eneath the Californian sun, the BNP Paribas Open transforms the Coachella Valley from a shimmering oasis into a gladiatorial arena where tennis titans clash. Here, amidst the vibrant courts and desert winds, the legend of Rafael Nadal resonates not just in the echoes of clay but in the defiant whispers of victories on hard courts. While Nadal's reign on clay remains undisputed, his journey at Indian Wells paints a different portrait, one of relentless pursuit, fierce adaptation, and a hard-fought 2009 triumph that redefined his dominance beyond clay.

Nadal's first foray into the desert heat came in 2004, a fresh-faced teenager fresh off his maiden French Open glory. Though unseeded, he announced his arrival with a bang, claiming three wins before succumbing to a young Roger Federer in the quarterfinals. This early spark ignited a rivalry that would define tennis' golden age, and Indian Wells would become one of their crucial battlegrounds.

In 2007, a young Novak Djokovic challenged Nadal's authority in a semifinal showdown. In a display of fierce baseline mastery, Nadal outmaneuvered his opponent 6-3, 6-2, sending a powerful message across the tennis world. This victory marked the beginning of another epic rivalry, destined to rewrite the game's landscape.

Two years later, after a heartbreaking Australian Open final loss to Federer, Nadal returned to Indian Wells with a fire in his eyes. He carved through the draw like a desert sculptor, vanquishing up-andcoming Andy Murray (6-1, 3-6, 6-1) in a thrilling semifinal clash. In the final, he faced his arch-nemesis Federer once more. This time, it was more than just a title on the line; it was a declaration of defiance against Federer's hard-court dominance.

Nadal unleashed his ferocious baseline game and powerful topspin with renewed intensity, dismantling Federer 6-3, 6-1 in a masterful performance. This victory wasn't just a title; it was a statement, a declaration that Nadal could conquer not just clay but any surface the tennis world threw at him. He had defied the narrative, silencing doubters and rewriting his own tennis story under the Californian sun.



The years that followed witnessed Nadal and Federer locked in a gladiatorial duel. While Federer emerged victorious in 2010 (6-3, 3-6, 6-1), his serve-and-volley mastery neutralizing Nadal's baseline assault, Nadal returned in 2012, determined to reclaim his title. He overcame Andy Murray (6-3, 6-2) in the semifinals but fell short against Federer once more in the final, succumbing 3-6, 6-3, 6-0. Despite this defeat, Nadal demonstrated his unwavering desire to conquer the hard courts of Indian Wells.

In 2013, Nadal, returning from injury, found himself pitted against Juan Martin del Potro in the final. In a match etched in tennis lore, their strokes painted a captivating story on the canvas of the court. This time, Nadal proved stronger, unleashing his fierce baseline game and powerful topspin to overcome del Potro in a dramatic 4-6, 6-3, 6-4 victory. This hard-fought triumph showcased Nadal's resilience and cemented his dominance at the tournament, claiming his third BNP Paribas Open title.

The remaining years witnessed Nadal's indomitable spirit on display. He navigated challenging draws, reaching finals even as injuries and the rise of new stars tested him. In 2022, at the age of 35, he reached the final once more, only to be outmaneuvered by the rising American star Taylor Fritz (6-3, 5-7,6-1). While not the ending he had hoped for, the tournament showcased his remarkable adaptability and fighting spirit.

Though Nadal hasn't graced the Californian courts since, his absence echoes in the desert winds. His three titles, including the pivotal 2009 victory over Federer, stand as silent sentinels, reminders of his relentless pursuit of greatness. Indian Wells, for Nadal, wasn't just a tournament; it was a crucible, a furnace where his mettle was tested and his legend forged beyond the terracotta trenches.

