "Today's one more—winning Indian Wells. I also dream of it, so maybe next time."

Without question, Medvedev's time will come at the BNP Paribas Open, perhaps as early as next year. In addition, tennis fans may have witnessed the beginning of a potential rivalry: between one man who attained the No. 1 ranking roughly a year ago, and another who has become the first teenager to ever be No. 1 in the ATP Tour's world ranking.

Elena Rybakina Seeks Revenge Against Aryna Sabalenka

After losing to Aryna Sabalenka during the finals of this year's Australian Open, Elena Rybakina had a chance to retaliate roughly two months later, as she faced Sabalenka yet again in a finals match—this time at the renowned BNP Paribas Open.

Now ranked No. 7 in the WTA Tour world rankings, Rybakina, who was the No. 10 seed, defeated Sabalenka, who was the No. 2 seed, 7-6(11), 6-4, leading to her fourth WTA Tour singles title and first-ever WTA 1000 singles title. A winner of the 2022 Wimbledon Championships, the 23-year-old continues to display her immense potential, as she became the first female to defeat the WTA Tour's No. 1- and No. 2-ranked players at the BNP Paribas Open, in order to win the tournament.

The sixth straight first-time women's singles winner at the BNP Paribas Open, Rybakina also claimed her first victory since winning the Wimbledon Championships last summer.

"Hopefully I will come back next year and repeat this result," Rybakina stressed after reflecting on her hard-fought victory, as she ultimately defeated Sabalenka in 2 hours and 4 minutes.



"Today I would say that I was super disappointed with my serve, so I was back to old habits," Sabalenka emphasized as she attempted to explain her loss. "I was like a little bit overreacting on things, and I wasn't there in the first two games in the second set."

Nonetheless, Sabalenka is a 12-time WTA Tour singles winner and a Grand Slam champion. Holding a 318-161 career record in singles, the future is certainly bright for her. And an entertaining rivalry has potentially begun between her and Rybakina. After all, they're only the third duo to ever compete in the Australian Open and BNP Paribas Open finals in the same year.

"It's actually the first time it went my way," Rybakina said, as she remembered her Australian Open loss.

"I will make sure it was the last one," Sabelenka quickly responded, much to the delight of tennis fans around the world.

Now is the time for more great tennis rivalries. Keep your eyes on this pair too, as they may have a tremendous rivalry as well.

2023 BNP Paribas Open: Two Dynamic Duos

Two successful duos continued to display their talents at Indian Wells Tennis Garden

n St. Patrick's Day, 43-year-old Rohan Bopanna proved that age is just a number, as he teamed up with Australian Matt Ebden, a two-time Grand Slam doubles champion (one in mixed doubles and another in men's doubles), to win the 2023 BNP Paribas Open men's doubles title.

A winner of 24 doubles career titles, Bopanna now has a 463-350 career record in doubles events. He has also been placed in the top five of the men's doubles world rankings, rising to as high as No. 3 in 2013, three years after he nearly won the 2010 US Open men's doubles title—and four years before he won the 2017 French Open mixed doubles title.

On the other hand, Ebden now has nine doubles career titles, one of which was last year's Wimbledon Championships. Currently maintaining a nearly .500 career record in doubles events (124-125), Ebden also won the 2013 Australian Open mixed doubles title.

As a result of the duo's 6-3, 2-6, 10-8 victory over Wesley Koolhof and Neal Skupski, who are both ranked No. 1 in men's doubles and have 27 doubles titles between them, Bopanna became the first Indian man to win the BNP Paribas Open men's doubles title since Leander Paes claimed it in 2007. He also became the oldest man to ever win a Masters 1000 doubles title, just 13 days after he turned 43. Prior to the 2023 BNP Paribas Open, Bopanna had won four other Masters 1000 doubles titles.

"It's called Tennis Paradise for a reason," Bopanna said, while reflecting on Indian Wells Tennis Garden and his victory at the world-renowned facility. "I'm so happy that Matt and I were able to get this title here."

