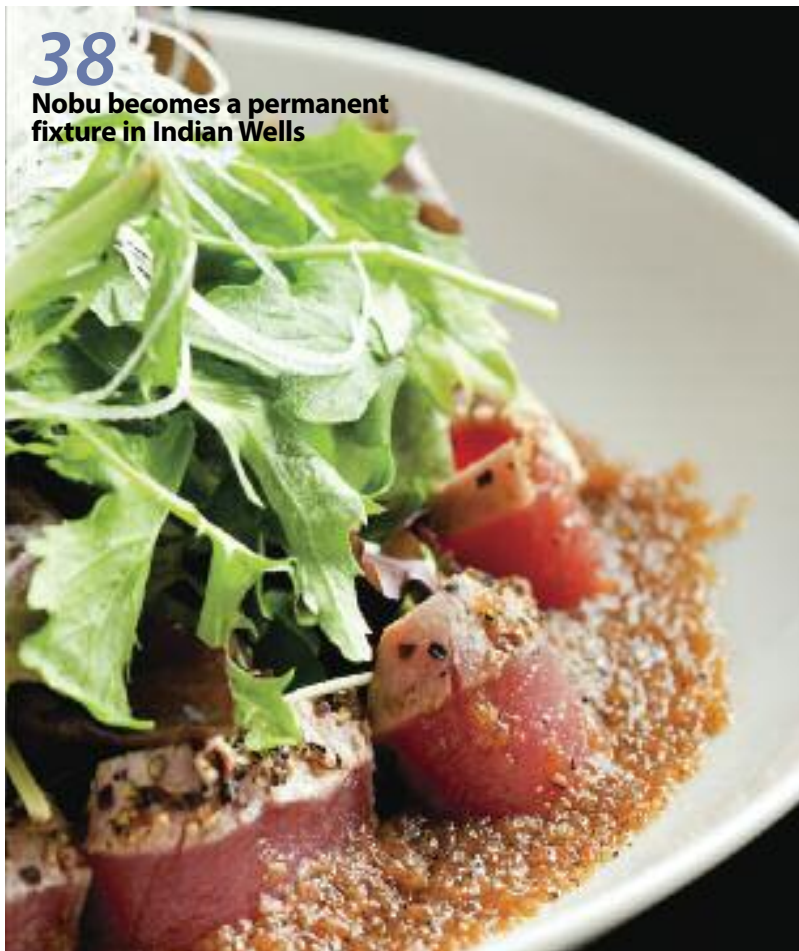

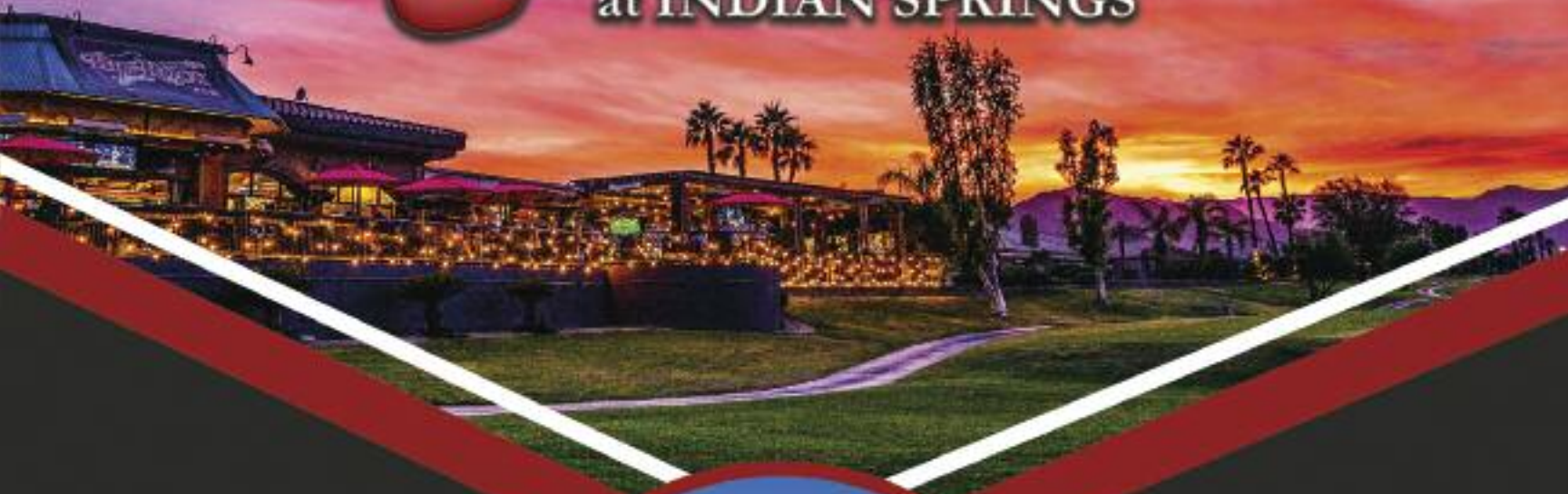

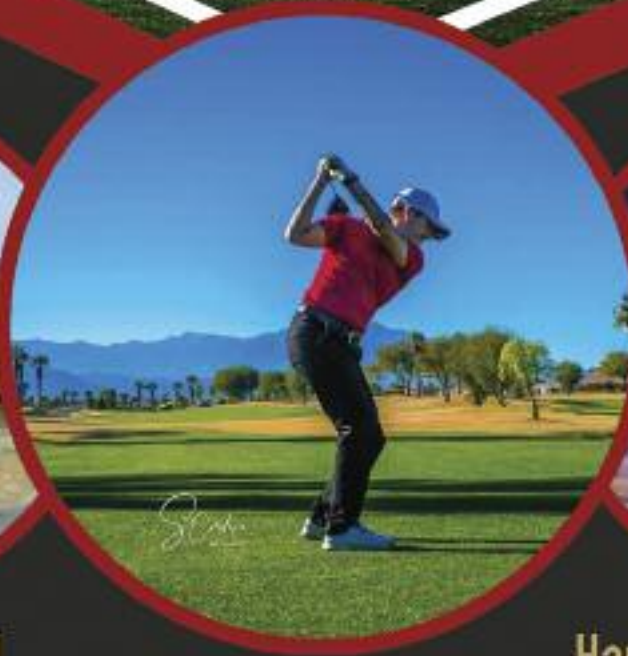

Teenage Sensation

Coco Gauff

Wins Her First Grand Slam



Gauff's breakthrough year came in 2018. She reached the fourth round of Wimbledon at the age of 15



Coco Gauff made history on September 9, 2023, when she became the first American teenager to win the U.S. Open since Serena Williams in 1999. The 19-year-old from Florida defeated Aryna Sabalenka of Belarus in three sets, 2-6, 6-3, 6-2. Gauff got off to a slow start in the first set but dominated in the next two sets to secure victory. The win was a culmination of years of hard work and dedication to tennis—including as a fan at the U.S. Open in years past to watch her idols, Serena and Venus Williams.

Gauff first made tennis news in 2018, when she became the youngest qualifier in Wimbledon history, making it to the fourth round in 2019. She followed that with a semifinal appearance at the French Open in 2019. In 2022, she reached the finals of the French Open, ultimately losing to Iga Swiatek.

Her victory at this year's U.S. Open cements her status as one of the top players in the world, which is exactly where many tennis fans believed she would one day be. Not only is it her first Grand Slam title, she's also the youngest woman to win the U.S. Open since Maria Sharapova won in 2006, also at age 19.

The then No. 6 seeded Gauff received a check for \$3 million for her win in New York, exactly the same amount handed to Novak Djokovic, who won the U.S. Open men's title a day later. Women tennis professionals can thank Hall of Famer Billie Jean King for

that. Fifty years ago, she fought for pay equity and got it when the 1973 U.S. Open became the first major sporting event to offer the same prize money to male and female competitors. King was at the U.S. Open to watch Gauff win her first Grand Slam, as was former President Barack Obama.

