n the early days of country club living, it was all about the golf. For the golfer in the family this was a dream come true. Now, with over 35 private luxury communities under the Discovery Land Company flagship, where did this concept derive from? "Family," states Meldman who has three sons, Hunter, Will and Max. "My driving passion will always be family. I strive daily to create an environment for my family that fosters connections, memories, and most importantly – fun. This was my primary motivation with Discovery too; our communities are a place for families to come together to spend their days doing whatever they want and having a blast together while doing it."

"I'm an outdoorsman at heart," shares Meldman. "I love skiing, fishing, hiking, and spending time in nature with my family. I also enjoy playing paddle and pickleball with friends. Our Outdoor Pursuits program originated from my sons and I spending time in Montana, where they learned to tie their own fishing flies, wakeboard, go white water rafting, ski, venturing into the wilderness with a backpack, and camp out. It brought my family so much joy that we made those types of outdoor experiences a core aspect of every Discovery Club, embracing the local activities and culture is essential to what we do."








A key component of Discovery Land Company's success is the outdoors and the locations of each community. From Montana to Hawaii, Costa Rica to New York, California to Scotland, Meldman's eye for the native beauty of each property is a testament of his love for the outdoors. "Every project evolves and is custom-designed to the environment and culture of the area we're in. We are incredibly thoughtful in our design to ensure that each project feels like a natural part of its surroundings," explains Meldman.

Community members are encouraged to experience Mother Nature with the help of the onsite Outdoor Pursuits program, their own personal adventure concierge that tailors the itinerary to the member's requests. Whether it is archery, zip lining, biking, surfing, horseback riding, or unique adventures based on what the areas offer, Outdoor Pursuits plans it all, members just show up and enjoy the experience.

Considering that all of Meldman's projects feature spectacular world class and fun golf courses, golf isn't the first thing he mentions. With a smile Meldman explains, "I developed a passion for golf later in life, in fact I didn't actually begin playing golf until after I started Discovery. During the first 15 years of my career, I didn't golf at all: it was just a means that helped sell real estate. I think my initial detachment from traditional golf helped shape the relaxed, laid-back atmosphere that has become a hallmark of golf at Discovery, which is focused around creating social, family-friendly communities rather than adhering to traditional, golf-centric developments. "


"My sons had a large role with the more relaxed concept " says Meldman, "I wanted to teach my kids how to golf when they were young, but it was a struggle getting them to wear collared shirts. Instead of fighting with them I finally decided to change the traditional 'rules' of golf and make it fun. I let them wear t-shirts or bathing suits, and we would blast rock and roll on the driving range."

You'll find Meldman out on the course at all of his properties, especially with family and friends. One of the few traditions in opening a new course is Meldman having the course









record, "I have to have the course record for every course I open even though it only lasts for one putt, because as soon as the next guy putts out, he usually beats me," Meldman says with a laugh. Favorite golf equipment, "I love my LA Golf Shafts and my Sun Mountain golf bags."

With the continued success of Discovery Land Company as the unrivaled leader in luxury real

Estate and with properties in over ten countries and expanding their portfolio to the world's most attractive destinations across the Americas, Europe and the Middle East, Meldman does find time for new endeavors such as Casamigos Tequila. "Casamigos was created from our desire to enjoy the best tequila," recalls Meldman. "At the time, there wasn't a truly great, affordable tequila on the market, so George (Clooney), Rande (Gerber), and I set out to create the smoothest, best-tasting tequila, one that didn't need salt or lime. It wasn't just about creating a product but crafting an experience people would enjoy sipping and sharing with friends, which is why Casamigos resonated with so many." Resonate it did, in 2017 Casamigos Tequila was sold to Diageo for \$1 billion.

Today Meldman continues to actively invest in leading lifestyle brands with a focus on golf, apparel, and wellness consumer goods. However with very little fanfare and an immense sense of pride in 2007 Meldman also established the Discovery Land Company Foundation. Since its inception, the foundation has contributed more than \$17.6 million to numerous local community organizations focused on families, education, and community engagement.

