Palou dominates the \$1 Million Challenge at The Thermal Club

For fans of the NTT INDYCAR SERIES, the \$1 Million Challenge satisfied the need for speed, and then some. The first annual event to be hosted at The Thermal Club took place from March 22 through March 24 and saw speed and strategy pay off for Spaniard Alex Palou with a lucrative victory on the final day in the Sprint for the Purse.

Palou, reigning NTT INDYCAR SERIES champion, pulled in \$500,000 for the win in the non-points exhibition event at the private, luxurious motorsports club located in Thermal, California. Palou led all 20 laps of the Sprint for the Purse from the pole, driving his No. 10 DHL Chip Ganassi Racing Honda to a 5.7929-second victory over the No. 3 XPEL Team Penske Chevrolet of Scott McLaughlin, who earned \$350,000 for his runner-up finish.

"The car was amazing," Palou said. "I was a bit surprised how the competitors did the first 10 laps, saving tires. I was like: 'All right, that's our game. I like it.' Super proud of the 10 car and everyone at Chip Ganassi Racing."

Palou is the first Spanish racing driver to win a National Championship in American open-wheel racing history and is also the first Spaniard to win in the GP3 Series.

There were numerous viewing stands available during the race as well as at track-side gathering zones adjacent to the clubhouse and food trucks, however most of The Thermal Club's members watched the cars tear up the track from the balconies of their homes on the Club's grounds. Tim and Twanna Rogers, owners of The Thermal Club, enjoyed the view from

their private balcony while hosting friends off and on during the competition.

Felix Rosenqvist rounded out the podium finishers in the No. 60 AutoNation/SiriusXM Honda fielded by Meyer Shank Racing, earning \$250,000. Rosenqvist and Palou each won heat races earlier in the race that trimmed the 27 car field to 12 drivers for the Sprint for the Purse on the 17-turn, 3.067-mile circuit at the base of the Santa Rosa Mountains.

Colton Herta placed fourth and earned \$100,000 in the No. 26 Gainbridge Honda fielded by Andretti Global after deliberately finishing more than 90 seconds behind Palou in the first 10-lap segment of the Sprint for the Purse to save his Firestone Firehawk tires. Tire changes were not allowed during the break between 10-lap segments, and Herta and about half of the field in the 12-car feature opted for a slower, tire-saving strategy in the opening 10 laps on the abrasive circuit.

Marcus Armstrong rounded out the top five in the No. 11 Ridgeline Lubricants Chip Ganassi Racing Honda, as CGR was the only team with two drivers in the top five. Armstrong earned \$50,000.

Palou was never challenged in either of the two segments, jumping away from the field on the start on Lap 1 and restart on Lap 11. Tire wear didn't appear to slow his pace at any point, as he inexorably drove away from McLaughlin lap by lap.

The cruise to the checkered maybe gave new father Palou time to think how he would spend his \$500,000 payday, after being proverbially sprayed by champagne.

"I need to buy a lot of diapers," Palou said. "I'll probably do that and probably do some small party with the boys [Ganassi crew]."

The most intense action in the final 10-lap segment came courtesy of Herta and Alexander Rossi.

Herta used his fresher tires to pick off drivers one by one as the laps counted down, while also carefully managing the 40 seconds of push to pass each driver was allotted. Herta dove under Linus Lundqvist's No. 8 American Legion Chip Ganassi Racing Honda for fifth on Lap 12 and then passed Armstrong for fourth with three laps to go after a stirring duel.

Rossi also saved tires in the first stint in his No. 7 Arrow McLaren Chevrolet and was in full aggression mode from the drop of the green flag on the Lap 11 restart after the halftime break.

2016 Indianapolis 500 winner Rossi climbed to sixth on Lap 11, and he and two-time series champion Josef Newgarden engaged in a spirited, side-by-side duel with contact for fifth place on Lap 12. Both drivers went wide in a corner while racing for fifth place, allowing Lundqvist and Herta to slip by for fifth and sixth place, respectively.

Rossi finally completed the pass of Newgarden later in the lap for seventh place. But Rossi used plenty of push-to-pass and tire rubber during those side-by-side jousts, and he ended up seventh at the finish.

The next NTT INDYCAR SERIES race is the iconic Acura Grand Prix of Long Beach, a points-paying event Sunday, April 21 on the streets of Long Beach, California.

The Thermal Club owner Rogers noted that the drivers and crew members alone comprised 1,200 attendees over the weekend, with close to another 2,000 spectators, including luminaries such as Caitlyn Jenner and Denver Bronco’s football legend John Elway, mixing and mingling with race fans.

Rogers said, “With INDY, we could keep our members in mind, and they love having INDY here. We are already looking at having two races next year, a points and a challenge race. And we have eight member races here per year already.”

He continued, “The event worked well for guests because it was point to point with food and all amenities included. We had two objectives in hosting the event at The Thermal Club: to have fun and to sell real estate.”

With 82 acres remaining to be developed at The Thermal Club, Rogers said that plans are progressing to build out a fifth track. BMW is also planning to renew their Performance Driving Center West lease agreement on the grounds of the Club for \$300,000 per month.

The Thermal Club’s members average \$30 million net worth each, and most are motorsport

enthusiasts who savor race car action. First opened in 2013, the Club offers four racing circuits, karting and autocross tracks, designed by Alan Wilson. Each track has its own covered paddock and a full pit crew. The tracks can accommodate any vehicle at any speed, from F1 to high performance exotics to vintage motorsports racecars.

In order to burn some rubber as a member of The Thermal Club – either with one’s own racing vehicle or with a car ordered for the day provided by The Club – the buy-in is \$200,000 initiation fee, \$2,400 per month membership fee and purchase of a lot with the firm commitment to build a luxury villa within five years, minimum 6,500 square feet. Most homes average 8,000 to 15,000 square feet, while Rogers’ home is 24,000 square feet.