Rafael Nadal Career

To date, Nadal has won 92 ATP singles titles, including 22 Grand Slam men's singles titles and 36 ATP Tour Masters 1000 titles. He is one of two men to achieve the Career Golden Slam in men's singles, with titles at all four majors and the Olympic singles gold. He is the first man in history to win Grand Slam singles titles on three different surfaces in a calendar year (Surface Slam) and is the youngest (24) in the Open Era to achieve the Career Grand Slam. Following his triumph at the 2022 Australian Open, he became the fourth man in history to complete the double Career Grand Slam in singles, after Roy Emerson, Rod Laver, and Novak Djokovic. He is the first man to win multiple majors and rank world No. 1 in three different decades. [3] Representing Spain, Nadal has won two Olympic gold medals including a singles gold at the 2008 Beijing Olympics and a doubles gold at the 2016 Rio Olympics. In the process, he became the first male player in history to complete the Career Grand Slam and win Olympic gold medals in both singles and doubles. Nadal is the only Spanish player, male or female, to win all four majors twice, to rank world No. 1 for more than 200 weeks, and to win more than 20 majors. He has led Spain to five Davis Cup titles in 2004, 2008, 2009, 2011, and 2019. At the international level, he has won the 2017 and 2019 editions of the Laver Cup with Team Europe.

Historic achievements

Nadal has been the most successful player in history on clay courts. He has a 63-8 record in clay court tournament finals and has lost only three times in best-of-five-set matches on clay.[4] He has won 14 French Open titles (unbeaten in finals), 12 Barcelona Open titles (unbeaten in finals), 11 Monte-Carlo Masters titles, and 10 Rome Masters titles, and has won at least one of the three clay-court Masters 1000 tournaments every year between 2005 and 2014. His 9th French Open crown in 2014 made him the first man in the Open Era to win a single tournament 9 times, breaking a 32-year record held by Guillermo Vilas, who won the Buenos Aires title 8 times. He subsequently won his 9th title at three more tournaments; 2016 Monte Carlo, 2016 Barcelona, and the 2019 Italian Open. In 2018, he became the sole record-holder for most titles at the ATP 500 (Barcelona), Masters 1000 (Monte Carlo), and Grand Slam (French Open) levels.

He also holds the longest single-surface win streak in the Open Era, having won 81 consecutive matches on clay between April 2005 and May 2007.[5] Nadal has never been taken to five sets in 14 French Open finals, and has never lost consecutive matches on clay since the start of his professional career.[6] Many tennis critics and top players regard him as the greatest clay-court player of all time.[7][8] [9] Nadal's 14 French Open titles are a record for one player (male or female) at a single major, surpassing the old record of 11 Australian Open titles won by Margaret Court. Nadal is the only player to defeat Roger Federer in the finals of three different Grand Slam tournaments as well as on three different surfaces (2009 Australian Open on hard court, 2006 French Open on clay court, and 2008 Wimbledon on grass court). He has won 6 hard-court majors (2 Australian Open & 4 US Open titles), tied with Andre Agassi for fourth-most behind Pete Sampras (7), Federer (11) and Novak Djokovic (14) in the Open Era.

Nadal is the first player to win four Grand Slam titles without dropping a set (2008, 2010, 2017 and 2020 French Opens) surpassing the old record of three titles held by Björn Borg. He is also the first player, male or female, to win 100 matches at the French Open and holds the all-time record for the most match wins at a single major, with 112 at the French Open.[10] He is the only player, male or female, to record three streaks of four or more consecutive titles at a single major in their career (2005-2008, 2010-2014 and 2017-2020 French Open),





surpassing the old record of 3 consecutive Wimbledon titles won by Sampras twice (1993–1995, 1997–2000). Nadal is the only player to bagel both Federer (2008 French Open) and Djokovic (2020 French Open) and defeat both in straight sets in Grand Slam finals. He has won the most ATP titles (30 titles) without dropping a set, with 26 of these titles won on clay courts and 4 on hard courts.[11]

Nadal is the sixth player to be ranked ATP world No. 1 for more than 200 weeks. Nadal has qualified for the ATP Finals for a record 16 consecutive years (2005–2020).[12]

Nadal is the third male player to win over US\$100 million in prize money after Djokovic and Federer.

Nadal is one of three male players in history to have won at least two Grand Slam titles each on grass (2), hard courts (6) and clay (14), alongside Mats Wilander and Djokovic.