The U.S. Open victory is a highlight of Gauff's career to date, but it's also a major moment for American tennis. The United States hasn't had a women's Grand Slam champion since Sloane Stephens won the U.S. Open in 2017. Gauff's win is a sign that American tennis is on the rise, and the teenager is poised to become one of the sport's biggest stars.

In addition to her accomplishments on the court, Gauff is also a role model and inspiration for young girls around the world.

Here is a more detailed look at Coco Gauff's history and accomplishments on and off the courts:

Early career: Gauff first picked up a tennis racket at the age of 6. She quickly showed promise and began competing in junior tournaments when she was 10. In 2017, she won the U.S. Open junior girls' singles title.

Breakthrough year: Gauff's breakthrough year came in 2018. She reached the fourth round of Wimbledon at the age of 15, becoming the youngest player to do so since 1991. She also won



her first WTA Tour match at the Linz Open.

Continued success: Gauff continued to build on her accomplishments. She has won four WTA titles, including the Washington Open in 2023 and the Cincinnati Open in 2023. She also reached the finals of the French Open in 2022.

U.S. Open champion: Gauff's biggest accomplishment to date came this year, when she won the U.S. Open, defeating No. 2 seed Aryna Sabalenka in the final. It seems likely that there will be more Grand Slam titles in her future. Currently Sabalenka is No. 1 seed and Gauff is No. 3.

Role model: In addition to her accomplishments on the court, Gauff is also a role model for young girls everywhere. An advocate for education and empowerment, she has spoken out about issues such as racial injustice and gun violence.

Coco Gauff is a truly special talent. She's a gifted athlete with a bright future ahead of her and we look forward to seeing her in 2024 at the BNP Paribas Open at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden.