Rogers reflected, “For our first year, the INDY race definitely met our expectations. Our drivers were happy with the facility, and we were pleased the way the race turned out on television and in person. We might look at developing corporate sponsorships next year. This is about learning and growing.”

He added, “And, Alex Palou may be looking at living here.” That may help with finding adequate storage for all those diapers. **DG&T**

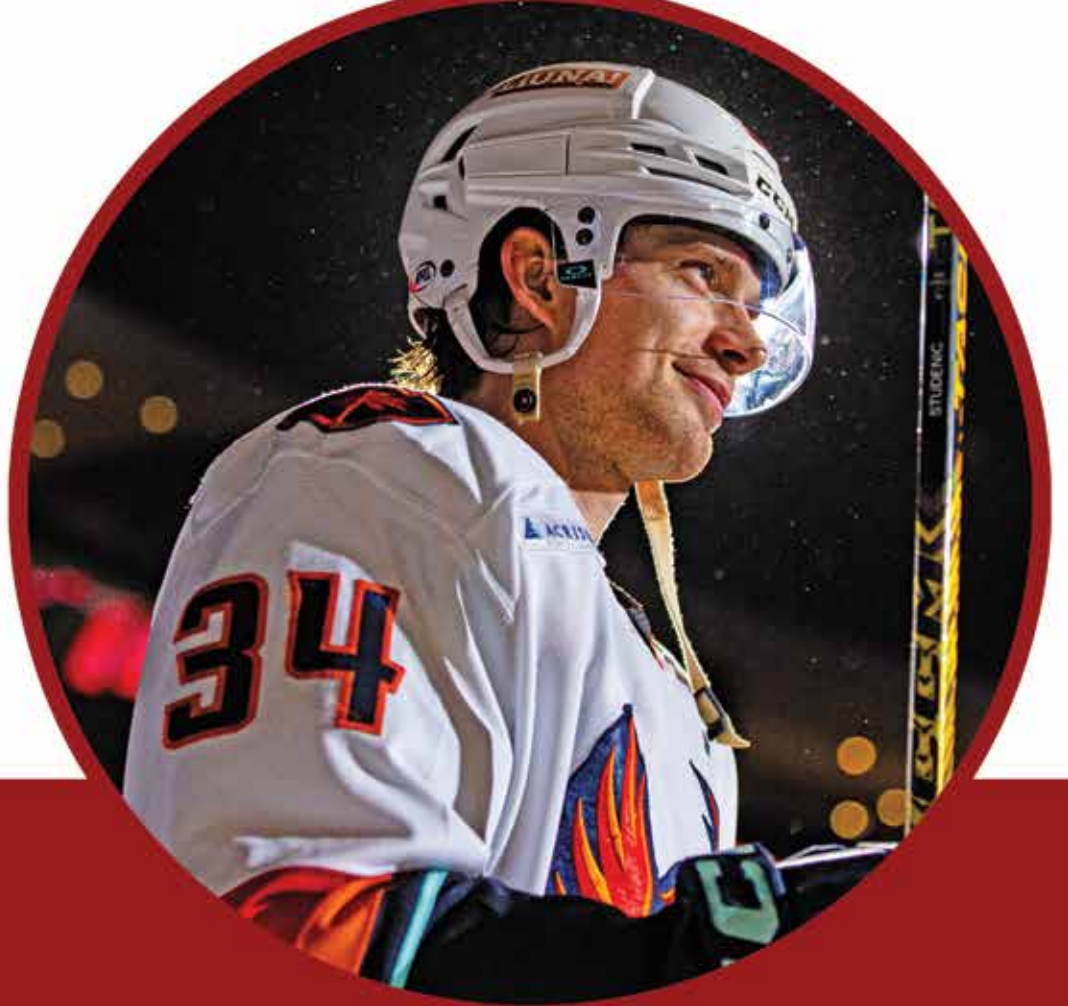

Taking life season by season, on and off the ice

For Marián Studenič, Coachella Valley Firebirds left winger forward, the best part of playing hockey is skating onto the ice and getting to hear the Coachella Valley crowds cheer. Studenič says, “It’s very impressive how many people there are that come out to support us. It’s amazing being able to play in front of a full stadium, especially since there’s such a strong fan base here in the Coachella Valley.”

Originally from Slovakia, this 25-year old example of athletic excellence is currently signed to a one year agreement with the Firebirds, the local AHL (American Hockey League) team which also covers him as part of the Seattle Kraken through what’s called a “two-way contract.” The Kraken compete in the National Hockey League as a member of the Pacific Division in the Western Conference.

Studenič started skating at three years old. He says, “Kids who start at nine or 10 years old can still end up playing hockey, but it’s always better to get out onto the ice as soon as possible.” His early experience combined with his discipline have resulted in him becoming an elite athlete and exceptional skater, known for his strength, speed, and agility. One of his favorite parts of the game is deftly maneuvering himself around the outside of the rink and sliding right past other players.

He played as a youth with his hometown team, HK 36 Skalica. He made his professional debut with the club during the 2014–15 season in the Slovak Extraliga. After two seasons in the Slovak League, Studenič moved to North America to develop his game at the major junior level. He was selected 11th overall in the 2016 Import Draft by the Hamilton Bulldogs of the Ontario Hockey League (OHL). Studenič was selected in the fifth-round, 143rd overall, by the New

Jersey Devils in the 2017 NHL Entry Draft, and on April 2, 2018, Stuenkel signed a three-year, entry-level contract with the New Jersey Devils. After attending the Devils training camp, Stuenkel was assigned to their AHL affiliate, the Binghamton Devils, for the 2018–19 season. Stuenkel made his AHL debut on October 7, 2018 against the Toronto Marlies where he also scored his first AHL goal.

