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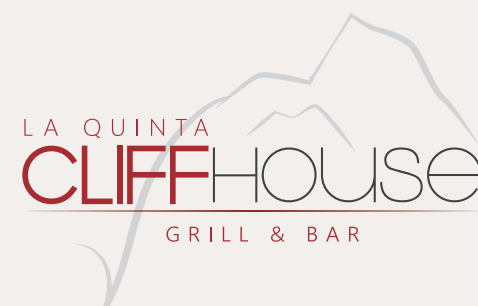

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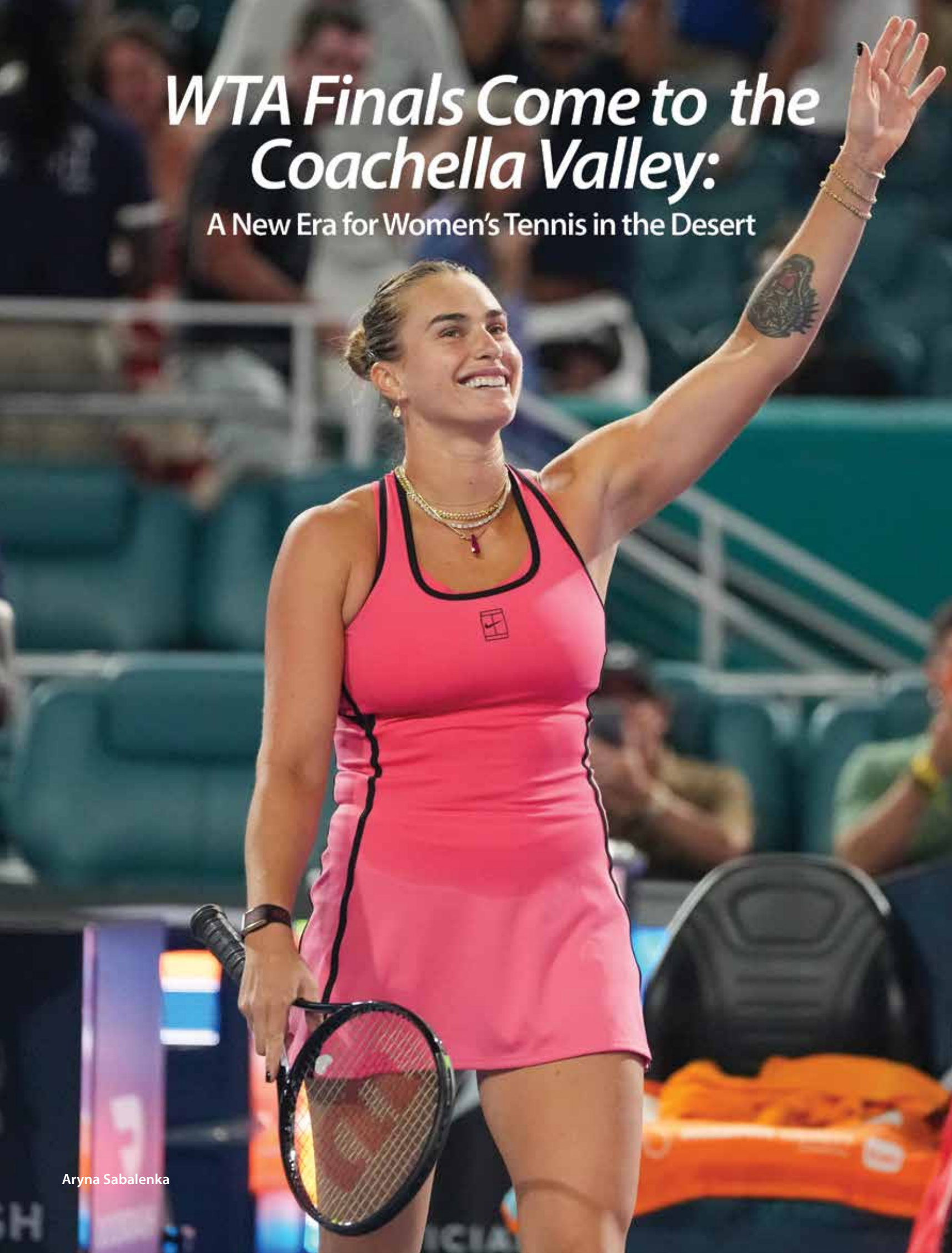
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WTA Finals Come to the Coachella Valley:

A New Era for Women's Tennis in the Desert

This November, the eyes of the tennis world will turn toward the Coachella Valley as the most prestigious championship in women's professional tennis makes its historic debut at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden. The 2026 WTA Finals will be held November 8 through 15, 2026, bringing the top eight singles players and top eight doubles teams on the WTA Tour to Southern California for an extraordinary week of championship tennis.

For the Coachella Valley, this is far more than another tennis tournament. The WTA Finals represent the culmination of the entire women's professional tennis season, and for the first time, the season-ending championship will be contested at the famed Indian Wells Tennis Garden. The event will combine the world's best female athletes with one of the most celebrated tennis destinations on earth, creating what promises to be an unforgettable November in the desert.

The tournament arrives in Indian Wells after an unexpected change in plans. The WTA Finals had been scheduled to remain in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, through 2026 under a three-year agreement between the WTA and the Saudi Tennis Federation. The first two editions were held in Riyadh in 2024 and 2025, but in July 2026 the WTA and Saudi Tennis Federation mutually agreed to end the hosting arrangement one year early. The WTA requested that the 2026 Finals move to a new location, and Indian Wells was selected as the replacement host.

The decision instantly transformed the final chapter of the 2026 tennis season. Instead of ending the year in Saudi Arabia, the world's leading women will finish their season under the palm trees and clear blue skies of the Coachella Valley. The move also gives American tennis fans an opportunity to see the world's elite women competing for the Billie Jean King Trophy on one of the sport's most famous courts.

The field will not be determined until the conclusion of the season, because qualification is based upon the PIF WTA Race to the Finals. The top seven players in the race qualify automatically, while the eighth position can be awarded to the highest-ranked Grand Slam champion who falls within the qualifying range. Eight singles players and eight doubles teams will compete, with singles play beginning in two round-robin groups before advancing to the semifinals and championship match.

Even though the final field is still being determined as of this writing, the potential lineup is spectacular. Elena Rybakina enters the

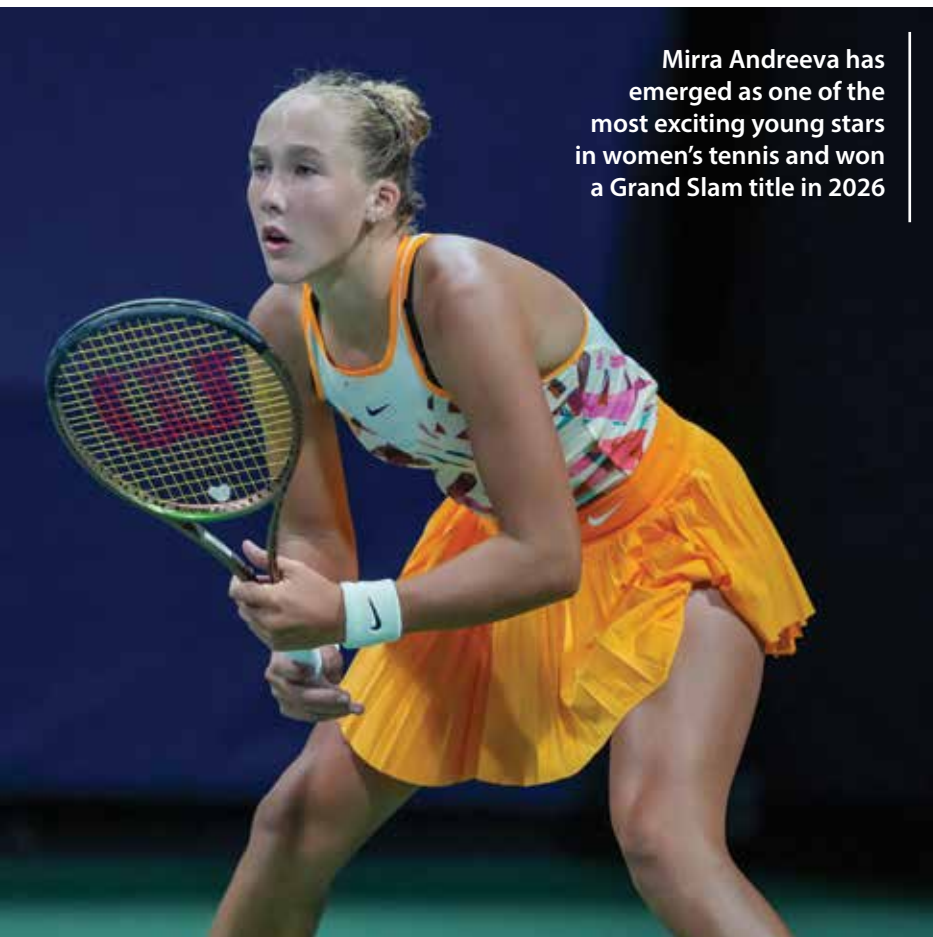

autumn as one of the leading contenders. The powerful Kazakh star won the 2025 WTA Finals in Riyadh and captured the 2026 Australian Open before taking over the No. 1 position in the PIF Race to the WTA Finals. As of the latest WTA race standings, Rybakina leads the way, followed closely by Aryna Sabalenka and Mirra Andreeva.

