





Pat McCabe, tournament director for The 2026 American Express Golf Tournament – colloquially referred to as "The Amex" – is surprised how often he's asked who's performing in the weekend concerts even before fans get around to the golf.

However, golf reigns supreme at this popular PGA TOUR event, set to take place from January 19–25, 2026 in La Quinta, California, across three prestigious courses: the Nicklaus Tournament Course at PGA West (par 72, 7,147 yards), the Pete Dye Stadium Course (par 72, 7,210 yards), and La Quinta Country Club (par 72, 7,060 yards).

The Amex annually tees up the start of the PGA TOUR's west coast swing and is the TOUR's first 2026 regular season event in the U.S., showcasing 156 professional golfers and 156 amateurs. The

tournament was founded in 1960 as the Palm Springs Golf Classic. It has undergone several name changes over the decades, including Bob Hope Desert Classic, Bob Hope Chrysler Classic, Humana Challenge, CareerBuilder Challenge, Desert Classic, and now, The American Express.

Spectators and players can expect exceptional golf, unforgettable hospitality experiences and show-stopping entertainment. As if the top-tier golf isn't enough, this year's concert entertainment following play on Friday and Saturday evenings will see Old Dominion and One Republic rock the stage. Both concerts will take place on the PGA West Stadium Course driving range.

McCabe, through SPORTFIVE, a global sports marketing agency, has been at the helm of the tournament since 2019. He considers



himself fortunate to have overseen the transition to current title sponsor, American Express. He plays a central role in organizing and shaping the event, which has evolved under his leadership.

McCabe said, "The event would not be what it is without our exceptional sponsor, American Express. They continue to provide over the top amenities for fans, spectators, players, and sponsors while hosting a superlative pro-am field of players."

SPORTFIVE manages other PGA TOUR events, including the Procore Championship in Napa, California, the ISCO Championship in Louisville, Kentucky, the ONEFlight Myrtle Beach Classic, and the Puerto Rico Open, among others.

McCabe notes that most of the attendees at The Amex are from the southern California region, with many having a residence in the Coachella Valley. But last year, he was excited to see strong ticket sales to visitors from all 50 states in the U.S. as well as from 12 other countries.

It's still early as golf timelines go, and McCabe notes that final player commitments aren't determined until the week prior to the event. Golf enthusiasts will be watching to see if Sepp Straka of Austria, the 2025 winner, can recapture the trophy. Straka ended up with a -25 total score (rounds 65, 64, 64 and 70). Straka was followed by Justin Thomas at -23 in second place and Justin Lower and Jason Day who tied for third at -22.

Other potential entries include Scottie Scheffler, Xander Schauffele, Patrick Cantlay, Tony Finau, and Rickie Fowler.

McCabe said, "I can project that someone 20 under par will win,

Regardless, the courses here complimented by the spectacular desert weather will deliver a week of exciting play and activities."

As a charity event, The Amex can now boast \$68 million in lifetime charitable contributions, conferring a powerful impact socially and economically to the La Quinta area and to the Coachella Valley as a whole. The tournament is estimated by some to have generated around \$150 million for the Coachella Valley just since 2020.

Through its charitable foundation, Impact for Golf, the tournament will again bring in life-affirming support for organizations that uplift community members and families, with funds being directed to nonprofit organizations dedicated to health and wellness, youth sports, family support, education and homelessness. Charity recipients include Boys and Girls Clubs, Family YMCA of the Desert, Galilee Center, and Find (Food In Need of Distribution) Food Bank, for whom The Amex has just scored naming rights.

McCabe said, "We anticipate another year with \$25 million in economic impact brought about by attendees across the valley and throughout the country and beyond, sponsors, hospitality partners, volunteers, players, caddies and of course spectators."


Daily Grounds tickets begin at \$85 for access to Thursday's first round on January 22 and for the final round on Sunday, January 25. Admission on Friday and Saturday, January 23 and 24, is \$135 and includes the post-round concert each day.

For the most deluxe experience, fans can visit the private Champions Club, presented by Wealthspire, located around the





18th hole of the Stadium Course. It includes a preferred parking pass and features a climate-controlled tent and open-air deck with hosted breakfast and lunch, snacks and a full bar all day. Daily tickets are \$475-525. Champions Club members holding tickets to Friday's and Saturday's concert days get in on access to an upgraded VIP viewing area near the stage with a complimentary full bar. American Express cardholders can receive 20% off the ticket price for Daily Grounds and Champion Club tickets for The 2026 American Express.



Other refreshment stations and public venues at PGA West's Stadium Course include The Turn, Michelob Ultra Beers For Birdies (at the Alcatraz hole offering beer discounts any time a pro makes a birdie on the hole), Bushmills Whiskey Lounge and Corona Premier Par-Tee Lounge.