On August 13, 2020, Stuenkel was assigned by the Devils to HC Slovan Bratislava of the Slovak Extraliga on loan until the commencement of the delayed 2020–21 North American season. He scored his first NHL goal against the New York Rangers on 18 April 2021.

In the following 2021–22 season, Stuenkel split the season between New Jersey and the new AHL affiliate, the Utica Comets, registering just one goal through 17 games with the Devils. On January 24, 2022, Stuenkel's tenure with the Devils ended as he was claimed off waivers by the Dallas Stars. On July 1, 2023, having left the Stars as a free agent after not receiving a qualifying offer, Stuenkel was signed to a one-year, two-way contract with the Seattle Kraken for the 2023–24 season.

Stuenkel remains philosophical about a lifestyle that involves moving and feeling unsettled at times. He acknowledges that players are never sure how long they will be in one place. Instead of focusing on the transience, however, he chooses to look at the experience as an adventure – something that he finds “exciting.”

A normal day starts out around 8 a.m., with practice taking place for an hour or two on the ice at Acrisure Arena followed by a regimen of working out in the gym for a few hours.



Studenič says, “It’s fun being on the road, especially depending on the city. I’ve gotten used to living out of two luggages [suitcases]. I never mind the travel, but I like being home most of all. It’s always best to sleep in my own bed.”

When he’s not traveling to away games, Studenič works on his golf. He’s new to it, so he’s been putting in some time on the driving range. He also had a chance to spectate at the BNP Paribas tennis tournament that recently concluded in Indian Wells, which reminded him of playing tennis with his younger brother back home in Slovakia.

In between seasons, he treasures time with family in his native country. He points out that during active season, his body takes a beating, so the chance to rest and relax for three or four months is always welcome. He spends quality time with his mother, father and brother as well as friends he grew up with while preparing mentally and physically for another upcoming – and demanding - hockey schedule.

He says, “My parents pushed me my whole life to succeed. They’re proud of me.”

His parents visited him at the holidays, and they share his love of the Coachella Valley. When asked if they would ever move to the United States to join him, he replies, “No, they’ll stay put. After all, home is home.”

As for the potential downside of the sport – the injuries – Studenič stays positive. “I recently lost six teeth, so they don’t look so great right now. But I’m getting them fixed. The worst part was that I couldn’t eat solid food for two weeks, but my mom helped me by mixing chicken and potatoes into a soup. It was delicious.”

He continues, “It could be a lot worse. It’s always best to have injuries to the teeth instead of, say, a broken arm or hand or a torn ACL. With those, you’re out for a long time, but with busted teeth, it’s just for part of the day.”

Studenič isn’t sure where he’ll be a year from now, saying, “One year goes by really quickly. And the goal for most of us is to play with the NHL.” Ideally, he’d like to remain in the desert and see the Firebirds elevate to NHL level, which would be the best of both worlds for him.

He says, “I’m not sure what the future will bring . . . I kind of have to just roll with it and take it season by season. For now, though, playing hockey makes me happy.” **DG&T**

Empire Polo Club's Equestrian Elegance

The allure of wide brimmed hats, stomping divots and graceful athleticism

As the cliché goes, polo is the sport of kings... in which case, Empire Polo Club in Indio reigns supreme. Lush green fields, majestic horses, and players adorned in full polo regalia create a captivating scene, completed by dressed-to-impress spectators in stands and on picnic blankets.

Founded in 1987 and situated in Indio, California, Empire Polo Club features 12 grass polo fields, a regulation-sized polo arena, two exercise tracks, both polo and hunter/jumper stabling, The Tack Room Tavern Restaurant and the Date Shed Night Club. The Club accommodates a turn out of 700 horses, making it one of the largest polo clubs on the west coast.

HISTORY:

The sport of polo has a rich history, originating in central Asia. It was first played in Persia (Iran) between the 6th century BC and the 1st century AD by the nomadic Iranian people. Women played as well as men. It was originally a training game for cavalry units, usually the king's guard or other elite troops. To the warlike tribesmen, who played with as many as 100 to a side, it was a miniature battle. The game was played from Constantinople, where Emperor Theodosius II constructed a polo ground early in the 5th century, to Japan by the Middle Ages. The game also spread south to Arabia and to India and Tibet.

The game quickly spread throughout Europe when the soldiers brought the game back to England, and it became more formal with leagues and teams.

British and Irish immigrants in the Argentine pampas started practicing polo during their free time. The sport spread quickly among the skillful gauchos in Argentina, and Argentina is now noted for having the largest contingent of 10 handicap players out of any other country.

The modern, international game of polo is derived from the form played in Manipur, India, where it was played even by commoners who owned a pony.

James Gordon Bennett Jr. organized what was recorded as the first polo match in the United States at Dickel's Riding Academy in New York City in May, 1876. Bennett established the Westchester Polo Club.

Polo has become a spectator sport for equestrians and high society, often supported by sponsorships. It is now popular around the world, with well over 100 member countries in the Federation of International Polo, played professionally in 16 countries. Polo was an Olympic sport from 1900 to 1936.

HOW TO PLAY:

Taking place on horseback, polo is played by two opposing teams with the objective of scoring using a long-handled wooden mallet to hit a small hard ball through the opposing team's goal. Each team has four mounted riders, and the game usually lasts one to two hours, divided into seven-minute periods called chukkas or chukkers.

Arena polo is an indoor or semi-outdoor variant with similar rules and is played with three riders per team. The playing field is smaller, enclosed and usually comprised of compacted sand or fine aggregate. Arena polo has more maneuvering due to space limitations and uses an air-inflated ball slightly larger than the hard solid ball used in field polo. Standard mallets are used, though slightly larger, and head arena mallets are an option.

SEASON:

Empire Polo Club's winter season begins in December with pre-season weekend tournaments. The main season starts in January and continues through the first weekend in April, offering one-goal, four-goal and eight-goal leagues. Polo games are open to the public, and spectators are invited to attend. Sunday Polo kicks off with Opening Day and Hat Day in early January, and there are weekly

featured matches at 12 p.m. and 2 p.m. Tailgating and general admission are free with a \$20 parking fee at Empire Polo Club. VIP seating is also available for an additional fee.

