Coral Mountain Desert Club: Reimagining bold golf and surf culture in La Quinta



An interview with
David McLay Kidd and Noah Hahn

"Improvisation is where good becomes exceptional!" - David McLay Kidd

"Coral Mountain will be the first new club and probably the last in the desert." - Noah Hahn



In a lilting Scottish burr, David McLay Kidd offers what may be the most succinct summary of his career: "That is my life—traveling." The renowned golf course architect is on the road several days a week, away from home base in Bend, Oregon, shuttling between projects like a director moving from set to set. He analogizes his design process to filmmaking: the routing is the screenplay, construction is the shoot, and the finished course is the final cut. Some scenes are shot exactly to script while many are improvised on location.

"Improvisation is where good becomes exceptional," he says. "My job is to guide the talent without overpowering it."

That creative ethos is now headed to La Quinta, California, where Kidd is working on Coral Mountain Desert Club, a new, highly private golf community for homeowner members that pairs worldclass golf with a nearby located surf club experience. It's a Southern California original for Kidd—an allnew build rather than a renovation—and a collaboration with Meriwether Companies and partner Michael Schwab.

Kidd's path to Coral Mountain loops back to Hawaii two decades ago. After finishing Bandon Dunes in Coos County, Oregon, he was invited to design Nanea Golf Club on the Big Island of Hawaii by

Chuck Schwab and George Roberts. It's where Kidd met Charles' son, Michael Schwab, now a partner with Meriwether Companies. Years later Michael reconnected with Kidd about the planned Coral Mountain project, locking in their own partnership.

Kidd said, "I want to do cool things with cool people, and you couldn't want for cooler folks than the Meriwether crew—and Michael."

Noah Hahn, managing partner at Meriwether Companies, says, "David – who's clearly one of the top five golf architects in the world – is not a traditionalist. Our whole ethos is to deliver something the desert hasn't seen—golf and surf, yes, but also a youthful, more open attitude," he explains. "There are 150 courses in the valley, many versions of the same thing. David builds true, linksstyle golf, and that's rare here."

Both men emphasize that Coral Mountain will embody barefoot luxury. Kidd explains, "We want it laidback—the exact opposite of uptight. While the club is private and membership will be tied to homeownership, the team's intention is an attitude that's welcoming, relaxed and human." Kidd nods to Nanea as his model for how a top-tier private club can still be gracious.

Hahn continues, "In Scotland, the pedestrians have the right of way. We'll have trails running through the property—bikes, hikers—and the attitude is: let the people go. We're all living here together."

Kidd relishes original works. Rolling Hills in Los Angeles and Rancho Santa Fe in San Diego may be notable recent SoCal efforts, but Coral Mountain will be, in his words, "a completely original build from a greenfield site in the desert." He credits Meriwether

with giving him neartotal creative runway. "If you hire Quentin Tarantino, you don't walk on set and tell him how to shoot the movie," he laughs. "They trust me to deviate from the script where it makes the art better."

Kidd is cleareyed about the pressure that comes with delivering on time and on budget – the accountability factor. "There's a moment where the rubber hits the road and reality bites—by 9 a.m. tomorrow we have to be good with it," he says. That tension—between art and execution—is, for him, essential fuel. And being in the same time zone as the site helps. He says, "I can grab Starbucks in Bend and land in Thermal in two and a half hours to do a few scenes before lunch," reinforcing the screenwriting analogy.

Though the golf is Kidd's canvas, the surf component broadens the lifestyle and stretches the season. The surf lagoon—the largest pneumatic wave basin in the country—located a few miles from the course in Thermal, California, will be engineered, controllable, and inclusive.

Hahn says, "We can make a sixfoot wave or a onefoot Waikiki wave. Anybody can learn—mom, dad, the kids—together." He calls it "democratized surf," devoid of sharks and shore break, where confidence builds session by session. Hahn points out that on a 95degree May afternoon, that's a sweet feature. He says, "Just like Cabo—you hop in the ocean. Here, you hop in the wave, similar to what we've developed at Cabo Real Surf Club in Los Cabos, Mexico."

According to Hahn, Coral Mountain is built on three pillars: 1) golf 2) surf and 3) fitness/recovery. As part of the third pillar, Hahn describes a toolkit of hydrotherapy, light therapy, compression

and mobility work, and potentially even hyperbaric chambers.