McCabe said, "A lot of people don't realize how much work is involved for one week of temporary build out, with thousands of volunteers and thousands of square feet of activity space, which takes over two months to set up. At the same time, it's fascinating, and it allows us to create a safe, enjoyable event for everyone involved. It positions us to ensure we have happy spectators, players and sponsors for 2026, 2027 and beyond."

The American Express golf tournament stands out not only for its elite field and entertainment lineup but also for its enduring philanthropic impact through its charitable arm, the Impact Through Golf Foundation. Since the tournament's inception in 1960, this charitable vehicle has channeled tens of millions of dollars into nonprofits serving the region. As of recent reports, more than \$67 million has been distributed to around 100 + nonprofit organizations in the Greater Coachella Valley

In the most recent cycle, the Foundation announced that it would donate \$1.1 million to fifteen local charities in a Community Impact Celebration held in November 2025. The beneficiaries represented a cross-section of causes: youth development, education and mentoring programs, health and wellness initiatives, homelessness and housing services, food assistance and disaster-recovery efforts. Among the recipients were organizations such as Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Desert, Coachella Valley Rescue Mission, Coachella Valley Volunteers in Medicine, The First Tee — Coachella Valley, Galilee Center and the Hunter Lopez Foundation.

The Foundation's process revolves around selecting local charities whose work aligns with specific priority areas: health and wellness, education and youth/family support, homelessness and housing, natural-disaster recovery, capital improvement and legacy projects. Applicants must be 501(c)(3) charities active in the Coachella Valley region, typically for at least two years, and have an operating budget of at least US \$250,000. The review process includes letters of intent, finalist selection and a formal grant application.

Historically, the philanthropic legacy of the tournament and its charity arm has grown progressively. According to a 2023 article, the event surpassed the US \$65 million mark in lifetime charitable

contributions after "another million-dollar year" of donations. In 2024, the Foundation distributed US \$1,050,000 across 16 desert charities — consistent with the shift in recent years toward fewer grantees receiving larger amounts each.

The benefits of such funding are tangible in the region. For example, one 2024 grantee, the Family YMCA of the Desert, used its grant to create a new outdoor childhood space at its La Quinta and Indio child development centers — illustrating how funding from the tournament's charitable program helps realize facility-and program-expansion projects rather than just covering basic operational expenses.

The tournament itself is firmly rooted in the Coachella Valley, with host venues including PGA West (Pete Dye Stadium Course and Nicklaus Tournament Course) and La Quinta Country Club. The philanthropic program is an intrinsic part of the event's identity: the Foundation's name has even been branded as "Impact Through Golf". Through the decades, the tournament has leveraged its economic footprint, spectator engagement and community network to lift up local nonprofits, earning it a reputation for combining world-class sport with local social impact.

Taking a broader view, the importance of the program lies not only in the dollar amounts but in the strategic focus: enabling programs that have lasting community effects. The emphasis on capital improvement and legacy projects—for example, creating or upgrading physical spaces for youth, health clinics or homeless services—signals a commitment to long-term infrastructure rather than short-term fixes. The 2025 grant cycle specifically prioritized larger amounts to fewer organizations, enabling deeper investment in major projects or multi-year initiatives.



For local nonprofits, receiving a grant from the Impact Through Golf Foundation means access to significant resources, visibility connected to a major PGA Tour event, and alignment with a brand known for quality and impact. For the community, it means that when spectators attend the tournament or entertainers perform, there is an embedded social return: a portion of the economic activity supports tangible improvements in local education, health, youth services, and social welfare.

While the 2025 distributions were \$1.1 million, the cumulative total since 1960 surpasses US \$67 million and growing. One might reasonably anticipate that future years will build on this foundation, potentially channeling even greater resources to fewer, strategically chosen organizations to maximize long-term benefit.

The 2026 WM Phoenix Open will once again shine as one of the most exhilarating and celebrated tournaments on the PGA Tour calendar. Scheduled for early February at the famous TPC Scottsdale in Arizona, this event—known around the world as "The Greatest Show on Grass"—combines championship golf with a festival-like atmosphere unlike anything else in the sport. Since its inception in 1932, the Phoenix Open has grown from a regional tournament into a global phenomenon that attracts record-breaking crowds, world-class players, and millions of viewers each year.

The defending champion, Thomas Detry of Belgium, returns in 2026 after claiming his first PGA Tour victory in stunning fashion last year. His calm precision and consistent play separated him from a star-studded field, marking one of the biggest wins of his career. Now, Detry heads back to TPC Scottsdale with the goal of defending his title against a new wave of challengers eager to experience what it feels like to conquer golf's most boisterous stage.