When asked how he would describe Discovery Land Company at a social event Meldman becomes thoughtful and replies, "The idea is that arriving at a Discovery Land Company property

should feel like coming home to a place you know and love while enjoying world-class service. You never have to worry about a thing, and never have to bring anything, everything is there. All you have to do is simply show-up and have a good time!"

With a home at almost every community, Meldman is easy to spot out and about on any given day. "I spend significant time throughout the year at many of our properties because I'm deeply involved in the development and ongoing evolution of each club," says Meldman. "Being onsite allows me to ensure that every community we create maintains its unique character and meets the high standards that our members expect. And for me, it's all about being part of the community, engaging with residents and staff, and continuously refining the experience to make sure it aligns with the vision of Discovery."

A vision of combining family, the outdoors and luxury has come full circle for Meldman's Discovery Land Company and with this success, the future of luxury living is thriving.



Then the National Pickleball League (NPL) was created in 2022, Kim Jagd desired to be an owner of one of its original six teams.

Unable to achieve this goal at that time, she instead participated as a signed player. Drafted by the NPL's Indy Drivers, she had a very successful season last year. Not only did she win 85 percent of her matches, but the Drivers also won the league's inaugural national title.

"It was an exhilarating experience—the most fun I've had while playing pickleball the last 10 years," she stresses.

Yet, despite this exhilaration, her passion for ownership still remained fully intact. While acquiring more knowledge about the game, she eventually pursued potential investors who shared her visions.

The first was Rob Zwemmer, a renowned real estate agent that lives near Jagd in Indian Wells, Calif.'s Desert Horizons Country Club. A passionate pickleball player, he has participated in Desert Horizons' thriving pickleball program alongside Jagd. Due to his enthusiasm for the game, he was interested in joining her as she purchased a NPL team.

"Rob had the pickleball passion and business savvy to become the perfect partner for this endeavor together, resulting in the creation of the Coachella Valley Scorpions," she emphasizes.

For further support, she found another partner: actor Vince Vaughn, who—along with being known for movies like Wedding

Crashers and Dodgeball—is very knowledgeable about sports. Vaughn's children were enrolled at Jagd's daughter's volleyball training business, leading to a friendship. Soon, Jagd was introduced to Vaughn, as they all began to play pickleball together.

"Vince was intrigued with the idea of a professional pickleball league for individuals who are 50 years old or older (as is the case with the NPL) and very shortly thereafter became the Coachella Valley Scorpions' majority owner," she says.

As a result of Vince's involvement, which was announced nationally this July, the NPL and the Scorpions received considerable media attention.

"Vince is committed to growing the Coachella Valley Scorpions and helping people—both young and old—become involved with this great lifelong sport," she states.

In addition, former tennis professional Vince Van Patten offered to support Jagd as a team member. A pickleball player since 2021, Van Patten has competed for the Scorpions as a substitute for an injured team member.

"The Scorpions have great camaraderie, and pickleball is the world's most social sport," he says. "I have made tons of instant friends."

He adds, "I'm also devoting my body and mind to pickleball because I love playing it at a high level, which I can't do in tennis anymore."

Dayne Gingrich, a professional pickleball player and co-author of

OnCourt



the best-selling book Pickleball Mindset, has become involved as a team member, too. As the Scorpions' number one draft pick and the NPL's overall number two pick, he was particularly attracted by the league's competition. Since being drafted, he has been focused on leading the Scorpions to a national title.

"I gravitate toward the potential of development, both on and off the court," he explains. "I love having the opportunity to do more than my peers—working harder, sacrificing more and developing a level of grit that the majority won't strive for. And the Scorpions have allowed me to do exactly that."

Aside from Van Patten and Gingrich, Jagd (alongside team manager Ryan Wills) has recruited a variety of other highly talented pickleball players. In all, Jagd and Wills, while relying on their Division 1 recruiting and training experience, observed 275 players during two player combines, prior to drafting their current team members.