Sabalenka is another enormous attraction. The hard-hitting Belarusian has established herself as one of the dominant forces in women's tennis and has been at or near the top of the world rankings for several seasons. Her 2026 season included titles at Indian Wells and Miami, making her only the fifth woman to complete the prestigious Sunshine Double. She will be one of the favorites whenever she steps onto Stadium 1 in November.

American fans will have plenty of reason to be excited as well. Coco Gauff remains one of the biggest names in women's tennis and one of the most popular young American athletes in the world. Jessica Pegula is another major American contender who has consistently performed at the highest level. Both players have been in the hunt for qualification throughout the 2026 season. Gauff's presence would be particularly meaningful in Indian Wells, where an American superstar playing in a season-ending championship could generate tremendous enthusiasm among Southern California tennis fans.

Another name to watch is Iga Swiatek. The Polish superstar has become a fixture at the WTA Finals and has qualified for the event in each of the previous five seasons. Although she was outside the automatic qualification

positions earlier in the summer, her victory in Toronto moved her closer to the top eight. With the final portion of the season still to be played, Swiatek remains a major threat to qualify.

Mirra Andreeva is another fascinating player. Still just 19, Andreeva has already emerged as one of the most exciting young stars in women's tennis and won a Grand Slam title in 2026. Her rise has been rapid, and a WTA Finals appearance in Indian Wells would give fans the opportunity to watch one of the sport's future superstars competing against established champions.

The attraction of the WTA Finals, however, goes far beyond the players. It is also a remarkable story about the transformation of the Indian Wells Tennis Garden and the vision of Larry Ellison.

Ellison, the technology entrepreneur and passionate tennis enthusiast, purchased the Indian Wells tournament and facility in 2009 and embarked on an enormous effort to transform it into a world-class tennis destination. His investment helped create the modern Indian Wells Tennis Garden, which today is widely regarded as one of the finest tennis facilities anywhere. The annual BNP Paribas Open has repeatedly been recognized by players as one of their favorite tournaments, while the facility has earned the nickname "Tennis Paradise."

Ellison's commitment to tennis in the Coachella Valley has been extraordinary. His vision has been about much more than simply staging a successful tournament. It has been about building an environment where players, fans, sponsors and

the community can experience professional tennis at the highest possible level. Stadiums, practice courts, restaurants, hospitality facilities and surrounding amenities have helped transform the property into a destination capable of hosting the biggest names in the sport.

The results speak for themselves. The 2025 BNP Paribas Open attracted a record 504,268 fans over two weeks, surpassing the previous attendance record of 493,440 set in 2024.

That history makes Indian Wells a natural home for the WTA Finals. The facility already knows how to handle enormous crowds and international media attention, and the community has developed a deep appreciation for women's tennis through the annual BNP

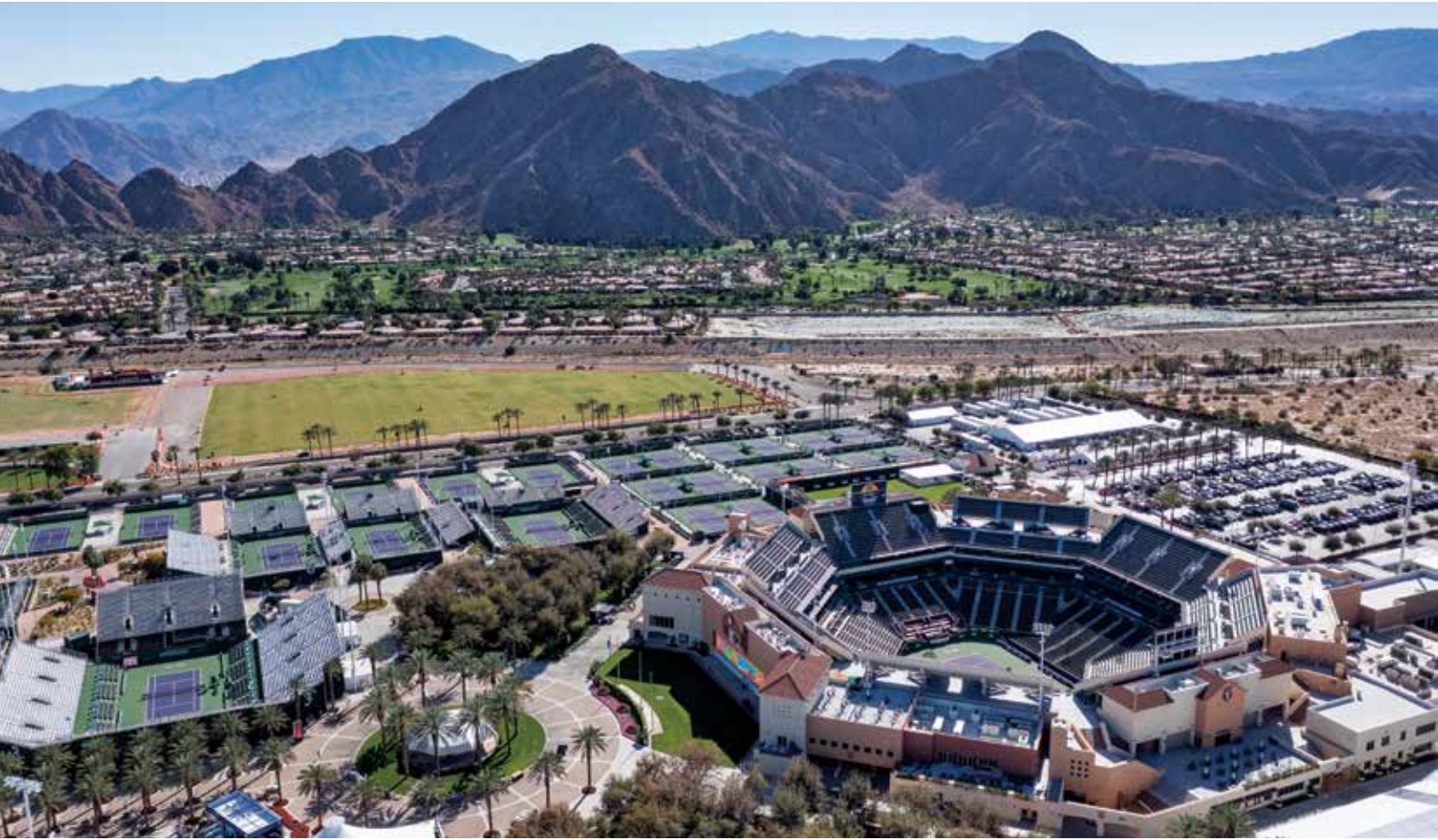
Paribas Open. Now the desert gets the opportunity to host the most important women's championship of the entire year.

The WTA also arrives with an impressive collection of global commercial partners. Beginning in 2026, Mercedes-Benz became the WTA's Premier Partner and Exclusive Automobile Partner, creating the new branding of the "WTA Tour Driven by Mercedes-Benz." The WTA also counts PIF, Rolex, Morgan Stanley, Verizon, Accenture, Corpay, Usana and Wilson among its global partners, regional partners and suppliers.

Rolex has a particularly strong connection to the WTA Finals, serving as the official timekeeper and timepiece of the season-ending championship since 2011. The luxury watch company expanded its relationship with the WTA in 2025 by becoming a year-round global partner.

For the Coachella Valley, the arrival of these international brands is another indication of the significance of the event. The WTA Finals will bring television production, international media, corporate hospitality, sponsors, tennis professionals and fans from around the world into the desert at a time of year when the region is traditionally attracting visitors seeking beautiful weather and world-class entertainment.

How many people will attend? No official final attendance projection has been announced, so it would be premature to claim a specific number. But the potential is enormous. The Indian Wells Tennis Garden has demonstrated its ability to attract more than half a million visitors during the two-week BNP Paribas Open. The WTA Finals will be a different event, with only eight singles players and eight doubles teams competing, but it will offer eight days of championship tennis and a concentrated schedule featuring the biggest stars in the women's game. The facility's previous attendance records suggest that substantial crowds should be expected.



And then there is the setting itself.

There are few places in professional tennis quite like Indian Wells in November. The mountains rise dramatically beyond the courts, palm trees surround the grounds and the desert's warm daytime temperatures provide a spectacular backdrop for tennis. Evening temperatures can become cooler, creating an entirely different atmosphere from the heat of the summer tennis season. The combination of natural beauty and world-class facilities is one reason players have consistently ranked Indian Wells among the sport's premier destinations.

The 2026 WTA Finals therefore represent a remarkable homecoming of sorts for elite women's tennis in the United States and a major milestone for the Coachella Valley. The event has traveled from Riyadh to Indian Wells, but the significance of its arrival goes far beyond the change of scenery.

It represents an endorsement of the Indian Wells Tennis Garden, the Coachella Valley and the extraordinary vision that Larry Ellison has invested in the desert. It brings together the WTA's most powerful global sponsors, the world's greatest female tennis players and an audience that has demonstrated again and again its passion for the sport.