Few tournaments can match the sheer magnitude of the WM Phoenix Open. Each year, attendance routinely surpasses 700,000 fans over the course of the week, making it by far the most attended golf event in the world. What sets this tournament apart is the energy of its galleries. Fans don't just watch—they participate. From the moment the gates open, there's a buzz that runs through the air, a blend of excitement, celebration, and anticipation. The spectators are passionate, knowledgeable, and unrestrained, cheering wildly for great shots and letting players know when nerves get the better of them.

No hole captures that spirit better than the iconic par-3 16th, known as "The Coliseum." Enclosed by grandstands that seat more than 20,000 fans, it has become one of the most famous holes in golf. Players are greeted by roars that rival a football stadium, and the atmosphere is as intense as it is unforgettable. It's not unusual for pros to feed off the energy, celebrating birdies with the crowd or acknowledging the playful boos after a missed green. The 16th hole



is pure theater—an experience that every player dreams of and every fan remembers.

A major element of the week, beyond the leaderboard and the fairways, is the evening entertainment. This year the four-night concert series known as the Coors Light Birds Nest returns, held across the street from the tournament venue at the intersection of 82nd Street and Bell Road. The Birds Nest has become an essential part of the WM Phoenix Open experience, offering nightly major-league acts, food, drink, games and a party atmosphere that draws fans of music, golf and festival vibes alike. In 2026 the lineup has already locked in country-rising star Zach Top for Thursday night with special guest ERNEST, and global dance phenomenon John Summit to close out the series. These concerts begin early evening—gates opening in the mid-afternoon, and headliners beginning around 8:30 pm—giving guests the option to attend golf



during the day and dive into concert mode at night. The Birds Nest is strictly 21-and-over, emphasizing the adult-festival tone, and tickets include general admission and VIP options (with upgrades for food, drinks and premium viewing).

The location of the Birds Nest, just steps away from the main tournament entrance, makes it easy for attendees to move between the golf and the festivities. One moment you're cheering a birdie on the 16th; the next you're dancing under lights to top-tier music. The dual nature of the event appeals both to hardcore golf fans and to those who come for a lively week of entertainment, hospitality and

Beyond the fanfare, the golf course itself is a masterpiece. Designed by Tom Weiskopf and Jay Morrish, the Stadium Course at TPC Scottsdale is both visually stunning and strategically demanding. Set against the rugged beauty of the McDowell Mountains, it offers wide fairways, immaculate greens, and dramatic risk-reward opportunities. The desert setting creates breathtaking views in every direction, especially at sunrise and sunset when the light glows over the surrounding cacti and rock formations. The course's design perfectly balances playability for amateurs throughout the year and challenge for professionals during tournament week, with its blend of reachable par 5s, short par 4s, and devilishly tricky par 3s.

The 17th hole is another fan favorite, a short par 4 that tempts players to drive the green but punishes even slight errors with water lurking along the left. It's a place where tournaments have been won or lost, and in 2026 it's sure to provide more heart-stopping drama. The finishing hole, a par 4 with water running up the left side, adds to the suspense, giving fans a perfect vantage point to witness closing heroics or heartbreak. Each hole seems designed to draw emotion, making TPC Scottsdale one of the most entertaining venues in professional golf.

Just as important as the course and competition is the location itself. Scottsdale sits on the edge of Phoenix, providing easy access to the amenities of a major metropolitan area while maintaining the relaxed charm of the Sonoran Desert. For fans traveling from across the country, the convenience is unmatched. The tournament site is only a short drive from Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport and surrounded by world-class resorts, restaurants, and entertainment venues. The city's vibrant nightlife, luxury shopping, and dining options make the WM Phoenix Open as much a social destination as a sporting event.

The weather in February is another major attraction. With average daytime highs in the low 70s and abundant sunshine, conditions are ideal for both golf and spectators. Clear skies and crisp desert air create a postcard-perfect setting for one of the tour's most exciting weeks. The surrounding region offers countless opportunities for exploration, from hiking in the McDowell Sonoran Preserve to experiencing the culture and cuisine of Old Town Scottsdale. The combination of elite golf and leisure makes this event a highlight not only for players but for thousands of visitors who plan their vacations around it.

Beyond the competition and entertainment, the WM Phoenix Open also has a meaningful community impact. Organized by The Thunderbirds, a Phoenix-based civic organization, the tournament





has raised hundreds of millions of dollars for Arizona charities over the decades. Proceeds from ticket sales, sponsorships, and events like the famous Birds Nest concert series directly benefit local nonprofits, hospitals, and youth programs. The Phoenix Open's legacy of giving back has become as important as the leaderboard itself.


Another point of pride for the event is its ongoing commitment to sustainability. Under the leadership of its title sponsor, WM, the tournament has achieved zero-waste status for several consecutive years. Every cup, plate, and piece of material on the grounds is recycled, composted, or converted into energy. That environmental stewardship has set a standard for large-scale sporting events worldwide, proving that even an event of this size can operate responsibly while entertaining hundreds of thousands of people.