Caroline Wozniacki *Is Back!*





The tennis world was stunned in 2020 when former world No. 1 Caroline Wozniacki announced her retirement from the sport. She was only 29 years old and had just won her first Grand Slam title at the Australian Open. But Wozniacki was ready to start a family with her husband, former NBA player David Lee, and she wanted to focus on her health after being diagnosed with rheumatoid arthritis.

Three years later, she's making a comeback. A role model for women everywhere, Wozniacki is out to prove that it's never too late to follow your dreams. Her odds are good; this isn't the first challenge she's faced in her life, including a battle with rheumatoid arthritis. But she's a fierce competitor and determined to succeed.

Still, a comeback isn't without challenges. She'll be 33 years old when she returns to the tour, and she'll have to adjust to competing against much younger players.

"I'm not going to lie, it's going to be tough," she said. "But I'm up for the challenge."

Wozniacki has reason to be optimistic. As a former World No. 1 and Grand Slam champion, she knows what it takes to win at the highest level. Among her accomplishments are 30 WTA singles titles including a Grand Slam, a WTA finals title, three Premier Mandatory titles and three Premier 5 titles. She was 1st runner-up at the U.S. Open in 2009 and 2014, the French Open in 2014 and Wimbledon in 2016. She was ranked No. 1 in the world for 71 impressive weeks, a record not broken until this year when Polish player Iga Swiatek hit 72 weeks. Wozniacki was the first Scandinavian player to hold the top ranking and the first Danish player ever to win a Major singles title.

Since deciding to return to tennis, Wozniacki has been training hard and is in good physical condition. She's



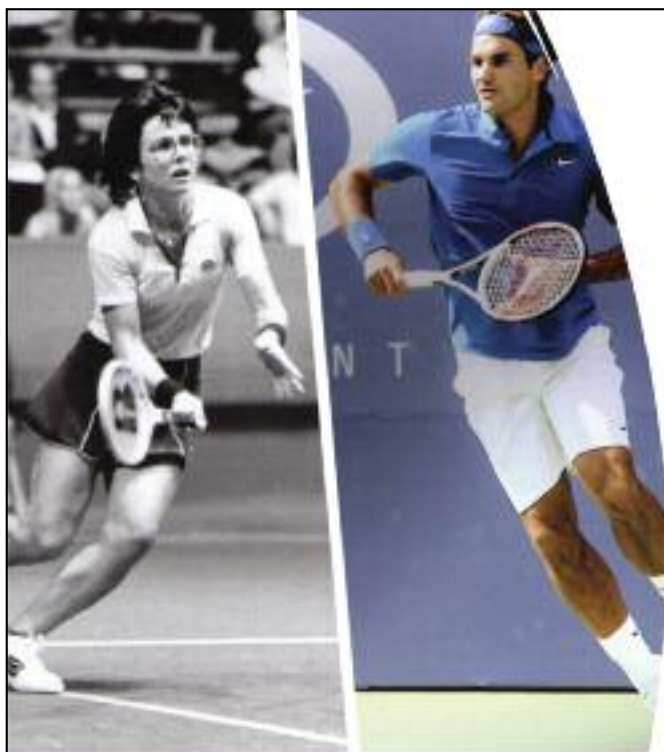


also been getting the support of family and friends, including tennis great Serena Williams. The tennis world is excited to see the return of this fan favorite to the courts. She's a great ambassador for the sport and her comeback is a boost for women's tennis. She first returned to the court at the 2023 Canadian Open where she made it to the second round. As of this writing, she's made it to the round of 16 at the U.S. Open.

Wozniacki and Lee have two children: a son, James and a daughter, Olivia. They'll no doubt benefit from a role model like Wozniacki who can teach them by example the importance of hard work, passion and dedication.

Regardless of how her comeback ultimately evolves, Caroline Wozniacki is a champion. Her comeback is a story of hope and inspiration, and tennis fans everywhere are excited to see what she can achieve in the years to come.