"We did the extra work to make sure we not only had great pickleball players, but good team players and personalities that would get along well together," she says. "So far, that work has really paid off as our team is very cohesive and unselfish. Our team members love to compete for (and with) each other!"

As of Sept. 10, when this article was written, the Scorpions had competed in four NPL events, leading to a sixth place showing overall. Thus far, tournaments have been held in locations ranging from Kansas to Texas. Its final competition will occur later in the fall during NPL's Championship Weekend, set to be hosted at Cincinnati, Ohio's The Pickle Lodge on Oct. 18, 19 and 20.

Although the team endured several injuries this season, Jagd is highly optimistic about its future. First off, it has recently partnered with Agua Caliente Casinos, which is serving as a presenting sponsor. Due to this partnership, the Scorpions will be creating entertaining pickleball events, clinics and camps.

"Agua Caliente Casinos will help the Scorpions spread pickleball's



incredible health and wellness benefits throughout the Coachella Valley [as well]," she states.

Furthermore, the Scorpions are preparing to create a farm team and program that will enable 45- to 60-year-olds—who are already near the professional level—to refine their skills and strategies, which they'll need while preparing to become potential full-time NPL members.

"We also intend to create a foundation that will promote pickleball, health and wellness among the Coachella Valley's youth," Jagd adds. "Additionally, we are interested in finding partners that will help us build a substantial indoor and outdoor venue, which will be used for competitive, amateur and community pickleball events."












In 2024, the tennis world witnessed an extraordinary display of dominance by Carlos Alcaraz, who cemented his status as one of the sport's greatest talents. The young Spaniard not only captured the French Open and Wimbledon titles but also demonstrated his exceptional prowess at the BNP Paribas Open at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden this year. Alcaraz's victories were marked by his unmatched skill, strategic brilliance, and unwavering resolve.





French Open Triumph: Alcaraz vs. Zverev

Carlos Alcaraz's path to the 2024 French Open final was nothing short of remarkable. The clay courts of Roland Garros, with their unique demands, played to Alcaraz's strengths. US Open Victory: Sinner vs. Fritz

As the 2024 US Open approached, the spotlight shifted to Jannik Sinner, a rising star who had shown remarkable promise throughout the season. The final matched Sinner against Taylor Fritz, an American player known for his powerful serve and aggressive style of play.

Sinner, having previously demonstrated his ability to compete at the highest level, entered the final with a combination of youthful exuberance and strategic acumen. The match began with a high tempo, as both players exchanged powerful shots and sought to gain an early advantage. Sinner's tactical play and impressive baseline consistency proved crucial, as he managed to neutralize Fritz's serve and break his rhythm.

The first set was closely contested, but Sinner's determination and skill prevailed as he secured it in a tiebreaker. The subsequent sets

Derek Laxdal welcomed as head coach for Coachella Valley Firebirds

The former coach of the year prioritizes positivity...By Alison Elsner

As the new coach of the Coachella Valley Firebirds, Derek Laxdal is looking forward to bringing his special style of optimism to the team and helping his players navigate, both on and off the ice.

The Seattle Kraken (@SeattleKraken) recently announced that Laxdal has been hired as the new head coach of the franchise's American Hockey League (AHL) affiliate, Coachella Valley Firebirds, who play home games at Acrisure Arena in Palm Desert, California. Laxdal succeeds Dan Bylsma, becoming the Firebirds' second head coach in franchise history.

Laxdal joins the Firebirds from the Ontario Hockey League's (OHL) Oshawa Generals where he led his team last season to an 89-point (40-19-7) regular season record and a spot in the OHL Championship Series. As a result, he was voted OHL Coach of the Year by his coaching peers from across the league.

For Laxdal, it's not all about the game nor is it all about winning (even though that's important). He says, "The beauty of the AHL is that we have a great nucleus of talent, a mix of young kids and veterans. I get to work with [assistant coach] Brennan Sonne and [video coach] Peter Thome, and we can see the progression of these players' careers."

