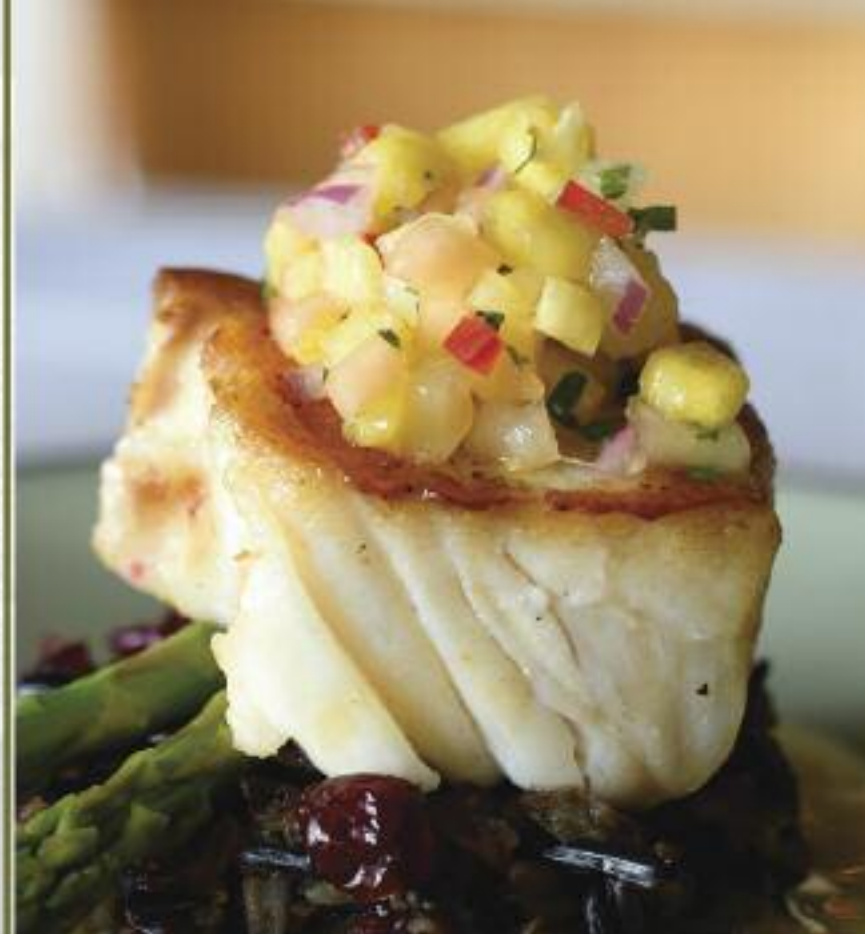

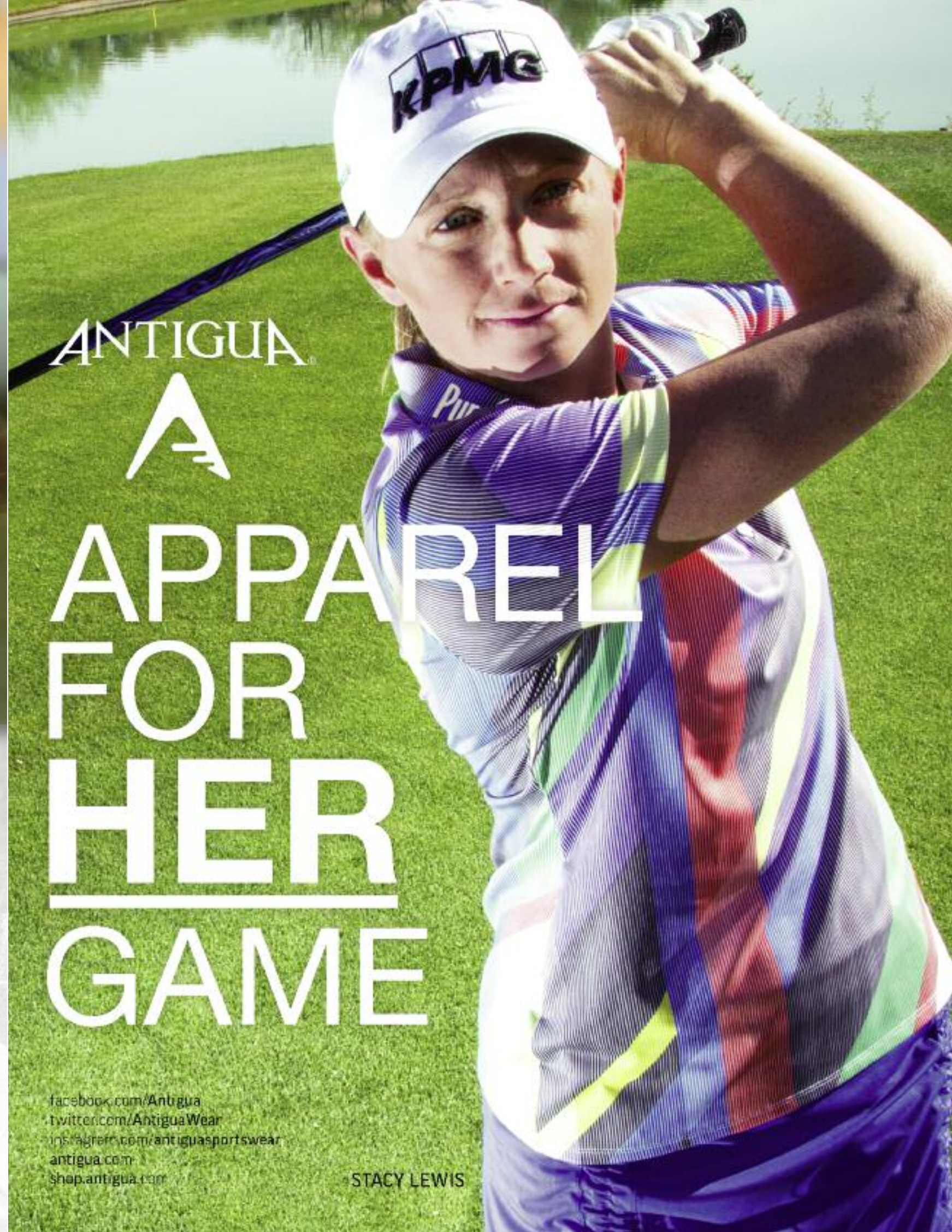

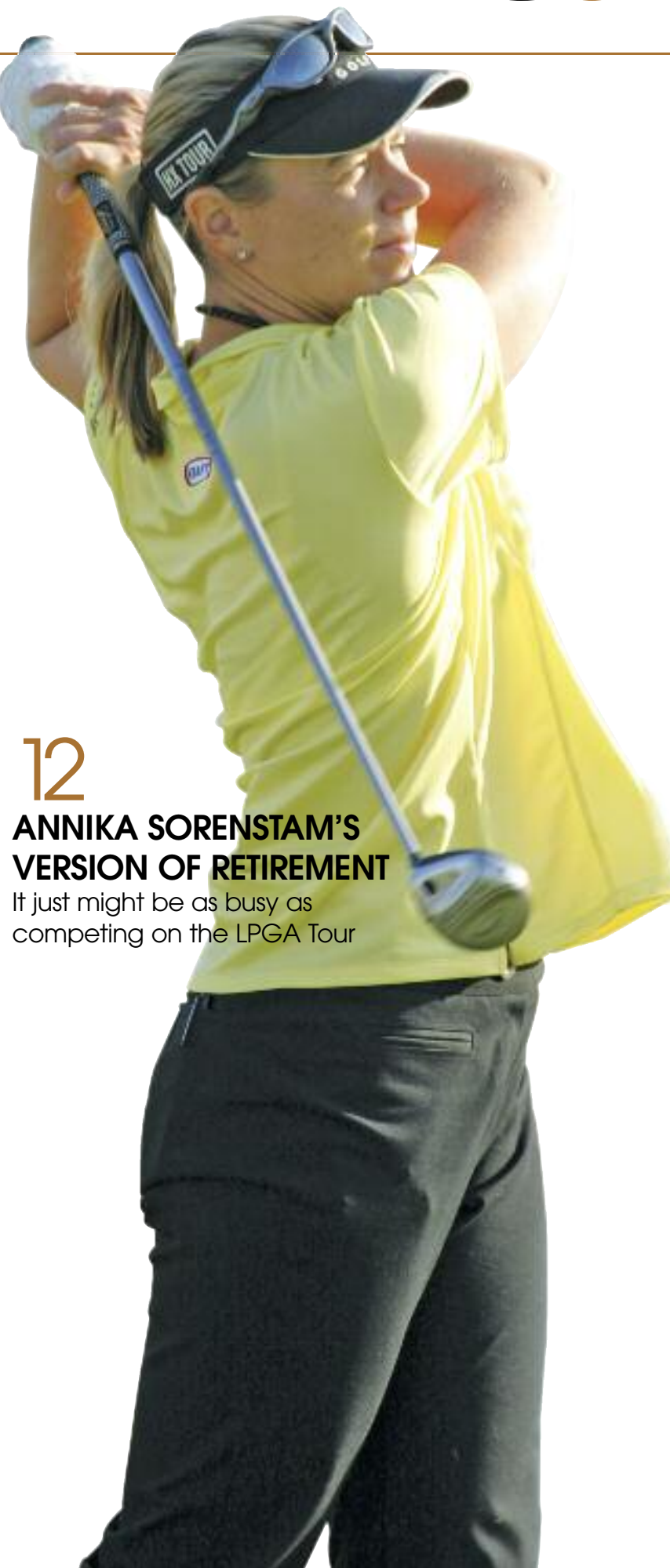

# SHOULD YOU HIRE

### HERE'S WHY:

#### ■ LAWYERS OWE THEIR CLIENTS HIGHER DUTIES THAN AGENTS

Real estate agents owe their clients typical fiduciary duties of good faith, fair dealing and full disclosure, but these duties are fairly limited. For example, agents in California can (and often do) represent both the buyer and seller of a home, or may even have a personal interest in the transaction, as long as the proper disclosures are made. Lawyers, on the other hand, are ethically bound to avoid conflicts of interest by representing only the interests of one party, and a lawyer may not have a personal interest in the transaction. Lawyers owe their clients the highest duties of loyalty and fidelity.

#### ■ AGENTS CANNOT GIVE LEGAL ADVICE

Real estate agents are not authorized to practice law. This means that they can help negotiate and fill-in blanks on a form selected by the parties or act as a scrivener in recording the parties' agreement, but that's about it. Lawyers, on the other hand, are specifically trained and authorized to practice law without limitation. Moreover, lawyers owe their clients a duty of competency, including a duty of diligence that far exceeds the duties of a real estate agent. This means that lawyers are supposed to think about and anticipate potential problems in the transaction that agents often overlook (often resulting in expensive litigation), and lawyers must advise their clients accordingly.