From November 8 through November 15, the desert will become the center of the tennis universe. The championship will crown the best women's player of the 2026 season, but it will also showcase something equally important: the Coachella Valley has become a legitimate home for the biggest events in world tennis.

And for anyone who loves tennis, watching the world's best women battle for the final championship of the year beneath the mountains and palm trees of Indian Wells promises to be a spectacular way to finish the 2026 season. ■ **Written by DG&T Staff**

Dressed in pickleball attire and braving the 116 July desert temperatures, hundreds of fans converged upon Agua Caliente Casino in Rancho Mirage to celebrate the Coachella Valley Scorpions (CVS) winning season, enjoy a VIP on-court fan experience and cheer on the Scorpions during an exciting game against the LAXtreme.

Organizer, CVS Co-Owner and national title winner herself Kim Jagd says, “Today’s event is about congratulating the Scorpions for

their 2025 championship win, sharing our trophy with the fans, introducing the 2026 roster and offering a great pickleball exhibition for the crowd.”

Transforming the concert venue into a pickleball stadium and with Scorpion team members in place, balls started to fly. Professionals offered VIP fans and players of all levels tips and hands on learning demos where attendees actually played with the pros as they rotated through three different “Dink with a Pro” stations. From serving to



hitting the target for prizes, fans with armloads of swag then moved from the courts to the stadium seating to watch the professions in non-stop court action.

On hand and with his own dream of playing on a professional team was NFL Hall of Famer Terrell Owens. As an ambassador to the sport, Owens started playing pickleball about 19 months ago and has already elevated his game to a professional level. When asked, Owens is eager to explain.

“Where I grew up in Alabama there wasn’t much pickleball. Several years ago my friends started playing and finally convinced me to give it a try.” It didn’t take long for Owens to get hooked on the sport and now trains with a coach in Los Angeles and is a potentially viable member of a professional team in the Major League Pickleball Champions Series.

Jagd smiled when asked about Owens, “Terrell is an extraordinarily talented athlete and has trained hard to reach this level. When I asked him to participate he was excited about the chance to show off his skills.”

It’s hard to imagine the meteoric rise of pickleball, now considered a sport for all ages. For Co-owners Kim Jagd, General Manager and star player, and Rob Zwemmer, an award-winning real estate agent, realizing their vision of assembling a pro pickleball team, for national-level MLP Champion Series competition is more than just a love of the sport, it’s about the Coachella Valley Scorpions carrying out their goal of engaging the community and raising awareness of this fast-growing and popular recreational sport.

The dream of achieving their mission statement of building a pickleball community with its own team in the Coachella Valley Scorpions is now a championship reality. The team’s commitment to elevating the passion for the sport across generations in the Coachella Valley is front and center; it’s about uniting youth, families, and seniors through spirited play, fostering camaraderie, and hosting camps, clinics and special events.

As fans cheered and matches were won at the Showdown, the CVS goal of establishing a location with indoor/outdoor courts for



organized after school pickleball games, developing a junior team (Coachella Valley Junior Scorpions) and competitions with peer teams across the country seems well on its way.

Perhaps the time is now for you to pick up a paddle and join the fun. Who knows, you might end up a team member of the Coachella Valley Scorpions!

Bettinardi Golf

How One Man and a Milling Machine Revolutionized Golf



What do Fred Couples, Matt Fitzpatrick, Lexi Thompson and Collin Morikawa have in common? They have all won using Bettinardi putters. Include the likes of Sir Nick Faldo, President Donald J. Trump and notable athletes from football to baseball that also use Bettinardi putters, making it safe to say that Robert Bettinardi's unique idea of "one piece technology" is a success!

Raised in a household of six children in Evergreen Park, Illinois, golf was of little interest to Bettinardi while growing up. Around 22 his father Donald, a golfer himself, talked Bettinardi into going with him and trying the game. "I remember I could barely hit the ball, and then I hit a couple of shots where the ball went really far, I think 250 yards. It was like, oh my gosh, I want to do that the next shot and the next shot. Then of course you learn golf isn't like that," Bettinardi says with a laugh.

While growing up what was of interest to Bettinardi was the family business of engineering. Donson, a precision machining company founded by his late father Donald and continues to be owned and operated by the family. Intrigued by the process of creating with metals and overall management, influenced Bettinardi to attend the prestigious Milwaukee School of Engineering (MSOE) earning a degree focused on industrial management.

For six years after graduating he worked under his father in the manufacturing business before starting his own ventures. Those ventures included the very successful X-Cel Technologies, which he still owns today, that manufactures machined parts for a variety of industries, including transportation, heavy industry, pneumatic/hydraulic manifolds, electrical/mechanical housings, and GPS aviation. All of this and his newfound interest in golf led to Bettinardi putters, or in engineering lingo, golf putter machining.

During the first two years of golfing Bettinardi says he was definitely more interested in the game and playing better. "I didn't start getting serious about equipment until after a few years of playing, and then I'd look at equipment every time I'd go into the pro shop. In fact my first set of new clubs was Ben Hogan irons in a box! No one gets box iron sets anymore it's all fitted. I was driving home and I opened up the box and it was like Christmas, I'll never forget it."

Interestingly enough it was another trip to the pro shop that changed everything. "I walked into a pro shop" explains Bettinardi, "and these guys were talking about milling putters, meaning like a milling machine, it got my attention. Remember I have these high tech machines and know how to work with metals. I thought about it for a while and then I called some people in San Diego because that's where most of the golf clubs are made, and asked around to see if there was an interest in a putter milled from a single piece of steel with no heat required, and that's how I got started."

Because of Bettinardi's background in engineering and metal, it didn't take long for him to figure out how to do it, "people were flabbergasted, it turned out to revolutionize the golf industry," and at one point, even Tiger Woods used his radical "one-piece technology" putters.

When researching Bettinardi, in the beginning the family name was not on the product, Bettinardi gives a little chuckle when asked. "I started out working with a company called Titleist, with a gentleman named Scotty Cameron, we became good friends. At the end of the day I knew I wanted to get to the point where it was my company making them and that took about seven or eight years, and the rest is history." That history began in 1998 when within one month of marketing his own line Jesper Parnevik won a PGA Tour event with a Bettinardi putter.



Today Bettinardi is an eight handicap, and is passionate about the game, belonging to four or five country clubs including one of his favorites Calusa Pines in Naples, Florida. He's also a member at Rich Harvest Farms and Flossmoor Golf Club (founded in 1899) in Illinois plus a few local clubs, "I play as much as I can," he admits.

Bettinardi and his wife Ann have three adult children, two daughters and a son. When asked what hobbies he has that might surprise people he quickly answers "fishing. My wife and I love to fish, and we love to travel."

While talking with Bettinardi one can still feel the passion for business, but is the drive still there to create? Without hesitation he replies, "All day long, I'm constantly working with my team of graphic designers and engineers designing the newest, latest & greatest. Right now my son Sam and I are working on how to design a golf club, there's more to it than people think. What do golfers want,

and what works, we've been working on it for a few years and we're getting close."

Based in Tinley Park, Illinois, to date the company has morphed into Bettinardi Golf, creating everything from head covers, to wedges, clothing, golf clubs and of course putters, but you can't talk about Bettinardi Golf with talking about Sam or Sammy affectionately called by his father.

Growing up Sam admits to living, breathing and loving golf, but also showed an interest in the family golf business around nine years old. In 2013, Sam joined the company after graduating from DePaul University with a degree in business management. In 2022, Sam became president of Bettinardi Golf and serves in that role today. What was the first thing that Sam brought to the company that his father hadn't paid much attention to, "One of Sammy's major ideas was social media. Back then it was just starting out, Sammy covered all. He's done a tremendous job in marketing the company," states Bettinardi with pride in his voice. In fact "He had the idea of collaborating with the sports world and even Hasbro that owns Monopoly, which is the number one game in the world. He loved the game as a child and played it all of the time with his sisters. My son has grown the business double digits every year he has been here."

Robert Bettinardi's life is a full and rewarding one, he is a man on the go with an eagerness to design and create, while living life to the fullest. When asked to describe his life in one sentence, his reply came quickly and with earnest. "I'm going to say something outside of golf, I'm a Christian, so I'm a big believer in Jesus, and I'm trying to live a life that is pleasing to him. It's not easy; there are a lot of temptations and all of this stupid stuff that comes after you. But by living this life my family is well taken care of."