As the 2026 edition approaches, anticipation continues to build. Fans are eager to see if Thomas Detry can repeat his 2025 success or if one of golf's young stars will seize the moment and claim victory in front of the sport's most passionate crowd. With its combination of world-class players, breathtaking desert scenery, and an atmosphere that feels more like a festival than a golf tournament, the WM Phoenix Open continues to represent everything that makes modern golf so dynamic.

From its roots in 1932 to its present-day status as a global showcase, this tournament has transcended tradition. It is where the sport meets spectacle, where precision meets passion, and where Arizona's desert landscape transforms into the epicenter of the golf world for one unforgettable week. The 2026 WM Phoenix Open will once again remind fans and players alike why it remains not just the "Greatest Show on Grass," but one of the greatest shows in all of sports.


Curley-Wagner Golf Design forges global connections on and off the green

For Brian Curley—half of the Curley-Wagner Golf Design duo—every aspect of creating a new golf course is a positive experience. "I like it all—travel, meeting new people, getting into the construction," Curley says. "For me, the planning part comes easy, and it's certainly not sitting in a cubicle."

Curley began his career with Landmark Land Company in La Quinta in 1984, a point in time he fondly recalls as "the same year I got married." As a young designer working with Ernie Vossler and Joe Walser, Jr., he soon began collaborating with legendary golf course architect Pete Dye.

"I was tossed into the mix to draw the courses, since my background was in design and architecture," Curley explains. "The joke was always, 'Pete couldn't draw his own breath,'" he adds with affection. Curley worked with Dye on high-profile projects including PGA West Resort and Kiawah Island, the latter which hosted the Ryder Cup.

His deep connection to the Coachella Valley continued through acclaimed designs such as The Plantation Golf Club





in Indio (originally co-designed with Fred Couples) and Marriott's Shadow Ridge in Palm Desert.

When Landmark faced an economic downturn in 1992, Curley partnered with Lee Schmidt in 1997 to form Schmidt-Curley Golf Design. Schmidt, who had served as Vice President of Design and Construction at Landmark Land Company and was part of the leadership at Nicklaus Design, focused on construction, and together they quickly became "the darlings of the golf world."

"Somehow we caught lightning in a bottle when the golf world came roaring back," Curley recalls. "We got so many jobs in different parts of the world that we often weren't even together." When China's golf industry exploded, the firm built over 50 courses there as well as in Thailand and other parts of Asia.

Among their most recognized projects in China are Mission Hills Haikou—named Best International Resort by Golf Digest—and Mission Hills Shenzhen, the World's Largest Golf Club, designed in collaboration with golf greats such as Jack Nicklaus, Greg Norman, and Annika Sörenstam. In Thailand, their achievements include Amata Spring Country Club and Siam Country Club, both highly acclaimed.

When Schmidt decided to wind down, Curley formed a new partnership with Jim Wagner, a former senior design associate at Nicklaus Design. Schmidt relocated to Florida, while Curley remains based in Paradise Valley, Arizona, where he lives with his wife of 41 years. "It's more like 20 years, given how much I've been gone," he jokes. Their two grown sons have followed creative paths—one is an architect in Santa Barbara and the other a golf course shaper.

Curley recalls that in 2013, golf development in China came to a halt—the same year President Barack Obama began his second term and President Xi Jinping rose to power in China. "We lived a fast-paced life, designing 25 courses for Mission Hills Golf Club. When things hit a wall, I realized I had to pick up my ball and take it somewhere else."

Curley and Wagner have since designed eight projects in Vietnam, where Curley maintains an office in Hanoi—a favorite destination. Their firm offers full-service golf course design and master planning across the globe, with completed projects in Burma, Thailand, Cambodia, Indonesia, Malaysia, and the Philippines. Wagner, the younger of the two, is based in the Philippines.

The Curley and Wagner portfolio spans over 150 courses in 25 countries, including the U.S., Asia, the Middle East, and Europe. They've been named GOLF Magazine's Architect of the Year and Best Golf Course Architect by Asian Golfer for seven consecutive years. Current projects include a world-class tournament course under development in Villar City, Philippines, and high-profile courses in Saudi Arabia, Indonesia, and Vietnam.

Reflecting on his time in Southeast Asia, Curley says, "I often say that creating golf courses in Asia was the best thing I ever did and creating golf courses in Asia was the worst thing I ever did." After 20 years abroad, reentering the domestic market in the U.S. and Mexico has been challenging. "It just depends on whatever pond you fish in."