#### ■ AGENTS ARE PAID ONLY IF THE SALE IS COMPLETED

This may sound like a benefit to a homebuyer, but the fact that a real estate agent only earns a commission if the deal closes creates inherent conflict and bias in the agency relationship. The agent is obviously incentivized to make sure the transaction is completed so they can get paid, even if the closing may not be in the buyer's best interests. This conflict is even more pronounced when the agent represents both the buyer and seller in the transaction, since a buyer's interests are in direct conflict with the seller's interests—the buyer wants the lowest possible price while the seller wants the highest possible price. Recognizing this inherent conflict, some states actually prohibit such dual agency. Lawyers, on the other hand, typically charge an hourly or flat fee, such that they are unaffected by the transaction itself.

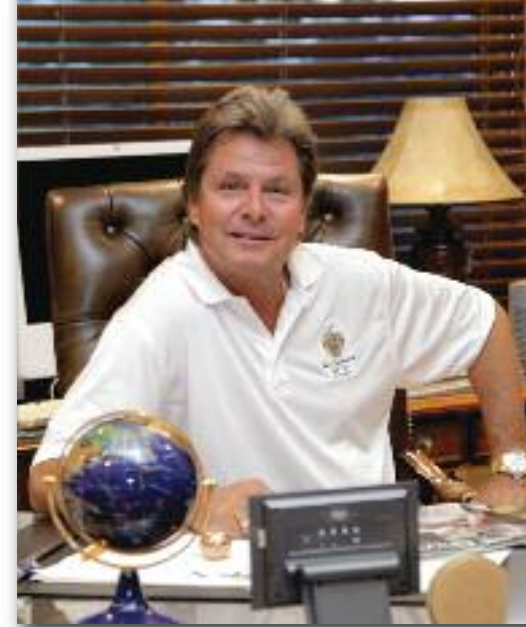

# Annika Sorenstam's Version of Retirement

A foundation that runs six tournaments annually, benefitting women's golf at all levels. Golf course design. A clothing line. Captain of a major international sports team. Wife, mom, taxi driver, cheerleader even co-owner of a concrete business.