Nadal won five straight French Open singles titles from 2010 to 2014 to become the only player in the tournament's history to win 5 consecutive singles titles, breaking the previous record of 4 titles held by Paul Aymé and Borg. In 2017, by winning his 10th French Open title, Nadal became the first man to win a milestone 10 titles at the same major. He has played 32 matches against his primary rivals — Federer and Djokovic — in majors and leads 21-11 (10-4 vs Federer and 11–7 vs Djokovic). He is 14–2 on clay and 7–9 off clay against them.

In 2018, Nadal became the first player, male or female, to amass 450+ match wins on both hard and clay courts, with 514 and 474 wins respectively. His 500+ hard court wins rank him No. 4 on the Open Era list, and his 1000+ total match wins have only been achieved by four other players in the Open Era.[13] He holds the record for winning at least one Grand Slam title in 10 consecutive years (2005-14) breaking the previous record of 8 consecutive years held by Borg, Sampras and Federer. He also holds the record for most years (15) winning at least one Grand Slam title (2005-14, 2017-20, 2022).

In 2008, Nadal became the second Spanish man to win Wimbledon. Nadal is one of only two male players in history to have won the French Open and Wimbledon in the same year at least twice, after Rod Laver and Borg. In 2009, Nadal became the first Spaniard to win the Australian Open.[14]

He is also the first of two male players to win three consecutive Grand Slam tournaments on three different surfaces (clay, grass, and hard courts) in the same year (2010), a feat later achieved by Djokovic (2021).[15] By winning the 2010 US Open, Nadal completed a men's singles Career Grand Slam at the age of 24, making him the youngest in the Open Era to do so. He is the 7th male player in history to achieve this feat. In addition, Nadal has completed the Career Golden Slam and is only the second male player in history to attain this after Andre Agassi. By winning the 2022 Australian Open, he became the fourth man in history (joining Roy Emerson, Rod Laver, and Djokovic) to complete the Double Career Grand Slam, by winning each Grand Slam title at least two times. Nadal has won ATP tournaments in 19 countries throughout his career.


He is the only male player to win the French Open and the US Open in the same year four times (2010, 2013, 2017, 2019). Both Ivan Lendl (1986, 1987) and Laver (1962, 1969) achieved this feat twice.

Nadal has won 36 ATP Masters 1000 titles, four behind Djokovic's 40, and reached 53 finals, a record 76 semi-finals, and a record 99 quarter-finals.











Indian Wells Tennis Garden is preparing for yet another memorable championship

Last year, the BNP Paribas Open was named the ATP Tour Masters 1000 and WTA 1000 Tournament of the Year for the ninth straight time—an all-time record.

Shortly afterwards, the tournament released its new campaign for 2024, known as "Feel The Magic", a follow-up to its "New Era" campaign in 2023. If last year's turnout (more than 450,000 attendants) and storylines (Carlos Alcaraz's and Elena Rybakina's singles victories, in particular) provide any indication, the 2024 BNP Paribas Open is bound to be one of Tennis Paradise's best yet.

First off, current and up-and-coming stars are either seeking their first BNP Paribas Open or striving to add to their trophy collection. At the same time, legends like Novak Djokovic, Roger Federer and Rafael Nadal may appear too, depending on their health once the tournament begins (set to be held March 4-17).

Of course, if just one of these legends chooses to play, the championship will become even more popular, potentially leading to record attendance. In anticipation of what's to come (and what may occur), here are some of Desert Golf & Tennis's predictions.

Rising Stars are Preparing to Make History

There is no doubt about it. A huge void has been created in the world of tennis, due to the absences of Federer and Serena Williams. Unfortunately, Federer's career may be nearly (if not completely) over, while Nadal's playing days are potentially numbered as well. And, although Djokovic won three Grand Slam titles last year, he is 36 years old, which is certainly considered "old" in the tennis industry.





Thankfully, there are a wide array of extremely talented tennis players that are preparing to become the sport's next big names. Some have already proven themselves on the grandest of stages, whereas others are still looking to shine at the biggest events. With this in mind, Desert Golf & Tennis expects some of this young talent to challenge for the BNP Paribas Open title this year.