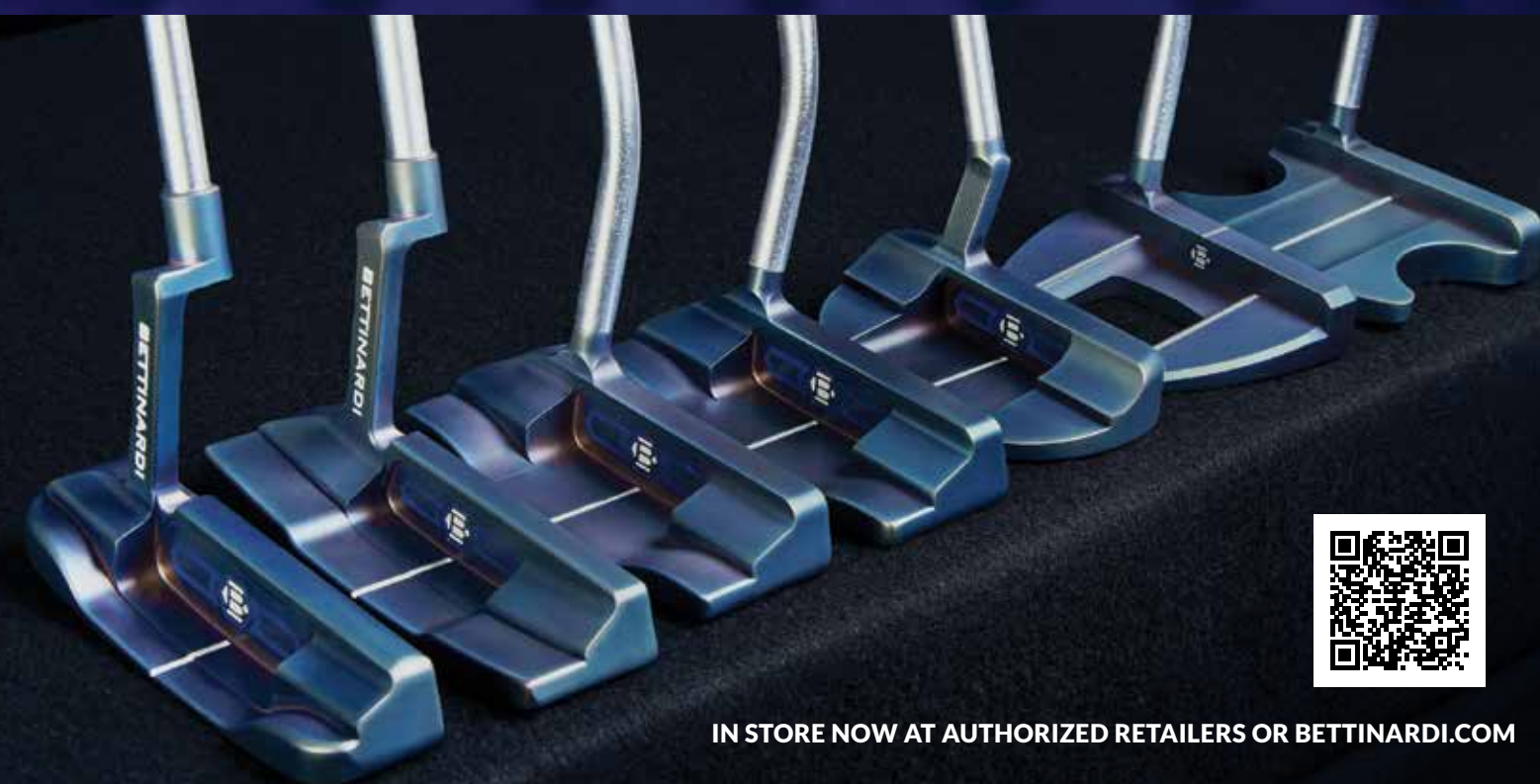

positions itself for the next era of golf and recreation



Fresh bermudagrass and course-wide turf renovation elevate play and reputation

A course-wide turf renewal has powerfully proclaimed SilverRock's standing among the Coachella Valley's most compelling golf and lifestyle destinations.

SilverRock is entering one of the most exciting chapters in its two-decade history. An interview with Randy Duncan, general manager and director of golf at SilverRock Resort since 2004, reveals that the golf club has continued to evolve as one of La Quinta's premier public golf destinations, with a renewed focus on course conditions, playability and the overall experience for golfers and visitors.

Duncan says, "We are elated that the City of La Quinta has completed a fresh, course-wide turf upgrade designed to elevate playability, durability and visual appeal."

At the heart of that momentum is the playing surface. The two-summer renovation replaced aging turf with a new premium bermudagrass, selected for better playability, stronger growth habits and its ability to withstand desert heat, drought, traffic and the stresses of overseeding. The front nine was renewed first, followed by the back nine in summer 2026. Crews also laser-leveled tee boxes, refined bunker access and transition areas, and restored fairway contours closer to the original Arnold Palmer design. The result is a cleaner, firmer and more consistent encounter from tee to green.

Duncan says, "I'd put this course up against any course in the desert, and what's impressive is that we did most of it in house. Our superintendent, Chris Hoyer, is so talented in terms of agronomy knowledge, leading teams, contractors, and maintenance crews. It makes us all really proud."

The staff at SilverRock is known for its friendly, welcoming demeanor and commitment to making every



guest feel at home. James Saenz, head golf professional, leads the golf operations and has been with Duncan since day one, also dating back to 2004.

Duncan said, “From the moment you arrive at SilverRock, you’ll be treated with genuine kindness and hospitality. The staff takes pride in creating an experience where every golfer feels more like a member than a guest.”

Owned by the City of La Quinta and managed by Landmark Golf Management, SilverRock’s Arnold Palmer Classic Course stretches 7,239 yards across more than 200 acres beneath the Santa Rosa Mountains. Massive native bunkers, dramatic water features, rocky outcroppings and strategic angles give it the scale and character of a prestige venue. Its reputation is equally substantial: SilverRock served as a PGA Tour tournament course from 2008 through 2011, proving that a municipal course can meet professional scrutiny while remaining accessible to residents and visitors.

Winners saw defending champion Charley Hoffman showcase his defense in 2008 during the tournament, ultimately won by D.J.

Trahan. The overall tournament winners were Pat Perez in 2009 and Bill Haas in 2010. In 2011, SilverRock saw the rise of Jhonattan Vegas, then a 26-year-old PGA Tour rookie from Venezuela, who eventually defeated Gary Woodland in a playoff.

SilverRock’s public status should never be mistaken for a compromise in quality. The routing asks players to think from the tee, manage bold bunkering and choose smart approaches into the greens. Multiple tees welcome a range of abilities, while the back markers preserve a formidable championship test.

Duncan says, “The new bermudagrass fairways deliver cleaner lies, better recovery and a polished presentation, which means that SilverRock can stand confidently beside the Coachella Valley’s respected private clubs in both course quality and reputation—without the membership barrier.”

He continues, “The upgrades have taken SilverRock from an excellent round of golf to a first-class recreational outing. SilverRock was already playing in the big leagues; the upgrades simply gave it an even sharper uniform and a state-of-the-art playing field.”



The benefits extend beyond aesthetics. The new p turf on the greens reduces the need for traditional overseeding of the putting surfaces, shortening the annual fall closure from roughly four weeks to about two and a half.

Accessibility remains central to SilverRock’s identity. At least one-third of tee times are reserved for La Quinta resident cardholders. Non-residents can book through dynamic pricing, broadening access to a level of design and conditioning often associated with a private or high-end resort golf. During the valley’s busiest months, demand is strong enough that tee sheets routinely approach capacity.

SilverRock also extends its value beyond the standard round. “Walk the Rock,” a long-running program for La Quinta residents, offers late-afternoon walking play on a nine-hole loop that begins on No. 2 and finishes near the clubhouse. Without carts and timed near sunset, it blends golf, fitness and the joy of immersing oneself in the desert landscape.

SilverRock Grill, housed in the historic Ahmanson Ranch House, is open for breakfast and lunch. Led by Chef Jose Bravo and a very friendly staff, the top-rated restaurant attracts golfers and non-golfers alike with indoor and patio seating, mountain views and a pup-friendly atmosphere.



In December, the property becomes a central stage for Ironman 70.3 La Quinta, with SilverRock Park hosting race-week activities and the bike-to-run transition and finish area, to include a swim in stunning Lake Cahuilla, a scenic desert bike course, and a run through the picturesque Coachella Valley landscape. For a few days, a golf landscape transforms into a sought-after gathering place for athletes, spectators and families.

For golfers, the headline remains the course itself: a top-quality course, reinvigorated from tee to green and framed by one of the valley's most dramatic mountain settings. For La Quinta residents, it is also a public investment in access, wellness and quality of life.

As GM Duncan reminds us, for a golf resort that is public in ownership yet characterized by private-club caliber in ambition and holds its own and then some.

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Tom Doak

The Icon of Minimalist Modern Golf Architecture

A successful mix of engineering, art, golf, and now scholarships

In the Coachella Valley, golf architect Tom Doak's name is almost synonymous with Stone Eagle, the highdesert course that perches along a mountain plateau above Palm Desert, where tee shots cling visually to granite backdrops and never quite lift into open sky – with the eye, anyway. That sensation of vertigo and exhilaration captures Doak's ethos: move less earth, find more golf.

Doak describes Stone Eagle as “a rugged site” with roughly 300–350 feet of elevation change and about 400 feet from the parking area to the golf floor. The course occupies land long constrained by elevation restrictions for residential building. What couldn't be approved for neighborhood construction becomes something more rare, involving a journey through raw topography, where the mountain shoulder frames nearly every early swing.

Doak said, “Originally, we intended for the clubhouse to be very limited due to building constraints. However, the result is far from the modest lean-to we envisioned.” He explains that

it's known as the Aerie, which is the hilltop indooroutdoor retreat named for an eagle's nest.

His famously walkable designs demand a bit more leg motion while members still have the option to take carts.

Doak said, “I think Stone Eagle is still one of my more under-rated courses. But it's one of my favorite places, and I'm very proud of it.”