"We're busier than ever," Curley adds. "There's a lot of activity in Saudi Arabia right now in terms of new golf course construction. We're seeing a return to golf course communities where homes and condos are part of the package." Speaking about his current remodel project in Newport Coast, California, he notes, "Pelican Hill is all open space, all ocean, and not a home in sight. But the pendulum always swings back."

Curley prefers starting projects from scratch. "I have lots of experience transforming an unfriendly site—like a steep, rocky hillside in China—into a functional golf course. When starting fresh, I get to create the course and the entire world that surrounds it. I have

tremendous respect for artists who do remodels, but I enjoy the complete experience, including the massive dirt moves and rough grading. It's about a lot more than just putting in bunkers."

His favorite course? Cypress Point in Pebble Beach, California. "It's where I grew up. Of course I snuck in there, then later I caddied, but it's a favorite as far as overall experience."

As the global golf landscape continues to evolve, Brian Curley remains a visionary at its forefront—bridging artistry, engineering, and international diplomacy through the language of design. With a repertoire that spans continents and a reputation built on excellence, Curley's work not only shapes fairways and greens but also defines the future of the sport itself.

"Every course is a chance to create something lasting," he says. "It's not just about golf—it's about place, experience, and legacy."

Visionary Kim Jagd leads team to victory as owner, manager and player

This might be a good time to break out your Spotify recording of "We Are The Champions" by Queen. The tune perfectly captures the buzz of the unprecedented victory achieved by the Coachella Valley Scorpions pickleball team at the NPL (National Pickleball League) Championships this past October 16-19, marking the finale of the league's third season.

It's a juncture that Kim Jagd, co-owner, general manager, and star player, knew in her heart could be actualized while remaining cautiously optimistic.

Jagd said, "As a player, I visualize winning but never overlook my opponents. As a general manager, I believed our strategy of playing with a variety of partners during the regular season was integral and I felt good about our chances IF we could stay healthy. When the injury bug came calling, John Riedy [second year player] was asked to step up when David Katz tore his calf on the first day of the playoffs."

The strategy succeeded and confetti flew with the Scorpions' players rallying to capture the trophy and \$50,000 in prize money, which was divided evenly among all 14 players. The NPL championship – including a handsome trophy presented by Rod Davis, NPL chief executive officer - was awarded by QC Kinetix after a dominant 7-2 victory







over the No. 1 seeded and host Seattle Tsunami at the Side Out Tsunami Pickleball Center.


Presented by Agua Caliente Casinos and Powered by JOOLA, the No. 2 seeded Scorpions avenged two earlier losses this season to the Tsunami as the third season of the first and only professional pickleball league for the top champion pros aged 50-and-over came to a monumental close.

"This has been a culmination of two years of hard work," said Jagd. "We are so grateful for the NPL and to Seattle Tsunami for putting on a first-class championship event. Our ownership group – including Indian Wells residents Rob Zwemmer and Ruth Ann Poppa [Jagd's mother], Don Zuker of McKinney, Texas, and majority stakeholder Vince Vaughn—an avid sportsman and pickleball enthusiast-had a vision, and we are so pleased to execute that vision. I want to congratulate our players and staff, specifically Coach Andy Banachowski and my day-to-day business partner, Danielle Lehman, for creating a top-notch organization built on sportsmanship, camaraderie and fun!"

Award-winning actor Vaughn, who became the majority owner of the Scorpions in July of 2024, gave the team a huge shoutout on their big win.

He said, "Congratulations to the Coachella Valley Scorpions on winning the 2025 NPL Pickleball Championship! Well played! Well done Kim Jagd on lights out coaching and playing. Big congrats to the entire league on an exciting and entertaining season. Onward."

The Scorpions were a perfect 3-0 in mixed doubles on Sunday as Jagd teamed with long-time mixed doubles partner, Scott Burr. Wendy Ochoa and Drew Slacum both won 2-0 matches while Natalie Hill and John Riedy won 2-1. In women's doubles, Sabrina Guillebeaux and Stacy Zelenski and Kara Williams/Hill each recorded 2-0 wins. In men's doubles, Marcin Rozpedski/Cord Robbins and Keith Jain/Riedy both won 2-0 matches.



Other Scorpion team members included injured players Brandi Zaslansky and David Katz. On Friday, the Scorpions defeated the Austin Ignite, 8-4, and in the Saturday semifinals, the Scorpions beat 2024 runner-up, Columbus Hotshots, 7-5.

The championships showcased highly driven athletes, such as Marcin Rozpedski and Scott Burr, who trained intensely for months along with owner Jagd. Jagd added, "Long time mixed partner Scott Burr and I put together one of our best performances in the finals vs. Seattle to secure the sixth point."

La Quinta resident Burr, one of the team's stars, is known for his experience and clutch performances. Though highly competitive, Burr values the camaraderie that comes with being part of a team.