First, there's no reason to believe the men's singles defending champion, Carlos Alcaraz, won't contend for the title yet again. After all, last year, he defeated Daniil Medvedev 6-3, 6-2.

"It feels amazing to lift the trophy here," the then 19-year-old said. "I would say this has been the perfect tournament. This [is the] tournament that I really wanted to win."

Since then, the ATP Tour's No. 2 ranked player has won his second Grand Slam singles title, as he captured the 2023 Wimbledon Championships, while defeating Djokovic in the final, 1-6, 7-6, 6-1, 3-6, 6-4—a victory that proved he can beat the best of the best.

Meanwhile, Medvedev, who will be 28 years old once the 2024 BNP Paribas Open begins, is another favorite to win. The 2021 US Open champion will likely be joined by 22-year-old world No. 4 Jannik Sinner and 26-year-old world No. 5 Andrey Rublev, who are seeking their first BNP Paribas Open titles, too. At the same time, past champions like Taylor Fritz and Dominic Thiem will potentially be competing for their second titles.


On the women's side, world No. 3 Elena Rybakina will be contending for her second consecutive BNP Paribas Open title. By defeating the current world No. 2 Aryna Sabalenka 7-6, 6-4 during last year's final, she became the event's sixth straight first-time women's singles champion. In addition, she added her name to the record books: as the first woman to defeat the WTA Tour's No. 1 and No. 2-ranked players, prior to winning the BNP Paribas Open.

"It's always a pleasure to play against Aryna, and it's always a tough battle," she said. "Hopefully I will come back next year and repeat this result."

She will possibly be joined by other recent winners like world No. 1 Iga Świątek (the 2022 champion), Paula Badosa (the 2021 champion) and Bianca Andreescu (the 2019 champion). At the same time, plenty of other highly talented professionals, like Sabalenka, world No. 4 Coco Gauff, world No. 5 Jessica Pegula and world No. 6 Ons Jabeur, will likely be showcasing their talents at Tennis Paradise as well—further examples of the ways that tennis fans will "feel the magic" yet again this spring.

The Big Three Set for a Big Comeback?

The legacy of 20-time Grand Slam singles champion Roger Federer will remain fully intact at Indian Wells Tennis Garden forever. After all, he won the championship five times, a record he shares with Djokovic. Upon claiming the title back-to-back-toback in 2004, 2005 and 2006, he won it again in 2012 and 2017, proving that he was not only capable of dominating the sport, but also maintaining longevity.

However, despite his longevity, as he won Grand Slam titles from 2004 to 2018, everything eventually comes to an end. Prior to the 2022 Laver Cup, he announced the event would be his final professional tournament on the ATP Tour. Will he change his mind and play professionally once again though? If he does, it will only further enhance 2024 BNP Paribas Open fans' experiences, but the tournament's overall "magic", too.

The two other members of the Big Three—Djokovic and Nadal—may or may not appear in the BNP Paribas Open as well. Djokovic, who won the championship in 2008, 2011, 2014, 2015 and 2016 (but had to withdraw last year, due to visa issues), has encountered a wrist injury from time to time during the last few months. On the other hand, Nadal had to withdraw from the 2024 Australian Open, a championship he won in 2009 and 2022, as his hip muscle was injured.

"I have worked very hard during the year for this comeback," Nadal said. "We all remain positive with the evolution for the season [though]."

While looking ahead to the 2024 BNP Paribas Open, there is certainly much to be positive about, regardless of whether or not the Big Three contends. From rising stars, to expansive, top-of-thenotch facilities, to breathtaking mountain views, thousands of fans will soon "feel the magic" of Tennis Paradise once again.



The \$1 Million Dollar INDYCAR Challenge will heat up the course on March 22-24

Visitors to The Thermal Club may see the world through a different lens after discovering life inside this oasis of opulence. The energy as well as the gears start to shift the moment one passes through the unmarked gates which are tucked between acres of farmland and date palm groves, five miles from the Jacquelyn Cochran Regional Airport in Thermal, California at the base of the Santa Rosa Mountains.