His instinct to celebrate the land first and to “leave as much of it alone as you possibly can” is how Doak learned to work. It became the signature often labeled minimalism which he continues to embrace: a school of design that routes holes around natural features and hides the heavy hand of construction. Minimalism, from Doak's perspective, is less a style than a discipline, building where the ground already suggests strategy. It embraces moving the earth to soften a severe slope or finishing a green and trusting the wind, the firm sand, and the angles.

In contrast to his desert sculpture of Stone Eagle, Pacific Dunes—opened in 2001 in Bandon, on Oregon's southern coast—was the breakthrough that unlocked sites of similar promise worldwide. It's the course that convinced developers to prioritize the land over the blueprints, earning it top marks in Doak's global reputation.

Instead of citing favorite projects, Doak prefers to separate the courses he returns to often or has golfed on more extensively

from those that live mostly in memory. He's played Pacific Dunes “probably a hundred times,” learning from elite players and beginners alike. Farther afield, he cites Tara Iti Golf Club in New Zealand and Barnboughle Dunes Golf Links in Tasmania among the career touchstones, both regularly placed among his top work.

Other notable construction experiences for Doak include Rock Creek Cattle Company in Deer Lodge, Montana and St. Patrick's Links at Rosapenna Golf Resort in County Donegal, Ireland.

Doak said, “I knew from the time I was 12 or 13 years old that I was interested in golf course design, but back then, the path wasn't as clear for designers.”

He began at MIT (Massachusetts Institute of Technology) then transferred to Cornell to study landscape architecture, ultimately winning support to travel the British Isles to study classic links and even to caddy at St Andrews, a formative immersion in windshaped golf. He later apprenticed with Pete Dye, learning construction from the inside out and absorbing, then diverging from, Dye's psychological design platform.

In the early 1990s, Doak wrote “The Confidential Guide to Golf Courses,” personal appraisals originally intended for friends that circulated widely with candid commentary. (Later, he expanded the project into a multivolume reference.) He also authored “The

Anatomy of a Golf Course," now regarded as a primer for committed enthusiasts.

Doak said, "That book was written 33 years ago, and, amazingly, it sold the most copies ever – 6,000 – last year. I think it corresponds with my higher profile in golf architecture now, but, go figure!"

Doak emphasizes choosing good people, good places, and good ground. He hints at a second course at Cape Kidnappers Golf Course at Hawke's Bay in New Zealand, over two decades after the first. Cape Kidnappers has been hailed as one of the great modern marvels in golf, having played host to the PGA Tour's Kiwi Challenge in 2008 and 2009 and being ranked among the Top 100 Golf Courses in the World.

Doak also speaks with zest about Punta Brava Golf Club, an ultra private golf and surf club in Ensenada, Baja, Mexico at the tip of the Punta Banda Peninsula, whose design he led. The granite drama here showcases the volcanic rock of the Pacific, with as many as eight or nine holes where a ball can find the ocean.

Doak said, "I consider my style to be a bit of a throwback. I just don't tear up a piece of land wall to wall to create a beautiful course. The final product should integrate with the natural environment." He explains that the land is his guiding force, remaining true to the natural surroundings.

Doak just recently announced a new scholarship program, the Doak Award, to be presented every two years to a student who has showcased a commitment to a career in golf-course architecture. Doak has modeled the program after the Dreer Award which he earned while at Cornell in the early 1980s, which paid for him to travel and study golf courses. Applicants should email proposals to Tom Doak at doakgolf@aol.com by November 1, 2026 and include "Doak Award Proposal" in the subject line. Three finalists will be selected for interviews in early 2027 with the winner will be announced in the fall of 2028.

Doak's work might suggest that great courses aren't built but are found. However, the truth is, he is an innovator who will never accept mediocrity. This master architect of over four dozen highly acclaimed courses around the globe is the true wizard behind the curtain of creativity and recreational bliss out on the links, cementing his role model status for generations to come. ■ Written by Alison Elsner

This month's golf tip is feeling FOOTWORK. In these golf photos, I feel there is several ways to gain: POWER, SPEED & DISTANCE. Hopefully you can feel the difference that starts from your FEET & FOOTWORK.



PHOTO 1: 7 Iron Neutral

Feet: heels in about 2"

Feet: width apart about shoulder

Weight: interior on both feet & up through the knees
1 Power source: starts from the floor/ground with your feet



PHOTO 2 : Start of Takeaway

Feet: weight shifts to left interior/right exterior (it might feel like you are rolling your weight on your feet)

Weight: interior on both feet & up through the knees
Left knee: if you can point at the ball

Right knee: can lock or feel flexed depending on your: body, injury, & abilities



PHOTO 3: start of down swing

Feet: weight shifts to outside left interior (it might feel like you are rolling your weight on your feet toward the target)

Weight: SHIFT LEFT TOWARD THE TARGET, FEEL LIKE YOU ARE SNOW SKIING TO THE LEFT & up through the knees (this creates POWER, SPEED & DISTANCE)

Toes: will stay feeling more planted, 1 or both heels will shift or move feeling toward the left target

Knees: will start to feel like they are facing the target



PHOTO 4: just past impact

Feet: weight shifts to outside left interior/right exterior (it might feel like you are rolling your weight on your feet toward the target)

Weight: SHIFT LEFT TOWARD THE TARGET, FEEL LIKE YOU ARE SNOW SKIING TO THE LEFT & up through the knees (this creates: POWER, SPEED & DISTANCE)

Toes: will stay feeling more planted, 1 or both heels will shift or move feeling toward the left target

Knees: will start to feel like they are facing the target

Heels: front heel (the left) right / back heel might come off the ground (depending on fitness / injury)



PHOTO 5: finish

Feet: 80-90 % weight shifts to outside left interior (it might feel like you are rolling your 80-100 % weight on your feet toward the target)

Weight: SHIFT LEFT TOWARD THE TARGET, FEEL LIKE YOU ARE SNOW SKIING TO THE LEFT & up through the knees (this creates: POWER, SPEED & DISTANCE)

Toes: will stay feeling more planted, 1 or both heels will shift or move feeling toward the left target

Both knees: will start to feel like they are facing the target

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The Magnificent 2026 King Hassan II Trophy

The 50th Anniversary – A Celebration of Golf, Culture and Moroccan Hospitality



Australia's Scott Hend emerged victorious with an impressive 15-under-par total of 204, earning him his first King Hassan II Trophy title

The 2026 King Hassan II Trophy marked a golden milestone in one of golf's most prestigious international tournaments. Celebrating its 50th edition, the tournament once again transformed the magnificent Royal Golf Dar Es Salam in Rabat, Morocco, into the center of the golfing world. Held from 18–24 May 2026, the event brought together legendary golfers from the PGA TOUR Champions alongside the world's leading women professionals competing simultaneously in the Lalla Meryem Cup. The anniversary tournament was not simply about golf—it was a celebration of Morocco's rich heritage, warm hospitality, spectacular scenery and unforgettable cuisine.

The Royal Golf Dar Es Salam has long been regarded as one of the finest championship courses anywhere in the world. Nestled within an ancient cork oak forest on the outskirts of Rabat, the course combines immaculate fairways with challenging greens and breathtaking natural beauty. Players and spectators alike were treated to perfect playing conditions, while the surrounding woodland created a peaceful atmosphere unlike almost any other venue on the professional golf calendar.

The 2026 field featured 66 PGA TOUR Champions players, including many of the sport's greatest names. Former major champions and Ryder Cup stars such as Miguel Ángel Jiménez, Steven Alker, Thomas Bjørn, Colin Montgomerie, David Toms, Ernie Els, Retief Goosen, Padraig Harrington, Stewart Cink, Y.E. After three outstanding rounds of championship golf, Australia's Scott Hend emerged victorious with an impressive 15-under-par total of 204. Hend's consistent rounds of 66, 69 and 69 earned him his first King Hassan II Trophy title, finishing five strokes ahead of runners-up Steven Alker of New Zealand and American Tommy Gainey, who shared second place at ten-under-par. Hend collected the winner's prize of \$400,000 while adding his name