The Empire Polo Club hosts local, national and international matches and tournaments. The grounds are owned by Alex Haagen, III. Since 1993, the Empire Polo Club has leased its polo grounds annually to the organizers of the Coachella Valley Music and Arts Festival and the Stagecoach Festival, bringing awareness of the polo venue to hip crowds who swarm the east valley each year to immerse themselves in music.

Newbies interested in learning how to play polo can sign up for sessions offered by the Los Angeles Polo Training Center & Polo School which is located on property at the Empire Polo Club.

If you're new to the sport, just remember to clap lightly so as not to startle the horses. It's pretty easy to look like a pro, and the reality is that anyone can play and/or watch polo. **DS&L**

Goosen's career is one of a story-book champion in the world of golf, having won 38 events world-wide including two U.S. Opens



Retief Goosen adds The Galleri Classic win to his many accomplishments world-wide. This year, the Galleri Classic was not decided until the final hole. There was drama when Steve Alker bogied the par-three 17th to drop a shot from -14 to -13, tying Retief Goosen, both hit their second shots into the water at the 18th, however, Goosen was able to get up and down for par to take the winners purse, while Alker bogied the final hole to lose the tournament, finishing in a three-way tie for second place with Ricardo Gonzalez and Alex Cejka.

Goosen's career is one of a storybook champion in the world of golf, having won 38 events world-wide including two U.S. Opens, one in a playoff against Mark Brooks in 2001 and another beating Phil Mickelson by two shots in 2004. The World Golf Hall of Famer was delighted with his surviving win at Mission Hills Country Club.

The Galleri field featured 78 PGA Champions which included 20 major tour winners and six World Golf Hall of Fame members who played for a purse of \$2.4 million, with \$330,000 going to winner Retief Goosen.

It was a natural flow into the schedule for the senior men professionals having just completed their event in Newport Beach. The tournament was played over on the Dinah Shore Tournament Course that has been one of the desert's premier layouts since opening in 1971. Many of the players remarked that it's one of the best-conditioned golf courses they play all year.

GRAIL, the host sponsor of the tournament has committed to a five-year agreement to stay in the valley. The GRAIL test is an early detection screening test created to take a simple blood sample and the results can reveal warning signs of up to 50 different types of cancer. For a fee, fans attending the event were able to sign up and be tested on the grounds, any day of the tournament. Bio-tech company GRAIL jumped into its first sports sponsorship believing it had an excellent opportunity with golf and the desert population to reach its most sought after demographic, those 50 and older.

Tournament Director, Michelle DeLancy said "we have a five-year commitment for The Galleri Classic, and I think it could be a major tournament one day." There are a lot of golf fans here in the desert that would come out and support such a move by the PGA Champions Tour. Long time tour professional John Cook, who once lived at Mission Hills and played the course hundreds of times said, "it is a major championship course and always has been, the ladies had a great run here for 51 years with the Dinah Shore and the ANA, it is classic and old school."

Over 500 volunteers turned out in support of the event to ensure it was a success. It sure looks like the Galleri Classic is destined to become one of the premier events on the Champions Tour given the golf course, a field of legends, major champions and personalities.

The 2025 Galleri Classic will be played March 28th thru 30th and who knows, maybe as a major on the PGA Champions Tour. **DG&T**