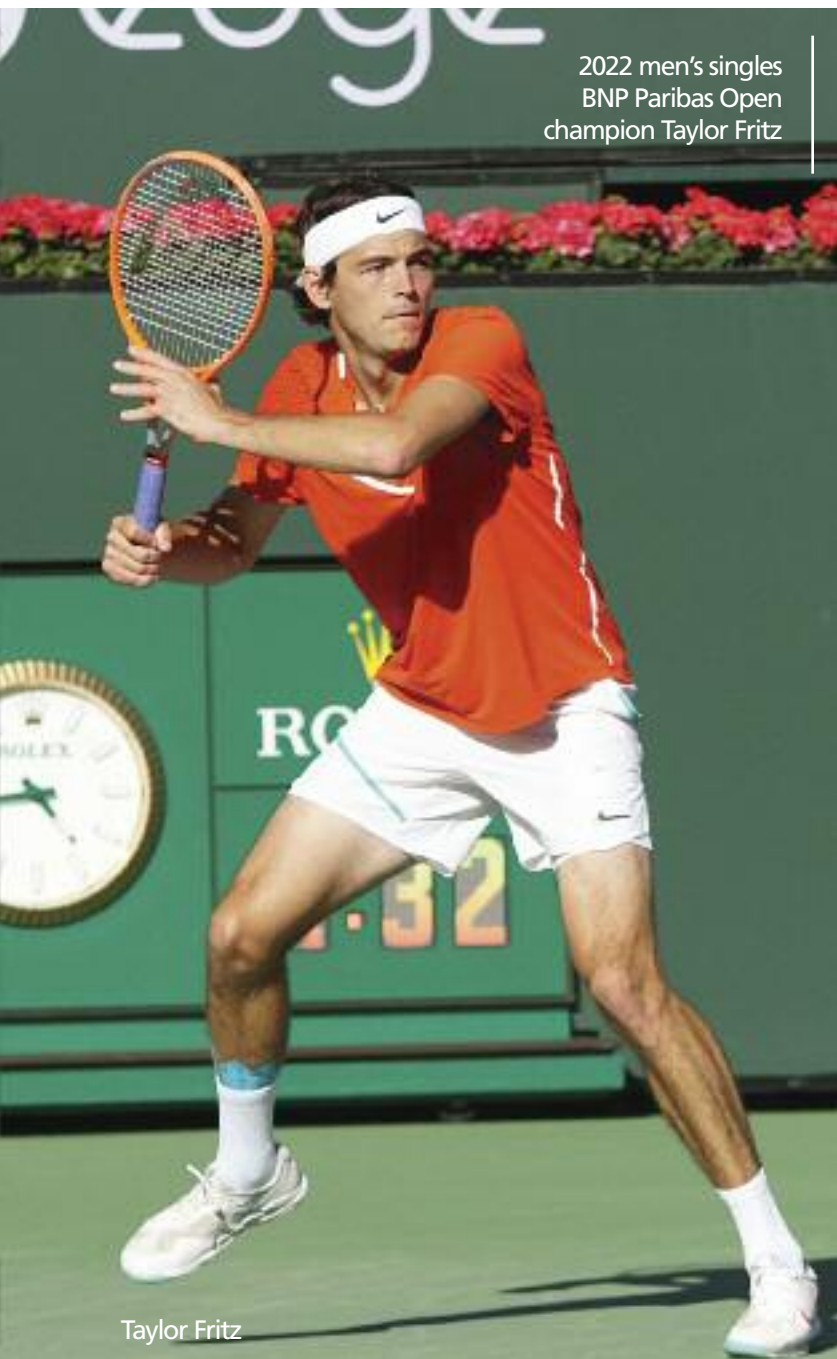

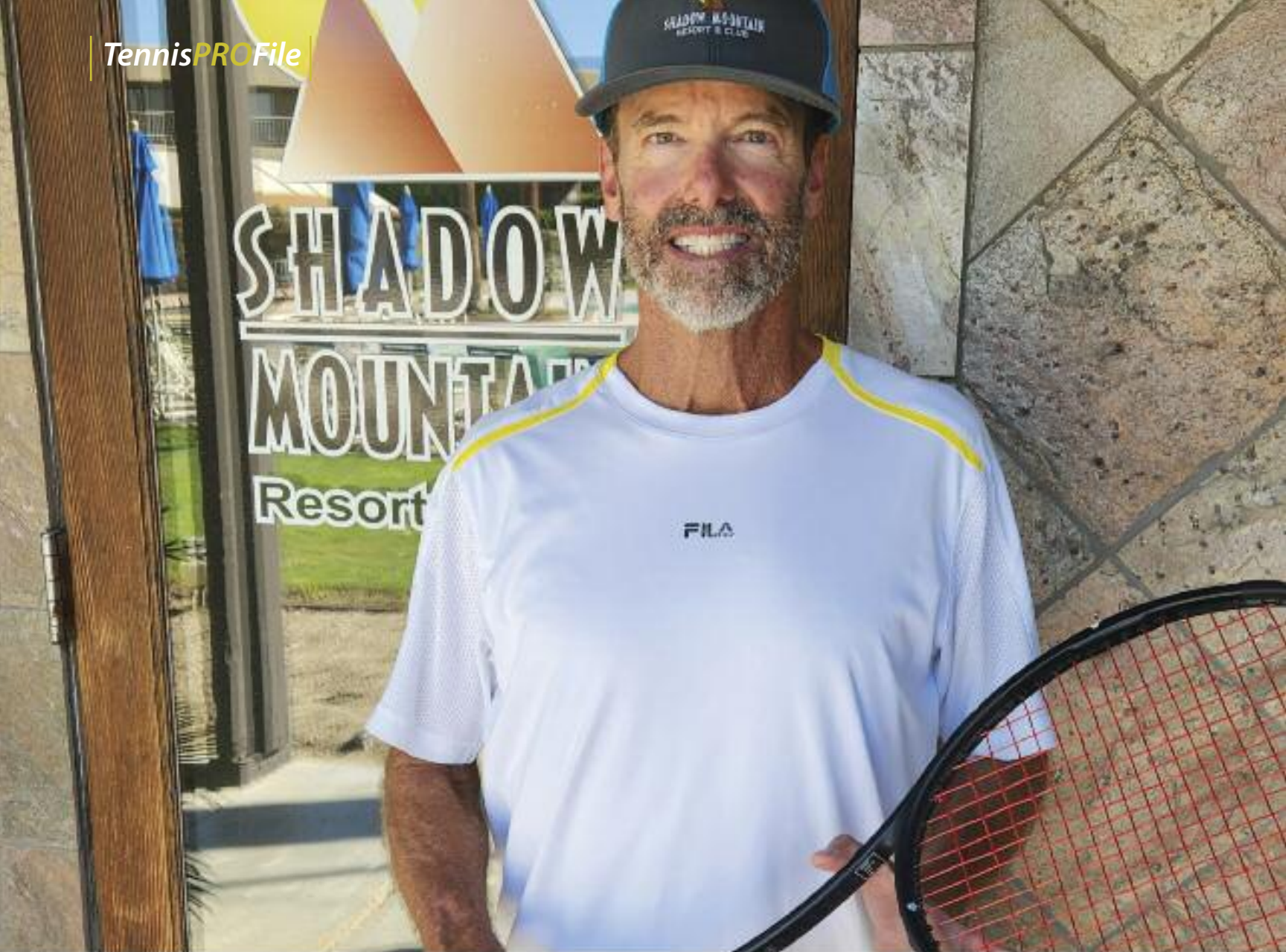

Listed as one of America's 50 greatest resorts for the past 20 years, *Tennis Magazine* has consistently ranked the Desert Tennis Academy as one of the top 25 tennis academies in the U.S. Palm Desert Shadow Mountain also holds the distinction of being one of the Top 75 Tennis Resorts in the world in 2017 and one of the Top 25 Camps with the Jr. Desert Tennis Academy, as named by Tennis Resorts Online. The resort's well-maintained facility includes 16 courts, 3 clay and 6 lighted for night play.

Meet Head Tennis Professional, John Randolph. Randolph started playing tennis at the age of five when his mother took him to his first tennis lesson. Randolph competed in other sports as well as tennis until his freshman year at Palm Springs High School where he began to focus exclusively on tennis, playing varsity on the team there through his senior year.

Upon graduation, Randolph went to work for former top 7 ranked player in the world and renowned coach Jose Higuera at Mission Hills Country Club. Under the auspices of Higuera, Randolph worked with many top juniors from around the world, including Alejo Mancisidor, a former top 50 touring pro. During this time, Randolph also attended College of the Desert, where he was the number one singles player on the team. He was the MVP



for College of the Desert for two seasons, including the undefeated conference winning team in 1989, the year he also reached the final of the conference championship. Following College of the Desert Randolph went on to U.C. Santa Barbara where he earned a Bachelor's Degree in Psychology.