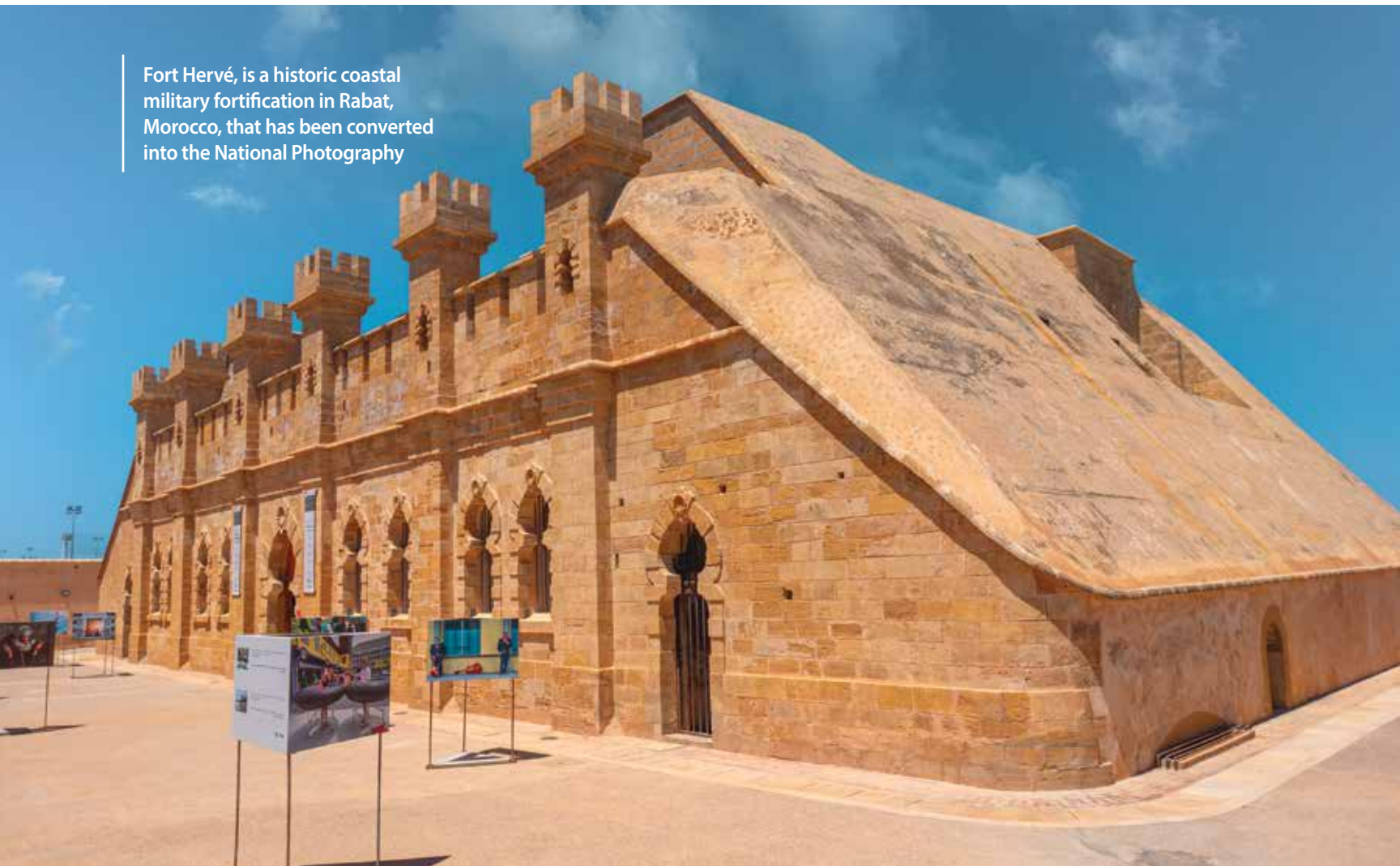
to the distinguished list of champions who have won this famous Moroccan tournament.

The King Hassan II Trophy is renowned not only for its world-class golf but also for one of the most unique trophies in professional sport. Instead of receiving a traditional silver cup, the men's champion is presented with an exquisite ceremonial Moroccan dagger, known as a Koummya. Crafted in gold and decorated with precious jewels, the dagger represents courage, honor and Moroccan craftsmanship. It has become one of golf's most treasured prizes and is instantly recognized around the world.

One of its most iconic landmarks is the magnificent Hassan Tower, the unfinished 12th-century minaret that has become a symbol of the city.

symbol of the city. Nearby stands the spectacular Mausoleum of Mohammed V, whose gleaming white marble, intricate mosaics and impressive royal guards make it one of Morocco's most visited monuments.

Equally captivating is the enchanting Kasbah of the Udaya's, a maze of blue-and-white streets overlooking the Atlantic Ocean. Visitors wander through flower-filled alleyways, browse charming artisan shops and relax in traditional cafés while enjoying panoramic views across the Oued Bou Regreg River. Just outside the Kasbah lies the peaceful Andalusian Gardens, offering colorful flowers, fountains and shady pathways that provide welcome relief from the afternoon sunshine.

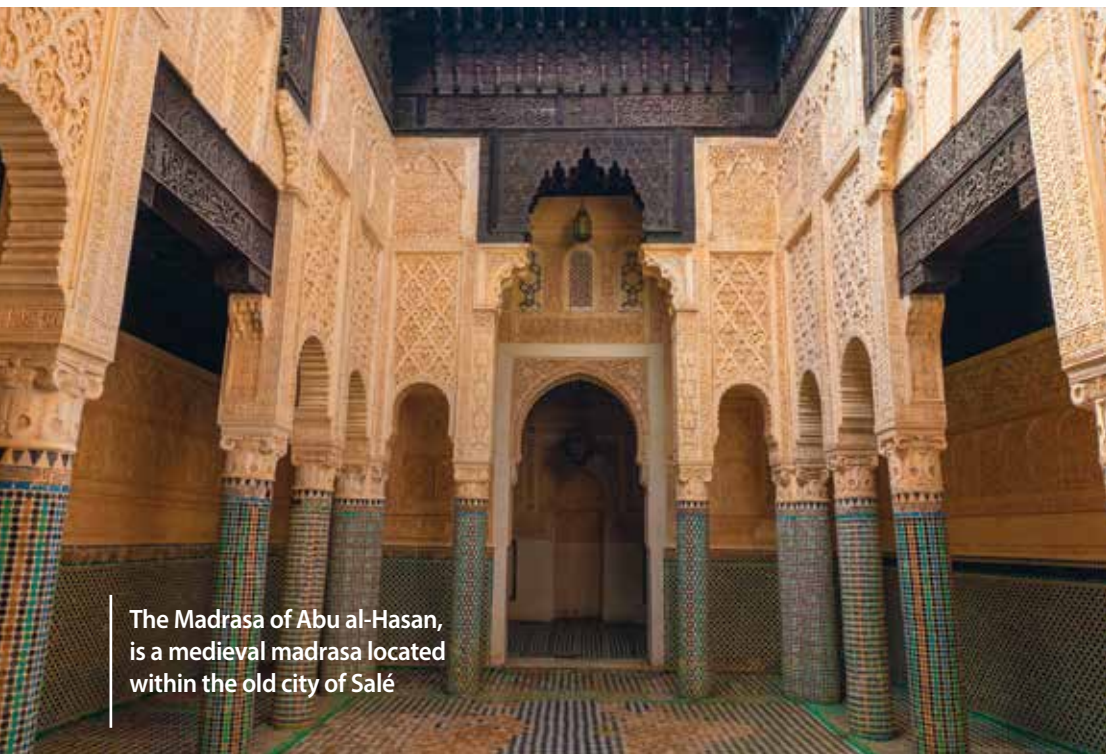
The city's ancient Medina offers a fascinating glimpse into authentic Moroccan life. 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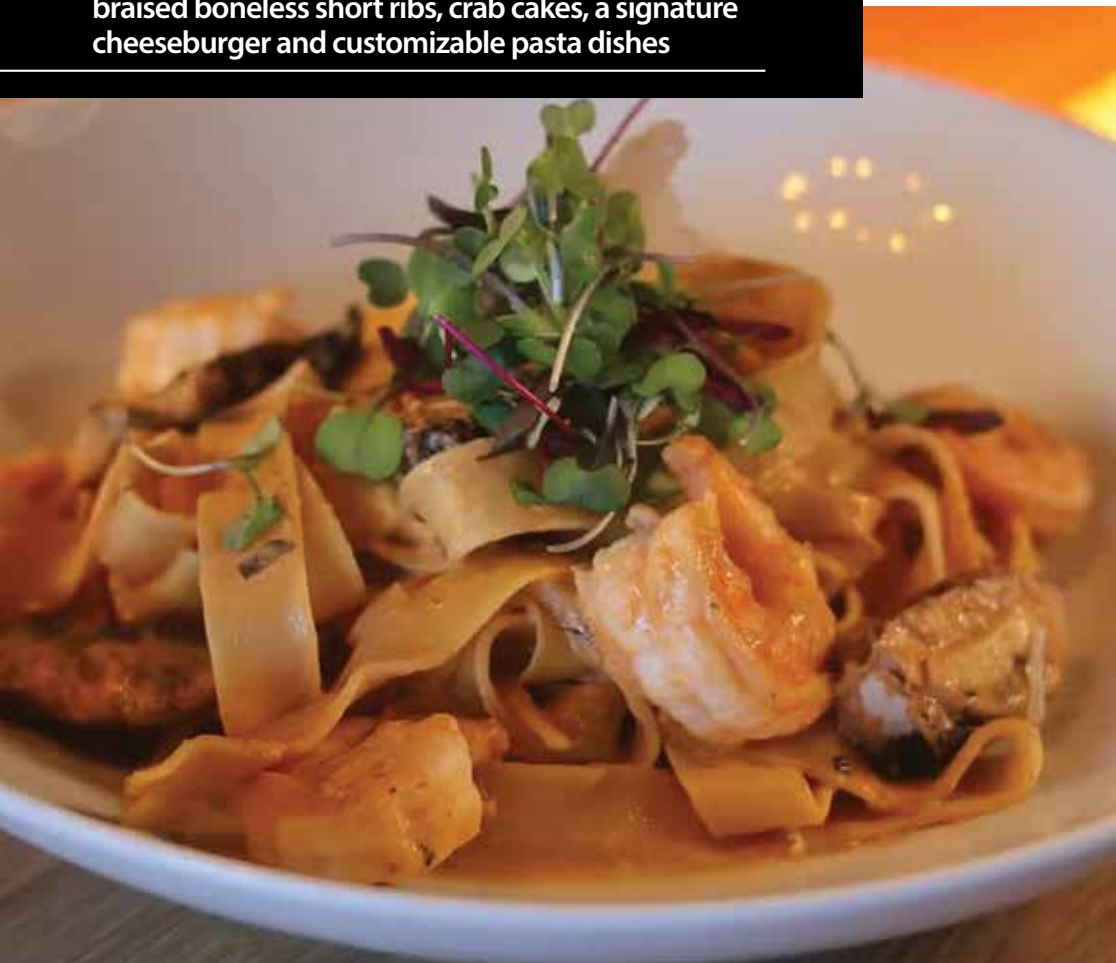