He continues, "We want members to perform at their best—however they define that." Expect purposebuilt pickleball and paddle, a skate park, a mountainbike pump track, movement studios, yoga decks tucked into the base of Coral Mountain, and a glamping zone. At low density tee times, kids will even get a window to play at a pop-up part-3.

Kidd's résumé hardly needs burnishing, as Bandon Dunes Golf Resort in Coos County, Oregon remains an eradefining debut. But at this point of his life and career, Kidd is realistic about focusing on what he can control and eliminating the noise. He says, "I've learned to breathe deeply and let go."

Ask for a favorite among his roughly three dozen courses and he dodges the "they're all my children" cliché, then tells a story. In 2018, he flew his father—a Scottish greenkeeper—to play every one of his courses across the lower 48 - on his own plane as he's a licensed pilot. They returned home, poured the whisky, and Kidd pressed

for a verdict. His dad chose Gamble Sands in Brewster, Washington by a razorthin margin for its stunning views, appealing surfaces and joyful golf. The point, Kidd says, is that golfers don't need to hate one to love another. "This isn't binary. You can love them all."

Coral Mountain aims to be a fresh cut with a family-forward and modern cast. Hahn believes the timing and the land are singular. Kidd is energized by the blank canvas.

And the coach still wants rings. "We're the Patriots with six Super Bowls already," Kidd tells his team of 18 designers. "You want to be happy with that—or do you want seven?"





The 2026 BNP Paribas Open at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden produced a pair of headline-grabbing champions and plenty of storylines beyond the results: a hard-fought women's final that saw World No. 1 Aryna Sabalenka finally claim the elusive Indian Wells crown, a taut men's final won by Jannik Sinner, an engagement announcement that added a personal fairy tale to the tournament week, and the continued commercial growth of an event that has repeatedly broken attendance records in recent seasons. The two-week, combined ATP/WTA event — played in the Southern California desert at the world class Indian Wells Tennis Garden — again underlined why the BNP Paribas Open is commonly spoken of as tennis' unofficial "fifth Grand Slam."

Aryna Sabalenka capped a dramatic title run by outlasting Elena Rybakina

On the women's side, Aryna Sabalenka capped a dramatic title run by outlasting Elena Rybakina in a classic final. Sabalenka dropped the opening set but bounced back to take the second and then prevailed in a tense third-set tiebreak to secure the WTA 1000 crown in Indian Wells, a victory that carried real narrative weight after previous heartbreaks in big finals. The match's scoreline and the swings of momentum reflected the rivalry between two of the tour's most powerful hitters; for Sabalenka, the win represented both tactical resilience and a mental breakthrough on one of the biggest stages outside the slams. Sabalenka's off-court life added another layer to the story: she confirmed her engagement to businessman Georgios Frangulis on March 3, 2026, posting video and images from the proposal on social media in the days just before the event — a moment that went viral among fans and fellow players and became part of the tournament's wider human-interest narrative.

The men's final produced a different sort of drama: Jannik Sinner emerged as champion after a tightly contested match against Daniil Medvedev, with both sets decided in tiebreaks. Sinner's straight sets victory — remarkable for the razor-edge intensity of each set — underscored his capacity to deliver in pressure moments and to close out matches at the highest level. For Sinner, the Indian Wells title was another significant milestone in a season


that has increasingly seen him convert high-level opportunities into big trophies; for Medvedev it was another fine run at a marquee Masters 1000 event. The tactical chess between Sinner's penetrating baseline aggression and Medvedev's counterpunching made for a high-quality, edge-of-your-seat final that kept the desert crowd fully engaged.

Beyond the winners and the on-court drama, Indian Wells continues to be a festival of tennis with scale and commercial clout that few non slam events can match. The tournament's recent attendance trajectory shows how it has become a destination not only for players but also for mass audiences: the BNP Paribas Open organization reports that the event drew a record total attendance of 527,626 this year eclipsing 504,268 spectators in 2024, the first time the tournament surpassed the half million mark. That 2025 figure eclipsed the then recent high set in 2024 and cemented the event's place as the largest combined ATP/WTA tournament by crowd numbers each year. The sheer number of fans, spread across Stadium 1, Stadium 2, the practice

courts and the event's fan areas, contributes to a weeklong atmosphere that many players and commentators regularly praise.