"It's important to be supportive of your teammates, especially if they're struggling," Burr said. "It goes way beyond sports—it's really

Marcin Rozpedski, arguably the best player in the league, who is originally from Poland and owner of The Rozpedski Performance Academy for elite tennis instruction, is renowned for his impressive transition from professional tennis to top tier pickleball. He echoes Burr's sentiment that the journey is about more than just clinching the title.

Rozpedski said, "Losing a pickleball match is not a loss, it's a lesson." That said, he readily admits that it's not so much that he loves to win—it's that he can't stand losing.

Both men have high praise for their teammate Kim Jagd. "Everything Kim touches turns to gold," Rozpedski said. "She could sell ice to Eskimos. She's incredibly successful yet humble—as a business professional, a player, a general manager, a teammate, and a friend. I trust her completely."

Jagd, a former collegiate volleyball standout at UCLA, played on the 1984 NCAA National Championship team. She later competed on the Pro Beach Volleyball Tour (WPVA) for three years before transitioning into coaching—first at the University of Colorado, then back at UCLA for another 18 seasons before retiring.

The NPL features 12 teams from across the country. Rod Davis, NPL CEO, resides in the Coachella Valley, reinforcing the league's ties to the desert.


As for the team celebration upon nabbing the winning trophy? Jagd said, "We went to a Mercer Island restaurant called The Crawlspace Gastropub, where we shared a meal before we all flew home. We are currently planning a team and community celebration for January."

Incidentally, while basking in the glory of their conquest, the team members all sang, "We Are The Champions" in unison.

This months golf tip is feeling the golf swing from the ground (many call it groundforce or I call it footwork). The golf swing has many power sources, footwork is 1. In golf, we have many amazing feeling products to "measure" data and footwork (see my photo). See my photos of the downswing: footwork, weight transfer & leg work. I feel a huge power source is from the ground & footwork. Here is my golf tip for footwork & distance.





FOOTWORK golf positions to look or feel: (from the downswing)

- FOCUSING ON THE FEET TURNING TOWARD THE TARGET:
 - The BODY should feel like it is turning around the spine
 - Use as many body parts as you can
 - In the downswing, start with the: feet, knees, hips, chest, then arms, & then finally the hands
 - The feet plus weight shift / start pointing toward the target, the heals will stay on the ground
 - Feel like you are pushing off your back foot with weight transfer to the front of your swing

BEGINNER GOLFER FOOTWORK DRILL:

- Run in place for 30 seconds as fast as you can
- Pause / take a break then do 3 sets of 10
- Hit some golf balls (7 iron)



INTERMEDIATE – ADVANCED FOOTWORK DRILL:

- Work on your FEET speed
- Run in place 30 seconds as fast as you can
- Pause 30 secondsdo 5-10 sets of them
- Hit golf balls
- Do that for ½ hr to 1 hour various speed clubs (mid club driver)
- Sprints: on range, sprint to "something" (50-100 yards) sprint back
- · Repeat, then hit balls

I look forward to helping you adding distance with your golf game with solid feeling FOOTWORK. I feel this is a huge element to the PROPER FOOTWORK & DISTANCE in your game. I look forward to seeing you on the golf course or driving range. Happy Golf Feels!






Joe and Sue Funkey, owners of Giuseppe's Restaurant and Pizzeria, have a hard and fast rule: the food must be of the absolute highest quality. Besides creating an authentic Italian cultural and culinary adventure for patrons, the Funkeys prioritize top tier ingredients such as Wisconsin cheese, Stanislaus tomatoes and the freshest dough.

Joe Funkey said, "We aren't just trying to offer the best price; we insist on presenting a great quality meal."

The menu at Giuseppe's in Marriott's Shadow Ridge Vacation Club in Palm Desert is the same as the original, developed 18 years ago with the Original Giuseppes Pizza and Pasta in Cathedral City. 



he 2026 Bentley Continental GTC Hybrid marks a significant evolution in Bentley's grand-touring heritage, blending the opulence and craftsmanship of the marque with advanced electrified performance. Positioned as the convertible counterpart to the coupé version, it delivers open-air luxury without sacrificing the dynamic capability Bentley is known for. The model taps into the growing demand for high-performance hybrids, offering a compelling combination of power, refinement and everyday usability.

Under the skin, the Continental GTC Hybrid utilizes a sophisticated plug-in hybrid powertrain centered on a turbocharged 4.0-litre twin-turbo V8 engine mated to a high-output electric Performance figures underline motor. the car's capability. The 0-60 mph sprint is quoted in the mid-3-second bracket for the hybrid models: approximately 3.5 to 3.8 seconds, depending on specification. Top speed is similarly impressive, with the hardtop GT Speed variant quoted at 177 mph in hybrid guise. From a driving standpoint, the feel is said to remain unmistakably Bentley: the ride quality exhibits outstanding composure, even when the system is deployed for more aggressive driving. Bentley's Dynamic Ride electronic anti-roll system, all-wheel steering, and finely-tuned suspension hardware help balance the demands of high performance with grand touring comfort.