"We want to win the Slams, the Masters, the 500s and try to get to that No. 1 ranking," Ebden stressed. "That's what it's about. Today's a big step in that direction."

And who's to say they won't? After all, Ebden has showcased his talents at significant tournaments before, while Bopanna just proved that age is nothing but a number. And there's no reason to think their successful partnership won't continue throughout the remainder of 2023—and beyond.

Krejcíková and Siniaková Dominate Yet Again

Meanwhile, although they're only 26 and 27 years old, respectively, Katerina Siniaková and Barbora Krejcíková proved that experience is key at the 2023 BNP Paribas Open.

As the top seeds, with regards to women's doubles, Siniaková and Krejcíková defeated Beatriz Haddad Maia and Laura Siegemund 6-1, 6-7(3), [10-7] to claim their 15th women's doubles title together.

So far, Siniaková has won 22 women's doubles titles, including all Grand Slams, and three singles titles. Krejcíková, on the other hand, has triumphed at 16 women's doubles events, including each Grand Slam too, and six singles events, including the 2021 French Open.

Prior to the victory, the duo had finished second at the 2019 BNP Paribas Open, as they lost to Elise Mertens and Aryna Sabalenka. They certainly sought out revenge this year, defeating Haddad Maia and Siegemund in less than 2 hours. And no one can deny their recent run, especially in Grand Slams, as they've won four of the last five Grand Slam women's doubles titles, while also winning 24 consecutive Grand Slam women's doubles matches.

During the 2022 US Open, the duo also became the seventh team in the Open era to complete the career Grand Slam in women's doubles.

"There's a lot of emotions, but you just need to pick every ball and keep fighting," Siniaková said. "I think that's what's helping."

Undefeated in 2023, as the duo has a 11-0 record, Siniaková and Krejcíková haven't had as much success at WTA 1000 events though, as they hadn't claimed one since May 2021 and have only won three so far.

Perhaps this is the beginning of WTA 1000 greatness for the duo? No matter what happens, no one can deny their recent dominance.


"I'm really happy with how the match turned out at the end," Krejcíková stressed. "It's very nice to win another title."

Is yet another title in store for the duo in the near future? As



evidenced by their dominance, there's no reason to not expect greatness for years—perhaps even decades—to come.

The Agua Caliente Indian Reservation was established in 1876 and expanded in 1877. The Reservation includes land in what is now Palm Springs, Cathedral City, and Rancho Mirage.

Today, the Tribe has more than 500 members and is one of the largest employers in the Coachella Valley with its Tribal government, three casinos, a resort hotel and spa, and attractions such as the Indian Canyons, Tahquitz Canyon, Indian Canyons Golf Resort, and the new Agua Caliente Culture Plaza in downtown Palm Springs, which includes the Agua Caliente Cultural Museum and The Spa at Séc-he.

The Spa at Séc-he opened April 2023

For the Agua Caliente Band of Cahuilla Indians, no ancestral site is more significant than the Hot Mineral Spring on its ancestral land in downtown Palm Springs. The hot water, known to the Tribe as *Séc-he*, has effervesced for thousands of years. Bathing, or "taking the waters," is an ancient tradition.

Just as the Hot Mineral Spring is the heart and soul of the Tribe, so it is for the newly opened The Spa at Séc-he, which offers 22 private mineral baths to guests.

"The opening of The Spa at Séc-he is a defining moment for the Tribe," says Chairman Reid D. Milanovich. "The hot spring water means everything to us. It's at the heart of tribal life and has been a cultural resource for us and our ancestors for thousands of years. The power of these healing waters is real, and we are proud to offer the experience to all who come."







This past week I had the pleasure of golfing with a few of my clients & meet new golf friends. I feel excited to share some of these golf wedge tips with you. This months golf topic: wedges, ball position, shaft lean, weight distribution and club selection. Today let's work on the basics of wedges & then you will feel a better wedge game.