Single day crowd milestones have also been notable: organizers and press reports documented a single day attendance record early in the post pandemic comeback when more than 60,721 fans visited the grounds on a single Saturday — an affirmation of the event's popularity on marquee days when sessions feature top names and evening entertainment activations. That capacity for jaw dropping single day turnouts has been a logistical challenge and a commercial opportunity for the tournament, shaping everything from hospitality packages to on site retail and sponsor activations.

Sponsorship and partnerships are integral to the Indian Wells experience, and the 2026 field of partners reflected both continuity and new strategic additions. BNP Paribas remains the title sponsor and the anchor partner of the tournament; the organizers' partnership pages and industry reporting also noted an expanded roster that included new or returning partners across categories — from apparel and retail co branding with lululemon to food and beverage alignments such as FAGE as an official yogurt partner, and tournament operational

suppliers and activations from brands like Dunlop (official ball), Yonex (stringing service), Silversea (official cruise partner) and others. Commercially, those relationships have allowed Indian Wells to broaden its on site fan experiences — everything from branded retail pop ups and hospitality suites to themed culinary offerings — while giving sponsors a high visibility platform at one of the sport's crown jewel events.

For tournament organizers, the challenge remains how to preserve the unique "Tennis Paradise" vibe while scaling operations to meet record crowds; for players, Indian Wells remains one of the most meaningful non Grand Slam titles to win because of the tournament's size, the quality of the field and its place in the tour calendar. The 2026 champions left the desert with trophies and headlines, and the event itself continued to broaden its commercial footprint and cultural resonance — from sold out premium hospitality experiences to headline grabbing moments that went well beyond all expectations.



Annual Stater Bros. Heroes Challenge Brings All Star Honor to the Desert

Once again the Stater Bros. Charities Jack H. Brown Heroes Challenge Golf Tournament concluded with a record breaking fundraiser, an emotional honorees ceremony, and exciting golf. Presented by PepsiCo, and named after Stater Bros. late Executive Chairman, Jack H. Brown, this 19th annual event raised over 1.2 million dollars for Stater Bros. Charities that supports critical needs in the communities where Stater Bros. teammates live and work. In fact, since 2008, Stater Bros. Charities has invested over \$54 million in countless local organizations and causes that benefit hunger relief, children's well-being, education, health, veterans and active service members, and pet well-being.

Held in Indian Wells, California at the Renaissance Esmeralda Resort & Spa and the Indian Wells Golf Resort, the Challenge hosted 370 sponsors and special guests. Keeping with Brown's legacy as a proud Navy Veteran who served on active duty with the Pacific Fleet of the United States Navy during the Vietnam War era, the event hosted six Congressional Medal of Honor recipients and six Navy SEALs.

The Challenge kicked-off Sunday evening with the evening dress attire Heroes Challenge Charity Awards Banquet held at the Renaissance Esmeralda Resort & Spa. During the evenings event the Stater Bros. Charities awarded \$250,000 to local non-profit organizations that are making a positive impact through their communities in Southern California. These organizations

included U.S. Vets Inland Empire, RAD Camp, Palm Springs Air Museum, Fisher House Southern California and SEAL Legacy Foundation and were each awarded \$50,000.

Sunday evening festivities also brought reality and the events mission to life with the introduction of the attending Congressional Medal of Honor recipients. Bestowed upon individuals serving in the Armed Services of the United States, this is the highest award for valor in action against an enemy force. Those honored were Kenneth J. David, Robert M. Patterson, James A. Taylor, Jay R. Vargas, Salvatore A. Giunta and Leroy A. Petry.

As the sun rose on a beautiful Monday morning in the desert, it was time for golf at the spectacular Indian Wells Golf Resort, home to two world-class golf courses. Stater Bros. teammates and the event's generous corporate sponsors were excited and honored to rub elbows with professional golfers and American armed forces heroes while doing good for the community.

Hosting the day of golf was none other than former U.S. Ryder Cup Captain Dave Stockton. The impressive roster of golf professionals participating included World Golf Hall of Famer Donna Caponi-Byrnes, winner of three U.S. Opens Hale Irwin, Women's U.S. Open Champion Brittany Lang, PGA TOUR winner Mark Pfeil, PGA TOUR veteran Dave Stockton Jr., Coach to several tour players Ron Stockton, PGA Tour player Jin Park and professional trick shot artist Dan Boever. After breakfast golfers converged on the driving range where they were treated to a once in a lifetime golf clinic with these accomplished professionals. With a lot of ou's and ah's, players of all skill levels witnessed the smooth swing of the pro's, one on one advice they'll never forget and witnessed trick shots that they'll think about for a long time.