He explains that with the first two Firebirds' teams, many of the players skewed older, but now he's also excited to see the draft picks come through, such as Canadian Jagger Firkus and goaltender Niklaa Kokko from Finland.

Laxdal joined Oshawa as head coach and assistant general manager in 2022 after spending three seasons as an assistant coach with the NHL's Dallas Stars. Prior to Dallas, Laxdal spent six seasons with the franchise's AHL affiliate Texas Stars as head coach from 2014-2020. In 380 games behind the AHL bench, he had a record of 189-139-52 including a run to the Calder Cup final in 2018, losing in seven games to the Toronto Marlies. Laxdal also won two WHL titles with the Edmonton Oil Kings (2011-12 and 2013-14) and reached the pinnacle of junior hockey, winning the Memorial Cup with the Oil Kings in 2014.

Laxdal's professional coaching career also includes five years in the ECHL with the Idaho Steelheads. He achieved a winning record throughout all five seasons and led the Steelheads to two Kelly Cup Championship finals, winning in 2007 and finishing as runners-up in 2010. Additionally, he received the ECHL Coach of the Year award alongside his championship win in 2007.

Prior to his coaching career, Laxdal played six seasons (1984-85 to 1990-91) in the NHL between the Toronto Maple Leafs and the New York Islanders. In total, he played 27 seasons of professional hockey in several leagues including the NHL, AHL, ECHL, WHL and more. He won two championships throughout his professional career: the AHL Calder Cup in

1990 and the B&H Cup (previously the United Kingdom's Autumn Cup) in 1997. He represented Canada internationally, winning a U20 World Juniors Championship silver medal in 1985-86.

Having been a player, including part of that time serving as a team captain, Laxdal says, "I know that players come to the rink to feel positive. Yes, it's a job, but it's a process too, and it's important to make it fun and create a family atmosphere. For me, we play not just for the logo on the front of the shirts but for the fans and the families."

When asked how he plans to take an entirely new group of players and groom them for the playoffs, Coach Laxdal says, "I really just focus on helping these players make their goals and getting to the finals. As part of a feeder system to the next Seattle Kraken, taking the next steps to the NHL and aiming for the Calder Cup are some of the most effective tools. One of my favorite things is to see these players succeed as I work to mold great people and change their lives. To me, that is fulfilling."

The coach regularly stays in touch with former players, while acknowledging the international flavor of the team. He appreciates the mix, and he fondly recalls helping some of these young men find their way around in the United States such as assisting one of his young Russian players receive his driver's license in Texas.

In short, he takes an interest in their lives and puts a priority on ensuring they can perform at their best.

As Laxdal and his family make the move from Canada to the Coachella Valley, he emphasizes their interest in giving back to the community. His wife has her equine certification and plans to take part in horse rescue activities.

As for the enthusiasm to be expected from the Coachella Valley fans? Laxdal is well aware of the passion and excitement that the Firebirds have created among their fan base, noting that, "Without other pro teams in the area, this is THE home team. Since it's not a nationwide brand, the events generate so much support including from the Canadian snowbirds!" Laxdal fully expects to see some of his family and friends from The Land of Maple Syrup as they winter in the desert.

For Coach Laxdal, everything is interconnected. As he says, "Overall, we've got a great formula for success."

Road to the LPGA prepares world's best female pro golfers...By Alison Elsner

This year marks a new chapter in the history of the Epson Tour Championship, to be held at Indian Wells Golf Resort for the first time. The season-ending "Race for the Card" showcases the future stars of the LPGA, taking place September 30 through October 6.

The Epson Tour is the official qualifying tour of the LPGA Tour and enters its 44th competitive season in 2024. With the support of entitlement partner Seiko Epson Corporation, and with a welcome from the City of Indian Wells, the Tour's mission is to prepare the world's best female professional golfers for a successful career on the LPGA Tour. In the last decade, the Epson Tour has grown from 15 tournaments and \$1.6 million in prize money to \$5 million awarded across 20 events in 2024. With more than 600 graduates and alumnae moving on to the LPGA Tour, former Epson Tour players have won 480 LPGA titles.