BNP Paribas Open

Champions Continue
to Dominate

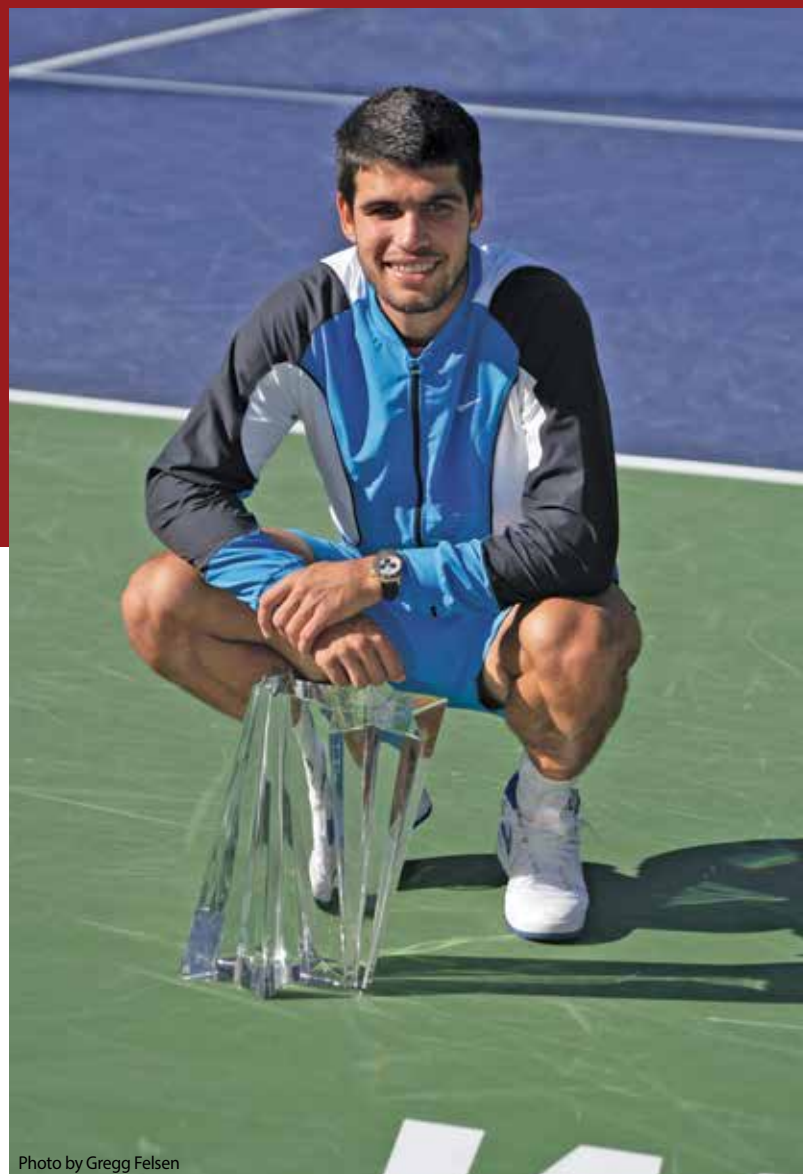

Year after year, the BNP Paribas Open proves to be one of the tennis industry's most exciting tournaments. And this year was no exception, as a repeat champion was crowned, a world No. 1 won yet again and two pairs of doubles champions enthused the crowds with their play.

In reflection of another successful, thrilling and highly attended championship (493,440 fans enjoyed the action, an all-time record), here are Desert Golf & Tennis's key takeaways from this year's BNP Paribas Open.

Alcaraz Wins Again

Despite injuring his right ankle last month, Carlos Alcaraz successfully defended his title, becoming the first male to do so since Novak Djokovic, who won in 2014 and 2015 (along with 2016). Consequently, he became the eighth man to successfully defend the BNP Paribas Open.

Aside from this significant achievement, he also joined a living legend, with regard to another record. Along with Rafael Nadal, he is one of only two men to claim five ATP Masters 1000 events before turning 21.

To add his name to the record books, Alcaraz had to overcome several challenges though, in addition to his injured right ankle. First, he hadn't competed in a finals since August 2023. Additionally, he hadn't won since the 2023 Wimbledon Championships. And, finally, his opponent, Daniil Medvedev, defeated him during the semifinals of the 2023 US Open.

Nonetheless, Alcaraz remained positive, as he ultimately defeated Medvedev 7-6 (5), 6-1, a victory that occurred just hours after he had ended Jannik Sinner's 19-match winning streak.

"It means a lot to me—lifting this trophy, winning this tournament—because I [overcame] a lot of problems in my head [and] a lot of problems physically," Alcaraz said.

While reflecting on his victory, he focused on the thousands of fans who had just witnessed his title defense, ensuring they knew how much he appreciated them.

"I enjoy playing so much in front of you. So much energy. I felt the love since the first day until today," Alcaraz stressed. "Thanks to you, thanks to the energy you bring to me, I could show my best tennis."

Iga Świątek returned this year to win yet again. As a result of her performance at the BNP Paribas Open, she's is now ranked No. 9.

Świątek Maintains Her No. 1 Ranking

Although she didn't successfully defend her title during the 2023 BNP Paribas Open, Iga Świątek returned this year to win yet again—and become only the 10th female to record multiple victories at the championship.

By defeating Maria Sakkari 6-4, 6-0, whom she had outlasted in 2022 too, Świątek continued to prove why she's the current No. 1 ranked female, a position she's held for roughly 100 weeks (among the top 10 total of all time).

"It's amazing standing here again [with the trophy]," she said, while reflecting on her victory.

Due to her win, Świątek now has a 19-4 career record in WTA Tour finals. She also increased her total singles victories at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden to 18 (with only two losses). As an example of the 22-year-old's recent performances, while competing against Sakkari, she has won their last three matches and six sets. Not to mention, while doing so, she has only dropped 15 games.

Yet, regardless of Świątek's recent dominance, Sakkari remains positive, as she continues her comeback. After all, she dropped out of the top 10 of the rankings earlier this year. But, as a result of her performance at the BNP Paribas Open, she's ranked No. 9 now.

"I just loved every minute of it," she emphasized. "Hopefully next time I can come back stronger."

Doubles Champions Thrill Crowds

Oftentimes, when the media focuses on the BNP Paribas Open, they mainly only discuss the singles champions. But each year, doubles champions showcase their talents as well, as was the case once again this March.

First, Wesley Koolhof and Nikola Mektić defeated Marcel Granollers and Horacio Zeballos, 7-6 (2), 7-6 (4), leading to their third victory as a team this season. Fully understanding what it takes to compete at the highest level, the duo is not only comprised of former world No. 1s, but Grand Slam champions (with other partners), too.

As evidenced by their recent performances, their partnership may very well lead to similar successes down the road. In fact, many fans believe they could capture another Grand Slam title, potentially sooner than later.

"From the first moment we started playing again in Auckland this year, things just clicked," Koolhof stated. "We complement each other very well on the court."

Without question, Hsieh Su-wei and Elise Mertens also complement each other very well, as shown by their victories at the 2021 and 2024 BNP Paribas Opens. Upon defeating Kateřina Siniaková and Storm Hunter 6-3, 6-4 this year, the duo was quite pleased with their performances.

"[We're] very happy about our game today," Mertens said. "A lot of things worked, [as we] only lost our serve once—[and] on the second set, we didn't drop anything." **DG&T**

Golf Instruction Golf Fitness

HAPPY GOLF FITNESS MONTH. Let's have some golf fun feeling this month & get you feeling more FIT. Before you try any of these golf stretch: please start slow, listen to your body's fitness needs & physical limitations / abilities.

When I moved to LaQuinta, CA back in 2006, I was impressed by how "fit all my golfers / students" were.

One of my master golf pro mentors (Joe Thiel / Fred Couples original golf teacher), gave me this golf "whole body stretch"... "DEEP OVERHEAD SQUAT". I personally have worked up to it, I feel you might like it too.