Filled with excitement and new found knowledge, golfers set out on both courses, the Players and Celebrity, for a day of great shots, laughter, competition and a few shots they hope to never repeat again or are lucky enough to brag about to their friends.

As the tournament came to an end it was time for a well-deserved reception featuring a bar-b-que dinner and awards ceremony. The consensus being that no matter what happened on the course, everyone was a winner!

With event dates set for next year, the event is produced by La Quinta resident and former American Express Executive Director Jeff Sanders and his team at Jeff Sanders Entertainment.

Known in the golf event business nationally for breaking records for charity, Jeff has directed over 200 golf events that have raised over \$175 Million for charity over his years in the industry with events that includes PGA Tour golf tournaments, multi-night concert series and corporate and charity golf outings.



Ensuring that the Legacy of 9/11 and
the heroism is never forgotten

It was an idyllic day on the renowned Arnold Palmer Course at Mission Hills Country Club in Rancho Mirage, California, when 125 fiercely loyal golfers, in addition to other enthusiastic supporters, turned out to raise funds for the Tunnel to Towers Foundation. This 3rd Annual Celebrity Golf Classic coincides with the 25th Anniversary of September 11th, reminding us of the 9/11 tragedy at the World Trade Center Twin Towers in New York. This sold out golf tournament was hosted by former Los Angeles Angels first baseman and fan favorite, Wally Joyner, and chaired by Irv Zakheim.

The glorious day on the links began with a continental breakfast at 9:00 a.m., followed by a Shotgun Start at 11:00 a.m. Post-tournament festivities commenced at 4:00 p.m. with a fun buffet reception that included a raffle, live auction, and Golf Awards ceremony.

The City of Rancho Mirage was this year's Title Sponsor of the tournament. Rancho Mirage Mayor, Lynn Malotto, thanked all golfers and supporters "for spending your day, not just on the golf course, but in service to a cause that truly matters. Today was about more than fairways and scoreboards -- it was about honoring sacrifice and standing behind the heroes who protect our freedoms. Your participation turns remembrance into real tangible support for families who needed it most."

The Tunnel to Towers Foundation, formed in the aftermath of the 9/11 attack on the World Trade Center Twin Towers in New York, is nearing its 25th anniversary. The organization provides assistance and services to injured Veterans and First Responders plus Gold Star and Fallen First Responder families with young children. Some of their programs include paying off mortgages of the families of fallen veterans or first responders. In its nearly 25 years, the Foundation has raised more than \$1 billion and assisted 17,500 veterans with housing and wraparound services they desperately need. This year, in honor of the 343 members of the Fire Department of New York who made the ultimate sacrifice on 9/11, the Foundation is

delivering 343 mortgage-free homes to Gold Star families, to Fallen First Responder families, and to catastrophically injured veterans and first responders, who will receive homes specially equipped to allow them to reclaim their day-to-day independence.

The Foundation was started by the family of FDNY Firefighter Stephen Gerard Siller, who had just gotten off duty on September 11, 2001, when he heard on his scanner about an airplane hitting the World Trade Center. He turned around but found the Brooklyn Battery Tunnel closed to traffic for security reasons, so he put on 60 pounds of gear and raced on foot through the tunnel to the Twin Towers, where he perished while saving others.

"This is the best Foundation in the country and is 25 years strong," said Joyner. "Ninety-four cents of every dollar raised goes directly to the bottom line. This Foundation does what it says, and they deliver for a great cause. I cannot think of a better purpose."

Tunnel to Towers Foundation Board Member Jack Oehm, a retired FDNY Battalion Commander, thanked Joyner and said, "We are the luckiest people in the whole world because we get to be part of this amazing Foundation. You all donate your time, talent and treasure, and you are changing lives every day. Our Foundation, simply put, takes care of the people who take care of us."

Starting in May and culminating in September, the Foundation will undertake an unprecedented national campaign to mark the 25th Anniversary year of the 9/11 attack: "Steel Across America" will transport an authentic 20-foot steel beam from the World Trade Center to communities across the U.S. This powerful symbol of reverence and resilience will visit landmarks, sporting events and town squares across America, creating moments of connection for those who lived through that traumatic time, and educational opportunities for those too young to remember. It will be more than a remembrance -- it will be a bridge between generations and a reminder that the spirit of service embodied by Stephen Siller and so many others 25 years ago continues to inspire Americans today.