The Club is a posh resort for mega well-heeled (as in average \$30 million net worth each) motorsport enthusiasts who can savor race car action at their doorsteps and over their private balconies. You might say they're the one percent of the one percent. First opened in 2013, the Club offers four (soon to be five) racing circuits, karting and autocross tracks, designed by Alan Wilson. Each track has its own covered paddock and a full pit crew. The tracks can accommodate any vehicle at any speed, from F1 to high performance exotics to vintage motorsports racecars.

The grounds feature gas pumps, car washes, detailing equipment and full-time mechanics and driving instructors. When members wish to sell their classic Ferrari for the newest Porsche, there is a salesperson onsite to ensure Club members receive a fair price. There are also 24- hour armed guards and an 18-foot high barrier sound wall.

In the past two decades, there's been a marked increase in the number of women participants in the sport of racing, both behind and beyond the wheel, proving that women wear the firesuits well. These days, race tracks see any number of female lead performance engineers, gearbox mechanics, drivers and fans. At The Thermal Club, there are two female members who are the primary drivers in their family, and they participate in nearly every member racing event.

On March 22 through 24, 2024, The Club will host the \$1 Million Dollar INDYCAR Challenge, an exhibition race for the NTT INDYCAR Series, to be televised on NBC on March 24. While Championship points will not be on the line, the event

will feature a multi-million dollar purse. A draw party to begin the event will embed members of The Thermal Club with each of the 27 race teams and drivers. The weekend format will include a qualifying session and two heat races, with the top six from each heat advancing to an All-Star showcase. The top five finishing teams will split their earnings with The Thermal Club members, including a \$1 million prize awarded to the winner.

The NTT INDYCAR Series hosted a successful Open Test on the 17-turn, 3.067-mile layout last February to jump-start the 2023 racing season, setting the scene for the 2024 season. Prize breakdown will be \$700,000 for second place, \$500,000 for third place, \$200,000 for fourth place, \$100,000 for fifth place and \$23,000 each for sixth through 27th place.



Spectator tickets start at \$2,000 each, and the VIP experience includes lunch, beer and wine, parking, pit access and a premium view of the track. Tickets may be purchased at: universe.com/ events/indycar-l-million-challenge-at-the-thermal-club-march-24-2024-tickets-VXP3L7?ref=ticketmaster. There's also a member's race over the weekend for which limited amateur slots are available for \$150,000 each. Each entry will ensure a \$5,000 donation to Martha's Village & Kitchen.





The Thermal Club was established and financed by car collectors and enthusiasts Tim and Twanna Rogers, who amassed their \$7.5 billion in sales by buying and supplying fuel to 7-Eleven convenience stores and gas stations as well as owning Tower Energy Group (as in Tower Markets). The Club provides amenities including a motorsports village, spa, hotel for guests with 48 casitas, fitness center, tennis courts and a pool.

In order to open it up on the track as a member of The Thermal Club – either with one's own racing vehicle or with a car ordered for the day provided by The Club - the buy-in is \$200,000 initiation fee, \$2,400 per month membership fee and purchase of a lot with the firm commitment to build a luxury villa within five years, minimum 6,500 square feet. Most homes average 8,000 to 15,000 square feet, while Rogers' is 24,000 square feet. Garages are two and three stories, often with viewing lofts from inside – think modest airplane hangar. Keep in mind these are second, third or fourth dwellings for most of these billionaire residents, who include a

famous athlete's son, a celebrity musician, a prominent entertainment executive and the son of a recently deceased political kingmaker and philanthropist.

Membership includes access to all tracks and amenities, and the standard membership is vertical, including the primary member, spouse, children and children's children. Out of the 276 available lots, 140 have currently been sold, according to Rogers.

Athree-person design review committee that includes Tim Rogers, his construction manager and main architect must approve the design of each villa, which usually falls into Spanish style or clean-line minimalism.



And Rogers maintains the right to expel any member for lack of compliance such as abusive behavior to staff or failure to move forward with building. When asked if he'd ever had to exercise this authority, he responds, "Absolutely." Rogers says, "The point is to develop the property, not leave these sites vacant for years."