On the design front the Continental



GTC Hybrid carries the familiar flowing lines of the Continental family – yet incorporates fresh detailing to mark its new generation. The LED headlamp units have a sharper, more distinctive motif; at the rear, sleek oval tail-lamps and integrated twin tail-pipes (in the case of higher-output models) emphasize the car's dynamic credentials. With the roof down, the GTC brings an added dimension: refined opentop motoring. Bentley engineers have taken special care to ensure that cabin noise, structural rigidity and thermodynamic

control continue to meet the high bar expected of the marque, so the drop-top experience remains plush and composed.

Inside, the level of luxury is unique. The GTC Hybrid features a cabin deeply rooted in handcrafted materials: Nappa leather in multiple color-ways, open-pore wood veneers, hand-stitched leather, and optional build-to-order Mulliner bespoke finishes. In the Azure versions for 2026, the upmarket open-top models offer front seat massage with six settings, climate-controlled seats and augmented comfort kits as standard.

The infotainment is state-of-the-art, including seamless smartphone integration, high-definition displays and advanced driver-assistance technologies. Personalization remains a major pillar of the Bentley experience - exterior hues numbering into the dozens, bespoke interior materials and even custom accessories.

As for pricing, the early data points suggest the 2026 Continental GTC Hybrid will carry a starting MSRP roughly in the region of \$250,000 to \$370,000, depending on specification, options and regional differences. For example, listings for related 2026 Continental GTC models (non-hybrid V8 convertible) show prices around US\$321,670. Since Bentley's hybrid models invariably command a premium, one can anticipate that a well-specified GTC Hybrid may land toward the upper end of that range or beyond once options are added. In previous years, the 2025 Continental GTC

Speed plug-in hybrid started around US\$332,200 before options. that, a fully optioned 2026 GTC Hybrid could easily approach or exceed \$400,000. Ownership of a vehicle like this thus veers into ultra-luxury territory, not just by performance but also by exclusivity.

From an ownership perspective, the hybrid architecture introduces some interesting considerations. While the electric-only range reported (up to around 50 miles) is useful for commuting, urban driving or short trips, drivers should expect that real-world all-electric range may vary considerably depending on conditions, vehicle weight, ambient temperature and charging behavior. The hybrid system's complexity also means that service and maintenance are likely to require specialized Bentley expertise and may incur higher costs than conventional models. On the flip side, the presence of the electric drive offers quieter, smoother acceleration at low speeds, greater refinement, and improved efficiency for those who can plug in regularly.

In terms of usability, the GTC Hybrid still seats four, although like most grand tourers the rear seats are best suited for occasional use. The boot space in convertible form tends to be more restricted than the coup, particularly when the roof mechanism is deployed, so prospective buyers should consider how much open-top luggage capacity they require. For spirited driving or longer trips the all-wheel drive system and ample torque ensure the car remains composed and confident even in inclement conditions.

The 2026 Bentley Continental GTC Hybrid serves established clients seeking the very best in craftsmanship, refinement, exclusivity and speed — while also acknowledging the new era of electrification. For those able to command the price premium, and willing to live the luxury lifestyle, this car ticks nearly every box. It is perhaps the most complete open-top grand tourer available today.



Lindeberg performance polo or moisture-wicking skirt often falls in the \$120 to \$145 price range, appealing to the golfer who views the sport as an athletic pursuit and a style statement. From Italy, Chervò offers a vision of chic, technical luxury. Renowned for its "comfort-matic" technology, Chervò's apparel provides exceptional stretch, thermal insulation, and breathability. Their sleek trousers, which can cost over \$200, and sophisticated outerwear, often priced above \$250, are staples for those who demand high performance with a dose of continental flair.

The golf market has also seen the rise of specialized boutique brands catering to the most discerning clients. A. Putnam, for example, has quickly established itself as a pinnacle of luxury, focusing on timeless, multifunctional pieces crafted from premium materials. This is where golf wear truly becomes lifestyle apparel. With an emphasis on luxury knits and sophisticated silhouettes, A. Putnam's pieces carry a corresponding price tag: a V-neck polo can be \$165, a "C'est Tout Skort" is \$170, and a "Garden Dress" retails for \$255, reflecting its positioning as a true luxury brand.

Similarly, Amy Sport offers a boutique experience with its "course to cocktails" mentality, creating unique, artistic, and often colorful prints on its performance pieces. An AmySport golf dress typically costs around \$175, with its popular skorts priced at \$160, appealing to women seeking a look that stands out.