That's "retirement" for Annika Sorenstam, and that's just how she likes it.

Sorenstam walked away from the LPGA Tour at the end of the 2008 season, arguably at the top of her game. She ended the year at No. 3 in the Rolex World Rankings, won three tournaments and finished tied for seventh in her final tournament, the Dubai Ladies Masters. Her professional career wrapped up with a total of 93 wins (72 on the LPGA Tour, 17 on the Ladies European Tour), 10 majors and three ANA Inspiration titles.

Yet even as she announced her retirement in May of 2008, her ultra-active future was already in place. In fact, she cited her willingness to transition into the business, philanthropic and family world during her announcement. She also declared her intention to wed Mike McGee, son of former PGA Tour player Jerry McGee and managing director for her brand. The two tied the knot in January 2009, and now have two children, Ava (7) and William (5).

Since then, she has not looked back, gaining traction in all of her current endeavors, and actually expanding her list of responsibilities by taking on the captaincy of the European Solheim Cup team and becoming an investor in Capillary



Concrete, which produces a protective and draining sub-base for sports areas. She's also taken her expanding parental role head-on, acting as a major force in Ava and William's lives by doing the things most moms do: transporting them to games, cheering them on at games, helping them with homework, dropping them off at school and being there in general.

"It's a fun time for me. What I really love about my job is I get to pick and choose what I like to do," she says. "I'm very fortunate that I can work a little here on design when it's that time of year, then I move on to maybe photo shoots for the clothing. Then I spend a few hours every week on Capillary Concrete, which I never





"I would say I love to stay busy, I love doing things," Sorenstam says. "That's one of the reasons I don't miss competitive golf, because I have so many other things going that I like. If I didn't have that, I'd probably be sitting at home wondering what life on tour would be like. So having all these balls in the air is fun. I'm learning a lot about a lot of different things. Kids certainly challenge you, so it's just a different type of life, a different chapter of my life."

Upon learning about Sorenstam's post-LPGA lifestyle, most are inclined to wonder how she does it. Sorenstam says it helps to simply be that type of person—one who loves to work, loves to learn and loves to stay busy. She also says time management is crucial to getting it all done, along with the ability to compartmentalize her focus, taking on one task as a time and thinking of nothing else.

"Time management is very important to me. I try to structure my time to be efficient and scheduling is really important," she says. "This morning I'll be working on this, and next week I'll be working on this, so it's all about scheduling

thought I would. But that's what happens when you retire from golf; you learn about concrete."

Sorenstam has other concrete responsibilities outside the house, including the Annika Foundation, which provides opportunities in women's golf at the junior, collegiate and professional levels while teaching young people the importance of living a healthy, active lifestyle through fitness and nutrition. It hosts six tournaments a year globally, recently conducting its annual U.S. event at Reunion Resort in Orlando. This fall, the foundation will host the Annika Intercollegiate in Minneapolis, Minnesota, and will also conduct events in China, Argentina, and Sweden.

Then there's Annika Course Design, responsible for seven major projects worldwide including a joint effort with Arnold Palmer Design in Lake Elmo, Minnesota. The two firms are combining to renovate the former Tartan Park Golf Course owned by 3M Corporation. The 27-hole facility will be pared down to 18 holes, with nine designed by Sorenstam and nine designed by Palmer, hence its new name: The King & The Queen.

Sorenstam has also been working relentlessly on her clothing business, the Annika Collection, since retirement from the professional game, and her designs are now available at courses from municipal



facilities to clubs hosting the LPGA Tour. And, of course, the Solheim Cup now requires more of her attention as this year's competition gets closer. The 2017 event is scheduled for August 14-20 at the Des Moines Golf and Country Club in West Des Moines, Iowa.

and quality time. When I do it, I'm doing it. I try not to be interrupted with something else. After a few hours I'm done focusing on that [project] and I'm ready for something else."

To help balance work and family life, Sorenstam tries to limit out-of-town



business trips to 24-hour affairs, with a goal of being home for bedtime or, at the very least, home in the morning in time for breakfast and a quick shuttle to school. On the weekends, the family enjoys simply spending time together, hanging out in Orlando.

As much as she loves her work, Sorenstam says one day she will slow down. "You go through career changes when you get to different phases of your life," she says. "The Solheim Cup won't be around after August, so that will free me up. With the foundation, we're making great headway, so I see myself continuing to work on that. And I love my collection; I'd like for that to continue.

But as her kids get older, she wants to spend more time with them. "I want to be there, I want to learn with them and help them along as much as I can. Again, I don't mind being busy. I like the juggling back and forth. It gives you a little variety. I think it's important to do what you like also. I think I'm a better mom if I can do the things I enjoy, then spend time with [my children] on their things."

# The New Mission Hills Country Club

If you've had the privilege of visiting Mission Hills Country Club over the years, you've probably noticed how much nicer the place looks these days, and how different it feels.

The club, which opened for play in 1972, has just completed the first phase of what will eventually be a complete interior renovation—and no assessment was required. While the exterior and primary spaces are certainly recognizable, the differences and upgrades are immediately clear: more glass, more contemporary colors and a spacious, open feeling that was missing in the old configuration. Once through the entryway, the new golf shop doorway becomes obvious, as do a new textured wood wall and a massive brass screen, both of which highlight what is now known as Champions Craft+Kitchen.

The bar, previously located where the wood wall now dominates, has been moved into the center of the room, behind the brass divider. That move opens up the entire area, highlighting the

dramatic view members and guests have always enjoyed. It also puts a focus on the bar, once a six-seat side attraction and now a three-sided, full-service nerve center. The men's locker room was also given a contemporary makeover, and a snooker table has just been added to the mix. The women's locker room was renovated four years ago.