"Together, we can ensure that as we mark 25 years since that tragic day, we do so by continuing the mission of service, sacrifice, and support for those who protect and defend us," said Joyner.

Local media personalities Patrick Evans and John White of KESQ News Channel 3 will once again ratchet up the excitement, connecting with attendees and energizing the field. 

GolfInstruction: Release

This month's golf tip is **RELEASING THE CLUB or BODY**. In these golf photos, I feel there is 2 (two) different kind of releases, **BODY RELEASE & WRIST RELEASE**. Hopefully you can feel the difference which feel vast. A proper **RELEASE** will create power, speed, distance & accuracy.



WRIST RELEASE:

- You will need: ping pong paddles, golf club, & then golf balls (practice at a range or mirror)
- DRILL: grab your ping pong paddles, feet apart, & get in a set up position (or you can do it in a chair)
- RELEASE: practice your right hand going over your left (notice your right hand physically crossing over your left) see the photos



BODY RELEASE:

- You will need: PW, 7 iron, & then golf balls (practice at a range or mirror)
- DRILL: 30 motions, body, club & everything facing the target
- RELEASE: the body only, if you can. . . hips, knees, feet, the club stay matching your spine (approx 2 pm . . . not straight up – see photos)

I look forward to helping you adding **RELEASE** to your golf game. I feel this is a huge element to your: power, speed, distance & accuracy. I look forward to seeing you on the golf course or driving range. Happy Golf Feels!



Charissa Farley's Love Letter to Dining
in the Coachella Valley

When builder turned restaurateur Charissa Farley opened Wildest Restaurant + Bar in Palm Desert, she had no idea her grand opening would collide with a global shutdown. "You don't know what you don't know when you open a restaurant," she says with a laugh. What followed was a test of resilience and reinvention that ultimately shaped Wildest into one of the Coachella Valley's most distinctive dining rooms—ingredient driven, design forward, and unmistakably hospitable.

Farley, a self-described food and wine "groupie," once chose construction projects based on the local culinary scene. Wildest reflects that passion. Its name nods to her playful design sensibility, and the refreshed entry bar—velvet, bows, and a speakeasy wink—sets the tone. After studying how luxury resorts encourage great

conversation, she challenged her designer to "soften the sound and make it lush."

That intimate bar flows into a dining room animated by caricatures, regulars, and accolades from sources like Wine Spectator and Open Table. A new pergolaframed patio seats 40 and transforms into a private dining salon during cooler months, complete with drapes and a fireplace. Farley even incorporated pavers reminiscent of her construction days, subtly weaving her past into the restaurant's future.

Next door, she's creating a petite market from her catering space, offering freshbaked bread and desserts, charcuterie, champagne, caviar, and European "hiddengem" bottles sourced by manager sommelier Farouk Chaabi. The market's aesthetic will be deeply

personal—built around vintage cookbooks inherited from her family and curated collections of silver, copper, china, and midcentury kitchen tools.

In the kitchen, Executive Chef and partner Trilby Tatro translates Farley's creative ideas into dishes designed for 200 diners. Standout menu favorites include the New Zealand venison rack with blackberry bordelaise, Santa Barbara uni pasta, and Texas quail. Comfort classics—scallops, short ribs, prime filet, and crispyskin barramundi—round out the offerings. The kitchen also maintains a robust allergen sensitive throughline, with plantbased, glutenfree, nutfree, and dairy free options crafted with intention, not compromise.

The wine program balances celebration and accessibility, with trophy bottles alongside affordable European finds. Monthly wine dinners are a hit, and the playful happy hour features items like truffle Gruyère grilled cheese with tomato soup, trumpet mushroom "calamari," and delicate squash blossoms. The bar is expanding with Martini Mondays, Whiskey Wednesdays, and desserts enriched with Coachella Valley datewhiskey sauce. And, a brunch is coming soon, teased only by two words: whiskey French toast.

For Farley, hospitality is the true signature. "You're in my living room," she says—and on busy nights, she proves it by pouring champagne for guests waiting outside.

At Wildest, the first impression is only the beginning.