Four athletes have mathematically clinched their 2025 LPGA Tour card through the Epson Tour's Race for the Card following the Guardian Championship. Yahui Zhang and Jessica Porvasnik will become 2025 LPGA Tour rookies, while Lauren Stephenson and Fatima Fernandez Cano will return to the biggest stage in women's golf full-time. The four players secured their spot in the top 15 with three tournaments still to play in the 2024 Epson Tour season.

Yahui Zhang, currently No. 1 on the Epson Tour's Official Points List, earned LPGA Tour Membership after a T5 finish at the Guardian Championship. As a 2024 Epson Tour rookie, Zhang secured two top-10 finishes in her first three starts of the year. Just a month later, the 18-year-old had her first chance to win on the Epson Tour, going into a playoff with Savannah Vilaubi at the Otter Creek Championship. The People's Republic of China native came up just short in Indiana, ultimately falling to Vilaubi in a playoff but continued her solid play, adding two more top-10 finishes to her 2024 resume before finally breaking through and earning her first professional victory at the Four Winds Invitational, moving her to No. 1 in the Race for the Card.

The City of Indian Wells is no stranger to hosting big sporting events, known for hosting the BNP Paribas Open each March, one of the largest events of the year in tennis. As part of its partnership with the City of Indian Wells, the Epson Tour is offering exclusive benefits to Indian Wells residents, including access to a dedicated viewing deck on the 18th green and discounted admission, hospitality ticket packages and Pro-Am playing opportunities.

Players will be taking on the John Fought-designed Players Course, or "The Beast" as it's known, transitioning from previous years where

the Tournament was held in Daytona Beach, Florida, at LPGA headquarters.

This season, The Epson Tour transitions from a money-based ranking to a points-based system. Following a similar structure to the LPGA Tour, members compete for points in each official tournament, with a 30 percent increase in points value for the Epson Tour in Indian Wells. The top ten-point earners will become fully exempt on the 2025 LPGA Tour.

The field size is 108 players with a 72-hole competition with a cut to the low 60 players and ties following 36 holes. Monday and Tuesday will feature practice rounds all day with a "Meet the Pros" party on Tuesday evening. Two Pro-Ams will be held on Wednesday, and first, second and third rounds will be held through Saturday. On the final day, Sunday, the final round begins at 7:15 a.m., with the trophy presentation at the #18 green immediately following play and the LPGA Tour Card Ceremony.





insists on being addressed as Tom – not Mr. Fazio - for the same reason that he doesn't keep a precise count of the number of golf courses he's built: he doesn't like to feel old.

No living golf course designer has more credits on Golf Digest's list of America's 100 Greatest Golf Courses and Golfweek's Collection of America's Best. Around four dozen of Fazio's courses have been ranked by "Golf Digest" in their greatest 200 courses in the United States. His individual honors include "Best Modern Day Golf Course Architect", which he received from "Golf Digest" three times. In 1995, Fazio became the second course architect to receive the Old Tom Morris Award, the highest recognition awarded by the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America.

Fazio says that his biggest mentor was his uncle, George Fazio, who was a golf pro at Hillcrest Country Club in Los Angeles after World War II where he provided golf instruction to Bob Hope. The association with Hope, also an avid property investor, created a pathway to interest in the land at The Vintage Club in Palm Desert for which the Fazios were called to survey in 1978. George and Tom Fazio built the first course, The Desert, at The Vintage Club in 1980, followed by the second course, The Mountain. In many ways this signified a new standard of excellence in country club living and "made The Vintage Club a sought-after place to belong," according to Tom Fazio.

He says, "My uncle George was close friends with Del Webb, and knowing people like that opened up opportunities for us. I worked on courses from the 1950s through the early 2000s until the real estate crash in 2008." Fazio established his own golf course design and consulting firm in 1982, marking the birth of Fazio Golf

Design and Consulting, with The Vintage Club marking the final collaboration between George and Tom.