This evolution has also attracted crossover titans from the wider worlds of athleisure and high fashion. Lululemon has successfully translated its mastery of performance fabric and body-flattering cuts to the golf course. Its line of golf-specific polos and skorts, such as the popular Pace Rival or Stretch Twill Front Pleat Golf Skirt, offers a more accessible entry point into luxury, with many skorts priced around \$98 to \$118. Lululemon has proven that its cult-like following for yoga and running translates perfectly to the demand for comfort and movement in golf. At the absolute apex of luxury, one finds a brand that isn't a golf brand at all: St. John. For decades, the iconic St. John Santana knit jacket or cardigan has been the unofficial uniform for the "old money" set at the most exclusive clubs. While not a performance garment, wearing a St. John knit, with its signature gold buttons and multi-thousand-dollar price tag, is the ultimate statement of quiet, established luxury on the course.



In the realm of personal luxury, few items command the same blend of artistry, engineering, and mystique as a

high-end mechanical watch. These are not mere instruments for telling time; they are miniature engines powered by springs and gears, crafted by hand, and designed to last for generations. The world of haute horlogerie, or fine watchmaking, is dominated by a pantheon of Swiss manufacturers, each with a distinct philosophy. Among these titans, names like Rolex, Patek Philippe, Jaeger-LeCoultre, Piaget, and Hublot represent different facets of this magnificent obsession, offering legacies of precision that command prices ranging from the equivalent of a luxury car to that of a masterpiece painting.



No discussion of fine timepieces can begin without acknowledging **Rolex**. It is, quite simply, the most recognized luxury watch brand on Earth, a status built on a relentless pursuit of durability, reliability, and masterful marketing. Founded by Hans Wilsdorf, Rolex cemented its reputation not by creating the most complex mechanisms, but by perfecting the most practical ones. The 1926 Oyster case was the world's first truly waterproof wristwatch, and the 1931 Perpetual rotor perfected the self-winding movement. A steel **Rolex Submariner**, a tool watch designed for divers, is an icon of robust elegance that can be acquired for around \$10,000, though market demand often doubles that price. At the highest end, rare vintage models like the Cosmograph Daytona can achieve astronomical figures at auction, with certain references sold for well over one million dollars, proving that the Rolex legacy is as much about investment as it is about invention.

If Rolex is the crown of practical luxury, Patek Philippe is the divine right of watchmaking royalty. With a history stretching back to 1839, Patek Philippe operates at a different level of craftsmanship and exclusivity. The company, still family-owned, is said to employ over a thousand artisans just to create its relatively small annual output. Each watch is seen as an heirloom, famously marketed with the slogan, "You never actually own a Patek Philippe. You merely look after it for the next generation." This ethos is embodied in iconic lines like the Calatrava, a model of Bauhaus-inspired dress watch simplicity that starts around \$25,000. Their most sought-after model, the Nautilus, designed by Gérald Genta, has seen its price on the secondary market soar to over \$150,000 for a steel version that retailed for a fraction of that. For the brand's true masterpieces, the Grand Complications, prices are often unlisted, with unique pieces like the **Grandmaster Chime** selling for over \$30 million, making it one of the most expensive timepieces ever sold.

Where Patek Philippe represents the peak of finishing, Jaeger-**LeCoultre** is revered as the "watchmaker's watchmaker." For much of its history, JLC produced its innovative movements for other top-tier brands, including Patek Philippe and Audemars Piguet. The maison is a true innovator, with over a thousand unique calibers to its name. Its most iconic creation is the Reverso, born from a challenge by polo players in the 1930s who needed a watch that could withstand the rigors of their sport. The brilliant solution was a case that could be flipped over, protecting the crystal. Today, this Art Deco classic remains a cornerstone, with clever variations like the Duoface, which features a second time zone on its reverse side, starting around \$12,000. JLC's mastery, however, extends to highly complex astronomical complications and gyrotourbillons that can easily command prices well into the six-figure range, securing its reputation as a house of true technical genius.





Another master of a specific craft is **Piage**t. While many houses battled over complications, Piaget embarked on a quest for ultimate slimness. In 1957, it revolutionized the industry with the Caliber 9P, a manual-wind movement that was astonishingly thin. This was followed by the 12P, the world's thinnest automatic movement at the time. This pursuit culminated in the Altiplano collection, the quintessential ultra-thin dress watch. These timepieces are feats of micro-engineering, where the caseback itself is often used as the mainplate for the movement to shave off precious millimeters. The visual effect is one of impossible elegance, a watch that seems to melt onto the wrist. This specialized artistry comes at a significant price, with models in precious metals typically starting around \$20,000 and skeletonized or diamond-set versions climbing dramatically higher.