Other upgrades include new seating in all areas; new main light fixtures; a new Touchdown Room, a private work and meeting space just inside the front doors; improvements to the Dinah Shore boardroom; a new Anytime Lounge with a media area; a new private dining room; and new wine lockers.

The membership has responded. John Conroy, director of marketing and membership, says the spaces have received rave reviews and have also helped generate a new membership

dynamic. The average age of golf members who have joined over the last 14 months is 52, a clear indication that the club is attracting a younger set.

"The vibe has totally changed," Conroy says. "Our evenings now are much more social. As you know, the desert kind of rolls up early. And with our new Champions area, which is our lounge area, our relaxed area, our members are here until 9 o'clock at night. Before, they just followed the sun; when the sun went down, that's when they left."

Along with the renovation, Conroy says there are additional reasons the club is attracting younger members and families. He points to the fact that Mission Hills is not just a golf club but also a country club, with all the traditional country-club amenities. "We've got three golf courses, 33 tennis courts, pickle ball courts, a fitness facility and kids programming, so we've got a lot of activities available for young families to take advantage of."

Rancho Mirage High School has also been a huge benefit to the club. "The high school has been open for three years now," Conroy says. "It's a \$115 million high school and it's beautiful. Now we see families being a bit more drawn to Rancho

Mirage, which was the senior community of the valley for so long. We're evolving."

Phase two of the renovation will involve a revamping of the Sports Club. Current plans call for redesigned and repositioned workout spaces and new spaces for spin and Pilates classes. Conroy expects that phase of construction to begin within the next 12 months, during a time that will cause the least amount of inconvenience for members.

"I think the feeling of it is [that members] love their environment pre- and post-golf round, tennis match, workout time, etc. It's just so much nicer. It's neat to come to their club, neater than it was before. So [the renovations] have been a definite draw," Conroy concludes. "We've done several realtor open houses to ensure that those selling homes in the community are aware of what's different. As they are showing homes, they're even prouder to bring them over the club."

# The 2017 BNP Paribas Open: An Event to Remember

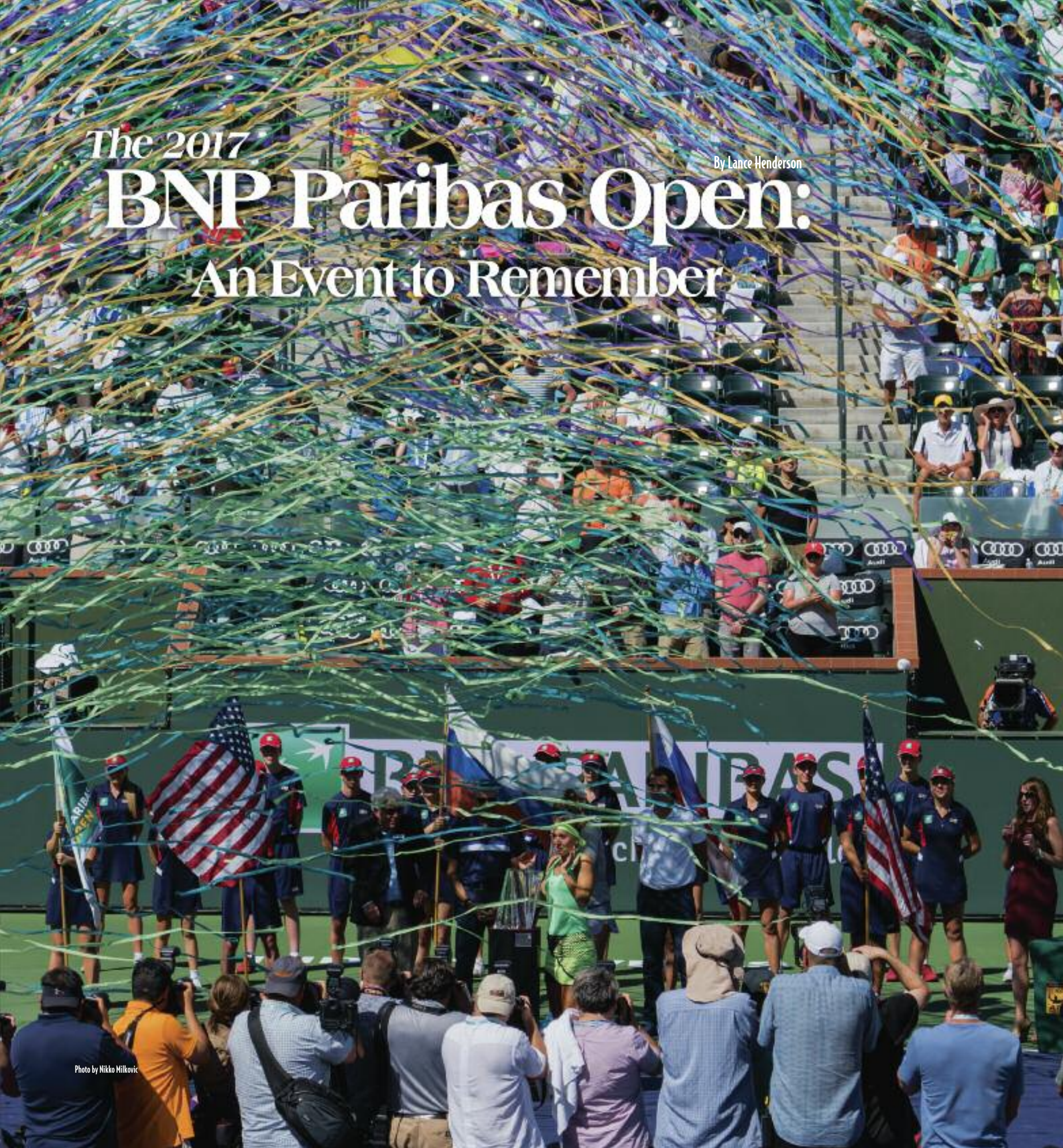

Roger Federer and Elena Vesnina took the men and women's championships during an extremely successful BNP Paribas Open over two weeks in early March, held at Indian Wells Tennis Garden (IWTG) in southern California's Coachella Valley.

Winning his fifth BNP Paribas Men's Championship, Federer bested fellow Swiss star Stan Wawrinka 6-4, 7-5 during Sunday's finale. On his way to the finale, he defeated Rafael Nadal the previous Wednesday 6-2, 6-3 in just over an hour—a decidedly one-sided match.