He continues, "For many years, the idea of golf courses in La Quinta or Indian Wells didn't mean much because everyone associated projects in the desert with Palm Springs. But the emergence of properties like Thunderbird and Eldorado and influential members there like President Eisenhower brought prominence farther east in the valley to the 'Playground of the Presidents.' Then PGA West really brought Indio into the picture."

Fazio is often associated with elite clubs and courses that accommodate celebrities and millionaires with five-star luxury and over-the-top amenities. Examples include the aforementioned The Madison Club in La Quinta, California; Gozzer Ranch Golf and Lake Club in Coeur D'Alene, Idaho; Kuki'o Golf and Beach Club on the big island of Hawaii; Chileno Bay Golf & Beach Club in Cabo San Lucas, Mexico; and dozens of others.

These course layouts offer amenities galore ranging from "comfort stations" in between holes, wellness programs and gourmet refreshment stations with craft cocktails and gourmet chef's fare. As Fazio says, "We're talking filet mignon, not hot dogs."

The common thread here is that many of these Fazio-designed courses have been developed by Discovery Land Company, based in Los Angeles and now with a reach that spans the entire world. Founded in 1994 by Mike Meldman, Discovery Land Company is a U.S. based real estate developer and operator of private residential communities and resorts with a world-renowned portfolio of domestic and international properties.

Fazio points out, "This isn't a trend, it's a signature style that has

been created in many instances by Discovery Land Company. They are all about fun and leisure experiences for the entire family, and with each project the bar is raised – it gets bigger and bigger. But it's not new. Discovery has been doing this for 25 or 30 years and it's been a success."

Discovery pioneered the high-end golf course model with the opening of Estancia Club in Scottsdale, Arizona in 1994 and, as Fazio reminds us, with Iron Horse Golf Club in Whitefish, Montana, in 2000 (renovated in 2009).

As for Fazio's projects in faraway lands, he and his company are currently building Discovery Dunes Golf Course in Dubai, U.A.E., Discovery Land Company's 35th project. Fazio explains that another exciting golf course endeavor is keeping his team busy creatively in Florence, Italy.

"People sometimes ask me when I'm going to retire. Why would I retire? What I do is so exciting, I get to work with such great people, and I lead a blessed life"



Fazio notes, "I travel regularly, but with today's technology, I don't need to be on site the entire time. We have so many talented members of our company who cover the project, but also we can have a person with a camera walking the course and I can easily evaluate the grass lines, the rolls, and the shape and elevation of the bunkers, especially with a six-foot person taking me through it. I view all of this on a 60-inch screen."

When asked if he has a favorite golf course project, Fazio says, "How can you compare clubs like The Vintage, The Madison Club, The Quarry, and Bighorn? Each is different, and each represents a certain pride of ownership and a special part of my life with memories and unique experiences. It's just not logical to pick one."

Working out of two offices, Fazio splits his time between Hendersonville, North Carolina in the summer and Jupiter, Florida in winter (where, incidentally, Bob Hope became an early investor in one of Fazio's first golf courses there decades ago).

Fazio says, "People sometimes ask me when I'm going to retire. Why would I retire? What I do is so exciting, I get to work with such great people, and I lead a blessed life. I'm able to support numerous charities, my wife and I are going to celebrate our 50th wedding anniversary, and I have five children and 16 grandchildren."

As far as any ground – or grass - he hasn't covered? He says, "There's really no where that I feel I've missed as far as being able to work on a project. If I'd wanted to create something in a certain location, I could have, but there's only so much time to do it all. I haven't been to New Zealand yet, and I know I can if I want to."

He sums up his zest for life and work by saying, "I still feel like I'm 42 years old. Every year is as good as it's ever been. I'm going to do this forever."