You will need: your Sand Wedge (56*) for all of these drills (start out simple, then add: lob wedge (60*, then gap wedge 52*)



Ball CENTERED:

Ball position: place the golf ball in the center of your stance

Feet together : then move your feet to a 7 iron width in a slightly "open stance" (left foot is back & right foot is slightly forward)

Torso (I call it the zipper of the body): is upright & more over the ball

Weight distribution: more on the left side (10-20%) the more you lean left with your weight the more the ball runs as well

Shaft lean: stays NEUTRAL, inside left leg for normal trajectory (the more you lean your SHAFT .the lower the golf ball runs or releases due to the delofting of the club)

Hands: slightly stronger grip thumbs to 2:00-2:30 pm

Notice in photo: the golf ball ejects at a normal trajectory (loft of the club)



Ball FORWARD:

Ball position: place the golf ball in the **FRONT** of your stance (more toward your left heal)

Feet together : then move your feet to a WIDER "hybrid / or fairway" width in a more "open stance" (left foot is back & right foot is slightly forward)

Torso (I call it the zipper of the body): is upright & more over the ball

Weight distribution: more on the left side (10-20%) the more you lean left with your weight the more the ball runs as well

Shaft lean: stays NEUTRAL, or slightly BEHIND THE BALL ..inside left leg for normal trajectory (the more you lean your SHAFT .the lower the golf ball runs or releases (due to the deloft of the club)

The shaft lead is also "lower", super close to the thighs feel like the club in on your lap

If you do shaft lean back: OPEN UP YOUR BLADE & use the bounce of the club more

Hands : palms facing "up to sky more" (stronger grip) . you could face the up to the sky (thumbs to 3 $\rm pm$)

Notice in photo: the golfball ejects at a **HIGHER** trajectory (loft of the club IS INCREASED DUE TO BALL POSITION)





Ball BACK:

Ball position: place the golf ball in the **BACK** of your stance (more toward your RIGHT heal)

Feet together : then move your feet to narrower stance a 9 iron width in a slightly "open stance" (left foot is back & right foot is slightly forward)

Torso (I call it the zipper of the body): is upright & more over the ball

Weight distribution: more on the left side (10-20%) the more you lean left with your weight the more the ball runs as well

Shaft lean: stays LEFT, or slightly TOWARD THE INSIDE TO OUTSIDE OF THE LEFT LEG .. (the more you lean your SHAFT .the lower the golf ball runs or releases (due to the deloft of the club)

If you do shaft lean: square blade then experiment with: hooded, then open, then really open blade

Hands: palms facing "up to sky more" (stronger grip) .you could face the up to the sky (thumbs to 3 pm)

Notice in photo: the golf ball ejects at a **LOWER** trajectory (the club is "delofted" just by the ball position)



Ball CENTERED

Ball FORWARD

Ball BACK

DRILLS:

BEGININGS GOLFERS: 10 balls of each ball position then work up to 50 balls

REPITIONS DRILLS: 50 balls of each swing (gain skill & knowledge, then feel)

RANDOM DRILLS: 1 of each swing (1 front, middle, back)

ADVANCED RANDOM: pitch V's chip V's flop (same yardage 10 balls in a row), (10 yards, 20 yards, then 30 yards)

ADVANCED RANDOW: same topic different clubs then add slopes

Super ADVANCED RANDOM: have a friend or family, "you play against them"

I look forward to seeing how you feel about a good THREE DIFFERENT BASIC BALL & SHAFT LEAN POSITIONS. Hopefully you can feel the difference after theses 3 swings tips & TRY some of theses golf drills. I look forward to helping you enjoy your golf game this winter. 

Anderson said, "I am honored to say that after many years of playing in other classics and supporting charitable causes around the world, I can host my own for the fifth year. The AACGC has become a renowned two-day event of great golf, fun, laughter and most importantly, charitable giving to causes near and dear to my heart."

Emmy and Golden Globe nominated actor Anderson is the star and executive producer of ABC's multi-award nominated sitcom



"black-ish." He portrayed Andre "Dre" Johnson, a family man who struggles to gain a sense of cultural identity while raising his kids in a predominantly white, uppermiddle class neighborhood.