After college, Randolph began teaching tennis at the Palm Spring Tennis Club, where he served as Head Pro. In the summers, Randolph traveled to Europe, playing tournaments, and coaching in south France. At this time, he also began working with several professional players on the WTA tour, including former Canadian number one and Fed Cup player and top 50 in the world Jana Nejedly. Randolph would later team up again with Jose Higuera, acting as hitting partner and helping to coach former number one player in the world and grand slam champion Jennifer Capriati, as well as Tracy Sinjin, formerly the number one ranked eighteen and under player in the United States.

Randolph would continue his coaching career at several other tennis clubs where he worked as the Head Tennis Pro, including the Palm Springs Plaza Racquet Club, the Riviera Resort, and the Reed Anderson Tennis School at the Westin. He has also taught tennis for the U.S. Santa Barbara Alumni Association Family Vacation Center and the Coachella Valley Parks and Recreation District. Randolph has served as the Head Tennis Professional at Shadow Mountain Resort & Club since 2001.

So, let's talk tennis. Randolph says his favorite surface to play on is hard courts. "I grew up on them, the bounce is very true and the footing is surer, although they can take their toll on the body. The other surfaces are fun and are softer and more forgiving, but there's much more slipping and sliding around on clay and grass."

Randolph mentioned, "a highlight this season was to work with one of the top 16-year-old junior players in the country, Allie

Bittner, who was in the desert to play the Easter Bowl national tournament."

When asked about the trend of players yelling at the referees, Randolph was quick to respond, "There definitely are a lot of different personalities out there now, which I think makes it more interesting. I tend to prefer the more well-behaved players myself, but if they were all like that it could get a bit boring. Having some outbursts and seeing players act up and display their emotions here and there can be entertaining. I doubt there is a competitive tennis player that has not smashed a racket at some point in their career!"