Cowboy Cantina moves to The River, celebrating Southwest cuisine and cultural diversity

La Copa takes over as a traditional sports bar with focus on football and soccer

Growing up in Denver, Colorado, restaurateur Jim Valdez cultivated an early fondness for the flavors of the Southwest. Influenced by savory family recipes emanating from Santa Fe, New Mexico – an amalgam of authentic Spanish, Mexican, and Native American tastes – Valdez' preferred meals embraced traditional ingredients such as Hatch chiles, Chimayó peppers, and spices like cilantro.

Valdez was prompted to bring the Southwest concept to the Coachella Valley to showcase the flavors of New Mexico and its



cultural diversity. In November, 2022, he opened Cowboy Cantina on El Paseo in Palm Desert, an innovative culinary adventure celebrating rustic dishes enjoyed by colonial Spanish settlers, American cowboys, Native Americans, and the people of Mexico.

Building on its tremendous success, Cowboy Cantina is now moving to The River at Rancho Mirage, with an opening date of late October, 2024. Valdez acknowledges the generosity of The River's owners in supporting the move. He says, "Their magnanimous partnership is a key factor in allowing us to show the local community how important they are."

Valdez says, "I'm excited to expand our reach to be more yearround, where guests can come in for our delicious food along with quality live music. I want to create a party atmosphere, and my goal is to find that sweet spot where a great experience intersects with exceptional value."

The "new" Cowboy Cantina at The River will continue to feature menu favorites, such as smoked brisket sandwich, saddle smash burger, cowboy Caesar salad, chicken enchiladas mole, cowboy Bolognese, big daddy's BBQ platter, Cantina fish tacos and so many more.

There are numerous plant-based and vegan options as well, such as Señor Jimmy's smothered tostada plate, mushroom burger, campfire cauliflower, vegan pomodoro, green chile slaw, kettle fries and others. Several of the regular menu offerings can be prepared vegan upon request.

Desserts at Cowboy Cantina are a sweet Southwest epiphany, with selections such as churro adobe dusted with cinnamon sugar and served with chocolate espresso dipping sauce; sopaipillas con dulce de leche with Mexican caramel ice cream and spiced chocolate sauce; and waffle madness with three scoops of ice cream, churros, whipped cream, sprinkles, chocolate sauce, ancho chile and caramel (serves four).

A visit to Cowboy Cantina becomes a lovingly choreographed production that balances superb meals with a vibrant atmosphere that makes every single guest feel comfortable, warm and welcome. The word average does not appear in Valdez' vocabulary or vision, especially when describing the next iteration of Cowboy Cantina.

As for the original Cowboy Cantina venue in the Palms to Pines Shopping Center, Valdez has plans for that, too. It will be transformed into a sports bar called La Copa – the cup in Spanish – so that fans have a hotspot from where to watch soccer and NFL football on 30 big screen televisions, while ordering up cold beverages and hot wings, burgers, nachos and the barbecue for which he's come to be known.

Anyone headed to San Diego will be seeing double, as Valdez is also opening both Cowboy Cantina and La Copa there this December while hitting Los Angeles in early 2025. Both restaurants will continue to radiate the spirit of the American West, making them destinations for lasting memories, new friends and maybe some uncharted territory in cuisine.

Valdez is clearly driven to excellence, not afraid to cover plenty of culinary ground in cities where he can deliver exactly what guests want as far as creative menu items and thematic engagement. He knows the multi-tasking will be intense, but for him the "hustle" is second nature and well worth it to succeed for himself and the community.

When he's not presiding over multiple kitchens and culinary operations, he's producing Hollywood films through his company, Fortress Media Group. This October, his newest film, "Spin the Bottle," starring Ali Larter and Justin Long and directed by Gavin Wiesen, is set to be released by Paramount. The horror story features a group of teenagers in small town Texas who unleash a deadly force after playing the famous game in an abandoned house where a grisly massacre once took place.

Fans may also recall Valdez' film "Maggie Moore(s)," starring Jon Hamm and Tina Fey, a 2023 black comedy film, loosely based on a true story and directed by John Slattery. It follows the story of Police Chief Sanders as he investigates the bizarre murders of two women of the same name, while unravelling a web of small-town lies and mysteries.