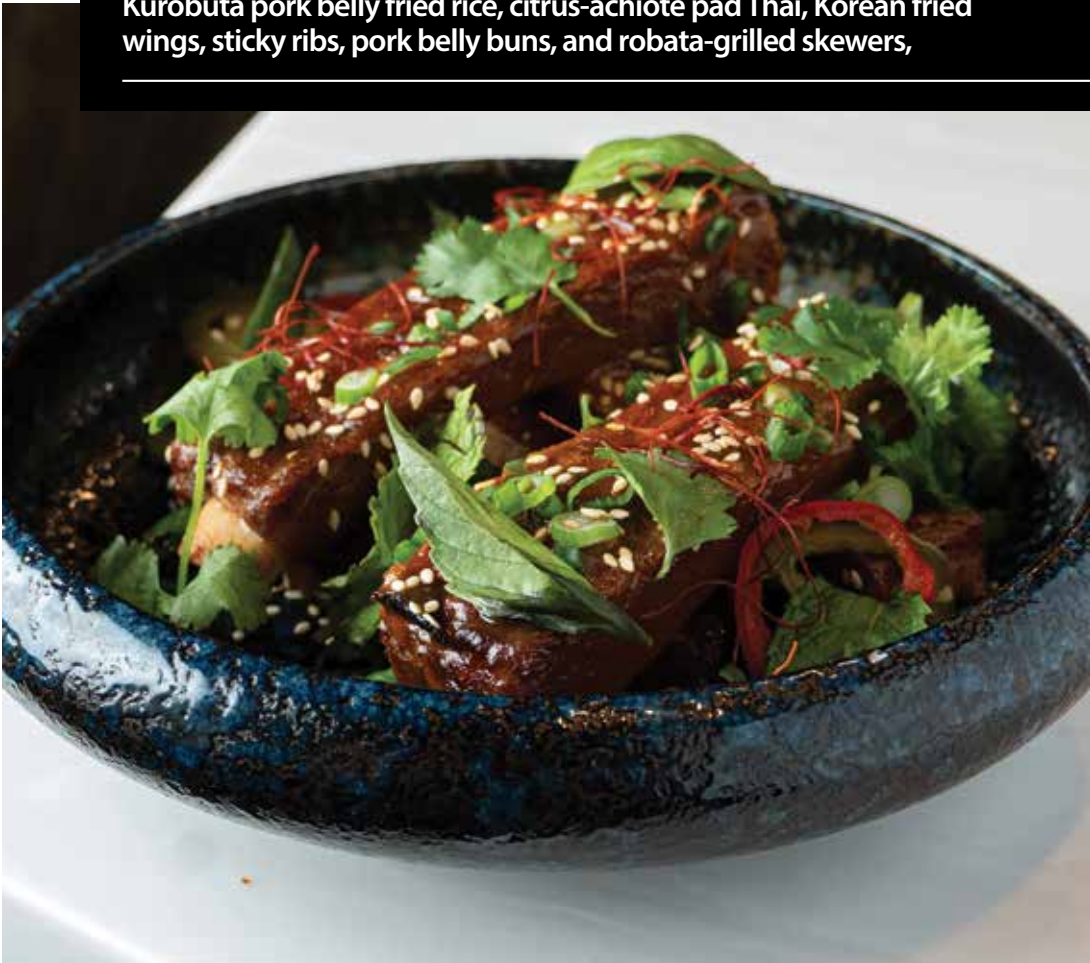
Yozu Modern Asian Bistro

There is speculation that several of the Old Brea Chophouse top performers will carry over to the El Paseo menu, such as ribeye cap steak, lobster mac 'n cheese, truffle deviled eggs, and the highly acclaimed warm butter cake.



The El Paseo Chophouse will likely be serving up classic steakhouse cuts, high-end chops, and traditional accompaniments



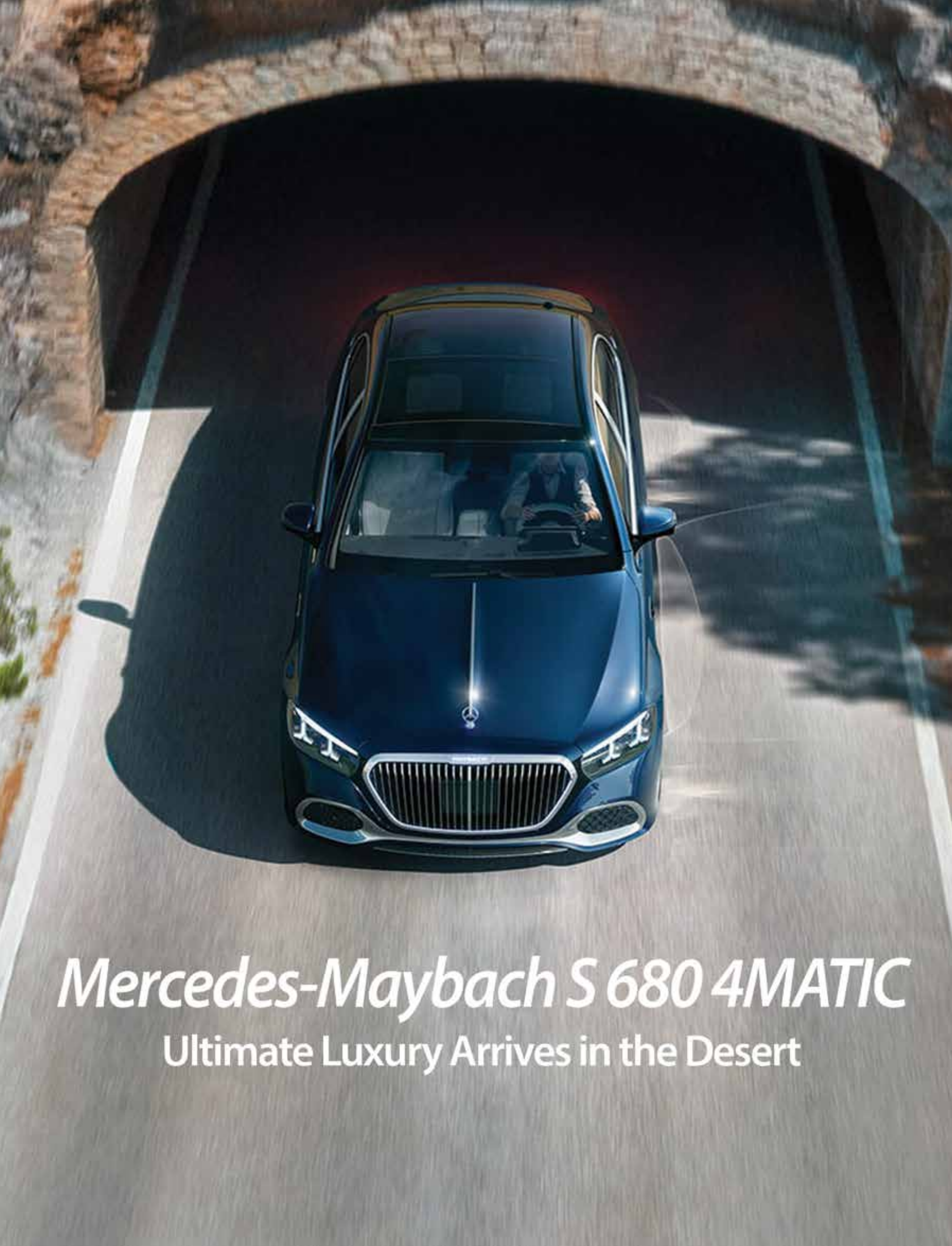

Mercedes-Maybach S 680 4MATIC

Ultimate Luxury Arrives in the Desert



The 2026 Mercedes-Maybach S 680 4MATIC represents one of the most extravagant expressions of automotive luxury available in America today. Combining a handcrafted V12 engine, extraordinary rear-seat comfort, sophisticated technology and the unmistakable presence of Maybach design, the S 680 is aimed at buyers who want something considerably more special than an ordinary luxury sedan. For the Coachella Valley, a region known for luxury resorts, celebrity culture, golf, tennis, fine dining and world-class events, the Maybach S 680 seems almost perfectly at home.

At the heart of the S 680 is a handcrafted 6.0-liter V12 biturbo engine producing an impressive 621 horsepower and 664 lb-ft of torque. Despite its enormous size and luxurious mission, Mercedes-Benz says the sedan can accelerate from zero to 60 mph in just 4.3 seconds. Power is delivered through a nine-speed automatic transmission and Mercedes-Benz 4MATIC all-wheel drive.