Many of those in attendance expected Serbian Novak Djokovic—with a record 19 straight winning matches at IWTG—to make the finals. He unexpectedly lost to Nick Kyrgios 6-4, 7-6 in the fourth round. Then Kyrgios withdrew as a result of illness, giving Federer clear sailing to the championship game versus Wawrinka.

Wawrinka, rated No. 3 in the world, won a riveting close fourth-round match against World No. 70, Yoshihito Nishioka from Japan, before defeating Austria's Dominic Thiem to advance to the final against Federer.

Elena Vesnina defeated fellow Russian Svetlana Kuznetsova 6-7, 7-5, 6-4 in a hard-won match that lasted a minute over three hours—the longest played at the Indian Wells tournament.

The 30-year-old Vesnina defeated France's Kristina Mladenovic 6-3, 6-4 in the semi-finals to reach the championship game, having defeated World No. 1 Angelique Kerber of Germany 6-3, 6-3 in the round of 16 and Venus Williams in the quarterfinals 6-2, 4-6, 6-3.

Yung-Jan Chan of Taiwan and Martina Hingis of Switzerland won the Women's Doubles title. They defeated Czech Republic players Lucie Hradecká and Katerina Siniakova 7-6, 6-2. At 36 years of age, this was the third doubles win for Hingis at the BNP Paribas Open. She also won in 1999 with Anna Kournikova and in 2015 with Sania Mirza.

Rajeev Ram of the U.S. won the Men's Doubles with partner Raven Klaasen of South Africa. The two defeated Lukasz Kubot of Poland and Marcelo Melo of Brazil in a hard-fought match on Ram's 33rd birthday.

Over the two-week BNP event, nearly 440,000 people attended. Sunday's finale saw more than 17,000 spectators at IWTG's Stadium Court.

If anyone knows how to host a smash tennis event, it's Hall of Famer Rosie Casals. The third annual Rosie Casals & Jackie Cooper Team Tennis Pro-Am, presented by Mylan WTT (World Team Tennis) and featuring local professionals, juniors and paid amateurs, will take place on Sunday, April 23 at Indian Ridge Country Club in Palm Desert, California.

All proceeds will benefit the Love & Love Tennis Foundation, founded two years ago by Casals and former pro-player Tory Fretz, to provide support for junior tennis.

Casals, a tennis legend and pioneer of the women's professional game, was inducted into the International Tennis Hall of Fame in 1996. This year's invitational is once again being produced by Casals' company, Sportswoman, Inc., to honor the memory of her friend and tennis pro, Jackie Cooper, who was instrumental in promoting junior tennis in the Coachella Valley.

Good friend Billie Jean King's Mylan WTT is the presenting sponsor, with King and Ilana Kloss, WTT's CEO and Commissioner, stepping up to help underwrite the fundraiser. Other event sponsors include Joan Oloff Shoes, *Desert Golf & Tennis* magazine and Marker Broadcasting (Jammin 99.5 FM, 95.9 FM The Oasis, Big 106 KPLM FM Country and Q102.3 FM Classic Rock).

The 2017 Jackie Cooper "You're the Best" award will be presented to Dee Dee Felich. "We were so excited to select Dee Dee for this award because of her passion and dedication for tennis," Casals says. "She is president of the Champions Volunteer Foundation and has been such a strong supporter of junior tennis as well as the Love & Love Tennis Foundation. We wanted to honor her for her lengthy involvement with Charlie Pasarell and what is now the BNP Paribas Open, from which she recently retired. Her close friendship with Charlie, who was last year's honoree and the impetus behind the establishment of the BNP, makes her the perfect candidate to embody what this award means."

The tournament will begin at 8:30 a.m. with an all-doubles team format, bringing top local pros and juniors together to compete in a Team Tennis format for trophies and cash prizes (for the pros). The teams will consist of one pro, one junior and two amateurs. Any level of tennis player is welcomed—and encouraged—to play.

A doubles shoot-out with the pros and juniors, also competing in a Team Tennis format, will be the highlight on center court immediately following a catered barbecue buffet lunch and an on-court live auction and trophy presentation.

"We hope to draw in a lot of great junior players both locally and from throughout southern California, such as Taylor Johnson," Casals says. "She continues to climb up the junior ranks and is now in the top 10 in the International Tennis Federation juniors. She has been participating in this event for the past two years, and I've been coaching her for three years. I just returned from the Australian Open where she played in the Junior Championships and lost in the third round."

Casals is one of the "Original 9" who paved the way for the first-ever professional Virginia Slims Circuit in 1971. She was the first winner of the Virginia Slims tournament in Houston in 1970, and a founder of the Women's Tennis Association (WTA) in 1973. She is regarded as a trailblazer in terms of demanding equal pay for women on the tennis courts, which served as a catalyst to permanent social change and equality for women throughout the country.

Best known for doubles, Casals won 12 Grand Slam titles, seven Wimbledon (five with Billie Jean King), two mixed doubles with Ilie Năstase, four U.S. Open doubles titles and a U.S. Open mixed doubles. Her 112 doubles titles are second only to Martina Navratilova.

The idea for Love & Love Tennis Foundation, a non-profit 501 (c) (3), was inspired by Jackie Cooper's long time passion for wanting to help juniors reach their potential. Cooper passed away from cancer in 2013 and is remembered fondly by many juniors, friends and fellow pros.

The Foundation also keeps Cooper's legacy alive through the involvement of Tory Fretz, a world-class player on the Tour in the 1970s, who agreed with Casals that the desert needed a foundation to support junior tennis and be more involved in the development of the game.

Last year, the Casals & Cooper Tournament raised \$30,000, with grants awarded to local Coachella Valley junior tennis organizations such as Andy Scorteanu's Tennis Academy, Rattlesnake Junior Tennis Academy, Camp of Champions, National Junior Tennis League and the Coachella Valley Unified School District (CVUSD) ASES after-school programs. Funding also provided rackets, tennis balls, tennis shoes and instructor fees.

Casals and the foundation are focusing outreach on developing a roadmap to better promote junior tennis throughout

the Coachella Valley. They are working closely with CVUSD to make tennis more accessible for the Hispanic community as well as for the Native American youth population.