These artfully-inspired projects translate into spirited avenues for entertainment and dining. Anyone who is open to exploring new flavors, textures, colors and approaches to food and life will find themselves a part of the creativity and sense of discovery that Jim Valdez has chosen to share with us, making our existence a lot more fun.

Atits core, the SF90 Stradale is packing a 4.0-liter twin-turbocharged V8, but don't let that fool you into thinking it's ordinary. This engine alone pumps out 769 horsepower. Then Ferrari thought, "What if we add not one, not two, but three electric motors?"—because why not? These motors add another 217 horsepower for a combined output of 986 horsepower. That's almost a thousand horses, for

those that are keeping track. Want to take a nuclear reactor for a spin around the neighborhood?

It's got moves. The SF90 can launch from 0 to 60 in under 2.5 seconds. Yes, 2.5 seconds—that's barely enough time to say "Ferrari" before you're rocketing past the speed of sound (almost). The top speed? A casual 211 mph. Forget about laws of physics; they simply don't apply here.

But the real magic? It's a plug-in hybrid. So, you can drive this monster on pure electric power for up to 15 miles. Yes, you can technically do your grocery run in electric mode, but who in their right mind would? This car is not made for errands—unless your errands involve outrunning jets.

As if the SF90 wasn't already ridiculous enough, Ferrari decided to give us two equally glorious versions: the SF90 Stradale (the hardtop) and the SF90 Spider (for those who enjoy their hair being blown back by hurricane-force winds).

The SF90 Stradale is the fixed-roof version, perfect for purists who love a good coupe. It boasts all the tech and power mentioned above







but with the solid feel of a hardtop. It's sleek, sharp, and built for maximum rigidity. If you want every ounce of performance with no compromise, this is your guy.

Then there's the SF90 Spider. The same insane powertrain, but with a retractable hardtop roof. Ferrari engineers somehow made it possible to take the roof off this monster without compromising its aerodynamics—or its spine-tingling speed. You get the same physics-defying 986 horsepower, but now you can feel the wind rip through your hair (and, likely, part of your soul). The top goes down in just 14 seconds, this thing does everything fast.

You want one? Of course you do. But unless your piggy bank is stuffed with about \$558,000 for the Stradale or slightly more for the Spider, it's not happening. Yes, that's right, over half a million dollars for this hybrid symphony of power and technology. And if you decide to check every box on the options list (because who wouldn't?), that price can easily creep up to \$700,000 or more. You didn't really think you'd get this much speed, luxury, and bragging rights for anything less, did you?

As for production numbers, Ferrari's keeping it somewhat exclusive. It's expected that only a few thousand SF90s will be produced annually, with the Spider being even more limited than the hardtop. The exact number for 2025 hasn't been confirmed, but estimates suggest Ferrari will keep it in the ballpark of 2,000 to 2,500 units, spread between the Stradale and Spider models

Let's talk about the SF90's handling. This car isn't just about brute force. It's got the finesse of a world-class ballerina wrapped up in the muscle of a heavyweight champion. It comes with Ferrari's eSSC (electric Side Slip Control), which manages torque distribution between all four wheels, making sure you stay planted while taking on corners that would make lesser cars crumble.

The car's interior is exactly what you'd expect from Ferrari: a minimalistic yet luxurious approach with digital displays, carbon fiber trim, and a steering wheel covered in more buttons than a fighter jet. And the HUD (Head-Up Display) keeps your eyes on the road because you're going to need every ounce of focus to pilot this beast.

The Ferrari SF90 is not just a car. It's a statement, a rebellion against the notion that hybrid tech is only about efficiency. No, Ferrari has proven that hybrid powertrains can also be about terrifying speed, ear-shattering exhaust notes, and sheer driving exhilaration. It's the type of car that makes you laugh at the absurdity of it all—because cars like this shouldn't exist. But thankfully, they do.