I asked Joe, what 1 golf stretch is the fastest "whole body golf stretch" (here it is):



Beginning GOLF STRETCH

- 7 iron
- Sit on a stable chair
- Place 7 iron in your hands
- Raise your club out in front of you

Beginning – INTERMEDIATE GOLF STRETCH

- 7 iron
- Sit on a stable chair
- Place 7 iron in your hands
- Raise your club out in front of you
- THEN STAND UP OFF THE CHAIR (hold the club in any position for 5-10 seconds, then work up to 30 seconds, then 1 minute, etc)



INTERMEDIATE – ADVANCED GOLF STRETCH

- 7 iron
- Sit on a stable chair
- Place 7 iron in your hands
- Raise your club out in front of you
- THEN STAND UP OFF THE CHAIR (hold the club in any position for 5-10 seconds, then work up to 30 seconds, then 1 minute, etc)
- THEN GET IN A SQUAT (as deep as you can), arms in any position that feel a stretch



I look forward to helping you add GOLF FITNESS to your golf game with GOLF STRETCHES. I feel this is a huge element GETTING YOUR GOLF GAME TO THE NEXT LEVEL ADD GOLF FITNESS into your golf game. I look forward to seeing you on the golf course or driving range. Happy Golf Feels & GOLF FITNESS!

chartreuse and Aperol.