Each residence has custom touches such as a concealed, year-round Christmas room behind cleverly camouflaged bookshelves, state of the art surveillance cameras, wine cellars on every level, and upper story patio grass for the pet pooch's convenience. For those concerned about lack of a golf course, not to worry. Most members and homeowners can play where they keep their other homes at The Madison Club, The Quarry Golf Club or in another palatial So Cal community.

Tim Rogers estimates that he's spent \$350 million to date to develop the 425-acre property, but he doesn't cut corners. He says, "During COVID, we never closed. It was important to stay open, including our restaurants, for our members as well as to keep our 165 employees working." The three restaurants have their own executive cheffrom France and pastry chef, and they serve breakfast and lunch seven days a week with dinner on Friday and Saturday nights.

Savvy businessman that he is, Rogers has ensured revenue opportunities for The Club such as a 70-car storage facility for members' race cars with untold millions worth of Lamborghinis, Ferraris, Porsches, Mercedes and LMP2 race cars inside. Indigo Auto Group maintains a storage property on site to assist with client sales, and BMW operates its Performance Driving Center West on property for a rental fee of \$300,000 each month.

One prominent member who graciously provided a home tour — while hosting a holiday gathering for Club employees who spent the day "racing" on the 40-foot model track built above the garage — noted that it's the excitement of watching the racetrack from one of his and his wife's many panoramic patios that's the appeal here.



He says, "The mountains are gorgeous and all, but sitting around watching them just doesn't do it for me. I want to see action."


Rogers is supportive of the community, having provided hundreds of thousands of dollars in improvements such as constructing the Borrego Health building (now occupied by DAP Health Center) and funding a local park for \$150,000. He supports events at or near The Club including a recent charity event for DAP Health and an upcoming Sheriff's conference. One event he particularly enjoyed was a recent night driving event for members of the CIA, FBI and MI-6 who took their vehicles up to 125 miles per hour then enjoyed a gourmet dinner.

When Rogers is asked if there is anything or anywhere else like The Thermal Club in the world, his response is simple: "No. It's one of a kind." He adds, "An invitation to race and be a part of The Thermal Club is considered the golden ticket."

Whether new driver, gentleman or lady racer or seasoned professional, the motto is the same: drive fast or go home.



The Foundation was established by Gullickson's twin brother Tom, after Tim passed away in 1996 from a brain tumor. It was a painful commemoration for Macaulay, for whom Tim had been a friend and a mentor, but it also inspired him to help others through charity in Gullickson's memory and set the charitable tone for the future of Desert Smash.



Macaulay makes it clear that supporters including the La Quinta Resort & Club along with Todd Marker of Marker Broadcasting have been integral to the success of Desert Smash. The La Quinta Resort collaborated early on and is now in lock step as the worldclass hospitality partner. Gulf Broadcasting and KESQ-3 have committed significant support for two decades, and Desert Smash attracts media coverage from Entertainment Tonight, Access Hollywood, Hollywood Reporter, Vogue, Vanity Fair and dozens of others

As for the inside baseball, so to speak, VIPs can look forward to the mother of all afterparties, the Desert Smash Bash, at Zenyara, the 50 acre, 11-bedroom, ultra luxury mega estate in Coachella that offers swimming, golfing, lounging on a man-made white-sand beach and a host of upscale recreational activities.

HAPPY GOLF MONTH. Let's have some golf fun feeling this winter & get you feeling some DISTANCE. Today's golftip is "LEVERS". Levers can also be called = hinge, flick the wrists, "L", whip, or other golf "terms" to increase "clubhead speed". When you add "LEVERS" you can create massive speed in the golf swing. 2 things traveling at different speeds = your turn & your LEVERS ADD DISTANCE.