Randolph also shared that Tennis is his love and his life and teaches semi and private lessons year around. Randolph says, "if I were to encapsulate my tennis life in a nutshell it might go something like I am living my dream, I am blessed to be able to share my passion for tennis every day with so many wonderful people." Randolph is a dedicated vegan who loves a healthy lifestyle. He plays the guitar, enjoys reading, traveling, going to the gym, and biking

Graphite Versus Lightweight Steel Shafts

Each shaft offers a variety of benefits, depending on golfers' particular needs

Without question, irons' graphite and lightweight steel shafts vary considerably, from the ways in which they're manufactured to their raw materials.

Typically, graphite shafts have a natural vibration dampener, leading to a softer feel. In addition, they can be produced at lighter weights and softer flexes than lightweight steel shafts. On the other hand, steel shafts offer better distance control than graphite shafts, along with a more consistent bend profile, which will tighten dispersion from left to right whenever golfers use them.

While reflecting on these differences, Bill Lange, senior director, global sales and product management, True Temper Sports, advises golfers to first be fitted for their shafts, in order to determine which type is the most suitable for their particular swing. Generally, he believes that graphite shafts are especially ideal for golfers that need lighter weight or softer flex options, such as those who have inflammation issues.

"However, with lightweight steel shafts, golfers are getting the best of both worlds—lighter weight to help with distance, as well as lower torque and more stability for control," Lange says. "A lightweight steel option could also be the best choice for a player that has played heavier steel shafts for a long time. A transition to a lighter steel shaft, either with the same or a similar profile as their current shaft, may be a better option than going straight to graphite from heavy steel."

Aside from their light weight, graphite shafts provide vibration dampening properties, another key positive. Yet, they also have some negatives, as there aren't as many options available for graphite in heavier weight classes, particularly for stronger players. And, of equal importance, if graphite steel shafts aren't fitted properly, the likelihood of inconsistent shot patterns tends to increase.

Meanwhile, lightweight steel shafts offer golfers lower torque, leading to more stability and consistency, while also providing more feedback on shots than graphite. But, unlike graphite shafts, they're limited on how light and flexible they can be, regarding their compositions.

"True Temper Sports can design both graphite and steel shafts with similar playing characteristics," Lange emphasizes. "As a result, we have a wide range of graphite and steel shafts."

For example, it offers Aerotech SteelFiber shafts, which combine the power of graphite with the stability of steel. Each shaft features over 59 miles of unique steel fiber material that's exclusive to Aerotech.

"There are two products in the SteelFiber family: SteelFiber and SteelFiber FC," he adds. "SteelFiber shafts are ideal for golfers with moderate tempos that need medium trajectories and spin rates. In the meantime, SteelFiber FC (Flight Control) shafts combine the advanced composite technology of SteelFiber with variable tip stiffness."

He continues, "Consequently, golfers will have a higher ball flight as they use their mid and longer irons, while maintaining the classic SteelFiber launch in their scoring irons."

According to Lange, True Temper Sports provides the following options for lightweight steel shafts, too.

"True Temper Sports' graphite and steel shafts will fit anyone, but golfers must be fit to determine which option is suitable for them," he adds. "To play their best, golfers need to choose the right weight, flex and kick point, leading to more consistency long term."

AMT (Ascending Mass Technology)

“These shafts are made to be lighter in the long irons and gradually increase in weight as golfers move to their scoring clubs,” Lange says. “Therefore, golfers can launch their longer irons higher in the air and create more spin, while also enabling them to maintain a standard trajectory with their scoring clubs.”



Dynamic Gold Mid 100

ALIGNMENT

Happy Golf Season! Today we are going to focus on your ALIGNMENT.

I have 3 photo examples of "ALIGNMENT". Alignment can help or make your swing or golf ball go in very wrong directions. I feel "proper" alignment to your intended ball flight is a huge key for success.

Set up: (to your desired path)

1. For "SQUARE SET UP" ... body is parallel LEFT..... YOUR CLUB & GOLF BALL TO THE FLAG....
2. Your body should be "parallel" LEFT TO YOUR TARGET (or feet to the left edge of the green)
3. NOT YOUR FEET TO THE TARGET



Alignment DRILLS - (advanced)

1. Place an object on your feet, step away (see where your feet is going)
2. You can work the ball " with your club face", after you set up your body



Slice DRILLS

1. Place an object on your feet (can be a alignment aid or golf club) step away (see where your feet is going)
2. Aim your feet way "LEFT of the target"
3. When your body is aimed to the FAR LEFT, YOU WILL SLICE the ball to the RIGHT. The more your body is aimed to the LEFT, the more your ball flies to the RIGHT
4. If you are aligned to the "FAR LEFT" =Slice, snap hooks, tops, shanks, over the top, hit in a neighbors bbq, can come out of bad alignment



Hook DRILLS

1. Place an object on your feet (can be a alignment aid or golf club) step away (see where your feet is going)
2. Aim your feet way "right of the target"
3. When your body is aimed to the FAR RIGHT, YOU WILL HOOK the ball to the left. The more your body is aimed to the right, the more your ball flies to the LEFT
4. If you are aligned to the "FAR RIGHT" = high right, hook, slices, over the top, can come out of bad alignment

Nobu ***becomes a permanent*** ***fixture in Indian Wells***

**The holistic dining experience immerses
guests in a foodie fantasy**

The pop up is now permanent. This means that Indian Wells, California has been added to the marquis of prestigious cosmopolitan locales around the world that get to claim host to Nobu, one of the top foodie destinations on the planet and a favorite of A-listers and Instagram influencers. The massive restaurant and hotel empire was founded by celebrity chef Nobu Matsuhisa alongside actor Robert De Niro and the producer Meir Teper.