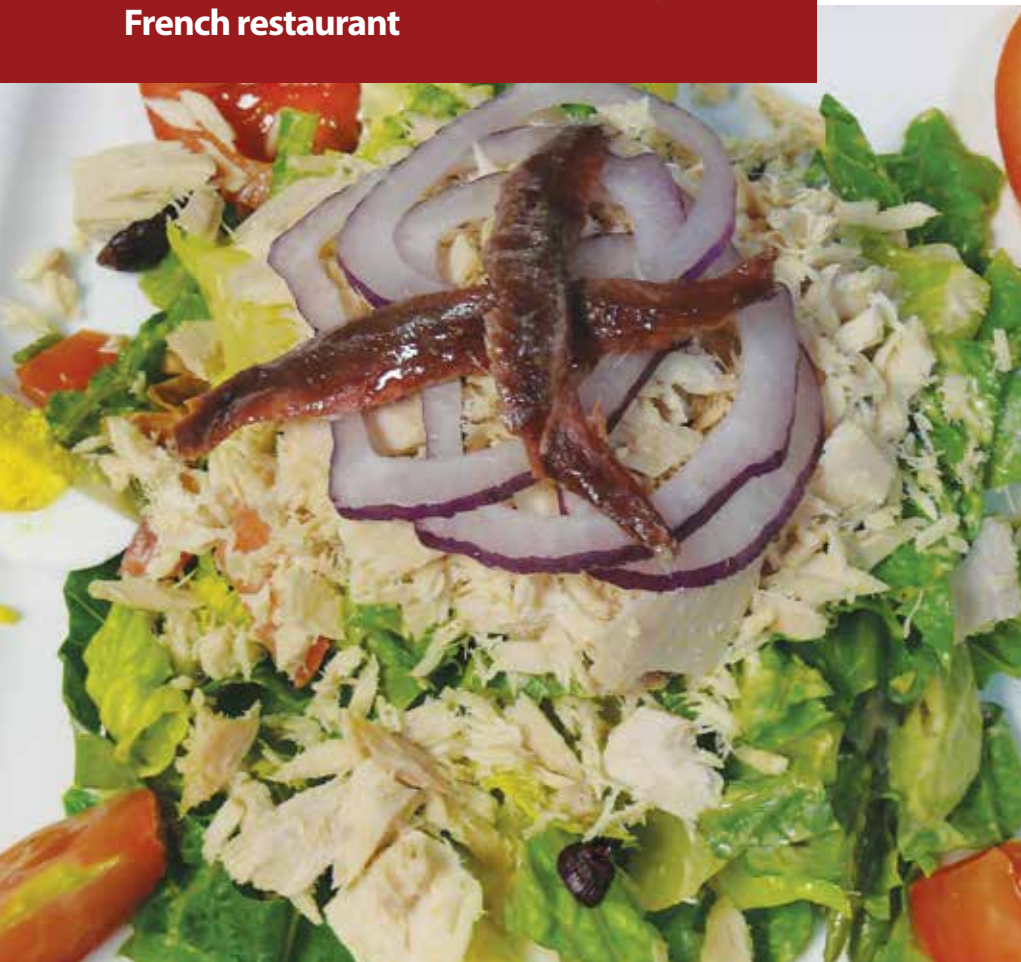

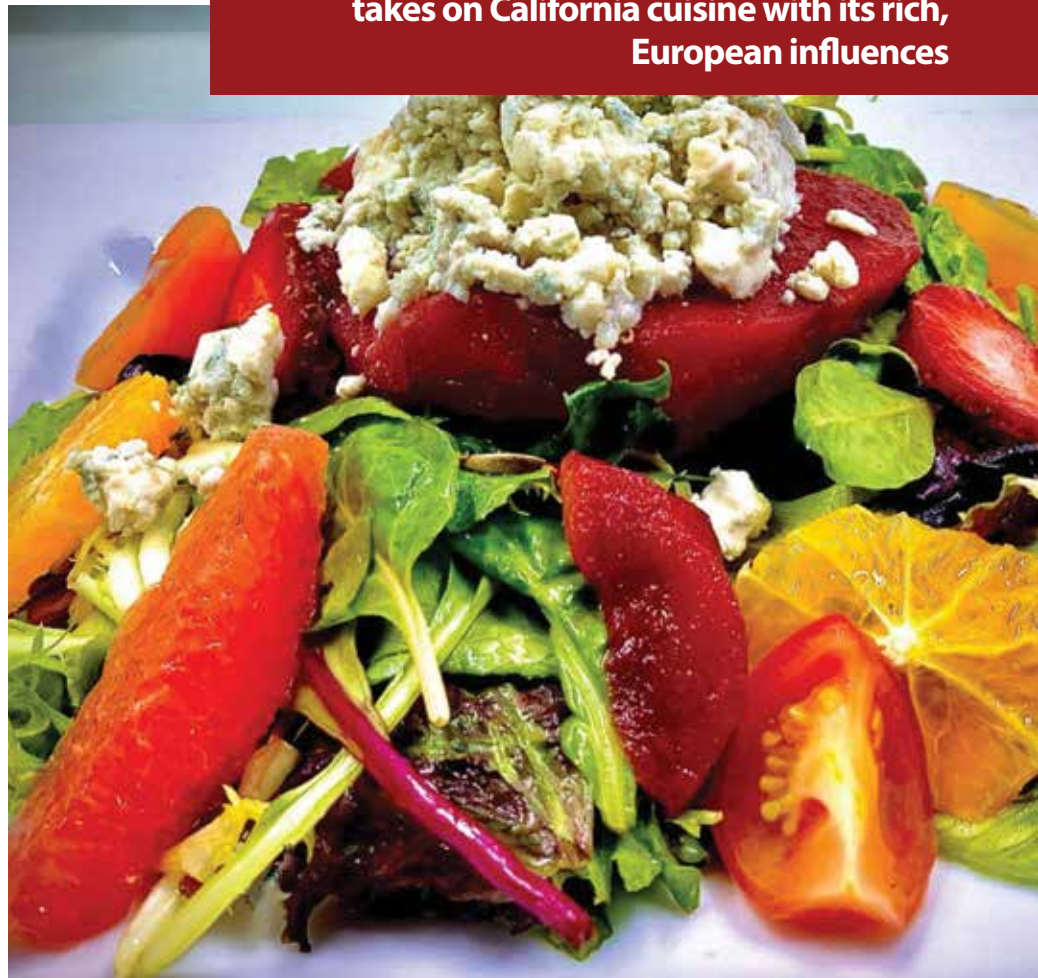

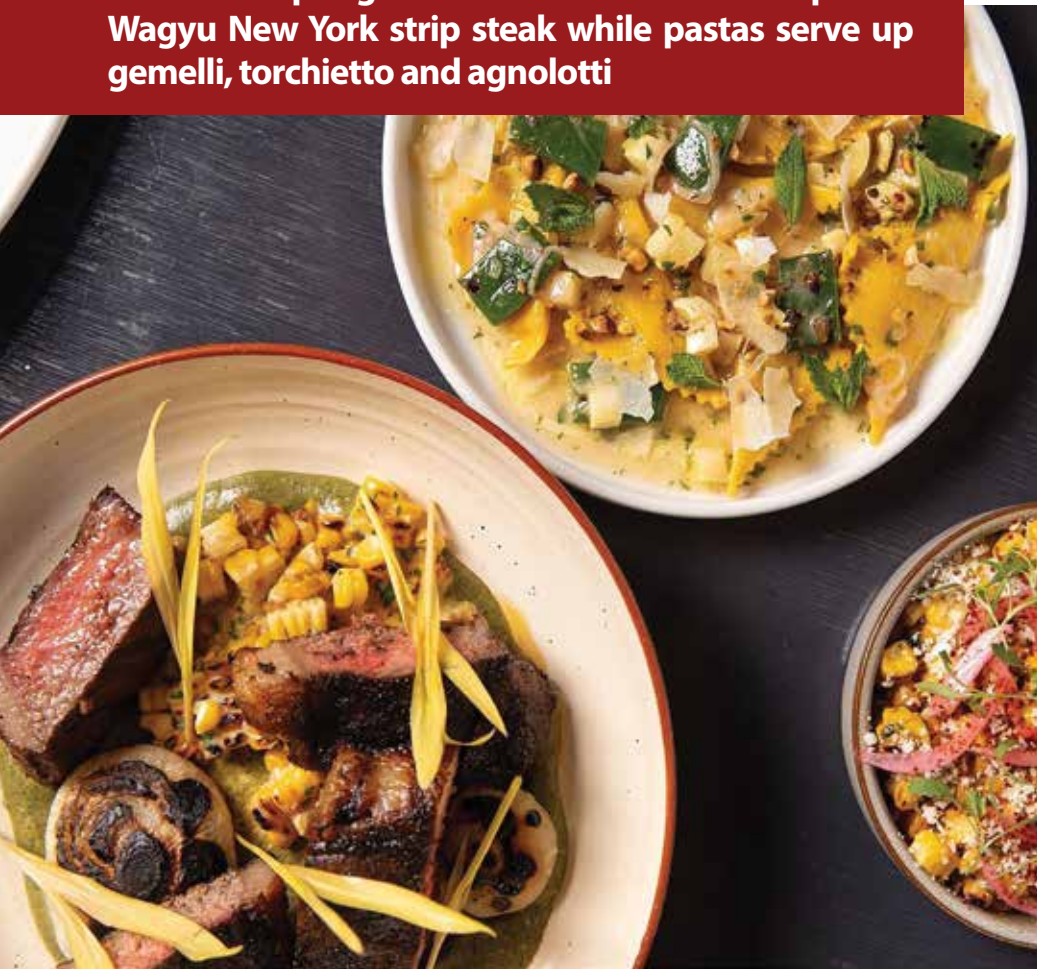

Palm Desert Food & Wine 2024:

More than a bite sized adventure

Just like Gale Gand's delicately balanced caramel cashew blossoms or Dominique Crenn's fluffy, classic brioche à tête, the 2024 Palm Desert Food & Wine Festival was a tastefully blended concoction of thoughtful ingredients and edible art, presented March 21-24, 2024 by Agua Caliente Casinos and produced by Palm Springs Life. A portion of the event's proceeds benefitted FIND Food Bank.