Tickets for the Pro-Am are \$250 per person, which includes an invitation to play in the tennis action and enjoy the barbecue lunch buffet and beverages catered by Indian Ridge. Admission for lunch only is \$25 per person for non-players. Sponsorships are available from \$500 to \$10,000 ([lovelovetennisfoundation.com/events](http://lovelovetennisfoundation.com/events)).

# My Last Sport

Pickleball is taking the nation by storm, and pro Karen Gysin tells us why

Pickleball is one of the fastest growing sports in the United States. It's a sport for all ages, sizes and athletic abilities. You can play with your kids, mother, father, grandparents, even great-grandparents, if they can still walk. It's a very social game, giving players the opportunity to meet other enthusiasts from all over and all walks of life.

Pickleball is a cross between, tennis, ping-pong and paddleball and was created by three men from Bainbridge Island, Washington, on an afternoon in 1965. One of the men had a Cocker Spaniel named Pickles. Pickles would pick up the ball and take off with it, thus giving the new sport its name: Pickle's Ball.

Most ball sports, including softball, baseball, tennis, golf, volleyball, soccer and basketball, require many skills to learn and practice in order to become a top-level player. Most also require a number of people of the same caliber for a game to be competitive and an enjoyable experience. The learning curve for pickleball, however, is much less than for other sports and four people of any age or level can enjoy it.

Pickleball is also a relatively inexpensive hobby. It requires only a paddle, a ball and a court. Because the court is much smaller than a tennis court, the game is by default a very intimate experience, allowing players to easily tease, smack talk, chat and just plain socialize during the game. You don't even have to have game buddies to play. You can simply show up with a paddle at a public venue and easily pick up a game by joining others of your same ability.

The sport itself is exploding all over the United States as well as on the international level. In 2016, the number of members in the USA Pickleball Association (USAPA) increased from 10,302 to 16,793, an average of 540 new members each month. The number of officially rated players rose from 6,000 on January 1, 2016 to 8,638 on Dec. 31, 2016, a 30-percent increase in one year.

Places to play have also increased across the country, yet facilities are having trouble keeping up with demand. Many country clubs are now converting tennis courts; one tennis court can be made into four pickleball courts. Public parks, too, are adding courts. Freedom Park in Palm Desert, California, has added eight courts to accommodate the demand—and it's still not enough. Once you start playing pickleball, you don't stop. It's extremely addicting and enjoyable, hence more people are jumping in.

As for me, I have competed at a high level at four other sports—softball, tennis, volleyball and golf—two of which I played professionally. I needed something to fulfill my need to compete, so I started playing tennis again in my 50s, after playing in college and competing in the USTA. I soon realized my body couldn't hold up as it used to. I would also hike every



day to the cross at Cahuilla, where there used to be four pickleball courts. Every day I would pass by and hear the ping of balls and wonder what those people were doing. I finally stopped and asked. I learned I could just show up with a paddle and join the game. I went to the store to buy a paddle that same day and joined those players the next. I haven't touched my tennis racquet since and the rest, as they say, is history!

Pickleball is much easier on my body, more fun, very social and just plain addicting. I have traveled all over the country ever since playing in tournaments, meeting amazing people and developing lifelong friendships with people that have the same passion for this sport. I think

anyone reading this article that has played pickleball even once will be able to relate.

Tournaments are now being played across the country and even here in the Coachella Valley. One was held this spring at Lakes Country Club, with our very own Marcin Rozpedski, director of tennis, fitness and spa, running the tournament. Rozpedski is the top singles pickleball player in the world and he lives right here in the Coachella Valley. Among the players was another valley resident, Morgan Evans, tennis and pickleball pro and one of the top players in the United States.

I can honestly say this is the last sport I will ever compete in. I also enjoy playing pickleball with my family and friends. Not

only is it inexpensive and less time consuming than other sports, it's also incredibly relaxing and provides great exercise. With the continued growth of the sport, the increasing number of players and the demand for new facilities, we hope to soon see expansion of public courts here in the valley and beyond.

Meanwhile, check out a court in your area to discover why this sport is so popular—and why it just might be your last best sport, too.

Bladder Cancer Awareness Golf Tournament

Great golf for an important cause

was nothing more the doctors could do, so they sent him to Loma Linda University Medical Center to await the inevitable. Throughout this time, Venturi never gave up.

Upon arrival at Loma Linda, Venturi was told that his only chance of survival was complete removal of his bladder. The surgery itself was straightforward and successful; however, the months following the surgery presented the most difficult

challenges. Venturi was in and out of intensive care three times during his two-month stay at Loma Linda. At one point, he slipped into a two-week coma and was given a 20 percent chance of survival. His strength and will ultimately triumphed and he made an incredible recovery. He attributes this successful healing to the team of doctors and nurses at Loma Linda, for whom he feels a great deal of loving appreciation.

Bladder cancer is not rare even though it does not receive the publicity of other cancers. It's the fourth most common cancer among men and fifth most common overall. Common early symptoms include pain during urination, blood in the urine and frequent urinary tract infections. If at anytime you suspect you are experiencing symptoms, common or otherwise, it's important to get a doctor's opinion.

Meanwhile, raising awareness is one way to combat this disease. Venturi and doctors at Loma Linda University Medical Center hope to make more people aware of the early symptoms of bladder cancer through this tournament. The truth is, awareness can and does save lives.

# Golfer's Playbook

## Side-Hill Lies Made Simple

One of the trickiest elements in golf is playing from a side-hill lie. Sure, it would be nice if all shots on the golf course were level, but that's not the reality of the game on most courses. On more challenging courses, players are likely to find that the approach to many greens involves a lie where the golf ball is either above or below a player's feet. Here's how to create a successful outcome with that shot.



### Ball Above My Feet

The first thing I ask myself when faced with this shot is, "How severe is the slope that the ball is sitting on?" The severity of the slope has a lot to do with my setup and alignment to the target. When the golf ball is resting on the ground above my feet, I am going to make several adjustments to my setup. First, I'll grip down shorter on the shaft to compensate for the degree to which the ball is above my feet. In the photo, the ball is approximately two inches above my feet, so I am going to grip down two inches on the club.