Now open at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden year-round, the transformational culinary experience is accessible to the general public and is no longer limited to the two weeks of the BNP Paribas tennis tournament, still a spectacular proposition overlooking on-court action on Stadium 2. In addition to the allure of the main dining section, there's a sushi bar with first come, first-served seating.

Named after the 74-year old chef, every dish is inspired by Matsuhisa's Japanese heritage and inventive Peruvian accents. He moved from Japan to Peru in 1973 to open his first restaurant. It was here that the fusion between the two cultures became apparent in his cuisine. The first Nobu opened in 1994 in New York, and by 1997 the first Nobu was established outside of the United States, in London.

Since then, Nobu has expanded throughout the U.S. and the world. Cities that are part of the exclusive club include Barcelona, Budapest, Dubai, Kuala



Lumpur, Milan, Malibu, Las Vegas and Scottsdale, along with four dozen others. And now, Indian Wells, California, undisputed hub of laid back chic and understated style, has made the cut.

Today, the vision extends beyond the plate. The success of the restaurants and the resultant cultural tidal wave have led to the launch of lifestyle experience hotels at several locations, such as in London, Santorini, Miami, Chicago, Marrakech, Manila and other world capitals. Whether in his restaurants or his hotels, Chef Nobu is meticulous about covering all the quality

bases, including exceptional service and elevated architectural design.

One's adventure might easily set forth with a cocktail, such as the Kinobi jalapeño which takes inspiration from the iconic yellowtail jalapeño. Kinobi dry gin from Kyoto Distillery is paired with house-made jalapeño honey syrup, yuzu and lemon juices with a dash of soy sauce. Other adult beverages pour up Matsuhisa martini, Qui espresso martini, grapefruit on the rocks and Pimm's cup. A solid selection of wines showcases top performers such as Far Niente chardonnay from Napa Valley '21,



Gabriel D'Ardhuy, Batard Montrachet, grand cru from Burgundy, France '15 (this one tastes even better when one considers its \$1,100 per bottle price tag) and Argyle, Reserve pinot noir from the Willamette Valley, Oregon '21.

The tab for each meal is not for the faint-hearted. The seven-course Japanese A5 Wagyu beef banquet totals up at around \$700. However, it is possible to score an exquisite meal for \$60 per person. The Wagyu from Kyushu, Japan, is velvety and sublime, offering new style or tataki with a two-ounce minimum order and yakimono with a four-ounce minimum order, priced by the ounce.

The eatery's famous signature dish is black cod with miso, a buttery cut that is marinated for two to three days in sake-miso sauce. Black cod (sablefish) lives in frigid Alaskan waters requiring a high fat content giving it such flavorful meat. It's also plentiful and sustainable.

Nobu's menu far exceeds what the most vivid imaginations can conjure up, including cold starters such as oysters with wasabi salsa, sashimi salad with Matsuhisa dressing and lobster ceviche on limestone lettuce. Nobu hot includes rock shrimp tempura with creamy spicy ponzu, prime filet toban yaki, grilled blue prawns with aji Amarillo and squid pasta with light garlic sauce.

The soups, tacos and shuku — such as crispy okra with spicy garlic ponzu - prepare the ambitious diner for what's to come. The nigiri sushi and sashimi menu features bigeye tuna, bluefin toro, Japanese snapper, kanpachi, mackerel, sea urchin, snow crab and multiple others to choose from, priced by the piece. The sushi maki menu also dishes up a variety of delicacies, including spicy tuna, negi toro, yellowtail scallion, eel cucumber, California, salmon skin and vegetable.