LEVERS: SEE PHOTO "L" in my WRISTS

- $\cdot After\,my\,turn...\,I\,added\,a\,\text{``LEVER''}...\,The\,hinge\,of\,my\,wrists$
- \cdot The LEVER IS ADDED ABOUT AT 3 $\&\,9$ o'clock or waist high in the golfswing
- · You can do this on both sides of the golf swing (takeaway & follow through)
- · The feel is to create some "speed/ whip or difference between the shaft & the forearms"
- · Watch your grip pressure. If it is too tight this won't feel right.

Beginning golfer Drill

7 iron = small golfswing (like chipping) ADD 1 LEVER...THE WRIST...FLICK THE CLUB (feel like you are swatting at the ball then add a bigger swing)


Intermediate - Advanced Drill

7 iron = FEET TOGETHER DRILL (1/2-3/4 swing)... slow speed, feet close together... just work on your LEVERS







Even though Nobu Matsuhisa's acclaimed restaurant is a yearround fixture at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden, somehow the black cod tastes more buttery and the Wagyu beef seems more tender while overlooking the tennis on Stadium 2. Matsuhisa, who hit the dining scene in the 1980s with his first restaurant in New York, today boasts satellite establishments throughout the world.

The superstar James Beard chefs signature blend of traditional Japanese dishes with South American ingredients and specially sourced seafood and beef include Arctic char with chimichurri, lobster with wasabi pepper sauce and many others. Hot special dishes cover squid pasta with light garlic sauce, eggplant with miso and rock shrimp tempura. Cold special dishes showcase salmon spicy cilantro with paper thin vegetables, live octopus shabu shabu and baby artichoke salad.

Sometimes only pasta will do, and for those times during tennis paradise, Ristorante Mamma Gina comes to the rescue. The Indian Wells Tennis Garden location is every bit as hip and happening as the El Paseo locale, with tantalizing menu offerings including soups, salads, appetizers, pastas and fresh meats and seafoods all prepared with a traditional Italian flair.

Mules are served in copper mugs – we should hope so – with choices such as Moscow, cucumber and dark and stormy. Specialty martinis and an expertly curated wine menu complement the cuisine.

Go-to selections include polenta pasticciata al gorgonzola (baked polenta with sweet truffled gorgonzola cheese), calamaretti fritti, spaghetti alla carbonara, cannelloni alla Fiorentina, New York alla griglia (16-ounce prime New York steak grilled and served with mushroom medley, roasted potatoes and spinach), branzino alla Tony, and brodetto di pesce fresco (cioppino style fish stew with calamari, salmon, mussels, clams, scallops and shrimp in a light saffron tomato broth).

The whiplash of the Turbo S comes at a price. At a suggested retail price near \$200,000, the features you get are impressive. Customize nearly everything from color of the paint, interior lighting, and leather softness. The Turbo S is a machine could be said to punch above its weight class.

The precision engineering you'd expect from Porsche is all over the Taycan, from the chassis to the newly designed two-speed

With a curb weight of just over 5,000 pounds, it isn't easy to compare this car with its peers. Yet, it screams off the line and handles like a champ.

The Taycan is not just a symbol of luxury and performance; it represents Porsche's ability to work miracles with metal and wheels. Taking this much weight around a track this fast should be criminal, but instead, it's an average day in the life a Porsche supercar. This is what the future holds for electric vehicles. With each iteration, Porsche refines its electric offerings, addressing concerns, and pushing the boundaries of innovation.

The Taycanis not just a car; it's a statement - a statement that electric vehicles can be thrilling, luxurious, and practical.

The Crete de Fleur gym leggings and coordinating Crete de Fleur gym sports bra build on the Barocco design, introducing refreshing swatches of pure white in an eye-catching silhouette on or off the court. The stretch leggings have a wide waistband, and the sleeveless sports bra offers structure with corset-inspired seams around the bustline, racerback and scoop neck. The trademark Medusa logo makes an appearance on the back of the sports bra and along the front of the leggings, reinforcing the origins of the logo, her image and spirit said to incarnate fatal passion in the fiercely headstrong woman who wears it. \$950 and \$595.

The **Greca pleated tennis skirt** is distinctively if not defiantly Versace, with the signature Greca key elastic design, showcasing a central Medusa motif in this pull-on style.