Once again, the big white tent – or rather three tents - on El Paseo were transformed from the west coast's premier fashion headquarters into an elegant warehouse of food and drink delicacies. In addition to the Grand Tastings on both Saturday and Sunday March 23 and 24, other events throughout the four days included a Cheese Masterclass with Afrim Pristine, the Gale Gand Guide to Cooking with Cinnamon, a James Beard Gourmet Four-Course Luncheon, a celebrity chef reception and The Commander's Palace Sunday Jazz Brunch.

The Grand Tastings on Saturday and Sunday featured multiple areas for sampling bite-sized treats such as key lime mousse from Shorebird and ceviche from Molé Palm Desert. Other restaurants showcasing their edible wares were TRIO Palm Springs, Jackalope Ranch, 360 Sports at Agua Caliente Casino, Morgan's in the Desert, Cowboy Cantina, Gelato Granucci, Porta Via, Sandfish Sushi, Daniel's Table, Wilma & Frieda's Café, Melissa's Produce and three dozen others.

The Grand Tastings gave guests the opportunity to interact with the chefs in more spontaneous settings, with 30 minute demonstrations taking place each day on three stages. A few of the showcases included demos with Tyler Florence, Jeremy Loomis, Aisha Ibrahim, Angelo Sosa, Mary Sue Milliken, Afrim Pristine and others.

The rundown of celebrity chefs who shared their delicious works included:

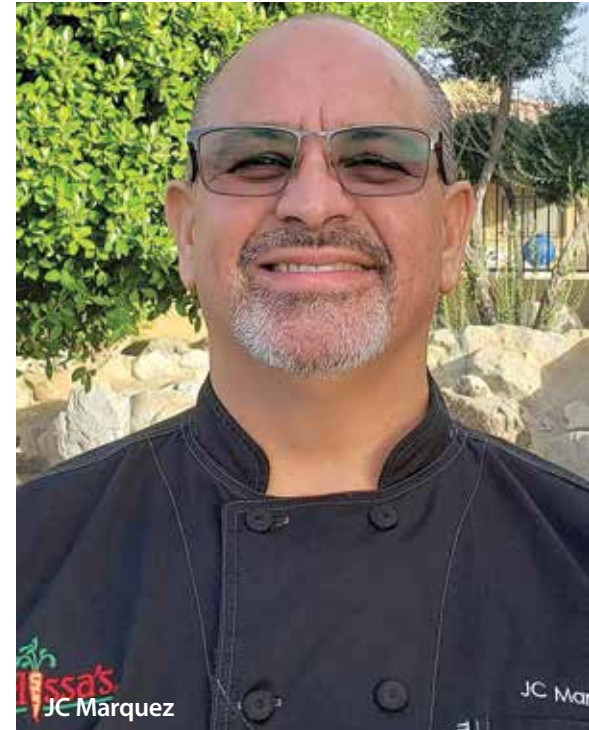

Leonetti Cellar/ FIGGINS represented the state of Washington, and favorites from the Napa Valley and Sonoma were also at the party, including ZD Wines Napa Valley, Bouchaine Vineyards, Sangiacomo and Venge Vineyards.

BONDLE Wines founder and owner Duyen Ha made an impressive showing. This young upstart launched BONDLE a couple of years ago after leaving New York City to attend culinary school in Paris. She now brings French natural wines in the form of magnums to wine lovers all around the globe with her American company that sells to consumers directly in 30 different states, embracing artisan winemakers with champagne being the biggest seller.

A special tent displayed products from cuisine-centric vendors, most of them related to cooking and lifestyle, offering top-of-the-line, unique and cutting-edge items, such as spices, herbs, olive oils, candles, cutting boards, kitchen appliances, cooking utensils and even jewelry. Exhibitors included Artistic Woodcrafts, Inc., Expedia Cruises, Palm Desert, Hotel Paseo, IVI Vision, Montecito Collective, New Orleans & Company, Northshore Living Herbs, Oceania, Sauz, Savory Spice Shop, Uqsha Genuine Paha, Willis, Winning Ways, Wolfe Cutlery and Zing Zang.

Palm Desert Food & Wine has become a stand-out around the nation and with industry insiders for its inclusion of top talent and its panoply of inventive flavors. It's about much more than just test driving a few recipes and menu options. The event brings an awakening to new ways of preparing foods as well to the depth of a variety of cultures, while lending insight into the journeys that these artists have taken on their often arduous paths to success.

From samples of mouth-watering dishes to education on the wine-making process to hobnobbing with celebrity chefs, the festival should be on everyone's calendar for 2025. **DG&T**

This past March, the big white tent(s) atop The Gardens on El Paseo transformed into a fashionable week of social and sartorial extravaganzas to rival any in New York, Milan or Paris. The largest consumer fashion event on the West Coast, produced by Palm Springs Life and presented by Agua Caliente Casinos, made its return from March 15 to 21, 2024.

Multiple shows, each featuring a different designer and/or theme each evening, highlighted fashion trends and presented the country's top talents, current and future. Each student presented brand-new pieces for the runway that embodied the latest trends in fashion and creativity, shaping the future of the industry and benefiting DAP Health. Founded in Milan in 1935, Istituto Marangoni's latest outpost in Miami harnesses the spirit and energy of the eclectic south Florida city while nurturing the next generation of designers and industry creatives. The institution takes a cutting-edge approach to fashion alongside guidance from distinguished instructors. The show included a generous donation from education sponsor Jordan Schnitzer, allowing 150 Coachella Valley high school students to attend the show and receive an exclusive preshow backstage tour.

"Saks Fifth Avenue Presents" closed out the week on Thursday, March 21 with luxury fashions. The spring and summer 2024 menswear and womenswear collections likely inspired a whole new wardrobe for many in the audience, offering up style statements that could take every clotheshorse from day to night with confidence and panache. Bighorn Bam benefited from this show's proceeds.

The events were buzzing with media while guests focused on making memories. In addition to proffering the ultimate fashion experience, the shows included pop-up shops and celebrity meet-and-greets. **DG&T**