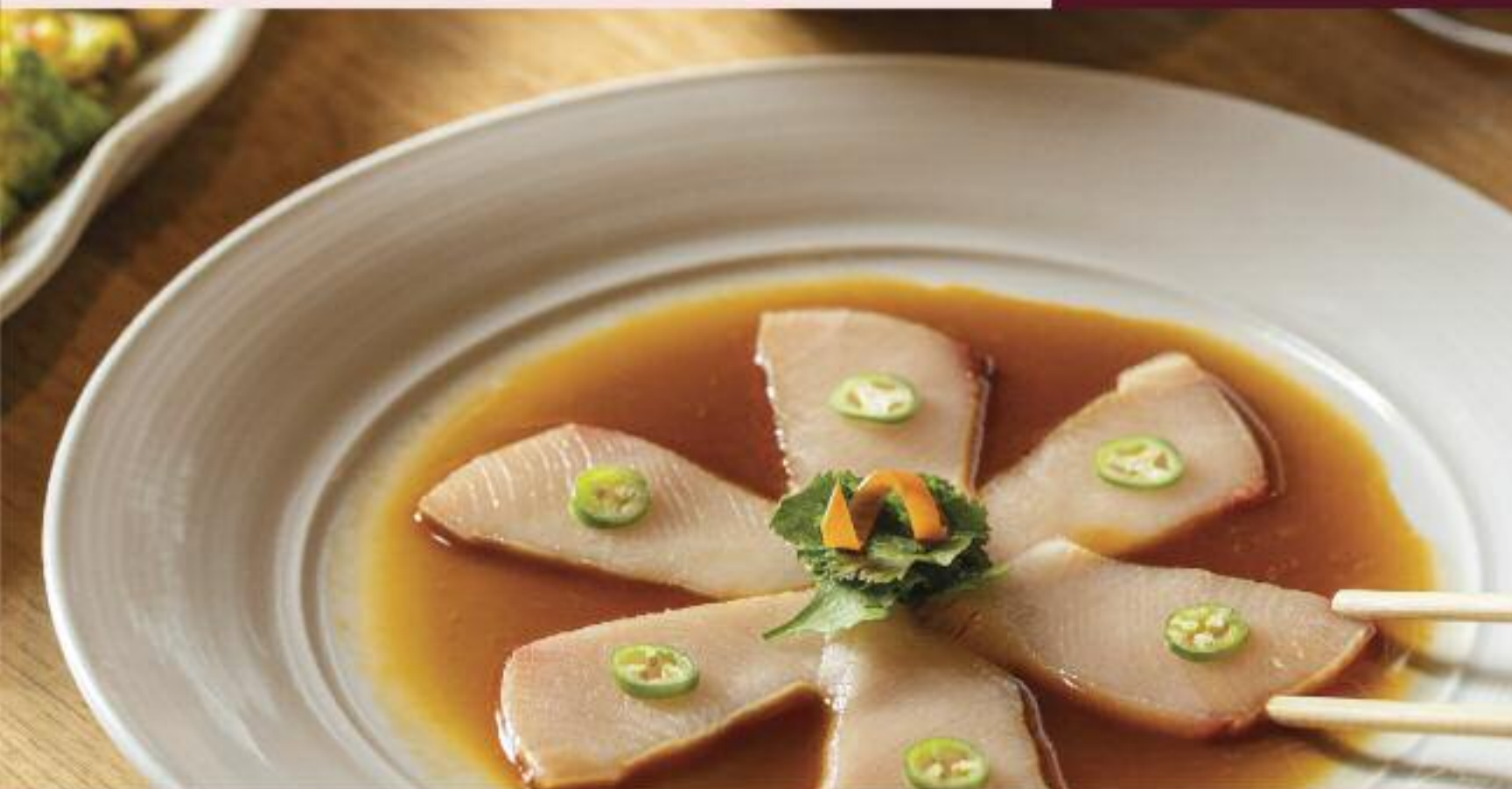
A special featured dish and a hidden gem for meat lovers is the Nobu-style beef toban yaki. Succulent slices of premium beef are marinated in a blend of traditional Japanese and Peruvian flavors and then expertly grilled on a ceramic toban plate, imbuing the meat with a subtle smoky nuance. The result is a harmonious blend of umami-rich taste, tender texture and aromatic appeal, served sizzling hot.



Desserts are delectable, featuring banana caramel soy toban yaki, passionfruit parfait and the blueberry yuzu tennis ball, clearly a bespoke concoction created for Tennis Garden visitors.

New Nobu restaurants are slated to open in Bangkok, Roma, Toronto, Hong Kong, Madrid and New Orleans soon. For now, desert dwellers can indulge their taste for Nobu-style flavors while enjoying dishes that represent and embody the Coachella Valley destination. The tennis is optional.

Upbeat music, dim lighting and a lively vibe set the tone at this adorable hot spot inside the Parker Palm Springs. Think Paris tabac or “les zinc” with a speakeasy undercurrent. The Jonathan Adler design complements the small bites menu. And the virtual shrine to good wine includes sophisticated and savvy selections, such as Domaine Boutet Saulnier Vouvray, Loire Valley, France 2020 and Petra Unger “Q” Gruner Veltliner, Kremstal, Austria 2019.

Bar seating and ledge-leaning is the rule of thumb in the Cave à Manger, where chic diners can order up small plated savory snacks. Examples include charred black pepper beef carpaccio truffle chimichurri, escargot cassalette with herb garlic butter, garlic and prawns, royal Osetra caviar and citrus donuts and duck, pork and fig terrine.

Vegans will be happy here too, with selections such as pastel de bacalao Portuguese style cod fish cakes and olives and honey roasted marcona almonds.

Each of the selections here is just right, best described as more than an amuse-bouche and less than a serving. Mangeons!