The ball above my feet also influences my posture in my setup and swing. I will try to "feel" my posture being a little taller than normal. Because the slope is angled from right to left, the ball will be influenced by this same angle and will fly through the air with this influence from the slope. To compensate, I want to aim more right of the flag in the distance.



In my swing, my focus is to maintain my tall posture as I rotate back and through into a tall finish. I like to make a few practice swings to get a feel for maintaining my taller posture and to control the depth of my divot through the ground.



### Ball Below My Feet

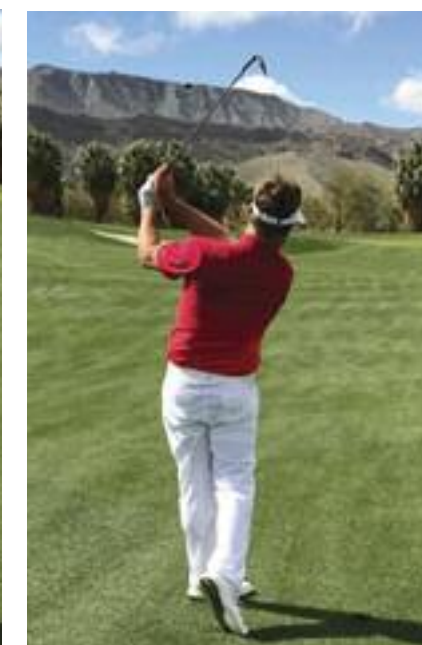
Having the ball below my feet is typically a more uncomfortable position. Faced with this lie, I adjust by playing one club extra than I would normally use and I make a smaller, more compact swing to help maintain better balance and let the club do more of the work.



When the ball is below my feet, I also have more tilt from my hips in my posture and I must aim left of my target since the slope is going to influence the ball to have more of a cut spin from left to right on its flight.



In terms of my swing, my focus again is to maintain my posture throughout the swing. And because the ball is below my feet, I am specifically going to focus on staying down through the ball. Using a club extra really helps me do this effectively.

# Staging Your Home

## To Sell in Today's Market

*It's not about you!*

Proper staging can help you sell your home faster and possibly for a higher price. In recent years, stagers have become savvier at zeroing in on what buyers want. I spoke with several home-staging professionals to find out what works these days, from tried-and-true basics to fresh ideas for prepping a home for a quick and profitable sale. Whether you're planning to hire a pro or want to learn a few tricks to do it yourself, these tips will get you up to speed on the latest techniques in staging to sell.

### Find the right team to work with

The most important thing for homeowners to focus on is choosing the right Realtor to represent them and properly showcase their property with professional photos and staging suggestions. As a real estate professional, I always offer to pay for an initial consultation with a home stager. In today's digital world, most buyers start on the Internet and homes must shine there. Pictures really are worth a 1,000 words! Realtors also use this as their tool to decipher which homes they will show to their clients.

When I go through the MLS listings, I see too many poor photos, no floor plans and no staging. Unless my client is specifically looking for a project, or the home is in a one-of-a-kind location, I will rule out the dated, ugly, messy homes.

Unfortunately, some of these homes could be gems if the homeowners had taken time to update the rooms with very little effort. Most of our second homebuyers want to start enjoying the good life. They don't want to spend the entire season remodeling or planning a remodel of their new purchase.

### Detach yourself from your house

The first step home sellers can take to ensure a successful outcome is to get detached from their home; now it is all about the buyers. If you're finding it difficult to let go of personal items, hire a staging pro. They will look at your home with fresh eyes and see both the strengths and flaws that may be invisible to you as a homeowner.

The process of staging takes the focus of your home away from you and puts it on the potential new owners of your home. I often show sellers photos of staged versus

unstaged homes to show what a striking difference staging makes. And a tour of the staged homes that are their competition will make most sellers believers. I also let them know that empty rooms look smaller than staged rooms. This helps home them understand that home staging is an investment, not a cost.

### Focus on the front

Wondering where to begin? Try sprucing up your home's curb appeal. Buyers make up their mind in the first 30 seconds as they approach the front door. Clean it up, paint and update the old weathered light fixture. Trim foliage; take out dead plantings and mulch if you are in a growing season. When your home hits the MLS, light it up. Potential buyers tend to drive by before they actually go inside.

### Say goodbye to ugly

There is really no nice way to say it: We all have a few ugly bits in our homes, and it's best to face the facts early on. The good news: There are plenty of quick fixes for your home's trouble spots.

New towels, cabinet hardware and accessories in a specific color scheme can

do wonders to a dated bathroom. If you have oak kitchen cabinets, paint them white and add quartz or stone counters to help update. Remove dated wallpaper and paint. Take down dusty, dated window treatments. Inexpensive updates can include changing out light fixtures, New bedspreads and bed linens immediately make a bedroom inviting. Go neutral and use accent pillows for a pop of color.

### Know your buyer

This is the golden rule of staging. The new paradigm is a targeted approach capturing the likely buyer pool through specific design styles that will resonate, such as hipster, industrial or beachy modern style.

We all want to be considered young at heart. I find that the chain home design stores, including Crate & Barrel, Restoration Hardware and Pottery Barn, present a transitional style that appeals to multi-generation buyers. If you're staging your home yourself, ask your real estate agent for help identifying your target market.

### Match your decor to your home's style and price range

It is all about creating the right lifestyle for each house. For example, in a high-end estate, the sofa should be a different one than in a two-bedroom condo on a lower price range. The staging budget should be higher in a multi-million dollar home. Spend more money on a couple of really nice pieces and accessorize around those pieces. Stay consistent with a style. If your home is not ultra contemporary, go for the classic modern style with light colors.

### Consider color

Beige, brown and yellow tones are very yesterday, as is faux painting. White, linen and grays are the trending colors. Stay consistent throughout the home. Too many people watch TV decorating shows and decide to paint every room a different color.

I had a seller reluctant to paint the inside of his home, which was very dark and heavy. I tried to emphasize how spending \$10,000 on paint was such a drop in the bucket for a \$2 million dollar home.

Not only will the house sell faster because of the lightness, it will appeal to a greater audience. Once the owner changed the paint, he was so happy he almost decided not to sell.

Experts say make your home photogenic. No red or green pillows, linens or accents as these colors look awful in real estate photos and are not appealing to many buyers. Use neutral colors — with more modern accent colors such as blues, taupe and tangerine.