The numbers are impressive, but the S 680 is not really about driving as quickly as possible. Its greatest achievement is the way it combines tremendous performance with an exceptionally quiet and composed ride. The "Airmatic" suspension is designed to provide a remarkably smooth experience, while standard rear-axle steering can turn the rear wheels by as much as 10 degrees, making a vehicle more than 17 feet long surprisingly manageable in tighter surroundings.

The Maybach's enormous 133.7-inch wheelbase creates a cabin that feels more like a private lounge than a conventional automobile. Rear passengers receive 49.1 inches of legroom, and buyers can configure the vehicle as either a five-passenger sedan or an even more luxurious four-passenger arrangement. The emphasis is clearly on those traveling in the back seat, where comfort and refinement take center stage.

Inside, almost every surface communicates exclusivity. Nappa leather, extended wood trim, ambient lighting, advanced climate



controls and sophisticated entertainment systems combine to create an environment designed for long-distance comfort. Available rear-seat entertainment, wireless headsets, a rear MBUX tablet, Dolby Atmos and Apple Spatial Audio allow passengers to turn the back seat into a mobile entertainment suite.

The exterior is equally distinctive. The traditional Maybach grille, extensive chrome detailing, dramatic proportions and available two-tone paint immediately separate the S 680 from the standard S-Class. Buyers can also choose from an extensive selection of manufacturer colors and special interior finishes, allowing the automobile to become considerably more personalized.



For 2026, Mercedes-Benz lists the S 680 4MATIC with a starting MSRP of \$244,400 in the United States, before options, taxes, registration and other charges. That price places the Maybach firmly in the ultra-luxury category, where buyers are looking for exclusivity as much as transportation. The available Maybach Night Series Design Package alone adds \$25,000 and brings darker exterior

appointments, special wheels, distinctive interior treatments and other design elements.

Fuel economy is naturally not the primary reason someone purchases a handcrafted V12 luxury sedan. Mercedes-Benz lists EPA ratings of 12 mpg city and 20 mpg highway. With a curb weight of approximately 5,214 pounds, the S 680 is a substantial automobile,



but the combination of V12 power, all-wheel drive and advanced suspension makes its size remarkably easy to forget from behind the wheel.

The Coachella Valley is an especially appropriate market for a car such as the Maybach. Palm Springs, Rancho Mirage, Indian Wells, Palm Desert and La Quinta have long attracted affluent residents and visitors who appreciate luxury automobiles, high-end resorts and exclusive experiences. During the winter season, the valley becomes a gathering place for people from across the country, and major events such as the BNP Paribas Open and the 2026 WTA Finals further reinforce the region's reputation as an international destination.

For local buyers, the most important question is availability. The Coachella Valley is served by Mercedes-Benz of Palm Springs, located at 4095 East Palm Canyon Drive in Palm Springs. The dealership is a full-service Mercedes-Benz retailer serving Palm Springs and surrounding Coachella Valley communities. However, because the S 680 is a highly specialized, low-volume model, buyers should not assume that a particular Maybach will be sitting on the showroom floor. Mercedes-Benz's own website provides local inventory searching, but individual Maybach availability can change quickly.

For someone in the desert who wants a particular exterior color, interior combination or optional package, ordering or locating a specific vehicle through a Mercedes-Benz dealer may be the most practical approach. This is particularly true with the S 680 because Maybach buyers frequently choose highly personalized

combinations rather than simply purchasing whatever happens to be available.

The automobile also makes extraordinary sense as a Coachella Valley grand-touring machine. A drive through Palm Springs, up Highway 74 toward the mountains, across the valley's resort communities or out toward Joshua Tree becomes a completely different experience when the road is surrounded by the silence and comfort of a Maybach cabin.

Perhaps the greatest appeal of the 2026 Mercedes-Maybach S 680 4MATIC is that it refuses to compromise. It has the power of a performance car, the technology of a rolling luxury suite and the craftsmanship expected of one of the world's most prestigious automotive names. It is not designed to be ordinary, and that is precisely the point.

In a community where luxury is part of the landscape, the 2026 Mercedes-Maybach S 680 4MATIC stands out as a particularly impressive statement. For Coachella Valley residents and visitors looking for the ultimate Mercedes-Benz sedan, the Maybach offers an extraordinary combination of power, elegance, craftsmanship and exclusivity—and there is a local Mercedes-Benz retailer available to help prospective buyers explore the possibility of bringing one into the desert. ■ Written by DG&T Staff

A truly exceptional watch is much more than an instrument for telling time. The world's finest timepieces represent craftsmanship, engineering, heritage and personal style, often combining precious metals, hand-finished movements, diamonds and complications that can take months or even years to perfect. For both men and women, names such as Patek Philippe, Rolex, Hublot, Cartier and Jaeger-LeCoultre remain among the most respected in luxury watchmaking.



Patek Philippe sits at the pinnacle of traditional Swiss haute horlogerie. The Geneva manufacture is renowned for complicated movements, extraordinary finishing and watches that can become treasured family heirlooms. The Calatrava remains an icon of understated elegance, while the Nautilus and Aquanaut have become some of the world's most coveted luxury sports watches. Patek Philippe offers exceptional pieces for women as well, including elegant complications and diamond-set models. Prices vary enormously, with many new watches costing tens of thousands of dollars and exceptional complications reaching hundreds of thousands. On the secondary market, highly desirable discontinued models can command dramatically higher prices.



Rolex remains arguably the most recognizable luxury watch name in the world. Its appeal comes from an extraordinary combination of prestige, durability and timeless design. For men, the Submariner, GMT-Master II, Daytona, Day-Date and Sky-Dweller remain particularly desirable. Current U.S. Rolex pricing ranges from approximately \$6,750 for an Oyster Perpetual 36 to more than \$84,000 for a platinum Daytona, with precious-metal and gem-set examples climbing beyond \$100,000.

Rolex has an equally impressive selection for women. The Lady-Datejust, Datejust 31, Oyster Perpetual and smaller Datejust models offer everything from understated stainless steel to spectacular combinations of gold and diamonds. Current examples include Lady-Datejust models beginning around \$13,300, while diamond-set precious-metal watches can exceed \$50,000.



Hublot appeals to collectors who prefer contemporary design and innovative materials. The Big Bang is instantly recognizable for its bold case and modern architecture, while the Classic Fusion offers a somewhat more restrained interpretation of the Hublot philosophy. Titanium, ceramic, carbon materials, precious metals and rubber straps are frequently combined in unconventional ways. Hublot's men's and women's collections span a broad range of prices, with current special-edition Big Bang models such as the Big Bang Original Soft Touch All Red listed around \$24,900 and more elaborate pieces reaching far higher.



Cartier brings an entirely different kind of sophistication. The French maison is legendary for jewelry, but its watchmaking heritage is equally significant. The Tank remains one of the most influential watch designs ever created, while the Santos combines distinctive geometry with a more contemporary appearance. Cartier's women's collection is particularly beautiful, with watches that can incorporate diamonds, precious metals and elegant bracelet designs. Men's Cartier watches range from relatively accessible luxury pieces to highly complicated and jeweled creations costing many tens of thousands of dollars.



Jaeger-LeCoultre is often described by serious collectors as the “watchmaker’s watchmaker.” The Swiss manufacture has developed an extraordinary number of movements and complications throughout its history. The Reverso, with its famous reversible case, remains the signature design and is available in both men’s and women’s configurations. The Master Control collection offers classic Swiss elegance, while the Polaris line provides a sportier alternative. Prices generally begin in the several-thousand-dollar range and can rise dramatically for complicated or precious-metal watches.

For women seeking something particularly sophisticated, the Patek Philippe Twenty~4, Rolex Lady-Datejust, Cartier Panthère, Cartier Tank, Hublot Classic Fusion and Jaeger-LeCoultre Reverso all offer distinct interpretations of luxury. These watches demonstrate that high-end horology is no longer simply divided into “men’s” and “women’s” categories. Case sizes, materials and designs increasingly allow collectors to choose according to personal taste rather than traditional gender classifications.

For men, the choices are equally extraordinary. A Rolex Submariner or GMT-Master II provides legendary sport-watch credentials, while a Patek Philippe Calatrava offers traditional elegance. A Nautilus delivers understated exclusivity, a Hublot Big Bang makes a dramatic contemporary statement, and a Jaeger-LeCoultre Reverso offers unmistakable individuality. Cartier’s Santos occupies an appealing middle ground between classic dress watch and sophisticated everyday timepiece.

Pricing is only part of the story. Availability can be equally important, particularly for highly sought-after models. Some watches are readily available through authorized retailers, while others have waiting lists or are significantly more expensive on the secondary market. Collectors should therefore consider authenticity, provenance, warranty, service history and the reputation of the seller alongside the price.

The finest watches ultimately reflect the personality of their owners. Patek Philippe represents the pinnacle of traditional watchmaking, Rolex combines prestige and practicality, Hublot embraces modern luxury, Cartier delivers timeless elegance, and Jaeger-LeCoultre rewards those who appreciate mechanical sophistication. Whether selecting a first serious timepiece or adding another extraordinary watch to an established collection, these five marques offer some of the most compelling choices in luxury horology today.