### Accessorize wisely

# American Beauty

Ford's redesigned GT elevates American sports cars to a new level



won a CLIO Award in the debut of CLIO's automobile category in September. While the CLIO has historically lauded advertising from international executives and brands, the fact that Ford won an award in the car category from a primarily international audience says that this car is making headlines around the world.

The GT's scissor doors harken to the Lamborghini line. The cockpit is snug. In fact, Ford vice president Raj Nair commented that designers intentionally built the cabin to create closeness. An F1-style steering wheel integrates all necessary driver controls, creating a stalkless steering column that allows uncluttered access to the transmission paddle-shift controls. A fully digital and configurable instrument cluster provides a wealth of driver-focused data. The display is configurable for multiple driving environments and different driving modes.

"While we hope enthusiasts rejoice about this all-new GT," Nair says, "all Ford customers will benefit from the ultimate

performance Ford and its new-generation innovations."

The rear-wheel drive, mid-engine platform comes coupled to a seven-speed transmission. The carbon-fiber frame reduces weight to just over 3,000 pounds. Though the use of a V6 in a car meant to rival the fastest machines in the world is shocking, so is the output of the EcoBoost engine Ford created. Anything north of 600 horsepower doesn't just raise eyebrows; drivers should expect to be on the local law-enforcement watch list with this weapon.

Active aerodynamics deploy the rear spoiler and open dampers based on the ride mode drivers select. In sport mode, the car lowers to just four inches above the ground and prepares for a torque-induced romp. The software controlling the car's computer is running more than 10 million lines of code and Ford tweaked it to perfection before releasing it to the public.

Ford expects to produce just 250 GTs a year in its plant in Canada, and the buying experience is not only exclusive but fun.

Each customer receives a set of completely customized "pieces" in a kit. Think of it as a model car that each owner can complete and send back to Ford. That kit serves as the model for the factory. Each racing stripe, brake caliper and trim piece is unique to the owner's preference.

Cars are rolling off the production line now but they don't come cheap. The estimated price tag on a GT is \$450,000. Yes, you read that right, nearly half a million for an American car.

It looks worth it from this vantage point.

O K, I'm a sucker for American made. Something about the red, white and blue makes me smile. There's been a lack of things to smile about in American sports-car conversations lately but not anymore. Ford has unleashed a beast that has every exotic carmaker taking notes.

Ford is teasing the news of its redesigned Ford GT this month. The "supercar" is said to have more than 600 horsepower and a top speed that will get you an all-expense-paid trip to the pokey. It's dynamic and produces stats worthy of the moniker "super."

The GT has seen success on the racing circuit as Ford has tested its 3.5L engine in real-time. Now that the production car

is ready for market, it's time to see how it stacks up against the leaders of the pack. Last year at Calabogie Motorsports Park in Canada, the GT bested the Ferrari 458 Speciale by more than three seconds. It distanced itself from the McLaren 675LT by a second, turning in a time of 2:09.8. And it turned in a top speed of 216 mph—all this with looks that kill.

The LeMans-style body is all curves and angles. The hood dives toward the pavement dangerously low while the rear deck hovers broadly stable. Air intakes in the hood and side panels ooze performance potential. A low-slung roofline creates a teardrop cabin just large enough for a driver and passenger.

This powerful platform makes a statement to the long-standing genre definers: Ford is serious. It's telling that the GT

Soft removable padding forms a scoop neck with ties behind the neck finished with gold-tone hardware at each end.

Continuing the global journey, the **Nepal Bikini** gives a shout of color in a bold black, pink, blue, orange and yellow paisley motif. Gleaming gold beads trace the strappy cutouts of the **High Halter Neck Bikini Top**, available for \$92. The matching **Nepal Hipster Bikini Bottom** (\$68) features shirred solid black sides and a low rise in the free spirited and colorful paisley pattern, which continues around the backside to cover and flatter the rear end. A playful alternative to the halter bikini top is the **Nepal Scarf Tankini Top** for \$100. This hybrid tankini and flowy scarf top has black ties that fasten behind the neck. Add some turquoise earrings and a black skirt, and you'll be ready to transition straight to an alfresco dinner on the terraced patio or the Lido Deck while the sun sets and the wine flows.

By the way, the designer's **Nepal Cover-Up Tunic** is a great choice for exploring expansive resort grounds, grabbing a light lunch or just covering in your cabana. The same trademark colorful paisley swirls of curvy contours and upbeat pigments decorate the border of the asymmetrical hem and the bust and neck area, creating a loose and luxurious look. The V-neck and three-quarter kimono sleeves compliment the torso and hips. The cover-up is 30 inches long and sells for \$148.

# Creating Runway Looks Through Bold Statement Jewels

Wear them and make your own statement

Fresh off the 2017 Fashion Week runways in New York, London, Paris and Milan, summer and fall jewelry trends have emerged with a shiny vengeance. ## REPOSSI

Creative director Gaia Repossi joined the family business (which originated in Italy) at House of Repossi on Place Vendome, Paris, in 2007. 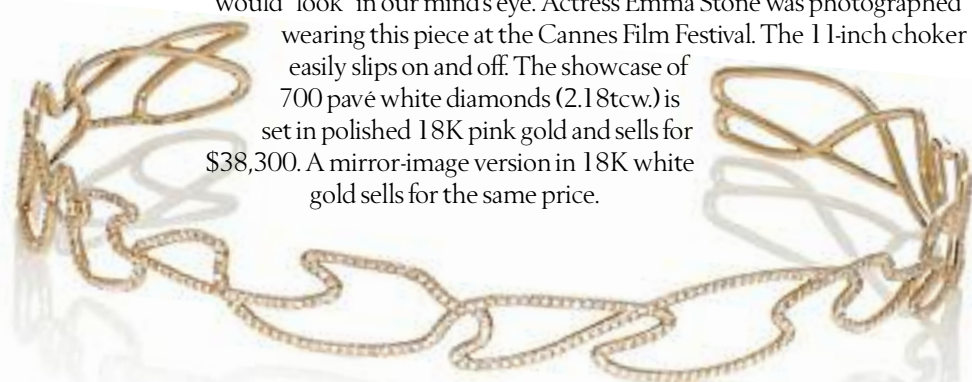
## Berbere Module Hinged Bracelet
